COUNTY OF TARRANT AFFIDAVIT

Before me the undersigned authority on this day personally appeared **GALBRAITH, J - 3552**, a peace officer for the STATE of TEXAS, who after being duly sworn upon oath deposes and says that he has good reason to believe that **REVILL, CHRISTOPHER STEVEN** did commit the offense of **Kidnapping 10990001** (Penal Code # **PC 20.03**) against the laws of the State of Texas on 10/11/16. Said reason and belief is based on the following facts and circumstances and is sworn to under oath before undersigned authority.

This offense happened in FORT WORTH, TARRANT County, Texas. I, Officer JM Galbraith #3552, working E242, received the following information Det D Rohloff:

On October 10, 2016, at approximately 2100 hours, ARR-Revill and VIC-Typhenie Johnson were outside talking. They had been dating for approximately 8 months and VIC-Typhenie ended the relationship approximately 2 month ago. On this date, VIC-Typhenie told ARR-Revill that it was over. While they were outside talking, WIT-Brown, VIC-Typhenie's current boyfriend, went out to check on her. VIC-Typhenie told WIT-Brown to go back to VIC-Typhenie's apartment. From the apartment window, WIT-Johnson, VIC-Typhenie's brother, could see both ARR-Revill and VIC-Typhenie talking and also could see ARR-Revill's vehicle and VIC-Typhenie's vehicle in the parking lot. At different times, WIT-Johnson would look out the window to monitor VIC-Typhenie's safety to make sure she was still okay. WIT-Johnson advised that after about 20 minutes, the conversation between VIC-Typhenie and ARR-Revill moved to the side of the apartment building, but he could still hear part of the conversation. After another 20 minutes, ARR-Revill came to the apartment and collected some items. WIT-Johnson asked ARR-Revill where VIC-Typhenie was and ARR-Revill said that she left with someone who was going to fix her vehicle. ARR-Revill then left the apartment. WIT-Johnson attempted to call VIC-Typhenie, but received no answer. WIT-Johnson looked outside and saw ARR-Revill's vehicle was gone and believed ARR-Revill had left the apartment complex. After another 5 minutes, WIT-Johnson went downstairs to look for VIC-Typhenie. When WIT-Johnson walked around the corner of the building, he observed ARR-Revill's vehicle had been moved off of the parking lot and backed in on the yard area, which consisted of grass and dirt. He also noted that the trunk lid was opened. WIT-Johnson did not approach ARR-Revill because he did not know if ARR-Revill had any weapons on him. WIT-Johnson decided to go the other way around the building to check on ARR-Revill. When WIT-Johnson arrived on the backside of the apartment building, WIT-Johnson saw ARR-Revill close the trunk lid of the vehicle and drive away from the building and out of the apartment complex. When WIT-Johnson arrived at the location where ARR-Revill's vehicle had been parked, WIT-Johnson found VIC-Typhenie's cell phone on the ground and one of her socks near the phone. WIT-Johnson immediately called ARR-Revill and told him to come back and ARR-Revill told WIT-Johnson that he would turn around and come back. After about 15 minutes, ARR-Revill had not returned. WIT-Johnson called the Fort Worth Police Department. When Officer Smith arrived, both Officer Smith and WIT-Johnson called ARR-Revill. When ARR-Revill answered for WIT-Johnson, Officer Smith told him that he needed to return to speak with police. ARR-Revill returned about 25 minutes later sweating excessively and advised that it was due to warm temperatures. The officers on the scene noticed this and also advised that the outdoor temperatures (64.9 degrees Fahrenheit) were very cool and that no one should be sweating like ARR-Revill was at this time. Crime Scene made the location and documented the scene. On scene comparisons were made of ARR-Revill's vehicle tires with tire impressions located in the yard area where ARR-Revill's vehicle was seen and VIC-Typhenie's property was located. These impressions appeared to match. There were also distinct shoe impressions in the same area which matched the soles of ARR-Revill's shoes he was wearing. While conducting this on scene investigation, additional officers went to ARR-Revill's home and located in the back yard a bra with the wire clasped on the back stretched out as if pulled apart, a ladies shirt, a smart watch with the clasp also broken, and a man's tank top. ARR-Revill's parents confirmed that those items were not there earlier and did not belong to them. The parents advised that they went to dinner and shopping and were not at home during the timeframe that VIC-Typhenie went missing. Searches were conducted both around the apartment complex and ARR-Revill's home, however; VIC-Typhenie was not located. ARR-Revill was detained for further investigation. Det. Henz read ARR-Revill his Miranda warning and he agreed to talk with Det. Henz. ARR-Revill denied harming VIC-Typhenie in any way and denied parking in the grass where VIC-Typhenie's property was located. Based on the police investigation, I believe that ARR-Revill took VIC-Typhenie by force by abducting her and hiding her in a place where she has not been located, therefore; committing the offense of Kidnapping.
