Enforcement: What is Proof of Payment?

 Proof of Payment means that passengers must present valid fare media, anywhere in the paid area of the system, upon request by authorized transit personnel.

Enforcement: Why Proof of Payment?

- BART opened in 1972 as a "barrier" system
 - BART "barriers" are physically easy to circumvent
 - ✗ Low railings
 - ▼ Fare gates over, under or through
 - ▼ Swing gates provide a clear path
 - Enforcement can only occur at "barrier" location
 - × BPD must directly observe OR
 - Employee or rider must:
 - Witness and be willing to place offender under Citizens Arrest; and
 - BPD must be nearby; and
 - Offender must be contacted
- In short, without proof of payment, fare evaders are only concerned at the brief moments when they evade into or out of the system

Proof of Payment Ordinance for BART

- Extensive public outreach before implementation on 1/1/18.
- Under the BART ordinance, Proof of Payment citations will be a non-criminal.
- Passengers inside the paid area, who are unable to provide proof of payment, will be issued a civil citation.
 - Warnings are an option available to CSO's/Officers.
- Proof of Payment citations will be processed through our existing civil process for parking citations; this includes an appeal process.
- Administrative penalty for Proof of Payment violation: \$120 for adults, \$60 for minors.
 - SB 614 (Hertzberg effective January 1, 2018) requires that minors and persons who provide satisfactory evidence of an inability to pay must be given an option of community service in lieu of the Civil Fine.

Proof of Payment Inspections

- Inspection protocol will be fair, non-biased and a combination of data driven and rotational.
- Police Officers and/or Community Service Officers will perform inspections within the paid area of the stations and on board trains where entire cars can feasibly be checked.
- Officers will activate mobile video recorders and continuously record proof of payment inspection operations.
- Officers will progress from one person to the next closest person, not skipping any persons in between.

Enforcement Audits

- Quarterly report on citations
- To ensure that enforcement activities are fair and unbiased, body camera videos of BPD Officers and CSOs engaged in proof of payment activities will be randomly selected for analysis and reporting on a monthly basis.
- Above will be available for the Office of the Independent Police Auditor.
