PRESS STATEMENT FROM ATTORNEYS FOR ALEC COOK

As a nation and society, we believe that each and every one of us is presumed innocent until proven guilty. This principle belongs to each one of us. This is our bedrock. We despise public lynchings and we oppose vigilante justice. Historically, those sorts of injustices happened when angry mobs took to the streets.

The internet has replaced the streets. As a result, for the past few days, we have seen how the rapid-fire internet news cycle erodes that presumption of innocence. This is exactly what is happening to Alec Cook right now. Alec, a 20 year old business major with no criminal history, has seemingly been charged, tried, and convicted.
