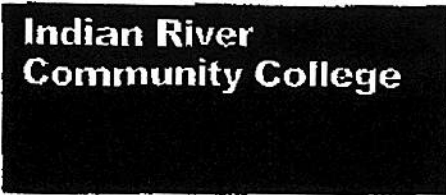

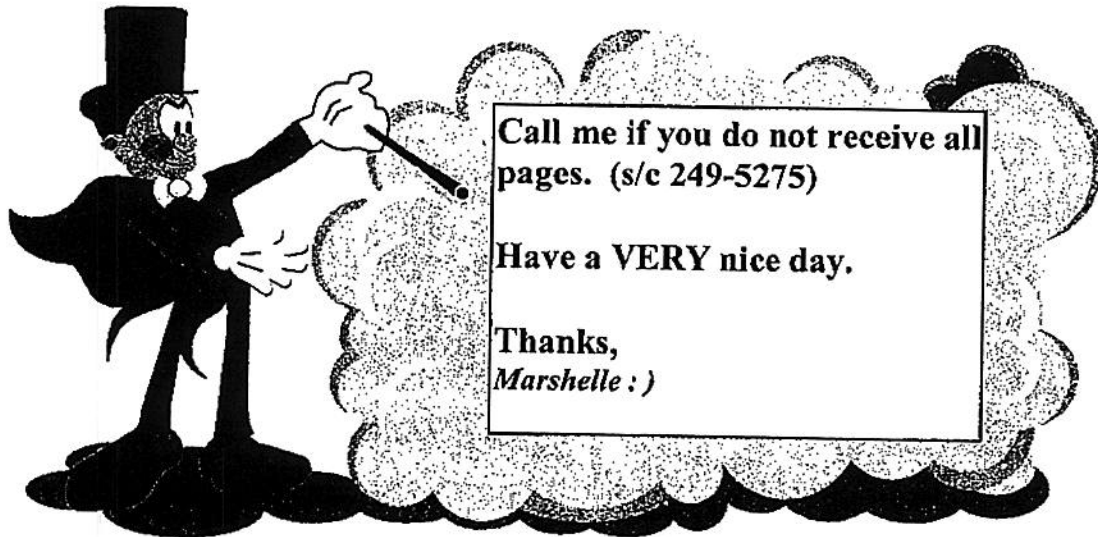

It was brought to my attention that Recruit Mateen was sleeping in class. Col. Gomez advised me that he had warned him about his sleeping in class at a previous date.

On April 17, 2007, I spoke with Recruit Mateen about his sleeping in class and he admitted to it. He wrote me a memorandum stating he fell asleep on this date, April 17, 2007, yesterday, April 16, 2007, and that he fell asleep on the firearms range.

This is a violation of the Policy Manual, Section II, Subsection H, Class II Offense. Recruit Mateen has admitted to sleeping during academy time on several accounts. I recommend a written reprimand to Recruit Mateen.

Approximately 2:15 p.m. today Luis Gomez informed me that Omar Mateen left campus during break and did not return. He did not let the instructor know he was leaving. I called MCI and spoke to PJ Wiesner to let them know that Cadet Mateen was missing from his classroom. Approximately 3:00 p.m. Sgt. Hill came to my office to see if Omar Mateen had called in to explain his absence. The class leader attempted to reach him on his cell phone which he did not answer, and could not leave a message because Mateen's voice mail was full. I checked with all the ladies to see if they had received a phone call, and Crystal said one student called in sick and transferred the message first to Kevin's phone and then to Joe's phone. She did not know if it was Mateen.

Mr. Riffle,

I am recommending probationary dismissal on recruit Omar Mateen. I was notified K. Lapham, Academy Coordinator, Indian river Community College, that recruit Mateen has two documented instances of sleeping in class as well as undocumented instances of sleeping in class. Additionally officer Mateen has been documented as being absent without permission... and most disturbing, an incident documented on 4/23 by another recruit where officer Mateen approached officer Thompson on 4/14/07 and asked "if he was to bring a gun to school would I (officer Thompson) tell anybody."

In light of recent tragic events at Virginia Tech officer Mateen's inquiry about bringing a weapon to class is at best extremely disturbing. I will FAX supporting documentation to your office.
