2 AGO.. RIDER STRUCK UBER DRIVERS CAR AND CAUSED DAMAGER.. (sic)

The suspects were described as:

2 WM AND 2 WF.. UNK DESC

The involved vehicle was described as a grey-colored 2007 Toyota Avalon.

Officer Jerome and I arrived at 0226 hours. We located the Avalon, with WA plate place, stopped near the west curb in the 5700 block of 20th Ave NW with its hazard flashers on. This vehicle was registered to the place. The vehicle was occupied by the located (hereafter "the bull"), who stepped out to contact us as we approached.

stated the following:

who drives for the Uber ridesharing application, picked up two white males and two white females who appeared to be a family from 222 NW Market St. Their listed destination was 183 8th Ave NW in Shoreline, WA. As he started the trip, he was notified the trip had been cancelled in the Uber application. This meant if he continued the trip, he would not be paid. asked the riders to request another ride in the application. They offered cash, but he is not allowed by Uber's rules to accept cash. stopped the car in the 5800 block of 20th Ave NW so the passengers would alight. The oldest male in the group, who believed was the father, kicked the outside of the rear of the passenger side of the vehicle, causing a dent. A woman who believed was the father's wife was asking him not to do that. appeared to be the daughter also was begging her father to stop. was consistent with a kick. then drove away to escape, stopping here, a block to the south. Everyone in the vehicle was wearing suits. The same man who kicked the car also spat on wall's head and the back of the driver's seat while sitting behind . The spit did land on . The young man with

I observed several droplets of apparently fresh-looking saliva on the back of the driver's headrest. On the body of the vehicle in the location indicated, there was a roughly foot-sized dent, scrape-marks, and displacement of dust, appearing to indicate that the damage was fresh The driver wiped what appeared to be fluid off the right side of his head as we spoke.

Officer Jerome photographed the saliva and the damage. I gave a North Precinct business card with my name and serial number and the incident number.

A computer return on the family's destination address showed three residents

Officer Jerome and I proceeded to the Shoreline address with permission from Sergeant Street, arriving at approximately 0247 hours. As we drove by the residence we saw lights on inside, and it appeared people were in the foyer. Officer Jerome and I approached the residence and knocked on the door. for "Sigurd," who I estimated was most likely to be the person who had committed the assault and property destruction. A woman, who we believe was was a went out of view, apparently to go speak with Hansen, and a young man who Hansen later stated was his son-in-law, who we believe to be (based on matching his appearance to a tagged photo on Hansen's publically available Facebook page), came to speak to me in the doorway. was heavily intoxicated. He informed me he did not want me to come inside the residence. I asked what happened with the Uber driver. For some reason he told me he was inside the house, which I could see. He then told me "we" were in an Uber and the driver stated the ride was cancelled and kicked them out of the car "in such an abrupt manner." He refused to say who was in the vehicle with him. He stated they had lost a cell phone, and so someone volunteered to order the Uber for them before the ride was cancelled. He denied that anyone offered the driver cash.

After a few minutes, Hansen came outside the doorway. He walked right up to me and shook my hand. I introduced myself and Officer Jerome. I explained why we were there. He asked, "What's the Uber guy?" He said he did not talk to an Uber guy and did not care about an Uber guy. I explained we were here to hear his side of the story. He asked, "What story?" He was obviously intoxicated. He vociferously declared that he did not know what I was talking about, that he got a ride from "an Uber guy, his name is took me home, we're here, we had Norwegian Independence Day, everybody's happy, I've got my family home, we're safe and sound, that's it!"

I asked if there had been another confrontation with an Uber driver in a Toyota Avalon. He said, "Nope! So, no is no! That means we're done!" He clapped his hands conclusively. I explained that we were not done, and to come with me. He tried to walk inside his house. I told him he was not free to go and put out my arm to restrain him. I told him several times to "Stop!" He briefly continued trying to enter the door of his house. Officer Jerome assisted me in pulling him away from the door. He then resisted our attempts and commands to place his hands behind his back. After a few seconds he stopped resisting so strenuously, and we were able to handcuff him.

He was compliant thereafter. He apologized for not stopping when I told him to.

Officer Jerome and I escorted Hansen to the front of our patrol vehicle.

Communications contacted , who responded to the scene. While we waited, I advised Hansen of his Miranda Rights. When I asked if he understood his rights, he said he did.

Hansen stated he supposed he had "to pay the piper." He stated his son-in-law offered the Uber driver \$100 to take them home, but the driver would not accept it because it didn't "jive" on his paperwork. I asked Hansen if he had spit on the driver. Hansen asked if it would be in his best interest to answer that. I told Hansen I was not a lawyer. Hansen stated the driver must have been stupid for not taking the \$100. Hansen stated he thought he kicked the vehicle's tire. After I told him there was a dent, Hansen stated, "Of course I'll pay for it!"

Officer Jerome spoke with , and informed him the person we had detained may or may not be the person who damaged the car. He advised clothing could have changed. positively identified the family as the family involved in the disturbance, and also positively identified Hansen as the man who damaged his vehicle, with 100% certainty.

came over and took custody of the watch Hansen was wearing on his left wrist, which Hansen stated was worth \$46,000.

I seated Hansen in the back seat of my patrol vehicle and seat-belted him. other woman and all declined to provide their information for the report, and also declined my invitation to provide their side of the story.

Officer Jerome drove Hansen and me to North Precinct, where Sergeant Street screened the arrest. We transported Hansen to King County Jail, and booked him for Assault and Property Destruction.
