

Public hearing set for Lottery finalist's private manager proposal

CHICAGO (Aug. 4, 2017) – The Illinois Lottery issued a notice for a public hearing regarding the selection of a new private manager, a significant step in its procurement. The hearing details are below.

The purpose of this public hearing is to provide an opportunity for Camelot Illinois – the finalist in the Illinois Lottery's solicitation for a private manager – to present an overview of its proposal for private management of the Lottery and to allow the public to comment on the proposal.

All interested parties are invited to attend the public hearing and will be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard.

The state endeavors to select a new private manager that shares the Lottery's goals of increasing profits to the state, responsibly broadening its player base, introducing new technology and innovation, ensuring responsiveness to public needs and concerns, and eliminating conflicts of interest.

After the public hearing, the Lottery and Camelot Illinois will seek to finalize contract details and, if successful, a Notice of Award will be posted on the Illinois Procurement Bulletin. At that time, a 14-day protest period begins, and, within seven days, the procurement file will be available for public inspection. If no protests are submitted, or after all timely protests are resolved, a contract could be executed.

About the Illinois Lottery
