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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), created pursuant to an amendment to the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu 1973 ("RCH") to develop, operate, and maintain the Honolulu Rail Transit Project ("HRTP").

This Request for Proposals ("RFP") is issued by HART to identify Persons qualified to submit competitive sealed proposals for the HART Board Consultant Services Contract. "Persons" means any individual, firm, corporation, company, LLC, LLP, joint venture, voluntary association, partnership, trust, public or private organization, other legal entity, or combination thereof.

#### 1.1 HRTP Description

The HRTP will provide high-capacity rapid transit service in the travel corridor between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. This corridor includes the majority of housing and employment on O'ahu. The north-south width of the corridor is a maximum of four (4) miles, with the corridor constrained by the Ko'olau and Wai'anae Mountain Ranges to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south.

The HRTP is identified in the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") as the design, construction and operation of a twenty (20) mile grade-separated fixed guideway transit system between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. All parts of the guideway will be elevated, except near Leeward Community College where it will be at-grade. The system will incorporate steel wheel-on-steel rail technology. The HRTP includes twenty-one (21) stations, one (1) Rail Operations Center ("ROC"), and eighty (80) light metro vehicles and associated core systems.

#### 1.2 HART Board Consultant Services Description

The selected Offeror (or "Contractor") will provide HART Board Consultant services in Honolulu, Hawaii. The selected Offeror will serve as HART's liaison to the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature and Congressional Committees and appropriate federal and state agencies. The selected Offeror will provide coordination, counsel, and information to HART and will advise and represent HART with respect to state transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and state funding opportunities. The scope of services for this Contract is attached hereto in the Special Provisions, Appendix A Scope of Services.

#### 1.3 Reserved

#### 4.0 PROCUREMENT PROCESS

#### 4.1 Addenda

HART will issue responses to inquiries, additional background information, and any other corrections or modifications it deems necessary, via written addenda, on or before the Final Addendum Date. Addenda will be incorporated as part of the RFP. Oral interpretations, clarifications, changes, or substitutions will be without legal effect. Only interpretations, clarifications, changes, or approved substitutions provided by a formal written addendum to the solicitation shall be binding.

#### 4.2 Modification or Withdrawal of Proposals

Proposals submitted pursuant to this RFP may be modified or withdrawn prior to the Proposal Due Date in accordance with HAR §3-122-16.07. Any proposal received by HART after the exact time of the Proposal Due Date will not be accepted, will not be considered for award, and shall be returned to the Offeror unopened at the time of late submission or as soon as practicable.

#### 4.3 Receipt and Registration of Proposals

In accordance with HAR §3-122-51, proposals and any modifications thereto will be time-stamped upon receipt and held in a secure place by HART until the Proposal Due Date. Proposals and modifications will not be opened publicly, but will be opened in the presence of two or more HART officials. Prior to contract awards, proposals and modifications will be shown only to members of the evaluation committee and HART personnel or their designees having legitimate interest in them.

#### 4.4 Confidential Solicitation Process

HART will maintain a confidential process for the duration of this solicitation. To the extent permitted by law, all records related to this procurement, including, but not limited to, proposals, evaluations, priority list procedures, price proposals, evaluation and selection procedures, and records during the evaluation and selection process, will remain confidential until the contract awards have been posted by HART in accordance with HAR §3-122-9.01 and §3-122-63.

#### 4.5 Proposals Property of HART

Proposals will become the property of HART. Copies of each proposal will be retained by HART after the proposal evaluation process.

#### 4.6 Discussions with Offerors

If discussions with Offerors are required to make a selection, the discussions will be conducted in accordance with HAR §3-122-53. Pursuant to HAR §3-122-53, a priority list will be established consisting of up to three Offerors. If more than three acceptable or potentially acceptable proposals have been submitted, the priority list will be limited through evaluation and ranking to the Offerors who submitted the highest-ranked proposals.

#### 4.7 Best and Final Offers

If required, best and final offers will be accepted in accordance with HAR §3-122-54.

#### 4.8 Rejection of Proposals; Waiver of Informalities and Minor Irregularities

Proposals may be rejected in accordance with HAR §3-122-97. Furthermore, HART may:

- a) Reject any or all proposals if such action is in the public interest; and
- b) Waive informalities and minor irregularities in proposals received.

#### 4.9 Basis of Award

The basis of award(s) will be the "best value" in accordance with the evaluation criteria set forth herein (HAR §3-122-57).

#### 4.10 Verification of Responsibility of Offeror

The successful Offeror shall, within three (3) business days of notification of contract award, furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of HRS §103D-310(c):

- HRS Chapter 237, tax clearance;
- HRS Chapter 383, unemployment insurance;
- HRS Chapter 386, workers' compensation;
- HRS Chapter 392, temporary disability insurance:
- HRS Chapter 393, prepaid health care; and
- One of the following:
  - (a) Registered and incorporated or organized under the laws of the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "Hawaii business"; or
  - (b) Registered to do business in the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "compliant non-Hawaii business."

Offerors are required to state whether that representation is an actual and/or potential conflict and whether the named party or HART would have to waive the conflict in order for the Offeror to perform this Contract. For actual or potential conflicts the Offeror shall also provide a detailed plan describing how the Offeror, alone, will mitigate the conflict. HART reserves the right to:

- 1. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
- 2. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
- 3. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
- 4. Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

It is a requirement of HART that Offeror organizations identified, including specialized subcontractors, remain intact for the duration of the procurement process, up to and including the execution of the resulting contract, unless otherwise approved in writing by HART.

The selected attorney/firm(s) acknowledges that they shall be prohibited from representing other clients whose interests are adverse to that of HART, or whose case(s) requires filing any form of litigation against HART, without HART's consent in writing

It is the responsibility of all Offerors to examine the entire RFP, to seek clarification of any requirement that may not be clear, and to check all responses for accuracy before submitting a proposal. Negligence in preparing a proposal confers no right of withdrawal after the Proposal Due Date.

#### 5.3 Proposal Due Date

Proposals must be submitted to HART by no later than the date and time as specified in the Solicitation Timetable (Section 1.4).

Offerors are to submit their proposal electronically.

#### 5.5 Format and Quantities

See Exhibit 2 for Proposal format. Proposal should not exceed 50 pages. Proposals are to be written in English, minimum 12-point font, and printed on 8-1/2" x 11" paper; any larger sheets should be folded to that size. Pages are to be consecutively numbered. Exhibits and firm brochures do not count toward the 50-page limit.

Offerors submitting an electronic proposal shall submit (1) an unredacted electronic copy, (2) a redacted electronic copy, and (3) the price proposal in a separate file. Offerors shall mail, via postal, the hardcopy original signed Cover Letter, signed evidence of authority to bind the firm, and signed Exhibits to the address indicated in Section 5.4 no later than five days from the Proposal Due Date

#### 5.6 Organization of Proposal

  - iv. Identify full details of the organization structure in Appendix A to the Proposal.
- c) Requirements and information to be provided in Appendix A to the Proposal:
  - Notarized Power(s) of Attorney for the Offeror indicating the authority of the Offeror's representative to sign for that Offeror;

To identify those Offerors with an understanding of government funding strategies in relation to Public Transportation and demonstrated experience in working with Federal, State, City, County and other government entities, particularly; U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Office of the Secretary of Transportation, White House Office of Management and Budget, City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, and Hawaii's Congressional Delegation.
  - ii. To identify Offerors with demonstrated effective communication skills, Offerors who can convey information that impacts the ability to shape and deliver a response timely and accurately to information on changes, guidance, rulemaking, or other anticipated local government actions that could have an impact on HART.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 3 of the Proposal:

#### 8.0 ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS

By submitting a proposal, an Offeror expressly agrees to all of the terms, conditions, provisions, and requirements set forth in this RFP and the General Terms and Conditions of Professional Services.

#### 9.0 DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) CONTRACT GOAL

HART established a DBE program in accordance with the regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation ("USDOT"), Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26 (49 C.F.R. Part 26). HART has received federal financial assistance from USDOT, and as a condition of receiving this assistance, HART signed an Assurance with the USDOT that it will comply with 49 C.F.R. Part 26.

The Contractor and its subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of the Contract. 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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), created pursuant to an amendment to the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu 1973 ("RCH") to develop, operate, and maintain the Honolulu Rail Transit Project ("HRTP").

This Request for Proposals ("RFP") is issued by HART to identify Persons qualified to submit competitive sealed proposals for the HART Board Consultant Services Contract. "Persons" means any individual, firm, corporation, company, LLC, LLP, joint venture, voluntary association, partnership, trust, public or private organization, other legal entity, or combination thereof.

#### 1.1 HRTP Description

The HRTP will provide high-capacity rapid transit service in the travel corridor between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. This corridor includes the majority of housing and employment on O'ahu. The north-south width of the corridor is a maximum of four (4) miles, with the corridor constrained by the Ko'olau and Wai'anae Mountain Ranges to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south.

The HRTP is identified in the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") as the design, construction and operation of a twenty (20) mile grade-separated fixed guideway transit system between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. All parts of the guideway will be elevated, except near Leeward Community College where it will be at-grade. The system will incorporate steel wheel-on-steel rail technology. The HRTP includes twenty-one (21) stations, one (1) Rail Operations Center ("ROC"), and eighty (80) light metro vehicles and associated core systems.

The FEIS was released in June 2010 and a Final Supplemental EIS and Amended Record of Decision ("ROD") were released in September 2013. The FEIS and additional information on the HRTP can be found at: <a href="http://honolulutransit.org">http://honolulutransit.org</a>.

#### 1.2 HART Board Consultant Services Description

The selected Offeror (or "Contractor") will provide HART Board Consultant services in Honolulu, Hawaii. The selected Offeror will serve as HART's liaison to the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature and Congressional Committees and appropriate federal and state agencies. The selected Offeror will provide coordination, counsel, and information to HART and will advise and represent HART with respect to state transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and state funding opportunities. The scope of services for this Contract is attached hereto in the Special Provisions, Appendix A Scope of Services.

#### 2.0 TERM OF THE CONTRACT

3.0 The term of any Contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation will be for five (5) months, commencing from the issuance of a written Notice to Proceed ("NTP"), with options to extend the contract up to six (6) years. The total Contract term shall not to exceed a total of six (6) years with options.

The Contract will be a multi-term contract subject to the availability of funds in accordance with HAR §3-122-149.

Contract funds are available for only the initial term of the contract, and the contractual obligation of both parties in each fiscal period succeeding the first is subject to the appropriation and availability of funds. HART shall notify the Consultant, on a timely basis, if funds are not available for the continuation of the contract for each succeeding fiscal period. If funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal period, the contract shall be cancelled and the Consultant shall be reimbursed in accordance with the contract documents.

#### 4.0 COMMUNICATIONS

#### 3.1 Inquiries and Requests for Clarification

All inquiries and requests for clarification regarding this RFP shall be submitted to the Transit Mailbox at the following email address: <a href="mailto:transitmailbox@honolulu.gov">transitmailbox@honolulu.gov</a> by no later than the deadline set forth in the Solicitation Timetable (Section 1.4). All correspondence shall refer to the appropriate RFP number, page number, and section number. See Exhibit 1. Oral interpretations or clarifications will be without legal effect. Only answers to questions issued by a formal written addendum shall be binding on HART.

#### 3.2 Rules of Contact and Communications

Offerors may not contact HART officials, Board members, employees or representatives concerning this RFP while the solicitation process is in progress, except as expressly required or permitted by this Instructions to Offerors ("ITO"), the RFP documents, or other instructions from HART. The solicitation process begins when the RFP is issued

other instructions from HART. The solicitation process begins when the RFP is issued and will be completed with the award of the Contract. Any contact determined to be improper, at the sole discretion of HART, may result in disqualification. In the case of a multi-award contract, the solicitation process begins when the RFP is issued and will be completed with the award of the last contract.

#### 4.0 PROCUREMENT PROCESS

#### 4.1 Addenda

HART will issue responses to inquiries, additional background information, and any other corrections or modifications it deems necessary, via written addenda, on or before the Final Addendum Date. Addenda will be incorporated as part of the RFP. Oral interpretations, clarifications, changes, or substitutions will be without legal effect. Only interpretations, clarifications, changes, or approved substitutions provided by a formal written addendum to the solicitation shall be binding.

#### 4.2 Modification or Withdrawal of Proposals

Proposals submitted pursuant to this RFP may be modified or withdrawn prior to the Proposal Due Date in accordance with HAR §3-122-16.07. Any proposal received by HART after the exact time of the Proposal Due Date will not be accepted, will not be considered for award, and shall be returned to the Offeror unopened at the time of late submission or as soon as practicable.

#### 4.3 Receipt and Registration of Proposals

In accordance with HAR §3-122-51, proposals and any modifications thereto will be time-stamped upon receipt and held in a secure place by HART until the Proposal Due Date. Proposals and modifications will not be opened publicly, but will be opened in the presence of two or more HART officials. Prior to contract awards, proposals and modifications will be shown only to members of the evaluation committee and HART personnel or their designees having legitimate interest in them.

#### 4.4 Confidential Solicitation Process

HART will maintain a confidential process for the duration of this solicitation. To the extent permitted by law, all records related to this procurement, including, but not limited to, proposals, evaluations, priority list procedures, price proposals, evaluation and selection procedures, and records during the evaluation and selection process, will remain confidential until the contract awards have been posted by HART in accordance with HAR §3-122-9.01 and §3-122-63.

#### 4.5 Proposals Property of HART

Proposals will become the property of HART. Copies of each proposal will be retained by HART after the proposal evaluation process.

#### 4.6 Discussions with Offerors

If discussions with Offerors are required to make a selection, the discussions will be conducted in accordance with HAR §3-122-53. Pursuant to HAR §3-122-53, a priority list will be established consisting of up to three Offerors. If more than three acceptable or potentially acceptable proposals have been submitted, the priority list will be limited through evaluation and ranking to the Offerors who submitted the highest-ranked proposals.

#### 4.7 Best and Final Offers

If required, best and final offers will be accepted in accordance with HAR §3-122-54.

#### 4.8 Rejection of Proposals; Waiver of Informalities and Minor Irregularities

Proposals may be rejected in accordance with HAR §3-122-97. Furthermore, HART may:

- a) Reject any or all proposals if such action is in the public interest; and
- b) Waive informalities and minor irregularities in proposals received.

#### 4.9 Basis of Award

The basis of award(s) will be the "best value" in accordance with the evaluation criteria set forth herein (HAR §3-122-57).

#### 4.10 Verification of Responsibility of Offeror

The successful Offeror shall, within three (3) business days of notification of contract award, furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of HRS §103D-310(c):

- HRS Chapter 237, tax clearance;
- HRS Chapter 383, unemployment insurance;
- HRS Chapter 386, workers' compensation;
- HRS Chapter 392, temporary disability insurance;
- HRS Chapter 393, prepaid health care; and
- One of the following:
  - (a) Registered and incorporated or organized under the laws of the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "Hawaii business"; or
  - (b) Registered to do business in the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "compliant non-Hawaii business."

Offerors may choose to use the Hawaii Compliance Express ("HCE"), which allows businesses to register online at <a href="http://vendors.ehawaii.gov">http://vendors.ehawaii.gov</a> to acquire a single, printable electronic "Certificate of Vendor Compliance." The HCE provides current compliance status as of the certificate issuance date. The "Certificate of Vendor Compliance," indicating that the Offeror's status is compliant with the requirements of HRS §103D-310(c), will be accepted for both contracting purposes and final payment. Offerors that elect to use the HCE services will be required to pay an annual fee of twelve dollars (\$12.00) to the Hawaii Information Consortium, LLC ("HIC"). Offerors choosing not to

participate in the HCE program will be required to provide the paper certificates as specified above.

#### 4.11 Suspension and Debarment

In accordance with 2 CFR §1200, the Offeror is required to verify that none of its principals, as defined in 2 CFR §180.995, or affiliates, as defined in 2 CFR §180.905, are excluded or disqualified as defined in 2 CFR §\$180.935 and 180.945. The Offeror is required to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, and must include the requirements to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into. By signing and submitting its proposal, the Offeror certifies to these requirements.

#### 4.12 Execution of Contract

Subsequent to contract award(s), HART will present the contract to the successful Offeror(s) for execution. The successful Offeror(s) shall return the signed contract within ten (10) calendar days from the date upon which the contract was presented for signature by HART, or within such time as HART may otherwise allow.

The successful Offeror(s) shall provide evidence of the required insurance coverages when returning the signed contract to HART.

#### 4.13 Cancellation of Solicitation

This solicitation may be cancelled at any time pursuant to the Chief Procurement Officer's determination that cancellation is in the public interest or reasons based on, but not limited to, those set forth in HAR §3-122-96.

#### 4.14 Public Inspection; Segregation of Confidential Information

Public inspection will be in accordance with HAR §3-122-58. The existing contract file, except those portions the Offeror has designated in writing to be confidential as trade secrets or other proprietary data, subject to HAR §3-122-58(b), will be available for public inspection upon posting of the award pursuant to HRS §103D-701.

If a person requests to inspect the portions of an Offeror's proposal designated as confidential pursuant to HAR §3-122-46(9), the inspection will be subject to written determination by Corporation Counsel for confidentiality in accordance with HRS Chapter 92F. If Corporation Counsel determines in writing that the material designated as confidential is subject to disclosure, the material will be open to public inspection unless the Offeror appeals pursuant to HRS §92F-42(1).

#### 4.15 Debriefing

The purpose of a debriefing is to inform a non-selected Offeror of the basis for the source selection decision and contract award. Pursuant to HAR §3-122-60, a written request for a debriefing shall be made within three (3) working days after the posting of the award of the contract. To the extent practicable, debriefing shall be held by HART within seven (7) working days of the request for the debriefing, provided the Chief Procurement Officer may determine whether to conduct individual or combined debriefings.

#### 4.16 Protests

Protests shall be made in accordance with HRS §103D-701 and HAR §3-126-4. A protest by a non-selected Offeror shall be filed in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the notice of award or within five (5) working days after the date upon which the debriefing was conducted.

Offerors are hereby notified of their right to appeal to the FTA pursuant to FTA C 4220.1F Chapter VII, Section 1.b.

#### 4.17 Commencement of Services

Services shall not commence until: (a) the contract has been executed; (b) the Chief Procurement Officer has certified the availability of funds; and (c) a Notice to Proceed has been issued.

#### 4.18 Conflict of Interest and Non-Disclosure Requirements

The Offeror shall disclose and provide what may be or may be perceived as a potential conflict of interest, the nature of the potential conflict, and whether it can be minimized.

A Contractor who is paid for developing or preparing specifications or work statements in the development of the specifications is precluded from submitting an offer or receiving a contract for that particular solicitation in accordance with HRS §103D-405(d) and HAR §3-122-13(e).

Offerors are required to submit Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest.

Offerors are required to disclose if they are currently representing any departments, agencies, or other entities of the State of Hawaii, City and County of Honolulu, and/or any other city or county of Hawaii. Offerors are required to state whether that representation is an actual and/or potential conflict and whether the named party or HART would have to waive the conflict in order for the Offeror to perform this Contract. For actual or potential conflicts the Offeror shall also provide a detailed plan describing how the Offeror, alone, will mitigate the conflict. HART reserves the right to:

- 1. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
- 2. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
- 3. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
- 4. Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

It is a requirement of HART that Offeror organizations identified, including specialized subcontractors, remain intact for the duration of the procurement process, up to and including the execution of the resulting contract, unless otherwise approved in writing by HART.

The selected attorney/firm(s) acknowledges that they shall be prohibited from representing other clients whose interests are adverse to that of HART, or whose case(s) requires filing any form of litigation against HART, without HART's consent in writing

and pursuant to Hawaii Rules of Professional Conduct. HART will evaluate any such conflict of interest on a case by case basis and may consent to representation by an attorney/firm where HART's interests will not be adversely affected.

Non-Disclosure: The Offeror may be given access to confidential records, solely for the purpose of performing the required services under the Contract. The Offeror shall be required to sign a non-disclosure statement prior to receipt of such documents obligating each employee, agent, or subcontractor of the Offeror not to make inappropriate use of or improperly disclose any of the contents of such documents.

#### 5.0 PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS; SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 5.1 Proposals Signed by Authorized Personnel

Each proposal shall be signed in ink by the Offeror and where the Offeror is an entity, by an authorized representative. Authorized representatives shall submit proof of their authority to bind the entity.

#### 5.2 Review of RFP

It is the responsibility of all Offerors to examine the entire RFP, to seek clarification of any requirement that may not be clear, and to check all responses for accuracy before submitting a proposal. Negligence in preparing a proposal confers no right of withdrawal after the Proposal Due Date.

#### 5.3 Proposal Due Date

Proposals must be submitted to HART by no later than the date and time as specified in the Solicitation Timetable (Section 1.4).

Offerors are to submit their proposal electronically.

Electronic proposal submissions must be sent to the email address indicated below and include the RFP number and the words "Proposal Submission" in the subject line.

Late submittals will not be accepted. It is the responsibility of the Offeror to ensure that its proposal is delivered by the Proposal Due Date.

#### 5.5 Format and Quantities

See Exhibit 2 for Proposal format. Proposal should not exceed 50 pages. Proposals are to be written in English, minimum 12-point font, and printed on 8-1/2" x 11" paper; any larger sheets should be folded to that size. Pages are to be consecutively numbered. Exhibits and firm brochures do not count toward the 50-page limit.

Offerors submitting an electronic proposal shall submit (1) an unredacted electronic copy, (2) a redacted electronic copy, and (3) the price proposal in a separate file. Offerors shall mail, via postal, the hardcopy original signed Cover Letter, signed evidence of authority to bind the firm, and signed Exhibits to the address indicated in Section 5.4 no later than five days from the Proposal Due Date

#### 5.6 Organization of Proposal

Offerors are to follow the outline format provided in Exhibit 2 when preparing and organizing their proposals. All exhibits identified in Exhibit 2 shall be submitted with the proposal. Specific content requirements for each section of the proposal and the corresponding evaluation points are described in Section 6 below.

## 6.0 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS, EVALUATION CRITERIA AND EVALUATION POINTS

Proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the evaluation criteria described through Sections 6.1-6.6 of this ITO. Each section of the proposal has a maximum number of points allocated, as stated below, totaling 100 points.

#### 6.1 Cover Letter and Proposal Form (0 points)

The Offeror will provide a one-or two-page letter indicating its desire to be considered for the Contract and stating the official names and roles of all known subcontractors. Offeror must clearly indicate the firm who will be signing the Contract with HART, if selected. The Offeror should discuss its capability to meet the requirements of the Contract. Identify a single point of contact for the Offeror, including the address, telephone and fax numbers, and email address to which questions should be directed. Authorized representatives of the Offeror's organization shall sign the letter. Attach Exhibit 3, Exhibit 4, and Exhibit 5 to the Proposal Letter.

#### 6.2 Organizational Eligibility (Section 1) (5 Points)

- a) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 1 of the Proposal:

- v. Exhibits required in Section 1 are Exhibits 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, and 13.
- b) If a Joint Venture, Limited Liability Company, or Partnership:
  - i. Identity of the lead entity, if any;
  - ii. Indicate the equity share percentage held by each member;
  - iii. Include an express statement from each of the equity members of the entity to confirm their joint and several liability; and
  - iv. Identify full details of the organization structure in Appendix A to the Proposal.
- c) Requirements and information to be provided in Appendix A to the Proposal:
  - Notarized Power(s) of Attorney for the Offeror indicating the authority of the Offeror's representative to sign for that Offeror;
  - Notarized Power(s) of Attorney for the Offeror indicating the authority of the Offeror's designated point of contact to sign documents for and on behalf of the Offeror's organization; and
  - Alternatively, in lieu of the Powers of Attorney, the Offeror may submit
    certified, original corporate resolutions for the Offeror (as appropriate)
    indicating the authority of the Offeror's designated point of contact to
    sign documents for and on behalf of the Offeror's organization. Such
    resolutions must be signed by the Secretary of the corporation and
    contain a corporate seal or notarization.
- d) While Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest is to be submitted in this Section, HART reserves the right to:
  - i. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
  - ii. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
  - iii. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
  - Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

#### 6.3 Experience of the Offeror (Section 2) (45 Points)

- a) The objective of this section is:
  - i. To identify Offerors with experience on projects similar in nature to providing government liaison services on HART's behalf with legislative and executive branches of the City and County of Honolulu, the State of Hawaii, and the Federal government, with demonstrated experience and

expertise in, capacity for, and record of producing quality work on projects similar in nature to the scope of services provided in Special Provisions, Appendix A.

- ii. To identify Offerors with the following:
  - A) Superior experience in serving as a liaison consultant with demonstrated experience in coordinating, developing and implementing strategies, securing funds, monitoring program opportunities and representing the agenda and interest of projects similar to HART, preferably with respect to local/federal transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and funding opportunities;
  - B) Experience in providing comprehensive reports, researching and preparing testimony and written comments on pending legislation for presentation at hearings, and for planning and implementing long and short-term federal funding strategies; and
  - C) Experience with Government initiatives, changes to legislation, guidance, rulemaking, and other actions regarding transportation policy, legislation, transportation policy and funding processes.
- iii. To identify Offerors with experience in successfully managing projects of similar size, scope, and nature as set forth in this RFP.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 2 of the Proposal:

Identify subcontractors the Offeror plans to use, to the extent they are known, indicating what portion of the Services each subcontractor is anticipated to undertake. Submit maximum one-page summary of experience for each listed subcontractor.
  - iv. <u>Key Personnel</u>: Provide the information requested in Exhibit 21 for Offeror's Key Personnel who will support the contract. For each person listed in Exhibit 21 provide:
    - 1) a resume; and
    - 2) two references.
  - v. Exhibits required in Section 2 are Exhibits 17, 18, 19 and 21.

#### 6.4 Approach and Understanding Relative to Scope of Services (Section 3) (30 Points)

- a) The objective of this section is:
  - i. To identify those Offerors with an understanding of government funding strategies in relation to Public Tresponsion of Personal privacy protected information and other government entities, particularly; U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Office of the Secretary of Transportation, White House Office of Management and Budget, City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, and Hawaii's Congressional Delegation.
  - ii. To identify Offerors with demonstrated effective communication skills, Offerors who can convey information that impacts the ability to shape and deliver a response timely and accurately to information on changes, guidance, rulemaking, or other anticipated local government actions that could have an impact on HART.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 3 of the Proposal:

I'm following up on a voice mail I left on your cell phone. I'm doing a story on HART's requests for proposals for personal services contracts for a federal government liaison and a board consultant contract. Can you or Lori do a zoom or in person interview regarding the need to increase the lobbying contracts for HART at a time when the rail project is significantly cutting costs? My questions are below underlined

As I understand it, both contracts are each worth \$1 million a year, which is three times the amount HART has been paying HART's longtime lobbyist Dennis Dwyer.

#### 1. Can you give details on why the need for escalating HART's lobbying costs?

In our previous conversation, you mentioned that about 5 people within your division – particular the outreach group – were recently let go.

- 2. Can you tell me how many HART employees (paid for by city taxpayer money) over all have been let go since Jan. 4?
- 3. How many consultants employees (both embedded and not embedded at HART) have been terminated since Jan. 4.
- 4. Can you give an estimate on the dollar amount of savings each year?

An expert I interviewed especially thought that the contract for the board consultant was narrowly tailored so that only a handful of attorneys who have worked with the city, state and the feds could qualify. He also mentioned that many of the duties listed for the federal government liaison and board consultant were handled by former CEOs and staff. He believes this might reflect the current CEO's lack of experience in lobbying in Washington, D.C. and the state Capitol.

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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), created pursuant to an amendment to the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu 1973 ("RCH") to develop, operate, and maintain the Honolulu Rail Transit Project ("HRTP").

This Request for Proposals ("RFP") is issued by HART to identify Persons qualified to submit competitive sealed proposals for the HART Board Consultant Services Contract. "Persons" means any individual, firm, corporation, company, LLC, LLP, joint venture, voluntary association, partnership, trust, public or private organization, other legal entity, or combination thereof.

#### 1.1 HRTP Description

The HRTP will provide high-capacity rapid transit service in the travel corridor between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. This corridor includes the majority of housing and employment on O'ahu. The north-south width of the corridor is a maximum of four (4) miles, with the corridor constrained by the Ko'olau and Wai'anae Mountain Ranges to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south.

The HRTP is identified in the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") as the design, construction and operation of a twenty (20) mile grade-separated fixed guideway transit system between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. All parts of the guideway will be elevated, except near Leeward Community College where it will be at-grade. The system will incorporate steel wheel-on-steel rail technology. The HRTP includes twenty-one (21) stations, one (1) Rail Operations Center ("ROC"), and eighty (80) light metro vehicles and associated core systems.

#### 1.2 HART Board Consultant Services Description

The selected Offeror (or "Contractor") will provide HART Board Consultant services in Honolulu, Hawaii. The selected Offeror will serve as HART's liaison to the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature and Congressional Committees and appropriate federal and state agencies. The selected Offeror will provide coordination, counsel, and information to HART and will advise and represent HART with respect to state transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and state funding opportunities. Addenda will be incorporated as part of the RFP. Oral interpretations, clarifications, changes, or substitutions will be without legal effect. Only interpretations, clarifications, changes, or approved substitutions provided by a formal written addendum to the solicitation shall be binding.

#### 4.2 Modification or Withdrawal of Proposals

Proposals submitted pursuant to this RFP may be modified or withdrawn prior to the Proposal Due Date in accordance with HAR §3-122-16.07. Any proposal received by HART after the exact time of the Proposal Due Date will not be accepted, will not be considered for award, and shall be returned to the Offeror unopened at the time of late submission or as soon as practicable.

#### 4.3 Receipt and Registration of Proposals

In accordance with HAR §3-122-51, proposals and any modifications thereto will be time-stamped upon receipt and held in a secure place by HART until the Proposal Due Date. Proposals and modifications will not be opened publicly, but will be opened in the presence of two or more HART officials. Prior to contract awards, proposals and modifications will be shown only to members of the evaluation committee and HART personnel or their designees having legitimate interest in them.

#### 4.4 Confidential Solicitation Process

HART will maintain a confidential process for the duration of this solicitation. #### 4.11 Suspension and Debarment

#### 4.14 Public Inspection; Segregation of Confidential Information

#### 4.15 Debriefing

To the extent practicable, debriefing shall be held by HART within seven (7) working days of the request for the debriefing, provided the Chief Procurement Officer may determine whether to conduct individual or combined debriefings.

#### 4.16 Protests

Protests shall be made in accordance with HRS §103D-701 and HAR §3-126-4. A protest by a non-selected Offeror shall be filed in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the notice of award or within five (5) working days after the date upon which the debriefing was conducted.

Offerors are hereby notified of their right to appeal to the FTA pursuant to FTA C 4220.1F Chapter VII, Section 1.b.

#### 4.17 Commencement of Services

Services shall not commence until: (a) the contract has been executed; (b) the Chief Procurement Officer has certified the availability of funds; and (c) a Notice to Proceed has been issued.

#### 4.18 Conflict of Interest and Non-Disclosure Requirements

The Offeror shall disclose and provide what may be or may be perceived as a potential conflict of interest, the nature of the potential conflict, and whether it can be minimized.

A Contractor who is paid for developing or preparing specifications or work statements in the development of the specifications is precluded from submitting an offer or receiving a contract for that particular solicitation in accordance with HRS §103D-405(d) and HAR §3-122-13(e).

Offerors are required to submit Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest.

Offerors are required to disclose if they are currently representing any departments, agencies, or other entities of the State of Hawaii, City and County of Honolulu, and/or any other city or county of Hawaii. Offerors are required to state whether that representation is an actual and/or potential conflict and whether the named party or HART would have to waive the conflict in order for the Offeror to perform this Contract. For actual or potential conflicts the Offeror shall also provide a detailed plan describing how the Offeror, alone, will mitigate the conflict. HART reserves the right to:

- 1. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
- 2. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
- 3. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
- 4. Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

The selected attorney/firm(s) acknowledges that they shall be prohibited from representing other clients whose interests are adverse to that of HART, or whose case(s) requires filing any form of litigation against HART, without HART's consent in writing

and pursuant to Hawaii Rules of Professional Conduct. HART will evaluate any such conflict of interest on a case by case basis and may consent to representation by an attorney/firm where HART's interests will not be adversely affected.

Non-Disclosure: The Offeror may be given access to confidential records, solely for the purpose of performing the required services under the Contract. The Offeror shall be required to sign a non-disclosure statement prior to receipt of such documents obligating each employee, agent, or subcontractor of the Offeror not to make inappropriate use of or improperly disclose any of the contents of such documents.

#### 5.0 PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS; SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 5.1 Proposals Signed by Authorized Personnel

Exhibits and firm brochures do not count toward the 50-page limit.

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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), created pursuant to an amendment to the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu 1973 ("RCH") to develop, operate, and maintain the Honolulu Rail Transit Project ("HRTP").

This Request for Proposals ("RFP") is issued by HART to identify Persons qualified to submit competitive sealed proposals for the Federal Government Liaison Services Contract. "Persons" means any individual, firm, corporation, company, LLC, LLP, joint venture, voluntary association, partnership, trust, public or private organization, other legal entity, or combination thereof.

#### 1.1 HRTP Description

The HRTP will provide high-capacity rapid transit service in the travel corridor between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. This corridor includes the majority of housing and employment on O'ahu. The north-south width of the corridor is a maximum of four (4) miles, with the corridor constrained by the Ko'olau and Wai'anae Mountain Ranges to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south.

The HRTP is identified in the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") as the design, construction and operation of a twenty (20) mile grade-separated fixed guideway transit system between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. All parts of the guideway will be elevated, except near Leeward Community College where it will be at-grade. The system will incorporate steel wheel-on-steel rail technology. The HRTP includes twenty-one (21) stations, one (1) Rail Operations Center ("ROC"), and eighty (80) light metro vehicles and associated core systems.

#### 1.2 Federal Government Liaison Services Description

The selected Offeror (or "Contractor") will provide Federal Government Liaison services in Washington D.C. The selected Offeror will serve as HART's liaison in Washington D.C. with Hawaii's Congressional Delegation and appropriate Federal agencies. The selected Offeror will provide coordination, counsel, and information to HART and will advise and represent HART with respect to federal transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and federal funding opportunities. #### 2.0 TERM OF THE CONTRACT

The term of any Contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation will be for five (5) months, commencing from the issuance of a written Notice to Proceed ("NTP"), with options to extend the contract up to six (6) years. The total Contract term shall not to exceed a total of six (6) years with options.

The Contract will be a multi-term contract subject to the availability of funds in accordance with HAR §3-122-149.

Contract funds are available for only the initial term of the contract, and the contractual obligation of both parties in each fiscal period succeeding the first is subject to the appropriation and availability of funds.   - (a) Registered and incorporated or organized under the laws of the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "Hawaii business"; or
  - (b) Registered to do business in the State of Hawaii, hereinafter referred to as a "compliant non-Hawaii business."

Offerors may choose to use the Hawaii Compliance Express ("HCE"), which allows businesses to register online at <a href="http://vendors.ehawaii.gov">http://vendors.ehawaii.gov</a> to acquire a single, printable electronic "Certificate of Vendor Compliance." The HCE provides current compliance status as of the certificate issuance date. The "Certificate of Vendor Compliance," indicating that the Offeror's status is compliant with the requirements of HRS §103D-310(c), will be accepted for both contracting purposes and final payment. Offerors that elect to use the HCE services will be required to pay an annual fee of twelve dollars (\$12.00) to the Hawaii Information Consortium, LLC ("HIC"). Offerors choosing not to

participate in the HCE program will be required to provide the paper certificates as specified above.

#### 4.11 Suspension and Debarment

In accordance with 2 CFR §1200, the Offeror is required to verify that none of its principals, as defined in 2 CFR §180.995, or affiliates, as defined in 2 CFR §180.905, are excluded or disqualified as defined in 2 CFR §\$180.935 and 180.945. The Offeror is required to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, and must include the requirements to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into. By signing and submitting its proposal, the Offeror certifies to these requirements.

#### 4.12 Execution of Contract

Subsequent to contract award(s), HART will present the contract to the successful Offeror(s) for execution. The successful Offeror(s) shall return the signed contract within ten (10) calendar days from the date upon which the contract was presented for signature by HART, or within such time as HART may otherwise allow.

The successful Offeror(s) shall provide evidence of the required insurance coverages when returning the signed contract to HART.

#### 4.13 Cancellation of Solicitation

This solicitation may be cancelled at any time pursuant to the Chief Procurement Officer's determination that cancellation is in the public interest or reasons based on, but not limited to, those set forth in HAR §3-122-96.

#### 4.14 Public Inspection; Segregation of Confidential Information

Public inspection will be in accordance with HAR §3-122-58. The existing contract file, except those portions the Offeror has designated in writing to be confidential as trade secrets or other proprietary data, subject to HAR §3-122-58(b), will be available for public inspection upon posting of the award pursuant to HRS §103D-701.

If a person requests to inspect the portions of an Offeror's proposal designated as confidential pursuant to HAR §3-122-46(9), the inspection will be subject to written determination by Corporation Counsel for confidentiality in accordance with HRS Chapter 92F. If Corporation Counsel determines in writing that the material designated as confidential is subject to disclosure, the material will be open to public inspection unless the Offeror appeals pursuant to HRS §92F-42(1).

#### 4.15 Debriefing

The purpose of a debriefing is to inform a non-selected Offeror of the basis for the source selection decision and contract award. Pursuant to HAR §3-122-60, a written request for a debriefing shall be made within three (3) working days after the posting of the award of the contract. To the extent practicable, debriefing shall be held by HART within seven (7) working days of the request for the debriefing, provided the Chief Procurement Officer may determine whether to conduct individual or combined debriefings.

#### 4.16 Protests

Protests shall be made in accordance with HRS §103D-701 and HAR §3-126-4. A protest by a non-selected Offeror shall be filed in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the notice of award or within five (5) working days after the date upon which the debriefing was conducted.

Offerors are hereby notified of their right to appeal to the FTA pursuant to FTA C 4220.1F Chapter VII, Section 1.b.

#### 4.17 Commencement of Services

Services shall not commence until: (a) the contract has been executed; (b) the Chief Procurement Officer has certified the availability of funds; and (c) a Notice to Proceed has been issued.

#### 4.18 Conflict of Interest and Non-Disclosure Requirements

The Offeror shall disclose and provide what may be or may be perceived as a potential conflict of interest, the nature of the potential conflict, and whether it can be minimized.

A Contractor who is paid for developing or preparing specifications or work statements in the development of the specifications is precluded from submitting an offer or receiving a contract for that particular solicitation in accordance with HRS §103D-405(d) and HAR §3-122-13(e).

Offerors are required to submit Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest.

Offerors are required to disclose if they are currently representing any departments, agencies, or other entities of the State of Hawaii, City and County of Honolulu, and/or any other city or county of Hawaii. Offerors are required to state whether that representation is an actual and/or potential conflict and whether the named party or HART would have to waive the conflict in order for the Offeror to perform this Contract. For actual or potential conflicts the Offeror shall also provide a detailed plan describing how the Offeror, alone, will mitigate the conflict. HART reserves the right to:

- 1. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
- 2. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
- 3. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
- 4. Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

It is a requirement of HART that Offeror organizations identified, including specialized subcontractors, remain intact for the duration of the procurement process, up to and including the execution of the resulting contract, unless otherwise approved in writing by HART.

The selected attorney/firm(s) acknowledges that they shall be prohibited from representing other clients whose interests are adverse to that of HART, or whose case(s)

requires filing any form of litigation against HART, without HART's consent in writing and pursuant to Hawaii Rules of Professional Conduct. HART will evaluate any such conflict of interest on a case by case basis and may consent to representation by an attorney/firm where HART's interests will not be adversely affected.

Non-Disclosure: The Offeror may be given access to confidential records, solely for the purpose of performing the required services under the Contract. The Offeror shall be required to sign a non-disclosure statement prior to receipt of such documents obligating each employee, agent, or subcontractor of the Offeror not to make inappropriate use of or improperly disclose any of the contents of such documents.

#### 5.0 PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS; SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 5.1 Proposals Signed by Authorized Personnel

Each proposal shall be signed in ink by the Offeror and where the Offeror is an entity, by an authorized representative. Authorized representatives shall submit proof of their authority to bind the entity.

#### 5.2 Review of RFP

It is the responsibility of all Offerors to examine the entire RFP, to seek clarification of any requirement that may not be clear, and to check all responses for accuracy before submitting a proposal. Negligence in preparing a proposal confers no right of withdrawal after the Proposal Due Date.

#### 5.3 Proposal Due Date

Proposals must be submitted to HART by no later than the date and time as specified in the Solicitation Timetable (Section 1.4).

Offerors are to submit their proposal electronically.

Electronic proposal submissions must be sent to the email address indicated below and include the RFP number and the words "Proposal Submission" in the subject line.

Late submittals will not be accepted. It is the responsibility of the Offeror to ensure that its proposal is delivered by the Proposal Due Date.

#### 5.4 Submittal Location

Submittals by facsimiles will not be accepted.

## 5.5 Format and Quantities

See Exhibit 2 for Proposal format. Proposal should not exceed 50 pages. Proposals are to be written in English, minimum 12-point font, and printed on 8-1/2" x 11" paper; any larger sheets should be folded to that size. Pages are to be consecutively numbered. Exhibits and firm brochures do not count toward the 50-page limit.

Offerors submitting an electronic proposal shall submit (1) an unredacted electronic copy, (2) a redacted electronic copy, and (3) the price proposal in a separate file. Offerors shall mail, via postal, the hardcopy original signed Cover Letter, signed evidence of authority to bind the firm, and signed Exhibits to the address indicated in Section 5.4 no later than five days from the Proposal Due Date.

## 5.6 Organization of Proposal

Offerors are to follow the outline format provided in Exhibit 2 when preparing and organizing their proposals. All exhibits identified in Exhibit 2 shall be submitted with the proposal. Specific content requirements for each section of the proposal and the corresponding evaluation points are described in Section 6 below.

## 6.0 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS, EVALUATION CRITERIA AND EVALUATION POINTS

Proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the evaluation criteria described through Sections 6.1-6.6 of this ITO. Each section of the proposal has a maximum number of points allocated, as stated below, totaling 100 points.

- v. Exhibits required in Section 1 are Exhibits 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, and 13.
- b) If a Joint Venture, Limited Liability Company, or Partnership:
  - i. Identity of the lead entity, if any;
  - ii. Indicate the equity share percentage held by each member;
  - iii. Include an express statement from each of the equity members of the entity to confirm their joint and several liability; and
  - iv. Identify full details of the organization structure in Appendix A to the Proposal.
- c) Requirements and information to be provided in Appendix A to the Proposal:
  - i. Notarized Power(s) of Attorney for the Offeror indicating the authority of the Offeror's representative to sign for that Offeror;
  - ii. Notarized Power(s) of Attorney for the Offeror indicating the authority of the Offeror's designated point of contact to sign documents for and on behalf of the Offeror's organization; and
  - iii. Alternatively, in lieu of the Powers of Attorney, the Offeror may submit certified, original corporate resolutions for the Offeror (as appropriate) indicating the authority of the Offeror's designated point of contact to sign documents for and on behalf of the Offeror's organization. Such resolutions must be signed by the Secretary of the corporation and contain a corporate seal or notarization.
- d) While Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest is to be submitted in this Section, HART reserves the right to:
  - i. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;
  - ii. Accept or reject any request for conflict waiver;
  - iii. Accept or reject any proposed conflict mitigation plan; and
  - iv. Consider any conflicts presented, waivers requested and/or mitigations proposed when scoring Offerors proposals against all evaluation criteria.

## 6.3 Experience of the Offeror (Section 2) (45 Points)

  - B) Experience in providing comprehensive reports, researching and preparing testimony and written comments on pending legislation for presentation at hearings, and for planning and implementing long and short-term federal funding strategies; and
  - C) Experience with Federal Government initiatives, changes to legislation, guidance, rulemaking, and other federal actions regarding federal transportation policy, federal legislation, federal transportation policy and federal funding processes.
- iii. To identify Offerors with experience in successfully managing projects of similar size, scope, and nature as set forth in this Federal Government Liaison RFP.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 2 of the Proposal:

Provide a description of those projects comparable or relevant to that anticipated for the Federal Government Liaison Contract.
  - ii. Past Performances: Provide the information requested in Exhibit 18 for the Offeror. If an Offeror has no record of relevant past performance or if the relevant information is not available, enter a declarative statement to that effect. Copies of awards, citations and commendations may be included in Appendix B and will not count toward the page limit.
  - iii. Subcontractor Information: If applicable, provide the information requested in Exhibit 19. Identify subcontractors the Offeror plans to use, to the extent they are known, indicating what portion of the Services each subcontractor is anticipated to undertake. Submit maximum one-page summary of experience for each listed subcontractor.
  - iv. <u>Key Personnel</u>: Provide the information requested in Exhibit 21 for Offeror's Key Personnel who will support the contract. For each person listed in Exhibit 21 provide:
    - 1) a resume; and
    - 2) two references.
  - v. Exhibits required in Section 2 are Exhibits 17, 18, 19 and 21.

## 6.4 Approach and Understanding Relative to Scope of Services (Section 3) (30 Points)

- a) The objective of this section is:
  - i. To identify those Offerors with an understanding of government funding strategies in relation to Public Transportation and demonstrated experience in working with Federal, State, City, County and other government entities, particularly; U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Office of the Secretary of Transportation, White House Office of Management and Budget, and Hawaii's Congressional Delegation.
  - ii. To identify Offerors with demonstrated effective communication skills, Offerors who can convey information that impacts the ability to shape and deliver a response timely and accurately to information on changes, guidance, rulemaking, or other anticipated federal actions that could have an impact on HART.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 3 of the Proposal:
  - i. Briefly describe how the Offeror will use its organization, subject matter expertise, key personnel availability and process expertise to ensure successful performance of the Contract;
  - ii. Briefly describe the Offeror's unique approach to identifying and implementing the RFP requirements while meeting HART, FTA, and State requirements, and;
  - iii. Provide a narrative addressing the Offeror's understanding and approach to performing the items of the Scope of Services, as set forth in Appendix A of the Special Provisions.

## 6.5 Price Proposal (Section 4) (20 points)

- a) The objective of this section is to provide a Price Proposal using the instructions listed herein. Submit all information as specified herein, using the Exhibit and formats specified.
- b) The Price Proposal of the selected Offeror will be incorporated into the Contract.
- c) The Offeror shall submit Exhibit 22, Price Proposal Form. The Offeror is to provide their price for each respective month for each year listed, both base and option years, and the total price of the Contract. The total price of the Proposal will be considered the cost factor for evaluation purposes. The price for this contract shall be inclusive of all cost related to this contract. There will be no reimbursable expenses in this contract.

- d) The Offeror shall submit Exhibit 24, Non-Collusion Affidavit, certifying to HART that there was no collusion and that the price submitted in response to the RFP was independently arrived at and developed.
- e) Price Proposals will become the property of HART. The Price Proposal will be retained after the Price Proposal evaluation process for the contract file.
- f) Proposals shall include any and all applicable taxes.

## 7.0 INSURANCE

The Contractor shall obtain and maintain insurance in the amounts and types specified in the General Terms and Conditions of Professional Services, as may be amended by the Special Provisions.

## 8.0 ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS

By submitting a proposal, an Offeror expressly agrees to all of the terms, conditions, provisions, and requirements set forth in this RFP and the General Terms and Conditions of Professional Services.

## 9.0 DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) CONTRACT GOAL

HART established a DBE program in accordance with the regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation ("USDOT"), Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26 (49 C.F.R. Part 26). HART has received federal financial assistance from USDOT, and as a condition of receiving this assistance, HART signed an Assurance with the USDOT that it will comply with 49 C.F.R. Part 26.

The Contractor and its subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of the Contract. The Contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 26 in the award and administration of USDOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the Contractor to carry out these requirements will be a material breach of the Contract, which may result in termination of the Contract or such other remedy, as HART deems appropriate.

HART has established an overall DBE Project goal of 13.00% for the duration of this Project. A separate Contract Goal has not been established for this Contract. DBE firms and small businesses shall have an equal opportunity to participate in the Contract.

The Contractor shall report its DBE participation obtained through race-neutral means throughout the period of performance. The Contractor shall submit the "DBE PARTICIPATION REPORT" reflecting payments made by the Contractor to DBE subcontractors in accordance with Appendix C, Section 1.6 of the Federal Requirements. Payments to the Contractor will not be processed if the DBE PARTICIPATION REPORT is not properly completed and attached. The DBE PARTICIPATION REPORT shall be prepared in the format set forth in Attachment 1.6(a).

## 10.0 NO REIMBURSEMENTS

HART will not provide any reimbursement for the cost of developing or submitting a proposal in response to this RFP.

CH, while on the HART Board raised concerns over the costs of the undergrounding of 138kV lines in West Oahu and on Dillingham corridor. She questioned HART on the land transfer of the ROC along with issues of the tendons and plithless system, to name a few examples. CH testified before City Council in 2016 and was very candid about her belief that the \$6.8 billion would not be adequate funding. CH was asked to testify before the City Council because then HART Executive Director believed she would be better received by the Council.

- 3. CH testified for and assisted in the development of passage of Act 1 of the 2017 First Special Session of the Hawai'i State Legislature. This involved understanding the projections on GET, TAT and the anticipated increase in the cost of the project. CH was very familiar with the calculations, working with Wes Machida and Robert Yu. CH was asked to provide testimony by the leadership of the House and Senate before a joint hearing. At that hearing, then Interim Director, Mr. Murthy concurred with the anticipated funding.

And 3. above. 3) CH is very familiar with the legislative process at all levels of government. 4) As set forth in 2. and 3. above, CH's ability to testify before the various levels of government is well established. In addition, CH has testified before Congressional panels as well. 5) As set forth in 2. above CH has demonstrated her ability to do so. 6) CH has shown that she does and is capable of establishing and maintaining working relationships with the listed entities. CH also continues to have her relationships in the Congress.

# SECTION 2 EXPERIENCE OF OFFEROR

#### 1. OBJECTIVE OF THIS SECTION

- a. In that a specific reference was made to Appendix A, the Offeror has taken this opportunity to show how it can provide the government liaison duties which this section seeks. (The following sub headings are not verbatim.)
- i) Membership and Quorum Issue. The membership and quorum strategies brings into light the conflict between the Act 1 of the First Special Session of 2017; the concept of home rule, the provisions of the Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, the legal theory of general laws and whether the acceptance of funding of Act 1 negates any defenses of home rule. This is further complicated by the fact that the HART Board did not challenge the provisions of Act 1 and in fact "welcomed" the four ex-officio non-voting members appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House. In fact, presently 3 of the voting members of this Board were originally appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House. The history of the membership and quorum issue is as follows.

When the RCH Section 17 (HART) was enacted, the composition of the HART Board was as follows:

#### Section 17-104. Powers, Duties and Functions of the Board of Directors — . . .

- 2. The board shall consist of ten members, nine voting members and one nonvoting member. All members shall serve part-time. The board shall be governed by the provisions of Section 13-103 of this charter, except that subsections (b) and (e) shall not apply and as otherwise provided herein.
- 3. Appointed members. There shall be seven appointed members. The mayor shall appoint three members. The council shall appoint three members. The six appointed and two ex officio voting members shall appoint, by majority vote, a ninth member. The initial appointments of the seven appointed members shall be as follows: One member from each mayoral or council appointment shall be designated to serve a five-, four-, and three-year term. The ninth member appointed by the voting members shall serve a two-year term.
- 4. Ex officio members. The state director of transportation and the city director of transportation services shall be ex officio voting members of the board. The director of the department of planning and permitting shall be the ex officio nonvoting member of the board. The ex officio members of the board shall not be subject to any term limit.

The general provision found in the RCH on Boards and Commission which is relevant to the HART Board in Section 13-103 which provides:

#### Section 13-103. Boards and Commissions -

- 1. Except as otherwise provided by this charter or by law, all boards and commissions established by this charter or by ordinance shall be governed by the following provisions:
  - (a) To be eligible for appointment to a board or commission, a person shall be a duly registered voter of the city.
  - (b) All members shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the council.
  - (c) All appointed members shall serve for staggered terms of five years, and they shall serve until their successors have been appointed and qualified. No person shall serve on the same board for more than two consecutive full terms or for more than ten consecutive years, whichever is greater. [Provisions (b) and (c) above do not apply to HART.]
  - (g) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.
  - (h) All meetings shall be held in city hall or other public places.
  - (i) The affirmative vote of a majority of the entire membership shall be necessary to take any action, and such action shall be made at a meeting open to the public.

Then when Act 1 became law, it contained this provision:

SECTION 18. Notwithstanding any law, charter provision, or ordinance to the contrary, in any county with a population greater than five hundred thousand, in order to ensure appropriate use of state authorized funds to finance a locally preferred alternative for a mass transit project, the president of the senate and speaker of the house of representatives shall each appoint two non-voting, ex-officio members to the board of directors of the county's rapid transportation authority, , , ,

Hawai'i Rev. Stat. §92-15 governs Boards and Commissions under State law and provides as follows:

[§92-15] Boards and commissions; quorum; number of votes necessary to validate acts. Whenever the number of members necessary to constitute a quorum to do business, or the number of members necessary to validate any act, of any board or commission of the State or of any political subdivision thereof, is not specified in the law or ordinance creating the same or in any other law or ordinance, a majority of all the members to which the board or commission is entitled shall constitute a quorum to do business, and the concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board or commission is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the board or commission valid...

The general rule of statutory construction applies here. That is to say if the words are clear and unambiguous, they are construed as written. *Watland v. Lingle*, 104 Hawai'i 128, 140, 85 P.3d 1079, 1091 (2004). The Hawai'i Supreme Court has stated that the Constitution must be construed "with due regard to the intent of the framers and the people adopting it." *Hanabusa v. Lingle*, 105 Hawai'i 28, 31, 93 P.3d 670, 673 (2004). The intent is found in the "instrument itself." *Id.* citing *Blair v. Harris*, 98 Hawai'i 176, 178-179, 45 P.3d 800, 800-801 (2002).

The Supreme Court of Hawai'i has also addressed these principles as it applies to City ordinances and clashes with the State laws. The case of *Richardson v. City and County of Honolulu*, 76 Hawaii 46, 56, 868 P.2d 1193, 1203 (1994) is an example. The Supreme Court stated:

[t]he fundamental starting point for statutory interpretation is the language of the statute itself.... [W]here the statutory language is plain and unambiguous, our sole duty is to give effect to its plain and obvious meaning.' "AIG Hawaii Ins. Co. v. Estate of Caraang, 74 Haw. 620, 633-34, 851 P.2d 321, 328 (1993) (quoting National Union Fire Ins. Co. v. Ferreira, 71 Haw. 341, 344, 790 P.2d 910, 912 (1990)). The dissent acknowledges "the plain language rule of statutory construction," but seeks to avoid it on the basis that a literal construction of HRS §§ 46-1.5(6), 101-2, and 46-61 "would produce an absurd or unjust result, inconsistent with the policies of the statute[s]." Dissent at 1215-16. We submit, for the reasons stated in this opinion, that construing the plain language of these three statutes to authorize the City to enact Ordinance 91-95 is neither absurd nor unjust. If we are correct, then the entire theoretical underpinning of the dissent's resort to any "extrinsic aids to statutory construction" is toppled.

[For clarification, this was a challenge by the Trustees of Bishop Estate against the City Council enacting an ordinance which permitted the condemnation of leasehold condominiums. This was the Kahala Towers case, located next to the Waialae Country Club.]

The same logic should apply to the "affirmative vote" of the majority of the members which the

Board is entitled to. The significance of the failure of the Charter Amendment is that it affirmed

the total number which is 10 and did not include the Act 1 additions. Therefore, the total number is 6 affirmative votes which is 2/3rds of the total number of voting members.

I believe that this is in line with State law. As set forth in *Hawai'i Rev. Stat.* §92-15, the quorum number and the voting numbers is what the Board is entitled to. The argument that this includes the Act 1 additions, fails because the Charter specifies the numbers as 10. The people had the opportunity to vote to include them and they did not.

It was also not the intent of the legislature for the Act 1 additions to play a role with the decision making of HART, they would have been identified as ex officio voting members of the HART Board. The intent was clearly identified as that they were there to: "ensure appropriate use of state authorized funds to finance a locally preferred alternative for a mass transit project." If they were there in any other affirmative capacity, they would be voting members.

I further believe the Legislature did not make their appointees voting members because that would be an overstep. To find that their presence in essence makes it possible for 2 voting members to stop an action versus 4 voting members, is to undercut the intent of the Charter and Act 1. Notwithstanding, Senator Inouye proposed exactly that.

Though I have read accounts that some believe that a Charter Amendment is necessary, the amendment failed in 2018. Moreover, the HART Boards own action in 2017 makes a challenge of Act 1 difficult at this time. The fundamental issue will be, does HART and/or the City wish to challenge Act 1? There is a severability clause in Act 1 and the issue will be whether the City has slept on its rights. These are the necessary issues to discuss with in developing the strategies.

ii) Short and Long-Term funding strategies for HART. This provision requires the Offeror to collaborate with the HART Board and the Senior Leadership to develop short and long-terms funding strategies for the Project. The Appendix discusses the FTA funding pursuant to the FFGA; securing additional GET and TAT; collaborating with the City Administration for innovative ways to secure funding (I assume this means without raising real property taxes); and to explore New Start Programs of the FTA. In order to effectively plan the short and long-term strategies, you need someone who knows the history and why we are here. If you review the ceremonial FFGA, executed on December 19, 2012 (two days after Senator Daniel K. Inouye passed), you will find my signature as a member of Congress. As some of you may be aware, I sat as a member of HART Board from July 2015 to October 2016. From April to October 2016. I served as the Chair of the HART Board. During this time period, I became aware of the fact that the first GET extension of \$1.5 Billion passed in 2015 was adopted by the City Council in the 2016. At that time, I testified that it was not enough money. The difficulty with Council was that then Executive Director and the prior Chair of the HART Board had said "\$1.2 Billion, not a penny more." When they testified before the Legislature, the unified voice of HART and the City said only \$910 Million was needed. Two years later, HART and the City was before the Legislature asking for GET extension for 10 years; some in the construction industry asked for GET in perpetuity. As you know, the efforts in the regular session of 2017 failed in Conference.

The Legislature knew the significance of the funding shortfall and called the First Special Session of the 2017. I testified before and assisted the Legislature in the development of what became Act 1. All of the funding sources listed in 2. of the Appendix A will be necessary for the completion of this Project. Notwithstanding, there must be diligent monitoring of the FTA's New Start program. Though in the past the HART project was deemed not to qualify for any additional New Start funds, the issue will be whether the Biden Administration's Infrastructure Plan will provide additional funds. From the time I was in Congress, it was the Democrat's objective to pass a massive infrastructure bill and a priority of Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Majority Leader Steny Hoyer. All of these facts are essential in the development of the funding strategies. Given the history, it will not be a simple task.

- (iii) Provide timely information about upcoming initiatives, changes, etc. which will impact HART and the funding and prepare the responses. I believe HART has had government relations individuals who have had this responsibility. However, I concur that the HART Board is in need of its own consultant to perform these functions. The Board may differ from the Senior Leadership of HART and among its members. Given the monthly meeting structure of HART which is an unpaid volunteer Board, timely information will permit the Board to have the necessary discussion to arrive at a unified position. To be without the ability to do this, the voice of HART will not be the Board, as it should be.
- (iv) Research and prepare testimony for hearings at all levels of government. The Offeror has years of experience in researching legislations at all levels of government and preparing testimony. Just as critical, the Offeror has many years of experience conducting hearings and receiving testimony. When one has extensive experience in this area, one is able to prepare testimony that assist the entity holding the hearing to better comprehend the HART Board's position. The HART Board, and HART generally, is now in the position where it must regain public confidence and trust. This is where if like the Offeror one knows what kind of testimony could be persuasive, it will be better received.
- (v) Support and assist HART in interactions with outreach with government at all levels, including to cooperate and support HART's Federal Liaison Consultant. The purpose of this provision is communications with the relevant parties at all levels of government to ensure that HART is viewed as transparent and open as to its activities. This is necessary to regain the public's trust and confidence in this Project. The Offeror is able to perform this task and adds that due to her years in Congress, she believes that she will be able to support and will cooperate with whomever HART selects as its Federal Liaison Consultant. The Offeror believes given the limited number who qualifies as the Federal Liaison Consultant, she has probably dealt with the individual and/or the entity.

- (vi) Establish and Maintain a good working relationship with all levels of government in order to maximize HART's input and influence. The Offeror believes that her years of experience and the relationships built over time with her colleagues at the various levels of government will qualify her for this duty. In order to accomplish this goal, it is necessary that people respect the HART Board Consultant and the Offeror believes she has earned it from many over the years.
- (vii) Availability to perform the above stated duties. The Offeror stands ready and able upon the Board reasonable request to meet with Board, staff and designees in order to satisfy the responsibilities as may be assigned to her.
  - b. The Offeror has the following:
- (i) Superior Experience in serving as a liaison consultant. The Offeror has no prior experience serving as a liaison consultant. However, the Offeror believes that the responses provided above establishes her unique qualifications for the position of HART Board Consultant.
- (ii) Experience in providing comprehensive reports, researching, testimonies, planning and implementing long and short-term strategies. The Offeror believes that the information provided above satisfies this requirement.
- (iii) Experience with Government initiatives, changes to legislation rulemaking, and other actions regarding transportation policies. The Offeror believes that the information provided above satisfies this requirement. The Offeror also states that while on HART, she took the initiative to appear before the Charter Commission to ask for changes in the Charter to ensure that the HART Board would have oversight authority over the operations of HART in addition to the hiring and firing of the Executive Director. Without those changes, which also addressed the qualifications of the Executive Director, the HART Board would have remained for most part a rubber stamp to the HART staff. The change which the voters of the City and County of Honolulu concurred with, enables this discussion.
  - c. Offeror's with experience in successfully managing projects of similar size as this RFP.

The Offeror does not have experience in successfully managing a project similar to the size of this RFP. Notwithstanding, the Offeror believes that this RFP is not for the management of a project in the traditional sense. The RFP seeks an individual who will act as a consultant to this Board. Offeror believes she has the experience to do so and notes that it requires an individual to do this task not a team of individuals.



## Section 3 APPROACH AND UNDERSTANDING

The purpose of this Section is to identify two primary characteristics of the Offeror. The first is an understanding of the government funding strategies with all relevant entities. The second is the demonstration of effective communication skills. The ability to convey information.

This Section has the following requirements:

### 1. Describe how the Offeror will ensure successful performance of this Contract.

As stated earlier, the Offeror has only one person and that is Colleen Hanabusa. The Offeror will ensure that she fulfills the requirement of this Contract and notes that the responses provides under Section 2 above should address the issue of expertise in this arena.

#### 2. Offeror's unique approach to implement RFP.

This requirement addresses how the Offeror will meet HART, FTA and State requirements while meeting the conditions of this RFP. Critical to meeting this condition is to known that HART, FTA and State have specific guidelines. For example, the FTA has FTA Circular C 4220.1F which address Third Party Contracting Guidelines which have been reviewed by Offeror. In addition the Federal Requirements are attached to the RFP as Appendix C. This includes conditions relating to DBE participation. Offeror discloses that it is not a qualified DBE. Notwithstanding if Offeror were to subcontract, it will comply with DBE requirements. HART has a 27 page "General Terms and Conditions for Professional Services" which Offeror will comply with its terms and conditions. As for the State of Hawai'i, Offeror is familiar with the terms of Chapter 103D, HRS and the applicable Hawai'i Administrative Rules. In addition Offeror is very knowledgeable about Act 1 of the First Special Session of 2017.

In meeting these requirements, there must first be a recognition of the laws and rules and the ability to meet the conditions set forth therein. Offeror represents that it is able and willing to meet those conditions.

## 3. A narrative of how Offeror understanding and approach to address Appendix A.

Offeror points to Section 2 where it responded in detail; however the following is a narrative summary of its approach to the requirements of Appendix A

The subparts of Appendix A are bolded in this narrative. The Membership and Ouorum Issue brings into light the conflict between the Act 1 of the First Special Session of 2017; the concept of home rule, the provisions of the Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, the legal theory of general laws and whether the acceptance of funding of Act 1 negates any defenses of home rule. This is further complicated by the fact that the HART Board did not challenge the provisions of Act 1 and in fact "welcomed" the four ex-officio non-voting members appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House. Ironically, 3 of the voting members of this Board were originally appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House. It is my contention that the legislature did not intend for its members to participate in the decision making of HART. If that was the intent, they would have been identified their representatives as ex officio voting members of the HART Board. Aside from the argument that the legislature overstepped and interfered with home rule, the Offeror believes the simplest and cheapest solution is to amend the law in the legislature. However, the present Board must be in agreement and there cannot be mixed messages sent to the legislature. Short and Long-Term funding strategies for HART. It appears as if since the inception of HART, the issue which it has been plagued with is money. That is to say, whether there is sufficient funds to finish this project. To develop the funding strategies, this provision requires the Offeror to collaborate with the HART Board and the Senior Leadership to develop short and long-terms funding strategies for the Project. The Appendix discusses the FTA funding pursuant to the FFGA; securing additional GET and TAT; collaborating with the City Administration for innovative ways to secure funding (I assume this means without raising real property taxes); and to explore New Start Programs of the FTA. In order to effectively plan the short and long-term strategies, you need someone who knows the history and why we are here. If you review the ceremonial FFGA, executed on December 19, 2012 (two days after Senator Daniel K. Inouye passed), you will find my signature as a member of Congress. As some of you may be aware, I sat as a member of HART Board from July 2015 to October 2016. From April to October 2016, I served as the Chair of the HART Board. During this time period, I testified before City Council that \$1.5 Billion was not enough money. The difficulty with Council was that then Executive Director and the prior Chair of the HART Board had said "\$1.2 Billion, not a penny more." When they testified before the Legislature, the unified voice of HART and the City said only \$910 Million was needed. Two years later, HART and the City was before the Legislature asking for GET extension for 10 years; some in the construction industry asked for GET in perpetuity. As you know, the efforts in the regular session of 2017 failed in Conference. The Legislature knew the significance of the funding shortfall and called the First Special Session of the 2017. I testified before and assisted the Legislature in the development of what became Act 1. All of the funding sources listed in 2. of the Appendix A will be necessary for the completion of this Project. Notwithstanding, there must be diligent monitoring of the FTA's New Start program. Though in the past the HART project was deemed not to qualify for any additional New Start funds, the

issue will be whether the Biden Administration's Infrastructure Plan will provide additional funds. From the time I was in Congress, it was the Democrat's objective to pass a massive infrastructure bill and a priority of Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Majority Leader Steny Hoyer. All of these facts are essential in the development of the funding strategies. Given the history, it will not be a simple task, especially with the legislature if a GET and TAT extensions are sought. Provide timely information about upcoming initiatives, changes, etc. which will impact HART and the funding and prepare the responses. I believe HART has had government relations individuals who have had this responsibility. However, I concur that the HART Board is in need of its own consultant to perform these functions. The Board may differ from the Senior Leadership of HART and among its members. Given the monthly meeting structure of HART which is an unpaid volunteer Board, timely information will permit the Board to have the necessary discussion to arrive at a unified position. To be without the ability to do this, the voice of HART will not be the Board, as it should be. The Offeror would propose that during the legislative session, it may be in the interest of the Board to form a PIG to meet and discuss these matters. This would mean at least a number less than the majority will be informed about the upcoming initiatives and changes. Research and prepare testimony for hearings at all levels of government. The Offeror has years of experience in researching legislations at all levels of government and preparing testimony. Just as critical, the Offeror has many years of experience conducting hearings and receiving testimony. When one has extensive experience in this area, one is able to prepare testimony that assist the entity holding the hearing to better comprehend the HART Board's position. The HART Board, and HART generally, is now in the position where it must regain public confidence and trust. This is where if like the Offeror one knows what kind of testimony could be persuasive, it will be better received. Support and assist HART in interactions with outreach with government at all levels, including to cooperate and support HART's Federal Liaison Consultant. The purpose of this provision is communications with the relevant parties at all levels of government to ensure that HART is viewed as transparent and open as to its activities. This is necessary to regain the public's trust and confidence in this Project. The Offeror is able to perform this task and adds that due to her years in Congress, she believes that she will be able to support and will cooperate with whomever HART selects as its Federal Liaison Consultant. The Offeror believes given the limited number who qualifies as the Federal Liaison Consultant, she has probably dealt with the individual and/or the entity. Establish and Maintain a good working relationship with all levels of government in order to maximize HART's input and influence. The Offeror believes that her years of experience and the relationships built over time with her colleagues at the various levels of government will qualify her for this duty. In order to accomplish this goal, it is necessary that people respect the HART Board Consultant and the Offeror believes she has earned it from many over the years. Availability to perform the above stated duties. The Offeror stands ready and able upon the Board reasonable request to meet with Board, staff and designees in order to satisfy the responsibilities as may be assigned to her.



#### I. INTRODUCTION

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (the "Authority" or "HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu. The Authority is responsible for the development, operation, maintenance and expansion of a fixed guideway transit system for the City and County of Honolulu.

The Authority is requesting proposals from Offerors to provide Federal Government Liaison Consultant services in Washington, D.C. The Consultant will serve as HART's liaison in Washington, D.C., with Hawaii's Congressional Delegation and appropriate Federal agencies. These services shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Assist HART with strategic planning and coordination in the development of a comprehensive federal affairs strategy for HART, including:
  - a. Assist in the development and implementation of short and long-term federal funding strategies for the Honolulu Rail Transit Project (HRTP);
  - b. Assist in securing federal funding for advancing HART's capital programs;
  - c. Support and assist in monitoring the FTA New Starts program, including establishment of relationships and interactions with executive department personnel involved in the New Starts program, including the FTA, the Office of the Secretary of Transportation, and the White House Office of Management and Budget; and
  - d. Attend meetings to represent the interests of HART, and act as a liaison between HART and the Federal government, including but not limited to members of Congress and designated staff, USDOT officials, and FTA officials.

- 3. Research and prepare testimony and written comments on pending federal legislation and regulations to be presented on behalf of the Authority at Federal Administrative and Congressional hearings.
- 4. Assist HART in outreach to the Congressional committees having jurisdiction over the FTA New Starts program, including providing updates for committee members and staff about the HRTP and HART's other activities.
- 5. Support and assist HART in interactions with the Hawaii Congressional delegation and staff.
- 6. Establish and maintain good working relationships with the Hawaii Congressional delegation and their staffs in order to maximize the Authority's input and influence in federal matters relating to public transportation.
- 7. Work with Administration and Congressional members and their staffs during annual budget preparations, to maximize budgetary authorizations.
- 8. Work collaboratively with representatives of other agencies, governments, and associations that share a common interest in public transportation and the FTA New Starts program, including the American Public Transportation Association and others. Provide regular information to these groups about the HRTP and report back to HART on the activities of groups with common interests.
- 9. Be available, upon reasonable request, to meet with HART staff and others, as specified, in order to perform the responsibilities assigned.
- 10. The selected Offeror must comply with the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995, as amended.

Regarding the consultant, we first need to determine if Denis continues his consultancy with the City, whether there will be a conflict if he is retained by HART. Lori and I discussed having Colleen do the local and Congressional pieces, with Denis doing the federal administrative piece (FTA, DOT, etc.). Please find more clarification on the funding question based on a similar contract, the Williams & Jenson contract - SC-HRT-1300100. (Denis Dwyer's firm)

Although there are no explanation on the Funding Certification, Act 1 likely played a role in how the 2018 portion was funded. The Comptroller certification requirement created a color of money challenge and the State took the position that federally non-permissible items are also ineligible for reimbursement/certification under Act 1. The original contract and the first amendment were coded to the capital fund with a unit code that identified it as not federally eligible. (690/7791)By the second amendment which applied to FY2018, after Act 1 had been passed, the funding codes moved it to fund 290. The invoices in fund 290 are not be submitted to the State for reimbursement/certification due to fund 290 being considered the operating/administrative fund and are strictly prohibited under Act 1.

The following screenshot is the Funding certification from the Williams & Jenson contract referenced above. The reclassification of funding and the December 2017 date supports that conclusion as well.

Please find more clarification on the funding question based on a similar contract, the Williams & Jenson contract — SC-HRT-1300100. (Denis Dwyer's firm)

Although there are no explanation on the Funding Certification, Act 1 likely played a role in how the 2018 portion was funded. The Comptroller certification requirement created a color of money challenge and the State took the position that federally non-permissible items are also ineligible for reimbursement/certification under Act 1. The original contract and the first amendment were coded to the capital fund with a unit code that identified it as not federally eligible. (690/7791)By the second amendment which applied to FYZ018, after Act 1 had been passed, the funding codes moved it to fund 290. The invoices in fund 290 are not be submitted to the State for reimbursement/certification due to fund 290 being considered the operating/administrative fund and are strictly prohibited under Act 1.

I don't know for sure and I am open to whatever is the best approach.

At one point, both City and HART had a contract.

- At some point, City Procurement revised Denis' City contract to remove any reference to rail since HART had a contract. I don't believe this was appropriate, as both City and HART had reason to utilize him on rail related topics.
- HART canceled contract, which left City without any clause for rail-related discussions. I was told that Andy told MD that he was going to engage Mufi as the HART lobbyist. This never happened, but the contract cancelation caused lots of communication/billing problems for the City and for Denis. By the way, even after HART canceled his contract, HART and the HART Board continued to call on him for help.
- City just completed an extension with Denis at the end of last year but I think it may only be a year.
- DTS oversight of the City's contract has been very poor. He did not have ANY contract from June through
  December because, in my view, DTS dropped the ball. Despite no contract, he continued to provide assistance
  to both City and HART during that time.
- We can check to see if we could leverage the DTS contract, but given the history and the lack of focus on his contract by both DTS and HART, I believe the best approach is for us to have our own contract. If City and HART procurement feel otherwise, that's ok with me but we need to get this resolved as Denis is currently "working for free" which is not fair to him and he is a key link between us and FTA and Congressional delegation.

With the funding issues that we are facing, the 2 RFPs that we are considering are both very important.

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

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#### 1.0 OVERVIEW

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation ("HART") is a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu ("City"), created pursuant to an amendment to the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu 1973 ("RCH") to develop, operate, and maintain the Honolulu Rail Transit Project ("HRTP").

This Request for Proposals ("RFP") is issued by HART to identify Persons qualified to submit competitive scaled proposals for the HART Board Consultant Services Contract. "Persons" means any individual, firm, corporation, company, LLC, LLP, joint venture, voluntary association, partnership, trust, public or private organization, other legal entity, or combination thereof.

#### 1.1 HRTP Description

The HRTP will provide high-capacity rapid transit service in the travel corridor between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. This corridor includes the majority of housing and employment on O'ahu. The north-south width of the corridor is a maximum of four (4) miles, with the corridor constrained by the Ko'olau and Wai'anae Mountain Ranges to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south.

The HRTP is identified in the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") as the design, construction and operation of a twenty (20) mile grade-separated fixed guideway transit system between East Kapolei and Ala Moana Center. All parts of the guideway will be elevated, except near Leeward Community College where it will be at-grade. The system will incorporate steel wheel-on-steel rail technology. The HRTP includes twenty-one (21) stations, one (1) Rail Operations Center ("ROC"), and eighty (80) light metro vehicles and associated core systems.

#### 1.2 HART Board Consultant Services Description

The selected Offeror (or "Contractor") will provide HART Board Consultant services in Honolulu, Hawaii. The selected Offeror will serve as HART's liaison to the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature and Congressional Committees and appropriate federal and state agencies. The selected Offeror will provide coordination, counsel, and information to HART and will advise and represent HART with respect to state transportation policy, legislation, regulation, and state funding opportunities. The scope of services for this Contract is attached hereto in the Special Provisions, Appendix A Scope of Services.

3.0 The term of any Contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation will be for five (5) months, commencing from the issuance of a written Notice to Proceed ("NTP"), with options to extend the contract up to six (6) years. The total Contract term shall not to exceed a total of six (6) years with options.

The Contract will be a multi-term contract subject to the availability of funds in accordance with HAR §3-122-149.

#### 4.1 Addenda

HART will issue responses to inquiries, additional background information, and any other corrections or modifications it deems necessary, via written addenda, on or before the Final Addendum Date. Addenda will be incorporated as part of the RFP. Oral interpretations, clarifications, changes, or substitutions will be without legal effect. Only interpretations, clarifications, changes, or approved substitutions provided by a formal written addendum to the solicitation shall be binding.

#### 4.2 Modification or Withdrawal of Proposals

Proposals submitted pursuant to this RFP may be modified or withdrawn prior to the Proposal Due Date in accordance with HAR §3-122-16.07. Any proposal received by HART after the exact time of the Proposal Due Date will not be accepted, will not be considered for award, and shall be returned to the Offeror unopened at the time of late submission or as soon as practicable.

#### 4.3 Receipt and Registration of Proposals

In accordance with HAR §3-122-51, proposals and any modifications thereto will be time-stamped upon receipt and held in a secure place by HART until the Proposal Due Date. Proposals and modifications will not be opened publicly, but will be opened in the presence of two or more HART officials. Prior to contract awards, proposals and modifications will be shown only to members of the evaluation committee and HART personnel or their designees having legitimate interest in them.

#### 4.4 Confidential Solicitation Process

HART will maintain a confidential process for the duration of this solicitation. To the extent permitted by law, all records related to this procurement, including, but not limited to, proposals, evaluations, priority list procedures, price proposals, evaluation and selection process, and records during the evaluation and selection process, will remain confidential until the contract awards have been posted by HART in accordance with HAR §3-122-9.01 and §3-122-63.

#### 4.5 Proposals Property of HART

#### 4.6 Discussions with Offerors

If discussions with Offerors are required to make a selection, the discussions will be conducted in accordance with HAR §3-122-53. If more than three acceptable or potentially acceptable proposals have been submitted, the priority list will be limited through evaluation and ranking to the Offerors who submitted the highest-ranked proposals.

#### 4.9 Basis of Award

#### 4.10 Verification of Responsibility of Offeror

The successful Offerer shall, within three (3) business days of notification of contract award, furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of HRS §103D-310(c):

- HRS Chapter 383, unemployment insurance;
- HRS Chapter 386, workers' compensation;

#### 4.11 Suspension and Debarment

In accordance with 2 CFR §1200, the Offeror is required to verify that none of its principals, as defined in 2 CFR §180.995, or affiliates, as defined in 2 CFR §180.905, are excluded or disqualified as defined in 2 CFR §§180.935 and 180.945. The Offeror is required to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, and must include the requirements to comply with 2 CFR §1200, Subpart C, in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into. #### 4.12 Execution of Contract

Subsequent to contract award(s), HART will present the contract to the successful Offeror(s) for execution. The successful Offeror(s) shall provide evidence of the required insurance coverages when returning the signed contract to HART.

#### 4.13 Cancellation of Solicitation

This solicitation may be cancelled at any time pursuant to the Chief Procurement Officer's determination that cancellation is in the public interest or reasons based on, but not limited to, those set forth in HAR §3-122-96.

#### 4.14 Public Inspection; Segregation of Confidential Information

Public inspection will be in accordance with HAR §3-122-58. The existing contract file, except those portions the Offeror has designated in writing to be confidential as trade secrets or other proprietary data, subject to HAR §3-122-58(b), will be available for public inspection upon posting of the award pursuant to HRS §103D-701.

If a person requests to inspect the portions of an Offeror's proposal designated as confidential pursuant to HAR §3-122-46(9), the inspection will be subject to written determination by Corporation Counsel for confidentiality in accordance with HRS Chapter 92F. If Corporation Counsel determines in writing that the material designated as confidential is subject to disclosure, the material will be open to public inspection unless the Offeror appeals pursuant to HRS §92F-42(1).

#### 4.15 Debriefing

The purpose of a debriefing is to inform a non-selected Offeror of the basis for the source selection decision and contract award. To the extent practicable, debriefing shall be held by HART within seven (7) working days of the request for the debriefing, provided the Chief Procurement Officer may determine whether to conduct individual or combined debriefings.

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#### 4.16 Protests

Protests shall be made in accordance with HRS §103D-701 and HAR §3-126-4. A protest by a non-selected Offeror shall be filed in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the notice of award or within five (5) working days after the date upon which the debriefing was conducted.

Offerors are hereby notified of their right to appeal to the FTA pursuant to FTA C 4220.1F Chapter VII, Section 1.b.

#### 4.17 Commencement of Services

Services shall not commence until: (a) the contract has been executed; (b) the Chief Procurement Officer has certified the availability of funds; and (c) a Notice to Proceed has been issued.

#### 4.18 Conflict of Interest and Non-Disclosure Requirements

The Offeror shall disclose and provide what may be or may be perceived as a potential conflict of interest, the nature of the potential conflict, and whether it can be minimized.

A Contractor who is paid for developing or preparing specifications or work statements in the development of the specifications is precluded from submitting an offer or receiving a contract for that particular solicitation in accordance with HRS §103D-405(d) and HAR §3-122-13(e).

Offerors are required to submit Exhibit 11, Certification Regarding Conflict of Interest.

Offerors are required to disclose if they are currently representing any departments, agencies, or other entities of the State of Hawaii, City and County of Honolulu, and/or any other city or county of Hawaii. Offerors are required to state whether that representation is an actual and/or potential conflict and whether the named party or HART would have to waive the conflict in order for the Offeror to perform this Contract. For actual or potential conflicts the Offeror shall also provide a detailed plan describing how the Offeror, alone, will mitigate the conflict. HART reserves the right to:

- 1. Reject any proposal that presents an actual or potential conflict of interest;

#### 5.5 Format and Quantities

See Exhibit 2 for Proposal format. Proposal should not exceed 50 pages. Proposals are to be written in English, minimum 12-point font, and printed on 8-1/2" x 11" paper; any larger sheets should be folded to that size. Pages are to be consecutively numbered. Exhibits and firm brochures do not count toward the 50-page limit.

Offerors submitting an electronic proposal shall submit (1) an unredacted electronic copy, (2) a redacted electronic copy, and (3) the price proposal in a separate file. 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#### 6.4 Approach and Understanding Relative to Scope of Services (Section 3) (30 Points)

To identify those Offerors with an understanding of government funding strategies in relation to Public Transportation and demonstrated experience in working with Federal, State, City, County and other government entities, particularly; U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Office of the Secretary of Transportation, White House Office of Management and Budget, City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, and Hawaii's Congressional Delegation.
  - ii. To identify Offerors with demonstrated effective communication skills, Offerors who can convey information that impacts the ability to shape and deliver a response timely and accurately to information on changes, guidance, rulemaking, or other anticipated local government actions that could have an impact on HART.
- b) Requirements and information to be provided in Section 3 of the Proposal:

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#### HART BOARD CONSULTANT APPENDIX A - SCOPE OF SERVICES

The selected Offeror shall provide professional services primarily involving capital funding opportunities, including related Government liaison activities. This is expected to involve frequent consultations with the Board of Directors the Senior Leadership of the Honolulu Authority for Rapid transportation (HART) and interactions on behalf of HART with legislative and executive branches of the City and County of Honolulu, the State of Hawaii, and the Federal government. To ensure that all aspects of HART's anticipated needs are covered by these professional services, the scope of the Contract is broad. These duties shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Assist in the development and implementation of the HART Board of Directors membership and quorum strategies.
- In collaboration with the HART Board and Senior Leadership, assist in the development and implementation of short and long-term funding strategies for the Honolulu Rail Transit Project (the Project);
  - a. Assist in securing the resumption of federal funding for advancing the Project's capital programs:
  - b. Assist in the development and execution of a plan to secure additional State funding, including General Excise Taxes (GET) and/or Transient Accommodation Taxes (TAT);
  - c. Collaborate with City Administration on innovative approaches to securing additional City funding; and,
  - d. Support and assist in monitoring the Federal Transit Authority's New Starts program.
- 3. Provide timely information about upcoming initiatives, changes to legislation, guidance, rulemaking, or other anticipated city and county, state, and federal actions that could have an impact on HART, particularly those related to potential funding opportunities, and support efforts to shape and deliver the Authority's response.
- 4. Research and prepare testimony and written comments on pending city and county, state, and federal legislation and regulations to be presented on behalf of HART at city and county, state, and federal administrative and legislative hearings.
- 5. Support and assist HART in interactions with and outreach to the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature, and Congressional committees having jurisdiction over the Project and FTA New Starts program, including providing updates for committee members and staff about HART's activities. Federal outreach and communications will be in support and cooperation with HART's Federal Liaison Consultant.
- 6. Establish and maintain good working relationships with the Honolulu City Council, Hawaii State Legislature, and Hawaii Congressional delegation and their staffs in order to maximize the Authority's input and influence in matters relating to public transportation.

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7. Be available, upon reasonable request, to meet with the HART Board of Directors, staff and others, as specified, in order to perform the responsibilities assigned.

The selected Offeror must comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to lobbyist registration requirements. The selected Offeror must comply with the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995, as amended.
