RESPONSE:

We have the following to share from the Saskatchewan Ministry of Health:

We encourage all Saskatchewan residents to follow COVID-19 public health orders and recommendations.

Interprovincial travel is strongly discouraged.

Saskatchewan does not have punitive measures for interprovincial travel. However, residents who travel should be aware of restrictions that might be in place in other jurisdictions, including mandatory self-isolation.

Recreational travel outside of Saskatchewan is not recommended. The federal government has suggested guidance on services that may be considered essential for travel.
