
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
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Edgecombe Avenue at 137th Street facing north



Riverside Drive at West 155th Street facing east



This section, almost completely residential in nature, is populated by a middle-income group. Large apartments of good appearance are the major housing unit with the greatest concentration along Broadway and Riverside Drive. Tenement houses appear, but only in the Negro section along Eighth Avenue and to some extent in the Spanish settlement on 145th Street. Broadway, especially between 144th and 147th Streets, is a shopping area of some importance. Many other good quality stores appear along Amsterdam Avenue. Eighth Avenue is a busy shopping thoroughfare for Negro trade. City College with its large student body is in this district. The Polo Grounds, at the northwest corner, draws big crowds to the section.
