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Narrative

On Wednesday, July 15, 2015, I was assigned to work A-Team, Housing Unit 6 at Santa Rita Jail (SRJ).

About 1058 hours, I returned to the back hall of Housing Unit 6 after completing a contact visit for an inmate. I met with Deputy Carriedo near the east dining slider and he told me inmate Mario Martinez was having an asthma attack. Martinez was an inmate housed in C-pod and who was at that moment seated in the east dining area. I told Deputy Carriedo to instruct the inmate to move to the quasi-yard, which was located about twenty yards from the location where Martinez was seated. Martinez was relocated to the quasi-yard in order to help him breathe better, with access to fresh air, while he waited for medical staff to arrive. Deputy Carriedo instructed Sheriff's Technician Padilla to contact Corizon Medical Services for Martinez. Martinez walked out to the quasi-yard. As Martinez walked to the quasi-yard, I saw he was carrying his inhaler. Martinez appeared to be breathing in a very labored manner and was making grunting and groaning sounds. Sheriff Technician Padilla was on the phone with Corizon medical personnel as Martinez was being walked to the quasi-yard.

About 1101 hours, Corizon Nurses M. Inocencio (RN) and C. Padmore (LVN) arrived in Housing Unit 6. About this time, Martinez, who had been standing in the quasi-yard, went on his hands and knees and continued making the same sounds. RN Inocencio asked Martinez to walk into the nurse's office, located about ten yards from the quasi-yard, so she could give him a breathing treatment. Martinez did not respond with words or get up, but remained on his hands and knees, making the same sounds. RN Inocencio went to the nurse's office to set up the breathing treatment machine. LVN Padmore continued to try and get Martinez to go to the nurse's office. When LVN Padmore was unsuccessful with getting Martinez to go into the nurse's office, I helped LVN Padmore assist Martinez to where the breathing machine was set up outside of the nurse's office. LVN Padmore took one of Martinez's arms and I took the other. We carried Martinez to the hallway outside of the nurse's office. Martinez was placed in a seated position on the floor with his back against the south wall of the hallway next to the entrance to the nurse's office. A short time later, Martinez was administered oxygen by the nurses from an oxygen tank located in the nurse's office.

About 1110 hours, RN Inocencio was unable to detect any improvement to Martinez's condition after he was given the oxygen, so she requested I call for a Code 3 medical response. I immediately requested Code 3 medical via my hand held radio; while RN Inocencio and LVN Padmore continued to administer emergency medical measures to Martinez.

About 1118 hours, Corizon Nurses R. Mand (LVN), G. Apilado (LVN) and S. Hopkins (RN) arrived and assisted with the emergency medical measures. At the same time, Alameda County Fire Department (ACFD) Engine 17 and Truck 17 arrived at SRJ. Firefighters F. Wynn, C. Thompson and K. Burke were on Engine 17 and Firefighters D. Licon, S. Krauss and A. Aslanian were on Truck 17

About 1120 hours, ACFD personnel arrived in Housing Unit 6 and took over emergency medical measures



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from Corizon medical staff.

About 1125 hours, Sergeants S. Lenthe, B. Barker and Lieutenant R. Lacer arrived on scene.

About 1126 hours, Paramedic Plus #5102 with Adam Ehie and John Pita arrived on scene.

About 1127 hours, Paramedics Plus supervisor, Serena Johnson arrived on scene.

Between the hours of 1110 and 1144 hours, emergency medical measures were provided to Martinez from Corizon medical personnel, Alameda County Fire Department personnel, and Paramedics Plus personnel.

About 1144 hours, Pita declared Martinez deceased. The EKG strip was provided to me as evidence.

About 1145 hours, Deputies Maria and Black searched for any involved parties or witnesses to Martinez's situation in C-pod. Deputy Black was not able to locate any involved parties or witnesses to this incident. Deputy Maria took written statements from inmates John Henry Michael Ambrose and Anthony Sims All three inmates stated they witnessed Martinez gasping for air in the C-pod and using his inhaler when he was sitting in the dining area after Deputy Carriedo had taken him out of C-pod. All three inmates said they did not see Martinez again after they watched him walk to the back hallway. See attached statements by Deputy Maria.

Deputy Wilkie took a written statement from Martinez's cellmate, Jose Delacruz who was placed into the west isolation cell in order to secure the crime scene in cell C-8. Cell C-8 was the cell he and Martinez shared. Delacruz stated he could tell Martinez was struggling to breathe and wanted to get help from staff. Delacruz said Martinez did not want him to call for help initially, but eventually was convinced by Delacruz to let Delacruz get help. Delacruz notified the housing control technician, via the intercom, that Martinez needed medical attention. When Deputy Carriedo came to C-pod and asked Martinez to step out of the dorm, Delacruz assisted Martinez to a dining table. Delacruz did not see Martinez after Martinez walked to the quasi-yard. See attached statement from Delacruz taken by Deputy Wilkie.

No other involved parties or witnesses could be located.

About 1200 hours, Eden Township Substation (ETS) was notified of the incident.

About 1206 hours, Alameda County Coroner's Bureau was notified of the incident

About 1310 hours, Sergeant Gemmell and Deputy Hawks, ETS investigators, arrived on scene to take pictures and conduct a search of Martinez's cell. During the search, an oval shaped pill was located in a paper cup on

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the desk. Pictures were taken of the pill by Sergeant Gemmell. Refer to follow-up investigation report by ETS investigators.

The oval shaped pill was later collected as evidence and identified as a 45mg Remeron by Corizon medical staff. Corizon confirmed neither Martinez nor Delacruz was prescribed this medication. Another inhaler was also located in a property bin containing indicia with Martinez's name on it. The inhaler was collected as evidence.

About 1325 hours, Deputies Beezley and Henshaw arrived from the Coroner's Bureau to collect Martinez's body. During their movement of Martinez's body, I saw no signs of external injury or violence to Martinez's body.

About 1355 hours, Deputies Beezley and Henshaw departed for the Coroner's Bureau with Martinez's body. I received a copy of Coroner's receipt #36166 as evidence.

I took 43 pictures of Martinez, Housing Unit 6 cell C-8 and the Housing Unit 6 Quasi-Yard. I also took 5 pictures of Delacruz to document his appearance and rule out a possible altercation between him and Martinez. I placed a CD ROM containing the 48 pictures into the Locked Photo Evidence Box located in the medium muster room at Santa Rita Jail.

I placed the following items into evidence locker #15 at Santa Rita Jail: EKG strip showing no signs of life; Coroner's receipt #36166; a copy of a court order to provide medical care to Martinez; a copy of Corizon's medical history for dental treatment; copy of all pod logs for Housing Unit 6; one inhaler; and one 45mg. Remeron pill. Additional evidence was collected by the Coroner's Bureau investigators.

Four additional statements were taken from Corizon Medical Services' personnel who were associated with this incident. These statements were taken from the following individuals:

Deputy Berumen took statements from C. Padmore, who was the first LVN on scene; and M. Inocencio, who was the first RN on scene. See statements by Deputy Berumen.

Deputy Becker took statements from Dr. Timothy Han, who was the dentist who treated Martinez; and Dental Assistant Brenda Morris, who assisted Dr. Han in the treatment of Martinez.

Refer to follow-up investigation.

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Supplement Narrative

On Wednesday, July 15, 2015, while assigned to the Santa Rita Jail Clinic, the following incident occurred.

About 1030 hours, inmate Mario Martinez had returned to Housing Unit 6 after his scheduled dental appointment in the Clinic. Later that morning, inmate Martinez died due to unknown reasons.

In an attempt to ascertain the health of inmate Martinez leading up to the time of his death, I spoke with the Dentist, Dr. T. Han, who provided me with the following statement.

Dr. Han stated inmate Martinez complained of a toothache. He ordered two x-rays of which he discussed the results with Martinez. He then scheduled Martinez for a later date to return the clinic to have the tooth extracted. Dr. Han reviewed Martinez's health questionnaire and saw that he had asthma but no allergies to any medication. Dr. Han prescribed 500mg of Amoxicillin and 400 mg of Ibuprofen. Dr. Han stated he did not notice Martinez having any difficulty breathing during his exam. (See attached statement)

I spoke with the Dental Assistant B. Morris, who provided me with the following statement.

Ms. Morris said when Martinez entered the office, she asked if he was O.K. or if he had a cold because his nose was running. Martinez said he had a nasal problem and was supposed to have surgery. Morris took two x-rays per Dr. Han's orders. Morris said Martinez filled out a heath questionnaire which she and Dr. Han reviewed. Morris said she did not take Martinez's blood pressure because he had no history of high blood pressure. Morris then gave Martinez one 500 mg capsule of Amoxicillin and two 400 mg tablets of Ibuprofen per Dr. Han's orders. Morris said she placed the medication in Martinez's mouth personally and poured water into his mouth and watched him swallow the medication. Morris said she does this for all inmates because they are waist chained per Sheriff's Office procedures. Martinez was then given a future appointment to have his tooth extracted. Morris said that Martinez seemed fine during the appointment and was talking and seemed happy because he was being treated by the doctor. (See attached statement)

Prior to his appointment, I arrive to Housing Unit 6 to pick-up inmate Martinez; I noticed he appeared somewhat out of breathe. Inmate Martinez said he had asthma and he was ok to go to his appointment.

When I escorted inmate Martinez back to his housing unit, he appeared to be breathing fine and talked to the other inmates the entire time.

Supplement Narrative

On July 15, 2015, about 1500 hours, while working at Santa Rita Jail clinic, I was detailed by Lieutenant R. LACER to obtain statements from two nurses who responded to a medical emergency earlier in the day in Housing Unit 6 (H/U 6).

I contacted Registered Nurse (RN), Magdelana INOCENCIO, in the Corizon Pill Room, who told me the following in summary:

On July 15, 2015, about 1100 hours, RN INOCENCIO was the assigned nurse for H/U 8. RN INOCENCIO received a phone call from her supervisor, Stephanie HOPKINS, telling her to respond to H/U 6 to see an inmate, later identified as Mario MARTINEZ who was having asthma problems. The assigned nurse for H/U 6 was out on a lunch break. RN INOCENCIO responded to H/U 6 from H/U 8. About ten seconds after RN INOCENCIO arrived, Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) Chris PADMORE also arrived. RN INOCENCIO saw MARTINEZ in the Quasi-Yard on his hands and knees trying to keep himself from collapsing to the ground. RN INOCENCIO told MARTINEZ to follow her into the sick call room to provide a nebulizer treatment. MARTINEZ did not respond and was unable to follow her instructions. RN INOCENCIO went into the sick call room and prepared the treatment; while MARTINEZ was assisted by deputies and LVN PADMORE toward the sick call room. RN INOCENCIO heard a deputy call her into the hallway near the sick call room. RN INOCENCIO walked into the hallway and saw MARTINEZ sitting on the floor and leaning against the wall. RN INOCENCIO noticed MARTINEZ had a "blue-ish" color to his fingernails. RN INOCENCIO and LVN PADMORE went to grab the oxygen tank from the sick call room but noticed the crank to turn it on was missing. PADMORE immediately ran to H/U 7 to grab their oxygen tank, RN INOCENCIO said she advised Deputy S. CHRISTIANSEN to call for code 3 medical emergency assistance. About two to three minutes later, LVN PADMORE returned with an oxygen tank and applied an oxygen mask on MARTINEZ. About one minute later, RN INOCENCIO noticed MARTINEZ was not breathing and initiated Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). MARTINEZ was placed flat on his back on the floor. RN INOCENCIO removed the oxygen mask and used an "ambu-bag" to provide breathes for MARTINEZ. These actions were taken as the nurses continued giving MARTINEZ CPR. RN INOCENCIO said no automated external defibrillator (AED) was used. Several other nurses arrived and assisted with CPR on MARTINEZ. Firefighters and paramedics arrived, took over, and continued CPR. RN INOCENCIO stayed in H/U 6 and provided information as necessary. Refer to signed CR-6 statement form from RN INOCENCIO.

On Friday, July 17, 2015, about 0745 hours, I contacted LVN PADMORE in the Corizon administration room and he told me the following in summary:



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On Wednesday, July 15, 2015, about 1100 hours, LVN PADMORE was in the Corizon pill room finishing his lunch break. LVN PADMORE overheard HOPKINS tell another nurse there was a "man down" in H/U 6. LVN PADMORE volunteered to run the emergency response bag to H/U 6. LVN PADMORE arrived to H/U 6 and saw RN INOCENCIO was already on scene. LVN PADMORE met with RN INOCENCIO in the Quasi-yard and saw MARTINEZ on his hands and knees. MARTINEZ was moaning and grunting as if he was in pain. LVN PADMORE told MARTINEZ to follow him into the sick call room where they would provide a nebulizer treatment. MARTINEZ did not verbally respond. RN INOCENCIO left to the sick call room to prepare the treatment while LVN PADMORE and Deputy CHRISTIANSEN assisted MARTINEZ toward the sick call room. MARTINEZ was placed seated on the floor and leaning against the wall in the hallway. The nebulizer treatment was placed on a chair as far out the sick call room as possible due to the availability of electric outlets. At that point, RN INOCENCIO instructed LVN PADMORE to run to H/U 7 and grab an oxygen tank. LVN PADMORE ran to H/U 7, grabbed an oxygen tank from their sick call room, and returned to H/U 6 about one to two minutes later. As LVN PADMORE returned, RN Raj MAND also arrived to H/U6. An oxygen mask was placed on MARTINEZ. About a minute later, RN INOCENCIO noticed MARTINEZ was not breathing. RN INOCENCIO initiated CPR. LVN PADMORE and RN MAND started chest compressions and provided breathes with an "ambu-bag." Several other nurses responded to H/U 6 and assisted with CPR. LVN PADMORE said by the time they were able to use an AED, firefighters and paramedics arrived and took over resuscitation efforts. LVN PADMORE stayed in H/U 6 until he was no longer needed. Refer to signed CR-6 statement form from LVN PADMORE.

Supplement Narrative

On Wednesday, July 15, 2015 at 1058 hours, while working as a deputy sheriff in Housing Unit 6 (HU6), the following incident occurred:

I was in the east deputy office when Technician V. Padilla #229 called me. Padilla informed me an inmate in C-pod had pushed the intercom button and informed him one of the inmates in the pod was having an asthma attack. I immediately went to C-pod and saw an inmate, later identified as Mario MARTINEZ standing by the stairs. The stairs are located toward the back of C-pod. MARTINEZ was leaning forward on his outstretched arms onto the top of a table. I called for MARTINEZ to come out of the pod. MARTINEZ walked out of the pod and sat down at one of the tables. I asked MARTINEZ what was wrong. MARTINEZ told me he couldn't breathe. MARTINEZ seemed like he was trying to clear his throat and kept forcibly exhaling. MARTINEZ had an asthma inhaler in his hand; I asked MARTINEZ if he had already used his inhaler. MARTINEZ did not respond, but he did put his inhaler to his mouth and use it. I went to the back hall and had Technician Padilla call for a nurse. I asked MARTINEZ if he wanted to go out to the quasi-yard to get fresh air. MARTINEZ stood up and walked outside in the quasi-yard. I kept sight of MARTINEZ through the quasi-yard windows, which run the entire length of the wall and provide a complete view of the quasi-yard.

At 1101 hours, Corizon Nurses M. INOCENCIO and C. PADMORE arrived at HU6 and went out to the quasi-yard. MARTINEZ was pacing back and forth. Deputy S. CHRISTIANSEN, who was also working in HU6, stayed with them. I walked away to do a security check on the civilian staff member in the West Multi-purpose room.

I returned about six minutes later and saw MARTINEZ through the glass windows of the quasi-yard. MARTINEZ was on his knees with his head down on the ground facing toward the quasi-yard windows. MARTINEZ appeared to be having trouble breathing. Deputy S. CHRISTIANSEN and Corizon Nurse PADMORE were outside in the quasi-yard with MARTINEZ. CHRISTIANSEN and PADMORE were attempting to get MARTINEZ to respond to instructions to go to the nurse's office. Nurse INOCENCIO was already in the nurse's office getting the oxygen tank that is located in the nurse's office. INOCENCIO called out and asked for MARTINEZ to be brought to the nurse's office. I held the quasi-yard door open as CHRISTIANSEN and PADMORE helped MARTINEZ to the area outside of the nurse's office. MARTINEZ was helped into a sitting position on the floor next to the nurse's office door. He was leaning up against the wall. I could see MARTINEZ was still breathing, although his breaths seemed labored. INOCENCIO placed an oxygen mask onto MARTINEZ and told Deputy CHRISTIANSEN to call for a code 3 ambulance. CHRISTIANSEN immediately called for an ambulance over the radio. The call was placed at 1110 hours.



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I went outside of the HU6 to get the XT-4 key from CP-7 so I could open the fire gates for the responding paramedics. Before I arrived at CP-7, Deputy D. MADSEN #1271 was already running from CP-7 with the key. MADSEN opened the gates. I waited outside of HU6 in order to direct the responding medical personnel to the correct housing unit. At 1118 hours, fire truck 17, with LICON, KRAUSS and ASLANIAN; and engine 17, with BURK, THOMPSON AND WYNN arrived. The firefighters entered HU6 at 1120 hours.

At 1125 hours, Sergeants S. LENTHE, B. BARKER and Lieutenant R. LACER entered HU6.

At 1126 hours, Para Medics Plus #5102 with Adam EHLE and John PITA arrived at HU6.

At 1127 hours, Para Medics Plus supervisor, Serena JOHNSON arrived at HU6.

Between 1110 hours and 1144 hours, the Corizon Medical Services personnel, Alameda County Fire Department personnel, and Para Medics Plus personnel provided emergency medical care to Martinez.

At 1144 hours, Pita declared MARTINEZ deceased.

SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE

NOTIFICATION

On Wednesday, 071515, around 1155 hours, I spoke with Lieutenant R. Lacer, Santa Rita Jail (SRJ) Watch Commander, who advised me inmate Mario Martinez recently died while in custody at that facility in Housing Unit 6.

Lieutenant Lacer provided me with the following timeline:

Around 1045 hours that morning, Martinez was in the Housing Unit 6 C Pod with the other inmates, out of their cells, for recreation (pod time). Martinez had recently returned to the housing unit following a dental appointment.

Around 1058 hours, Deputy Carriedo responded to C Pod, at the request of the housing unit Sheriff's Technician, to contact an inmate suffering from an asthma attack. Deputy Carriedo located inside the pod, and Martinez complained of having difficulty breathing. Deputy Carriedo escorted Martinez to the quasi yard to get some fresh air. Martinez had an issued inhaler on his person at this time. Deputy Carriedo later told me he noticed Martinez being able to breathe in but was making shallow coughs and was grunting, seemingly having difficulty clearing his throat.

Around 1101 hours, Corizon nursing personnel were summoned to the housing unit and, shortly thereafter, was a request for emergency medical personnel (code 3).

Around 1144 hours, Martinez was pronounced deceased by Paramedics Plus personnel.

Detective Hawks and I responded to 5325 Broder Boulevard, Dublin, to assist with the investigation.

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION

On Wednesday, 071515, around 1250 hours, Detective Hawks and I arrived at Housing Unit 6, where we were briefed on this event by Deputy Carriedo and Deputy Christiansen.

Outside of the nurse's office on the east side of the housing unit, I observed a blue blanket covering the body of Martinez, between two plastic chairs. Deputy Christiansen removed the blanket and I observed Martinez's body, lying on his back, on a flexible stretcher, wearing only brown boxer shorts and gray socks. Martinez' jail-issued identification armband was affixed to his right wrist. Martinez' head was facing northeast and his feet were facing southwest, parallel to the east wall along the east entryway wall of the housing unit.

I observed an adhesive backed monitor patch attached to Martinez' front right shoulder area and another adhesive backed monitor patch attached to the left upper chest area, to the left of his nipple. Smaller adhesive backed patch monitors were attached to the front of either shoulder and to Martinez' lower right abdomen, to

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the right of his bellybutton. An IV line was inserted into the inside of the right elbow, just below the fold of the arm, attached to a bag containing an unknown fluid. An oropharyngeal airway (OPA) device was inserted in Martinez` mouth.

I observed no signs of visible injury or suspicious trauma to Martinez` body. A circular bruise was present in the center of Martinez` chest, midline between his nipples. That marking was from the chest compression device (likely an external cardiac compressor), utilized by the fire department personnel, when they were attempting to resuscitate Martinez.

I inspected Martinez' clothing and found nothing noteworthy. His 3XL yellow pants were to the south of his body and appeared clean. His 4XL yellow shirt and brown undershirt were in the quasi yard and both appeared clean. There was a faded brown vertical stain towards the center of the shirt, near the lettering, however it appeared dry and unrelated to this event. Adjacent to the pants were Martinez' jail issued sandals and an inhaler (Proventil). Inside the pocket of Martinez' shirt was a brown brush, a folded piece of ripped lined yellow paper (likely used to transport coffee or other powdered substance) and a small torn piece of white paper with the handwritten numbers 510-703-9025.

I inspected Martinez' cell (HU 6, C Pod, Cell 8) and nothing appeared out of the ordinary. Martinez occupied the top bunk, which had a folded mattress, a plastic tub with books and letters and miscellaneous personal items. A white pill was found on the desk, inside a Styrofoam cup, later determined by Corizon medical staff to be 45mg Remeron.

Around 1325 hours, ACSO Coroner's Bureau investigators Deputy S. Beezley and Deputy J. Henshaw arrived to collect Martinez' remains. In doing so, they turned Martinez' body over onto his side and I was able to inspect his back. I found nothing suspicious or signs of trauma to his backside. The coroner's receipt was 2015-02179.

AUTOPSY

Case Status: FURTHER

On Thursday, 071615, around 0830 hours, I attended the autopsy of Martinez at the Alameda County Coroner's Bureau, located at 2901 Peralta Oaks Court in Oakland. The examination was conducted by Forensic Pathologist J. Iocco. Prior to the autopsy, I advised Dr. Iocco of the information gathered during the preliminary investigation.

Martinez' body was located on an examination table. Martinez was supine on the table and nearly nude (he wore the same clothing previously described). Two identification tags were affixed to the toe on his right foot identifying his body and the Coroner's Bureau report number. Martinez' listed height was 69 inches and his listed weight was 207 pounds. Brown paper bags covered each hand and were held in place by plastic zip style ties.

Doctor Iocco began the examination around 0855 hours. After removing the identified medical intervention devices, Doctor Iocco examined the body for the presence of any identifiable injuries and noted the following:

Martinez` lungs appeared over-inflated, pale in color, indicative of air entering and not being able to exhale. Upon further inspection, Dr. locco observed mucus coating the bronchi and showed me numerous bronchi that were blocked by a thick, paste-like substance. Dr. locco attributed these mucus plugs to an acute episodic small airway obstruction.

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Refer to the forthcoming Autopsy Protocol for further information.

CONCLUSION:

During this investigation, I took photographs of Martinez at SRJ, of his cell, and of his body throughout various stages of the autopsy. The digital photographs were transferred to a CD-R and later placed into evidence.

The cause and manner of Martinez' death will be forthcoming in the Autopsy Protocol. At this time, this investigation is closed as there is nothing to substantiate any criminal conduct regarding Martinez' death.

On July 15, 2015, about 1140 hours, while working as a Visiting Deputy at Santa Rita Jail (SRJ) the following occurred:

While in Housing Unit 6 (H/U6), I assisted with a medical emergency and was detailed by Lieutenant R. Lacer to obtain statements from inmates in C-Pod, who may have witnessed the medical emergency.

I entered C-Pod and contacted Anthony Sims and Michael Ambrose who occupied cell 1. Sims told me, during pod time, he saw Mario Martinez gasping for air by Cell 8 and walked toward the pod door. Sims told me Deputy M. Carriedo opened C-Pod door and let Martinez sit down at the dining table. Sims saw Martinez use an inhaler and then saw Martinez walk to the back hallway of H/U6. Refer to Sims' written statement for further information.

I interview Ambrose who told me he saw Martinez during pod time. Martinez was gasping for air and Martinez's face was red in color, as if he was having trouble breathing. Ambrose said Martinez's cell mate, Delacruz, assisted Martinez to the pod door to notify Deputy Carriedo. Deputy Carriedo opened the pod-door and had Martinez sit down at one of the tables. Ambrose saw Martinez use an inhaler before walking to the back hallway and out of sight. Refer to Ambrose's written statement for further information.

John Henry from C- Pod, cell 9, wanted to speak with me about Martinez's medical emergency. Henry told me he was playing Dominos at pod time and saw Martinez gasping for air. Delacruz, Martinez's cell mate, was assisting Martinez to the pod door to notify the technician. Shortly after seeing Delacruz helping Martinez to the door, Deputy Carriedo responded to the C-pod door. Henry saw Martinez sit down at a dining table and he saw Martinez use an inhaler. After Martinez used the inhaler, Henry saw Martinez and Deputy Carriedo walk out into the quasi-yard. Refer to Henry's written statement for further information.

After interviewing the above mentioned inmates, I handed over the signed statement forms to Deputy Carriedo who was working as an Inmate Services Deputy in H/U 6.

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Supplement Narrative

On Wednesday, July 15, 2015, I was working as a Deputy Sheriff at Santa Rita Jail assigned to Housing Unit 7.

About 1145 hours, I responded to a detail in Housing Unit 6 (H/U6) related to an inmate, later identified as Mario MARTINEZ who was pronounced deceased in the back hall of Housing Unit 6. Upon arrival, I was detailed by Sergeant S. LENTHE #1227 to obtain a written statement from MARTINEZ's cellmate, Jose Luis DELACRUZ

I contacted DELACRUZ in H/U6 West isolation cell, who related the following information to me in summary.

On Wednesday, July 15 2015, about 1035 hours, durring pod time, MARTINEZ returned from his dental appointment at the Santa Rita Jail Clinic. MARTINEZ was sitting at the pod table next to the stairs in C pod. DELACRUZ sat down next to MARTINEZ and noticed his face was flush and he appeared to having problems breathing. DELACRUZ told MARTINEZ he was going to press the pod door intercom to get deputies to help. MARTINEZ said he did not need help at first, but agreed after DELACRUZ convinced him. DELACRUZ pressed the button and informed the H/U6 Sheriff's Technician that MARTINEZ was having an asthma attack and could not breathe. Deputy CARRIEDO responded to C pod and escorted MARTINEZ to a dining table in the dayroom. DELACRUZ said MARTINEZ was walking on his own accord, but slowly, and his breathing appeared labored. MARTINEZ then walked to the quasi-yard while clutching his chest. The next time DELACRUZ saw MARTINEZ, he was being attended to by medical staff in the back hallway of the housing unit. (Refer to DELACRUZ's attached written statement form for his verbatim statement.)

After taking his statement, DELACRUZ spontaneously told me MARTINEZ has had trouble breathing in the past. DELACRUZ said he had overheard MARTINEZ breathe erratically while sleeping and he was being treated by nursing staff at the jail for asthma related problems.
