### April 2017 Pennsylvania Registered Voter Survey

### **Key Findings:**

1. As Donald Trump reaches 100 days as the 45<sup>th</sup> President of the United States a majority (54%) of Pennsylvania registered voters disapprove of the way he his handling his job.

2. While a majority (51%) of registered voters in the Keystone State see President Trump as a strong leader, less than 1 out of 3 believe the President to be honest and trustworthy.

3. Over half (52%) of registered voters in the Commonwealth do not think that President Trump can manage the government effectively.

4. A majority (51%) of Pennsylvania's registered voters indicated confidence that President Trump can keep the United States safe, but most are uneasy about Trump's handling of the situation in Syria (51%) and North Korea's nuclear program (55%)

5. Most (54%) of the state's registered voters think that the U.S. Congress should investigate whether or not there was contact between the Russian government and the Trump campaign in 2016.

6. Pennsylvania registered voters are divided on the performance of Governor Tom Wolf with 40% approving of his work as governor, 35% disapproving and 24% unsure of how to rate the first term Democrat's work as the Commonwealth's chief executive.

7. The state's voters are also very divided on the work of United Stares Senator Pat Toomey. After securing a second term in last November's election Senator Toomey's work is approved of by 36% of registered voters compared to 34% disproving and 31 % offering no opinion of the Republican's job performance.

8. Pennsylvania's Senior United States Senator Bob Casey Jr. draws mixed reviews from the state's voters with about a third (34%) approving of his work, a quarter (25%) disapproving of his efforts, and the remainder (41%) offering no opinion on the second term Democrat's work in the Senate.

#### **Methodological Statement**

The following report contains the results of a telephone survey of 406 registered voters in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania between April 19 and 26, 2017. Respondents were interviewed in English on both land lines (158) and cell phones (248) by the staff of the Muhlenberg College Institute of Public Opinion (MCIPO) in Allentown, Pennsylvania on the Institute's Computer Aided Telephone Interviewing (CATI) system. With a randomly selected sample of 406 respondents the margin of error for the surveys is +/- 6% at a 95% level of confidence. Margins of error for questions with smaller sample size will be larger. In addition to sampling error, one should consider that question wording and other fielding issues can introduce error or bias into survey results. The sample data has been weighted by gender and party to reflect those characteristics as reported by the Pennsylvania Secretary of State. The calculation of sampling error takes into account design effects due to the weighting identified above. In order to reach a representative sample of adult Pennsylvanians both land lines and cell phones are called up to 5 times. The response rate for this survey as calculated using the American Association of Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) RRII formula is 8%. Due to rounding the totals provided in the frequency report may not total 100%. The survey instrument (presented in its entirety below) was designed by Dr. Christopher P. Borick of the MCIPO is conjunction with the staff of the Morning Call. The survey was funded exclusively by the Morning Call and the MCIPO.
