The Federal Communications Commission's January 31, 2017 letter informed the Court that the Commission is abandoning and no longer defending arguments contained in Sections I and III.B of the Respondents' brief filed jointly by the Commission and the United States in defense of the Order on review. In light of the deference given to the Commission in these matters, Respondent United States no longer intends to defend those aspects of the Order discussed in Sections I and III.B of the brief.
