The OISIT report reflects a complete and thorough investigation and contains specific details about suicidal ideation.

Those viewing the report should use discretion as such information can be triggering to those with mental health or substance abuse issues.

The public discussion about suicide can influence behavior negatively by contributing to contagion or positively by encouraging help-seeking.


ACTIVATION

On Saturday, January 20th, 2018 at approximately 1808 hours, I received notification from a deputy with the Johnson County Sheriff's Department of an Officer Involved Shooting in Overland Park, Kansas. The deputy advised that the incident had occurred at or near 9309 W. 149th Terrace, Overland Park, Kansas, I was further advised that Overland Park Police Department Deputy Chief of Police Simon Happer was currently the Officer in Charge of the incident. I called Deputy Chief Simon Happer to confirm the request for activation of the OISIT. I then contacted Captain Troy Duvanel to assist in making notification to team members to respond. I then contacted the Johnson County Criminalistics Laboratory CSI Supervisor Andrea Reed to make notification to them as well. Ms. Reed was already aware of the incident and preparing to respond. I then called A.D.A. Chris McMullin to advise him of the situation as well and left him a voice message. ADA McMullin would return the call in a matter of a few minutes. I drove directly to the scene and contacted Overland Park Police Department command staff and supervisory personnel. Ten initial detectives would respond to the scene, representing the Mission, Olathe, Johnson County Sheriff's Department, Leawood Police Departments and the Johnson County District Attorney's Office. This is in addition to myself and Jeremiah Waters with the Merriam Police Department. A total of three JCSO Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene. Two responded to the scene itself, and one was sent from the scene to the Overland Park Police Department-Sanders Facility, 12400 Foster, Overland Park, Kansas to process the involved officers. Overland Park Police Department staff advised that they would handle the public information duties. Additional detectives from the Johnson County District Attorney's Office and Olathe Police Department would assist later in the investigation.

I arrived on scene at approximately 1852 hours and contacted Overland Park Police Department Deputy Chief Simon Happer, Major Cindy Henson and other members of their department. I was given a briefing on what was believed to have transpired. I was advised that two Overland Park Police officers had been dispatched to the address of 9309 W. 149th Terrace, Overland Park, Kansas on a suicidal subject. As officers were outside of the residence, the garage door opened, and a minivan began driving backwards towards an officer. The officer that the van was driving towards fired his duty weapon at the vehicle. I was further advised that the vehicle then did a rapid turn and the officer closest to the van fired his duty weapon again at the vehicle. The mini-van then traveled northbound across 149th Terrace and came to rest in the front yard of 9308 W. 149th Terrace, Overland Park, Kansas.

The involved officer was still on scene, Officer Clayton Jenison. I met with Officer Jenison separately, introduced myself and provided a brief overview of the investigation process and what he could expect in the coming days. Sgt. Goddard and Officer Vendetti were determined to be witness officers to the event. Officer Jenison, Sgt. Goddard and Officer Vendetti were later transported to the Overland Park Police Department-Sanders Facility located at 12400 Foster Street, Overland Park, Kansas, and processed by CSI personnel. CSI personnel along with OISIT Investigator Ahring met with them there for standard post-shooting processing. Officer Jenison was processed, and a weapon check was conducted along with an ammunition count. Sgt. Goddard and Officer Vendetti had a weapon check conducted along with an ammunition count. It was later determined that Officer Newlon was a first responding officer to the event and a weapon check and ammunition count was conducted on him as well.

At the shooting scene, the outside temperature was approximately 40-45 degrees Fahrenheit. The wind was approximately 10 miles per hours and the weather was partially cloudy with high humidity. OPPD officers had secured the scene with crime scene tape and a crime scene log was started. CSI personnel thoroughly processed the scene, documenting it through photography, evidence collection and scanning. The Olathe Police Department command post was called to the scene. Overland Park Police Department provided scene lighting for the on-scene investigation. The Olathe Police Department unmanned aerial system was called to the scene to take imagery from an elevated perspective. An orthosmosaic image was created from the system which provides an overview of the scene:



During the initial stages of the investigation it was learned that the subject had been identified as John Albers, WM, It was also learned that the subject had been utilizing social media and advised that he was going to kill himself and that perhaps he may have even stabbed himself live on a social media platform. A video was recovered that is believed to be a snapchat "story". In this video, John is observed smoking and states the following:

"Fuck it. Someone needs to find my journal and then can read it to people and shit. I'm done with this. I'm going back to jail if I don't die right now. Call...they've already called the cops but I'm killing myself. So, I love people. You know who you are. Come to my funeral, but I'm done. Fucking done. All these people on my arm, I love all of you. Find my journal."

The scene then changes and shows John holding a knife to his chest. While doing this he states,

"I love you people. Come to my funeral."

It was later determined that much of the video "story" that was sent out to other people had been recorded from inside the kitchen area of the residence. This scene would later be photograph by crime scene personnel and items recovered as evidence from the kitchen. The journal that was referenced by John in the video was recovered from the basement of the residence and is further described in Lead #44.

Detectives worked at the scene and in the field initially, reconvening at the Olathe Police Department at approximately 0900 hours on Sunday, January 21st, 2018. The remainder of the investigation was headquartered at the Olathe PD. The team worked until Wednesday, January 24th, 2018. After the team was disbanded, two Olathe detectives along with myself and Jeremiah Waters continued to work on the investigation for several days until submission to the DA. A total of seventy-nine (79) leads were actively investigated. Lead #80 to interview Steve and Sheila Albers has not been assigned or completed as of yet due to a family request.

The family provided consent to search the residence, the vehicle and would later provide consent to search a recovered iPad and cellular phone. One search warrant written and executed for Snapchat. Approximately 624.9 staff hours were spent on the investigation by the team. This does not include hours spent after the team was disbanded on the 24th, or time spent by Olathe PD support personnel and Administrative Assistant Maranda Cochran. JCSO Crime Scene Investigators spent twenty-six and a half (26.5) hours processing the scene, two and a half (2.5) hours processing the officers, three (3) hours in the autopsy and thirty-one (31) hours processing the suspect vehicle. This does not include their laboratory time or time spent in briefing.

SHOOTING SYNOPSIS

This synopsis is based on a combination of witness interviews, involved officer interviews, recorded audio and video from multiple sources, and physical evidence. For specifics on individual interviews and other evidence, refer to the investigative narratives contained in Olathe Case Number 2018-0000981.

Officers Uniforms/Vehicles/Call Signs

Officer Clayton Jenison was wearing a traditional marked Overland Park Police Department uniform with an outer vest and had been occupying a standard marked Overland Park Police Department vehicle (1P44) prior to the incident. Officer Jenison's uniform had a badge on the left front portion, his name on the right front portion and the word POLICE on the back of his uniform. Officer Vendetti was wearing a traditional long-sleeve Overland Park Uniform with an under vest. This uniform had a badge on the upper left chest area, name placard on the right side and Overland Park Police Department patch on the left shoulder. Officer Vendetti was occupying an Overland Park Police Department vehicle (1P54). Sgt. Goddard was wearing a traditional Overland Park Police Department Uniform with an under vest. The uniform had a badge on the upper left chest area, name placard on the right side and Overland Park Police Department patch on the left shoulder. Sgt. Goddard had been occupying an Overland Park Police Department vehicle (1P40). Officer Newlon was wearing a traditional Overland Park Police Department uniform with an external vest carrier. The external vest had a badge on the left front portion, his name on

On Saturday at approximately 1736 hours, the Overland Park Dispatch Center receives a phone call from The following is a synopsis of the 911 audio.

Officer Jenison appears to be trying to call out on his radio as he continued to move back away from the van.

Officer Vendetti arrives on scene at 17:49:35. He parks along the southside of the road in between the properties of 9039 W. 149th Terrace and 9401 W. 149th Terrace. As he is arriving, Officer Jenison can be

seen walking backwards, with his arms extended in front of him, down the driveway away from the residence of 9309 W. 149th Terrace. A silver van is seen backing towards Officer Jenison. Officer Newlon is seen in the street, east of 9309 W. 149th Terrace, moving toward Officer Jenison. Sergeant Goddard is seen turning from northbound England Street going west on 149th Terrace.

As the silver van almost clears the garage, it appears to speed up toward Officer Jenison who has backed up just past the halfway point of the driveway toward the street. Two shots are heard being fired at 17:49:37 hours by Officer Jenison. The van slows down but again speeds up. It then turns counterclockwise at the end of the driveway until it faces north toward the street with its front wheels just in the street. While the van turned, Officer Jenison is seen trying to avoid being struck by moving within the center of the spiral turn of the van.

The van next started backing up toward the residence. The video shows Sgt. Goddard pulling up to the northeast corner of the driveway with his emergency lights activated. Officer Vendetti exits his vehicle and can be seen running in the middle of the street toward the van and Officer Jenison. Officer Vendetti yells, "stop the car!" The van is observed backing up rapidly toward the house and the direction of Officer Jenison. Multiple shots are then heard being fired by Officer Jenison at 17:49:45 hours with the last one fired at 17:49:47. Officer Vendetti yells, "shots fired shots fired!" The van begins to roll forward and crosses the street northbound coming to rest in the yard. Officer Vendetti radios, "we have shots fired, he's down, we need medical ASAP!"

The panoramic view of the dash camera footage was reviewed and it shows Officer Jenison shooting and moving backwards as the van is reversing towards him. Officer Clayton Jenison Video (Lead #45)

The video begins with Officer Jenison's police vehicle in a parked position in a parking lot. The first time displayed on the video was approximately 17:43:08 on January 20th, 2018. The vehicle pulls onto the street and the lights were activated at approximately 17:43:37. The siren is activated at approximately 17:43:39. Officer Jenison (234) advises dispatch he was at 143rd and Grant at approximately 17:43:44.

The call is dispatched for Units 234 and 237 for a J21 (suicide attempt) at 9309 W. 149th Terrace. At approximately 17:45 the dispatcher advises officers to switch to Tac 6. Officer Jenison switches to Tac 6 at 17:46 hours.

At approximately 17:47:03 hours Officer Jenison stops his vehicle on Hayes at the intersection of Hayes and 149th Terrace. 9401 W. 149th Terrace and 9309 W. 149th Terrace are both partially visible in the video.

Between 17:47 and 17:48, Officer Jenison approached 9309 W. 149th Terrace on foot. He contacted Officer Newlon in the yard and there was conversation about a dog and trying to get a phone number. Officer Jenison appears to use his radio to request a phone number for the child and have him come upstairs. Officer Jenison then asks Officer Newlon if he had his phone with him. Officer Jenison said he thinks there is a "mom right there."

At approximately 17:49:23 Officer Jenison is visible on the driveway near the garage doors. At approximately 17:49:26 the garage door begins opening. At 17:49:34, the vehicle began backing out of the garage and Officer Jenison yells, "Stop!" He again yelled "Stop" at 17:49:35. The vehicle was visible, backing from the garage toward Officer Jenison. Officer Jenison backed away from the vehicle. He yelled, "Stop again and fired two (2) shots at approximately 17:49:38.

The suspect vehicle appeared to stop briefly at 17:49:40 and then resumed backing at 17:49:41. Officer Jenison again yells, "Stop". The car continues backing and turning until it was facing away from the residence and was partially on the street and in the yard. The engine is revving and the tires were squealing on the pavement.


Officer Jenison can be heard on the video calling into dispatch that shots have been fired at approximately 17:49:45. Then a volley of shots are fired. Approximately eleven (11) additional shots were fired between 17:49:46 and 17:49:48. The suspect vehicle then began rolling forward toward the street. An officer can be heard yelling, stop, John, stop the car, as it rolled across the street.

Officer Jenison then called into dispatch that shots had been fired at 17:49:55. Another officer can be heard calling dispatch for medical assistance for the suspect. Officer Jenison was breathing very heavily and uttered, "fuck."

Officer Jenison's voice is heard becoming high pitched, with a distraught emotional tone and said, "I though he was going to run me over man." At approximately 17:51:17, Officer Jenison repeated that he thought he was going to be run over by saying, "I thought he was going to run me over man."

At approximately 17:52:10 Officer Jenison appears to throw up or be dry heaving. The video also shows Officer Jenison weeping. At approximately 17:54:48 an officer moved Officer Jenison's police vehicle to block the road. While continuing to weep Officer Jenison said, "I didn't want to do it" at approximately 17:56:37. At approximately 17:58:30, Officer Jenison said, "I fucking told I told him to stop."

It is stated after they changed clothes, they began walking towards the garage together and the heard two or three loud noises he believed were gunshots. It is stated that he and his wife got down and he heard another volley he thought consisted of around ten shots. It is stated they waited a few minutes and closed the garage doors. Albers' residence. OFFICER NEWLON INTERVIEW (LEAD #38)

Officer Newlon was interviewed at the Olathe Police Department on January 21st, 2018 at approximately 1650 hours. Officer Newlon advised that he recalled the incident and stated he was dispatched on an attempted suicide call. He stated that he remembered receiving information that the subject had stabbed himself in the stomach, he was on Snapchat and there was blood at the scene. Officer Newlon advised that he understood that his department had previous contact with the subject and he had expressed violent tendencies in the past. Officer Newlon advised that he had not previously responded to the address, and further advised he had no previous dealing with John Albers.

Officer Newlon stated that he was the first officer to arrive on scene and due to the nature of the call he waited in his patrol vehicle for another officer to arrive. He stated once another officer arrived, he put on his gloves and started to approach from the east while the other officer, who was later identified as Officer Jenison approached from the west. Officer Newlon stated that after reaching the front of the residence they took a moment to assess the situation. Officer Newlon advised that they heard a large dog barking and thought they could not approach the front door based on the information they had. Officer Newlon stated that Officer Jenison asked him if he had his patrol phone on him, which he did not. Officer Newlon then ran back towards his patrol car to get his phone. Officer Newlon advised that while running back he observed a silver Jeep sitting in the roadway and he remembered hearing the calling party was in a silver Jeep. He said he wasn't sure if the calling party was the subject's mother or not, but he knew it was someone related to the call. Officer Newlon said he approached the female in the Jeep and attempted to get a phone number for the subject inside the residence. Officer Newlon said at the same time he was reaching into his patrol vehicle to retrieve his phone. Officer Newlon advised that he turned around and looked and he saw the garage door start to open. Officer Newlon said that he then started making his way on the south side of the street back to where Officer Jenison was. Officer Newlon described Officer Jenison as being right by the driveway or right on the driveway. Officer Newlon stated that Officer Jenison was trying to contact the subject in the vehicle. Officer Newlon said that he saw the van start to back up and heard Officer Jenison giving commands to the driver to stop. Officer Newlon said that he then saw the van accelerate rapidly and noticed it was heading right at Officer Jenison. Officer Newlon said he then heard, what he believed, were three shots. Officer Newlon believed he was approximately 100 feet away from the van when it began to back out of the garage.

Officer Newlon advised that he drew his gun and was starting to approach the van while also trying to maintain cover. Officer Newlon said that as he was making his approach, he saw the van "swoop" around and saw Sgt. Goddard's vehicle approach. Officer Newlon said he then saw the van start to back up towards Officer Jenison and there was another volley of fire. Officer Newlon recalled hearing about another three shots and said the van then went forward until it came to rest across the street.

Officer Newlon recalled that Officer Jenison said to him, "I thought he was going to run me over." Officer Newlon stated it was one of the first things Officer Jenison stated and he repeated it several times. Officer Newlon described Officer Jenison as visibly upset and breathing heavy. Officer Newlon said that Officer Jenison did a quick check of himself and noticed he was bent over breathing heavy and his voice was cracking. Officer Newlon said that he stayed with Officer Jenison the entire time he was on scene, except for a short time when Officer Jenison was in an ambulance. Officer Newlon also stated that he conducted a protective sweep of the residence with Officer William Robbins.

Officer Newlon later explains that the reason he thought the vehicle was accelerating towards Officer Jenison was due to the speed of the vehicle. He said in his experience when you back out of a garage/driveway it is typically a "nice easy back out". He stated on this occasion the van started slowly and then, 'sped up." He further advised, "he was already back there, he was about an arms' reach away from the van." Officer Newlon stated that Officer Jenison was already yelling and giving commands. Officer Newlon said that he saw Officer Jenison's arm extend out as the van was coming towards him.

Officer Newlon explained the vehicle turn and stated, "it seemed like the front of the van just whipped around in a completely different direction." Officer Newlon said that Officer Jenison stepped around to the back side of the van to stay away from the front of it, but the van then continued backing up the driveway again, as he was trying to make his way off to the side.

Officer Newlon would state that Officer Jennison was almost directly behind the van as it initially started to back towards him after the turn. Officer Newlon drew a diagram as well.

Officer Newlon described the protective sweep as well.

SERGEANT JASON GODDARD INTERVIEW (LEAD #37)

Sergeant Goddard was interviewed in relation to this incident. Sgt. Goddard stated that he responded from the station and that prior to his departure he was aware that John Albers had stabbed himself, was armed and was covered in blood. Sgt. Goddard stated that he prepared his less lethal shotgun, by collecting it from a rear cargo drawer, loading the rounds in the gun, and placing it on the floorboard of the front passenger seat. Sgt. Goddard explained that he prepared it anticipating a possible need.

Sgt. Goddard stated he arrived on scene and turned the corner of the street. Sgt. Goddard stated, "I see Officer Jenison behind a minivan, uh, the minivan is backing up. I see him begin to fire". Sgt. Goddard said he is not sure if Officer Jenison had fired prior to him arriving. Sgt. Goddard continues to say, "the vehicle then accelerates like a J-turn, and then he's now like, he was down closer to the sidewalk and now he was back towards the house and the minivan is backing up towards him again and he then proceeds to fire again. Uh, I see the driver get struck. Looks to be multiple times, goes limp, and the van rolls across the street to the yard where it rests. So then, I jump out of my car, I go running to the car with Vendetti, we check on the driver, he's clearly deceased, nothing we can do for him".

Sgt. Goddard was asked again to describe what he saw and heard. Sgt. Goddard advised that dispatch had advised that the reportee or "mom" would be arriving in a gray Jeep. Sgt. Goddard stated that he saw a gray Patriot parked behind a patrol vehicle. Sgt. Goddard stated he saw the van backing up and Jenison

behind the vehicle in a "shooting stance" as he fires into the van. Sgt. Goddard continues to say that the wan then moves "rapidly" and does a "J-turn". Sgt. Goddard states Officer Jenison moved closer to the garage, the van is "backing towards him", and he "fires again".

Sgt. Goddard would explain that he was not sure if he shifted the vehicle into park, but he did remove the key from the ignition and placed the keys on the roof of the van.

Sgt. Goddard would state, "once that car did the J-turn and came back at him, my concern was he was going to get hit with it".

OFFICER ADAM VENDETTI INTERVIEW (LEAD #39)

Officer Vendetti was interviewed in relation to this incident. Officer Vendetti heard the dispatch call involving Unit 234, Officer Jenison and Unit 237, Officer Newlon. It was dispatched as a suicidal subject. Officer Vendetti advised that it was reported that the suicidal subject was broadcasting himself on video, and was armed with a knife, stabbing himself. Officer Vendetti advised it was also reported that there was a lot of blood. Officer Vendetti advised that he looked at the call notes because of the type of call and the fact that he was a CIT officer. Officer Vendetti advised that he was familiar with and had been on calls at this location before. Officer Vendetti advised that approximately 4-6 weeks ago, John had battered his dad after drinking a bunch of alcohol. Officer Vendetti advised that he recalled John telling officers if they took him to Marillac, he wouldn't fight the police.

Officer Vendetti made a broadcast about John's previous statements about being a wrestler and wanting to fight the police on prior contacts. Officer Vendetti advised that he pulled in from the west and stated that when he pulled in his perception was that Officer Jenison was in a shooting stance. Officer Vendetti advised that he had "tunnel vision" at this point and could see Officer Jenison standing in this position and he could see the garage was open at the residence.

Officer Vendetti advised that he had no idea of what was going on inside the garage. He advised that he didn't know if John was standing there with a knife, since it was reported he was armed. Officer Vendetti said he sees the silver minivan backing out of the garage towards Officer Jenison. Officer Vendetti advised he could not tell the angle of the vehicle backing out in reference to Officer Jenison's position. Officer Vendetti explained that he couldn't tell if Officer Jenison was directly behind the vehicle or off to the side and did not know what Officer Jenison perceived.

Officer Vendetti advised that within seconds of the van coming out of the garage, Officer Vendetti advised he heard the first couple of gunshots. As Officer Vendetti is exiting his vehicle, the silver minivan does a turnaround as he approaches. After the silver minivan turns around, Officer Vendetti jumps out of the way as a reaction. Officer Vendetti explained that he was reacting to more gunshots. Officer Vendetti advised that he knew John still had control of he van because it went from reverse to drive.

Officer Vendetti then described the vehicle traveling across the street. Officer Vendetti ran to the driver's side door of the van as it approached the neighbor's house. Officer Vendetti advised that he asked Sgt. Goddard if the vehicle was in park because he was worried the van might continue into the neighbor's house.

Officer Vendetti explained that at this point he could see John slumped over in the driver's seat. Officer Vendetti advised that he had to lift John's head up as he was reaching across the front of him to check John's pulse. Officer Vendetti used his left hand to check the right side of John's neck. Officer Vendetti advised that he could not find a pulse on John's carotid artery and believed him to be dead.

Officer Vendetti assumed that the minivan came to a stop due to John's foot coming off the accelerator pedal. Officer Vendetti advised that he could not find the gear shift and assumes that Sgt. Goddard put the van into park. Officer Vendetti described seeing Officer Jenison's face as he was walking up to the van and that Officer Jenison was "all fucked up". As Officer Vendetti described the events, he became emotional.

OFFICER CLAYTON JENISON INTERVIEW (LEAD #40)

Officer Jenison was interviewed in relation to this incident. Officer Jenison advised that he responded to the area of this call for service from the area of 143rd and Grant. Officer Jenison was unable to recall the exact address of the call. Officer Jenison advised that the information for the call indicated it was an attempted suicide. Officer Jenison advised that he drove with his lights and siren on to the call. Officer Jenison advised that he parked on a side street near the address and thought his camera was pointed at the house. Officer Jenison advised that while enroute to the call dispatch advised the subject had been actively cutting himself and was threatening to stab himself. Officer Jenison further advised that dispatch stated the parents were not home and that the subject had sent out information via social media.

Officer Jenison stated he switched radio channels and approached the address on foot with Officer Newlon. Officer Jenison stated that he positioned himself behind a tree in the front yard and could hear a dog barking from within the home. Officer Jenison stated that dispatch had said the subject's mother was enroute to the address in a white Jeep. Officer Jenison advised that Officer Newlon left his position and returned to his vehicle to get a phone and around that same time, a female arrived in a white SUV. Officer Jenison believed the female was the subject's mother and Officer Newlon contacted her.

Officer Jenison stated he felt he could best cover the front door by standing closer to the garage door, so he moved from the tree toward the garage door area. Officer Jenison said that this area would offer him protection if the subject exited the front door and he felt he could control the situation from that position. Officer Jenison said he did not know the subject's intentions, which could have been "self-harm" or "homicidal tendencies."

Officer Jenison said that as he moved toward the garage, the garage door began to open. Officer Jenison commented that the subject's mother opened the garage door when she arrived but then stated he was not sure if the subject's mother opened the garage door or if the subject did.

Officer Jenison stated that to contain the area and not knowing what was in the garage, not knowing what the subject's relationship with his mother was (who was believed to be standing on the road with Officer Newlon), he unholstered his service weapon and approached. Officer Jenison said as he was looking into the garage he observed a sliver van with the brake lights on. Officer Jenison stated that initially he did not see anyone in the vehicle, but when the reverse lights came on he knew someone was in the vehicle. Officer Jenison said that he wanted to contain the situation and not let the subject leave, which is why he was behind the vehicle.

Officer Jenison states the van then begins moving backward. Officer Jenison stated that he told the subject to stop, but he did not stop. Officer Jenison stated that he tells the subject to stop again. Officer Jenison described himself as "running backwards" at this time. Officer Jenison stated that he was "afraid he was going to hit me", which was the reason he "shot" the first time. Officer Jenison could not provide a distance on how far the vehicle was away from him, but stated it felt like it was "from me to you" away. Officer Jenison said he felt the vehicle was "pretty close" to him and it was not stopping. Officer Jenison said he felt the vehicle was going fast enough to be a threat and cause him bodily harm. Officer Jenison advised that he fired "two to three" rounds. Officer Jenison was not sure what caused him to stop

shooting during the initial backing incident. Officer Jenison stated that it might have been because he observed the brake lights come on, but he was not sure.

Officer Jenison advised that after the initial shots were fired he got on this radio to inform dispatch that shots had been fired. Officer Jenison then stated the vehicle accelerated in reverse rapidly past him. Officer Jenison described the vehicle as doing a "U-turn" that caused the rear of the vehicle to be facing toward him again. Officer Jenison described himself as being positioned "dead center" right between the wheels. Officer Jenison said the vehicle accelerates back toward him. Officer Jenison said he fires again "fearing" he was going to be struck. Officer Jenison stated, "I believe he was going to hit me." Officer Jenison stated that he was "running" backwards as the vehicle backs up toward him. Officer Jenison stated that he fired until the vehicle started moving forward. Officer Jenison stated that when the vehicle began moving forward he felt it was no longer a threat to him, which was when he stopped firing. Officer Jenison believed he had fired between "five and seven" shots.

Officer Jenison stated that he holstered his weapon and moved to the vehicle to help assist in performing life saving measures. Officer Jenison commented the reason they were sent to the call was to help the subject. Officer Jenison stated his intentions on that day were not to shoot the subject, but instead get him the help he needed.

Officer Jenison said that as he approached the vehicle, Officer Vendetti instructs Officer Newlon to get him back. Officer Jenison was asked about any conversation that took place. Officer Jenison recalled breaking down and saying, "I thought he was going to hit me." Officer Jenison described himself as being very emotional, crying, and at one-point dry heaving.

Officer Jenison was asked to further explain his movement around the time the garage door was going up. Officer Jenison said he moved from the tree, which was not a lot of cover for him, closer to the house. Officer Jenison said as he walked closer to the house the garage door was opening. Officer Jenison said he unholstered his weapon. Officer Jenison said he knows he is there for someone who attempted suicide, but he does not know what is waiting for him inside the garage. Officer Jenison said the vehicle is "on" and the reverse lights are on. Officer Jenison said he wanted to keep "him here", so he could get him help. Officer Jenison said the vehicle starts reversing and he told him to stop, and the vehicle does not stop. Officer Jenison said he was moving backward and again tells "him to stop", but he does not stop. Officer Jenison said he shoots and tried to move out of the way. Officer Jenison said he gets on the radio saying, "shots fired."

Officer Jenison was asked what he was thinking when the vehicle was backing toward him after he told the driver to stop. Officer Jenison said, "I am thinking he was going to hit me." Officer Jenison said he was afraid if he was hit that he was going to get knocked down and run over. Officer Jenison said that he did not want that to happen and added that he did not know what "his" (driver's) intent was.

REVIEW THE BLUE AND WHITE STRIPED NOTEBOOK/JOURNAL (LEAD #44)

Detectives reviewed the journal that is believed to be the same journal referenced by Mr. Albers in the video. A thorough review of the journal was conducted, and the following are portions of the writing that was in or on the journal.

On the outside of the journal are a few written words that include: 2018, Ease, Zemgchove, Fuck12, Lilzom, and a heart with J&K. Fuck12 is likely a reference to fuck the police and appears to be urban slang.

"January 1, 2018 3:39 pm

Well I'm in JDC (Juvenile detention Center) Kid jail pretty much. I have been here since Dec 29 2017. Why am I here Well I will explain everything. So on the 27th broke up w me My mind was split cuz I was actually changing for her since I got out of Meralic (12/20/17). So I obv was a mess and my mins is so foggy of that night even tho I was sober. So took my keys then when my father showed up I stole his car and skrtd off. My whole mind was in such a dark place. Well you might think why did you also kill urself when going 135 on highway In my dads car. Finally I called reminded me suicide is for pussys. So I drove to his house after I calmed myself down and pulled over. I was not just made, that broke up w me I was furius cuz my whole life is so fucked up. And she mad a comment that my past is a big problem for her cuz at partyes people say oh that suck we (unittelligeble) John. Anways I got to house. Well a cop showed up. So I ran out the back and hopped fences then (unintelligible) got to the car. Then I stated to drive off but the cop was in the middle of the street. So I sped up and he moved."

[&]quot;10:01 am 1/20/18

I passed my drug test. Then I came back to school and skipped 5 and 6 to take a nap and they excused my absents. Then came over after school and he hung out til 10:30 pm. (Unintelligible) Im in a 5 hr recertification course for refereeing. I just got caught shoplifting at Sheels. I am a complete fuck up."

"1/20/18 Today I got caught Shoplifting at Scheels. I now have additional charges and way to much to come back from. My just told me I am literally a dipointment and never going to change. Well Your Compeltly right I love you But no Im gone life will be 100% easier. we fight so much but I do love you. It love you so much and I need to both to not end up like me. These days (unintelligible).

A later entry states, I love you and forgive me.

I love you and and and well be back some day."



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

They said they would be staying with friends at I and provided me with their cellular phone numbers. I provided them with a business card containing my cellular phone number and told them to call me if they needed assistance moving forward.

Deputy Brungardt provided me with two Johnson County Sheriff's Office Consent to Search forms. He filled out the vehicle information portion for the Albers' van. Immediately after they left, I checked the forms and noticed through a miscommunication between myself and Deputy Burngardt the second form signed by Mr. Albers was printed in Spanish. Deputy Brungardt said the forms had the information for vehicles and residences on each from and they use them for multiple items. Through a miscommunication he provided me with the address as 9304 W. 149st Terrace rather than the Elbers' actual address, 9309 W. 149th Terrace.

I explained to him the process was not complete and at this point I did not have any information to share with him. I explained the incident was being investigated by the Johnson County OISIT team members and the investigation was going to take time. I told him his residence would be completed at some point today, but I could not provide him with an exact time. I told him as soon as processing was complete at the residence, I would notify him.

I also told Mr. Albers at some point I would like to meet with him and his wife to further explain the investigatory process and speak with them about John. Mr. Albers said he would contact me later in the day to arrange a meeting and thanked me for the assistance in retrieving his items from the residence.

Upon arrival, I was assigned Lead #19 to conduct a neighborhood canvass to check for possible damage to the houses located east of the address for possible damage from gunshots.

I checked the houses located at locate any obvious damage to the houses that appeared to be caused from fired projectiles.

I asked if either had observed anything and both stated they had not. They asked me if everything was safe now and I told them it was. They provided me with their contact information and I provided them with a business card and asked them to call me if they remembered anything else.

Lead #22 – Patrol Vehicle Ammunition Count

On 01-20-18 at 1901 hours, I was notified that an officer involved shooting had occurred at 9309 W. 149th Ter. Overland Park, KS. 66221 involving Overland Park Police Officers. I arrived on scene and was assigned lead #22 by Detective Waters with the Merriam Police Department. Lead #22 involved conducting an ammunition count of the firearms inside of the patrol vehicles that belonged to the officers that were on scene.

At 2022 hours, I located Overland Park Police patrol vehicle #1P44 on W. 149th Ter. and Hayes St. The

wehicle had been driven by OPPD Officer Jenison. The patrol rifle and shotgun were locked in place between the front driver and passenger seats. I removed the 5.56mm Rock River Arms rifle and observed serial number. I removed the magazine from the gun and determined that the rifle did not have any ammunition in the chamber. Sgt. Hruska with OPPD was near me and I asked him how many rounds are supposed to be in the magazine, he replied that it is a 30 round magazine but normally only 28 rounds are kept inside. Sgt. Hruska also stated the shotguns only contain five rounds. I counted the rounds in the magazine and they added up to 30. I removed the Benelli 12GA shotgun from the vehicle and observed serial number. The shotgun contained 5 shotgun rounds in the tube and none in the chamber. The firearms were placed back into the patrol vehicle.
At 2036 hours, I located Overland Park Police patrol vehicle #1P54 on W. 149 th Ter. East of Hayes St. The vehicle had been driven by OPPD Officer Vendetti. I located the patrol rifle and shotgun locked in place between the front driver and passenger seats. I removed the 5.56mm Rock River Arms rifle and observed serial number. I removed the magazine from the gun and determined that the rifle did not have any ammunition in the chamber. I counted the rounds in the magazine and they added up to 30. I removed the Benelli 12GA shotgun from the vehicle and observed serial number. The shotgun contained 5 shotgun rounds in the tube and none in the chamber. The firearms were placed back into the patrol vehicle.
Overland Park Police patrol vehicle #1P40 was parked in the driveway of 9309 W. 149 th Ter., facing southwest. The vehicle had been driven by OPPD Sgt. Goddard. The scene was still being processed by members of the Johnson County Crime Lab and I was not able to conduct the round count until 2135 hours. The patrol rifle and shotgun were locked in place between the front driver and passenger seats. I removed the 5.56mm Rock River Arms rifle and observed serial number I removed the magazine from the gun and determined that the rifle did not have any ammunition in the chamber. I counted the rounds in the magazine and they added up to 28. I removed the Benelli 12GA shotgun from the vehicle and observed serial number. The shotgun contained 5 shotgun rounds in the tube and none in the chamber. The firearms were placed back into the patrol vehicle.

On 01-21-18, Detective Waters informed me that Overland Park Police patrol vehicle #1P33 had been removed from the scene before a round count was conducted and was taken to the Overland Park Police Department at 12400 Foster St., Overland Park, KS., 66213. At 1107 hours, I met with OPPD Sgt. Stevens in the parking lot of the police department and he unlocked patrol vehicle #1P33. The patrol vehicle had been driven by OPPD Officer Newlon on 01-20-18. I located the patrol rifle and shotgun locked in place between the front driver and passenger seats. I removed the 5.56mm Rock River Arms

the rifle did not have any ammunition in the chamber. I counted the rounds in the magazine and they added up to 28. I removed the Benelli 12GA shotgun from the vehicle and observed serial number. The shotgun contained 5 shotgun rounds in the tube and none in the chamber. The firearms were placed back into the patrol vehicle.

On 01-21-18 at 1400 hours, I conducted an interview with Sgt. Goddard (Lead #37). During the interview, Sgt. Goddard stated that he had prepared his less lethal shotgun prior to leaving the parking lot of the Overland Park Police Department on 01-20-18. Sgt. Goddard stated he had left the shotgun on the floorboard of the front passenger seat and did not take it out of the vehicle when he responded to the incident. Sgt. Goddard explained that the Sergeant's patrol vehicles are equipped with a less lethal shotgun that is locked at the rear of the vehicle, patrol officers have the option to sign out a less lethal shotgun at the beginning of the shift.

On 01-22-18 at 1355 hours, I called Sgt. Goddard and asked him if he secured the less lethal shotgun while he was on scene at 149th Ter., he said no. Sgt. Goddard stated was driven to his police department by someone with Olathe Police and his patrol vehicle was driven back by Sgt. Hruska. Sgt. Goddard said he was able to get into vehicle #1P40 sometime between 0130 and 0140 hours to retrieve his personal belongings, and he did not see the shotgun on the passenger side.

At 1418 hours, I called Sgt. Hruska and asked him if he secured the less lethal shotgun when he transported the vehicle to the police department, he said no. Sgt. Hruska said he did not see a shotgun on the passenger side. As I was speaking with Sgt. Hruska, he walked out to vehicle #1P40 and saw that the less lethal shotgun was secured at the rear of the patrol vehicle. Sgt. Hruska said the six less lethal rounds were in the side saddle. I asked Sgt. Hruska to provide me with the serial number and model of the shotgun, he said it is a Remington 870 with serial number Sgt. Hruska suggested I speak with Captain Olney because he was overseeing the video downloads of the patrol vehicles when they were brought to the station.

On 01-23-18 at 1048 hours, I attempted to contact Captain Olney. I left him a message to return my call.

As I reviewed the interview of Sgt. Goddard, he stated he "discharged" the less lethal shotgun after 0100 hours on 01-21-18 when he could re-enter his patrol vehicle in the parking lot of the police station. In the interview, Sgt. Goddard said he placed the shotgun in the cargo drawer. At 1634 hours, I called Sgt. Goddard and asked him to clarify what happened with the shotgun. He said he was allowed to get his duty gear from his patrol vehicle around 0100 hours. Sgt. Goddard stated he noticed the shotgun was on the floorboard of the passenger side and did not appear to have been moved since he placed it there prior to going to the call on 01-20-18. Sgt. Goddard stated he unloaded the shotgun and secured it back in the cargo drawer. Sgt. Goddard was mistaken or did not understand my question when I had called him on 01-22-18 and inquired about the less lethal shotgun.

It should be noted that none of the dash camera videos show Sgt. Goddard's less lethal shotgun being taken out of his vehicle during the call.

On 1/20/2018 at about 1736 hrs, a female caller who identified herself as called 911 and reported her ex-boyfriend, who she later identified as John Albers, contacted her through Facetime. stated there is currently a no-contact order. The dispatcher was obtaining basic information relating to the no contact order from and she stated, "he is going to kill himself." When asked, said she did not know his address, she said she had just tried calling his mother and his father, but they did not answer. attempted to provide directions to his house without providing the exact address. She was able to advise the address was near 151st street, but she did not know exactly where.

Stated "he popped, he took a thing of pills, I don't know what they were, and he swallowed them. He is drinking very heavily, he was just chugging and chugging huge bottles of Vodka." She continued by saying "he is saying when the Police get there he is going to stab himself." The dispatcher asked how she knew about this. stated she saw all of this on Facetime. The dispatcher confirmed that he said he was going to stab himself. said, "Yes, he said when the

Approximately 6:22 into the call, another unidentified juvenile female began talking to the dispatcher. I could hear screaming in the background. The female indicated was screaming, she said he called her and he stabbed himself. The female stated he facetimed her, she said is advising there is blood everywhere. I could hear the dispatcher tell another dispatcher to get medical en-route to the call. The caller advised he was in the basement and he was home alone. She said was still trying to call John's mom, but she was not answering. The dispatcher asked her to relay any other information she was getting from John. The caller advised he stabbed himself in his stomach and his chest. I continued to hear screaming and crying in the background.

Police show up he is going to stab himself, because he is so done with his life." The dispatcher

asked if she saw a knife and she stated she did not, but she saw him drinking a lot.

I could hear an unidentified adult female's voice in the background asking how he was calling. She stated she thought his number was blocked. The unidentified juvenile female stated he contacted through facetime and was using his email address. The adult female stated she was almost to John's house and was driving a silver Jeep Patriot.

The dispatcher stated there were officers on scene and she ended the phone call.

On 01/21/2018 at approximately 1000 hours, I (Det. C. Spegal) responded to Frontier Forensics Midwest, LLC (40 South 18th Street, Kansas City, Kansas 66102) to attend the autopsy of John D. Albers (

Prior to responding to Frontier Forensics Midwest, I responded to the Johnson County Criminalistics Laboratory (11890 South Sunset, Olathe, Kansas 66061) and contacted Crime Scene Investigator (CSI) Supervisor Andrea Reed. Reed provided me with two knifes that were previously recovered from the scene at 9309 West 149th Terrace, Overland Park, Kansas. I transported the two knives to Frontier Forensics Midwest, LLC and turned the knives over to Johnson County CSI Amy Shanahan, who also attended the autopsy.

I observed Albers body was in a sealed body bag with red tag # CSI Shanahan photographed the sealed body bag and took photographs during the autopsy. The autopsy was conducted by Dr. Altaf Hossain. Dr. Hossain was assisted during the autopsy by Chris Berry and Kelsie Pittsenbarger.

At the conclusion of the autopsy, Dr. Hossain advised preliminary results of the autopsy was that the manner of death was homicide and the cause of death of was gunshot wound of head and chest. A preliminary presumptive test showed the presence of amphetamines and alcohol in Albers system. The final autopsy report will be forwarded pending the toxicology results and the completion of the autopsy report.

CSI Shanahan collected Albers clothing, personal items, and other evidentiary items that were collected during the autopsy (see her supplemental report for further information).

CSI Shanahan later provided me with a compact disc containing the photographs that she took during the autopsy. The compact disc was later entered into evidence at the Olathe Police Department.

AUTOPSY FINDINGS:

- I. Gunshot wound A: Gunshot wound of the head
 - a. Entrance: Right back of the head, behind ear
 - b. Fracture of the skull
 - c. Laceration of the brain
 - d. Exit: Left temporal scalp
- II. Gunshot wound B: Gunshot wound of the back of the upper neck
 - a. Entrance: Back of the upper neck
 - The projectile tracks upwards and enters the occipital bone, enters the cranium through the occipital bone; fracture of the occipital and temporal bones
 - Laceration and fragmentation of the cerebellum
 - d. Projectile fragmented and the fragments exited the bone but stayed within the inner layer of the skin of the left temporal scalp
 - e. Projectile and fragments are retrieved
- III. Gunshot wound C: Gunshot wound of back of left shoulder
 - Entrance: Left medial back of the shoulder
 - b. Laceration of the muscle of the back of the shoulder
 - Exit: Left lateral back of the shoulder.
- IV. Gunshot wound D: Gunshot wound of the back of the right torso
 - Entrance: Back of the right chest
 - b. Laceration and perforation of the right lung
 - Laceration of the upper aorta
 - d. Laceration and perforation of the left lung
 - e. Laceration of the upper pericardium
 - f. Blood in the left chest cavity, about 2 liters and right chest cavity, about 300 cc
 - g. A hollow point, mushroomed projectile and fragments are retrieved on the left lateral anterior chest under the skin
- V. Gunshot wound E: Grazing gunshot wound of the right shoulder.
- VI. Gunshot wound F: Gunshot wound of the lower lip. Laceration of lower lip.

On the left anterior chest, there are 31 horizontal stab wounds. These stab wounds are located about 20 inches below the vertex and 1 inch left of the anterior midline. Of the larger stab wounds, the deepest stab wound pierces between 5th and 6th anterior left intercostal rib space but did not injure the heart, pericardium or lung.

SUMMARY:

The decedent expires from gunshot wounds of the head and torso.

Formal toxicological analyses detect small amount of ethanol and therapeutic level of amphetamine (Adderall). Ethanol is not detected at intoxicating level.

At the time of death, the decedent was not intoxicated with drugs or toxins.

INITIAL INFORMATION:

According to the initial investigational information, the decedent was reportedly, arrested and released on January 20, 2018 for an unspecified charge. Later that day, the decedent was at home with friends drinking liquor and taking pills. Late in the afternoon, the decedent began cutting himself with two different knives and his friends became concerned and contacted the police. An Officer arrived to the home to find the garage door up and the decedent in the driver's seat in a van parked in the garage. The van reversed quickly out of the garage towards the Officer. The Officer drew his service pistol and fired thirteen times as the van reached the road and performed a "J-turn". The car went forward a few feet after the turn and came to a stop. The Officer found the decedent seated dead at the wheel. The decedent was pronounced dead at the scene at 1754 hours, January 20, 2018.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF EXAMINATION:

The autopsy examination takes place at the Frontier Forensics Morgue in Kansas City, Kansas on 01/21/2018 at 1000 hours under the authority of Johnson County Coroner's Office.

IDENTIFICATION:

The body is received in a sealed body bag with an intact red seal number 0002804. Identification was made prior to arrival at this facility.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of 70-inch White male who is said to be 17 years of age. The body weight is about 142 pounds. The eyes have clear conjunctivae without petechiae. The mouth has native teeth. A tattoo is on the left inguinal area. There are writing tattoos on the left anterior forearm and the wrist. On the back of the right forearm there is a writing tattoo. An ID band is on the left ankle.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

Gunshot wound A; The entrance hole of about 3/8 inch is in the back of the right ear. It is located about 4 ½ inches right of the posterior midline and 8 ½ inches below the vertex. The gunshot wound is associated with the laceration of the brain, ranging from ½ to 2 ¼ inches. The projectile exits on the left temporal scalp, located about 6 inches below the vertex and 5 inches left of the posterior midline. The trajectory is from right to left, back to front and upwards.

Gunshot wound B: The entrance hole of about ½ inch is at the back of the upper neck. It is located about 9 inches below the vertex, and in the midline. The projectile travels left and upwards, enters the cranial cavity through the occipital bone. The projectile is

fragmented and the fragments are retrieved from the left temporal scalp, outside the bone but within the skin. Trajectory is back to front, right to left and upwards.

Gunshot wound C: The entrance hole of about is ½ inch is at the back of the left shoulder. The entrance hole is located about 12 inches below the vertex and 3 inches left of the posterior midline. The projectile travels to left and downwards. The exit of the projectile is 5 inches left of the posterior midline. The gunshot wound is associated with the laceration of the muscle and fatty tissue of about ½ to 1 inch. The trajectory is from right to left and slightly downwards.

Gunshot wound D: The entrance hole of about ½ inch is in the right back of the torso. The entrance hole is associated with abrasion about 1½ inches. It is located about 19 inches below the vertex and 4 inches right of the posterior midline. It is associated with the perforation and laceration of the right lung, perforation and laceration of the left lung, laceration of the upper aorta and laceration of the upper pericardium ranging from ½ inch to ¾ inch. A hollow point, mushroomed projectile and its fragments are retrieved on the left lateral anterior chest under the skin. There is about 2 liters of blood in the left chest cavity and 300 cc of blood in the right chest cavity. There is hemorrhage around the projectile on the left anterior lateral chest. The trajectory is from back to front, right to left and upwards.

Gunshot wound E: Grazing gunshot wound of the right shoulder. On the top of right shoulder is an irregular pink grazing gunshot wound of an area of 1 3/4 x 1 inch.

Gunshot wound F: The entrance is at the lower lip and is associated with laceration of lower lip and the projectile exits at right lower face. The gunshot wound is about 2 inches long. The trajectory is right to left and slightly downwards.

There is multiple stippling on the right arm, neck, right anterior chest, right shoulder, and right anterior back of the torso.

Other injuries:

Stab wounds of the chest: On the left anterior chest, are 31 horizontal stab wounds stab wounds located about 20 inches below the vertex and 1 inch left of the anterior midline. These stab wounds are in an area of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 3 inches. The seven (7) horizontal larger stab wounds measuring $\frac{1}{2}$ x 1/8 to 11/16 x 3/16 inch. The 24 horizontal superficial stab wounds measure 1/16 to 1/8 inch. Of the larger stab wounds, the deepest stab wound pierces between 5th and 6th anterior left intercostal rib space but did not injure the heart, pericardium or lung.

On the back of torso, is a vertical parallel pink abrasion of about 3 ¾ inches with a gap of ½ inch. At the lower end of this abrasion, at right angle to this, is a transverse impression in the lower midline back of the torso of about 3 ¾ inches.

Three fresh vertical linear cuts are on the right anterior distal forearm/wrist of about ¾ - 1 inch Proximal to these vertical cuts, are two horizontal cuts of about 1 to 1 ½ inches. A "Z-shaped" cut is on the back of left hand at the index and middle finger junction. In the back of left hand, is a cut of 1/16 inch at the origin of index finger.

A curved pink superficial cutaneous cut is on the anterior mid neck of about 3 ½ inches.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The anterior chest and abdominal walls have no extravasation of blood. The pericardial sac, peritoneal cavity, and pleural cavity have no hemorrhage. Ribs, stemum, and clavicles have no fracture.

The 270-gram heart has a smooth epicardial surface and a small amount of subepicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise from the aorta in the normal fashion. The coronary ostia are patent. The right coronary artery supplies the posterior interventricular septum and is without atherosclerosis. The left main coronary artery, left circumflex branches and left anterior descending coronary arteries have no atherosclerotic intrusion of the lumen. The valve cusps and leaflets are normally formed. The descending aorta is patent and has no atherosclerosis.

The right 200 and left 170-gram lung have smooth tan pieural surfaces. The parenchyma is soft and congested. The bronchi have light tan mucosal surfaces.

The 1,090-gram liver has a smooth, intact capsular surface and a sharp anterior margin. The red-brown parenchyma has no intrinsic nodularity. The gallbladder contains about 12 cc of green-yellow bile and has no calculi.

The 80-gram spleen has a smooth, intact capsular surface and a soft dark maroon splenic pulp. The periaortic and mesenteric lymph nodes are not enlarged.

The right 90 and left 90-gram kidneys have smooth cortical surfaces and red-brown parenchyma that has no abnormality. The pelvicalyceal systems are not dilated. The ureters are normal in course and caliber to the urinary bladder. The urinary bladder has a smooth gray-white mucosa and contains about 20 cc of clear urine.

The prostate and testes have no palpable masses.

The pancreas has a light tan nodular parenchyma without hemorrhage or calcification. The adrenal glands have pale yellow cortices.

The esophagus is intact and has smooth gray-white mucosa and is without foreign material.

The stomach has a light tan mucosa with its normal rugal folds and contains about 10 cc of brown liquid.

The vermiform appendix is present. The small and large bowels are without evident abnormality.

The strap muscles have no injury. The thyroid gland, tongue, epiglottis, trachea, and larynx have no injuries, and there is no foam in the airway, epiglottis, trachea, and larynx.

The reflected scalp has injuries as described above. Injury to the skull and brain is described above. The 1,150-gram brain has symmetric cerebral and cerebellar hemispheres covered by pale transparent leptomeninges. The cerebral cortex and cerebral white matter are tan-white. Caudate nuclei, basal ganglia and thalami are tan. Optic nerves, optic tracks, optic chiasms are without atrophy and are symmetrical. Mammillary bodies and substantia nigra are without abnormality.

SPECIMEN EXAMINATION:

Fluids and tissues are retained for submission to NMS Lab for toxicologic evaluation. Tissues are retained for histologic examination. Fluids, tissues, fingerprints, and blotter paper are archived at this facility.

TOXICOLOGICAL EXAMINATION:

Formal toxicological analyses detect small amount of ethanol and amphetamine (Adderall). The decedent had a prescription thus, some degree of tolerance and accommodation is expected. Ethanol is not detected at intoxicating level.

Other than the above findings, examination of the specimen(s) submitted did not reveal any positive findings of toxicological significance by procedures outlined in the accompanying Analysis Summary.

Reference Comments:

1. Amphetamine - Fernoral Blood:

Amphetamine (Adderall, Dexectine) is a Schedule II phonethylamine CNS-simulant. It is used therapeutically in the treatment of narcolepsy and obesity and also in the treatment of hyperactivity in children. Amphetamine has a high potential for abuse. When used in therapy, initial doses should be small and increased gradually. In the treatment of narcolepsy, amphetamine is administered in daily divided doses of 5 to 60 mg. For obesity and children with attention deficits, usual dosage is 5 or 10 mg daily.

Following a single oral dose of 10 mg amphetamine sulfate, a reported peak blood concentration of 40 ng/mL was reached at 2 hr. Following a single 30 mg dose to adults, an average peak plasma level of 100 ng/mL was reported at 2.5 hr. A steady-state blood level of 2000 - 3000 ng/mL was reported in an addict who consumed approximately 1000 mg daily.

Overdose with amphetamine can produce restlessness, hyperthermia, convulsions, hallucinations, respiratory and/or cardiac failure. Reported blood concentrations in amphetamine-related fatalities ranged from 500 - 41000 ng/ml. (mean, 9000 ng/ml.). Amphetamine is also a metabolite of methamphetamine, benzphetamine and selegiline.

2. Ethanol (Ethyl Alcohol) - Fernoral Blood:

Ethyl alcohol (ethanol, drinking alcohol) is a central nervous system depressant and can cause effects such as impaired judgment, reduced alertness and impaired muscular coordination. Ethanol can also be a product of decomposition or degradation of biological samples. The blood alcohol concentrations (BAC) can be expressed as a whole number with the units of reg/qL or as a decimal number with units of g/100 mL which is equivalent to % w/v. For example, a BAC of 85 mg/qL equals 0.065 g/100 mL or 0.085% m/v of ethanol.

Data Limitations

General Information:

These limitations are intended to assist you in reading the event data that has been imaged from the vehicle's SRS control unit. They contain general information and are not specific to this particular event. Event data should be considered in conjunction with other available physical evidence from the vehicle and scene.

Honda and Acura passenger vehicles designated as 2013 or later model year production are designed to be compatible with the Bosch CDR tool. Only some 2012 model year vehicles are compatible with the Bosch CDR tool.

Recorded Crash Events:

Data for front, side, rear and rollover events can be recorded as either non-deployment or deployment events. Both types of events can contain precrash and crash data.

- A non-deployment event is recorded if the change in longitudinal or lateral velocity equals or exceeds 8km/h over a 150ms timeframe or another type of non-reversible deployable restraint device other than a front, side, or side curtain airbag (e.g. seatbelt pretensioner) is commanded to deploy. Except as indicated below, non-deployment events are not locked into memory and can be over-written by subsequent non-deployment or deployment events.
- A deployment event is recorded if front airbag(s), side airbag(s), or side curtain airbag(s) are commanded to deploy. Deployment events are locked into memory and cannot be over-written.

The SRS control unit typically records only one event. Two events can be recorded if the T0 (time zero) values for each event occur within 5 seconds of each other. Therefore, a non-deployment event can be recorded and locked if it occurs within 5 seconds of a deployment event.

To is established by whichever of the following occurs first: (1) the change in longitudinal velocity at the SRS control unit equals or exceeds 0.8km/h over a 20ms timeframe; or (2) the change in lateral velocity at the SRS control unit equals or exceeds 0.8km/h over a 5ms timeframe; or (3) the occupant restraint control algorithm is activated; or (4) a commanded deployment of any type of non-reversible deployable restraint device (e.g. airbag or seatbelt pretensioner). If the time to deploy equals 0, then the command to deploy occurred at T0 or the device was not commanded to deploy during the event.

TEnd (end of event) is established by whichever of the following occurs first: (1) the change in longitudinal and lateral Delta V equals or falls below 0.8km/h over a 20ms timeframe; or (2) the occupant restraint control algorithm resets; or (3) time from T0 exceeds 300ms.

- Data recorded by the SRS control unit and imaged by the CDR tool is displayed relative to T0, not the time at which the vehicle made contact with another vehicle or object.
- Pre-crash data is recorded at 2 samples per second within the 5 seconds before T0. The sampling point at 0.0 is taken at T0 and is asynchronous with the other sample points. The time between -0.5 and 0.0 is not recorded and is between 1 and 500ms.
- Delta V data is recorded at 100 samples per second from T0 to 250ms or T0 to TEnd plus 30ms.
- Acceleration data is recorded at 100 samples per second from T0 to 250ms.
- Delta V, longitudinal reflects the change in velocity that the SRS control unit experienced in the longitudinal direction during the recorded portion of the event and is not the speed the vehicle was traveling before the event.
- Depending on the severity of the event and the accelerometer characteristics, saturation of the SRS control unit longitudinal or lateral accelerometers may occur, decreasing the recorded Delta V value.
- Time, accelerometer range exceeded is recorded if saturation of the SRS control unit longitudinal, lateral and/or normal (vertical) accelerometer occurs. The recorded data is the time at which the sensor range is first exceeded.

 The maximum recording capability of Deployment Command Data is 254ms or 255ms depending on vehicle model. A recorded value of 254ms or 255ms may indicate that the recording maximum was exceeded. In this case, the deployment command may have occurred between the recorded time and TEnd.

- Occupant size classification, right front passenger airbag suppressed data is recorded as yes (suppressed) if the front passenger seat weight sensor system determined the passenger seat was empty or occupied by a child-size occupant.
- EV mode data records the vehicle powertrain status, not a driver selected operation mode. EV mode is recorded as On when the vehicle is
 moving and the internal combustion engine is not operating. EV mode may be recorded as On or Off when the vehicle is stopped.

If power to the SRS control unit is lost during an event, all or part of the data may not be recorded.

Roll Rate Data:

Vehicle roll rate data is recorded separately from the non-deployment and deployment events as described above. Therefore, the T0 for the roll
rate data may differ from the T0 for the other data in this report.

Roll rate recording trigger (T0) is established by whichever of the following occurs first: (1) a rollover algorithm ON judgment (SRS control unit decision to command deployment); or (2) a change in relative roll angle at the SRS control unit equal to or exceeding 30 degrees (roll angle is not measured, but is calculated from the roll rate data); or (3) the rollover algorithm is activated.

Once a recording trigger has been met, roll rate data is recorded for one rollover event at 10 samples per second from 1 second before to 2 seconds after T0. If a roll angle trigger is satisfied without a rollover algorithm ON judgment, the recorded roll rate data is unlocked and can be over-written by a subsequent rollover event. Roll rate data triggered by or recorded during a rollover algorithm ON judgment is locked into memory and cannot be over-written.

On Wednesday, January 24, 2018, I was assigned Lead #26A, which consisted of taking follow up photographs of the rearview camera and its capabilities of viewing as well as obtain any information from the owner's manual or user guide.

On Wednesday, January 24, 2018, at approximately 1105 hours, I responded to the Johnson County Sheriff's Office Criminalistics Laboratory and took photographs of the backup camera monitor. These photographs depict the backup camera's capabilities. A grid was setup by Crime Scene Investigators with the Johnson County Sheriff's Office Criminalistics Laboratory to assist in the documentation of its capabilities.

I also took photographs and photocopies of the owner's manual and technology reference guide. In the owner's manual, page #323 and page #324, cover the rearview camera. According to the rearview camera display section on page #323, it shows a grid area, which is displayed through the rearview camera. Each grid line has an approximate measurement from the bumper. The first dotted gridline is

approximately 20" from the rear bumper. The second grid line is approximately 39" from the rear bumper. The third grid line is 79" from the rear bumper. The fourth grid line is 118" from the rear bumper. It also states the following:

The rearview camera has a unique lens that makes objects appear closer or further than they actually are.

Under the section marked About Your Rearview Camera:

The rearview camera is view restricted. You cannot see the corner ends of the bumper or what is underneath the bumper. Its unique lens also makes closer and farther than they actually are.

Visually confirm that it is safe to drive on before backing up. Do not rely on the rearview display which does not give you all information about conditions at the back of your vehicle.

Certain conditions (such as weather, lighting and high temperatures) may also restrict the rear view. Use a soft, moist cloth to keep the lens clean and free of debris.

To turn the guild lines on or off, press and hold the RETURN button for about three seconds. If you turn the guide lines off, they remain off until you turn them back on.

The rearview camera is covered on page #8 of the technology reference guide. The guide states the following information:

For added convenience, the area behind your vehicle is displayed to help you navigate while backing up.

Under the section marked How It Works:

When you shift into Reverse (R), a real-time image of the area behind your vehicle is shown in the center display.

Yellow parking guide lines also appear to help you judge distance

The rearview display turns off when you shift out of Reverse.

Under the section marked Turning the Guide Line On or Off:

Press and hold Return for about 3 seconds.

On 01-21-18, I was assigned Lead #34 that involved reviewing the in-car video for Overland Park Police Department patrol vehicle #1P40 that was being driven by Sgt. J. Goddard on 01-20-18. The following is a synopsis of what I observed on the footage:

The video is stamped with the date, time, vehicle number, and operating officer's name.

The video begins at 17:44:45 on 01-20-18 and the vehicle is seen in the parking lot of the Overland Park Police Department at 12400 Foster St., Overland Park, KS.

17:45:15, the audio turns on as the vehicle is exiting onto Foster St.

17:45:50, dispatchers advise officers en route to the call that they will switch radio traffic to channel Tac 6.

17:46:22, Goddard states his radio number (#240) and advises he is on Tac 6 and has his "less lethal ready".

17:46:46, Goddard receives radio traffic from Officer Vendetti (radio #233) stating "this kid has run from us before" and "he's a wrestler and always bragging on how he would fight us". Goddard copies the radio traffic.

17:47:14, dispatchers inform officers that the "mom" involved in the call is en route in a silver Jeep.

17:47:40, dispatchers inform officer that they were going to advise her not to enter the house.

17:48:30, Officer Jenison (radio #234), requests a telephone number for the male subject (later identified as John Albers) "to have him come upstairs".

17:48:58, dispatchers inform officers that John is currently on Snap Chat or another form of social media and that "they are observing blood".

17:49:17, dispatchers advise that the reportee did not have a current telephone number for John and that he was currently communicating via iPad.

17:49:23, unable to understand the officer's radio traffic regarding an address.

17:49:34, Goddard advises dispatch he has arrived.

17:49:37, the patrol vehicle turns westbound onto 149th Ter. from England St. The video shows Officer Newlon on the Southside of the street near 9305 W. 149th Ter. A non-law enforcement female subject can also be seen standing near a silver SUV on the northside of the street in front of 9300 W 149th Ter. A

van is seen in the driveway of 9309 W 149th Ter., as two shots are heard. Jenison can be seen standing at the rear of the van near the end of the driveway.

17:49:40, the van can be seen accelerating in reverse in the direction of Jenison. Jenison can be seen on the rear passenger side of the van standing on the driveway and moving towards the front lawn to avoid being struck by the van. As the van continues to reverse, it then makes a 180 degree turn onto the street and continues to reverse onto the curb, sidewalk, and towards the front lawn. The van's tires can be heard squealing as it turns. Goddard activates his patrol vehicle's emergency lights as he approaches the driveway of the residence.

17:49:43, the van continues to reverse onto the grass towards Jenison. Jenison can be seen behind the van walking backwards onto the driveway, in order to avoid being struck by the van, with his firearm drawn out in his hands. He then can be heard on the radio advising dispatch of shots fired, as the van appears to slow down. As Jenison is giving his radio traffic, the van begins to speed up as it reverses towards him. The patrol vehicle drives onto the driveway towards the front passenger fender of the van, as the van continues to reverse. The video then shows Jenison moving backwards as he fires his gun twice at the van before he is out of camera view. Goddard can be heard yelling "hey".

17:49:45, approximately 11 shots are heard being fired. The rear passenger sliding door window is seen shattering, along with the front passenger window. John can be seen sitting in the front driver's seat, without a shirt on. As the shots sound, John slumps forward towards the steering wheel, then back into the seat as the last shot is heard.

The standard view of the dash camera video shows Jenison shooting twice until he is out of camera view. I reviewed the panoramic view of the dash camera footage and it shows Jenison shooting and moving backwards as the van is reversing towards him. Jenison is then seen standing near the rear passenger side fender of the van when he is firing as the van continues to reverse. Jenison is out of camera view for the last four to five shots that are fired.

17:49:47, the van is seen traveling northbound at a slow rate of speed. Goddard is heard saying "oh, my god". An officer on scene can be heard yelling "John stop the car, shit" in the background. The patrol vehicle stays parked facing southwest, but the camera continues to record.

17:49:56, an officer can be heard telling dispatch that shots had been fired and medical assistance is needed.

17:50:05, officers can be heard saying John's name. An officer then tells someone (possibly Jenison) to take deep breaths.

17:50:20, the audio begins to have pulsating sounds.

17:50:22, Goddard asks dispatchers to have Med-Act enter the scene. Dispatchers confirm the request with Goddard and he tells them to have medical come in.

17:50:36, officers can be heard attempting to get a response from John by calling his name.

17:50:45, an officer asks "is the car, are we in ne..." Goddard replies "yeah, it's off. We're good".

- 17:51:16, audio begins to cut in and out.
- 17:51:23, Goddard advises dispatchers he needs officers to block off the area.
- 17:51:39, an officer is heard asking "you got a pulse?" a reply is not heard.
- 17:51:51, Goddard is heard asking someone "are you mom?" A female subject replies that she is not and that she was trying to get ahold of John's mother, "because my daughter is the one that called the police". Goddard then tells the female that she needs to step back and away from the scene. The female asks him "did they hit him?" Goddard tells the female again to step back. The female asks Goddard "you are who I think you are, aren't you?", Goddard replies "who?". The female states "I don't know I've been with the cops so much lately, with this."
- 17:52:17, Goddard is asked by a male subject "do we know what's going on?". Goddard states "he was suicidal and he tried to run over an officer and the officer shot him". The male subject asks "GSW?" (Gun Shot Wound), Goddard says yes.
- 17:52:52, an officer advises Goddard "that's mom". The audio then is difficult to understand what is said between the officer and Goddard. Goddard then is heard asking the officer to make sure Jenison is okay.
- 17:54:32, dispatch asks Goddard "is the suspect the patient?" Goddard replies "correct".
- 17:55:51, Goddard informs dispatch that Med-Act advised "code black at 1754" hours.
- 17:57:57, Goddard states "...his name? Yeah we do. We got called to a suicide attempt, he had stabbed himself multiple times. Umm, maybe pills, maybe alcohol as well." The remainder of the comments are difficult to hear and understand due to the audio cutting in and out.
- 17:59:31, Goddard provides dispatchers with the van's Kansas license plate of tunable to hear the last character of the tag). Goddard describes the vehicle as a silver van.
- 17:59:36, Goddard is heard greeting a male subject. The male subject asks Goddard what occurred. Goddard replies "basically, we were called on a suicidal subject. Alcohol, pills involved, was stabbing himself in the home. We were arriving and Jenison, I guess, got here first and I guess he approached the house. I pull up, the car was backing at him, towards him, trying to hit him, he starts firing and the car winds up continuing going back at him. (Unable to clearly hear Goddard's comments)...across the street, spins around, pointing that way. He's 10-40". The male subject asks Goddard if the vehicle was backing as the officer is shooting. Goddard replies "uh, yeah, he's backing out of the garage and shooting at him. Uh, he fired and he's still coming towards him and fired some more and that's where he wound up, but um I mean 10-40." The male subject and Goddard continue to speak, but it is not clear as to what is said due to the audio cutting in and out.
- 18:03:00, Goddard makes contact with a female and asks her if she lives here. The female states that her daughter was the one calling the police. The female states "I know she called because he (John) was supposed to be blocked because he is not supposed to be talking to his girlfriend, who is her best friend", the audio cuts in and out and I am unable to hear what the female says clearly. The female

mentions "takes pills" and "drinking alcohol". The female continues to say that "he sent another picture saying that he had stabbed himself in the stomach, I don't know if that's true".

18:03:44, the female advises Goddard that they have "dealt with him, many times with this". Goddard asks the female if she saw what happened, she says "yes". Goddard asks the female if the Jeep belongs to her, she said yes. Goddard asks her if she would be willing to sit in her vehicle and write out a statement on what she witnessed, she agreed and said she just needed to calm down.

18:04:29, the female states she was trying to contact John's parents first but the "girls were freaking out" and she told them to call the police because they could not reach his mom. The female also makes the comment, "he's had a, that has been his mission". The female tells Goddard "I'm so sorry you had to do this and deal with". Goddard then tells Officer Vendetti to accompany the female to her vehicle, obtain a statement, and stay with her.

18:07:53, Goddard makes contact with Jenison and asks him if he was "doing alright", he replies "yeah". Goddard asks Jenison if he needs anything, then the audio stops.

18:08:59, audio can be heard again.

18:09:13, Goddard makes contact with a male subject and tells him that one of the officers is obtaining paramedic information and that Newlon is with Jenison. The male subject asks if Jenison is the shooter, Goddard says yes. Goddard advises the male subject that Vendetti was with a witness and what she told him earlier.

18:10:45, Goddard contacts another male subject who asks him what happened. Goddard explains "we got uh, a J21 subject. Apparently, uh, alcohol and pills, had stabbed himself in the basement a couple of times. Um, I'm rolling up and I can see him reversing past towards, uh, towards Jenison. Jenison opens fire and keeps trying to hit him, spins around, yeah and continues firing at him and then winds up, uh, right there." The male subject asks Goddard where the vehicle came from, he replies from the garage. Goddard then advises the male subject of Jenison's position on the driveway during the shooting. The male subject asks Goddard Jenison's current location, he states Jenison is in a patrol vehicle with Newlon.

18:12:58 through 18:14:23, Goddard speaks with a male and female. Due to the audio quality, I am unable to hear clearly what is being said.

18:14:34, the audio clears up and a female is heard telling Goddard that the Crime Lab was asking about the scene. Goddard explains to her that a vehicle was involved with a "10-40 in the vehicle". Goddard states there were multiple shots.

18:14:27, a male subject asks Goddard where Jenison was standing, he stated that most of Jenison's shooting was done while he was standing on the driveway or the front yard. Goddard states "the car spun around, I mean it was, he was flooring it. I mean it was, he was out to do some damage".

18:18:09, audio stops.

18:27:45, two officers are seen walking across the front of the patrol vehicle towards the residence (9309 W 149th Ter.). Shortly after, flash lights can be seen through the first floor windows of the house.

18:31:13, flash lights can be seen through the second floor windows of the house.

18:32:53, audio starts back up. A woman can be heard talking and breathing heavily. It is difficult to understand what she is saying. The woman is then heard crying, and mentions the word "son" $_{\odot}$

18:34:44, two officers are seen walking northbound away from the residence.

18:39:10, Goddard advises a male subject that he notified someone that "he had passed away" and that "mom" was with a friend. Goddard said she mentioned that John had been arrested today for "shoplifting".

18:41:13, a woman can be heard crying. She tells Goddard "I want to see him" and asks if she would be able to see him before he is transported. Goddard advises the woman that he would have to do some checking.

18:44:25, the patrol vehicle's emergency lights are turned off.

18:45:45, audio stops.

19:08:38, video ends.

On Saturday, 01-20-18 at approximately 1743 hours, Overland Park PD officers responded to a suicidal subject call at 9309 W. 149th Terrace in Overland Park. When officers arrived they attempted to make contact at the residence and subsequently an officer involved shooting occurred. The subject shot by police was identified as

John D. Albers WM

John was pronounced deceased at the scene. The Johnson County Officer Involved Shooting Investigation Team (OISIT) was activated to investigate the shooting.

On 01-22-18, I was assigned Lead #35, which was to review the police training records for Overland Park PD Officer Jenison. The records were provided to me by OPPD Capt. Sutterby. Officer Jenison showed to have KLETC Certification ID #28841.

Prior to attending the police academy, Officer Jenison showed to have received one training course, which was 2016 Introduction to CALEA (2 hours).

Officer Jenison attended the basic full-time police academy class at Johnson County Community College. Officer Jenison was in the 117th Class, which began on 01-06-16. Officer Jenison received 657 hours of training during the police academy.

In addition to the police academy training in 2016, Officer Jenison attended 19 other training classes, which totaled 38.5 hours of training. The training included the following subjects

Combat Range, Patrol Rifle, Patrol Rifle Practice, Plain Clothes Range, Shotgun Range, "The First 5 Minutes", Autism and Law Enforcement, Domestic Violence, Driver Training, Field Force, Hemorrhage Control, Legal Updates, Perimeters, Physical Fitness and PAT, Radio Interoperability, Reality Based Training, SFST Review, Social Media, and Uniforms and Courtesies

In 2017, Officer Jenison attended 26 training classes, which totaled 107.25 hours of training. The training included the following subjects

Combat Range, Patrol Rifle Range, Pistol and Shotgun Range, Plain Clothes Range, DOSCI Card, LE On-Site at a Community Airport, Traffic Flares, "The First 5 Minutes" (twice), ARIDE, Autism and Law Enforcement, Basic Crime Scene, Defensive Tactics, Domestic Violence, Explosive Ordnance Disposal Update, Fair & Impartial Policing, Field Force, Fitness & PAT, i/Mobile, Legal Updates, Officer Involved Shooting, Pre-Log, Report Writing, Responding to Alzheimer's Patients, Secondary Weapon & Patrol Rifle Range, and SFST Review

In 2018, Officer Jenison attended one range session, which was cold weather range training on 01-17-18. The cold weather range training showed to be 1 hour.

After reviewing the above training records, I then focused on Officer Jenison's firearms training. Officer Jenison's Firearms Training Report showed 10 entries, which totaled 10 hours of training. The details of Officer Jenison firearms training showed



On Sunday, 1/21/2018 at about 1110 hrs, Sgt. Rothwell and I responded to where we made contact with John's parents:

Upon arrival we were greeted by Mr. and Mrs. Albers at the front door an invited into the residence. We proceeded to the finished basement where we could have a conversation in private. We introduced ourselves to Mr. and Mrs. Albers and briefly explained the reason for our visit. Sgt. Rothwell told Mr. and Mrs. Albers that the investigation was still ongoing and due to that there was certain information we could not release and questions we could not answer. They were advised we did not know the answers to some questions and we would not want to give them information that was not correct. Mr. Albers asked what information could be released at this time. Sgt. Rothwell advised that their house would likely be released at some point today. Sgt. Rothwell offered assistance with cleaning some of the blood that was in the residence. Mrs. Albers stated she would appreciate that, as she wanted her other sons to see the residence as normal as possible when they return.

Sgt. Rothwell explained the process of the autopsy and stated it would be completed today. They were advised they could chose a funeral home and the arrangements could be made to transfer John to the funeral home of their choice. Mr. and Mrs. Albers stated they were still in the process of deciding which funeral home to use and would contact Sgt. Rothwell when they made the decision.

Mr. Albers stated he was upset at the fact he didn't know more details regarding the incident. He stated yesterday the was told his son had died and had stabbed himself and then he heard it was an officer involved shooting. He said they are hearing a lot of

information, but it is all coming from Facebook. Mrs. Albers asked when they would be able to know the autopsy results. I told them I didn't have an answer for that at this time. She asked to give a guess and I told her the final report could take several months, but I believed someone would be able to share preliminary results with them in a shorter time frame.

Sgt. Rothwell told Mrs. Albers that we would like to speak with them separately about the events leading up to this incident. Mrs. Albers stated she would not have a problem providing that information but stated she would rather wait until they had the opportunity to speak with their attorney. Mr. Albers identified their attorney Mike Rader. Sgt. Rothwell told Mr. and Mrs. Albers that Mr. Rader was welcome to contact him also.

Mr. and Mrs. Albers said their immediate goal was to determine a funeral home and be allowed to return to their residence. Sgt. Rothwell advised he would contact them as soon as he knew a time they could return to their residence.

We thanked Mr. and Mrs. Albers for their time and we left the residence.

Lead #37 – Interview Sgt. Jason S. Goddard

On 01-21-18, was assigned Lead #37 that involved interviewing Sgt. Jason S. Goddard with the Overland Park Police Department. At approximately 1230 hours, I called Goddard and asked him if he would be willing to meet with me at the Olathe Police Department for an interview at 1600 hours, he agreed.

At 1545 hours, Detective J. Brungardt with the Johnson County Sheriff's Department and I met with Goddard at the Olathe Police Department (501 E. Hwy. 56, Olathe, KS. 66061). I asked Goddard if he wanted to review his patrol in-car video before the interview, he said yes. I escorted Goddard to a cubicle where he reviewed the footage.

The interview was conducted and recorded in an interview room of the Investigations Division. The following is a synopsis of the interview:

I thanked Goddard for meeting with us this afternoon and informed him that I would be obtaining some preliminary information before talking about the call on W. 149th Ter.

I asked Goddard about his employment and experience in law enforcement. Goddard stated he is a Sergeant with the Overland Park Police Department and is currently assigned to squad 11 on evening shift in the patrol division. Goddard said he has been an acting Sergeant for the past six months, but "officially" a Sergeant for two weeks. Goddard has been working for the Overland Park Police Department since May of 2006. Goddard indicated he began working for the police department after he graduated college in 2006.

I asked Goddard if he is part of any other units such as a Field Training Officer. Goddard stated he used to be an FTO prior to being a Sergeant and was also a basic evidence technician. Goddard said he currently is in charge of the police department's mentor program.

Goddard's work hours currently are 1530 to 2330 hours, Thursday through Monday with Tuesday and Wednesdays being his days off. I asked Goddard when the last shift he worked prior to 01-20-18, he said Friday (01-19-18) 1530 to 2330 hours. I asked Goddard what time he left the police department on Friday, he said he was not sure because he usually hangs out at the station for a little while after his shift ends, but guessed around 0030 to 0100 hours. I asked Goddard if he recalled what time he went to sleep when he arrived home, he said no. I asked Goddard if he remembers what time he woke up on Saturday morning (01-20-18), he said around 0830 or 0900 hours. Goddard stated he usually wakes up a little earlier on the days he is working.

I asked Goddard what he did prior to going to work on 01-20-18. He said he went to the gym, ate Indian food, returned home, and got ready for work. I asked Goddard what time he arrived at the station, he said around 1515 or 1520 hours. Det. Brundgart asked Goddard if his uniform was at the station, he said no he keeps it at home. Det. Brundgardt also asked Goddard if he has a take home patrol vehicle, he said no.

I asked Goddard what uniform he was wearing on 01-20-18, he said he was wearing the exact same type of uniform he was currently wearing. I saw that Goddard was wearing a long sleeve blue uniform shirt that was displaying Overland Park Police patches with Sergeant Stripes, blue tie, duty belt with duty gear, blue duty tactical pants, and black boots. I asked Goddard if he was wearing the same duty belt and equipment, he said yes except he was given a new holster because his old one had glass fragments in it. I asked Goddard if he was wearing his protective vest under his uniform shirt, he said yes. I asked Goddard if he was wearing a coat or jacket on 01-20-18, he said no. I asked Goddard if all of his equipment and uniforms are provided by the police department, he said yes except for the boots and flashlight. Goddard stated that officers have the option to purchase their own outer vest carriers if they chose to wear one over their uniform.

I informed Goddard that the call on W. 149th Ter. was dispatched at 1743 hours. I asked Goddard what his shift was like between 1530 and 1743 hours. Goddard replied that he had "backed on a couple of calls" and that there was a "disturbance at Old Chicago" where he gave someone a trespass warning. Goddard stated he also approved a couple of reports and looked for any traffic violations. Goddard said he was also at the Overland Park Police Department to help Sgt. Hruska "post a bond".

I asked Goddard how he was dispatched to the call at 9309 W. 149th Ter., he said he was at the station when the other officers were sent to the call. Goddard said he asked for the call because he was at the station and he knew Hruska was on his way to the station to handle the bond, and he (Goddard) was close to the highway. Goddard later explained that his radio number is 230 and Hruska is 240. Goddard said the call occurred in the 240 sector that Hruska supervises, but since Hruska was already in route to the station; Goddard decided to acknowledge the call and had dispatchers show him en route.

Goddard said before he left the station, he was aware that "he's (John Albers) stabbed himself, armed, covered in blood". Goddard stated he prepared his less lethal shotgun, by collecting it from a rear cargo drawer, loading the rounds in the gun, and placing it on the floorboard of the front passenger seat. Goddard stated he prepared the shotgun in "anticipating possibly a need". Goddard later explained that the less lethal shotgun is a Remington 870 with super sock rounds. Goddard stated the officers can check out the less lethal shotguns daily, but the guns are equipped in all of the Sergeant's cars.

Goddard stated he arrived to the scene quickly and as he turns the corner of the street, "I see Officer Jenison behind a minivan, uh, the minivan is backing up. I see him (Jenison) begin to fire". Goddard said he is not sure if Jenison had fired prior to him (Goddard) arriving. Goddard continues to say "the vehicle then accelerates like a J-turn, and then he's (Jenison) now like, he was down closer to the sidewalk and now he was back towards the house and the minivan is backing up towards him again and he then proceeds to fire again. Uh, I see the driver get struck. Looks to be multiple times, goes limp, and the van rolls across the street to the yard where it rests. So then, I jump out of my car, I go running to the car with Vendetti, we check on the driver, he's clearly deceased, nothing we can do for him". Goddard states he noticed Officer Newlon was on scene and has him stay with Jenison. Goddard said once he was relieved from his post with the body, he went to check on Jenison.

I asked Goddard if he had any prior contacts at the residence before the call on Saturday, he said he did not think so. Goddard said that while he was on his way to the address, Vendetti had told him over the radio that there were prior contacts with John and that he was a wrestler and "that he maybe fought with police or ran in the past".

I asked Goddard to tell me again what he saw and what he heard as he made the turn into the neighborhood. Goddard stated dispatchers had advised that the reportee or "mom" would be arriving in a gray Jeep. He said he saw a gray Patriot parked behind a patrol vehicle. Goddard stated he saw the van backing up and Jenison behind the vehicle in a "shooting stance" as he fires into the van. Goddard continues to say that the van then moves "rapidly" and does a "J-turn". Goddard states Jenison moved closer to the garage, the van is "backing towards him", and he (Jenison) "fires again". Goddard said the driver then "slumps" down and the van rolls across into a yard.

I asked Goddard if he heard any shots being fired as he is driving towards the residence, he said "I believe so, yeah". I asked him how many shots he heard, he said "multiple". I asked Goddard if he heard anyone yelling commands, he said he heard someone yelling "stop" and "no" but was not sure who. Goddard said that at the time, Newlon, Vendetti, Jenison, and himself were on scene but he does not know who was yelling. Goddard said he initially thought Jenison was the only person on scene because the other officer's patrol vehicles were parked west of the address.

I asked Goddard if he heard anything else from officers or the driver of the van as his patrol vehicle pulled into the driveway, he said no. Goddard stated the driver of the van never said anything that he could hear. I asked Goddard what happened once the van came to a stop in the yard. Goddard replied that he thought Vendetti radioed in that shots had been fired on the primary channel. Goddard said he and Vendetti approached the van and he was on the passenger side. Goddard stated he is not sure if he shifted the vehicle into park, but he did remove the key from the ignition and placed the keys on the roof of the van. According to Goddard, Vendetti determined John did not have a pulse. Goddard said "the way he was, there was nothing that Vendetti or I could do for him to sustain life or attempt anything". Goddard continued to say that when he reviewed his video, he could see John being struck by rounds as the patrol vehicle pulled into the driveway. Goddard indicated he and Vendetti stayed with John until Med-Act arrived and they confirmed that he was deceased.

Goddard informed me that once another officer arrived on scene, the officer took over his position on the passenger side of the van. Goddard said he then began to handle his other responsibilities of making sure there is a log officer, scene security, asking for additional resources, and briefing his command staff on what happened. Goddard said he then stayed in the area until the Officer Involved Shooting Investigation Team arrived to provide direction. I asked Goddard what he did once the OISIT arrived, he said he was told that an ammunition count, weapons check, and photographs would be conducted at the police department. Goddard said he was told that the patrol vehicles would stay on scene and then he was transported to the station by someone with Olathe Police.

Goddard informed me that prior to leaving the scene, he contacted John's mother (Sheila Albers) and told her that he had passed away but did not tell her how. Goddard said he contacted School Resource Officer Tracy Gibson and had her come to the scene because she knows Sheila personally.

I asked Goddard how long he has worked with the officers on scene, he said Newlon and Jenison have worked for the department for approximately two and a half years and he was not sure about Vendetti.

I asked Goddard to describe to me what was going through his mind when he turned the corner into the neighborhood and saw what was happening at the address. Goddard said "it's a bad deal all around, I mean it's everyone's first nightmare, no one wants to, you know, have to shoot anybody". Goddard also said "we have good training and, uh, we got good people. So, kinda hope for the best".

lasked Goddard what he was thinking or what his concerns were when he saw Jenison and the van moving backwards after conducting the turning maneuver. Goddard said he is not sure what happened between Jenison and the van prior to his arrival, but "once that car did the J-turn and came back at him (Jenison), my concern was he was going to get hit with it".

Det. Brungardt asked Goddard what were the lighting and weather conditions when he arrived on scene, he said it was "light to barely dusk". Det. Brungardt asked Goddard when he realized Jenison was the officer on the call, he replied that he had recognized Jenison's voice on the radio. Goddard indicated he also recognized Jenison because Newlon, Jenison, and Vendetti are "very different looking people" and Jenison is a "big guy" with blond hair. Det. Brumgart asked Goddard if he pulled out his weapon, he said no.

I asked Goddard what happened to the less lethal shotgun he had in his patrol vehicle, he said it remained on the floorboard until he was allowed to retrieve his duty gear from the vehicle after 0100 hours in the parking lot of the police department. Goddard said he "discharged" the shotgun and placed it back in the vehicle's cargo drawer. Goddard said the shotgun was on the floorboard and had not been moved unless someone with the Crime Lab had looked at it.

I asked Goddard if he had a debrief with Jenison, he said no but he checked in on him to see how he was doing. I asked Goddard if Jenison made any statements to him about what happened, he said no that Jenison was "upset" and "teary". Goddard said he told Jenison not to worry. Goddard stated he has had previous in-house training about getting a "back statement" from officers involved in a shooting. Goddard said he felt he did not need one since he was on scene when the shooting occurred.

Det. Brungardt asked Goddard what type of weapon systems he carries in the vehicle, he said a Benelli shotgun and an AR-15. Det. Brungardt asked Goddard if he deployed any of the weapons systems out of the vehicle, he said no. Det. Brungardt asked Goddard if he drew his firearm, Taser, OC, or baton, he said no and that he knew that once the van "rolled away, he (John) was no longer in a position to be operating that car".

I asked Goddard where he was looking as he drove up to the van in the driveway, he said he was looking at the driver. I asked him if he saw John making any movements, he said he did not recall. Goddard stated he was "anticipating" that the van would come his direction and have a "collision".

Det. Brungardt reminded Goddard that he had said earlier that he heard shots being fired as he was arriving on scene. Det. Brungardt asked Goddard if he was driving with the windows of his patrol vehicle up or down, he said he did not remember but he usually drives with them a little bit down.

We asked Goddard if he had any questions, he said no. We thanked Goddard for meeting with us and advised him we would call him if there were any additional questions, he agreed. The interview was concluded, and I walked Goddard out of the building.

Video of the interview was saved onto Olathe Police Department servers.

On Sunday, 1/21/2018 at about 1650 hrs, Det. Gressel and I met with Overland Park Police Department Officer Ryan Newlon, at the Olathe Police Department. Upon meeting with Officer Newlon we went to a private office where Officer Newlon reviewed his in-car video regarding this incident. Officer Newlon reviewed the video and did not ask any questions. We then responded to an interview room and began speaking with Officer Newlon at about 1700 hrs.

Officer Newlon indicated he has been employed with OPPD for about 1 ½ years and he graduated from the Johnson County Regional Police Academy in December 2016. Officer Newlon stated he is currently assigned to the evening shift, (1430-2230 hrs) and works Saturday through Wednesday. He stated he has been on this shift for about two weeks. He indicated he is an area car, which means he typically works a certain area, but is occasionally assigned to a district if they are short. Officer Newlon indicated his area is typically South of I-435 and West of Antioch Road. Officer Newlon said yesterday (1/20/2018) he was not assigned to a district and was just working his area. Officer Newlon indicated he is not assigned to any specialty units. Officer Newlon indicated he was wearing his patrol uniform, which consist of an outer vest. He said the outer vest has his name tag and badge displayed on the front and Police displayed on the back. He indicated he was carrying a Glock 22, taser on his chest and OC spray on his belt.

I asked Officer Newlon about his evening on Friday 1/19/2018. He stated he was not working on Friday and he went to bed around 0200 hrs on 1/20/2018. He stated that was a typical time for him to go to bed while assigned to evening shift. He told me he woke up on Saturday 1/20/2018 at 1030 hrs. He stated after waking, showering and getting ready for the day he went to work out at the gym located at the Sanders station. He thought he arrived around 1300 hrs, worked out for about 30-45 minutes before getting ready for his shift to start at 1430 hrs.

I began speaking with Officer Newlon about his shift on Saturday. He stated he only remembered responding to one previous call, which was a bank alarm. He said he had spent the rest of his shift conducting self-initiated activity.

I asked Officer Newlon to tell me about the call regarding this incident. He indicated he was at 151st and Stearns, when he was dispatched on an attempted suicide call. He stated he remembered receiving information that the subject had stabbed himself in the stomach, he was on snapchat and there was blood at the scene. He said he also understood they had previous

dealings with the subject and he had expressed violent tendencies in the past. Officer Newlon said he believed he gathered all this information from radio traffic he heard while responding to the call. Officer Newlon stated he had not previously responded to this address, and further advised he had no previous dealings with John Albers.

Officer Newlon said he traveled east on 151st to England and then north on England to the street the incident occurred on. He indicated he was the first officer to arrive on scene and he parked his marked patrol vehicle about one house to the east of the dispatched address. Officer Newlon stated due to the nature of the call, he waited in his patrol vehicle for another officer to arrive. He stated once the other officer arrived, he put on gloves and started to approach the residence from the east, while the other officer, who was later identified as Officer Jenison, approached from the west. He stated after reaching the front of the house they took a moment to assess the situation. He stated they heard a large dog barking and thought they couldn't approach the front door based on the information they had. Officer Newlon said Officer Jenison asked him if he had his patrol phone on him, which he did not. Officer Newlon said he then ran back towards his patrol car to get his phone. He said while running back he observed a silver Jeep sitting in the roadway and he remembered hearing the calling party was in a silver Jeep. He said he wasn't sure if the calling party was the subject's mother or not, but he knew it was someone related to the call. He said he approached the female in the Jeep in an attempt to get a phone number for the subject inside the residence. He said at the same time he was reaching into his patrol vehicle to retrieve his phone. Officer Newlon said when he turned around and looked, he saw the garage door start to open. He said he then started making his way on the South side of the street back to where Officer Jenison was. I asked where Officer Jenison was and Officer Newlon said Officer Jenison was right by the driveway or right on the driveway. He said Officer Jenison was trying to contact the subject in the vehicle. Officer Newlon said he saw the van start to back up and heard Officer Jenison giving commands to the driver to stop. He said he saw the van accelerate rapidly and noticed it was heading right at Officer Jenison. Officer Newlon said he then heard, what he believed, were three shots. Officer Newlon said he thought he was about 100 feet away from the van when it began to back out of the garage. I asked if he heard Officer Jenison say anything. He said he heard Officer Jenison say stop, please stop, over and over again.

I then asked Officer Newlon to tell me what he was thinking while this was happening. He said, "honestly I don't know exactly what I was thinking, all I was thinking there is somebody in a van and I see the van start to back towards somebody and I start to hear the shots." Officer Newlon said he drew his gun and was starting to approach the van while also trying to maintain cover. Officer Newlon said as he was making his approach, he saw the van "swoop" around and saw Sgt. Goddard's vehicle approach. Officer Newlon said he then saw the van start to back up towards Officer Jenison and there was another volley of fire. He said he didn't remember the number of shots but thought it was about three. He said the van then went forward until it came to a rest across the street.

Officer Newlon said he began to approach the van along with Sgt. Goddard, Officer Jenison and Officer Vendetti. He said as he was approaching he was told to go with Officer Jenison. Officer Newlon said at that point he holstered his firearm and went with Officer Jenison.

I asked if Officer Jenison made any statement to him. Officer Newlon stated Officer Jenison said, "I thought he was going to run me over." He said this was one of the first things Officer Jenison said and he repeated it several times. Officer Newlon said Officer Jenison was visibly upset and was breathing heavy. He said he saw Officer Jenison do a quick check of himself and noticed he was bent over breathing heavy and his voice was cracking. Officer Newlon said he stayed with Officer Jenison the entire time he was on scene, except for a short time when Officer Jenison was in the ambulance. Officer Newlon said during this time he conducted a protective sweep of the residence along with Officer William Robbins.

I asked Officer Newlon if he could better describe where he believed Officer Jenison was in relation to the vehicle. Officer Newlon said he was in the neighbor's yard when the initial shots were fired. He stated Officer Jenison was on the back-passenger side of the van and after the van turned around, he was still on the back passenger side of the van, but he had moved to the east side of the driveway as the vehicle was turning.

Det. Gressel asked Officer Newlon if he remembered the lighting conditions during this incident. Officer Newlon stated there was a light on towards the kitchen in the house, but the lights in the front of the house were off. He was asked about the lighting conditions outside and Officer Newlon stated he could not remember. Officer Newlon was asked if there were any other civilians outside that he remembered, other than the female he talked to, and he stated there were not.

Det. Gressel and I exited the room to discuss the interview and any potential follow up questions. Upon re-entering the interview room, Det. Gressel asked if Officer Newlon could describe in further detail what he saw or heard that lead him to believe the vehicle was accelerating and heading towards Officer Jenison. He stated the reason he thought it was accelerating towards him was due to the speed of the vehicle. He said in his experience when you back out of a garage/driveway it is typically done at a "nice easy backout". He stated on this occasion the van started slowly and then, "sped up." He further advised "he was already back there, he was about an arms' reach away from the van." He stated Officer Jenison was already yelling and giving commands. Officer Newlon stated Officer Jenison was near the back right side of the van, and as the van was backing Officer Jenison was also backing away, but the van was about an arm's reach away. He said he saw Officer Jenison's arm extend out as the van was coming towards him.

Det. Gressel asked if he could better explain how the van turned. He said, "it seemed like the front of the van just whipped around in a completely different direction." He said Officer Jenison stepped around to the back side of the van to stay away from the front of it, but the van then continued backing up the driveway again, as he was trying to make his way off to the side.

I asked how far he thought the van was away from Officer Jenison, and he stated he believed it was about 3-4 feet, if not closer. He said Officer Jennison was almost directly behind the van as it initially started to back towards him after the turn. Det. Gressel asked if Officer Newlon would be able to draw a diagram describing the turn. Officer Newlon agreed to draw a diagram, which is attached to this report. While completing the diagram, Officer Newlon stated the vehicle initially backed out of the garage, completed the turn near the end of the driveway, and then backed up the driveway towards the residence again.

Officer Newlon was asked if he discharged any of his weapons and he stated he did not. He also stated he did not retrieve any weapons from his vehicle.


Officer Newlon was asked if he could briefly describe what he saw when he conducted the protective sweep of the residence with Officer Robbins. Officer Newlon stated the reason for the sweep was to make sure there was nobody else in the residence. He said they started in the garage due to the door already being open. They entered the kitchen, where they saw alcohol bottles, an empty pill bottle and a bloody knife on the counter and blood on the floor. He said there was not a whole lot of blood and he expected to see more blood based on the information he received while enroute to the call. He said those were the main things of note as they made their way through the house. He said they did locate a canine in the upstairs master bedroom. Officer Newlon said after clearing the house he returned to Officer Jenison and eventually drove him to the Sanders station.

Det. Gressel and I thanked Officer Newlon for his time and concluded the interview. This interview was video recorded and later uploaded to MIDAS by OPD Detective Spegal.

On 01/21/2018, I (Det. McMillian) and Det. L. Smith, were assigned lead 39 which was to contact OPPD Officer Adam Vendetti and arrange for an interview.

At approximately 1230 hours, I contacted Officer Vendetti via his cell phone. After introducing myself to him, I requested him to respond to the Olathe Police Department for a voluntary interview. Officer Vendetti agreed to respond at 1430 hours.

Upon his arrival, Officer Vendetti was allowed to review his in-car video of his response and actions taken to this incident. After viewing the in-car video, Officer Vendetti was escorted to interview room 3 which was being recorded. It was explained to Officer Vendetti that this interview was voluntary on his behalf. Officer Vendetti's interview was recorded and attached with this case.

Officer Vendetti advised he began working for the Overland Park Police Department in 2015. Prior to Overland Park, Officer Vendetti worked for the Middletown Township Police Department in New Jersey for 13 years. Officer Vendetti is currently assigned to the Patrol Division with Overland Park on evening shift in area 3. He works from 1430-2230 hours. In addition to Officer Vendetti's patrol responsibilities, he is also on the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT), an evidence tech and is also a Mentor to new officers.

On the date of this incident (01/20/2018), Officer Vendetti was working his normal shift in area 3 in district 233 which is also his radio number. In this district, the boundaries are from approximately 123rd Street down to 143rd Street and from the Olathe border to Antioch. Prior to his shift yesterday and going to work, Officer Vendetti said

he slept for approximately 7 hours. After the incident and going home last night, Officer Vendetti advised he slept for approximately 8 hours prior to coming in for the interview.

When the call came out for this incident, Officer Vendetti was patrolling a construction area in his district around 133rd street. He heard the radio call get dispatched involving Unit 234 (Officer Jenison) and Unit 237 (Officer Newlon). It was dispatched as a J-21 (suicidal subject). They were given information that the suicidal subject was broadcasting himself on video, and was armed with a knife, stabbing himself. Officer Vendetti advised it was reported there was also a lot of blood as they were dispatched. Officer Vendetti pulled the call notes because of the type of call it was and the fact that he is also a CIT. The call involved John whom he was familiar with and has been on calls at this location before. Approximately 4-6 weeks ago, John had battered after drinking a bunch of alcohol. John had started to flee towards the west, which is why Officer Vendetti staged his response to that side of the street. They ended up having to take John to the hospital to get a medical clearance at St. Luke's South, prior to John being admitted to Marillac. John told the officers at the time that if they took him to Marillac, he wouldn't fight the police. Officer Vendetti said approximately a week or two after this call, he was familiar with officers dealing with John again and him stealing his dad's car. Officer Vendetti didn't have direct involvement with this call. Officer Vendetti advised during that call, John was reported as an endangered juvenile runaway.

Officer Vendetti continued going through his response to the scene. Officer Vendetti broadcast over the radio that John has previously run from the police and made statements of being a wrestler and wanting to fight the police on prior contacts. Officer Vendetti said he pulled up the map to the call and he could see that the other 2 units were approaching from England Street. He turned off his siren as he began to the approach the residence on 149th Terrace. As he was pulling in, his perception of the way Officer Jenison standing in the driveway, was that Officer Jenison was in a shooting stance. Officer Vendetti advised he had "tunnel vision" at this point and could see Officer Jenison standing in this position and he could see the garage was open at the residence.

Officer Vendetti advised he had no idea of what was going on inside the garage. He didn't know if John was standing there with a knife, since it was reported he was armed. Officer Vendetti advised because of the tunnel vision, if there was radio traffic about what Officer Jenison was seeing, he didn't hear it. Officer Vendetti then sees the silver minivan backing out of the garage towards Officer Jenison. Officer Vendetti advised he could not tell the angle of the vehicle backing out in reference to Officer Jenison's position. Officer Vendetti explained that he couldn't tell if Officer Jenison was directly behind the vehicle or off to the side and did not know what Officer Jenison perceived.

Within seconds of the van coming out of the garage, Officer Vendetti advised he heard the first couple of gunshots. Officer Vendetti advised, and you could hear him say

on the in-car video, "what the fuck" and he then "slammed" his patrol vehicle into park. As Officer Vendetti is exiting his vehicle, the silver minivan does a turnaround as he approaches. After the silver minivan turns around, Officer Vendetti jumps out of the way as a reaction. Officer Vendetti explained that he was reacting to more gunshots and he did not know what was going on. Officer Vendetti did not know if the shots were coming from Officer Jenison or from John inside the minivan. Officer Vendetti later advised that he knew John still had control of the van because it went from reverse back to drive.

After the shots rang out, Officer Vendetti began giving commands to John to stop the van. When Officer Vendetti was giving commands to John to stop the van, the van was rolling forward towards him. Officer Vendetti advised he then ran up to the driver's side door of the van as it approached the neighbor's house. Officer Vendetti was asking Sgt. Goddard if the vehicle was in park because he was worried about the van continuing into the neighbor's house. At this point, Officer Vendetti advised that he could see John slumped over in the driver's seat (he demonstrated on video). Officer Vendetti advised that he had to lift John's head up as he was reaching across the front of him to check John's pulse. Officer Vendetti used his left hand to check the right side of John's neck. Officer Vendetti advised that he could not find a pulse on John's carotid artery and believed him to be dead. As he was checking on John, Officer Vendetti also advised that he began calling out shots fired on his police radio and requested medical personal to respond "ASAP". Later in the interview, Officer Vendetti described that as the minivan was passing him in the street, he could see John slumped over in the seat.

Officer Vendetti advised when he observed John, John did not have a shirt on. Officer Vendetti was not sure of what type of pants John was wearing, but thought it could be gray sweats. Officer Vendetti said he could see an injury he believed to be a gunshot wound on top of John's right shoulder and he could see blood all over John's abdomen. Officer Vendetti advised there was blood coming from John's face. Officer Vendetti said all of this happened very quickly and he was doing multiple things at the same time, while also being concerned for officer safety. Officer Vendetti said that Sgt. Goddard just appeared to him at the passenger window of John's van. It wasn't until he reviewed the video that he could see what Sgt. Goddard had done as Sgt. Goddard arrived.

Officer Vendetti was not sure how the minivan came to a stop. Officer Vendetti said he can only assume that John's foot came off the accelerator pedal. Officer Vendetti said he remembers trying to locate the gear shift for the van and he couldn't find it. Officer Vendetti advised he can only assume Sgt. Goddard put the van into park. Officer Vendetti advised that he remembers seeing Officer Newlon approaching them and then he saw Officer Jenison. Officer Vendetti advised he saw Officer Jenison's face as he was walking up to the van and Officer Jenison was "all fucked up". When Officer Vendetti was describing seeing Officer Jenison's face after the shooting, Officer Vendetti became emotional as he recalled the events. Officer Vendetti told Officer Newlon to take Officer

Jenison to Officer Vendetti's patrol car to keep him away from John. Officer Vendetti said he wasn't sure if Officer Jenison knew at that time if John was dead. Officer Vendetti advised he remained at the van until the medical units arrived. Officer Vendetti updated medical personnel about John's condition. The medical units were on a different radio channel and it was Officer Vendetti's perception that they were not aware that shots had been fired.

After the medical units took over, Officer Vendetti advised he went to check on Officer Jenison and Newlon. He also advised that who was associated somehow with John's family had responded to the scene. was walking up to the scene and the van. Officer Vendetti escorted back to her vehicle, took down her information which he later passed on to a supervisor on scene. did indicate that she was with someone else initially at the scene, but that person left. Officer Vendetti believed it could be daughter. Sgt. Hasz asked Officer Vendetti to run John in the computer and pull his history for responding investigators and Med-Act. Officer Vendetti advised he didn't take any statements from anyone at the scene. Officer Vendetti advised this should all be on his in-car video because the cameras were still recording at this point. Major Henson later deactivated his equipment. Officer Vendetti was then put on perimeter security on the west side of the scene until relieved to respond back to his PD. Officer Vendetti never unholstered his weapon during this incident.

Officer Vendetti described after seeing his in-car video, it assisted him with details that he had not observed or seen when he initially arrived. Officer Vendetti advised because of his tunnel vision, he was focused on Officer Jenison and didn't see Officer Newlon and Sgt. Goddard until after the shooting. Officer Vendetti also described his memory of the event more like snapshots and photographs then one fluid memory of what happened during this call.

Officer Vendetti advised he was dressed in his long sleeve duty uniform with a mock turtle neck. His ballistic vest is worn underneath his uniform shirt. His badge and name plate were pinned to his uniform shirt, along with his service stars and his CIT pin. His duty gear is placed around his waist on his duty belt, which includes in his department issued Glock 22 .40 caliber handgun, 2 extra magazines, a taser and an ASP (collapsible baton). Officer Vendetti said he is left hand dominate and carries his duty gun on his left side. Officer Vendetti also carries a folding knife that is his own, not issued by his agency. Officer Vendetti advised he does not wear a body camera. In reference to his in-car video, the camera automatically turned on during this event because his emergency equipment was activated. The microphone worn on his belt also is set to automatically turn on, which it did in this case. Officer Vendetti did not utilize any other recording equipment during this incident.

On Saturday evening, 01-20-18, Overland Park PD officers responded to a suicidal subject call at 9309 W. 149th Terrace in Overland Park. When officers arrived, they attempted to make contact at the residence and subsequently an officer involved shooting occurred. The subject shot by police was identified as

John D. Albers WM

John was pronounced deceased at the scene. The Johnson County Officer Involved Shooting Investigation Team (OISIT) was activated to investigate the shooting.

On 01-24-18, Olathe PD Det. Spegal and I were assigned Lead #40, which was to interview

Overland Park PD Officer Clayton Jenison
WM

Clayton voluntarily responded to the Olathe PD at approximately 1345 hours. Clayton was with his attorney,

Morgan Roach

Clayton and Attorney Roach were provided a private room prior to the interview to watch OPPD in-car video files of the incident. The in-car video provided to Clayton was the Watch Guard video from his patrol unit and the Watch Guard video from Overland Park PD Officer Newlon's patrol unit. Based on where Clayton parked his patrol vehicle, video of the shooting incident was not captured, which was the reason he was allowed to view video from Officer Newlon's patrol unit. After reviewing video, Attorney Roach exited the room and advised they were ready to proceed with making a statement.

At approximately 1427 hours, Clayton, Attorney Roach, Det. Spegal, and I moved to an interview room. Clayton was advised he was there to make a voluntary statement, which he understood.

Prior to asking Clayton about the shooting incident, we obtained background information. Clayton stated he was hired by Overland Park PD on 12-07-2015. Clayton advised he had no

prior police experience, but served in the military. He attended the police academy from January 2016 through April 2016. Following his police academy graduation, Clayton completed the field training program. Clayton stated he was currently assigned to the Patrol Division and was work evening shift. Clayton advised his assigned district was 234, which is located in south Overland Park. Clayton said his shift hours were from 1430 hours to 2230 hours. Clayton stated his current days off were Thursdays and Fridays.

Clayton provided details about his uniform, which included his outer vest displaying an Overland Park police badge and the word "POLICE" on the back. Clayton said the outer vest carried the majority of his equipment to include his police radio. Clayton stated he wore a long sleeve patrol uniform under his outer vest, which displayed an Overland Park PD patch on one sleeve. Clayton stated his duty weapon was a Glock 22 .40 caliber handgun issued by his department. Clayton advised he carried his handgun on his right side (strong side) of his duty belt.

Clayton was asked about any recent training. Clayton advised on Wednesday of last week (01-17-18) he attended a "cold weather" range, which focused on officers using their weapons while wearing gloves. Clayton stated during the range he shot his patrol rifle and Glock 22 handgun.

Clayton advised on Friday, 01-19-18, he was off work and went to bed at approximately 2230 hours. Clayton said he woke up on Saturday morning, 01-20-18 between 0800 and 0830 hours. Clayton advised he went to Hy-Vee, Dunkin Doughnuts, and spent time relaxing with his wife prior to going to work.

Clayton stated he went into service following shift change/roll call on 01-20-18. He could not recall exactly what his patrol activities were prior to the incident. Clayton recalled trying to get his vehicle washed, but a fire call came out and the car wash was not working. Clayton said he drove south to the fire call/gas leak, which was in the area of W. 179th and Quivira. Clayton said he possibly stopped a vehicle, but he was not sure.

Clayton was asked to provide his account for what occurred when he responded to a call on W. 149th Terrace. Clayton was allowed to provide his account of the incident uninterrupted. At the conclusion of his account, follow up questions were asked regarding additional details. Below is a summary of the information Clayton provided.

Clayton stated he responded from area of 143rd and Grant. Clayton could not recall the exact address of the call, because the in-car computer maps the call for him. Clayton advised the info for the tall showed an attempted suicide. Clayton said he drove lights and sirens to the call. Clayton stated he parked on a side street near the address and thought his camera was pointed at the house. Clayton advised while enroute to the call dispatch advised the subject had been actively cutting himself and was threatening to stab himself. Clayton said dispatch advised the subject's parents were not home and that the subject had sent out information via social media. Clayton could not recall if he had handled a call at the address previously. Clayton mentioned they had recently switched shifts and only worked the area for about two weeks.

Clayton stated he switched over to TAC 6 (radio channel) and approached the address on foot with Officer Newlon. Clayton advised he positioned himself behind a tree in the front yard and could hear a dog barking from within the home. Clayton advised he shined his light on the windows of the house. Clayton said dispatch had provided info about the subject's mother being enroute to the address in a white Jeep. Clayton said Officer Newlon left his position and returned toward his vehicle to get a phone. At around the same time, a female arrived in a white SUV. Clayton believed the female was the subject's mother and Officer Newlon made contact with her.

Clayton stated he felt he could best cover the front door if the subject exited the house, by standing closer to the garage door, so he moved from the tree toward the garage door area. Clayton said this area would offer him protection if the subject exited the front door and he felt he could control the situation from that position. Clayton said he did not know the subjects intentions, which could have been "self-harm" or "homicidal tendencies."

Clayton advised as he moved toward the garage, the garage door began to open. Clayton commented the subject's mother opened the garage door when she arrived, but then Clayton said he was not sure if the subject's mother opened the garage door or if the subject did.

Clayton said to contain the area and not knowing what was in the garage, not knowing what the subject's relationship with his mother was (who he believed to be standing on the road with Officer Newlon), he unholstered his service weapon and approached. Looking into the garage, Clayton observed a silver van with the brake lights on. Clayton later stated he did not see anyone in the vehicle, but when the reverse lights came on he knew someone was in the vehicle. Clayton then commented he knew the subject was home by himself. Clayton said he wanted to contain the situation and not let the subject leave, which is why he was behind the vehicle.

Clayton states the van started moving backward. Clayton stated he told the subject to stop, but he did not stop. Clayton said he tells the subject to stop again. Clayton described himself as "running backwards" at this time. Clayton said he was "afraid he was going to hit me", which was the reason he "shot" the first time. Clayton could not provide a distance on how far the vehicle was away from him, but stated it felt like it was "from me to you" away. During the interview, Clayton and I were seated approximately 5 feet away. Clayton said he felt it was "pretty close" to him and it was not stopping. Clayton stated he felt the vehicle was going fast enough to be a threat and cause him bodily harm. Clayton was not sure how many rounds he fired but said "two to three." Clayton was asked what caused him to stop shooting during this initial backing incident. Clayton said he was not sure, but commented about getting out of the way and trying to get on his radio. Clayton said after watching the video, it might be because the brake lights coming on, but he was not sure. Clayton was not able to provide any further detail about his movements of getting out of the way from the van.

Clayton said after these shots were fired he got on his radio to inform shots had been fired. Clayton advised the vehicle accelerated in reverse rapidly past him. Clayton described the

vehicle as doing a "U-turn" that caused the rear of the vehicle to be facing toward him again. Clayton described himself as being positioned "dead center" right between the wheels. Clayton said the vehicle accelerates back toward him. As Clayton described this the first time his voice cracked and he paused to take a deep breath. Clayton said he fires again "fearing" he was going to be struck. Clayton said "I believed he was going to hit me." Clayton again described himself as "running" backwards as the vehicle backs up toward him. Clayton said he fired until the vehicle started moving forward. Clayton stated "he" does stop and goes forward. Clayton said when the vehicle began moving forward he felt it was no longer a threat to him, which was when he stopped firing. Clayton was not sure how many rounds he fired, but thought it was between "five and seven." Clayton was asked during this time if he could see the driver, but Clayton advised he never saw the driver until he approached the vehicle to assist with live saving measures.

Clayton said the vehicle came to a rest in the neighbor's yard across the street. Clayton said he holstered his weapon and moved to the vehicle to help assist in performing life saving measures. Clayton commented the reason they were sent to the call was to help the subject. Clayton stated his intentions on that day were not to shoot the subject, but instead get him the help he needed.

Clayton said as he approached the vehicle, Officer Vendetti instructs Officer Newlon to get him (Clayton) back. Clayton said Officer Newlon escorted him to the back of Officer Vendetti's vehicle. Clayton was asked about any conversation that took place between him and Officer Newlon. Clayton recalled breaking down and saying "I thought he was going to hit me." Clayton described himself as being very emotional, crying, and at one point dry heaving. Clayton stated he was later placed in a patrol car in an attempt to get him to relax.

Clayton stated he did not know when Sgt. Goddard arrived on scene, but recalled his vehicle pulling up. Clayton said he did not know when Officer Vendetti arrived, because he did not recall seeing him until the van had rolled across the street.

At approximately 1500 hours, we took a break and exited the interview room. At approximately 1509 hours, the interview was continued.

Clayton was asked to further explain his movement around the time the garage door was going up. Clayton said he moved from the tree, which was not a lot of cover for him, closer to the house. Clayton said as he walked closer to the house the garage door was opening. Clayton said he unhoistered his weapon. Clayton said he knows he is there for someone who attempted suicide, but he does not know what is waiting for him inside the garage. Clayton said the vehicle is "on" and reverse lights are on. Clayton said his main thing was to keep "him here", so they could get him help. Clayton said the vehicle started reversing and he told him to stop. Clayton said the vehicle does not stop. Clayton said he was moving backward and again tells "him to stop", but he does not stop. Clayton said he shoots and tried to move out of the way. Clayton said he then gets on the radio saying "shots fired."

Clayton was asked what he was thinking when the vehicle was backing toward him after he told the driver to stop. Clayton responded "I am thinking he was going to hit me." Clayton said he was afraid if he was hit that he was going to get knocked down and run over. Clayton stated he did not want that to happen and added he did not know what "his" (driver's) intent was.

Clayton stated he had not discussed the incident with anyone outside of his spouse, attorney, and peer support group with work.

Clayton was asked if he had any information to add that was not covered in the interview. Clayton stated he provided all the information he could recall. Attorney Roach was asked if he had any further questions, but he did not.

The interview was concluded at approximately 1514 hours. The interview was recorded on video. A DVD with the recorded interview was later provided to Det. Spegal, so it could be placed into the Olathe PD property room as evidence.

On 01/22/2018, I (Det. James McMillian) and Det. L. Smith, were assigned lead 43 to interview Overland Park Fire and Med-Act personnel that responded to the scene. We were informed that Engine 45 responded to the scene which included Firefighters John Heffernon, Ryan Konzem, Danny Meeker and John Gottshall. Med-Act unit 1145 included Shawn Morkert and Gabe Hajmohammad.

I called Captain John Heffernon who advised that all the above listed personnel were currently on duty at Fire Station 5, 16279 Antioch Rd. Overland Park, KS. Captain Heffernon requested we could respond to their location to speak with them. After arriving, Det. Smith and I contacted the crew. I spoke with Shawn Merkert, John Gottshall and John Heffernon. Det. Smith contacted Ryan Konzem, Daniel Meeker and Gabe Hajmohammad.

Shawn explained that he works for Overland Park Med-Act and rides with Gabe Hajmohammad. Gabe works for Johnson County Med-Act. Shawn said all Overland Park Med-Acts are shared with Johnson County like this. Each ambulance has a paramedic and a lieutenant, but it could vary which agency has the supervisor.

Shawn advised they were dispatched to this call as a code 2 behavior subject and to stage for the police. Code 2 is one unit going emergency response and other units just responding without emergency equipment. Shawn was driving the ambulance and Gabe was navigating. While en route, their response was upgraded to a code 1 response, but they still needed to stage and wait for the police to clear the scene. It was reported that a male was stabbing himself in the basement of the home. Police cars were also passing them in emergency response. They staged near a library located around the corner from the residence. Shawn said they had just pulled into their staging area when they received a radio call giving them clearance to respond. Shawn said he recalled thinking that the clearance to enter happened quickly, because usually it takes a while for the police to clear the scene for them to enter it. Shawn also advised their radio dispatchers are separate from the police and don't hear updates directly from the police officers on scene.

After hearing the scene was secure, they responded to the residence. Shawn said as they rounded the corner to turn onto 149th Terrace, something didn't seem right. Gabe told him the address was a couple houses down the street on their left. Shawn could see a police car parked sideways in the driveway with a door open. Shawn said this is not a typical response that he sees from the police. He confirmed the address again with Gabe and parked. Shawn saw another police car had parked in the street in front of him and

then saw a minivan that was in the yard across the street. Shawn said the van in the yard added to his confusion because he thought they were going to a residence. As they were getting out of the ambulance, one of the officers told them the call involved the van. Shawn said he started to realize that this situation was a high stress situation based upon how the police were acting. A woman was also approaching the scene and an officer was giving her commands to stay back.

Shawn said he moved to the driver's side of the minivan and as he was walking up he noticed the driver's side mirror was broken and it appeared to be a bullet hole. He started seeing that windows of the van were broken and sees the driver of the minivan is slumped to his left with a moderate amount of blood on him. Shawn realized this is more than a person stabbing themselves in the basement.

Shawn then began scanning the driver for injuries and began medical treatment. One of the officers told him that the driver had been shot. Shawn added that this all happened in a matter of seconds. Shawn said he checked for a pulse on the patient's carotid artery. He also held up the patient's head to see if he could establish an airway. Other medics were helping get their monitoring equipment set up while Shawn put the pads on the patient. The lines for the pads had been snapped on and Shawn put a pad on each of the patient's upper arms and on each side of the patient's abdomen. Shawn said the patient was not showing any signs of life through the monitoring equipment. He also attempted to listen to the patient's heartbeat by using a stethoscope. Shawn requested Ryan Konzem to check for a pulse which he did on the carotid artery as well. Shawn said he went through 4 checks (including Ryan's) to determine if the patient was showing any signs of life. Shawn then pronounced the patient type black (deceased).

Shawn said he could tell more things were going on beyond the initial call, so he and the crew were trying to be mindful of the crime scene. Shawn said he accessed the patient through the driver's door window and did not open the door. He recalled another firefighter letting them know the van was in park when they initially got there. Shawn and Ryan were the only people from his crew that had contact with the patient's body.

Shawn said the patient was slumped over to his left and was seat belted in the van. The patient was not wearing a shirt and he could see stab wounds on his abdomen. Shawn observed an injury to the patient's right shoulder that looked consistent with a gunshot wound. Shawn observed blood dripping from behind the patient's left ear, but he did not locate the source of the blood. Shawn observed what he thought were old injuries on the patient's right wrist and saw writing on the patient's left forearm. He specifically remembered seeing written in a heart. Shawn remembered this because he calls his wife with the same spelling. He also noticed the patient's skin changing color, turning into a pasty white which was not that way when they arrived. Shawn said this indicated to him how fresh this scene was. Shawn observed glass shards scattered throughout the van and on the patient.

Shawn was contacted by a female officer that he assumed was an investigator and was asked to evaluate the officer that was involved in the shooting. Shawn contacted Officer Jenison in the back of the ambulance and did an assessment on him. Shawn said Officer Jenison was hyped up and his adrenaline was still going. His heart rate and blood pressure were extremely elevated. Officer Jenison told Shawn that he thought the van was going to hit him. Officer Jenison said he didn't think he had fallen, he wasn't sure if he was shot and he didn't think he got hit by the van. Officer Jenison told him that the van was backing out of the garage right at him and he had to jump out of the way. Officer Jenison told him that he pulled out his weapon, he had to shoot and then the van turned around and started coming at him again. Officer Jenison said he had to shoot again and was not sure if the subject in the van was shooting back at him.

I contacted Firefighter John Gottshall. Gottshall advised he was the engine driver for this call. The call was dispatched as a code 2 behavioral. They followed the ambulance on the way to the call without their emergency lights. As they approached 151st and Antioch he remembered seeing a white police SUV driving with its emergency equipment on passing by. As they continued to the scene the call got upgraded to a code 1 stabbing. They staged around the corner from the residence and were not there very long when they were cleared to enter the scene. As he followed the ambulance to the residence he saw a white police SUV parked sideways in the driveway. Gottshall assumed it was the same police vehicle that passed them earlier. Gottshall said he was trying to figure out what was going on because the police usually don't park their vehicles on a scene like this.

Gottshall got out of the fire truck and observed a van parked across the street in the yard. The Med-Act crew and firefighters went to the minivan and he approached the driver's side. He could see that the driver's door window was busted out. He observed the patient in the driver's seat with blood on him and a bullet wound on his shoulder. Shawn and Ryan were checking and treating on the patient. Gottshall did not have any direct involvement with the patient. Gottshall also advised one of the officers on scene had told them the patient had been shot and it wasn't until later he learned it involved an officer. Gottshall said Shawn treated the police officer in the ambulance. Gottshall said the officer looked "distraught" and "really freaked out". Gottshall did not speak or interact with the officer.

I spoke with Firefighter Captain John Heffernon. Heffernon said they were dispatched to a self-inflicted stabbing in the basement of a residence and to stage for the police department. They staged a block or two away from the residence. They hadn't been stopped in the staging area for much more than a minute when they receive radio traffic that the scene was clear. As they arrived, he began to walk towards the residence. He remembered thinking it was unusual because there was a police car parked crooked in the driveway with the door open. He then heard someone yelling at them that it was

"over here" at which time he observed a minivan in the yard across the street. Heffernon said he didn't even see the minivan when they arrived because he was looking on the other side of the street trying to identify addresses.

Heffernon said that most of the crew approached the minivan on the driver's side but he went to the passenger side. He remembered seeing a police officer at the passenger door. Heffernon said he looked into the minivan and verified the minivan was in park. One of the officers told him that this involved multiple gunshots. Heffernon said he remained on the passenger side of the van and let the paramedics work with the patient. Shawn made the notification that the patient was type black. Heffernon advised he made the notifications through his chain of command because they were going to be on scene for an extended period of time. Heffernon said he remembers hearing an officer talking about dealing with the patient before. In the previous contacts, the patient was suicidal, but the officers had been able to talk him down.

The following interviews were conducted by Det. L. Smith. His report is listed below.

On Monday, January 22, 2018, I was assigned Lead #43, which consisted of interviewing the fire/medical staff from the Overland Park Fire Department and Johnson County Med Act, who had responded to the call.

On Monday, January 22, 2018, at approximately 1045 hours the prearranged interview
began of GHALIB A. HAJMOHAMMAD, W/M, (cell phone #
The interview was audio recorded and later uploaded to this case file. The
following is a summary of the interview:

Ghalib stated he is employed by Johnson County Med Act and is assigned to Overland Park Fire Station #5. On Saturday, January 20, 2018, he was assigned to Unit #1145 and his partner was Lt. Shawn Morkert with the Overland Park Fire Department.

Ghalib explained they were dispatched to a code 2 behavioral call and were told to stage for the police. Ghalib said they arrived in the area and staged at the library down the street from the call. He said they were dispatched on the main fire channel and upon their arrival, they switched to the operations channel. Ghalib said he pressed the button on their mobile data terminal (MDT) to show his unit had arrived. He said while en route to the scene they were told the patient had lacerations to the abdomen and chest and Overland Park Medical Center (OPR) was the closest trauma hospital. Ghalib said he received a lot of information on the MDT, but he didn't have time to read it has they were informed the scene was secure and they could respond to the address.

Ghalib explained upon their arrival, he saw a police car parked in front of the house and the garage door to the house was open. He said they stopped in front of the house and

were summoned over, by an officer, to a gray Honda Odyssey. Ghalib said when they were initially dispatched to the call, they were told the victim was in the basement.

Ghalib said he grabbed the cardiac monitor and jump bag and followed Lt. Morkert over to the vehicle. Ghalib said he looked at the patient and saw lacerations to his belly. Ghalib said he could not tell how deep they were. Ghalib explained the patient was sitting in the driver seat of the van and didn't believe the subject had a seat belt on.

According to Ghalib, Lt. Morkert hooked up the cardiac leads to the patient and used a stethoscope to check for vitals. Ghalib said they were following crime scene protocols, meaning he was handing Lt. Morkert the equipment so there was only one person touching the patient. He said Lt. Morkert did not find any signs of life and had another firefighter, who is a paramedic, also check for a pulse on the patient. Ghalib identified this firefighter as Ryan Konzem. Ghalib said after this took place, he got on his firefighter radio and advised dispatch that the patient was triaged type black, meaning deceased. He said he heard Battalion Chief Brian Eitel acknowledge his radio transmission as well. Ghalib said he left the cardiac leads on the patient since he was pronounced dead.

Regarding Ghalib's observations at the scene, he said the vehicle was in the middle of the yard and he saw what he thought were "brake marks" in the yard. He said it looked like the driver had slammed on the brakes and stopped in the middle of the yard. He also said the ground was wet. Ghalib said he did not hear anything being said that was relevant to this case while at the scene.

Ghalib said after about 5 to 10 minutes of being on the scene, a medical evaluation was done on the Overland Park Officer. He said this was performed by Lt. Morkert inside their ambulance. He said he assisted in the medical evaluation by putting the blood pressure cuff and oxygen sensor on the officer. He said Battalion Chief Eitel was also present in the ambulance when the medical evaluation was conducted. He said the officer was crying and Battalion Chief Eitel was speaking with him.

Ghalib said he did not write any reports on this incident as Lt. Morkert did all of the documentation. No other pertinent information was obtained and my interview with Ghalib concluded.

On Monday, January 22, 2018, at approxim	ately 1108 hours, the prearranged interview
took place of RYAN M. KONZEM, W/M,	(cell phone # 9
The interview with Ryan was audio recorde	ed and later uploaded to this case file. The
following is a summary of the interview:	

Ryan is a firefighter/paramedic with the Overland Park Fire Department. Ryan is normally assigned to Station #4, but worked at Station #5 on the day of the incident.

Ryan stated they were dispatched to a self-inflicted stabbing and were told to stage for the police. Ryan said during the response, he was in one of the jump seats on Engine 45 (E45) and Captain Heffernon was in charge of the radio traffic. He said they staged about a block away from the scene. Ryan was not familiar with the location; therefore, he did not know the area of where they staged.

Ryan said he heard the scene was secure, so they responded to the scene. He said since he is a paramedic his duties at the scene could either be patient care or firefighter related. He said when they arrived, he got the cot out of the ambulance and took it over to the ambulance crew. He said he saw the patient and was told by Lt. Morkert that this was an officer involved shooting and not just a stabbing. He said he helped the ambulance crew with patient assessment.

Ryan said he could visually see that the patient was not breathing, and he checked the carotid artery on the right side of the patient's neck. He did this with protective gloves on. Ryan said the monitor showed pulseless electrical activity and then asystole (cardiac flat line). I confirmed with Ryan that these findings are not conducive for signs of life.

Ryan described the victim as having a pale complexion. He said he observed two stab wounds on the left side of the victim's abdomen, a bullet injury to the victim's right shoulder and a bullet injury to the back of the victim's head. He described this bullet injury as "oozing" and "draining" blood. Ryan later said the victim was not wearing a shirt and he could not recall what type of pants the victim had on. He said the victim was located in a gray minivan.

Ryan said he wrote a report on this event and Captain Heffernon will know how to get a copy of it. No other pertinent information was obtained and the interview with Ryan concluded.

Daniel is a firefighter at Overland Park Fire Department Station #5. Daniel said they were dispatched to a behavioral call and he was in the jump seat on the driver side during their response to the scene. He said they responded and staged in the area of 151st Street and England. He said the call notes on the Mobile Data Terminal (MDT), indicated the subject had stabbed himself and was located in the basement of the residence.

Daniel said they heard the scene was secure, so they responded to the scene. Daniel said since he was on the driver side, the house they were sent to was on his side of the vehicle.

He said when they pulled up he noticed a police car at the house and the garage door to the house was open. He said there was some confusion at the scene as he had started to walk up the driveway to the house and was told by Captain Heffernon that the victim was in a vehicle.

Daniel said he went down to the vehicle on the passenger side and put his head in the open window. Daniel later said the glass on the front passenger side window was broken out and some of the glass was on the front passenger seat. He said he saw Shawn Morkert and Ryan Konzem at the front driver side door of the vehicle with the victim. Daniel said he opened the front passenger door, put his hand on the passenger seat to steady himself, and checked to make sure the vehicle was in park. Daniel said he was wearing nitrile gloves and was careful not to put his hands on blood or glass that was on the passenger seat.

Daniel said he waited to see if they were going to do patient care, left the passenger side of the vehicle and went over to the driver side. He said he was standing by the driver side mirror and saw the victim. He said the victim had two stab wounds on his abdomen and was not wearing a shirt. Daniel later said he saw a bullet wound on the victim's right shoulder, which he described as a "graze" or "exit" wound and a bullet wound on the back of his head or neck. He described this wound as having blood flowing out of it.

Daniel said he was told that this was an officer involved shooting, but could not recall who told him this. He said it was either someone from the fire department or ambulance crew.

Daniel said he did not write a report of this incident. No other pertinent information was obtained and my interview with him concluded.

A phone call was later placed to 913-888-6066, which is the office for the Overland Park Fire Department. I spoke with Sue Steger and requested a copy of all the reports pertaining to this incident. Sue later sent me an email with the reports as an attachment. The reports will be placed with this case file.

All of the above contacts were recorded individually. The audio recording will be attached with this case.


The first 20 pages of the notebook had handwritten logs of journals starting 01-01-2018 at 3:39 p.m to 01-20-2018. 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
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
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

It's very common for criminals to yell "12" if any cops are coming to warn their fellow criminals.



Review of Officer Jenison's In-Car Video

Lead #45

The video was provided to me on a USB drive in a sealed envelope by Corporal Jeremiah Waters with the Merriam Police Department following an OISIT briefing at the Olathe Police Department at approximately 1016 hours on 1/22/2018. I took the USB drive to my office and loaded the videos onto my computer at approximately 1056 hours and returned the USB drive to the envelope. It was sealed and later returned to Corporal Waters.

Upon watching the panoramic and standard versions of the video, I noted the following:

The video begins with Officer Jenison's police vehicle in a parked position in a parking lot. No sound was activated initially. The first time displayed on the video was approximately 17:43:08 on 01/20/18. The video had stamps indicating the Overland Park Police Department and Officer Clayton Jenison. At approximately 17:43:22 the vehicle begins to move forward.

As the vehicle pulled onto the street, lights were activated at approximately 17:43:37, along with the sound. The siren was activated at approximately 17:43:39. Officer Jenison (234) advised dispatch he was at 143rd and Grant at approximately 17:43:44.

The dispatcher stated, "234, 237 in route for a J21 attempt at 9309 W 149th Terrace". Officer Jenison drove west on 143rd to Switzer, where he turned left (south). The vehicle travelled south on Switzer to 147th, where it turned left (east). Officer Jenison turned right (south) onto Carter Street. The dispatcher told the officers the parents were not home and the subject was in the basement.

At approximately 17:45 the dispatcher advised officers to switch to TAC6 channel. At 17:46 Officer Jenison switched to TAC6. Next, the car went left (east) on 149th Terrace then north on Hayes Street, where Officer Jenison turned around facing south. (N38.85722 W94.69532) At 17:47:03 he stopped on Hayes at the intersection of Hayes and 149th Terrace. 9401 W 149th Terrace and 9309 W 149th Terrace are both partially visible in the video.

Between 17:47 and 17:48 Officer Jenison approached 9309 W.149th Terrace on foot. He contacted Officer Newlon in the yard and there was conversation about a dog and trying to get a phone number. Officer Jenison appeared to use his radio to request a phone number for the child and have him come upstairs. He then asked Officer Newlon if he had his car phone with him. Officer Jenison said he thinks there is a "mom right there."

At approximately 17:49:23 Officer Jenison is visible on the driveway near the garage doors. Officer Jenison can be heard saying, "ok a mom's just showed up we'll try to get an address for her." As he was saying this, at 17:49:26 the garage door started opening.

At 17:49:34, the vehicle began backing out of the garage and Officer Jenison yelled, "STOP!" He again yelled "STOP" at 17:49:35. The vehicle was visible, backing from the garage toward Officer Jenison. Officer Jenison backed away from the vehicle. He yelled, "STOP" again and fired two (2) shots at approximately 17:49:38, according to the video. Officer Vendetti's vehicle arrived at approximately the same time, stopping west of the scene.

The suspect vehicle appeared to stop briefly at 17:49:40 and resume backing at 17:49:41. Officer Jenison again yelled, "STOP." The car continued backing and turning until it was facing away from the house and was partially on the street and in the yard. The engine was revving and the tires were squealing on the pavement.

Officer Jenison can be heard on the video calling into dispatch that shots had been fired at approximately 17:49:45. Then a volley of shots are fired. Approximately eleven (11) additional shots were fired between 17:49:46 and 17:49:48. The suspect vehicle then began rolling forward toward the street. An officer can be heard yelling, STOP, JOHN, STOP THE CAR, as it rolled across the street.

Officer Jenison then called into dispatch that shots had been fired at 17:49:55. Another officer can be heard calling dispatch for medical assistance for the suspect. Officer Jenison was breathing very heavily and uttered, "fuck."

Around 17:50:38 an officer walked Officer Jenison to the rear of Officer Vendetti's vehicle. The officer was telling Officer Jenison to take deep breaths and another voice asked if he was OK. Officer Jenison replied that he was "good."

Officer Jenison's voice became high pitched, with a distraught emotional tone and said, "I thought he was going to run me over man." The other officer attempted to calm Jenison by talking to him and telling him he is good. Officer Jenison continued to breathe deeply and loudly. At approximately 17:51:17 Officer Jenison repeated that he thought he was going to be run over by saying, "I thought he was going to run me over man." The other officer said, "I know."

At approximately 17:51:45 Officer Jenison directs someone to the suspect van. He then told someone to keep the mom back. At approximately 17:52:10 Officer Jenison appeared to throw up or have dry heaves. The video showed Officer Jenison appear to be weeping. At approximately 17:54:48 an officer moved Officer Jenison's police vehicle to block the roadway.

While continuing to weep Officer Jenison said, "I didn't want to do it" at approximately 17:56:37. Officer Jenison asked for a phone at approximately 17:56:59 because he wanted to tell his wife he was good. At approximately 17:58:30 Officer Jenison said, "I fucking told I told him to stop. I fucking told him to stop." Another officer said he heard him. Officer Jenison, while he continued to weep, again said, "I fucking told him to stop." At approximately 18:00:05 Officer Jenison said "I ______ that fucking kid man." I was unable to understand a word in the previous sentence. This is indicated with a "

At approximately 18:01 an officer can be seen using crime scene tape to secure the scene. At approximately 18:01:37 a male voice asked, "How's it going?" Officer Jenison replied by saying, "How you doing sir? I'm doing alright." A male voice advised him to take some deep breaths. The video ended at approximately 18:01:59.

On Monday, January 22, 2018, I was assigned Lead 46. This lead was to review and document the in-car video of the vehicle driven by Officer Vendetti during this incident.

The video was contained on a 32GB Sandisk USB (Universal Serial Bus) flash drive. On this drive, I located a ZIP file which had been titled Overland_2018001376Vendetti1P54_20180121_0021.zip. I then watched the video by selecting the WGVPlayer.exe file which contained a player along with the recordings created by the WatchGuard in-car video system.

The video was one hour, twenty-two minutes, and twenty-two seconds in length. The time listed at the beginning of the video is 17:44:47 hours. It starts with Vendetti driving southbound on Melrose Lane approaching 135th Street in Overland Park, KS. He turns west onto 135th Street and activates his emergency lights and sirens at 17:45:18 hours. He does a u-turn at Nieman Road. He then drove eastbound until turning south on Switzer Road. While southbound, Vendetti identified himself as radio number "33". He told other responding officers "This kid has uh run from us before. He was a wrestler. He's always bragging out here to fight us." These comments were in reference to JOHN Albers, w/m, Next, Vendetti turned eastbound on 151st Street. As he approached his turn for northbound Carter Street, Vendetti turned off the sirens to his vehicle. As he completed his turn to northbound Carter Street, the dispatcher advised all officers, "Looks like he's on SnapChat currently and another form of social media talking about his J21. They are observing blood."

Vendetti arrives on scene at 17:49:35 hours. He parked along the south side of the road in between the properties of 9309 W 149th Terrace and 9401 W 149th Terrace. As he arrives, Officer Jenison can be seen walking backwards, with his arms extended in front of him, down the driveway away from the residence at 9309 W 149th Terrace. A silver van is seen backing toward Jenison. Officer Newlon is seen in the street, east of 9309 W 149th Terrace, moving toward Jenison. Sergeant Goddard is seen turning from northbound England Street going west on 149th Terrace.

As the silver van almost clears the garage, it appears to speed up toward Jenison who has backed up just past the halfway point of the driveway toward the street. Two shots are heard being fired at 17:49:37 hours by Jenison. During this time, Vendetti is heard stating, "What the!" The van slows down but again speeds up. It then turns counterclockwise at the end of the driveway until it faces north toward the street with its front wheels just in the street. While the van turned, Jenison is seen trying to avoid being struck by moving within the center of the spiral turn of the van. He ultimately ends up in

the center of the driveway, approximately halfway between the street and the residence along the passenger side of the van.

The van next started backing up toward the residence. At the same time, Sergeant Goddard pulls up to the northeast corner of the driveway with his emergency lights activated. Vendetti exits his vehicle and can be seen running in the middle of the street toward the van and Jenison. Vendetti yells, "Stop the car!" However, the van then backs up rapidly toward the house and the direction of Jenison. Multiple shots are then heard being fired by Jenison at 17:49:45 hours with the last one fired at 17:49:47 hours. Vendetti yells, "Shots Fired! Shots Fired!" As the van begins to roll forward, Vendetti with his right hand raised up, palm forward indicating to stop, yells, "Stop! Stop! John, stop the car! Shit!" The vehicle rolls northbound across the street coming to rest in the yard. As it passes Vendetti, he grabs the front driver's handle of the door apparently attempting to open it or to stop the vehicle. He then uses his radio to state, "We have shots fired. He's down. We need medical ASAP!" As the vehicle comes to a stop, Sergeant Goddard, Officer Jenison, Officer Newlon are seen moving toward the van.

While attempting to gain contact with JOHN, Vendetti states, "John, John, John, John. God damn it. Glove up, glove up. John are you alright." He then tells Jenison, "Are you okay? Alright. Go, go hang out by my car." Newlon then escorted Jenison to the rear of Vendetti's patrol vehicle. As he walked by the front of the vehicle, Jenison is seen holding his hands to his face.

Medical personnel arrive on scene at 17:51:09 hours. Vendetti tells them JOHN suffered several gunshot wounds. He also told them he has been unable to find a pulse. They assess JOHN and determine that he is deceased.

Vendetti next checks on the condition of Jenison. Jenison can be heard gasping. Vendetti tells him, "It's alright. It's alright. It's okay. Breathe. Just breathe. It's okay." Vendetti leaves Jenison with Newlon so that he can go help secure the scene.

At 17:57 hours, Vendetti can be heard telling an unknown subject, "It happened pretty quick." "I did not shoot." "I'm familiar with John so I put myself on the call". "I saw Jenison." "He looked like he was issuing some kind of commands, but I couldn't hear because I was still in my vehicle." "I saw the suspect vehicle whip out in reverse." It should be noted this conversation was difficult to understand because the audio continuously cut out.

At 18:09 hours, while speaking with an unknown male, Vendetti states that Jennison and Newlon are in his patrol vehicle. When asked if they were okay, he states, "No, well, Jenison is not."

At 18:11 hours, Vendetti is assigned to maintain a crime scene log for the western perimeter.

At 18:38 hours, the Overland Park Fire Department and Johnson County Med-Act personnel began leaving the scene.

At 18:56:26 hours, Vendetti's microphone is turned off. It is turned on again at 18:59:01 hours. At 19:02:01 hours, the microphone is against turned off for five seconds. At 19:02:29 hours, it is turned off again for fifteen seconds. At 19:03:19, it is turned off for six seconds. At 19:05:29, the microphone is turned off for five seconds.

The video ends at 19:07:08 hours.

Nothing further at this time.

Lead #47 – In Car Video Review Ofc. Newlon

On 01/21/2018 at approximately 1700 hours, I (Det. C. Spegal) was assigned Lead #47 to review Officer Newlon's in car video footage. I reviewed the video and observed the following;

The video footage began on 01/20/18 at approximately 1743:37 hours (according to the time stamp on the video surveillance footage). I observed Ofc. Newlon's vehicle turn eastbound on 151st from Stearns Place. After Ofc. Newlon turned eastbound onto 151st Street, he activated his vehicle's emergency lights and siren. After the lights and siren were activated, the microphone turned on and I could hear some of the radio traffic. I heard the dispatcher state that the subject stated that he was going to stab himself and that he was done with life. The dispatcher advised that the subject was currently in the basement, there were no parents at home, and Med Act was going to stage. I heard another officer ask to add him to the call because he was familiar with the subject. I observed Ofc. Newlon continue to travel eastbound past Switzer Road and turn left onto northbound England Street. As Ofc. Newlon was turning onto England Street, he turned off his emergency lights and siren. I observed Ofc. Newlon turn westbound on 149th Terrace and stopped his vehicle. As Ofc. Newlon turned onto 149th Terrace, there was a dark colored sport utility vehicle stopped at stop sign of eastbound 149th Terrace and England Street.

At approximately 1745:40 hours, Ofc. Newlon parked his vehicle about one house to the east of 9309 West 149th Terrace. I observed a sport utility vehicle drive past Ofc. Newlon traveling westbound. I also observed a white passenger vehicle pass Ofc. Newlon traveling eastbound. I was unable to see a license plate or other identifying information on the vehicles. I heard dispatch advise the officers on the call to switch radio traffic to "TAC 6".

At approximately 1746:34 hours, I observed Ofc. Newlon exit his patrol vehicle and walk westbound in front of his vehicle on the north side of road. Ofc. Newlon stopped just in front of his patrol vehicle.

At approximately 1746:43 hours, I observed Ofc. Jenison's patrol vehicle traveling eastbound to the west of Ofc. Newlon's patrol vehicle. I observed Ofc. Jenison's patrol vehicle turn north on Hayes Street. I observed Ofc. Jenison's vehicle turn around in the street and park facing southbound on Hayes Street. I observed two passenger cars following Ofc. Jension's vehicle. The vehicles continued northbound on Hayes Street after Ofc. Jenison's vehicle turned around. As Ofc. Jenison was parking his vehicle, I observed another sport utility vehicle drive past Ofc.

Newlon traveling westbound. I observed Ofc. Newlon walk south across the street and then another sport utility vehicle passed him traveling westbound. I was unable to read the license plate on either vehicle.

At approximately 1747:45 hours I observed Ofc. Jenison walk from his vehicle, across the street and toward the address of 9309 West 149th Terrace.

At approximately 1748:09 hours, I observed both officers approach the house. I heard what sounded like a dog barking inside the house and I heard the officers talking about the dog. Ofc. Jenison remained north of the residence in the front yard near a tree, while Ofc. Newlon remained at the west corner of the single car garage door. I heard Ofc. Jenison ask if they could get a phone number for inside the residence. I observed another passenger car driving eastbound past the residence. I then heard Ofc. Jenison ask Ofc. Newlon if he had a phone. Ofc. Newlon advised that he did not have a phone, but that he would run back to his vehicle and grab his phone.

At approximately 1749:00 I observed Ofc. Newlon running back toward his vehicle. I observed what appeared to be headlights pulling up behind Ofc. Newlon's vehicle. I then heard Ofc. Newlon state, "That's his mom". Ofc. Jenison was standing behind a small tree in the front yard of residence at that time. I heard Ofc. Newlon ask someone to stay back and then he asked if the person had a phone number for "him".

At approximately 1749:19 hours, I observed Ofc. Jenison start walking toward the garage door of the house.

At approximately 1749:25, I observed the garage door begin to open as Ofc. Jenison was reaching the driveway of the residence. Ofc. Jenison continued walking toward the garage door while the garage door was opening. As the garage door was almost fully opened, I observed the brake lights and reverse lights from the minivan inside the garage were illuminated. I observed Ofc. Jenison take two steps backward down the driveway toward the street. I heard Ofc. Newlon say, "Oh, wait" to the person that he was talking to.

At approximately 1749:33 hours, I observed that the garage door was fully opened. As soon as the garage door is fully opened, I observed the van began backing out of the garage.

At approximately 1749:35, I heard Ofc. Jenison yell "stop" as he began stepping backward down the driveway toward the street. I heard Ofc. Jenison yell "stop" a second time. As Ofc. Jenison is stepping backward, it appeared to me that he began to draw his firearm from his holster.

At approximately 1749:37 hours, I heard Ofc. Jenison yell "stop" a third time. After Ofc. Jenison yells stop, I observed him fire two shots in rapid succession. Ofc. Jenison continued walking backwards as he was firing and stopped firing after the second shot. Ofc. Jenison was almost to the sidewalk area after he fired the second shot. Just before Ofc. Jenison fired the two

shots, I observed Ofc. Vendetti arrive on the scene to the west of the residence. Ofc. Vendetti parked his patrol vehicle on the south side of the street facing east. After the second shot is fired, I observed the brake lights on the van illuminate and the van stopped briefly.

At approximately 1749:40 hours, I observed the van accelerate at a high rate of speed in reverse. I heard Ofc. Jenison yell "stop" a fourth time. At that time, the van's rear tires were near the sidewalk and the vehicle made a sharp J turn.

At approximately 1749:41 hours, I heard the tires screeching as the van made the sharp J turn and was accelerating backwards at a high rate of speed toward the house. I observed the vehicle back up into the yard in a southeast direction toward Ofc. Jenison. I observed Ofc. Vendetti exit his patrol vehicle and run toward the van. I observed Ofc. Jenison on the sidewalk area and he had turned around facing toward the north, so that he was facing toward the van. At this time, I observed Sgt. Goddard's patrol vehicle enter the video surveillance frame and his vehicle is traveling westbound. I observed the emergency lights on Sgt. Goddard's vehicle illuminate as his vehicle passed Ofc. Newlon's vehicle. Sgt. Goddard's vehicle continued to travel westbound toward the driveway and the van. I observed the van continue to back up in a southerly direction toward Ofc. Jenison. I observed Ofc. Jenison appeared to be trying to call out on his radio as he continued to move back away from the van.

At approximately 1749:44 hours, I observed the van continue traveling backward toward Ofc. Jenison and the house. The van was completely off the street at that time. I observed Ofc. Jenison stepping backward up the driveway toward the house. I heard Ofc. Jenison yell "stop the car". I then observed Ofc. Jenison begin to fire as he went back to a two-handed shooting stance. I observed Ofc. Jenison fire what appeared to be 11 rounds in rapid succession as the van continued to drive backward. Ofc. Jenison was stepping backward and toward the east as he fired. I observed that around the time that Ofc. Jenison was firing his final shots in the series, the van stopped moving backward. I observed the van then slowly start rolling forward at approximately 1749:47 hours.

At approximately 1749:49 hours, I observed Ofc. Vendetti run up toward the van as it is rolling forward. I observed Ofc. Vendetti had his hand extended toward the car and was yelling "stop the car, stop John, stop the car". I observed Sgt. Goddard exit his patrol vehicle and start running toward the van. I observed Ofc. Newlon moving into the camera view and toward Sgt. Goddard's patrol vehicle.

The van continued to roll across the street and into the neighbor's yard on the north side of the street. Ofc. Vendetti, Sgt. Goddard, and Ofc. Newlon ran toward the van. Ofc. Vendetti and Sgt. Goddard approached the driver's side. Ofc. Jenison then began to walk across the street toward the van. I observed Ofc. Jenison reholster his handgun as he was walking across the street. Sgt. Goddard ran around the front of the van and approached the front passenger side door. I heard, who I believe was Ofc. Vendetti yelling "John, John, John". As Ofc. Newlon and Ofc. Jenison

approached the passenger side rear of the vehicle, Sgt. Goddard opened the front passenger side door of the vehicle. I heard what sounded like Ofc. Newlon telling Ofc. Jenison to "stay back".

At approximately 1750:13 hours, I observed Ofc. Newlon and Ofc. Jenison walk away from van toward the street. I heard what sounded like Ofc. Jenison breathing very heavily. I heard Ofc. Newlon say, "Hey, deep breaths man, deep breaths".

At approximately 1750;22 hours, I heard Ofc. Vendetti say, "Are you okay?" as Ofc. Newlon and Ofc. Jenison were walking toward Ofc. Vendetti's patrol vehicle. I heard Ofc. Jenison say "Yeah, I'm good". I heard Ofc. Newlon telling Ofc. Jenison to come with him.

At approximately 1750:36 hours, I heard Ofc. Jenison say, "I thought he was going to run me over man". Ofc. Jenison sounded very upset and sounded as if he was about to cry as he was speaking. I heard Ofc. Newlon say something else, but I could not understand what he was saying.

At approximately 1751:06 hours, Ofc. Newlon appeared to get on the radio and advise that "one subject was down. Officer is 10-4".

At approximately 1751:15 hours, I heard Ofc. Jenison again state, "I thought he was going to run me over man". Ofc. Newlon stated "I know" and kept repeating "Hey".

At approximately 1751:20 hours, I observed Med Act and a fire truck pull up on scene. I heard Ofc. Jenison say "Fuck". Ofc. Jenison said something else, but I could not understand what he said. Ofc. Newlon said "Hey, but, hey, you're 10-4 man".

At approximately 1751:38 hours, I saw a white female subject run westbound past Ofc. Newlon's vehicle and she was running toward the van. I heard what appeared to be Ofc. Jenison yelling to Med Act and Fire personnel, "He's in the van, in the van. Keep the mom back". I observed fire and Med Act personnel begin walking up toward the van.

At approximately 1752:02 hours, I heard Ofc. Newlon state, "Listen man, you did what you, deep breaths man, hey". I heard Ofc. Jenison say "Yeah". I then heard what appeared to be Ofc. Jenison dry heaving as if he was about to vomit. I heard Ofc. Newlon say, "I'm sorry you got me man because I don't know what the fuck to say to you. Alright?" Ofc. Jenison responded, "Your good man". I could hear what appeared to be Ofc. Jenison taking a series of deep breaths.

At approximately 1752:33 hours, I observed a Med Act employee get a stretcher out of the ambulance and begin roll the stretcher up toward the van.

At approximately 1753:12 hours, I heard Ofc. Newlon tell Ofc. Jenison to come back over to his location and to get out of the street. Ofc. Newlon appeared to be speaking to a Med Act or Fire

employee and stated, "No holes, he's okay". I then heard someone ask him if he was okay. It sounded as if Ofc. Jenison then began crying.

At approximately 1754:01 hours, I observed Ofc. Newlon walking toward Ofc. Jenison's vehicle. Ofc. Newlon yelled to Sgt. Goddard that he was moving Ofc. Jenison's car to block the street. Sgt. Goddard advised him to tape off the street. Ofc. Newlon moved Ofc. Jenison's car to block the street. Ofc. Newlon removed some traffic cones from Ofc. Jenison's vehicle and placed them in the street.

At approximately 1755:46 hours, Ofc. Newlon returned to the area where Ofc. Jenison was at.

At approximately 1756:35 hours, I could hear what sounded like Ofc. Jenison sobbing. I heard Ofc. Jenison state, "I didn't want to". Ofc. Newlon replied "I know. Nobody ever wants to man. Okay? Nobody ever wants to". Ofc. Jenison continued crying and then asked Ofc. Newlon if he could get his phone out of his patrol vehicle. Ofc. Jenison stated that he wanted to tell his wife something, which sounded like "I'm good". Ofc. Newlon said "Here you go. That's the most important thing man, the wife, alright?"

At approximately 1758:30 hours, I heard Ofc. Jenison say, "I told him to stop". Ofc. Newlon responded, "I know". Ofc. Jenison then stated, "I fucking told him to stop". Ofc. Newlon responded, "I know. I heard you man". Ofc. Jenison appeared to start crying again and stated, "I fucking told him to stop". Ofc. Newlon stated, "You did".

At approximately 1800:44 hours, I observed a Med Act employee roll the stretcher back to the ambulance and loaded the empty stretcher into the ambulance.

At approximately 1802:12 hours, I heard someone talking with Ofc. Newlon and someone asked if they were okay. Someone then approached Ofc. Newlon and asked him if he was one of the first officers on the scene and he advised them that he was. At that time, the microphone shut off and I could not hear any sound or their conversation.

At approximately 1802:30 hours, I observed a Med Act supervisor arrive on the scene.

At approximately 1803:50 hours, the microphone was turned back on. I heard someone ask Ofc. Newlon whose car he was by. Ofc. Newlon responded that it was Ofc. Vendetti's vehicle. The person asked him where his car was at and Ofc. Newlon stated his vehicle was at the other end of the street.

At approximately 1804:15 hours, the microphone turned back off and there was no sound throughout the remainder of the video.

At approximately 1805:47 hours, I observed Sgt. Goddard talking to the white female who ran up to the scene. Sgt. Goddard walked the female subject back to the east behind Ofc. Newlon's patrol vehicle.

At approximately 1811:42 hours, I observed a white van pull up in front of Ofc. Newlon's vehicle. The vehicle appears to be an Overland Park Police Department Crime Scene van.

At approximately 1818:53 hours, I observed Sgt. Goddard again talking to the female that showed up on scene.

At approximately 1820:27 hours, the female subject walked back to the east and off camera view.

At approximately 1827:56 hours, I observed two officers enter the garage of 9309 West 149th Terrace.

At approximately 1834:43 hours, I observed the two officers exit the garage.

At approximately 1838:46 hours, I observed Med Act and the fire truck leave the area.

At approximately 1839:17 hours, I observed the Med Act supervisor leave the area.

At approximately 1842:10 hours, I observed an officer place evidence tape up around the inner perimeter on the east side of the residence and van.

At approximately 1918:29 hours, the in-car video footage ends.

All times noted are approximate times and are according to the time stamp on the video surveillance footage. The information in this report is a summary of my observations of the video and not a direct transcript of the video.

The video was of the inside of his residence and it was determined that the sounds thought was gunfire, was of his cat playing inside house. tated he had sent a copy of the video to my email. On 01-21-2018 at approximately 14:45 hours, Corporal Waters, Detective Wakefield and I responded back to the Albers' residence,

9309 W. 149th Terrace Overland Park, KS

to complete a walk through and subsequently release the residence back to the family.

After confirming the Johnson County Crime Laboratory personnel had completed processing we entered the residence through the front door at 14:50 hours.

Once inside the residence we completed a final walk through with Crime Laboratory personnel. Nothing of note was discovered during the walk through.

Upon completing the walk through at 15:15 hours, I re-contacted Mrs. Albers via text messaging and subsequently by telephone. During the phone call I told her the processing at the residence was completed. I told her we had some preliminary results from the autopsy that could be released. I also wanted to confirm she still wanted us to clean the scene as Detective Wakefield and I had previously offered to do. Mrs. Albers said she would call her attorney,

And call me back. At 15:24 hours, Mrs. Albers returned my call to let me know they would appreciate us cleaning the residence.

The blood located on the kitchen floor and counter was cleaned using household cleaners. The glass fragments in the driveway and front yard was also cleaned. While cleaning the glass at the front of the residence, Chanel 5 News arrived and parked on the street. I notified Mrs. Albers of their arrival and asked her if she had planned to enter through the garage.

The Albers arrived at the residence at approximately 15:43 hours. They pulled directly into the garage. Corporal Waters and I met the Albers at the front door of the residence and were invited into the living room area.

I told the Albers we had taken care of cleaning the residence to the best of our abilities and explained to them the area cleaned was not significant. I told them the preliminary results of the autopsy indicated John had had amphetamines in his system and we were still awaiting results to determine his blood alcohol levels. The Albers advised John had a prescription for which could explain the amphetamines in his system.

I told the Albers the cause of death was determined to have been a gun shot. They asked how many rounds. I explained I did not have that information and we would receive the autopsy report which would provide that information. They asked when that would be available and we explained it would be several weeks and could not provide them with an exact date.

Mr. Albers said he could not understand how the Police responded to assist his son and then killed him. That was not offering assistance.

During the conversation we discussed obtaining a statement from them in the future. The Albers said they wanted to cooperate and would contact their attorney and let me know. I told them to contact me if they have any questions. I also told them to feel free to provide my number to their attorney.

The conversation with the Albers was recorded with a digital voice recorder.

On Wednesday, January 31st, 2018, I was contacted via the telephone by the Albers' attorney,

Mr. Radar called to check if processing had been completed on the Albers' Honda Odyssey van. I advised him I would check with the Johnson County Crime Laboratory and re-contact him.

I spoke CSI K. Meyer and confirmed the processing of the vehicle was complete and the vehicle could be picked up.

I again spoke Mr. Rader and told him the vehicle could be picked up from the Johnson County Crime Laboratory. He said he would contact the Albers' insurance company, Encompass, to pick the vehicle up. He requested the opportunity to view the vehicle prior to Encompass taking possession.

I then spoke CSI K. Meyer about Mr. Rader's request and found he could respond to the Johnson County Crime Laboratory if he signed a written request form. CSI Meyer sent me the form, which was sent back to her for Mr. Rader to sign when he arrived.

Mr. Rader was advised he could view the vehicle at the Johnson County Crime Laboratory, but he would need to sign a request form upon his arrival. He agreed to do so. It was determined the Honda would be moved outside after he had the opportunity to view it to await a tow being arranged by Encompass.

I asked Mr. Rader if he had the opportunity to meet with the Albers regarding them meeting with me to provide a statement. He said he had spoken to them briefly and would contact me if they decided to do so.

On Friday, February 9th, 2018, CSI K. Meyer notified me via e-mail that Encompass had towed the Honda from the lot the previous day.

As of today's date, Monday, February 19th, 2018, I have not received any contact from Mr. Rader.

On 01-21-2018 Detective J. Waters assigned Lead #53, to interview Overland Park Police Department Officer William Robbins. The interview was conducted at the Olathe Police Department interview room number 3. The interview was video recorded and attached to the case file.

Officer Robbins provided the following biographical information:
Robbins, William S. w/m, Employed for the Overland Park Police
Department for three (3) years.

Officer Robbins said he worked the evening shift (1430-2230) on 01-20-2018. He wore his issued black uniform pants and long sleeved shirt with an exterior tactical vest.

Officer Robbins said he was patrolling and heard Officer Venndetti speak over the radio. He heard Officer Vendetti say, "Get out of the car, man down, get medical here now." He also heard approximately 3 to 5 gunshots over the in-car radio.

Officer Robbins said upon his arrival he was ordered by Major Henson to place police tape up on the outer and inner perimeter of the Officer involved shooting scene. He said an inner perimeter was set up due to the neighbors were coming out of their residences. He said Officer Newlon spoke to Colonel Haper. Officer Robbins was then instructed to assist Officer Ryan Newlon with a protective sweep of the 9309 West 149th Terrace, Overland Park, Kansas residence.

Officer Robbins said he entered into the residence through the garage door. He had his department issued firearm and flashlight out while conducting the protective sweep. I asked if he discharged his weapon in the house. He said no. The garage door lead into the kitchen. Officer Robbins said he observed blood on the kitchen floor near the base of the kitchen island. He also observed a long wood handled kitchen knife with blood on it. The knife was lying on top of the kitchen island counter. He also observed a bottle of Titos vodka and a blue bottle that looked like tequila. He also observed an empty bottle of prescription pills on the top of the kitchen island. He

said a cabinet door was open in the kitchen which contained liquor bottles. He assumed the bottles on the kitchen island were empty. He did not observe any other knives on the kitchen island. Officer Robbins said when he left the kitchen area he stepped around the blood on the kitchen floor. Officer Robbins cleared the first floor of the residence and did not locate any people.

Officer Robbins said he went to the basement of the residence. He said the lights were turned off and went to part of the basement. He assumed it was a bedroom belonging to John Albers due to numerous soccer apparel lying around. He said the bedroom had a bed, dresser, and a chair. He said the room was messy with the bed unmade, clothes and papers scattered throughout the bedroom. He then went to the basement area where a television, couch, and chairs were. He said the basement area was kept and clean. Officer Robbins said he did not locate any people in the basement.

Officer Robbins then went to the upper/upstairs part of the residence. He encountered two dogs. The dogs ran into the master bedroom which were secured in that bedroom. He placed a red bean bag chair in front of the bedroom door to indicate the dogs were in there. He did not locate any people upstairs.

I asked Officer Robbins if he observed or spoke with Officer Jenison. Officer Robbins said yes, when he had hung the police tape. He said Officer Jenison sat in the car with Officer Newlon. He said Officer Jenison had a "blank stare". Officer Robbins told Officer Jenison to relax and he (Officer Jenison) did not have to talk about the incident. He said Officer Newlon was speaking to Officer Jenison about their pets (dogs). Officer Robbins said he and Officer Jenison were Veterans of the military. Officer Robbins said he pulled Officer Jenison aside and said if he needed anything to give him a call.

Officer Robbins said he was told to secure the back side of the residence to make sure nobody entered the area. Officer Robbins said he cleared the scene at 2220 hours. Officer Robbins said he completed a report.

On 01/20/2018 at approximately 1815 hours I was notified of the Johnson County Officer Involved Shooting Team activation at 9309 West 149th Terrace Overland Park Kansas 66221.

On 01/23/2018 at approximately 0800 hours I was assigned Lead # 54, Look into the purpose and potential side effects for the drug Adderall.

According to Drugs.com, Adderall is a combination of amphetamine and dextroamphetamine which are central nervous stimulants that effect chemicals in the brain and nerves that contribute to hyperactivity and impulse control.

PURPOSE:

Adderall is used to treat Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)

SIDE EFFECTS:

Hallucinations Aggression Hostility Paranoia New Behavioral Problems

WARNINGS/PRECAUSIONS

Adderall may exacerbate symptoms of behavior and thought disorder in psychotic patients.

New onset psychosis or mania may occur with stimulant use.

Adderall usage may be associated with Aggressive Behavior or hostility.

Adderall may cause new or worsening psychosis (unusual thoughts or behavior) especially if you have a history of depression, mental illness or bi polar disorder.

PATIENT RESPONSIBILITY

Manufacturers of Adderall require the patient to notify their Doctor if the patient (or any family member) has/had depression, mental illness, bi-polar disorder, psychosis or suicidal thoughts or actions. Do not use this medicine if you have taken an MAO inhibitor in the past 14 days. A dangerous drug interaction could occur. MAO inhibitors include isocarboxazid, linezolid, methylene blue injection, phenelzine, rasagiline, selegiline, tranylcypromine, and others.

You may not be able to use Adderall if you are allergic to any stimulant medicine. You may not be able to use Adderall if you

high blood pressure, heart disease, coronary artery disease (hardened arteries);

severe anxiety, tension, or agitation (stimulant medicine can make these symptoms worse); or

Adderall may be habit-forming. Never share this medicine with another person, especially someone with a history of drug abuse or addiction. Keep the medication in a place where others cannot get to it. Selling or giving away this medicine is against the law.

Read all patient information, medication guides, and instruction sheets provided to you. Ask your doctor or pharmacist if you re any questions.

You may take Adderall with or without food, first thing in the morning.

Do not crush, chew, break, or open an extended-release capsule. Swallow it whole.

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To make swallowing easier, you may open the capsule and sprinkle the medicine into a spoonful of applesauce. Swallow right away without chewing. Do not save the mixture for later use.

What happens if I miss a dose?

What happens if I overdose?

Seek emergency medical attention or call the Poison Help line at 1-800-222-1222. An overdose of amphetamine and stroamphetamine could be fatal.

Overdose symptoms may include restlessness, tremor, muscle twitches, rapid breathing, confusion, hallucinations, panic, aggressiveness, muscle pain or weakness, and dark colored urine. These symptoms may be followed by depression and tiredness. Other overdose symptoms include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain, uneven heartbeats, feeling lightheaded, fainting, seizure (convulsions), or coma.

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What should I avoid while taking Adderall?

is medication may impair your thinking or reactions. Be careful if you drive or do anything that requires you to be alert.

Adderall side effects

Get emergency medical help if you have signs of an allergic reaction to Adderall: hives; difficult breathing; swelling of your face, lips, tongue, or throat.

Call your doctor at once if you have:

"Fuck it. Someone needs to find my journal and then can read it to people and shit. I'm done with this. I'm going back to jail if I don't die right now. Call...they've already called the cops but I'm killing myself. So, I love people. You know who you are. Come to my funeral, but I'm done. Fucking done. All these people on my arm, I love all of you. Find my journal."

The scene switches to JOHN holding a knife to his chest. While doing this he states, "I love you people. Come to my funeral." The video then ends.



On 01-22-2018 Lead Officer J. Waters assigned lead number 60, to interview the Blue Valley Northwest School Resource Officer (SRO). Overland Park Police Department Officer Richard Spandle was interviewed at the Blue Valley Northwest (BVNW) High School located at 13260 Switzer, Overland Park, Kansas 66213. The interview was audio recorded and attached to the case file.

Officer Spandle had been an SRO for the last seven (7) years and had been at Blue Valley North West High School for the last two (2) years. Officer Spandle said some of his duties included; Child in Need of Care, Thefts, and battery cases. He also was a general resource for the students at the high school.

I asked Officer Spandle if he knew John Albers. He said John Albers transferred from Blue Valley West in October 18, 2016. He had met John during the 2017 school year. John's mother, Sheila Albers, was the principal at and got to know Sheila. Officer Spandle had filled in as the SRO at and conduct had recently been declining. He learned this through conversations with Sheila.

I asked Officer Spandle to tell me about John Albers. He said he does not know John personally. He said outside of school John had conduct problems and had risky behaviors. He said John played soccer and was a wrestler at the school. He added, John had been quiet with no issues or problems while at school.

Officer Spandle spoke of an incident when John did not report to school. Sheila Albers contacted Officer Spandle for assistance in getting John to school. Officer Spandle said John showed up to school without any intervention.

Officer Spandle spoke of an incident around December 2017 with John. He said John had stolen his dads (Steve Albers) car which was later recovered in Kansas City, Kansas. The incident ended up with John being restrained by his dad. Johns was taken to Juvenile Intake and Assessment Center for that incident.

On 01-20-2018, Officer Spandle worked off-duty security at Holy Cross Elementary School for a fundraiser from 1400-2200 hours. Officer Spandle said he heard Officer 233 radio traffic. Officer 233 yelled in a "stressful voice" over the portable radio. He heard Officer 233 say, "Stop the car" and what sounded like multiple gunshots. He later learned of the address belonging to John Albers.



Officer Kendrick said on Saturday, January 20th, 2018 at approximately 13:00 hours, while working a theft case at Scheels, he was made aware of a second theft. The loss Prevention Officer (LPO) told him that a coach, upstairs, had noticed a referee, John Albers acting strange. John had left the area and was wearing different pants when he returned. They also noticed John was wearing more clothes than when he had arrived initially. The LPO was able to locate John, on camera, grabbing items from the store and taking them to the bathroom. Tags for the clothes were recovered in the bathroom where John had been.

The LPO asked Officer Kendrick what they should do. He told them John was maintaining unauthorized control of the items and it was obvious he attended to steal them.

At 13:22 hours he put himself out on the theft case involving John Albers.

A Manager and an LPO went upstairs and brought John down to the Loss Prevention Office. John asked the Manager and the LPO several times for a warning.

Officer Kendrick Mirandized John almost immediately. While doing so, he observed John look down, run his hands through his hair. He asked John if he understood his Miranda warning, he replied with "Yes Sir".

Officer Kendrick asked John if he took the clothes and if he was planning to take them without paying for them. John confirmed he had taken them and had not planned to pay for them. John asked him what he would be charged with. When told he would be charged with theft he appeared upset. John asked if he could just be let go. When told he could not just be let go, he told Officer Kendrick he was on diversion and asked what class misdemeanor theft was. When he was told it the theft would be a Class A Misdemeanor. His facial features indicated he was angry and was upset at getting charged for theft.

Officer Kendrick had John call his Father, Steven Albers to come get him. When John made the call he told his Father, he had fucked up and stolen from the store.

When John was asked to return the items he had stolen, he stood up, took off his hooded sweatshirt, took off a shirt from underneath, placed it on the table, put his hooded sweatshirt back on and sat back down. The Scheels LPO told John he needed to return what he had stolen and if it was determined he had stolen other items he would be charged with another theft. John immediately stood back up. Officer Kendrick asked what he was doing. John replied he was not done yet as he took off his shoes, took off sweatpants he had over his jeans, took off his hooded sweatshirt, removed another shirt and placed it on the table, then put on his hooded sweatshirt and sat back down.

When Mr. Albers arrived John told him he knew he had screwed up. Mr. Albers made a statement similar to , you lost diversion, lost your job, banned from the store, and you are getting charged with theft is there anything else you would like to fuck up in your life right now.

Mr. Albers told Officer Kendrick this was the third contact John had with the police in the last month.

While completing the civil restitution with Scheels, John asked if they could complete the paperwork outside because he was embarrassed standing there. As they left the

store he remembered Mr. Albers asking John if there was any more embarrassment he wanted to put himself through or something similar.

Officer Kendrick said he did not have a body camera and his mic pack did not function inside Scheels, so he utilized his digital recorder while on the call. He downloaded the audio to SharePoint at the conclusion of the call.

The interview was concluded at 12:23 hours.


