**SUPPLEMENT TO UNITED STATES’ MOTION FOR REVOCATION OF RELEASE
AND FOR COMPETENCY SCREENING AND HEARING**

The United States respectfully submits this Supplement to its Motion for Revocation of Release and for Competency Screening and Hearing (Dkt. 7).

In the early morning hours today, defendant Bryan Moles entered Washington, D.C., apparently to purchase and consume drugs. This conduct constitutes additional violations of the defendant’s conditions of release, because he was ordered to stay out of Washington, D.C., except to attend court hearings and to meet with his attorney, and to refrain from unlawful drug use.

Law enforcement has identified a Facebook page operated by the defendant, and recent photographs uploaded to the Facebook page include images of the defendant in Washington, D.C., this morning, engaging in social activities involving the use of narcotics. Photographs uploaded to the defendant’s Facebook page also include disturbing images of recent newspaper headlines covering the shooting of a Congressman in Virginia yesterday; the newspapers were placed in the photographs next to a non-descript black bag with unknown contents. Another photograph uploaded to the Facebook page includes a message from the defendant, urging the

reader to, “Please watch Fox News this afternoon for exciting updates,” apparently referring to the possibility that the defendant will be incarcerated. Another photograph uploaded to the Facebook page references a popular song called “Jeremy”; a famous music video connected to this song features a suicide by firearm. The Facebook photographs are attached as Exhibit 1.

Law enforcement has also learned that the individual who agreed to host the defendant at his home in Georgia has rescinded that offer because he can no longer accept responsibility in light of the defendant’s mental state and drug use. He wrote the following to the Probation Officer:

I wanted to let you know that we arrived to my hotel in Alexander, VA [sic] a few mins ago. However, he’s refused to stay with me and caught a cab toward downtown DC to meet with some friends he met last week when he was here.

...

Unfortunately, I’ve also informed his attorney that I am no longer interested in allowing him to reside with me in GA because his behavior and demeanor has deteriorated considerably. . . .

Law enforcement has learned that close friends and family members of the defendant believe that the defendant needs to be arrested and provided court-ordered mental health services on an inpatient basis.

Detention is appropriate under these circumstances, under 18 U.S.C. Sections 3142 and 3148.

The "Resist" movement spawned a shooting rampage Wednesday morning that targeted Republican lawmakers — an attack by a self-declared anti-Trump crusader that underscored the poisonous tenor of modern American politics. While police were silent about a motive, the Republicans who came under fire as they practiced for a charity baseball game said they were certain they were targets because of their political party. And the gunman's biography backs them. The shooter opened fire at a baseball field in Alexandria where the Republican team had been practicing for weeks, seriously wounding House Majority Whip Steve Scalise, a congressional staffer, a lobbyist and two U.S. Capitol Police officers from Mr. Scalise's security detail. The officers returned fire and killed the gunman, identified as 66-year-old James T. Hodgkinson of Belleville, Illinois. His brother said Hodgkinson was upset about the election of President Trump and traveled to the Washington area weeks ago to protest. As leaders in both parties appealed for national unity and political civility, some supporters of Mr. Trump said the shooting by a supporter of Sen. Bernard Sanders' White House bid was a likely consequence of an increasingly hostile "Resistance" crusade against the president.

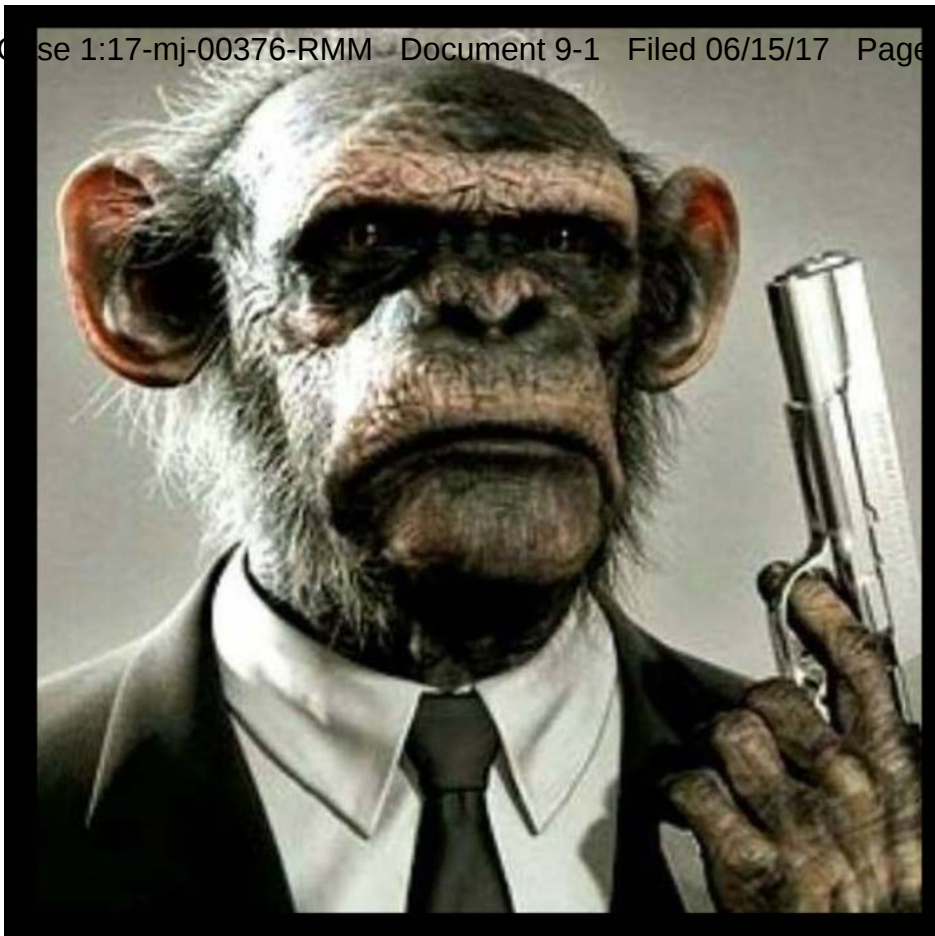

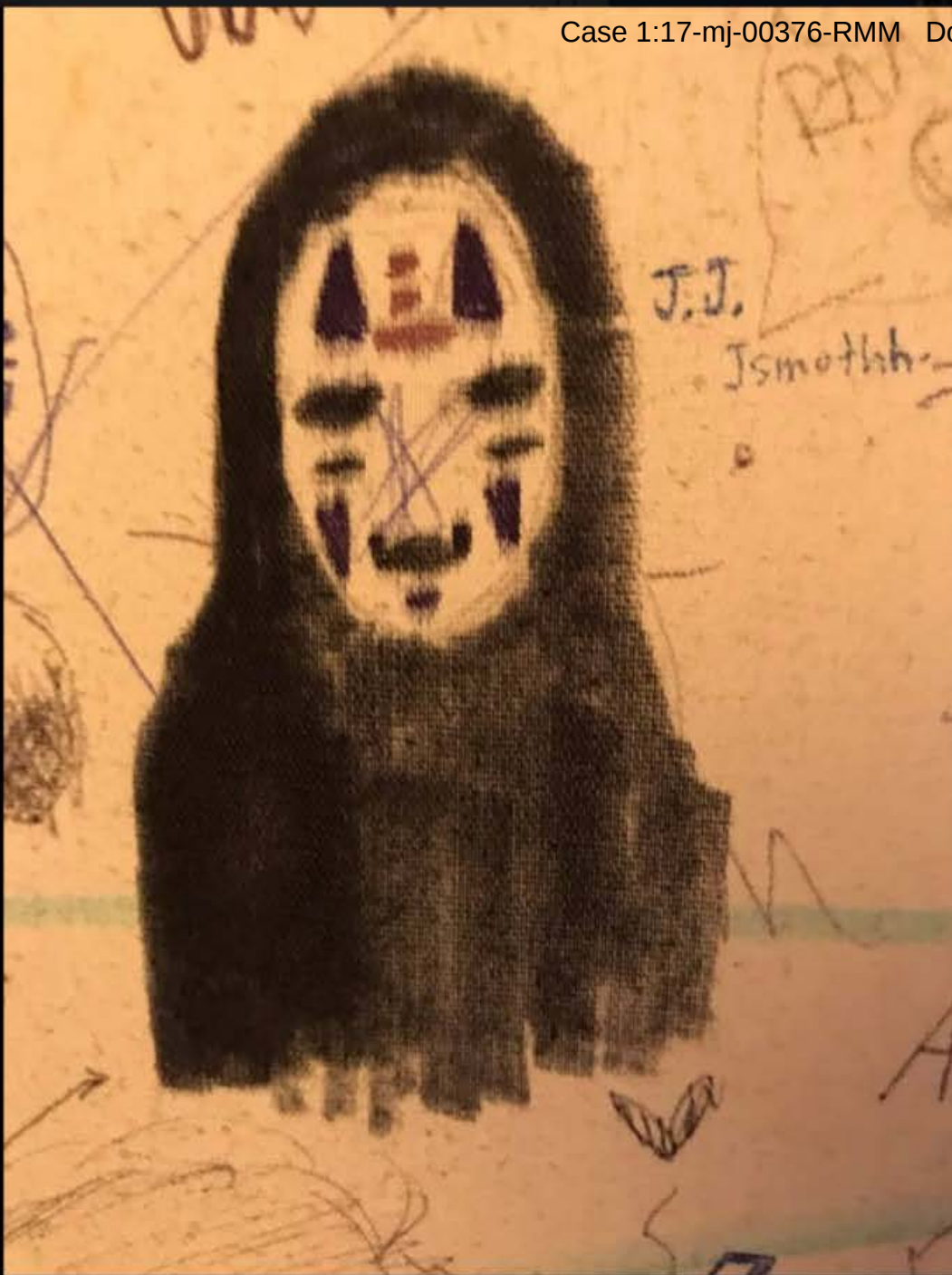
