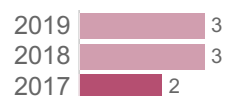

3 Year Growth



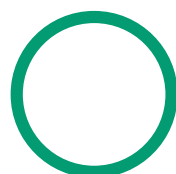

CCSA's Minimum Academic Accountability Criteria:

State rank: On a scale of 1 to 10, state rank measures a school's average status on DFS (Distance from Standard) performance (for grades 3-8 and 11 and Math and ELA tests) compared to other schools across the state.

Growth: A school's average change in CAASPP scale score points of DFS between 2016-17 and 2018-19.

Postsecondary readiness: Percent of high school graduates prepared for college or a career on the CA Dashboard College and Career Indicator (CCI). The 45% threshold was chosen because it represents the average for all schools included in CCSA's accountability system.

Similar Students Rank (SSR): On a scale of 1 to 10, SSR measures how well a school performs on the CAASPP compared to a demographically controlled prediction for that school.

Multiple Measure Review (MMR): Charter schools below ALL the initial filters in two of three years are invited to share outcomes aligned to California's 8 state priorities as described in the school's Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). Schools are able to demonstrate their own story of success by choosing student academic outcome measures most closely aligned to their mission. Charter schools are only eligible for the Multiple Measure Review process in their year of charter renewal. For schools requiring a MMR, CCSA charter renewal support depends on the MMR outcome.

Public Call for Non-Renewal: Some charter schools are not able to demonstrate academic growth and positive student outcomes during the MMR process or opt not to participate in MMR, while falling below all initial filters. If a charter school chooses to self-close, CCSA takes no further action. If a charter school is below all minimum criteria and continues to move forward with their charter renewal, CCSA will publicly advocate for the non-renewal of the school with the school's authorizer and local media.

Parental Education Levels: 1: No High School Diploma, 2: High School Diploma, 3: Some College, 4: Bachelor's Degree, 5: Graduate Degree

CCSA's Minimum Academic Accountability Criteria would not apply if a school participates in the DASS program, is less than four years old, or has fewer than 30 valid test taker..
