Officers maintained the perimeter and shut down the 5000-5100 block of Connecticut Ave. N.W. for no vehicular or pedestrian traffic to flow on to to scene. All other witnesses and pedestrians were escorted to the firehouse for their safety.	
At approximately 1524 hours S-1 exited the front of the Comet restaurant with hands up in the air. Officer A. Brown shouted loud verbal commands towards S keep his hands in the air and to walk backwards towards the officers' direct Sgt. Firehock then took over the commands and instructed S-1 to keep his hand behind his head and then lift up his shirt from the back of his neck which we expose his waistband. No weapons were observed on S-1 at this time. S-1 was instructed to lie on the ground. S-1 complied and walked back towards the direction of the police vehicle and laid on the ground. Officer Stevenson and Officer Diemer then placed S-1 in handcuffs. Sgt. Firehock had asked S-1 what weapons he had and where they were located. S-1 stated that he had an AR-15 laying on the kegs inside the restaurant along with a .38 caliber handgun the had sitting on a table. Sgt. Firehock further asked S-1 what his motive was entering the establishment armed. S-1 stated that he had read online that the Comet restaurant was harboring child sex slaves and that he wanted to see for himself if they were there. S-1 stated he was armed to help rescue them.
