RE: Call to EMSA regarding transport for David Fulps III on 5-2-16

On 5-25-16 at approximately 1700 I called the EMSA non-emergency line (918-596-3010) and spoke with Debbie Maack regarding whether or not David Fulps III was transported via EMSA from the Tulsa County Jail on the evening of 5-2-16. Debbie reported EMSA did not transport Mr. Fulps on 5-2-16 and noted her records show he was transported by a "TCSO cruiser" to the OSU Medical Center. EMSA records indicate Mr. Fulps self reported jumping off of his top bunk and landing on his head and neck. EMSA was not requested to transport Mr. Fulps until 5-3-16 where they transported him to St. John Medical Center from OSU Medical Center.
