During the week of 090506 to 090706 I supplied Deputy District Attorney Charlene Woods with copies of reports and photographs pertaining to PPB Investigation #06-76259. Deputy Charlene Woods stated she would be staffing this investigation with her superior and get back to me regarding the direction in which she would like to have me proceed.

On 091106 Deputy District Attorney Charlene Woods stated that I needed to proceed in this investigation by interviewing the alleged suspect MIKE MARSHMAN. On 091106 I contacted Supervisory Sergeant Pat Kelly informing him of what Deputy District Attorney Charlene Woods directed me to do. Sergeant Kelly stated he would send an email to our Captain, John Eckhart, explaining this and for me to contact Captain Tellis in Internal Affairs Division prior to contacting MARSHMAN to make sure directives were being followed. On 091106 I contacted Captain Tellis by phone. Both myself and Captain Tellis discussed the directives and Captain Tellis stated he would contact AC Beard and get right back to me regarding the interpretation of the directives. Captain Tellis contacted me back by phone stating after he had a conversation with AC Beard it was determined that no advance notice or bill of rights needed to be forwarded to MARSHMAN and that this was a criminal investigation and go about it the same way I do other criminal investigations.

On 091206 myself and Detective Eric Carter went to the residence of 13946 NW Charlton Road. We spoke with MIGUEL GONZALEZ-MOSELER and identified ourselves as police detectives showing him our photo identification and badges. I also supplied GONZALEZ-MOSELER with a business card. I explained to GONZALEZ-MOSELER that I was interested in seeing if there was any damage to a wall inside his residence and asked MOSELER if he was aware of any damage. MOSELER stated that he had not noticed any damage to a wall when he moved in. MOSELER was asked if it would be all right if we came into his home and he invited both of us in. We entered through a side door near a garage entering into the kitchen portion of the home. Directly next to the kitchen is the living room. GONZALEZ-MOSELER was asked how long he had been living in this home and he stated since February of 2006. According to MOSELER, that was the closing date. GONZALEZ-MOSELER was asked if he knew the names of the tenants that had lived there prior and he stated that their last name is MARSHMAN. According to GONZALEZ-MOSELER, the old tenants were moving out

at the same time they were moving in. GONZALEZ-MOSELER was asked if he had repainted any of the walls and he stated that he did not. GONZALEZ-MOSELER stated that he lives at that residence with his partner EWALD MOSELER and that they are busy with a wine distribution business when asked. GONZALEZ-MOSELER was asked if he knew what year the house was built and he stated 2002. According to GONZALEZ-MOSELER the house is not completely finished and he understood the previous family had run out of financing to do that.

I contacted [REDACTED] and explained that I was in his previous residence and asked him to walk me through via the telephone to the wall that the encounter occurred on involving him and his step-father. [REDACTED] directed me to stand in front of the French doors looking out into the backyard from the living room. [REDACTED] then stated there is a hallway to the left near the kitchen with two rooms. [REDACTED] asked if one of the rooms still had green carpet and I stated that it did. [REDACTED] stated there should be a closet on one of the walls and that is the hallway that it occurred on. I thanked [REDACTED] and ended my conversation with him at that time. I asked GONZALEZ-MOSELER if he could remove the pictures that had been hanging on the wall in the hallway. After GONZALEZ-MOSELER removed two photos that had been hanging side by side I observed two areas where the wall had indentations. I asked GONZALEZ-MOSELER if it would be all right if we had someone from our Identification Division come out and take photos. GONZALEZ-MOSELER stated he had a court appearance to attend to regarding traffic and that he needed to leave his home to do that. Arrangements were made with GONZALEZ-MOSELER to return the following day on 091306 at 11:00 a.m. to take said photos. GONZALEZ-MOSELER stated he had not observed the indentation marks on the wall when he moved in.

On 091306 myself and Detective Eric Carter contacted MIKE MARSHMAN in the Chief's Office. We utilized MARSHMAN's office to speak with him. Both myself and Detective Carter introduced ourselves and I asked MARSHMAN if he could close the doors to his office for privacy. MARSHMAN did this. I explained to MARSHMAN that I had been assigned an investigation that involves some family members of his and that I wished to speak with him regarding this. It was approximately 9:10 a.m. when we contacted MARSHMAN. I asked MARSHMAN if he was willing to speak with us and he stated that he really didn't know what to do. According to MARSHMAN, he had contacted Captain John Tellis after being contacted by the new homeowner of his old home yesterday. MARSHMAN stated that the homeowner had called him and mentioned

that we had been there. According to MARSHMAN, he then contacted Captain Tellis inquiring as to who he is to contact regarding this. MARSHMAN stated he also spoke to Robert King who directed him to speak with Mike Staropoli, an attorney. MARSHMAN stated he has an appointment with Mike Staropoli at 10:00 a.m. today. We thanked MARSHMAN for his time and concluded our interview with him. MARSHMAN was asked to provide Staropoli with our names and numbers.

On 091306 myself and Detective Eric Carter went to the residence of GONZALEZ-MOSELER. Also present with us was Criminalist Adam Cushman. GONZALEZ-MOSELER was asked if he had spoken with MIKE MARSHMAN yesterday after our visit. GONZALEZ-MOSELER stated that he did not but that his partner EWALD did. According to GONZALEZ-MOSELER, they were concerned about possible lawsuits and GONZALEZ-MOSELER asked about that. I explained to GONZALEZ-MOSELER that this had nothing to do with lawsuits involving him or his partner that it was confidential and he did not have to worry. I again asked GONZALEZ-MOSELER if it would be all right if our criminalist went in and took some pictures. Pictures were taken of the wall in question and we thanked GONZALEZ-MOSELER for his time and left said residence.

On 091406 myself and Detective Eric Carter spoke with Lieutenant Bob Heimbach from Family Services Division. I explained to Lieutenant Heimbach that it was my understanding that he had retrieved a phone number for STACY COLE from his phone. Lieutenant Heimbach stated he did not retrieve it from his phone that he had been given STACY COLE's cell phone number from another dispatcher after he returned from attending training at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. According to Lieutenant Heimbach, he had attended training in Quantico, Virginia from approximately January 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> returning back to the Portland area on March 17<sup>th</sup> of 2006. Lieutenant Heimbach stated that he did not return back to work until April 4, 2006. According to Lieutenant Heimbach, he had met STACY COLE while working at East Precinct as a sergeant. Lieutenant Heimbach stated that he was involved in smoothing disputes between uniform officers and dispatch and that he knew STACY as MARSHMAN not COLE. Lieutenant Heimbach stated he had called up to dispatch shortly after returning from his training in Quantico, Virginia and was told that STACY was out on a disability. Lieutenant Heimbach stated that is when he was provided with her cell phone number. Lieutenant Heimbach stated that he was at East Precinct from 2000-2001.

		<p>According to Lieutenant Heimbach, he received information from Captain Eckhart to pick up some paperwork downtown. Lieutenant Heimbach stated when he returned with the paperwork Captain Eckhart shared the information that was inside the envelope with him. Lieutenant Heimbach stated the information was inaccurate and he shared that with Captain Eckhart. According to Lieutenant Heimbach, he told Captain Eckhart that MIKE MARSHMAN's wife's name is not PATRICIA as was originally listed, that his wife's name is STACY. Lieutenant Heimbach stated that he also stated that their son's name was [REDACTED] Lieutenant Heimbach stated he retrieved a phone number belonging to STACY's cell phone that he had written on paper providing that information to Captain Eckhart. Lieutenant Heimbach was asked if he ever contacted STACY COLE after returning from his trip from Virginia on her cell phone and he stated he did not. We concluded our interview with Lieutenant Heimbach at that time.</p>

On 091406 a meeting had been prearranged between Detective Carter and Attorney Mike Staropoli to take place at the Child Abuse Team office located at 10225 E Burnside at approximately 9:30 a.m. Mike Staropoli arrived for said meeting as scheduled. Introductions were made and I provided Mike Staropoli with a business card. I thanked Mike Staropoli for coming to the meeting and for Detective Carter assisting in arranging it. I explained to Mike Staropoli that myself and Detective Carter were assigned an investigation involving MIKE MARSHMAN. It was explained to Mike Staropoli that two anonymous letters had been received at the bureau regarding allegations of possible abuse to MIKE MARSHMAN's stepson. I provided Mike Staropoli with the postmarked date of the first letter being June 23, 2006 and stated that the first letter was very vague. I explained to Mike Staropoli that the second letter dated August 14, 2006 that had been sent to the bureau was a little more specific. I went on to explain to Mike Staropoli that the second letter mentioned photographic evidence. I explained to Mike Staropoli that myself and Detective Eric Carter contacted STACY COLE, the ex-wife of MIKE MARSHMAN as well as [REDACTED] his stepson. It was explained that there are physical abuse allegations being mentioned by both and that there are photos depicting this. It was also explained to Mike Staropoli that myself and Detective Carter have also been out to the old residence where the MARSHMAN's lived and that photos had been taken there as well. I went on to explain to Mike Staropoli that I had attempted to contact Charlene Woods who was the Deputy DA assigned to this case to see if she wanted me to show him the letter or the photos but was unable to get a hold of her at this time. I explained to Mike Staropoli that I wished to have direction from her prior to showing the

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letter or photos to him. I explained to Mike Staropoli that Charlene Woods would be out of the office until Monday because of being away at training.

Mike Staropoli stated he had talked with MIKE MARSHMAN and that MIKE MARSHMAN recalled an altercation that he had with his stepson and that there may be indications that it happened in the living room of the old house. Mike Staropoli stated that the date of Spring of 2004 came up when they were discussing this. I explained to Staropoli that both the mother and the son are saying that when [REDACTED] was approximately seventeen years old when it happened. Mike Staropoli stated it would be interesting if the roll of film documented the time frame of the injuries. Mike Staropoli stated that it was also mentioned from MIKE MARSHMAN to him that the pictures were used as a form of leverage and that MARSHMAN mentioned that he had also told his ex-wife that she had slapped her son. We spoke with Mike Staropoli regarding unrelated matters and concluded our interview with him.

On 091406 I contacted Captain Tellis by phone. I explained to Captain Tellis that it was my understanding that MIKE MARSHMAN had contacted him regarding this investigation. Captain Tellis stated that he did speak with him a couple of times and that MIKE MARSHMAN's reason for contacting him was because of policies and procedures primarily. According to Captain Tellis, MIKE MARSHMAN told him that a person that had bought his house said that Karen Mack was at his old house making inquiries and wanted to know what was going on. MIKE MARSHMAN, according to Captain Tellis, contacted him wanting to know who he should make aware that this is taking place and if an investigation is occurring. According to Captain Tellis, MIKE MARSHMAN's position at work was originally associated with being an assignment in Internal Affairs Division and MARSHMAN is now working in the Chief's Office. Captain Tellis stated he advised MARSHMAN to let Chief Sizer know. According to Captain Tellis, the only other conversations that they had were words of encouragement. I concluded my interview with Captain Tellis at that time.

This report will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for their review. Detective Carter reviewed this report and agrees that it is an accurate account of what transpired.

Two anonymous letters were sent to Internal Affairs Division regarding possible alleged abuse to MIKE MARSHMAN's step-son. MIKE MARSHMAN's ex-wife STACY COLE and ex-step-son [REDACTED] were contacted regarding this alleged abuse. Also contacted was MIKE MARSHMAN's brother, EDWARD MARSHMAN. Phone conversations took place with writer and STACY COLE and writer and Captain John Tellis regarding information pertaining to this investigation. The information gained from those phone conversations is reflected in the narrative portion of this report.

**NARRATIVE:**

On 082806 I received an interoffice envelope from Lieutenant Jay Drum in the Internal Affairs Division. Said envelope contained a photocopy of a handwritten envelope titled "Internal Affairs," dated 23, June 2006. Said envelope also contained an interoffice memorandum dated July 21, 2006 to Captain John Tellis from Captain Ronald Schwartz. Said envelope also contained a photocopy of an envelope addressed to Internal Affairs Division dated August 15, 2006. Said envelope contained an anonymously written letter dated August 14, 2006 to Internal Affairs Division. Also enclosed in said interoffice envelope was a chronological record with IPR #2006-C-0328 and a Portland Police Bureau person's reports as well as a Portland Police Bureau Investigative Report. After reviewing said items in the interoffice envelope I contacted Lieutenant Drum by phone. I informed him I did not receive the copy of the first letter only the envelope. I also mentioned to Lieutenant Drum that I did not receive any documentation stating as to who performed the fingerprint test in the Identification Unit on said letter. Lieutenant Drum stated that he would email Captain Tellis regarding these questions.

On 082806 I received an email from Captain John Tellis that had been sent to Lieutenant Drum with "cc" copy coming to me. In said email from Captain Tellis it states that the original first letter sent had been examined for fingerprints by ID and the process destroyed the paper on which the message was printed.

On 082906 I contacted Captain Tellis by phone. Captain Tellis stated that the original first letter was destroyed in Identification when they used a substance called Ruthinium Pepraoxide to attempt to lift any latent fingerprints of value. Captain Tellis stated that he was also going to send an interoffice memorandum to me detailing this from Criminalist

Ken Jones. Captain Tellis stated the reason nothing was done officially is because it didn't rise to the level of a complaint. According to Captain Tellis, when the Identification Division was done examining said letter they gave it back to him with instructions not to open it because it was contaminated. Captain Tellis stated he didn't want the letter being that it was contaminated and Criminalist Ken Jones offered to destroy the letter for Captain Tellis which he agreed to have take place. Captain Tellis stated that in Criminalist Ken Jones' letter that he will be sending to me makes reference that Captain Tellis was given the letter but Captain Tellis stated that he did give it back to Ken Jones to destroy. According to Captain Tellis, the Independent Police Review Board has a copy of this letter as well. Captain Tellis stated that in situations like this when somebody sends in an anonymous letter to Internal Affairs a copy of that is referred to the Independent Police Review Board as well.

Captain Tellis stated that after receiving the anonymous letter there were two things that he wanted to accomplish. Captain Tellis stated that he wanted someone from Family Services to do some kind of background check initially. According to Captain Tellis, that check came up negative. Captain Tellis stated that if someone was alleging child abuse and it was a bureau member they had the job of reporting and could not remain anonymous when it had to do with child abuse. Captain Tellis stated that he had wanted to bring that person to test if he found out that it was a bureau member writing the letter anonymously. Captain Tellis stated that was the initial reasoning behind printing the letter to see if it was a bureau member sending it in anonymously. Captain Tellis stated that if a letter came in that was anonymous like this he would routinely print it and he stated that he would if it alleged child abuse and had to do with a bureau member when asked. Captain Tellis stated he was curious why someone would make a charge like that if they were a bureau member and not take action. Captain Tellis stated there were no fingerprints of value other than his office staff found on said letter.

I explained to Captain Tellis that I had received a second letter in a Ziploc bag. Captain Tellis confirmed that they had received the second letter anonymously written. I asked Captain Tellis if anybody attempted to get the second letter printed and he stated that they did not. According to Captain Tellis, the first letter yielded zero fingerprints and the likelihood of the second letter yielding any fingerprints would also probably be zero. Captain Tellis stated that it was obvious when it was only his office staff members who had prints left on the first anonymous letter that who ever sent it more than likely wore gloves while folding it and placing it in the envelope. According to Captain Tellis, they

had other anonymous letters that had come to Internal Affairs at about the same time also alleging criminal acts by bureau members. I thanked Captain Tellis for his time and concluded my interview with him.

On 082906 I called [REDACTED] by phone. I inquired from [REDACTED] if he had the opportunity to assist his mother in retrieving the photos that she had mentioned earlier having in the garage in boxes. I asked [REDACTED] if his mother did find any photos. [REDACTED] stated that he doesn't believe his mother found any photos. I confirmed with [REDACTED] the correct phone number for his mother of [REDACTED]. I left a voicemail message on STACY COLE's home phone number to have her call me.

STACY COLE called back on 082906 and we spoke regarding the photos of her son [REDACTED]. STACY COLE stated she had found the photos but was reluctant to provide them to me for fear of what might happen to MIKE. STACY COLE asked if we had gone out to the house that they used to live at on Sauvie Island and I explained that we had not. I explained to STACY COLE that we would like to observe the photos to see what it is that we are dealing with if anything and that we are at kind of a standstill at this point. I explained to STACY COLE that a lot of parents discipline their children and that the photos she has talked about might not rise to the level that we would even need to be involved. STACY COLE stated what if they show fingerprints on one side and thumbprints on another and yellowing in the center. I explained to STACY COLE that I couldn't speculate that a lot of it just depends on what the photos show. STACY COLE went on to state that is what the photos would show. I explained to STACY COLE that I would like to have her reconsider turning over the photos she has. STACY COLE stated she didn't know what to do and she had talked a lot with her son [REDACTED]. STACY COLE stated she did not know about turning over the photos and what it would do to MICHAEL and the fact that she had a hand in it and what it would all amount to. I asked STACY COLE if she was able to figure out which box the photos were in and she stated she did. I asked STACY COLE to go ahead and take some time and think about it and give me a call the following day to let me know whether or not she was going to turn over the photos. STACY COLE stated she doesn't understand how clear handprints that are on a child's neck can be viewed as discipline. According to STACY COLE, everyone has an idea of discipline and choking a child is not one of them.

I explained to STACY COLE that she needed to take into consideration also that when this was occurring and that [REDACTED] said he was at the boiling point and all the

frustrations that were going on in the home and the fact that [REDACTED] called MICHAEL an asshole. I explained that people have breaking points. I explained to STACY COLE from what I understood the history in the home was more emotional than anything. I went on to explain to STACY COLE that the amount of time that they spent together and she could only recall two physical abuse incidents and that her son [REDACTED] could only recall the one and that was pretty remarkable in itself compared to other families. I again asked STACY COLE to think it over and let me know the following day what her decision was and that we were not going to force her to do anything. I concluded my phone conversation with STACY COLE at that time.

On 083006 I received an interoffice envelope from Captain John Tellis from Internal Affairs Division. Inside said envelope was an interoffice memorandum from Captain Tellis to Criminalist Ken Jones dated July 18, 2006. Said interoffice memorandum detailed Ken Jones' processing of the letter submitted by Captain Tellis to the Identification Division for fingerprint processing. At this time I have not received a call from STACY COLE regarding whether or not she would be turning over said photos or not to me. This report will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for their review.

Per Sergeant Kelly he received the first letter at the end of June or at the beginning of July. Sergeant Kelly stated that after receiving the first anonymous letter he called Personnel to see if MIKE MARSHMAN had any dependants listed and spoke with Sergeant Ron Alexander. MARSHMAN. Captain Eckhart stated he had been made aware of this and Captain Schwartz had received a copy of the first letter. Captain Eckhart stated he asked Lieutenant Heimbach to pick up the items Commander Madison had for him. According to Captain Eckhart, he received the items in an interoffice envelope and that envelope contained a photocopy of the first letter and envelope sent from an anonymous person, as well as a Ziploc bag containing the second anonymous letter with the envelope on the outside of said bag and the letter inside the bag. Captain Eckhart stated Lieutenant Heimbach told him he knew MIKE MARSHMAN's ex-wife's name as STACY and that he thinks her son's name is [REDACTED]. According to Captain Eckhart, Lieutenant Heimbach also had STACY's cell phone number in his phone and retrieved said phone number writing it down as [REDACTED]. Captain Eckhart stated Lieutenant Heimbach stated STACY is an employee of BOEC. According to Captain Eckhart, Sergeant Kelly approached him stating this was getting bigger and it needed to be assigned to a detective for investigation referring to the follow-up Sergeant Kelly had been doing.

On 082306 I next spoke with Ben Jumbo from Bureau of Human Resources by phone. Ben Jumbo referred me to Hanh Tran from Benefits to attempt to gain access for dependants listed either under STACY COLE or MIKE MARSHMAN. On 082306 I contacted Hanh Tran by phone. Tran stated that she would need me to fax a letter with bureau letterhead stating what I needed and that information would be forwarded to a panel so that they could see if they could release it under HIPPA rules. I contacted Captain Eckhart and Sergeant Kelly again and asked that they get involved so that I could attempt to get this information quicker without going through a HIPPA panel. Sergeant Kelly referred me to Cathy Bless from Benefits. On 082306 I contacted Bless by phone and she stated she had a conversation with Sergeant Kelly by phone a few days ago where she told him to email her the information that he was requesting. According to Bless, she again had that same conversation with Sergeant Kelly today. I re-contacted Sergeant Kelly by phone and told him about my conversation with Cathy Bless. Sergeant Kelly asked that I contact Anna Kanwit. I called Anna Kanwit and provided her with

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information I was seeking over the phone and she asked that Sergeant Kelly email her a request and she would have Cathy Bless call back with the information. On 082306 Cathy Bless called back stating that STACY COLE has one son named [REDACTED]

Lieutenant Jay Drum called back on 082306 and stated that he was having difficulty locating the first anonymous letter that had been sent and thinks that Captain Tellis knows its whereabouts. According to Lieutenant Drum, Captain Tellis is out of town until Monday.

On 082306 myself and Detective Eric Carter went to the residence of STACY COLE located at [REDACTED] A female came to the door and identified herself as STACY COLE when asked. COLE invited myself and Detective Eric Carter into her home. Prior to coming into COLE's residence I displayed my photo identification and badge to her. I also provided COLE with a business card and explained to COLE that both myself and Detective Eric Carter were from the Child Abuse Team and we had received anonymous letters regarding possible abuse to MIKE MARSHMAN's step-son. I asked COLE if she had a son and she stated she did. According to COLE, her son's name is [REDACTED] I asked COLE when she met MIKE MARSHMAN and she stated it was when [REDACTED] was six years old. According to COLE, they were married when [REDACTED] was about seven and a half years old and ended up getting a divorce in 2005. [REDACTED]

I asked COLE if there was any truth to the allegations that were written in the anonymous letter regarding possible abuse to her son [REDACTED] COLE began to tear up and asked what was going to happen. I explained to COLE that it was our job to do an impartial investigation and that just because it involved allegations against an officer it doesn't mean that we are not going to look into things. It was explained to COLE if we found out during the course of our investigation that abuse took place that information would be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office and they could make a decision on whether or not a crime had occurred. It was also explained to COLE that the information would also

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be shared with our management personnel as well. COLE was asked if there was any truth to the allegation and she shook her head yes. COLE went on to state that MIKE drove [REDACTED] head into a wall when they were living at the old house and choked him leaving prints around his throat. According to COLE, this happened about three years ago when her son was seventeen years old. COLE stated it left a head impression in the wall. According to COLE, last summer her son didn't even come home from college. COLE stated that this was never reported when asked. According to COLE, she knew when MIKE was testing for the sergeant's position he wouldn't get it if something like this surfaced. According to COLE, the family went to about three counseling sessions and MIKE wouldn't go anymore. COLE was asked if there was any alcohol issues involved with MIKE and she stated that there were none that she thinks it had to do with the way MIKE was raised. COLE stated MIKE wouldn't even look at [REDACTED] or help him when he needed it. According to COLE, her son [REDACTED] would offer to help mow the grass and MIKE wouldn't have him help him. COLE was asked for the address of where this incident occurred and she stated she thinks the numbers are 13946 NW Charlton Road. According to COLE, this was approximately three years ago when this happened. COLE stated she was at a bachelorette party and when she came home she found a picture in the wrong place on the wall. The next day she thought [REDACTED] had hickies on his neck when she saw the bruises. COLE stated that she took pictures of the marks and continued to stay with MIKE. COLE would sporadically cry during the course of our conversation.

According to COLE, MIKE told her that [REDACTED] couldn't come home on the weekends from college. COLE stated that her son [REDACTED] also mentioned to her that things have changed in the home. COLE was asked if there were other incidents besides the choking incidents that she just described. COLE stated there was one other incident which she described occurring at a house they lived at on Lee Street, in Portland, Oregon. COLE stated [REDACTED] was approximately nine years old when that incident occurred and that she found MIKE with [REDACTED] in the bathroom and that [REDACTED] was on the floor between the toilet and the tub and MIKE was hitting him. According to COLE, she stated that she "reefed" MIKE off of [REDACTED]. COLE was asked for the numbers on Lee Street and she stated she wasn't sure that it was 1-0-7 or something. According to COLE, prior to the Lee address it was just verbal, things that occurred between MIKE and [REDACTED]. COLE stated that MICHAEL was not a talker and when she would try and converse with him about what was causing this he wouldn't respond. COLE was asked for addresses they had lived at together while with MIKE and she stated they lived at the Lee address when they got married in 1992 or 1993 and lived there for approximately nine years and then moved to Sauvie Island on Charlton Road and lived there for approximately three years. COLE stated [REDACTED] was sixteen or seventeen because he had just started driving when they moved into that address referring to the Charlton Road address. According to COLE, [REDACTED] started college when he was eighteen years old. COLE went on to state MIKE was the only dad that [REDACTED] has known and that his biological dad has not been involved in his life. COLE was asked if there were any other incidents of physical abuse from MICHAEL to [REDACTED] and she stated the physical violence stopped after the wall incident.

COLE was asked about the family counseling that she had mentioned and she stated they went to three appointments, all of them together, and saw a therapist by the name of [REDACTED]. According to COLE, they didn't share about the physical abuse that had occurred to [REDACTED] with the therapist because they felt that something might happen to MIKE and his job if they did. COLE stated that MIKE never wanted to return back to the therapist. COLE was asked if she talked to anyone about the physical abuse between MIKE and [REDACTED] and she stated she has talked to close friends that she knows but didn't tell them the details. According to COLE, she talked to someone who was a bureau employee and asked about counseling. COLE went on to state that if [REDACTED] walked into a room MIKE would leave the room that it got to that point. COLE stated that [REDACTED] would even offer to help MIKE by mowing the yard and MIKE would say no. COLE was asked who wanted the divorce, her or MIKE and she stated MIKE found the forms on the internet and they both filled them out. According to COLE, they had talked about a divorce and she didn't know really who first decided to do it. COLE went on to state that MIKE's father died a couple of months ago and MIKE wouldn't let them go to the father's funeral because they weren't family. COLE described MIKE as being passive aggressive and that she described incidents when they would attempt to go to dinner and if [REDACTED] got into the vehicle MIKE would get out of the truck. COLE was asked if any objects had been used on [REDACTED] by MIKE and she stated there were not.

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COLE was asked if [REDACTED] had been to the doctor for either of his injuries that we talked about and she stated that he has not. COLE went on to explain that MIKE is a one-person man. [REDACTED]

COLE was asked about [REDACTED] and if MIKE ever disciplined him such as grounding him or things like that. COLE stated that one day when she came home MIKE was in the process of having [REDACTED] throw everything in [REDACTED] bedroom in the driveway. According to COLE, when she returned home [REDACTED] would have spent the whole day in his bedroom while she was at work. 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her home after ED's father's funeral and felt bad because she and [REDACTED] were not at the funeral.

COLE was asked again if she had sent the anonymous letters to Internal Affairs and she said no, she didn't. COLE was asked if she had been seeking counseling help for herself and she stated that she has been. According to COLE, she questions why she stayed with MIKE after what he did to her son [REDACTED]. COLE stated that she is in the process of writing a letter to her son [REDACTED] expressing that she is sorry for not doing more to protect him. COLE was asked who she is currently seeing as a counselor and she stated his name is [REDACTED] and that she started seeing him at the end of June or the first of July of this year. COLE mentioned that she would like to call her son first and asked if that was okay and I expressed to COLE that was fine and she made a call to her son at approximately 2:23 p.m. COLE conversed with her son for a few minutes and handed me the phone. I made arrangements with [REDACTED] to meet him at his apartment the following day at 10:00 a.m. [REDACTED] provided an address of [REDACTED]. I thanked [REDACTED] for his time and concluded my conversation with him.

COLE was asked if any of the people that she had conversed with be it ED and KATHY MARSHMAN, the firefighter friend, or her mother told her to seek police intervention and COLE stated they did not. According to COLE, her son kept his apartment this summer because he was told he couldn't come home. COLE was asked if she thinks her son [REDACTED] wrote the letter and she stated she didn't think so. COLE was asked if she would mind filling out a handwriting exemplar and she said that would be fine. Lieutenant Drum stated that he would be sending what they have in Internal Affairs interoffice to me and he thinks the original letter that was first sent to IAD had been destroyed while looking for prints. I asked Lieutenant Drum if there had been a report written by Identification personnel that printed the letter and he stated that he is not observing a report. Lieutenant Drum stated that as of today he is unable to produce the letter and that he would find out more on Monday when Captain Tellis returns.

On 082406 myself and Detective Carter drove to [REDACTED] and contacted [REDACTED] invited us into his apartment and it was approximately 9:40 a.m. when we began our interview with [REDACTED] I displayed my badge and identification to [REDACTED] as well as providing him with a business card. We sat in his living room to conduct this interview. [REDACTED] was asked how old he was when he first met MIKE and he stated he thinks he was about seven years old when his mom and MIKE met and dated. According to [REDACTED] it was about a year or so after that they married. [REDACTED] stated they lived in an apartment in the Beaverton Town Square area for a couple of years and then moved to 107<sup>th</sup>/SW Lee Street in the Cedar Mill area. [REDACTED] stated that they bought the house and lived there until 2002 and then moved to Charlton Road on Sauvie Island. According to [REDACTED] they lived at that address until November 2005. [REDACTED] stated that the Charlton Road address was sold when his mother and MIKE got a divorce. [REDACTED] was asked if he still keeps things at his mother's home that she is currently living at and he stated that he does. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was asked to tell me a little bit about his relationship that he had with MIKE, his step-dad. [REDACTED] stated it seemed fine when his mother and his dad were dating and when they got married it became troublesome. [REDACTED] stated that he thinks his dad has difficulties with kids and being a father because of the type of childhood he had. [REDACTED] went on to describe his dad was emotionally abusive to him but not yelling and screaming, just that there was tension. [REDACTED] described the three of them not fitting well

together, referring to himself, his mother and his dad. [REDACTED] stated his mother and his dad seemed okay together or he and his mother seemed okay together and it seemed that there were different relationships. [REDACTED] described having the feeling that he was imposing on the relationship that his mother had with his dad.

I asked [REDACTED] about discipline in the home and he stated that it mostly came from his mother. [REDACTED] stated that he was never grounded when asked. [REDACTED] also stated that no objects were ever used for discipline when asked. [REDACTED] referred to MIKE as "dad," and I asked him if that is what he called him and he stated he did. I asked [REDACTED] if there was ever a time where his dad had disciplined him and he stated there was not. I explained to [REDACTED] that when we talked to his mother the day before she talked about two different incidents of physical abuse. 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the kitchen and when he went out to turn it off his dad was in the living room. [REDACTED] stated that he said to his dad, "You're an asshole." [REDACTED] stated that his dad asked him what he had said and he again repeated himself telling his dad that he was an asshole. [REDACTED] stated that his dad choked him and he couldn't breathe and then he dropped him. According to [REDACTED], his dad realized that he had done something stupid. [REDACTED] stated that he began crying and went to his room and that his dad came in later and the two of them talked about getting things fixed and getting a counselor and that [REDACTED] mentioned that his mom wanted a divorce. 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MARSHMAN, STACY talked about speaking with another Portland officer named Gary Barbour when she broke up with MIKE but it was just talk about step-children and dealing with them. According to MARSHMAN, he thinks that Gary Barbour took [REDACTED] on a ride-a-long. MARSHMAN stated that STACY asked him if there were rumors going around about her and Gary and if people think that is why she broke up with MIKE. On 6/20/06 I processed a single sheet of paper note and an envelope that was post dated 23 June 2006 with Ruthinium Tetraoxide. Latent fingerprints of value were obtained. From the files of the Portland Police Bureau I pulled the inked fingerprint cards of yourself and Sgt. Judy Brumfield. I had Cathy Rossetto come to ID where I took a full set of elimination prints.

From the envelope I identified the single identifiable latent print obtained as having been made by Cathy Rossetto who opened the letter.

From the paper note, I identified the single identifiable latent print obtained as having been made by Sgt. Judy Brumfield who touched the note.

No other latents were obtained even after additional latent fingerprint processing with Ninhydrin.

The envelope and note have been returned with this memo in a plastic envelope. Do not touch the processed evidence without gloves. It would be best to not leave it sitting out on a desk unsealed either because the chemicals will off-gas and contaminate the office with an odor and likely give folks a headache.

No copies of the evidence were made and it was contained in a sealed envelope while in the Identification Division vault.

Total time spent on this latent processing request is estimated at eleven hours of processing, examination, and PPB employee identifications. No call was produced for our internal call log or official police report written other than this memo.

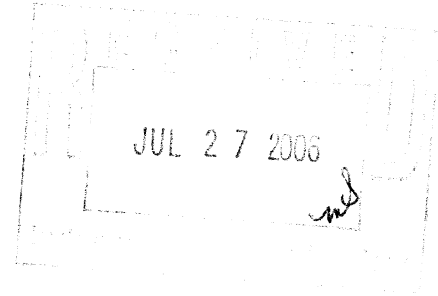
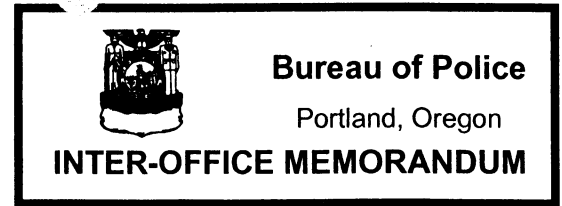

Captain Tellis told me that IAD had received an anonymous third party complain via US Mail stating Officer Michael Marshman had abused his step son an undisclosed number of years ago. The letter did not reveal any other details. Note that Michael Marshman is actually a sergeant assigned to East Precinct.

After discussion with Captain Tellis I assigned Sergeant Pat Kelly of the Child Abuse Team to make inquiries of the Personnel Division to determine if Sergeant Marshman had any children and/or step children. Sergeant Kelly was unable to locate the names of any children associated with either Sgt Marshman or his wife in 1991, Patricia Marshman. Further inquires of the Department of Human Services Child Abuse Hotline did not turn up any entries for Sgt Marshman.

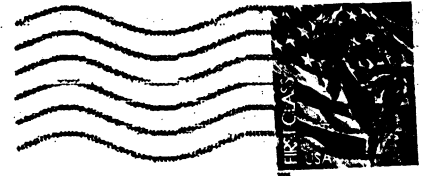
