\* Five year averages are displayed as a whole number, but percent change calculations between the current date range and average for the previous five year date range are calculated using the actual decimal averages. Intimidation is not included in percent change calculations because the category includes offenses not captured prior to 2016.

NOTE: The Portland Police Bureau recently transitioned to a new law enforcement records management system, the Regional Justice Information Network (RegJIN). Expected delays in record processing have been experienced as we acclimate to the new system. The offense codes used for statistical reporting are reviewed during record processing. The reported offense statistics presented in this report may change as reports continue to be processed.
