GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

- On Wednesday, February 4, 2015, at 2230 hours, members of the Seventh District received a radio assignment from the Office of Unified Communications for an Aggravated Assault in the 2400 block of Alabama Avenue, Southeast, Washington, D.C. Upon arriving on the scene, members located the victim, later identified as Tracy Jones (46), lying next to a Pepco pole near a bus stop and a vacant group home on the east side of the street with a knife in one of his hands. The victim was suffering from an apparent stab wound to the upper body and was barely conscious and unable to speak. The District of Columbia Fire Department Medic 33 and Engine 25 responded to the scene and began medical intervention. The victim was then transported to Prince George's Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead at 2341 hours by Dr. Ryb.
- An autopsy was conducted and the Maryland Medical Examiner reports the decedent was stabbed once in the chest with a sharp instrument that penetrated the heart. The Medical Examiner ruled the cause of death a stabbing and the manner of death a HOMICIDE.
- Mobile Crime Technicians responded the scene and began to collect evidence. A citizen advised IT observed property in front of an apartment building located at 2435 Ainger Place, Southeast. Officers responded and recovered papers and personal items that bore the name of the decedent on a small ledge in front of the building. Technicians conducted a secondary canvass of the area the next morning and located a black leather case with a broken handle in a dumpster adjacent to the 2400 block of Ainger Place, Southeast. A relative of the decedent informed police that IT last saw the decedent on the morning of February 3, 2015, and that the decedent carried a black leather case with a broken handle.


Statements of Witness 1

4. At approximately 10:26 p.m., a witness [hereinafter referred to as W1] called 911 and explained that it was with the victim, who was lying down by the bus stop and needed an ambulance. W1 told the call taker that the decedent was jumped about 10 minutes earlier, that there were about 8 "black Caucasian males," that one was wearing a red jacket, one was wearing a black jacket and one was wearing a blue jacket, and that they fled on foot toward Ainger Place, Southeast. While on the phone with the 911 call-taker, W1 was able to flag down Officer Richard Wince who briefly questioned W1. W1 told Officer Wince that the decedent was jumped by a group of individuals and that one of them was wearing a red jacket.

5. On the scene, Officer Charles Weems interviewed W1. W1 told Officer Weems that when IT got off the Metro bus in the 2400 block of Alabama Avenue, Southeast, IT observed two people striking the decedent with their hands. W-1 also said that the decedent ran across the street and fell to the ground. W1 told Officer Weems IT did not see either suspect stab the decedent. W1 said the suspects fled down Ainger Place, Southeast. W1 described one of the men (hereinafter referred to as S1) as a black male, 21 to 22 years old, slim build, 5'6" to 5'8" tall, wearing a red jacket, red skull cap, black Helly Hansen pants. W1 described the second man [hereinafter referred to as S2] as a black male, slim build, 21 to 22 years old, wearing a black skull cap, black Helly Hansen jacket and black pants.

6. W1 then traveled with police to the Homicide Branch. While in the transport vehicle, W1 told a detective that IT saw a black male in a red jacket stabbing the decedent.

7. At the Homicide Branch, W1 gave a videotaped interview. During this interview, W1 stated that IT got off the W4 bus and observed the decedent walking north up Alabama Avenue on the west side of the street, toward the intersection with Ainger Place, Southeast. It also saw S1 and S2 walking south down Alabama Avenue toward the same intersection. At the intersection, S1 and S2 ran south and started hitting and punching the victim, who was on the south side of the intersection. The victim ran northeast across Alabama Avenue. S1 and S2 ran back to the bus stop on the north side of the intersection, and then west down Ainger Place. After they got partway down Ainger Place, S1 and S2 jumped over a fence on the perimeter of the Kingdom Hall Church and cut back toward Alabama Avenue. They started chasing the decedent again, who was still in the middle of Alabama Avenue. Right before they got to the decedent, W1 heard a clicking sound and saw the decedent make a defensive flicking motion in their direction. W1 then saw S1 pull something, flick it, and make a poking motion at the decedent. W1 saw the decedent fall down in the street and then get up and go over to the Pepco pole by the group home, where he fell again. S1 and S2 ran west on Ainger Place again. When W1 went over to the decedent, IT observed a knife in one of the decedent's hands. When asked if there was anyone else out there other than the decedent, W1, S1 and S2, W1 said IT did not see anybody else out there.



During the videotaped interview, W1 described S1 as having a brown-skinned complexion, 20-22 years old, wearing a red Helly Hansen jacket, black Helly Hansen pants, a red Helly Hansen hat, and a little taller than S2. W1 described S2 as having a brown-skinned complexion, 20-22 years old, wearing a black Helly Hansen hat and black Helly Hansen clothing. W1 described the hat as one that could be pulled over S2's face but stated that IT could see S2's face. W1 initially stated IT had never seen them around the area before, but later said that IT had seen "the one in the Helly Hansen" come out from the Langston Lane apartment complex before and that he had dreads that were not very long. Your affiant notes (as indicated below) that she interviewed S-1a week later and saw a nappy bush hairstyle. After the videotaped interview, W1 spoke to your affiant in a conference room. W1 added that S2 was wearing black boots or tennis shoes. W1 also told your affiant that IT saw S1 and S2 in the McDonald's on Good Hope Road around 5:30 or 6:00 p.m. that same night.

9. W1 provided an alias during ITS 911 call and ITS February 4 interview. At the conclusion of W1's interview on February 4, 2015, a WALES check revealed IT had an outstanding parole violation warrant and IT was taken into custody and processed.

10. On February 25, 2015, W1 was interviewed again, at which time W1 was serving a sentence related to ITS parole violation. W1 stated IT provided ITS street name on February 4 to avoid being arrested on ITS outstanding parole/probation warrant. W1 stated that before the incident, IT boarded the 92 bus at Naylor and Good Hope Road, Southeast, in front of the Popeye's. IT stated that after IT got off the bus at the intersection of Ainger Place and Alabama Avenue, IT saw a group of 6-7 black males, possibly juveniles, walking south down Alabama Avenue toward Ainger Place. At the intersection, 4-5 of them turned right down Ainger Place. S1 and S2 stayed at the corner. When the decedent got to the southwest corner of the intersection, S1 and S2 stopped in the street. S1 and S2 then each struck the decedent. The decedent ran across Alabama Avenue. S1 and S2 ran north back toward the bus stop on the west side of the street. S1 and S2 then ran over to the decedent and all three fought in the street. W1 said that during the fight, S1 pulled something from his person and it looked like he was sticking or stabbing the decedent. W1 also reported hearing a click and seeing the decedent's hand make a flicking motion. W1 said the decedent fell in the street and then crawled to the sidewalk. W-1 said S-1 and S-2 fled down Ainger Place and jumped the fence on the perimeter of the Kingdom Hall church. W1 said that both S1 and S2 had thin facial hair, possibly goatees. W1 stated it did not see the suspects take anything from the decedent. During this statement, W1 describes the entire group as appearing as juveniles (and none of them as looking 20-22 years old).



11. On February 25, W1 also stated IT saw the same group hanging out in front of the McDonald's. First, IT saw S1 and S2. Then IT saw the rest of the group come up Good Hope Road from the direction of the barber shop. W-1 said IT did not see the two groups interact. W1 said everyone from the group other than S1 or S2 left during the assault.
12. W1 was re-interviewed on October 23, 2015, while still serving a sentence related to ITS parole violation. W1 stated IT did not recall stating during the February 4 interview that after S1 and S2 initially struck the victim, they ran west down Ainger Place, then turned back, jumped the fence on the perimeter of the Kingdom Hall church, and then assaulted the decedent again. W1 stated this description of events was incorrect and the description provided on February 25 (of the suspects running to the northwest corner and then over to the decedent in the street) was correct. W1 stated IT was nervous during the videotaped interview because IT was the only person out there when police responded and thought the police might believe IT was the person who assaulted the decedent. IT was also nervous IT might have an outstanding arrest warrant though IT did not know for what. W1 also clarified that the only suspect IT thought IT had seen before was S1.
13. During the October 23 interview, W1 stated that S1 pulled its weapon first and that after the decedent tried to defend himself with his own flicking motion, S1 stabbed the decedent. W1 further stated that the uninvolved juveniles ran south down Alabama Avenue and IT lost sight of them around Knox Place.
14. During the October 23 interview, W1 further stated that S1 and S2 appeared to be older than the rest of the group of individuals, consistent with ITS previous descriptions that they were 20-22 years old. W1 stated that S1's dreads were about one inch long, like twists to get dreads started. W1 stated S1 was the only person wearing a red jacket. W1 stated that IT saw S1 at McDonald's around 3-4 months before the stabbing. W1 further stated that the night of the stabbing, IT saw S1 and S2 come separately into the McDonald's but eat together, and that the group of juveniles came later and did not interact with them. W1 was shown video footage from the McDonald's from February 4, 2015, and identified a person in the footage as being ITSELF at the counter at 5:49 p.m. W1 watched the footage from 5:49 p.m. to 7:02 p.m. and stated IT did not see S1, S2 or any of the juveniles in the footage.



GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

15. W1 was interviewed again on October 27, 2015. W1 then clarified that as it stated initially, the decedent made a defensive flicking motion in the direction of S1 and S2 before S1 pulled its weapon. W1 explained that after the decedent made a flicking motion, S-2 got behind the decedent and struck him, knocking him to the ground. The decedent stood up. Then S-1 struck the decedent, pulled the decedent into him, and made the stabbing or sticking motion that caused W1 to collapse and crawl toward the Pepco pole. W1 stated IT could not recollect the last time IT saw S1 and thus it could have been longer than 3-4 months before the stabbing. W1 stated that the last place IT saw the group of juveniles was when they walked past the decedent and that IT was not paying careful attention to them after that.

16. During the October 27 interview, it was pointed out to W1 that the person IT identified as ITSELF in the McDonald's video was not IT. W1 then identified itself as a person who entered the McDonald's at about 6:46 p.m. It was pointed out to W1 that IT was carrying a Popeye's bag, at which time W1 remembered for the first time that it had been to Popeye's before it went to McDonald's. W1 watched the video from 6:46 p.m. until the point IT left at about 9:05 p.m. After watching the video, W1 stated that IT did not see S1, S2 or any of the juveniles inside the McDonald's. W1 stated the only person IT recognized in the video was someone who IT saw sell cigarettes to the group of people that were involved in the incident at some point that same night. W1 stated that after IT left the McDonald's, IT went to the gas station across the street from Popeye's to sell cigarettes. W1 said it then it took the bus from the front of the Popeye's to the location of the stabbing. W1 was shown video footage of Metrobus 6317 (the 92 bus) from February 4, 2015. W1 identified itself as getting on the bus at 10:14 p.m. in the 1800 block of Good Hope Road. W1 did not remember being in the 1800 block of Good Hope Road. W1 identified ITSELF getting off the bus at the intersection where the stabbing occurred at about 10:19 p.m. In an interview on October 28, 2015, W1 stated that after IT left McDonald's, IT went outside to smoke cigarettes. W1 stated that IT sells cigarettes but did not sell any that night. W1 denied stating IT sold cigarettes on October 27.

Video Footage and Electronic Monitoring


17. Your affiant was able to obtain video footage from various Washington Metro Area Transit Authority (WMATA) buses that were in the area of the 2400-2500 blocks of Alabama Avenue, Southeast, around the time of the stabbing. Just before Metrobus 6317 dropped off W1 at 10:19 p.m., it captured video footage of a group of four individuals walking south together down the west side of 2400 block of Alabama Avenue in the direction of Ainger Place. One member of the group is a black male wearing red pants, a red jacket, and white hat with black decoration and trim. After the bus passed this group of four, it captured 3 more black males walking shortly ahead of them in the same direction. The person in the red pants and the red jacket is the only person out of all the people captured by the bus footage wearing a red jacket before the bus stops and drops off W1 at the intersection where the incident occurs.

18. A search of MPD Databases revealed that Tyreke Chambers (DOB) 2/14/1998 (PDID) 654580, was being monitored via Global Positioning System (GPS), and was located in the vicinity of the stabbing. Electronic monitoring records show that Chambers was traveling south down the 2400 block of Alabama at a speed consistent with being on foot and that he arrived the incident location at 10:21 p.m. Records show he remained in the area of the incident location till about 10:26 p.m. (the same time W1 called 911), and then moved west down Ainger Place, Southeast, arriving in the area where the decedent's belongings were found thrown to the ground at about 10:28 p.m. According to the records, he then moved southwest through a cut toward Langston Lane.

19. Furthermore, on the night of the stabbing, K-9 Sergeant Johnnie Walter conducted a track from the area where the decedent's belongings were located with his blood hound. This track led Sergeant Walter through the Langston Lane Apartment Complex that is located in the 2700 block of Langston Lane, Southeast, and ended in the area of Hope Village, located at 2850 Langston Place, Southeast. Electronic monitoring records for Tyreke Chambers show that he arrived in the 2700 block of Langston Lane at 10:30 p.m. and remained there until 10:36 p.m.

Also, video footage obtained from the Langston Lane apartment complex shows a group of 7 black males climbing over a fence into the parking lot of the apartment buildings located in the 2700 block of Langston Lane at 10:34 p.m. A number of them appear consistent in appearance with the persons observed in the Metrobus footage, including the person wearing the red pants, red jacket, and white hat with black decoration and trim. Immediately after climbing over the fence, the person in the red jacket alters his appearance by taking off the red jacket, exposing a black or dark-colored jacket underneath.


Statements of Defendant

21. On February 6, 2015, detectives with the Homicide Branch spoke with Tyreke Chambers at his home at 3205 28th Street, Southeast, #3, Washington, D.C. On this occasion, Chambers denied observing any altercations or hearing anything about someone being stabbed. Chambers stated he owned a full red rain suit made by Bass Pro Shop.

22. On February 11, 2015, detectives with the Homicide Branch interviewed Tyreke Chambers at the Homicide Branch. When asked about the night of the stabbing, Chambers initially denied being with anyone other than a family member that night, and denied observing or participating in the stabbing or going to Langston Lane in the time period after the stabbing.

23. Chambers ultimately stated that after leaving Popeye's, he and a family member met up with friends. The group was walking down Alabama Avenue when they observed the decedent limping and wobbling up the street while talking on a cell phone. Chambers stated that "Nose" and others from the group then stated that the victim looked like a "lick" or a "stain," which Chambers understood to mean they planned to rob the decedent. Chambers stated that when his group passed the decedent on Alabama Avenue, Chambers was at the front of the group, and he asked the decedent if he was good because the decedent was limping. Chambers stated the decedent replied yes, he was just waiting for the bus. Chambers stated the decedent then bumped a member of the group whom Chambers knows as "Savage" and whose true name starts with "M." Chambers stated that after the decedent bumped "Savage," "Savage" looked at "Nose" with an expression that indicated "Savage" was about to whoop the decedent.

24. During the interview, Chambers stated that on the night of the murder, he was wearing a red Bass Pro Shop jacket and red jumper pants, and that at some point before returning home, he took off the pants because he was tired of wearing them. Chambers was shown an image located on social media of himself wearing a red Bass Pro jump suit and a white Michael Kors hat with black stitching and black trim. Chambers identified the person in the image as himself. The clothing from the image appears consistent with the red pants, red jacket, and white hat with black decoration and trim depicted in the Metrobus footage and footage from Langston Lane described above. Chambers was also shown a still shot from the Langston Lane video footage containing an image of four men who are consistent in appearance with the persons observed in the Metrobus footage, including the person wearing the red pants, red jacket, and white hat with black decoration and trim. Chambers identified the person in red as himself. Chambers stated that he was the only person on the scene of the stabbing wearing a red jacket. Chambers denied being with what was going on but said he stayed because he wanted to watch the fight. Chambers denied having any altercation with the decedent or touching him or his property. Chambers denied seeing anyone with a weapon.

Search Warrant


25. On February 21, 2015, members of the Homicide Branch and Officers with the Seventh District executed a D.C. Superior Court search warrant at the home of Tyreke Chambers at 3205 28th Street, Southeast, #3. Detectives searched the location and recovered several items, including a pair of red Bass Pro Shop rain pants, a white hat with black decoration and trim, and a knife in the bedroom occupied by Tyreke Chambers and another family member. The items were recovered by Mobile Crime Technicians and seized as evidence.

Statements of Associates

26. Persons believed to be friends or associates of Tyreke Chambers who were present at the scene of the incident were interviewed by police.

27. On February 13, 2015, detectives interviewed the family member who Chambers stated he was with at the time of the incident [hereinafter referred to as Associate 1 or A1] at the Homicide Branch. A1 initially stated that IT was not present at the scene of the incident but then recanted and stated that IT was present at the scene. A1 stated that IT was walking with Tyreke Chambers and that a group of other individuals including one named "Mike" was walking behind them. A1 stated that the decedent was walking up Alabama Avenue toward them, bumped "Mike," and an argument ensued. IT stated that Chambers stepped into the argument and a physical altercation ensued between the decedent and Chambers which spilled onto Alabama Avenue. A1 stated that Chambers was throwing punches to the decedent's body and at some point knocked the decedent to the ground. IT stated that "Mike" jumped into the altercation and advised Chambers that he was too small, and then "Mike" began punching the decedent, also knocking him to the ground. A1 stated that two other individuals with "Mike" also assaulted the decedent after Chambers. A1 stated IT did not see anything in anyone's hands.

28. On February 21, 2015, Tyreke Chambers was re-interviewed and stated he was aware that A1 told police he had been fighting the decedent, but stated A1 only said that because they were beefing because Chambers did not want to play with A1.

29. A1 was re-interviewed on September 9, 2015, and gave new versions of events. First, A1 stated that after the decedent bumped "Mike," an argument ensued, "Mike" swung at the decedent and missed, the decedent grabbed "Mike" in a bear hug and then let him go, the decedent then argued with Chambers, swung on Chambers and missed, and then Chambers swung back and missed. When informed that this version of events was inconsistent with what A1 stated on February 13 and asked to start over, A1 stated that "Mike" and his friends were walking ahead of IT and Chambers on Alabama Avenue, that Chambers moved into "Mike's" group, that the decedent bumped the group, everyone argued, the decedent got in their faces and bumped them again, the decedent put his finger in their faces and bumped "Mike," there was more arguing, the decedent bumped them again, the decedent and the crowd began to bump each other, the decedent bumped Chambers, Chambers swung, the decedent grabbed Chambers, "Mike" said Chambers was too small, "Mike" approached and the decedent let Chambers go, "Mike" and the decedent each swung on each other and missed, the decedent stumbled and fell back, the decedent got up and started to fight with "Mike" again, the decedent stumbled again, and then IT left with Chambers before the fight ended and did not see what happened next.


GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

30. On February 18, 2015, detectives interviewed another associate [hereinafter referred to as A2]. A2 stated that on the night of the murder between 9:00 and 10:00 p.m., IT was at the McDonald's with "Rico," "Streath," "Dion," and 4 or 5 other individuals IT did not know. A2 then stated the additional individuals included "Ray Savage from the Bang," and "Luwegee" and "Josh" from 23rd and Savannah. IT stated that as they walked down Alabama Avenue, they observed the decedent walking toward them. Then a fight broke out between three individuals from ITS group that IT didn't know. The person fighting the decedent was "Ray Savage" who was wearing a black jacket. Then "Luwegee," who was wearing a black Helly Hansen jacket with white stripes joined the assault. A2 observed the decedent fall to the ground and fled. A2 stated that "Rico" was a good friend and that "Rico" took no action in the assault of the decedent. A2 stated that "Rico" was the only person in the group wearing a red jacket. A2 stated that during the assault of the decedent, the decedent's book bag was taken and it was thrown into a dumpster along the flight path of A2 and others who were present at the assault as they fled and jumped the fence into the Langston Lane apartment complex. A2 confirmed that someone from this group had the decedent's bag but said IT did not know which person had it.

31. On February 23, 2015, detectives re-interviewed A2, who maintained that "Ray Savage" and "Luwegee" were the persons who assaulted the decedent. During his interview on February 21, 2015, Tyreke Chambers gave identifying information about the person he previously identified as "Savage" and then identified a photograph of T.T. (a juvenile) as "Savage" in a sequential array. On February 23, A2 was shown a photo array of T.T. (the juvenile identified by Chambers as "Savage") and stated IT did not recognize anyone in the group of photos.

32. On March 2, 2015, detectives interviewed another associate [hereinafter referred to as A3]. A3 initially stated that on the night of the murder, IT went to Popeye's and then met up with friends named "L.A.," "6LK," and "Dog." A3 said they took the bus to the church at the intersection of Alabama Avenue and Ainger Place. When they got off, "6LK" stated, "That's the guy that tried to stab me." Then "Dog" bumped the decedent and someone tried to grab his stuff. Then "Dog" hit the decedent with his forearm. A3 stated that the decedent had a knife but none of IT's friends had a weapon. A3 stated IT never touched the decedent or his property.

33. A3 then stated IT was at the Popeye's with "Reke" "Lonnie" and "Los/Lossie" and that afterward they walked around the neighborhood and encountered the decedent. "Reke" called the decedent a "dipper-head" and suggested they rob him. "Lossie" pushed the decedent and the decedent fell into A3. A3 pushed the decedent off and the decedent fell into a tree. "Quell" then hit the decedent once and then the decedent fell in the middle of the street. The decedent pulled out a knife and made a swiping motion and tried to cut "Savage." Then "Savage" stabbed him. They all ran off. "Lonnie" picked up the decedent's bag and threw it in the trash can near some apartment buildings near the church. Then A3 and the entire group jumped the fence and went home. A3 stated that "Lossie," "Reke," and "Lonnie" were not involved in the altercation, and stated IT was a closer friend to "Savage" and "Quell" than anyone else in the group. A3 was shown a photo array of T.T. (the juvenile identified by Chambers as "Savage") and stated IT did not recognize anyone involved in the investigation in the group of photos. On March 12, 2015, A3 was shown single photos of individuals involved in the investigation and did not identify anyone, including defendant Tyreke Chambers.

34. A3 was re-interviewed on September 10, 2015. A3 was informed that IT would not be charged but needed to tell the truth. A3 stated IT could not remember if it was at Popeye's or McDonald's before the murder. A3 stated it did not lie when IT said IT did not recognize the individuals in the single photos. A3 then stated that it was at the Popeye's with "L.A.." that they walked down Alabama Avenue to the bus stop in front of the church and saw three females and four males, none of whom were involved. A3 walked to Langston Lane and saw "Reke" walking toward the church. A3 then walked toward the church and saw "Reke" and his friends. "Reke" and his friends saw a dipper-head was walking toward them and "Reke" said he looked like he had money. Then someone else suggested a robbery. A3 walked past the dipper-head with "Reke," "L.A.," and 2 other people who appeared to be with "Reke." One of the people with "Reke" bumped the man. The man fell onto a tree. Then everyone ran over and hit the man. When asked who hit the man, A3 said the people who hit the man included "Quell" and the two boys with "Reke," but not "Reke." A3 went back and forth about whether "Quell" was one of the two boys with "Reke" or was another person in addition to the two boys with "Reke." A3 was re-shown single photos of individuals involved in the investigation and stated he was unable to identify anyone, including defendant Tyreke Chambers.

35. A3 was re-interviewed on September 18, 2015. IT stated that it went to the Popeye's with "Lonnie." Afterward they walked down 25th Street to Alabama Avenue and ran into "Reke" and "Quell" by the church at the corner of Alabama Avenue and Ainger Place, Southeast. A3 stated that "Reke" was a friend. At the bus stop on the northwest corner, A3 observed a man walking up Alabama toward them. IT stated "Reke" said he thought the man was a dipper-head and probably had money on him, which A3 understood to mean they ought to rob the man. All four of them walked toward the man on the southeast corner of the intersection. "Quell" bumped the man. The man pushed A3. A3 pushed the man off. The man swung and missed. A3 swung and missed. The man ran across Alabama Avenue. A3 went back to the northeast corner by the bus stop. While the man was in the street, he swung his hand back and forth, as if to use a knife to prevent people from coming near him. A3 did not see a knife. A3 stated after that, everything went blank. A3 did not see any of his friends with a weapon. A3 further said IT did not know where "Reke" and "Quell" were when the man was swinging the weapon. A3 said that after IT walked off down Ainger, IT's friends ran and caught up with IT. A3 stated that IT took the decedent's bag off the ground and threw it in the trash.

36. A3 stated it was untrue when IT stated IT did not recognize the individuals from the confirmation photos. A3 was reshowed the photos and identified a number of individuals, including defendant Tyreke Chambers as the person IT had been referring to as "Reke." A3 stated there was no "L.A.," "6LK," "Dog," "Lossie," or "Nose" and that no one ever said "That's the man who tried to stab me." A3 said that IT saw someone whom IT knows as "Savage" as it was walking toward Langston Lane after the incident was over, but that "Savage" was not present during the incident.

Summary

37. The investigation shows that Defendant Tyreke Chambers and one or more of his group observed the decedent and decided to rob the decedent. They then assaulted and stabbed the decedent. W1 has consistently maintained that the person who stabbed the decedent was wearing a red jacket. Video footage, electronic monitoring records and admissions by Chambers show he was the only person on the scene of the stabbing wearing a red jacket. Electronic monitoring records further show that just minutes after the stabbing, Chambers was located in the area where the decedent's belongings were later found. On February 21, 2015, red pants consistent with the clothing Chambers said he was wearing the night of the stabbing and a knife were recovered from his bedroom during a search warrant. Based on these facts and the above facts and circumstances, your affiant believes probable cause exists that Tyreke Chambers committed the above acts in the District of Columbia in violation of DC Code and respectfully requests a DC Superior Court Arrest Warrant be issued for TYREKE CHAMBERS, (dob) 2/14/1998 (PDID) 654580.

Tyreke Chambers was arrested on December 7, 2015, and charged as an adult pursuant to Title 16 with first degree felony murder while armed. He was transported to the Homicide Branch where he waived his Miranda rights and gave another statement to police.


Chambers stated he was incarcerated at a detention facility for 14 months and was released on February 3, 2015, the day before the stabbing.

Chambers gave approximately five versions of events that were inconsistent with his prior statements and with each other. In his fifth and final version of events, he stated he wanted to tell the truth. He stated he told the group the decedent was a "dipperhead" who always has a full stick and money on him. Chambers stated he believed if he hadn't said anything they would've walked the other way. Chambers stated when he got close to the decedent he realized he had made a mistake but it was too late. "Manny," "Damion," and "Ty Savage" started going through the decedent's pockets while Chambers watched and laughed. When they started assaulting the decedent, Chambers asked them to stop. When the police came by, they ran to a building. The decedent tried to flag down the police. When he came back, they called him hot. Chambers states "Ty Savage" and "Damion" had a knife. He did not see "Damion" stab the decedent but he did see "Ty Savage" swinging at the decedent. "Damion" hit the decedent and he fell. "Manny" did a wrestling move on the decedent and tried to take him down. "Ty Savage" kept saying "I hit him, I hit him." They were all dapping him up and congratulating him for catching his first body. Chambers stated he was in shock when "Ty Savage" showed him the knife. Chambers stated "Ty Savage" took the decedent's bag and there were 2 phones inside. Chambers stated "Ty Savage" was the person he previously identified as T.T. (the juvenile). Chambers was shown an image of the red rain pants that were recovered in the search warrant. Chambers stated they were his and they were the same ones he had on the night of the murder.


version of events, among other things, he stated that as he and a group of others were walking down Alabama Avenue, Chambers commented that the decedent looked drunk. Chambers stated he asked the decedent if he was okay and the decedent answered him in a disrespectful manner. The decedent then bumped into "Sticks" and they started fighting. The decedent asked "why ya'll messing with me?". Chambers stated the fighting continued into the street. Then "Sticks" started jumping up and down like he was excited and ran over to Chambers and showed him a knife with blood on it.

In his second version of events, among other things, Chambers stated "Ty Savage," meaning T.T., showed him the knife with the blood on it. Chambers stated "Ty Savage" had on dark clothing that night. Chambers maintained that he was wearing a red Bass Pro Shop suit with a Michael Kors hat. Chambers stated there were about 7-8 of them total, including himself, his family member, "Ty Savage," "Ty Savage's brother" and 2 others. When specifically asked if "Quell" and "Damion" were with the group he stated they were, but then immediately recanted and stated "Quell" was not there and that he didn't run into "Damion" until after the incident on Langston Lane. Chambers stated he just watched.

In his third version of events, among other things, Chambers stated that "Damion" was on Alabama Avenue. When asked if anyone else had on red that night, Chambers stated "yes, he had on a Helly." When asked who had on the red Helly, Chambers initially stated he didn't remember his name. Chambers later stated that "Terrence" was the person wearing the red Helly Hansen jacket but clarified that "Terrance" left before the altercation and was not involved. (In a previous statement to police, Chambers was shown a photograph obtained by himself and a person named "Terrance." The true name of the person he identified is known to police and is not "Terrance." When interviewed, the person he identified was shown a still shot from the Metrobus video footage and identified himself as a person wearing dark or black colored clothing that was consistent in color and pattern with the clothing from the social media photograph.)



In his third version of events, Chambers stated that "Damion" teed off on the decedent. The decedent fell and got back up. "Manny" smacked the decedent and the decedent fell into a pole. Then everyone in the group was jumping up and down because they "crushed" the decedent. Chambers stated he just watched the whole thing.

In his fourth version of events, Chambers stated the decedent bumped into "Manny." "Damion" hit the decedent in the back of the neck. The decedent fell and caught himself. The decedent walked away quickly but when he tried to run away someone hit him. The decedent ran into the street and started swinging. The decedent was swinging at "Damion" because he was the tallest. "Damion" had his fists up and kept approaching the decedent. Chambers walked away towards Knox Place but the group called him back so he returned. The decedent tried to flag down a police car. "Ty Savage" showed him the knife that had blood on it. "Ty Savage" took the decedent's bag and started throwing his movies and paperwork in the street and by the building near the old daycare center. Everyone in the group split up and ran away. Chambers, his family member, and "Damion" jumped the fence onto the upper half of the Lane. Everyone else went around the other way. "Ty Savage" was excited he stabbed the decedent and everyone was cheering him and saying he got his first body. "Manny" jumped the fence into the lower half of the Lane and walked up to meet them.
