### Narrative

On 10/15/07, at about 0106 hrs, we received an emergency call from 7202 Lake Front Tr in Arlington. The complainant said they could hear a black male yelling in the middle of the street and that he needs help.

I, Sergeant Martin and Officer Stewart #2260 and Officer Taylor #2382 were dispatched Code to this location. We received another call from 2312 Fossil Creek Dr, stating that a black female with a knife was chasing a black male running southbound on Fossil Creek Dr. I was first on scene at about 0114 hrs, and located the suspects at 7401 Fossil Creek Dr. I located a black heavy set female who was later identified as Malishia Booker, B/F [REDACTED], and another black female, who was identified as Ciara Booker, B/F [REDACTED] and there were also 3 small black females.

When I pulled up I spoke to the adult B/F and asked her where the male was who was running and she said that he had run away from us, and she pointed westbound towards Spring Miller Rd. She said he was possibly wearing only shorts and was dark skinned. I notified the other units in the area to watch for the B/M. I checked the two black female adults for weapons, and did not see any weapons on any one of them.

She asked that I transport them back to their house which was about 2 blocks away, and it was raining. She said she lived at 7407 Lake Front Dr. All 5 of the black females got into the rear of my patrol car unit 116, and transported them to the location. Upon arrival, the black male was standing at the door and she said that was her boyfriend. I contacted other units and said the other half of the domestic disturbance we were working was at this location. Officer Stewart, Officer Taylor and Officer Weil #2070 arrived to assist.

### Narrative

The black male was contacted by Officer Stewart and the female was contacted by Officer Weil, and Officer Taylor interviewed the children at the location. Prior to transporting the B/F identified as Ciara, she said that she had taken the knife away from her mother, so she wouldn't stab the boyfriend, and she said the knife was back at the house, although we had reports from neighbors in the neighborhood saying that she was chasing him down the street with the knife.

The black female suspect, who was identified as Malishia Booker, had a strong odor of alcohol on her breath, her speech was slurred and her balance appeared unsteady and her eyes blood shot, and she appeared to be intoxicated. She repeated numerous times that she didn't want to prosecute, although she was the one chasing the male with the knife. She said he had a key that she wanted and they were trying to kick him out of the house, and he was refusing to give them the key, and that's why she was chasing him. The residence was in disarray when we stepped into the house; it had a broken glass coffee table in the living room and the frame to the coffee table was in the hallway.

Next door to the location at 7405 Lake Front Tr, the brick mailbox was destroyed, and the victim, who was identified as James Roland, B/M [REDACTED] said that she had struck the mailbox with the car when she pulled in. He said she backed into the mailbox, destroying the brick mailbox and then asked him to pull the car into the garage. He refused and said that he wasn't going to be a part of the offense, so she pulled the car into the garage. We noticed that there was a white early 90s Ford Crown Victoria in the garage, bearing buyer's tag. On the buyer's tag it had JAMES ROLAND on the tag. It did have some damage to the left rear bumper. I tried to contact the residents at 7405 and got no answer, while the officers were interviewing and conducting their investigation.

At about 0147 hrs, Officer Stewart and Officer Weil attempted to handcuff the B/F identified as Malishia Booker in front of the residence. They asked her to put her hands behind her back. Officer Stewart got the right hand behind her back and cuffed it, and she began struggling and flail. She slung Officer Weil onto her back onto the sidewalk in front of the location. Officer Weil landed on her tailbone and the back of her head struck the sidewalk and she was completely dazed and started struggling to get to her feet. I ordered her to stay put where she was and I assisted Officer Stewart in subduing the black female. She was taken to the ground face first and continued to struggle, and Officer Stewart administered OC spray to her face. We were then able to get the left hand behind her back and handcuff her.

She continued to struggle as she went to the car and I then tended to Officer Weil, while the other officers secured the suspect in the vehicle. I called for an ambulance for Officer Weil, since she was obviously injured. The ambulance arrived and transported her to Methodist Hospital in Mansfield, where she was treated and later released, and found to have a contusion on the back of her head and bruised tailbone.

I took photographs of the scene with permission of the black male there. He said that he did not want to prosecute, and he was told that the State was going to prosecute, due to this being a domestic situation. He allowed me to take pictures of the inside of the house. I photographed a door to the laundry room that had two knife stab marks in it. The black female named Ciara said that her mother had stabbed the door twice and then the knives were in the kitchen. There were several knives in the kitchen and some were broken. Due to the fact that the Ciara and other children were still walking around in the house, and both the suspect and victim were still there, Officer Stewart collected all the knives and put them in the rear of his patrol car for safe keeping and security.

One of the knives was a butterfly type knife and it was located right directly next to the brown purse, that apparently belonged to Ms. Malishia Booker. The purse was open and marijuana seeds were visible in the bottom of the purse. I took photos of the scene and the mailbox and noticed that there were 3 small children that lived there, and their bedroom had absolutely no furniture in it. Mr. Roland said that the two smaller children were his and that he would take care of the other ones until other arrangements could be made. I requested a copy of this report be sent to Child Protective Services, as the living conditions for the children is they had no bed and they said that they slept on the floor most of the time.

I transported the memory card to the West Police Station and downloaded it onto a mini CD, labeling it TDM1, of the damage to the location. I also had pictures of Officer Weil at the hospital and a picture of her abrasion to her

right elbow area. I was unable to photograph the injury to her head, due to the hair covering of the contusion.

I transported the memory card to the West Police Station, and downloaded it onto a mini CD and dropped it in the evidence drop box; completed an evidence transmittal and submitted it as evidence.
