
## **History Based Journalism**

## **Student Evaluation Areas**

- Research Ability to locate relevant and reliable sources (Wikipedia can be a starting point, but it may not be used as a reliable source)
- <u>Content</u> Ability to use the sources to develop a story that is well written, interesting to read, and based on real events
- <u>Design</u> Ability to develop a beautiful functional template that demonstrates use of multiple techniques including resized pictures, quotes, fonts, titles
- <u>Creativity</u> Ability to take a creative angle on your stories topic (simply providing a Wikipedia overview
  of your topic in your writing is not the assignment)
