WHEREAS, the parameter of Corrections, in accordance with RCW 10.95.160(2), has set January 19, 2017, as the day on which the judgment and sentence of the court shall be executed by the superintenence reversal on papel, and rising costs are some of the troubling factors. NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Inslee, by virtue of the power vested in me as Governor of the state of Washington under RCW 10.01.120, hereby direct that the execution of the sentence of death for Clark Richard Elmore be reprieved, unless and until such reprieve is WI De W w first process with the car with th

lifted by order of myself or a future governor of Washington State. This warrant shall be obeyed and executed by the superintendent of the state, and the January 19, 2017, execution date shall be reprised.
