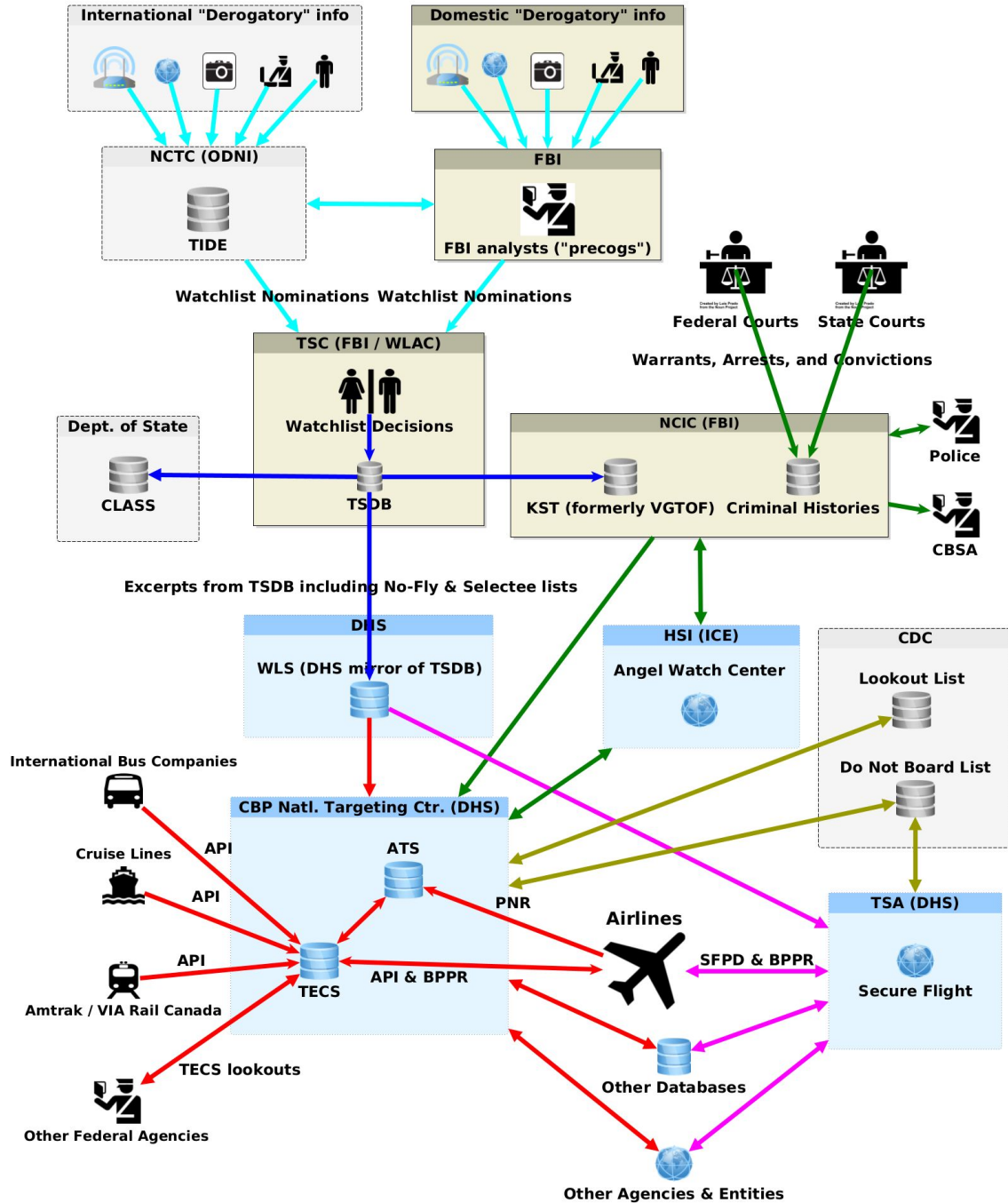


# The Identity Project

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## Key to Acronyms:

Angel Watch Center: operated by HSI (controls international travel by people who have been convicted of certain sex-related offenses)  
API: Advance Passenger Information (transmitted to CBP for international travel)  
ATS: Automated Targeting System  
BPPR: Boarding Pass Printing Result (fly/no-fly permission message from DHS; can include “handling codes” in addition to yes/no permission for boarding)  
CBP: U.S. Customs & Border Protection (component of DHS)  
CBSA: Canadian Border Services Agency  
CDC: Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (Dept. of Health & Human Svcs.)  
CLASS: Consular Lookup and Screening System (Dept. of State)  
Do Not Board List: created by CDC (used by TSA in Secure Flight ruleset)

FBI: Federal Bureau of Investigation (component of Dept. of Justice)  
HSI: Homeland Security Investigations (component of ICE)  
ICE: Immigration and Customs Enforcement (component of DHS)  
KST File: Known and Suspected Terrorist File (in NCIC; formerly “VGTOF”)

Lookout List: created by CDC (used by CBP in TECS ruleset & lookout system)  
NCIC: National Crime Information Center (operated by FBI)  
NCTC: National Counterterrorism Center (operated by ODNI)  
NTC: National Targeting Center (operated by CBP)  
ODNI: Office of the Director of National Intelligence (includes CIA, NSA, etc.)  
PNR: Passenger Name Record (transmitted to CBP for international flights)

Secure Flight: TSA database and profiling/scoring system  
SFPD: Secure Flight Passenger Data (transmitted to TSA for domestic flights)

TECS: CBP database formerly “Treasury Enforcement Communications System”  
TECS Lookout: Flag in TECS set by CBP or other agencies to trigger an alert  
TIDE: Terrorist Identities Datamart Environment  
TSA: Transportation Security Agency (component of DHS)  
TSC: Terrorist Screening Center (multi-agency entity controlled by FBI)  
TSDB: Terrorist Screening Database (includes No-Fly & Selectee Lists, etc.)

VGTOF: Violent Gang and Terrorist Offender File (in NCIC; renamed “KST”)  
WLAC: Watchlisting Advisory Council (inter-departmental entity that controls watchlist/blacklist algorithms including no-fly criteria)  
WLS: Watchlist Service (DHS mirror copy of TSDB)

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Key to color-coding of entities and data flows:

Beige boxes: FBI and FBI components (TSC, NCIC, etc.)

Blue boxes: DHS and DHS components (TSA, CBP, ICE, etc.)

Gray boxes: Other U.S. Federal agencies and departments

Light blue lines: “Derogatory” information and watchlist/blacklist “nominations”

Dark blue lines: Watchlisting/blacklisting decisions (including No-Fly orders)

Green lines: Criminal history data including warrants, arrests, and convictions (used for international flights only, not domestic flights, so far as is known)

Brown lines: CDC No-Board orders (to international and domestic airlines)

Red lines: International travel records (to CBP) and orders to airlines

Magenta lines: Domestic U.S. travel records (to TSA) and orders to airlines

This is what we know, as of January 2021, about no-fly decisions by the U.S. government, how they are communicated to airlines, and which agencies are involved:

For domestic U.S. flights, no-fly orders can be derived from either (1) the TSDB No-Fly list or (2) the CDC Do Not Board List. Both of these lists (along with non-list-based suspicion-generating and pre-crime profiling rules) are included in the Secure Flight algorithmic ruleset used by the TSA to generate a “Boarding Pass Printing Result” in response to the transmission of “Secure Flight Passenger Data” by the airline to TSA.

For international flights to, from, via, or overflying the U.S., no-fly orders can be derived from either (1) the TSDB No-Fly list, (2) the CDC Do Not Board List and/or Lookout List, or (3) criminal history (including past convictions for sex-related offenses monitored by the “Angel Watch Center”) or arrest warrant data from NCIC. All of these, along with pre-crime profiling rules and “handling codes” such as “TECS lookouts,” are included in the algorithmic ruleset used by CBP to generate a “Boarding Pass Printing Result” in response to the transmission of API and PNR data by the airline to CBP.
