In response to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, enclosed is a processed copy of Bates Stamped documents, FBI (19-cv-1278)-6194 through FBI (19-cv-1278)-6693. The enclosed documents represent the fifteenth interim release of information responsive to your request.

Additionally, included in this release are 65 pages of previously processed material. This material is being provided to you per a court order. This material consists of documents from FBI(19-cv-1279)-1249 through FBI(19-cv-1279)-1313.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum includes information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes additional standard responses that apply to all requests for records on individuals. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records. For questions regarding Parts 1, 2, or 3, visit the www.fbi.gov/foia website under "Contact Us." Previously mentioned appeal and dispute resolution services are also available at the web address.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) National Security/Intelligence Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of national security and foreign intelligence records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and PA exemption (j)(2) as applicable to requests for records about individuals [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2); 50 U.S.C.§ 3024(i)(1)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC.§ 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that national security or foreign intelligence records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching those systems or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. A reasonable search normally consists of a search for main files in the Central Records System (CRS), an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled and maintained by the FBI in the course of fulfilling law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization and encompasses the records of FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ), FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide and includes Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records. - (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheets. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. Forms and directions can be accessed at www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/identity-history-summary-checks. - (iv) The National Name Check Program (NNCP). The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private citizens cannot request a name check.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual:
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

Inside the Trump Team's Push on Israel Vote That Mike Flynn Lied About

Transition team's bid to scuttle U.N. vote criticizing Israel was intense. Jared Kushner, Mike Flynn and Nikki Haley all made calls

In the days before a late-2016 vote on a United Nations resolution that criticized Israel, then-President-elect Donald Trump and top aides made a last-ditch push to target a majority of the U.N. Security Council to scuttle the text, people familiar with the situation said.

The lobbying effort, which ultimately failed, was wider and more intense than has been reported, according to interviews with dozens of diplomats and U.S. officials. It was also conducted against the wishes of the sitting U.S. government. The Obama administration's decision to abstain from the vote criticizing Israel's settlements in East Jerusalem and the West Bank was what enabled the Security Council to pass a resolution condemning the country's settlements for the first time in 36 years.

The December 2016 push by Mr. Trump and his transition team came at the request of Israel and involved top aides including the president's son-in-law, Jared Kushner, former national security adviser Mike Flynn and the current U.S. ambassador to the U.N., Nikki Haley, according to the people familiar with the matter.

Though the diplomatic effort was ultimately fruitless, Mr. Flynn's lies about it to federal officials have formed part of the basis of the December plea deal he struck that requires him to cooperate with investigators looking into whether the Trump team colluded with Russia to win the 2016 election—something both the White House and the Kremlin have repeatedly denied. That criminal probe is led by special counsel Robert Mueller.

Mr. Flynn in last month's plea agreement admitted to having placed calls to officials from multiple countries, including Russia, about the Israel resolution and to having "falsely stated" to the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he had only asked the countries about their position on the text. In fact, "a very senior member of the Presidential Transition Team"—Mr. Kushner, according to people familiar with the matter—"directed Flynn" to contact the officials to "influence those governments to delay the vote or defeat the resolution," according to the documents, which didn't provide further details on the matter.

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The transition team ended up locating many relevant officials, including those from Spain, the -U.K., Uruguay, Russia, Egypt and Malaysia, according to people familiar with the matter and court documents.

Mr. Kushner called the British ambassador to the U.S., Kim Darroch, urging the U.K. to delay the vote, these people said. Mr. Flynn spoke with Spanish Foreign Minister Alfonso Dastis about the vote while the minister was at a loud holiday party in Madrid, according to a person familiar with the call.

Ms. Haley tried to contact Ms. Power, but she declined to take or return the call, telling her staff that Ms. Haley's outreach was inappropriate, according to a person familiar with the matter.

One person familiar with the lobbying said efforts also were made to reach China, New Zealand, Japan and Ukraine. Officials from New Zealand, Japan and Ukraine said they didn't receive an approach. China officials didn't respond to requests for comment.

FULL-COURT PRESS

The last-ditch lobbying effort to scuttle a 2016 United Nations resolution on Israel by then-President-elect Donald Trump and top aides was more extensive than has been reported and went right up to the last moments before the vote, according to people familiar with the effort:

- One transition member called the U.S. State Department's 24-hour operations center for the phone numbers
 of officials, but the department declined to provide them.
- Jared Kushner, the president's son-in-law, called the British ambassador to the U.S., Kim Darroch, urging the U.K. to delay the vote.
- Mike Flynn, soon to be national security adviser, reached Spanish Foreign Minister Alfonso Dastis about the
 vote while the minister was at a loud holiday party in Madrid.
- Nikki Haley, now the U.S. ambassador to the U.N., tried to contact then-Ambassador Samantha Power, but she declined to take or return the call, telling her staff that Ms. Haley's outreach was inappropriate.
- Mr. Trump himself on the day of the scheduled vote told Egyptian President Abdel Fattah Al Sisi that putting the resolution to a vote would damage Egypt's standing with his administration.
- About two hours before the scheduled vote, Mr. Flynn called Malaysia's Permanent Mission to the U.N., but mission staff refused to connect him to their representative.
- As diplomats gathered in the Council chamber to vote, the cellphone of Uruguay's deputy ambassador rang, and it was Mr. Flynn asking to table the resolution, The ambassador declined. The resolution passed.

At the U.N., ambassadors discussed at holiday parties and in late-night phone calls how best to respond, some noting that Messrs. Flynn and Kushner had told them the incoming administration "would remember" how they voted, people familiar with the calls said.

Mr. Trump discussed the U.N. resolution with Egyptian President Abdel Fattah Al Sisi on the day the vote was scheduled. The president-elect made it clear that putting the resolution to a vote would damage Egypt's standing with his administration, according to a diplomat briefed on the call.

Stunning diplomats, Egypt pulled the resolution at the last minute, saying it wanted to give the incoming administration a chance "to deal in a comprehensive way with the different aspects of the Palestinian issue." The co-sponsors of the text—New Zealand, Malaysia, Venezuela and Senegal—then stepped in to put the text forward for a vote the next day. "It was impossible to stop that vote," said one Security Council diplomat.

About two hours before the scheduled 3 p.m. vote on Dec. 23, 2016, Mr. Flynn called Malaysia's Permanent Mission to the U.N., according to a Malaysian official. The mission staff, aware of the likely reason for the call, refused to connect him to their representative, the official said.

As diplomats gathered in the Council chamber to vote, the cellphone of Uruguayan deputy ambassador Luis Bermudez rang, and it was Mr. Flynn, said a person familiar with the call. Mr. Flynn asked him to table the resolution, and the ambassador declined, the person said.

The resolution passed with 14 members of the Security Council voting in favor and the U.S. abstaining. Mr. Trump, in a Dec. 28, 2016, tweet condemning the result, wrote: "Stay strong Israel, January 20th is fast approaching!"

Senate Committee to Question Jared Kushner Over Meetings With Russians

By JO BECKER, MATTHEW ROSENBERG and MAGGIE HABERMAN MARCH 27, 2017 Senate investigators plan to question Jared Kushner, President Trump's son-in-law and a close adviser, as part of their broad inquiry into ties between Trump associates and Russian officials or others linked to the Kremlin, according to administration and congressional officials.

The White House Counsel's Office was informed this month that the Senate Intelligence Committee, which is investigating Russian interference in the 2016 presidential election, wanted to question Mr. Kushner about meetings he arranged with the Russian ambassador, Sergey I. Kislyak, according to the government officials. The meetings, which took place during the transition, included a previously unreported sit-down with the head of Russia's state-owned development bank.

Until now, the White House had acknowledged only an early December meeting between Mr. Kislyak and Mr. Kushner, which occurred at Trump Tower and was also attended by Michael T. Flynn, who would briefly serve as the national security adviser.

Later that month, though, Mr. Kislyak requested a second meeting, which Mr. Kushner asked a deputy to attend in his stead, officials said. At Mr. Kislyak's request, Mr. Kushner later met with Sergey N. Gorkov, the chief of Vnesheconombank, which the United States placed on its sanctions list after President Vladimir V. Putin of Russia annexed Crimea and began meddling in Ukraine.

A White House spokeswoman, Hope Hicks, confirmed those meetings, saying in an interview that nothing of consequence occurred and portraying them as routine diplomatic encounters that went nowhere. But Mr. Gorkov, who previously served as deputy chairman of the board at Sberbank, Russia's largest state-owned bank, said in a statement issued by his bank that he met with Mr. Kushner in his capacity as the then-chief executive of Kushner Companies, his family's sprawling real estate empire.

Members of presidential transition teams routinely meet with foreign officials, and there is nothing inherently improper about sitting down with the Russian ambassador. Part of Mr. Kushner's role during the campaign and the transition was to serve as a chief conduit to foreign governments and officials, and Ms. Hicks said he met with dozens of officials from a wide range of countries.

She added that Mr. Kushner was willing to talk to Senate investigators about the meetings with Mr. Kislyak and the banker, saying, "He isn't trying to hide anything and wants to be transparent."

Still, meetings between Trump associates and Russian officials or others linked to Mr. Putin are now of heightened interest as several congressional committees and F.B.I. investigators try to determine the scope of the Russian intervention in the election and links between Russians and anyone around Mr. Trump.

The Senate panel's decision to question Mr. Kushner would make him the closest person to the president to be called upon in any of the investigations, and the only one currently serving in the White House. The officials who initially described that Senate inquiry to The New York Times did so on the condition of anonymity in order to speak candidly about Mr. Trump's son-in-law.

The F.B.I. declined to comment. There are no indications that Mr. Kushner is a focus of its investigation, and Ms. Hicks said he had not been questioned by the bureau.

Mr. Kislyak's contacts with Trump administration officials have proved problematic: Mr. Flynn was fired for misleading Vice President Mike Pence about the nature of the conversations he had with the Russian envoy, claiming he had not

discussed the sanctions against Russia when communications intercepts showed he had.

Attorney General Jeff Sessions was forced to recuse himself from any Russian inquiries led by the Justice Department after he failed to disclose at his Senate confirmation hearing that he had met with Mr. Kislyak during the campaign.

The meetings Mr. Kushner arranged with Mr. Kislyak all took place in December, during the transition, Ms. Hicks said. Mr. Kushner attended the initial meeting with Mr. Kislyak to explore whether a channel could be set up between the Russian government and the incoming administration to improve relations between the United States and Russia, Ms. Hicks said. They also discussed how the United States and Russia could cooperate on issues in the Middle East, an area Mr. Kushner has been deputized to take the lead on, she said.

Mr. Kislyak asked for a second meeting to "deliver a message," Ms. Hicks said. Mr. Kushner sent Avrahm Berkowitz, a White House aide and longtime associate. At that session, Mr. Kislyak told Mr. Berkowitz that he wanted Mr. Kushner to meet Mr. Gorkov, the Russian banker, Ms. Hicks said.

Mr. Gorkov is a graduate of the academy of Federal Security Service of Russia, a training ground for Russian intelligence and security forces. And as the head of Vnesheconombank, Mr. Gorkov presides over a bank whose supervisory board is controlled by members of Mr. Putin's government, including Prime Minister Dimitri A. Medvedev. It has been used to bail out oligarchs favored by Mr. Putin, as well as to help fund pet projects like the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi.

Around the time the Russian ambassador asked that Mr. Kushner meet with Mr. Gorkov, American intelligence agencies were concluding that Russian spies, acting on the orders of Mr. Putin, had sought to sway the election by hacking political targets, like the Democratic National Committee, and passing stolen emails to WikiLeaks.

Mr. Kushner had not yet stepped aside as chief executive of Kushner Companies, which was trying to attract investment for the company's crown jewel, an overleveraged Manhattan office tower on Fifth Avenue. The company was in the midst of negotiations to redevelop the building with Anbang Insurance Group, a Chinese company with ties to the Beijing government.

Senate investigators plan to ask Mr. Kushner if he discussed ways to secure additional financing for the building during his meeting with the Russian banker, a government official said. Ms. Hicks said that no such business was discussed at the half-hour session, during which Mr. Gorkov expressed a desire for an open dialogue. Nor did the issue of the American sanctions against Russian entities like Vnesheconombank arise, she added. "It really wasn't much of a conversation," she said.

Mr. Gorkov, in the statement, went further. He said that bank managers, as part of a new strategy for the institution, met with international financial institutions in Europe, Asia and America to talk about promising trends and sectors. He also met with representatives of "business circles of the U.S., including with the head of Kushner Companies, Jared Kushner."

And in an interview on the state-owned Rossiya 24 TV channel on Dec. 29, the same month that he met with Mr. Kushner, Mr. Gorkov said he hoped that the situation caused by Ukraine sanctions imposed by the Americans against Russian banks like his "would change for the better."

The inquiry into Mr. Kushner's dealings with the ambassador and Mr. Gorkov may further complicate Mr. Trump's efforts to move past the Russia situation. Last week, the F.B.I. director, James B. Comey, confirmed in testimony to Congress that his agency had begun a counterintelligence investigation into Russian interference and whether any associates of the president might have colluded with the Russian government.

Mr. Trump's former campaign chairman, Paul Manafort, has been under scrutiny in the F.B.I. investigation because of his ties to pro-Russian politicians in Ukraine. In August, he was forced to step down as the chairman of Mr. Trump's campaign amid reports that his name emerged in a secret ledger in Ukraine listing off-the-books payments for consulting work he did for a Russian-backed government there. He has denied any wrongdoing and has said he never worked for the Russian government.

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Other Trump associates who have been drawn into the F.B.I. investigation include Roger J. Stone Jr., a longtime Republican operative who has acknowledged contacts with Guccifer 2.0, the mysterious online figure that is believed to be a front for Russian intelligence officials, and Carter Page, a former foreign policy adviser to the campaign who has done extensive business in Russia. Both have denied doing anything unlawful.

The Senate investigation is proceeding on a separate track from the F.B.I. investigation while drawing on some of the same material, like routine electronic surveillance of the Russian ambassador and his embassy cohort. The committee chairman, Senator Richard M. Burr, Republican of North Carolina, has told the White House he plans to interview all Trump aides who had contact with Russian officials, according to White House officials. Depending on those interviews, some may be called upon to testify in closed-door sessions.

Mr. Burr and Senator Mark Warner, a Virginia Democrat and the committee's vice chairman, said in a statement: "Mr. Kushner has volunteered to be interviewed as part of the committee's investigation into the Russian activities surrounding the 2016 election." They added that their inquiry would "follow the intelligence wherever it leads."

The extent of Mr. Kushner's interactions with Mr. Kislyak caught some senior members of Mr. Trump's White House team off guard, in part because he did not mention them last month during a debate then consuming the White House: how to handle the disclosures about Mr. Flynn's interactions with the Russian ambassador.

Ms. Hicks said that Mr. Trump had authorized Mr. Kushner to have meetings with foreign officials that he felt made sense, and to report back to him if those meetings produced anything of note. She said that because in Mr. Kushner's view the meetings were inconsequential, it did not occur to him to mention them to senior staff members earlier.

"There was nothing to get out in front of on this," she said.



U.S. senators grilled former Exxon CEO Rex Tillerson about his past dealings with Russia at his recent confirmation hearing to become secretary of state.

Sen. Marco Rubio, R-Fla., asked Tillerson whether he thought Vladimir Putin was a war criminal (Tillerson's answer: "I would not use that term"), while Sen. Bob Menendez, D-N.J., pressed him on Exxon opposing sanctions against Russia.

Senators have taken a hardline on Russia, both for its annexation of the Crimean Peninsula in Ukraine and its likely interference in the 2016 elections. Some, including Rubio, were keen supporters of economic sanctions against Russia in 2014.

At that time, Exxon, with Tillerson at the helm, had struck joint venture deals with the Russian petro giant Rosneft to explore for oil across the country. Exxon estimated its exposure on those deals at \$1 billion. Sanctions presented big problems for those investments.

At his confirmation hearing on Jan. 11, 2017, Tillerson rejected the assertion that he ever tried to scuttle sanctions.

"I have never lobbied against sanctions personally," Tillerson said. "To my knowledge, Exxon never directly lobbied against sanctions."

That's an artfully crafted answer that's pretty misleading

Government lobbying records show that in 2014 and 2015, Exxon paid the Nickles Group over \$193,000 to press "issues related to Russian sanctions impacting the energy sector," along with a number of other matters.

It paid another \$120,000 in 2014 and 2015 to Avenue Solutions for work on a range of issues, including "energy sanctions in the Ukraine and Russia."

In the same time frame, according to public logs, Tillerson visited the White House five times to see Jeffrey Zients, director of the National Economic Council. The meetings started about a week after President Barack Obama authorized the first of three rounds of sanctions. Bloomberg reported that Tillerson saw Treasury Secretary Jack Lew seven times in the second half of 2014. The Treasury Department oversees how sanctions are carried out.

That seems to directly contradict Tillerson's statement, but Exxon spokesman Alan Jeffers told us it didn't.

"Exxon Mobil regularly engages with lawmakers and others to discuss the potential impact of sanctions and to express our view that sanctions should treat American companies fairly," Jeffers said. "We do not express an opinion as to whether or not sanctions should be imposed; that is a decision for policy makers."

But at Exxon's May 2014 shareholder meeting, Tillerson offered a more negative take on sanctions overall. He told reporters that sanctions are "imprecise and ineffective." and that "our views are being heard at the highest levels," he said, according to the Associated Press.

Oil industry experts told us it's hard to believe that Exxon wouldn't have opposed the sanctions.

Tadeusz Patzek is a professor and petroleum industry analyst at King Abdullah University of Science and Technology in Saudi Arabia. Patzek thinks Tillerson is a good choice for secretary of state, but he also said Exxon's interests in Russia were quite clear.

"Russia is the last global frontier with big untapped oil resources that could be made available to Exxon," Patzek said. "From this point of view, Exxon must have viewed the sanctions as unhelpful to the corporation."

Tim LaPira, a political scientist who studies lobbying at James Madison University, told us Tillerson's claim is "implausible."

"The message of what sanctions would do would necessarily communicate that they were taking a clear position against them," LaPira said. "If Exxon Mobil hired expensive lobbyists to communicate about sanctions, but not the corporation's position against them, then it seems to me they used shareholders' money to accomplish exactly nothing."

Government ethics advocate Jordan Libowitz with Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington said, "I doubt they would lobby for a bill that essentially cost them \$1 billion."

Our ruling

Tillerson said that he never lobbied against sanctions that targeted the Russian energy industry, nor to his knowledge had Exxon. But lobbying records show Exxon spent over \$300,000 to argue its case on sanctions. Visitor records for the White House and the Treasury Department show Tillerson was a visitor when sanctions were being considered.

An Exxon spokesperson said the company simply offered information on sanctions. But in 2014 Tillerson told reporters that he thought sanctions generally were ineffective and that he had let top government officials know what he thought of them.

We rate this claim Mostly False.

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Why Has America Lost its Friends and Allies?

The Chessboard is Changing!

Each day as I watch the news reports of recent events from across the globe, I wonder, "Who are America's friends anymore?" Try as I might, I can no longer readily identify them. It seems our longtime friends and allies are in retreat. And I am forced to ask myself, "How many of us are aware of this and have noticed that it's happening?" Having visited the Middle East (Turkey, Syria, and Egypt) and Europe several times during the current administration's two terms of office, I witnessed unquestionable signs of the downward spiral in US credibility and respect. Those who counted on us for friendship and support in tackling world problems and threats – and who we counted on as well in return – are now nervous, skeptical and afraid.

For example, the Egyptians could not understand why, after so many decades of friendship, an American administration would spurn their civil uprising against the Muslim Brotherhood. They cannot understand why an American administration would have shut off US military modernization assistance at such a critical time in the Middle East.

Any special relationships garnered since World War II appear to have either disappeared or are certainly in decline. Clearly, confidence in us as the world's foremost leader has dissipated due to this administration's choice to cast aside allies and marginalize friends, despite our enemies becoming more numerous.

The international chessboard is clearly changing but not for the benefit of America.

Why is this so? For me, there can be no question, it is the direct result of Progressive Socialism, which has permeated both our governing parties. The harsh truth is we do not have competent senior government officials. Our current lot are, sadly, only amateurs at handling foreign relations and our national security. We cannot permit the current leaders in the White House and halls of Congress to continue in their efforts to push us down the read of progressivism leading to the ultimate destruction of the America we have known and love. We cannot continue to allow our national prestige and honor to be decimated at home and abroad. We must commit ourselves to creating the solution.

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

FBI supervisor removed from Special Counsel's Office had interviewed Michael Flynn

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A supervisory special agent who is now under scrutiny after being removed from Robert Mueller's Special Counsel's Office for alleged bias against President Trump also oversaw the bureau's interviews of embattled former National Security advisor Michael Flynn, this reporter has learned. Flynn recently pled guilty to one-count of lying to the FBI last week.

FBI agent Peter Strzok was one of two FBI agents who interviewed Flynn, which took place on Jan. 24, at the White House, said several sources. The other FBI special agent, who interviewed Flynn, is described by sources as a field supervisor in the "Russian Squad, at the FBI's Washington Field Office," according to a former intelligence official, with knowledge of the interview.

"The most logical thing to happen would be to call the other FBI Special Agent present during Flynn's interview before the Grand Jury to recount his version," said a former U.S. Intelligence Official, with knowledge of the interview.

Strzok was removed from his role in the Special Counsel's Office after it was discovered he had made disparaging comments about President Trump in text messages between him and his alleged lover FBI attorney Lisa Page, according to the New York Times and Washington Post, which first reported the stories. Strzok is also under investigation by the Department of Justice Inspector General for his role in Hillary Clinton's email server and the ongoing investigation into Russia's election meddling. On Saturday, the House Intelligence Committee's Chairman Devin Nunes chided the Justice Department and the FBI for not disclosing why Strzok had been removed from the Special Counsel three months ago, according to a statement given by the Chairman.

The former U.S. intelligence official told this reporter, "with the recent revelation that Strzok was removed from the Special Counsel investigation for making anti-Trump text messages it seems likely that the accuracy and veracity of the 302 of Flynn's interview as a whole should be reviewed and called into question."

"The most logical thing to happen would be to call the other FBI Special Agent present during Flynn's interview before the Grand Jury to recount his version," the former intelligence official added.

The former official also said that "Strzok's allegiance to (Deputy Director Andrew) McCabe was unwavering and very well known."

Flynn, a retired three-star general, issued a statement on Dec. I, saying, "it has been extraordinarily painful to endure these many months of false accusations of "treason" and other outrageous acts. Such false accusations are contrary to everything I have ever done and stood for. But I recognize that the actions I acknowledged in court today were wrong, and, through my faith in God, I am working to set things right."

According to another source, with direct knowledge of the Jan. 24 interview, McCabe had contacted Flynn by phone directly at the White House. White House officials had spent the "earlier part of the week with the FBI overseeing training and security measures associated with their new roles so it was no surprise to Flynn that McCabe had called," the source said.

McCabe told Flynn "some agents were heading over (to the White House) but Flynn thought it was part of the routine work the FBI had been doing and said they would be cleared at the gate," the source said.

"It wasn't until after they were already in (Flynn's) office that he realized he was being formally interviewed. He didn't have an attorney with him," they added.

Flynn's attorney Robert Kelner did not respond for comment.

A former senior Trump administration official, however, described Strzok as one of the "best agents in the bureau. And has now become the latest victim in the Russia investigation."

"He was the top counterintelligence agent and an asset to the bureau and America," said the official, who disputed that Strozk would let his political leanings influence his work, despite the alleged anti-Trump text messages his sent Page.

FBI spokeswoman Carol Cratty could not be immediately reached for comment. Strzok could also not be reached for comment.

A former FBI agent said the investigation into Strzok and the reported text messages between him and Page, shows a "bias that cannot be ignored particularly if he had anything to do with Flynn's interview and his role in it."

The former U.S. intelligence official questioned, "how logical is it that Flynn is being charged for lying to an agent whose character and neutrality was called into question by the Special Counsel."

According to an anonymous source in The Washington Post, Strzok's and Page had exchanged a number of texts that "expressed anti-Trump sentiments and other comments that appeared to favor Clinton."

Nunes said Saturday that the mistress of Strzok, who was the top FBI official assigned to Mueller's Special Counsel, was an FBI lawyer working for FBI Deputy Director McCabe.

The FBI and Justice Department have "failed to sufficiently cooperate with the Committee's August 24 subpoena, and have specifically refused repeated demands from the House Intelligence Committee for an explanation of Pete Strzok's dismissal from the Mueller probe," Nunes said.

"We now know why Strzok was dismissed, why the FBI and DOJ refused to provide us this explanation, and at least one reason why they previously refused to make Deputy Director McCabe available to the Committee for an interview," the chairman added.

Justice Department spokewoman Sarah Isgur Flores said, "we disagree with the Chairman's characterization and will continue to work with congressional committees to provide the information they request consistent with our national security responsibilities."

Isgur Flores said in a written statement to this reporter that the Justice Department provided the House Intelligence committee and leadership with "several hundred pages of classified documents and multiple briefings—including for example clear answers as to whether any FBI payments were made to a source in question related to the dossier—and has more recently cleared key witnesses they have requested to testify, including Mr. McCabe, Mr. Strzok, and the alleged handler in question."

But Nunes said, "by hiding from Congress, and from the American people, documented political bias by a key FBI head investigator for both the Russia collusion probe and the Clinton email investigation, the FBI and DOJ engaged in a willful attempt to thwart Congress' constitutional oversight responsibility."

He added "this is part of a months-long pattern by the DOJ and FBI of stonewalling and obstructing this Committee's oversight work, particularly oversight of their use of the Steele dossier. At this point, these agencies should be investigating themselves."

Nunes instructed the House Intelligence Committee staff on Saturday "to begin drawing up a contempt of Congress resolution for DOJ Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein and FBI Director Christopher Wray. Unless all our outstanding demands are fully met by close of business on Monday, December 4, 2017, the committee will have the opportunity to move this resolution before the end of the month."

A source familiar with the chairman's request said Nunes knows the answers to "whether the FBI paid for dossier, whether the dossier launched investigation, and whether the dossier was used as a basis for FISA applications."

MUELLER MADNESS: Special Counsel Hands Over All 'EVIDENCE' On Mike Flynn

What's next for the embattled former national security advisor?

The Office of Special Counsel complied with a federal judge's order and as a result turned over all evidence related to former National Security Advisor Lt. Gen. Michael Flynn's case, according to two sources who spoke to this reporter.

In December, Judge Emmet G. Sullivan ordered Special Counsel Robert Mueller to provide Flynn's attorneys with any and all information that may have been withheld from the case. Sullivan took over as the presiding judge after District of Columbia Judge Rudolph Contreras was recused from the case on Dec. 7. There was no explanation as to why Contreras, who presided over Flynn's guilty plea on Dec. 3, was recused from the case. Flynn pled guilty to one count of lying to the FBI, despite testimony provided to Congress by former FBI Director James Comey, where he stated that the agents did not believe Flynn had lied about his conversation with former Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak in December 2016.

Sullivan ordered the government to produce any evidence in its possession that is "favorable to defendant and material either to defendant's guilt or punishment."

"The government is further directed to produce all discoverable evidence in a readily usable form," the order stated. "For example, the government must produce documents as they are kept in the usual course of business or must organize and label them clearly."

In a column appearing in National Review, former Assistant US Attorney for the Southern District of New York Andrew McCarthy speculated that the judge may have been concerned that favorable evidence was withheld in the case.

Contreras' recusal raised suspicion among lawmakers that have been investigating the FBI's handling of the Russia investigation for the past year. Last week, however, Congressional investigators with the House Oversight Committee discovered a series of text messages between embattled FBI Special Agent Peter Strzok and his paramour FBI attorney Lisa Page

revealing that Contreras and Strzok were close friends, as previously reported. Strzok was also one of two FBI agents who had originally interviewed Flynn.

"It wasn't a definitive answer but certainly raises significant questions," Rep. Jim Jordan (R-OH) of the House Oversight Committee, told this reporter last week.

text message chain uncovered by investigators is telling. In one particular chain of messages sent on July 25, 2016, Page tells Strzok, "Rudy is on the FISC! Did you know that? Just appointed two months ago."

At that point, the pair continues to discuss other issues but comes back to Contreras. "I did. We talked about it before and after. I need to get together with him." Later, Strzok appears to return to his discussion about Contreras, as reported last week.

Lawmakers cautioned that while the text messages show Contreras and Strzok were friends, there is still no definitive answer on why the judge was recused from the case.

Strzok, who was at the center of the investigation alleging Trump colluded with Russia, was removed from the Special Counsel and demoted in the FBI after tens of thousands of text messages revealed he was vehemently biased against Trump.

Sullivan's request for Mueller to turn over all evidence came after the plea, and the judge noted that even if Mueller believed the information was not "material" to the case, it would be up to Sullivan to decide whether or not to disclose the information to Flynn's attorney.

The implications that possible exculpatory evidence was withheld by Mueller's office would be a significant development for Flynn.

In January, Mueller and Flynn's lawyers filed a joint status report with the court stating that they were not ready to move forward with a sentencing hearing. The court filing stated that "due to the status of the Special Counsel's investigation, the parties do not believe that this matter is ready to be scheduled for a sentencing hearing at this time."

It's not certain what Flynn's next steps will be but one option being discussed by attorneys, pundits and supporters is that he withdraw his guilty plea before sentencing.

RUSSIA AND THE U.S. NATIONAL INTEREST

BOTTOM LINE UP FRONT:

- RUSSIA REPRESENTS AN INDIRECT THREAT TO AMERICA
- PUTIN HAS TURNED RUSSIA IN A CRIMINAL ENTERPRISE THAN THREATENS STABILITY IN EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST
- THE ONLY THING PUTIN UNDERSTANDS IS FORCE. OR THE DETERMINED SHOW OF FORCE

FACTS:

Russia is in demographic and economic tailspin. The Orthodox Christian population is not reproducing at the required replacement rate of 2.1 live births per female and the fall in value of the ruble and lower oil prices are severely hurting the Russian economy.

Putin must expand his territory in order to access new population centers for labor and to intimidate neighbors into his economic fold. By invading Ukraine he violently broke the post-WWII international taboo of redrawing borders through force.

Putin will not stop there and is actively undermining the independence of other neighboring states to include the Baltic nations. (For the figures on how the Russian military dwarfs its neighbors see chart at end of memo).

At over a \$90 BILLION, the Russia Defense budget has more than doubled in the last decade and is **third highest in the world** after the U.S. and China.

Since the invasion of Crimea, Russia has taken a very aggressive stance in various regions of the world by:

US Must Cooperate With Russia, Arabs to Defeat ISIL - Retired US Intel Head The United States must work with Russia and cooperate with Arab countries to defeat ISIL, retired DIA (Defense Intelligence Agency) chief Michael Flynn told the German weekly news magazine Der Spiegel in an interview.

"Our message must be that we want to help and that we will leave once the problems have been solved. The Arab nations must be on our side. And if we catch them, Kuwait for example, financing, if they funnel money to IS, that's when sanctions and other actions have to kick in," Flynn said.

ISIL when it was part of the rebel coalition, prior to its break-off from al-Qaeda and development into an independent entity.

According to Flynn, Russia must be considered a factor in the Syrian crisis, although he said it would have to pressure Iran to back out of its military efforts in Syria and other countries.

"We have to work constructively with Russia. Whether we like it or not, Russia made a decision to be there (in Syria) and to act militarily. They are there, and this has dramatically changed the dynamic. So you can't say Russia is bad, they have to go home. It's not going to happen. Get real," Flynn told Der Spiegel.

Flynn also noted that the decreased willingness of the US to engage in combat has led its ally France to seek help from Russia.

"Look at what happened in the past few days: The president of France asked the US for help militarily (after the Paris attacks). That's really weird to me, as an American. We should have been there first and offered support. Now he is flying to Moscow and asking Putin for help," Flynn added.

Syrian Army Gains Upper Hand in Fight Against ISIL in AleppoFlynn also criticized the idea of targeting terrorism geographically, asking "where" the terror came from rather than "why,"

"We were too dumb. We didn't understand who we had there at that moment. When 9/11 occurred, all the emotions took over, and our response was, 'Where did those bastards come from? Let's go kill them. Let's go get them,'" Flynn said.

He added that he regrets the US overthrow of Saddam Hussein, calling the overthrow of both Hussein and Muammar Gadhafi strategic failures, which led to the rise of ISIL.



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International relations have entered a very difficult period, and Russia once again finds itself at the crossroads of key trends that determine the vector of future global development.

Many different opinions have been expressed in this connection including the fear that we have a distorted view of the international situation and Russia's international standing. I perceive this as an echo of the eternal dispute between pro-Western liberals and the advocates of Russia's unique path. There are also those, both in Russia and outside of it, who believe that Russia is doomed to drag behind, trying to catch up with the West and forced to bend to other players' rules, and hence will be unable to claim its rightful place in international affairs. I'd like to use this opportunity to express some of my views and to back them with examples from history and historical parallels.

It is an established fact that a substantiated policy is impossible without reliance on history. This reference to history is absolutely justified, especially considering recent celebrations. In 2015, we celebrated the 70th anniversary of Victory in WWII, and in 2014, we marked a century since the start of WWI. In 2012, we marked 200 years of the Battle of Borodino and 400 years of Moscow's liberation from the Polish invaders. If we look at these events carefully, we'll see that they clearly point to Russia's special role in European and global history.

History doesn't confirm the widespread belief that Russia has always camped in Europe's backyard and has been Europe's political outsider. I'd like to remind you that the adoption of Christianity in Russia in 988 - we marked 1025 years of that event quite recently - boosted the development of state institutions, social relations and culture and eventually made Kievan Rus a full member of the European community. At that time, dynastic marriages were the best gauge of a country's role in the system of international relations. In the 11th century, three daughters of Grand Prince Yaroslav the Wise became the queens of Norway and Denmark, Hungary and France. Yaroslav's sister married the Polish king and granddaughter the German emperor.

Numerous scientific investigations bear witness to the high cultural and spiritual level of Rus of those days, a level that was frequently higher than in western European states. Many prominent Western thinkers recognized that Rus was part of the European context. At the same time, Russian people possessed a cultural matrix of their own and an original type of spirituality and never merged with the West. It is instructive to recall in this connection what was for my people a tragic and in many respects critical epoch of the Mongolian invasion. The great Russian poet and writer Alexander Pushkin wrote: "The barbarians did not dare to leave an enslaved Rus in their rear and returned to their Eastern steppes. Christian enlightenment was saved by a ravaged and dying Russia." We also know an alternative view offered by prominent historian and ethnologist Lev Gumilyov, who believed that the Mongolian invasion had prompted the emergence of a new Russian ethnos and that the Great Steppe had given us an additional impetus for development.

However that may be, it is clear that the said period was extremely important for the assertion of the Russian State's independent role in Eurasia. Let us recall in this connection the policy pursued by Grand Prince Alexander Nevsky, who opted to temporarily submit to Golden Horde rulers, who were tolerant of Christianity, in order to uphold the Russians' right to have a faith of their own and to decide their fate, despite the European West's attempts to put Russian lands under full control and to deprive Russians of their identity. I am confident that this wise and forward-looking policy is in our genes. Rus bent under but was not broken by the heavy Mongolian yoke, and managed to emerge from this dire trial as a single state, which was later regarded by both the West and the East as the successor to the Byzantine Empire that ceased to exist in 1453. An imposing country stretching along what was practically the entire eastern perimeter of Europe, Russia began a natural expansion towards the Urals and Siberia, absorbing their huge territories. Already then it was a powerful balancing factor in European political combinations, including the well-known Thirty Years' War that gave birth to the Westphalian system of international relations, whose principles, primarily respect for state sovereignty, are of importance even today.

At this point we are approaching a dilemma that has been evident for several centuries. While the rapidly developing Moscow state naturally played an increasing role in European affairs, the European countries had apprehensions about the nascent giant in the East and tried to isolate it whenever possible and prevent it from taking part in Europe's most important affairs.

The seeming contradiction between the traditional social order and a striving for modernisation based

on the most advanced experience also dates back centuries. In reality, a rapidly developing state is bound to try and make a leap forward, relying on modern technology, which does not necessarily imply the renunciation of its "cultural code." There are many examples of Eastern societies modernising without the radical breakdown of their traditions. This is all the more typical of Russia that is essentially a branch of European civilisation.

Incidentally, the need for modernisation based on European achievements was clearly manifest in Russian society under Tsar Alexis, while talented and ambitious Peter the Great gave it a strong boost. Relying on tough domestic measures and resolute, and successful, foreign policy, Peter the Great managed to put Russia into the category of Europe's leading countries in a little over two decades. Since that time Russia's position could no longer be ignored. Not a single European issue can be resolved without Russia's opinion.

It wouldn't be accurate to assume that everyone was happy about this state of affairs. Repeated attempts to return this country into the pre-Peter times were made over subsequent centuries but failed. In the middle 18th century Russia played a key role in a pan-European conflict - the Seven Years' War. At that time, Russian troops made a triumphal entry into Berlin, the capital of Prussia under Frederick II who had a reputation for invincibility. Prussia was saved from an inevitable rout only because Empress Elizabeth died a sudden death and was succeeded by Peter III who sympathised with Frederick II. This turn in German history is still referred to as the Miracle of the House of Brandenburg. Russia's size, power and influence grew substantially under Catherine the Great when, as then Chancellor Alexander Bezborodko put it, "Not a single cannon in Europe could be fired without our consent."

I'd like to quote the opinion of a reputable researcher of Russian history, Hélène Carrère d'Encausse, the permanent secretary of the French Academy. She said the Russian Empire was the greatest empire of all times in the totality of all parameters - its size, an ability to administer its territories and the longevity of its existence. Following Russian philosopher Nikolai Berdyayev, she insists that history has imbued Russia with the mission of being a link between the East and the West.

During at least the past two centuries any attempts to unite Europe without Russia and against it have inevitably led to grim tragedies, the consequences of which were always overcome with the decisive participation of our country. I'm referring, in part, to the Napoleonic wars upon the completion of which Russia rescued the system of international relations that was based on the balance of forces and mutual consideration for national interests and ruled out the total dominance of one state in Europe. We remember that Emperor Alexander I took an active role in the drafting of decisions of the 1815 Vienna Congress that ensured the development of Europe without serious armed clashes during the subsequent 40 years.

Incidentally, to a certain extent the ideas of Alexander I could be described as a prototype of the concept on subordinating national interests to common goals, primarily, the maintenance of peace and order in Europe. As the Russian emperor said, "there can be no more English, French, Russian or Austrian policy. There can be only one policy - a common policy that must be accepted by both peoples and sovereigns for common happiness."

By the same token, the Vienna system was destroyed in the wake of the desire to marginalise Russia in European affairs. Paris was obsessed with this idea during the reign of Emperor Napoleon III. In his attempt to forge an anti-Russian alliance, the French monarch was willing, as a hapless chess grandmaster, to sacrifice all the other figures. How did it play out? Indeed, Russia was defeated in the Crimean War of 1853-1856, the consequences of which it managed to overcome soon due to a consistent and far-sighted policy pursued by Chancellor Alexander Gorchakov. As for Napoleon III, he ended his rule in German captivity, and the nightmare of the Franco-German confrontation loomed over Western Europe for decades.

Here is another Crimean War-related episode. As we know, the Austrian Emperor refused to help Russia, which, a few years earlier, in 1849, had come to his help during the Hungarian revolt. Then Austrian Foreign Minister Felix Schwarzenberg famously said: "Europe would be astonished by the extent of Austria's ingratitude." In general, the imbalance of pan-European mechanisms triggered a chain of events that led to the First World War.

Notably, back then Russian diplomacy also advanced ideas that were ahead of their time. The Hague Peace conferences of 1899 and 1907, convened at the initiative of Emperor Nicholas II, were the first attempts to agree on curbing the arms race and stopping preparations for a devastating war. But not many people know about it.

The First World War claimed lives and caused the suffering of countless millions of people and led to

the collapse of four empires. In this connection, it is appropriate to recall yet another anniversary, which will be marked next year - the 100th anniversary of the Russian Revolution. Today we are faced with the need to develop a balanced and objective assessment of those events, especially in an environment where, particularly in the West, many are willing to use this date to mount even more information attacks on Russia, and to portray the 1917 Revolution as a barbaric coup that dragged down all of European history. Even worse, they want to equate the Soviet regime to Nazism, and partially blame it for starting WWII.

Without a doubt, the Revolution of 1917 and the ensuing Civil War were a terrible tragedy for our nation. However, all other revolutions were tragic as well. This does not prevent our French colleagues from extolling their upheaval, which, in addition to the slogans of liberty, equality and fraternity, also involved the use of the guillotine, and rivers of blood.

Undoubtedly, the Russian Revolution was a major event which impacted world history in many controversial ways. It has become regarded as a kind of experiment in implementing socialist ideas, which were then widely spread across Europe. The people supported them, because wide masses gravitated towards social organisation with reliance on the collective and community principles. Serious researchers clearly see the impact of reforms in the Soviet Union on the formation of the so-called welfare state in Western Europe in the post-WWII period. European governments decided to introduce unprecedented measures of social protection under the influence of the example of the Soviet Union in an effort to cut the ground from under the feet of the left-wing political forces.

One can say that the 40 years following World War II were a surprisingly good time for Western Europe, which was spared the need to make its own major decisions under the umbrella of the US-Soviet confrontation and enjoyed unique opportunities for steady development.

In these circumstances, Western European countries have implemented several ideas regarding conversion of the capitalist and socialist models, which, as a preferred form of socioeconomic progress, were promoted by Pitirim Sorokin and other outstanding thinkers of the 20th century. Over the past 20 years, we have been witnessing the reverse process in Europe and the United States: the reduction of the middle class, increased social inequality, and the dismantling of controls over big business.

The role which the Soviet Union played in decolonisation, and promoting international relations principles, such as the independent development of nations and their right to self-determination, is undeniable.

I will not dwell on the points related to Europe slipping into WWII. Clearly, the anti-Russian aspirations of the European elites, and their desire to unleash Hitler's war machine on the Soviet Union played their fatal part here. Redressing the situation after this terrible disaster involved the participation of our country as a key partner in determining the parameters of the European and the world order. In this context, the notion of the "clash of two totalitarianisms," which is now actively inculcated in European minds, including at schools, is groundless and immoral. The Soviet Union, for all its evils, never aimed to destroy entire nations. Winston Churchill, who all his life was a principled opponent of the Soviet Union and played a major role in going from the WWII alliance to a new confrontation with the Soviet Union, said that graciousness, i.e. life in accordance with conscience, is the Russian way of doing things.

If you take an unbiased look at the smaller European countries, which previously were part of the Warsaw Treaty, and are now members of the EU or NATO, it is clear that the issue was not about going from subjugation to freedom, which Western masterminds like to talk about, but rather a change of leadership. Russian President Vladimir Putin spoke about it not long ago. The representatives of these countries concede behind closed doors that they can't take any significant decision without the green light from Washington or Brussels.

It seems that in the context of the 100th anniversary of the Russian Revolution, it is important for us to understand the continuity of Russian history, which should include all of its periods without exception, and the importance of the synthesis of all the positive traditions and historical experience as the basis for making dynamic advances and upholding the rightful role of our country as a leading centre of the modern world, and a provider of the values of sustainable development, security and stability. The post-war world order relied on confrontation between two world systems and was far from ideal, yet it was sufficient to preserve international peace and to avoid the worst possible temptation - the use of weapons of mass destruction, primarily nuclear weapons. There is no substance behind the popular belief that the Soviet Union's dissolution signified Western victory in the Cold War. It was the result of

These developments resulted in a truly tectonic shift in the international landscape. In fact, they changed global politics altogether, considering that the end of the Cold War and related ideological confrontation offered a unique opportunity to change the European architecture on the principles of indivisible and equal security and broad cooperation without dividing lines.

We had a practical chance to mend Europe's divide and implement the dream of a common European home, which many European thinkers and politicians, including President Charles de Gaulle of France, wholeheartedly embraced. Russia was fully open to this option and advanced many proposals and initiatives in this connection. Logically, we should have created a new foundation for European security by strengthening the military and political components of the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE). Vladimir Putin said in a recentinterview with the German newspaper Bild that German politician Egon Bahr proposed similar approaches.

Unfortunately, our Western partners chose differently. They opted to expand NATO eastward and to advance the geopolitical space they controlled closer to the Russian border. This is the essence of the systemic problems that have soured Russia's relations with the United States and the European Union. It is notable that George Kennan, the architect of the US policy of containment of the Soviet Union, said in his winter years that the ratification of NATO expansion was "a tragic mistake."

The underlying problem of this Western policy is that it disregarded the global context. The current globalised world is based on an unprecedented interconnection between countries, and so it's impossible to develop relations between Russia and the EU as if they remained at the core of global politics as during the Cold War. We must take note of the powerful processes that are underway in Asia Pacific, the Middle East, Africa and Latin America.

Rapid changes in all areas of international life is the primary sign of the current stage. Indicatively, they often take an unexpected turn. Thus, the concept of "the end of history" developed by well-known US sociologist and political researcher Francis Fukuyama, that was popular in the 1990s, has become clearly inconsistent today. According to this concept, rapid globalisation signals the ultimate victory of the liberal capitalist model, whereas all other models should adapt to it under the guidance of the wise Western teachers.

In reality, the second wave of globalisation (the first occurred before World War I) led to the dispersal of global economic might and, hence, of political influence, and to the emergence of new and large centres of power, primarily in the Asia-Pacific Region. China's rapid upsurge is the clearest example. Owing to unprecedented economic growth rates, in just three decades it became the second and, calculated as per purchasing power parity, the first economy in the world. This example illustrates an axiomatic fact - there are many development models- which rules out the monotony of existence within the uniform, Western frame of reference.

Consequently, there has been a relative reduction in the influence of the so-called "historical West" that was used to seeing itself as the master of the human race's destinies for almost five centuries. The competition on the shaping of the world order in the 21st century has toughened. The transition from the Cold War to a new international system proved to be much longer and more painful than it seemed 20-25 years ago.

Against this backdrop, one of the basic issues in international affairs is the form that is being acquired by this generally natural competition between the world's leading powers. We see how the United States and the US-led Western alliance are trying to preserve their dominant positions by any available method or, to use the American lexicon, ensure their "global leadership". Many diverse ways of exerting pressure, economic sanctions and even direct armed intervention are being used. Large-scale information wars are being waged. Technology of unconstitutional change of governments by launching "colour" revolutions has been tried and tested. Importantly, democratic revolutions appear to be destructive for the nations targeted by such actions. Our country that went through a historical period of encouraging artificial transformations abroad, firmly proceeds from the preference of evolutionary changes that should be carried out in the forms and at a speed that conform to the traditions of a society and its level of development.

Western propaganda habitually accuses Russia of "revisionism," and the alleged desire to destroy the established international system, as if it was us who bombed Yugoslavia in 1999 in violation of the UN Charter and the Helsinki Final Act, as if it was Russia that ignored international law by invading Iraq in 2003 and distorted UN Security Council resolutions by overthrowing Muammar Gaddafi's regime by force in Libya in 2011. There are many examples.

This discourse about "revisionism" does not hold water. It is based on the simple and even primitive

logic that only Washington can set the tune in world affairs. In line with this logic, the principle once formulated by George Orwell and moved to the international level, sounds like the following: all states are equal but some states are more equal than others. However, today international relations are too sophisticated a mechanism to be controlled from one centre. This is obvious given the results of US interference: There is virtually no state in Libya; Iraq is balancing on the brink of disintegration, and so on and so forth.

A reliable solution to the problems of the modern world can only be achieved through serious and honest cooperation between the leading states and their associations in order to address common challenges. Such an interaction should include all the colours of the modern world, and be based on its cultural and civilisational diversity, as well as reflect the interests of the international community's key components.

We know from experience that when these principles are applied in practice, it is possible to achieve specific and tangible results, such as the agreement on the Iranian nuclear programme, the elimination of Syrian chemical weapons, the agreement on stopping hostilities in Syria, and the development of the basic parameters of the global climate agreement. This shows the need to restore the culture of compromise, the reliance on the diplomatic work, which can be difficult, even exhausting, but which remains, in essence, the only way to ensure a mutually acceptable solution to problems by peaceful means

Our approaches are shared by most countries of the world, including our Chinese partners, other BRICS and SCO nations, and our friends in the EAEU, the CSTO, and the CIS. In other words, we can say that Russia is fighting not against someone, but for the resolution of all the issues on an equal and mutually respectful basis, which alone can serve as a reliable foundation for a long-term improvement of international relations.

Our most important task is to join our efforts against not some far-fetched, but very real challenges, among which the terrorist aggression is the most pressing one. The extremists from ISIS, Jabhat an-Nusra and the like managed for the first time to establish control over large territories in Syria and Iraq. They are trying to extend their influence to other countries and regions, and are committing acts of terrorism around the world. Underestimating this risk is nothing short of criminal shortsightedness. The Russian President called for forming a broad-based front in order to defeat the terrorists militarily. The Russian Aerospace Forces make an important contribution to this effort. At the same time, we are working hard to establish collective actions regarding the political settlement of the conflicts in this crisis -ridden region.

Importantly, the long-term success can only be achieved on the basis of movement to the partnership of civilisations based on respectful interaction of diverse cultures and religions. We believe that human solidarity must have a moral basis formed by traditional values that are largely shared by the world's leading religions. In this connection, I would like to draw your attention to the joint statement by Patriarch Kirill and Pope Francis, in which, among other things, they have expressed support for the family as a natural centre of life of individuals and society.

I repeat, we are not seeking confrontation with the United States, or the European Union, or NATO. On the contrary, Russia is open to the widest possible cooperation with its Western partners. We continue to believe that the best way to ensure the interests of the peoples living in Europe is to form a common economic and humanitarian space from the Atlantic to the Pacific, so that the newly formed Eurasian Economic Union could be an integrating link between Europe and Asia Pacific. We strive to do our best to overcome obstacles on that way, including the settlement of the Ukraine crisis caused by the coup in Kiev in February 2014, on the basis of the Minsk Agreements.

I'd like to quote wise and politically experienced Henry Kissinger, who, speaking recently in Moscow, said that "Russia should be perceived as an essential element of any new global equilibrium, not primarily as a threat to the United States... I am here to argue for the possibility of a dialogue that seeks to merge our futures rather than elaborate our conflicts. This requires respect by both sides of the vital values and interest of the other." We share such an approach. And we will continue to defend the principles of law and justice in international affairs.

Speaking about Russia's role in the world as a great power, Russian philosopher Ivan Ilyin said that the greatness of a country is not determined by the size of its territory or the number of its inhabitants, but by the capacity of its people and its government to take on the burden of great world problems and to deal with these problems in a creative manner. A great power is the one which, asserting its existence and its interest ... introduces a creative and meaningful legal idea to the entire assembly of the nations,

the entire "concert" of the peoples and states. It is difficult to disagree with these words.

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American foreign policy is in a state of confusion and disarray. A central reason is this administration's attempted solutions to international problems is not reality based. The world is complex beyond imagining. A good leader must bring insights and instincts that are right for the time that can be understood by those who would serve him, and which can be understood by friend and foe alike. This is much harder than many think. Hillary Clinton has an amalgam of views that her record demonstrates cannot result in sound policy. Indeed, she was, as Secretary of State, the primary policy official for the first four years of the Obama Administration.

I recognize that one of the most important duties I will have as President is to reestablish a diplomatic and military policy that serves the interests of our people. We must restore our credibility. But, that can only be done if our policies and actions are consistent, understandable, and predictable. The world must know there are areas of compromise and mutual accord and matters on which we will fight. I know well that rashness, weakness, and fuzzy thinking cannot be tolerated. The enormous military power of this nation, and the blood of our magnificent military personnel can only be deployed when there is no other solution. I will not be a quick trigger president like my opponents. Our friends and enemies must know that if unleashed, we have a plan for victory. This will require expert analysis from the country's best, most experienced people. I will call on these leaders because their work will be central to success. It will be my goal to establish a foreign policy so sound and so wise that it will endure for several generations.

When I am President, no one will doubt that I will be willing to use military force, but they need not fear reckless action. When I am President, make no mistake - I know there is much I do not know. Yet, my life experiences give me valuable insight that exceeds those of my young, inexperienced and ambitious opponents. A fair evaluation of the positions I have taken on specific issues reveals my approach to military and diplomatic issues. The foundation principles will be realism, strength, and caution. I am far more realistic and cautious than my opponents who always have a quick sound bite answer for everything. Over the long period of my campaign, I have taken positions that reflect these views. Here are some of them:

- 1. I have made it clear that I deeply understand the threat of ISIS and other terrorists and my dedicated commitment to its destruction.
- 2. As a private citizen, I opposed the invasion of Iraq. I thought this was unnecessary and carried too many dangers. History has proven my caution correct.
- 3. I have condemned the attack on Libya. It did not involve core American interests and has resulted in even more chaos and instability. The disorder has created a space for ISIS and a humanitarian disaster.

- 4. Although I have strongly opposed the Iran Nuclear Deal, which the President unwisely signed along with many allied nations, I tend to believe there would be large and adverse implications for just tearing it up my first day in office as my opponents suggest. Iran will already have had access to the billions of dollars that the sanctions had tied up. There are no easy solutions to deal with this problem. As I have said, I will watch Iran intensely to determine if they violate the agreement. With my election, Iran will know they will not be able to play games with me. They will suffer a fearful cost if they violate this agreement.
- 5. I am the only candidate who is willing to state the obvious: It makes no sense that after the fall of the Soviet Union the United States and Russia are at each other's throats. I believe we must make a serious effort to end this breach for the benefit of Russia, the United States, and the world. My negotiating skills tell me an easing of tensions and improved relations is possible because the current status of relations is adversely impacting both parties. Some say the Russians won't be reasonable. I intend to find out. You can be sure there will be no agreement unless it's a good agreement. [Debate point: Rubio said he would shoot down Russian planes. That is reckless.] In international relations, one needs, first of all, maturity and judgment and how to use power, and to recognize the interests of the adversary. My young competitors don't have a clue. They stand no chance against a tough realist like Putin.

- 6. I am also tired of our allies expressing their fears of China and Russia while expecting the United States to foot the bill. They must pay more and when I am President they will pay more. With greater support, we will successfully ensure that our allies remain free and prosperous.
- 7. Finally, I deeply understand that my highest and first duty is to ensure the defense of America, her interests, and her people. We will defend America and work to further advance peace and prosperity the world over based on common sense, realism, and mutual benefit. My record shows that is my approach. I will call on the best minds this nation has to craft such a policy and determine when to take action, and when to avoid unwise engagements.

Convention Operations – Structure and Management

Date:

Thanks for recognizing the importance of the command structure in your email today.

Since we have not had a chance to discuss organizing the Convention structure, I thought I would write this memorandum to communicate to you what I envision based on my experience running conventions over the last 40 years (ugh I didn't realize it was so long).

Overall Structure

For the convention operations to work correctly, it must be structured properly. The main components of the Convention structure should include Delegate Operations, Floor Organization and Operations, Convention Committees (Rules, Credentials and Platform), Programming each night, Media and Press Corps, RNC liaison, Administration (managing tickets, office space, hotel rooms, cars, etc) and Surrogates as they relate to the Convention and Delegate operations. The structure will grow organically with many moving parts. Unless we set it up properly in the beginning, we will be devoured by the details.

I can walk through the proper way to build this structure when you have the time. Meanwhile, I want to lay out the framework in this memo so that you have a sense of what we need to do. Obviously, if you disagree with what I am suggesting, we will talk it through so that whatever we structure is within your comfort zone.

If we have locked up the nomination prior to July, the Convention becomes a TV show and the entire 2 weeks (platform is the week before the actual convention) is used to emphasize DT's image and to unify the Party. We would use the Convention program and the structured media to fix identified weaknesses in DT's image and begin the assault on Clinton and the failures of the Obama Administration. The delegate operation will fold into the floor organization. They would be used to keep the political and media worlds under control and to assist in the management of any "Establishment" negativity that the Media will want to exploit in order to achieve their narrative.

If we do not have the nomination "locked up" before Cleveland, the delegate operations division of the structure becomes the foundation for everything we do. This runs the gamut from the Convention Committees, to the strategy on the floor to the deal cutting needed to secure the nomination.

In both instances, the structure of the Convention Operations is the same, but depending on the nomination status, the emphasis is very different.

Command structure is key. For the Convention Operations to be successful, the structure must be set up to flow from you to me to the heads of each of the divisions set up to run the Trump Convention Operations

Because the Trump for President structure is not top heavy with personnel and Chiefs, it will be easier than usual to structure the organization properly.

In the week after I am announced, I need to have you present me as the Trump Convention Manager on a number of fronts. This will allow me to be seen as "your person". It will provide me with the credibility to do my job and will ensure that people understand that this operation is what DT wants set up.

The immediate important places for me to be presented are to the Delegate Operations (this can be done on Monday), to the RNC, to the Trump for President staff and any others you deem important.

Delegate Operations

This group would be a collective body. As you have already established it, Ed would manage the Delegate operations. Strategy would be set by a committee composed of you, me and Ed with his key people involved as circumstances dictate. I would be responsible for managing the strategy of this group, reporting directly to you and DT. Ed will maintain his visible role as head of Delegate Operations but would be working as a part of the Convention Operations, not independently. I assure you that I will manage him in a way that is sensitive to his public and self-image. However, he needs to be tucked into the Convention operations for the structure to be managed correctly and successfully.

The elements of Delegate Operations would be organized into 4 groups. The strategy would focus on different aspects of delegate operations through the 4 divisions. The main divisions of the Convention Delegate structure need to be incorporated into and built around the 4 distinct functions below:

- 1. **Selection of "physical" delegates**at the upcoming state conventions and caucuses. To the best degree possible, we must avoid future Louisiana situations. Trojan delegates can be insidious to our interests in Cleveland.
- 2. Soliciting support of "unbound" delegates and delegates from candidates who have withdrawn. This needs to be pursued aggressively and immediately, and incorporated into a network to include local State leaders and national VIPs.
- 3. *Targeting of upcoming primaries by CDs* to maximize number of delegates we win. We have to establish minimum targets in each State and develop a strategy to pursue these delegates. We can gain delegates if this strategy is implemented properly.
- 4. Management of Appointments to Convention Committees. This group will

focus on the election of State reps to the Rules, Credentials, Arrangements and Program committees. Additionally, it will maintain communication with our people to ensure they are able to defend our interests.

Of course all 4 of these divisions are intertwined and will overlap with each other in certain instances. However, by setting up the divisions along these functional lines, we will best focus the goals and management of the tactics.

Each of these groups will need to be organized with a Division leader, regional operatives, use of VIPs as surrogates, etc.

The budgets for these operations are a separate matter. The Barrack concept we spoke about on Thursday is one way to cover these expenses in a proper way and consistent with the FEC rules. We can have a separate conversation on this topic on Monday.

RNC & Congress

1. RNC

As we get closer to the convention there are many aspects of interaction with the RNC that will become important. Many of the items are mundane but it will impact the candidate, his family and the campaign. Items include such things as what is the DT hotel (we should have first choice), credentials, family involvement (in program, speaking, around DT, etc.), tickets to all sessions, transportation, Media management, etc.

Additionally, we must be included in all aspects in the development of the Convention program with the RNC and the Committee of Arrangements. The picture the national audience sees must comport with the themes of the Trump campaign. We cannot tolerate cognitive dissonance.

If we are the "presumptive nominee" we should be dictating the goals for each night of the Convention. Of course we would include the thinking of the Republican National leadership in Congress and the States, but we must be driving the strategy. This will be a ticklish task given the opposition we are confronting in Washington. As presumptive nominee, some of this opposition will dissipate, but resistance will remain in many places. We will have to manage this resistance through a integration of your current political structure and an outreach effort that will be established specifically for this goal.

If we are not the presumptive nominee, it will be equally important for us to structure this operation properly. In this situation, we need to be actively involved on a daily basis in interacting with all elements of the RNC and its Convention Committees. Only through daily dialog and being physically present will we be able to protect our interests.

In either case, we must set up a structure within the Convention Operations that will interact with the appropriate RNC committees.

2. Congress

The outreach to Congress and official Washington as relates to the Convention should be a part of the Convention structure. Especially if we are the presumptive nominee, we will be deluged with many requests for DT and the campaign.

In order to best manage this process, we need to set up a Congressional Outreach division within the Convention structure. The purpose of this group is dedicated to the "smoozing" of Members of Congress, important staff, and key influences on the Members. After the Convention, this group can meld into the Campaign's Congressional Liaison division. Each chamber will have a respective "cloak room" organized at the convention. We can make use of the structures that Congress typically sets up.

Next Steps

As you can see, the Convention operations can be a management nightmare. The key is to get ahead of the process, have a plan and set up the correct command structure.

I would like to sit with you on Monday to review the development of the Convention Operations as I have laid it out. In this meeting I can answer any of your questions, incorporate your thinking and build the plan with you for the launch of the Convention operation.

I should note that I have no people in mind yet. Any one you want to involve I will include. As outsiders come on board, we can bring them into this structure. It becomes a "political plum" for you to use to build the campaign.

Assuming you feel comfortable with this plan, I envision several actions in the next week to launch the Convention operations. They include:

- 1. Announcement of my designation as Convention Manager. This can be done on Tuesday.
- 2. Inclusion of the delegate operations inside of the Convention structure. This can be done on Monday.
- 3. Introduction of me by you to the RNC Chairman, or his Executive Director, as the campaign link for the Convention. Ideally you make this call immediately after the campaign makes my announcement.
- 4. If DT does a meeting in Washington on Thursday, I should be included (and Ed should be too). DT would lay his hands on this structure and allow both Ed and me to build our outreach program.

Summary

Please understand the spirit in which this Memorandum is being written. I have been a part of Conventions that were set up properly and those that were done improperly. If we do not do it correctly we will look disorganized and amateurish.

Done properly, the media will notice. The story line will be that DT has begun the transition to the General Election, unifying the Party and demonstrating his prowess as an "organizational genius".

Given that DT is known for his organizational skills it is very important that we demonstrate that his campaign has been structured consistent with his image in the business world. It will generate positive press that DT is able to transition into the non-business world and knows what he is doing.

While I know what we must do to set it up properly, I am totally open to suggestions for people and ideas that you deem important to meet your objectives as Campaign Manager. There is no ego involved on my part. I am results driven and have done this enough times to know what will work, and how we can win. In all instances the structure will be set up to meet DT's needs and your needs as Campaign Manager.

As we move closer to the convention you are going to be pulled in many directions with responsibilities for the General Election and selection of the VP consuming you among many others. The command structure I have laid out in this Memorandum allows you to keep control over the Convention, nomination of DT and the political process while still giving you the time to do the important General Election and candidate management duties that will be required.

I look forward to building a great convention for DT and you. I am available to discuss any of the information in this Memorandum with you by phone over the weekend or on Monday.

Trump: The Kremlin's Candidate

Donald Trump's energy adviser is all in for Putin.

By Robert Zubrin - April 4, 2016

Donald Trump has denounced the North Atlantic Treaty Organization as being "obsolete," and has called for sharply reducing U.S. commitments to the alliance that has been the bulwark of American security since World War II. While Trump's apologists have attempted to explain these remarks as a mere "bargaining position" to try to get Europeans to increase their military expenditures, the Donald's announcement of the appointment of Carter Page as one of his principal advisers argues for a far more straightforward and alarming interpretation of his statements.

Carter Page is an out-and-out Putinite. A consultant to and investor in the Kremlin's state-run gas company, Gazprom, Page has a direct financial interest in ending American sanctions against the company. Not only that, but Page is tight with the Kremlin's foreign-policy apparatus and has served as a vehement propagandist for it.

In February 2014, thousands of Ukrainians braved police gunfire to rise up and overthrow the corrupt Putin stooge Viktor Yanukovych, who had been president of Ukraine for four years. Yanukovych, breaking his pledge to take Ukraine on the path to freedom offered by the European Union, had decided to surrender the country to the Moscow-run "Eurasian Union" instead. Within weeks, the Kremlin responded by sending troops to invade the Ukrainian province of Crimea, and then, in April, it seized Donetsk, Lugansk, and other parts of eastern Ukraine as well. Under the terms of the 1994 Budapest Memorandum, in return for Ukraine's giving up its nuclear arsenal, the United States, Russia, and the United Kingdom were all bound to defend Ukraine's territorial integrity.

RELATED: Trump Confesses Admiration for Strongman Who Offs Journalists, Fans Applaud As the invasion unfolded, however, the Obama administration chose to ignore this pledge, limiting its help to Ukraine to non-lethal military equipment and symbolic sanctions. But even this was too much for Carter Page, who, in an article on the Center for National Policy website, peddled the Kremlin line that the broad-based Euromaidan revolt was a CIA coup, and denounced Obama for doing anything at all: "Many critics of the Obama Administration may consider the President weak, feckless or worse," wrote Page. "Such reviews are patently unfair as the opposite problem stands at the center of the current situation. Instead of any weakness of the Administration impacting the Russian government's position, aggressive steps taken by Assistant Secretary of State Nuland and other U.S. officials to stage-manage the recent revolution in Ukraine represent a primary force which created the hostile situation we now see. . . . Washington's political tactics represented the principal driving force toward proactively attempting to redefine whose fold Ukraine would fall under."

In another article, Page represented Ukraine as a runaway province of Russia, and excused the Kremlin's aggression by saying that the United States would take similar action if Quebec tried to secede from Canada. "Although Canada is slightly smaller than Ukraine in terms of the population living across the U.S. border," wrote Page, "Ukraine is similarly important to Russia in terms of trade and other aspects of its relationship. From a U.S. perspective, Washington would likely come down hard if Russia precipitated in such a destabilizing revolution in Canada. Potentially much harder than Russia is responding now."

Page has not changed these views. Far from it. In January 2015, writing on the Global Policy Journal website, Page compared U.S. support for Ukrainian independence to the killing of black youth by American police officers. "With the continued escalation and threat of further sanctions on Russia, the West has focused on the so-called annexation of Crimea," wrote Page. "But just as injustice for minorities might be largely forgotten until documented on video, the annexation of the entirety of Ukraine by a few officials in Washington which started that region's current disorder in the first place has received far less attention. While the loss of Michael Brown and Eric Garner has received intense media coverage and perfunctory federal government investigations, the economic injustice unleashed upon the millions of people residing in Russia, Ukraine and the former Soviet Union by misguided Western policies has met limited recognition.

"The deaths triggered by U.S. government officials in both the former Soviet Union and the streets of America in 2014 share a range of close similarities. . . . " And so on, and so on.

With Page providing Trump's Russia policy, it is not surprising that the Donald has also attracted the support of other prominent Putinites. For example, Professor Stephen F. Cohen, the husband of Nation editor-in-chief Katrina vanden Heuvel, and a person well known as "Putin's Pal," is gushing in his praise, saying that "Donald Trump is taking on the disastrous U.S. foreign policy triumphalism."

Furthermore, says Cohen, "Donald Trump has emerged as the only U.S. presidential candidate to challenge Washington's bipartisan foreign policies that contributed greatly to the new Cold War." Other noteworthy Putinite Trump supporters include Aleksandr Dugin, the chief composer of the Kremlin's new ideological synthesis of Communism and fascism, and its leading organizer of pro-Moscow fifth-column movements in the West. "In Trump we trust," says Dugin, apparently proposing the substitution of Trump for God in the American national motto.

Of course, the highest stamp of approval a Putin supporter can get is that of the Kremlin dictator himself, and Trump has that too. "He is a bright and talented person without any doubt," Putin said on December 17, adding that Trump is "an outstanding and talented personality."

Trump has earned the enthusiastic endorsement of the Putin chorus because he promises to gut NATO, thereby enabling Russian domination of Europe. The crafty Vladimir Lenin once termed Western dupes who helped the Kremlin achieve its strategic goals "useful idiots." Whatever one might say of Vladimir Putin, he also is undoubtedly a skilled assessor of men. So there should be no doubt about it. Trump is indeed an outstanding and talented personality - for a useful idiot.

Corey,

Hope all is well. Wanted to send you an updated message of what I'm up to in Europe. I heard from our military attaché here in London that Senator Sessions was in London last weekend and that the meetings went good. I have had two meetings with our Naval attaché and the Army attaché in London, and will have one final update tomorrow from them. They have briefed me at a very high level on the security picture here in Europe and are eager to get involved in any future briefings for Mr. Trump via Skype or secure network next time we have a briefing.

On Monday I have a meeting with the CFO of US energy company Cheniere to discuss US LNG exports (their company is responsible for the exports coming out of Sabine pass). On Tuesday I am off to Thessaloniki, Greece for a high level meeting with Amos Hochstein, the state departments energy envoy, to discuss energy security with the eu commission's energy representative. By the time I'm back stateside when I am requested, I will have the most up to date information on these issues possible.

Also, the UK government looks like they are interested in hosting Mr. Trump when we signal to them if there will be a foreign policy trip. I had a lunch with the Australian Ambassador in London and that was the message. The Greek and Cyprus governments, the EU Parliament and Russian governments have also relayed to me that they are interested in hosting Mr. Trump.
