On 18 October 1985 at 0050 hours, the undersigned, Det. William R. Baker, Car 502, was contacted in the Violent Crimes office by the radio room and advised that one of the T.A.P. units was holding a van which he believed was filled with stolen property on River Road at Ohio St. and that he was requesting that a C.I.D. unit be dispatched to that location to assist in the investigation.

The undersigned, along with Det. R. Owen and Sgt. M. Doughty, responded to the scene and met with Sgt. R. Johnson, Car 750, who had made the initial stop on the suspect vehicle.

STATEMENT FROM SGT. R. JOHNSON

In his statement regarding the incident, Sgt. Johnson advised that he had been checking the park while on routine patrol and had discovered a 1982 Cadillac, Ky. '85 NPF-139, parked on the west end of the park, which had had all the wheels removed from it. As he was examining the vehicle, he observed a red van leaving the park at a high rate of speed which disregarded a stop sign at the park entrance and River Road.

Sgt. Johnson then attempted to stop the vehicle with his emergency equipment, but the vehicle did not stop and a high-speed pursuit ensued westbound on River Road which finally ended with the assistance of an L.P.D. unit driven by LPD Off. R. Howell at River Road and Ohio St.

The driver of the vehicle was placed under arrest by Sgt. Johnson

for the traffic charges and the interior of the van was examined.

Sgt. Johnson and Off. Howell observed four (4) Cadillac wheels and tires in the rear of the van along with a large orange vehicle jack and a ladies' purse. Thinking the purse to have been stolen from the Cadillac, Sgt. Johnson checked it for identification and found a wallet containing the identification of Sharon E. Stubbins.

Also found in the purse were a set of Cadillac ignition and trunk keys on a separate keyring with some other automotive keys.

The driver of the van, identified as Leonard E. Watkins, was read and explained his constitutional rights by Sgt. Johnson and indicated that he understood those rights. He told Sgt. Johnson that he had made a bet with the owner of the car that he could steal it without the owner knowing about it.

SUSPECT VEHICLE (1974 Ford Van)

The van containing the stolen wheels was then examined by the undersigned and Sgt. Doughty for additional evidence and was then photographed both inside and out by the undersigned. These photos will be included in this case file upon their return from the lab.

The van was found to have four (4) wheels and tires in the rear storage area along with a ladies' purse containing the identification already described. The van was impounded and towed to Tony's Wrecker Service on Lagrange Road with the property left inside.

VANDALIZED VEHICLE (1982 Cadillac)

While the van was being processed, Det. R. Owen went to the location of the 1982 Cadillac in Cox's Park. He advised us by radio that the Cadillac had been doused with gasoline inside probably in preparation for burning the car. (See Det. Owen's supplement for details of this examination)

Sgt. Doughty and I then went to the location of the Cadillac and the vehicle was dusted for latent fingerprints. However, due to absorption of oil from the gasoline fumes inside the car, no identifiable prints were lifted. The vehicle was photographed by Det. Owen and these photos will be made a part of this file.

A plastic, one gallon bottle was discovered sitting on the ground approximately twenty (20) feet from the front of the vehicle and this bottle was found to contain gasoline.

The keys removed from the ladies' purse found in the van were found to fit the Cadillac. The collar around the ignition switch had been knocked forcibly from the steering column in an effort to make it appear that the car had been stolen without keys, but no evidence of the vehicle having been "hot-wired" was found. The front seat of the vehicle was also found to be in the position furthest up to the steering wheel indicating that the driver had been a smaller person.

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10/22/85

Papers found inside the vehicle indicated that it was registered to Danny Ray Johnson at 2902 Palmetto Circle. When no answer could be gotten at the listed telephone number, a Jeffersontown P.D. unit was dispatched to his address, but no one was found to be home.

Det. C. Skaggs, Car 533, had been called to the scene by Sgt. Doughty to assist in the investigation and he had the Cadillac impounded and towed to Tony's Wrecker Service for further investigation.

While still at the scene in Cox's Park, Leonard Watkins indicated that he wished to give a statement concerning the incident and said that a woman had set up the destruction of the car for another man who wished to collect the insurance on it. He stated that the woman was Sharon Stubbins whose identification we had previously found in the purse inside Watkins' van. He stated that she had run from the park on foot when Sgt. Johnson had arrived and he didn't know where she was at that time.

ARREST OF SHARON E. STUBBINS

The scene at Cox's Park was cleared at approximately 0245 hours and Det. Skaggs transported Watkins from the park in route to the office. As he left the park, he contacted radio and advised that he was going to stop a yellow vehicle on River Road which Watkins had told him contained the Stubbins subject.

Det. Owen, Sgt. Doughty, and I also responded to the location where he had the vehicle stopped. This vehicle was found to contain both Sharon E. Stubbins and Maria Watkins, wife of Leonard Watkins.

Sharon Stubbins was Mirandized at the scene and was then transported to the Violent Crimes office by the undersigned and Det. Doughty. Maria Watkins was not placed under arrest, but agreed to follow the police units to headquarters.

Stubbins denied any knowledge or participation in the incident and stated that she had just been riding around with Watkin's wife who had been baby-sitting for her while she was out earlier.

After being re-Mirandized by the undersigned at the Violent Crimes office, Sharon Stubbins indicated that she wished to talk with an attorney before answering any questions and was allowed to call her attorney in New Albany. She then contacted Mr. Geoffrey Morris here in Louisville and requested that he come to headquarters.

While waiting for Mr. Morris to arrive, Stubbins orally indicated that she was acquainted with Danny Ray Johnson, owner of the vehicle, and that she had dated him for the past three months. She gave this as the reason for her having a set of keys to his car inside her purse.

She stated that Watkins had given her a ride to the Holiday Inn on Zorn Ave. where she had been going to meet a male subject for a prostitution date. She stated that she had backed out at the last minute and had gotten a ride home (as far as the bridge) from the Holiday Inn.

INTERVIEW WITH MARIA WATKINS

I then interviewed Maria Watkins, b/f/25, who had been driving the car containing Sharon Stubbins and was the wife of Leonard Watkins.

Mrs. Watkins stated that she would be willing to give a taped statement regarding what little she knew about what was going on and this taped statement was taken at 0340 hours.

In her taped statement, Maria Watkins advised that she had been called by Sharon Stubbins on the 17th at approximately 1900 hours and asked if she would babysit Stubbins' infant while Stubbins went to church. She had agreed and had gone to Stubbins house about 1930 hours.

She said that she had received a call from Stubbins at about 2200 hours and had been told not to leave the answering machine on because "Danny" might call and she was to take a message.

She stated that at approximately 0210 hours, Stubbins had returned home and told her that Leonard was possibly in trouble in Louisville and that she was going to call the Jefferson County Jail to see if he had been arrested. Stubbins called the jail and was told Leonard had not been turned over to them at that time so she told Maria that she wanted to go back to Louisville to look for him.

They dressed the babies and Maria drove Stubbins back to Louisville in her yellow Mercury. She stated that she was surprised that the Mercury was at her house since her husband had driven it away earlier that night and she said that he had evidently returned without her knowing and picked up his Ford van.

She said that Stubbins directed her to River Road and the Cox's Park area and told her that there was probably a car with no wheels on fire in the park where Leonard was supposed to be. When they arrived at the park, Stubbins said she saw the car and the police and told her to drive on. It was at this time that they were stopped by the police on River Road.

STATEMENT FROM SHARON E. STUBBINS

Sharon Stubbins was allowed to confer with her attorney, Mr. Geoffrey Morris, who had come to headquarters at her request, and later advised that she would be willing to give a statement concerning the incident.

A taped suspect statement was taken from Stubbins in the presence of her attorney at 0515 hours after she was again Mirandized.

In her statement regarding the offense, Stubbins said that she had been dating Danny Ray Johnson for some time and that he had indicated to her that he was having trouble making the payments on his Cadillac on which he owed \$11000.00. He told her that the car also needed about \$5000.00 in repair work and asked her if she knew anyone who would help him get rid of the car.

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Stubbins said that she told Johnson that she would try to help him and approached Leonard Watkins for assistance. Watkins agreed to help her destroy the vehicle and said it would cost Johnson \$200.00.

She said that she told Johnson about this and he agreed to pay the \$200.00 for getting rid of the car. Johnson gave her the keys to the car and was told by Stubbins to leave it in the church parking lot on Floyd Street after church. He said this was fine and that since it was his birthday, he would go out with one of the other ministers in the church.

He drove Stubbins to the First National Bank on Bardstown Road and withdrew \$200 in cash from the automated teller machine there which he then gave to Stubbins. Stubbins had parked her car at the Howard Johnsons on Jefferson Street and Johnson returned her to that location to pick it up. She then followed Johnson to his apartment in Jeffersontown where he removed his personal property from the car and took it into his apartment.

Stubbins then drove to the Tree Tops apartments in Indiana where she had arranged to meet Leonard Watkins. She left her car there and drove with Watkins to the church where she used the keys given her by Johnson to remove the car from the lot. They drove back into Indiana and got a bottle of gas and looked for a place to remove the wheels from the vehicle which Johnson said they could also have as a bonus.

Not finding a suitable place, they drove back into Kentucky and parked the car in Cox's Park where Watkins removed the wheels and placed them in his van. He then doused the interior of the car with gasoline in preparation for setting it on fire. It was at this point when Sgt. Johnson drove into the park and Stubbins ran from the scene on foot.

She went to the Holiday Inn on Zorn Ave. where she found a ride to Indiana and returned to her home. She told Maria Watkins what had happened and got her to take her back to Louisville to look for Leonard. It was here that she was arrested.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Stubbins was found to have \$80 in cash in her possession which she said had been given her by Danny Johnson. She stated that she had given \$100 of the money to Leonard Watkins and \$20 to Maria Watkins for baby-sitting. This money, along with the keys to the Cadillac found in her purse were seized and placed into the property room.

In reference to the above report, on 10-18-85 at 0100 hours, the undersigned was contacted by the radio room and advised that several units had requested an auto theft car at Cox's Park.

Upon arriving at that location, the undersigned was advised by Sgt. R. Johnson that while on TAP patrol, he had observed a 1982 Cadillac, license number NPF-139, parked at the far western edge of Cox's Park. The wheels and tires had been removed from the vehicle and it was sitting on its frame. He also advised that the interior had been soaked with gas. At approximately the same time, Sgt. Johnson stated that he saw a Ford van, red in color, leave the park at a high rate of speed. Sgt. Johnson chased the van and was able to stop it, with assistance from the Louisville Division of Police at River Road and Ohio Street. The driver of the van was found to be Leonard E. Watkins. Four wheels and tires, along with a large floor jack was found inside the van. A purse containing a set of car keys, along with several items of identification belonging to a Sharon Stubbins was also found. Watkins was charged with several traffic charges and taken back to Cox's Park. His vehicle was photographed and towed to Tony's wrecker service.

A registration check of the 1982 Cadillac's license tag, NPF-139, showed the vehicle to be registered to a Danny Ray Johnson, 2902 Palmetto Circle, Louisville, KY. A check for stolen revealed that the vehicle had not been reported stolen, at that time.

Leonard Watkins was interviewed at the scene and gave the undersigned an oral statement that he and a B/F by the name of Sharon Stubbins had picked up the vehicle in Louisville at a church parking lot and had taken it to Cox's Park to burn, so that the owner could collect the insurance money. Watkins stated that when the police vehicle had first pulled into the park that he had gotten into his van and attempted to leave and that Sharon Stubbins had run across the open field and he did not currently know where she was. The 1982 Cadillac was photographed and then towed to Tony's wrecker service storage lot.

Watkins was placed in the undersigned's police vehicle for transportation to the Hall of Justice. At River Road and Zorn Avenue a yellow late model Mercury passed us going East on River Road. The undersigned was advised by Watkins that the vehicle appeared to be his. The above yellow Mercury was stopped at River Road and the entrance of Cox's Park and found to contain Leonard's wife, a Maria Watkins, and Sharon Stubbins. Maria Watkins was advised of the nature of our investigation and asked to follow the undersigned to the Hall of Justice. Sharon Stubbins was taken into custody and transported to the Hall of Justice.

At the County Police Headquarters, Leonard Watkins gave the undersigned, a taped statement stating that he had been contacted by Sharon Stubbins about burning a 1982 Cadillac that belonged to the minister of her church. He stated that Stubbins had informed him that the owner was having to spend a lot of money on the vehicle and needed to get rid of it. He stated that he did not actually know the owner, but he believed that the owner was Sharon Stubbins' lover. Watkins stated that they went to the Calvary Cathedral Church located at 748 So. Floyd and at that location Stubbins got out of Watkins' vehicle and using a set of keys got into the 1982 Cadillac. Watkins stated that they drove over into Indiana and picked up Watkins' van so that they would have something to haul the tires in. He stated that they stopped in Indiana and got a jug of gas and proceeded to Cox's Park. At Cox's Park, they attempted to burn the vehicle, however, a police vehicle arrived before they could start the fire.

Watkins was charged and placed in Corrections.

Maria Watkins was interviewed by Det. W. Baker and also, gave a taped statement in regards to the information she had about the stolen vehicle and the attempt to burn it. (See Det. Baker's investigative letter contained in this file.)

Upon arrival at headquarters, the undersigned was advised to call Off. Donny Smith of LPD. The undersigned contacted Off. Smith at the Holiday Inn at River Road and Zorn Avenue. He advised that he had picked up a black female earlier in the evening at Zorn and I-71 and had given her a ride to the Kennedy Bridge where she had requested to be let out. Officer Smith described the black female and his description matched Sharon Stubbins. Officer Smith was asked to come to JCPD Headquarters to identify Sharon Stubbins which he agreed to do. Upon arriving at Headquarters, Smith identified Stubbins as the black female he had picked up and dropped off at the Kennedy Bridge.

Sharon Stubbins was interviewed by Det. Baker and after consultation with her attorney, she gave a taped statement in regards to the theft and attempted burning of the above vehicle. (See Det. Baker's investigative letter contained in this file.) A set of keys and \$80.00 cash was taken from Sharon Stubbins and placed in the property room. Stubbins stated that the keys had been given to her by the owner of the vehicle, Danny Johnson, and that the \$80.00 cash was what remained of the cash that Johnson had given

her for disposing of the vehicle.

Sharon Stubbins was charged and placed in Corrections.

Several attempts had been made to contact Danny R. Johnson in regards to the theft and recovery of his vehicle. At approximately 0330 hours, Johnson called the radio room in regards to a message that had been left on his phone recorder. Johnson was transported to County Police Headquarters by Officer M. Stalker.

Danny Johnson was interviewed in regards to his vehicle being stolen by the undersigned. Johnson stated that he had not given anyone permission to drive his vehicle and that it was in fact stolen. Johnson stated that he had left his vehicle parked in the church parking lot at 748 So. Floyd and that he had last seen his vehicle around 2330 hours on 10-17-85. A stolen vehicle report was taken from Johnson. At the time this stolen vehicle report was taken, a truthful statement had not been obtained from Sharon Stubbins. Due to the nature of our investigation and the possibility that we were dealing with an attempted insurance fraud theft, the undersigned asked Johnson if he would remain at police headquarters for further questioning.

After the taped statement was obtained from Sharon Stubbins, Johnson was advised of his rights and questioned further. When confronted with the evidence against him, Johnson gave the undersigned a written statement, admitting that his vehicle had not been stolen and that he had given the keys to his vehicle to Sharon Stubbins and that he knew that she was going to get rid of the vehicle and that he was going to use the insurance payoff to get another vehicle. He stated that he was a minister at the Calvery Cathedral Church and that he knew Sharon Stubbins because she attended that church. But that he did not know and had never met Leonard Watkins.

A comparison of Johnson's car keys were made against the car keys that had been obtained from Sharon Stubbins and they appeared to match.

Johnson also stated that he had taken \$200.00 cash from the money machine at his bank, and had given part of the money to Sharon Stubbins for getting rid of the vehicle.

Johnson was charged and placed in Corrections.

for a lawful purpose, if that burning occurs under circumstances contemplated by this provision as threatening to other persons.

As indicated in the introduction to this chapter, the requirement of "dwelling house" is no longer an element of arson. Its influence on the proposed sections, however, should be apparent. In any case involving the burning of a dwelling, absent some special circumstance, the presence of another person would be a reasonable possibility and treatment of such conduct as the highest degree of arson would be appropriate. The substitution of "building" for "dwelling house" in KRS 513.020 serves only to equate the burning of another type of building which houses persons with the burning of a dwelling.

Arson in the Second Degree: Conviction of the offense defined by KRS 513.030 requires proof of the three basic elements of arson plus one aggravating factor, namely that the defendant intended to damage a building. (As with arson in the first degree, the offense may be committed when a person burns his own building.) In other words, this offense is the same as arson in the first degree except that it need not be established that the defendant knew of the presence or likely presence of another person in the building. Stated differently, arson in the first degree (a Class B felony) is reduced by this provision to arson in the second degree (a Class C felony) if the special threat to person required by KRS 513.020 cannot be shown.

In this section, a defense unavailable for first degree arson is provided for arson in the second degree when the following elements coincide: (i) The defendant was the sole owner of the damaged building or was acting with consent of the owners; and (ii) the defendant's sole intent was to destroy or damage the building for a lawful purpose. Labeling the principle as a "defense" means that a defendant need only raise the issue. The objective of this part of the provision is to allow for the burning of a building as part of a lawful scheme of demolition. It should be noted, however, that the section does not preclude a prosecution under other sections of this code if the defendant's conduct in burning his building *wantonly* endangers the life or property of other persons. It should also be noted that the defense is not available to a person who burns his own building for purposes of defrauding an insurance company or for any other unlawful purpose.

Arson in the Third Degree: This offense, the lowest of the three degrees, is also classified as a felony. The principal difference from the previous two offenses lies in the defendant's state of mind as it relates to the consequences of his act of burning or exploding. For commission of the first two degrees of arson, an offender must consciously desire to cause damage to a building. For arson in the third degree, the requisite damage to a building must be caused *wantonly*. As defined in KRS 501.020, the culpable mental state of wantonness (related to the offense of arson) would require the existence of these factors: (i) a substantial and unjustifiable risk of damage to a building; (ii) a gross deviation from the standard of conduct that a reasonable person would observe; and (iii) a conscious disregard of the aforementioned risk by the defendant. Since an offender must perceive a risk before he can be "wanton," criminal liability for arson will not attach to a "negligently" caused burning or explosion that results in damage to a building.

Subsection (2) of this provision provides a defense to a charge of third degree arson. The defense is intended to preclude criminal sanctions against a person whose wanton conduct has caused injury to no one other than himself or persons for whom he acts. Once again, it should be noted that this defense does not preclude a prosecution under any other section of this code.

513.030 Arson in the second degree

(1) A person is guilty of arson in the second degree when he starts a fire or causes an explosion with intent to destroy or damage a building:

(a) Of another; or

(b) Of his own or of another, to collect or facilitate the collection of insurance proceeds for such loss.

(2) In any prosecution under this section, it is a defense that:

(a) No person other than the defendant had a possessory or proprietary interest in the building, or, if other persons had such an interest, all of them consented to the defendant's conduct; and

(b) The defendant's sole intent was to destroy or damage the building for a lawful purpose.

(3) Arson in the second degree is a Class B felony.

(1) A person is guilty of arson in the third degree if he wantonly causes destruction or damage to a building of his own or of another by intentionally starting a fire or causing an explosion.

513.060 Burning personal property to defraud insurer

(1) A person is guilty of burning personal property to defraud an insurer when, with intent to defraud or injure an insurer, he:

(a) Sets fire to, burns, or causes to be burned; or

(b) Aids, counsels, or procures the burning of any of the goods, wares, merchandise, or other personal property of himself or another, that is insured at the time against loss or damage by fire.

(2) Burning personal property to defraud an insurer is a Class D felony.


