**DENYING PLAINTIFF’S MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER; DENYING
PLAINTIFF’S MOTION FOR A PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION; GRANTING IN PART PLAINTIFF’S
MOTION FOR AN INJUNCTION PENDING AN OPPORTUNITY TO PETITION THE COURT OF
APPEALS FOR A STAY**

For the reasons stated in the Court’s Memorandum Opinion separately issued, Plaintiff’s Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction (ECF No. 7) is **DENIED** and Plaintiff’s Motion for a Preliminary Injunction Pending Appeal (ECF No. 25) is **GRANTED IN PART**, as provided below. It is hereby:

ORDERED that Defendants are **ENJOINED**, until March 3, 2017, from directly or indirectly publicly disclosing the identity of Plaintiff John Doe Company, by taking actions including, but not limited to, the public filing of either the civil investigative demand served on Plaintiff or the Director’s Decision and Order on Plaintiff’s Petition.
