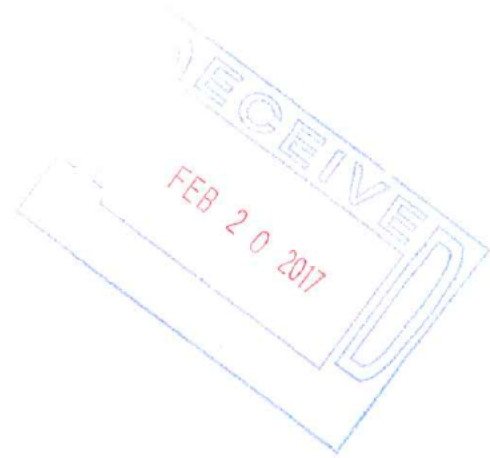

Dear Secretary Stepp:

I look forward to receiving the Wisconsin Resources magazine. I enjoy the informative articles and especially those highlighting Wisconsin folks who are tending the environment. This month's enclosure about Groundwater was very good.

However, I am alarmed that the enclosure did not give the entire story about the state of Wisconsin's ground water, particularly the aquifers. As you know, aquifers originated from the last ice age and can not be replenished successfully from rain water. It is my understanding that Wisconsin actually has more drought than California as by percentage the Wisconsin aquifers have been more depleted than those in California or Kansas/Nebraska. . As indicated in the Groundwater supplement, 30% of Wisconsin ground water is used for agriculture and that the number of acres irrigated in Wisconsin has risen from 62,000 in 1964 to now 473,000 in 2012. Is there any wonder that the Wisconsin aquifer is being depleted rapidly? In Wild Rose WI wells in the city are drying up. Could it be the result of all the irrigation sprinklers in that area along Hwy 51 irrigating crops in sandy soil? It makes no more sense to grow crops in sandy soil than it does to produce milk in California as it takes 6 times more water in California to make a gallon of milk. Does it make sense that Gov. Walker changed ground water permits so that they are good forever and can never be reviewed? Gov Walker is not ignorant but this short term profit mentality is reprehensible. How about the arrogance of Sen Tom Tiffany and the Republican legislature to relax clean water standards for mines so that mining profits are high and the Wisconsin gains next to nothing but long term water contamination? How about the 30 mile dead zone in Green Bay? Should that not give us pause to ask what we are doing? And you appear not to condemn a CAFO in Bayfield County one mile from a stream that leads to Lake Superior in 8 miles. I know you know that Lake Superior contamination takes 250 years to recycle.



3. The magazine, like the DNR, also has as a major focus of managing natural resources and protecting the environment. You could hardly find a better or cheaper way of doing it.

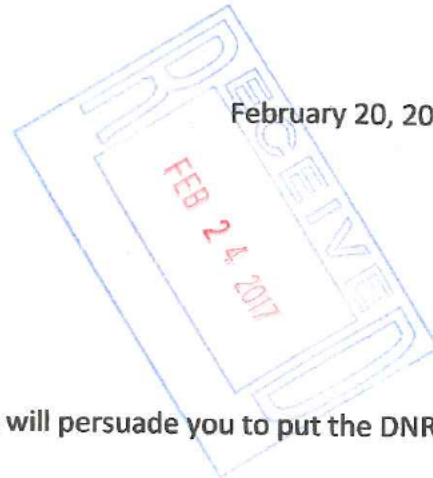

Magazine Options

Option 1-

Assumptions:

- Remove statutory language requiring a Natural Resources Magazine for all Conservation Patron license buyers effective 2018.
- Announce we are taking no new subscriptions as of May 1, 2017
- Last print edition would be June 2017 edition

Actions:

Allow current contracts to expire- Printer expires May 1 2017 (may need to make sure we're covered for June edition). Subscription fulfillment contractor expires June 30, 2017. Design Contractor expires June 1, 2017 and Magazine Consultant expires June 30, 2017.

Projected Subscription Liability costs: \$695,100 for both non-patron and patron license holders Based on a starting estimate of \$500,000 balance in Magazine account- plus \$360,000 in collected patron license fees minus the projected \$274,500 cost of producing 3 issues (Feb-April-June); liability = (\$109,600)*

Option 2: *Times out best w/ the budget process*

Assumptions:

- Remove statutory language requiring a Natural Resources Magazine for all Conservation Patron license buyers effective ~~2018~~
- Announce we are taking no new subscriptions as of July 1, 2017
- Announce that last print edition would be February 2018 (This is just before most Conservation Patrons renew their licenses).

Actions:

We would have to start putting out bids ASAP for the 4 various contracts with stipulations that they are temporary until after the February 2018 magazine edition. Special provisions can be created which would allow us to cancel the contract upon short notice should we find a vendor's services are no longer needed.

Projected Subscription Liability costs: \$308,000 for both non-patron and patron license holders Based on a starting estimate of \$500,000 balance in Magazine account plus \$360,000 in collected patron license fees from previous year-minus the \$549,000 projected cost of producing magazines until 02/01/2018; liability = \$3,000 •

Option3: *E-magazine (spirit... but not necessarily meeting expectations)*

If the legislative mandate is not removed we could try to go to an online newsletter type "magazine" that would fit the spirit of the mandate. This would be emailed to the subscriber list but runs the risk of not satisfying the customer in that they won't be getting exactly what they think they are paying for with their subscription.

The contracts could then be allowed to expire. As an FYI- from July 1, 2016 until present we have paid:

Subscription contractor- \$59,232.58/Printer- \$75,350.56/Design Contractor-\$25,000 and the Consultant \$4,360. These costs are figured into the cost-per-issue production costs mentioned in Options 1 & 2.

Option 4:

Keep producing the magazine as is. This would mean filling at least one of the two FTE magazine positions currently vacant in order to maintain the quality of magazine expected by subscribers.

We would have to start putting the 4 contracts out for bid ASAP since the expire starting in May 2017.

This option however, means we continue a project that does not meet our core mission or work of protecting our natural resources. We are not in the magazine publishing business. Currently we must rely on freelance writers who produce nice warm and friendly stories but know nothing about our work at DNR and can't be relied on to carry our message. We also rely heavily on staff who volunteer to write for the magazine on work time but this takes away valuable staff time that can be put to better use on core work.


We understand that funding for the *Wisconsin Natural Resources* magazine may be eliminated in the next state budget. We hope that you will reconsider this action.

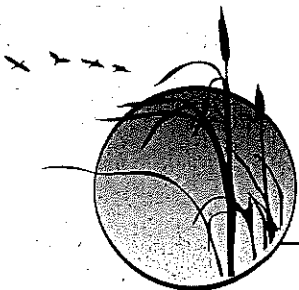

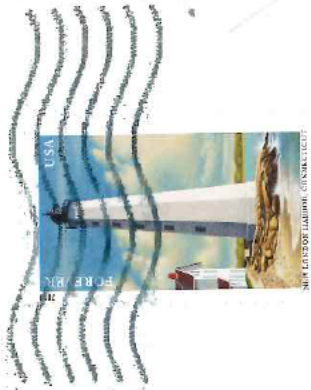

Just reading this last issue heightened my awareness of ground water issues, our delightful lighthouses, Foulds Creek Natural Area, and unusual Wisconsin recipes.


Even if one were to skim the magazine, the photographs are worth more than the subscription price. In fact, I frequently used the pictures when teaching elementary school.
