



[Also "to/too," "hear/here" and pretty much every other homonym he banged out on his keyboard during his Facebook ranting/Twitter self-emasculation.)







He's spectacularly bad at it, and he's just making things worse for Ostrow. For example, here is the voicemail he left with Tannebaum:


