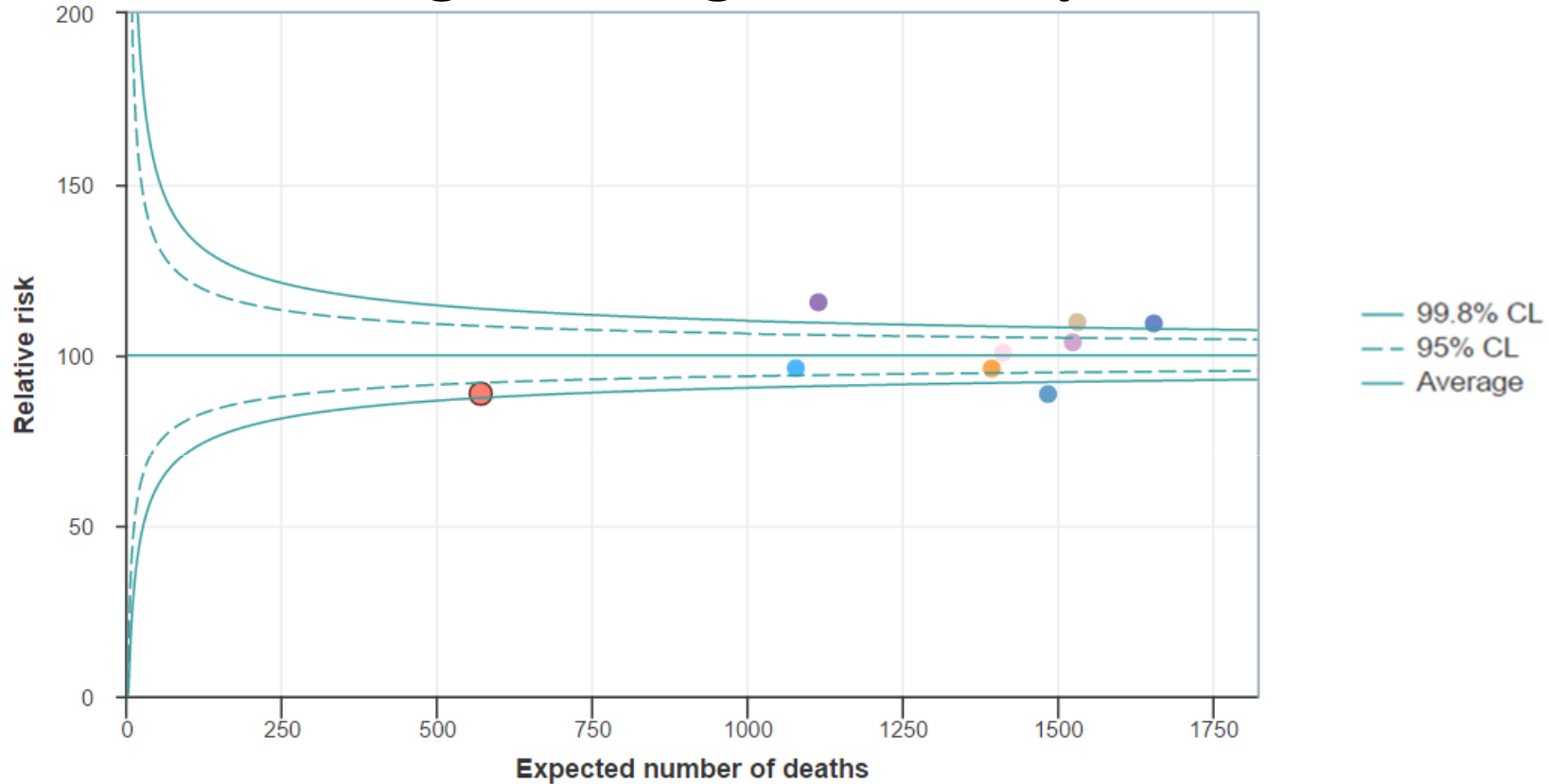

HSCIC SHMI Update

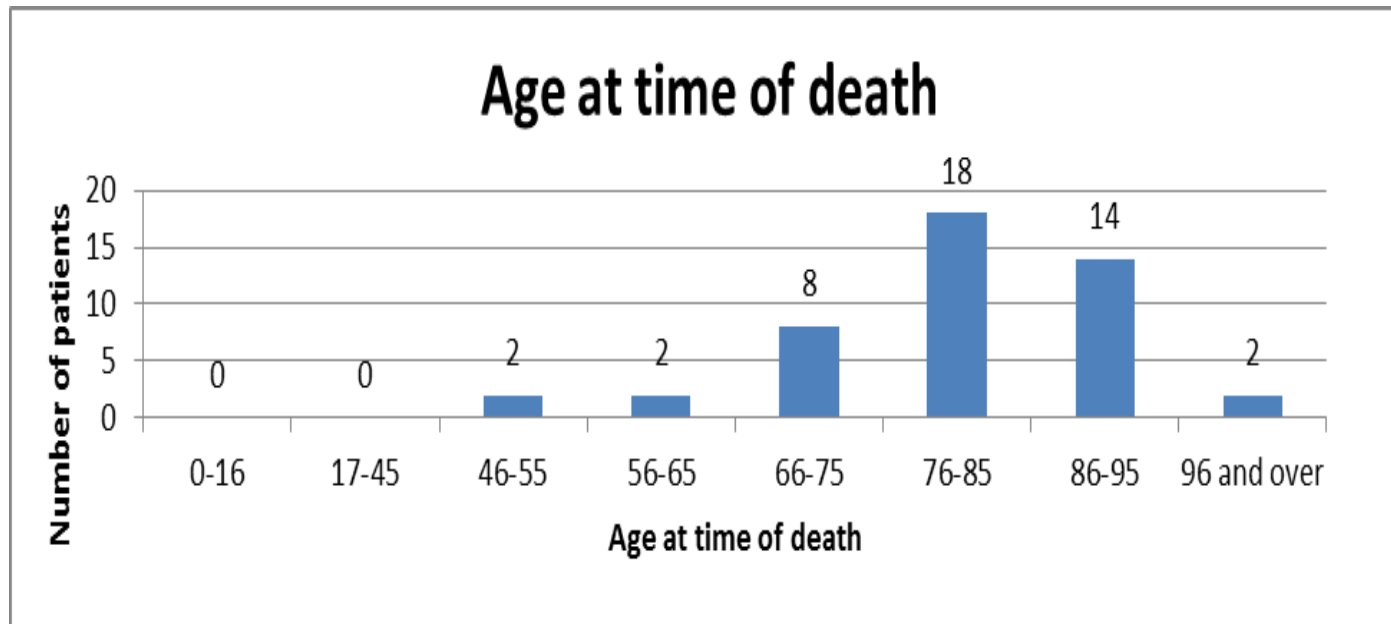
- SHMI for the year to June 2016 is 1.01 which is a small improvement on the year to March which was 1.02

Of the 46 Deaths, 19 were referred / discussed with the Coroner and of these 12 went on to have a Post Mortem (PM) to establish cause of death.

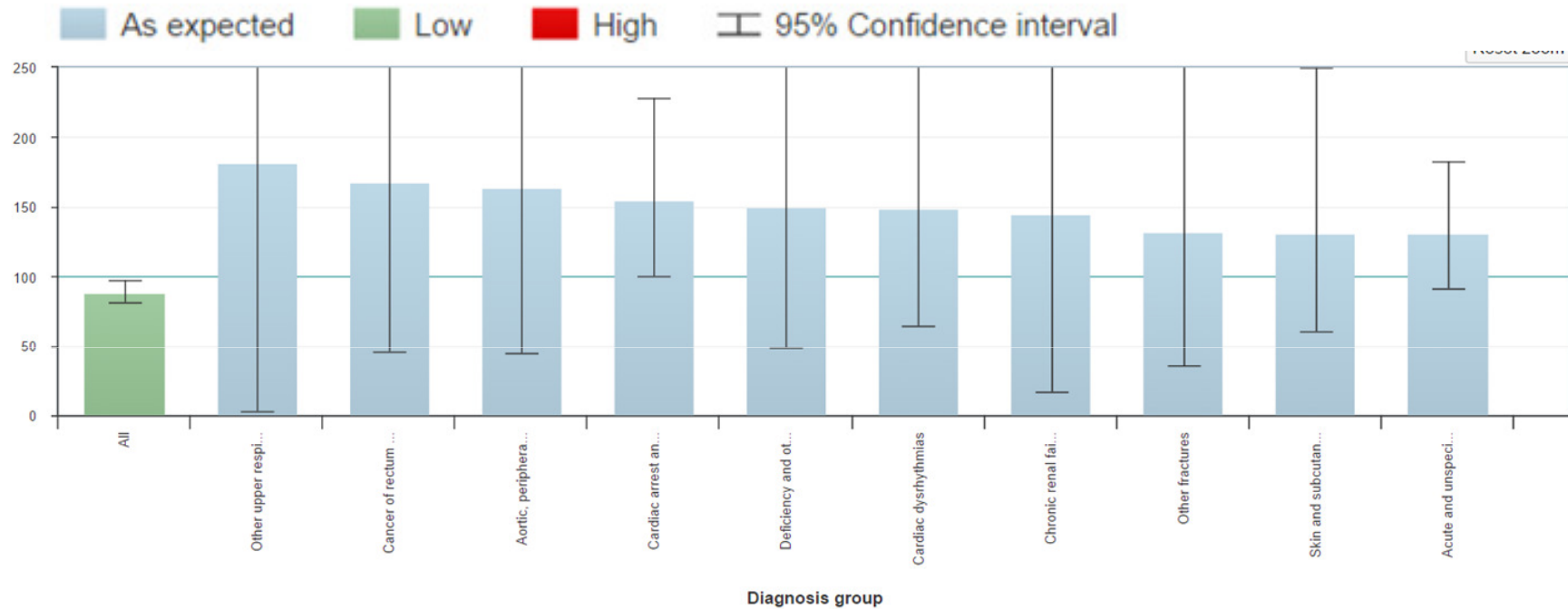

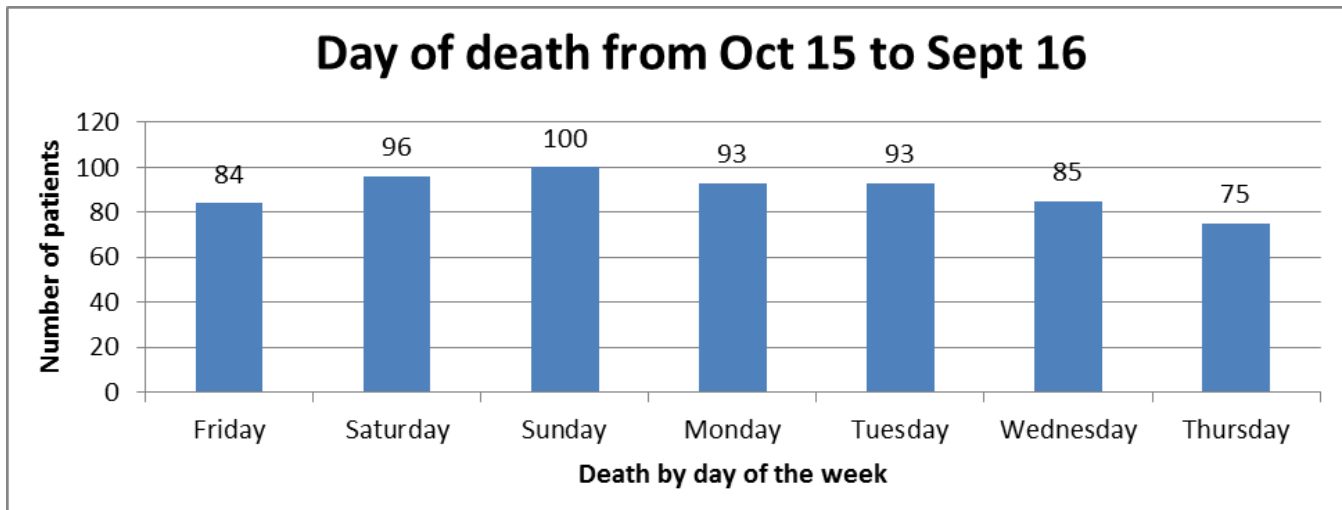
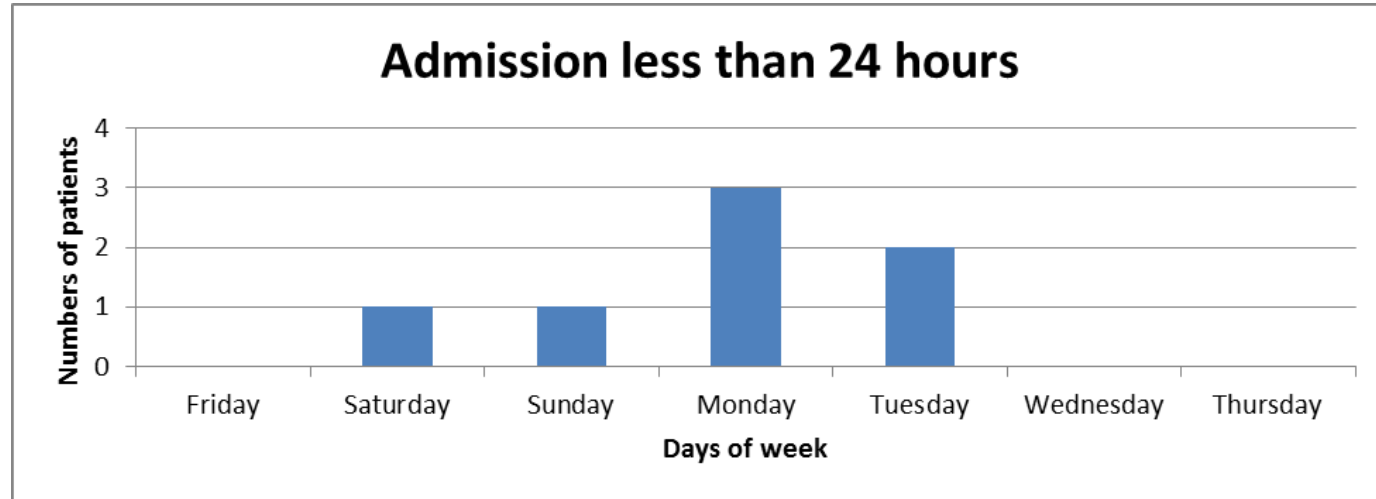
Of the 46 deaths there were no patients that had learning difficulties.





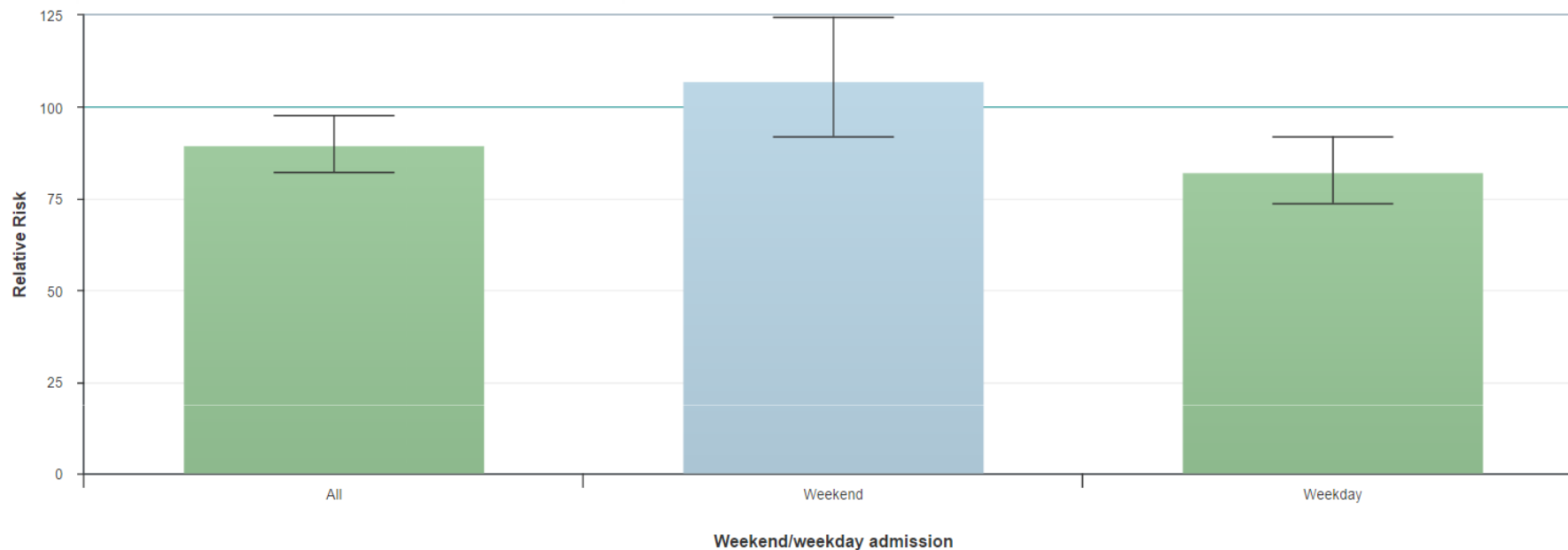
HSMR 'Top 10' Diagnosis ordered by lower confidence interval

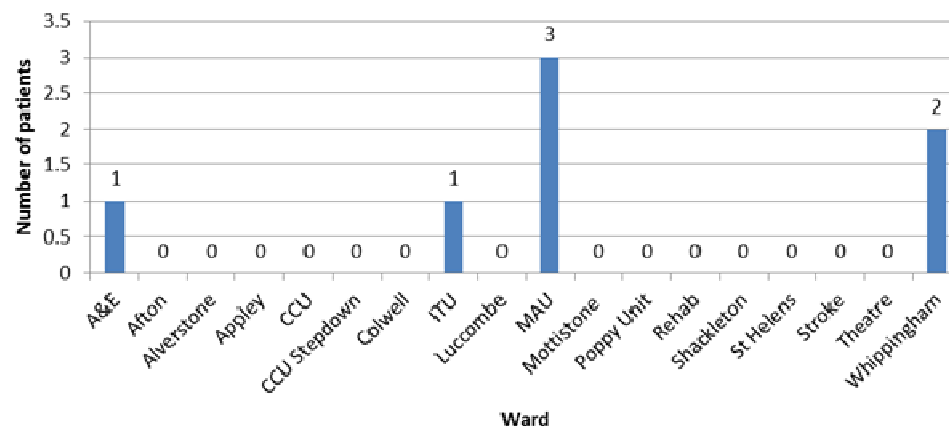

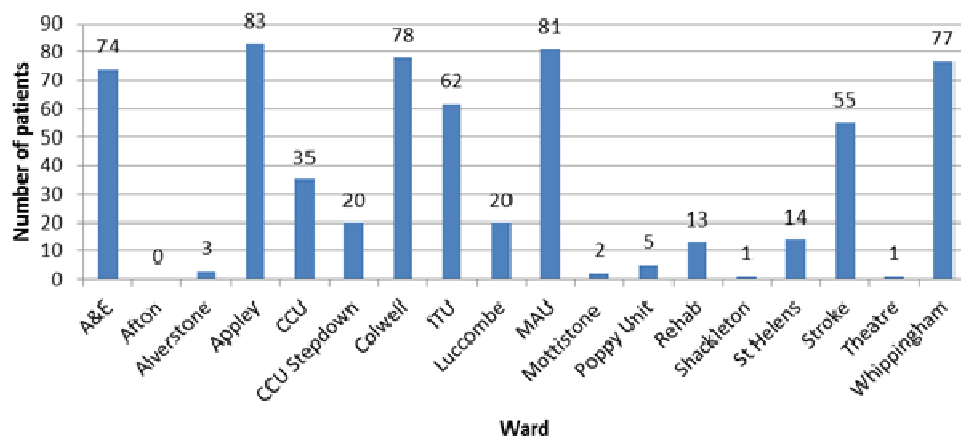




Place of death within 24 Hours of Admission

Beareavement Survey-15 Questions with ratings and open text

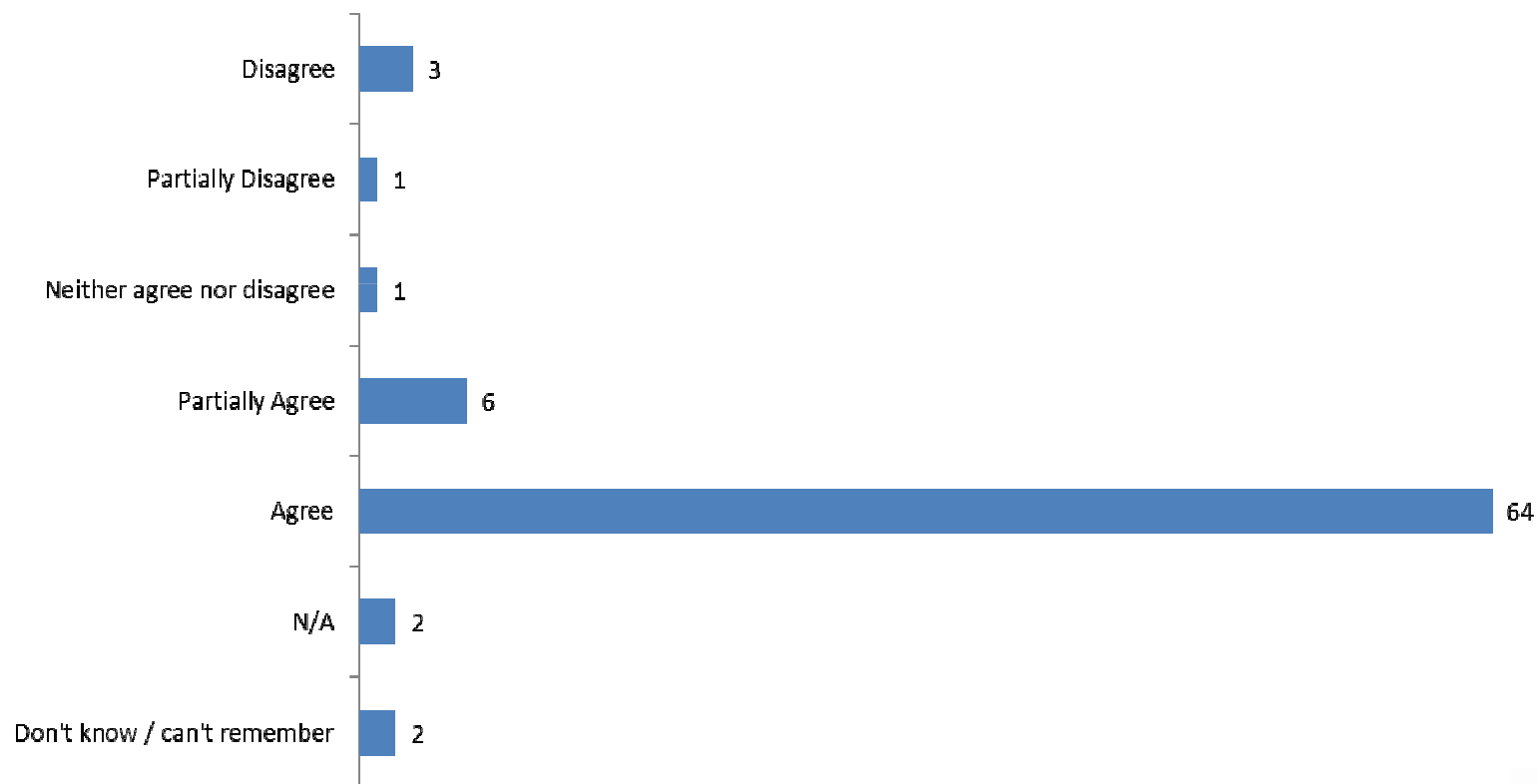
- Treated with dignity and respect, according to wishes, pastoral support, pain control, nutrition
