SAC Burton of Albuquerque, New Mexico, phoned and said he had had a phone call this morning from Senator Anderson who was in his office in the Federal Building in Albuquerque. From March 18 through 22, 1957, the Bureau, pursuant to a request of Secretary of Labor Mitchell, made a security check of the telephone lines in Mr. Mitchell's Office and those ! of his administrative assistant and secretary. No evidence of irregularity or tampering was located during the course of this check. At the conclusion of the check, the Secretary's office indicated the possibility of requesting a recheck of these lines in the near future. Our Laboratory estimated that a recheck would require a minimum of four-man days.

b6 Today, Special Assistant to b70 Secretary Mitchell, called Liaison and stated that the Secretary wondered if it would be possible for the Bureau to cause another telephone security check to be made similar to the one made in March, 1957. stated that the reason for this recheck is because the Department of Labor is still greatly concerned with the activities of officials in the Teamsters Union andwanted to make sure that their phones are secure.

SECURITY SURVEY OF TELEPHONE LINES

During the course of the past two weeks, technically trained Special Agents of the FBI Laboratory have conducted a security survey of your office and residence telephone lines. The six lines in your office are terminated at seven instruments, while the two lines in your residence are terminated at five instruments. All instruments were opened and thoroughly inspected for proper wiring. The terminal appearances of the lines were checked through five telephone exchange effices and at all other appearances where the possibility of tapping existed.

I am happy to report that no evidence of tampering was detected. Special protection was afforded all critical instruments. In addition, quarterly security checks of your telephone lines will be made in the future.

Yesterday I saw Attorney General Hoggans and during the course of our discussion he requested that, it possible, the Eureau make arrangements for the installation of a White House telephone in his residence, together with an unlisted telephone. He also asked that we arrange to make the periodic checks of the telephones in his residence, as well as in his office.

Mr. Rogers discussed generally the plans which he had for holding press conferences which he anticipates holding two or three times a month. He intends at such times to present some interesting development , in the Department's work to the press.

Mr. Rogers indicated he was desirous of establishing a better press for the Department of Justice and hoped to be able to sell the whole Department through press contacts and through television and other media.

In our discussion I advised him that I would have sent to him a memorandum of the work and the time which the Eureau has given to the preparation of material for the McClellan Committee.

I also told him we would send him a memorandum of the steps we had taken with the Internal Revenue Eureau to bring about injuiries into the income taxes of communist organizations and Communist Party members.

Mr. Rogers stated that he had read in the paper about the meeting of the top hoodlums in a mountain retreat in New York and that he was interested in this matter and at his next press conference in answer to any queries he would state that the FBI was keeping in complete touch with the situation. 

PROPOSED CHANGE IN MANUAL OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

Part II, Section 3, Subsection A, of the Manual of Rules and Regulations, should be amended to read as follows:

- Security checks of all office telephone and teletype lines shall be made by a sound-trained Agent at the intervals indicated to determine whether any effort is being made to intercept Bureau messages:
 - Quarterly at the field office city.
 - b. Annually at Resident Agencies occupying. federal or commercial building space (as distinguished from private residences).

If the telephone company is reluctant to permit examination of the lines on company premises, the discretion of the SAC will prevail as to whether to insist on such examination.

Memorandum to Mr. Parsons RE: Security Devices Laboratory; Harry A. Miller Company; Sargent and Greenleaf Company

In its present state of design it can be compromised by appropriate "counter" design and equipment. Further development of this unit will be followed.

A so-called "Microphone Detector," intended to take advantage of the resonant frequency of microphones, is under design at the Laboratory. It does not appear that this unit will perform as expected by the company. However, development will be followed.

A "Transistorized Photo-Cell Probe" is still in the planning stage. It is hoped that this unit will permit detection of a modulated light beam (visible or infrared) by means of which a voice signal within a room is being overheard by unauthorized persons outside the room. Development will be followed.

It is of interest to note that State Department security officers have been "talking up" all of the first six items as being exceptionally good and having been designed by SDL at the request of the State Department. Such was claimed by State in a proposed annual report to the NSC Special Committee. As a matter of fact, State Department does not have proprietary right to any of the above items, all of them having been developed by SDL at their own expense.

SDL does not have a grasp of the fundamental problems involved in microphone and radio frequency detecting equipment. It lacks the technical equipment and qualified personnel to do a good job. Fundamental performance of SDL products in no instance exceeded that of similar equipment which has been available for years.

Of particular importance is the fact that employees of SDL were most indiscreet. They volunteered information as to the names of other Government agencies and of individuals in those agencies for whom they had developed and were developing equipment. They were very strongly cautioned as to the confidential nature of the Bureau's inquiry. The Bureau should be most circumspect in any future dealings with SDL.

SECURITY CHECK OF TELEPHONE AND TELETYPE LINES

SAC Letter Number 51, dated 5-22-51, established the requirement that a monthly check be made of the field office telephone and teletype lines to make certain that no attempt is being made to tamper with these lines. There is no existing provision for checking these lines at Resident Agency offices.

Effective immediately, a sound-trained Agent shall make security checks of telephone and teletype lines in the following instances.

- 1. On a quarterly basis at the field office city.
- On an annual basis at Resident Agencies where offices are located in Government or commercial buildings, as distinguished from private residences.

Care should be exercised so that a pattern is not established as to the exact day of the checks. As provided in SAC Letter Number 80, Section G, dated 8-10-51, if the telephone company is reluctant to permit examination of the lines on company premises, the discretion of the SAC will prevail as to whether to insist on such examination. While a determined effort must be made to make the checks at all locations, cooperation with the company in other matters is not to be jeopardized. These checks are to be made at all terminal appearances of the lines and at any other necessary locations regardless of the type of cable used between the company exchange and field office or Resident Agency quarters.

The quarterly check should provide adequate security for field office lines at this time. The annual check at Resident Agencies is not only a necessary precaution but is an excellent means of maintaining contact with plant officials of the telephone companies located in smaller cities of your field division.



Reference is made to your memorandum of August 19, 1958, requesting the FBI to make a security check of a number of offices in the Department.

The problem of the security of space in the Justice Department building is a part of the much larges over-all problem of general security of sensitive government space. While it is true that in an effort to be of as much assistance as possible, this Bureau does on occasion perform security checks of the Attorney General's office, the Bureau cannot undertake an expanded program of such service because of the severe adverse effect on our own heavy workload.

In this regard, it is noted that in connection with a somewhat related problem involving security of government telephone service, by memorandum from the Deputy Attorney General under date of June 13, 1955, a copy of which was designated for you as Chairman of the Interdepartmental Committee of Internal Security, this Bureau was advised that "It is my understanding that the General Services Administration which furnishes the buildings occupied by most government agencies also has the responsibility for furnishing adequate telephone communications and for the security of such telephone lines." A representative of General Services Administration subsequently advised this Bureau that the problem of telephone security had been referred to the Office of Security and Compliance of General Services Administration for handling.

Accordingly, since the Justice Department building is among those buildings under the general supervision of the General Services Administration, it is suggested that you may wish to refer your request to that agency for possible assistance.

note to the Director concerning difficulties experienced on Extension 444.
Mr. Holloman indicated that: (1) arrangements were made for the telephone company to recheck the lines and iron out the difficulty and (2) the Laboratory was advised to conduct a security check on the phone line. The Director requested that the difficulties be looked into promptly.

The Laboratory reports that a telephone security check was promptly instituted at 5:44 P. M., 12-12-58. All possible points of access where irregularities or tapping could occur were carefully examined. Completion of the check has determined that from a security standpoint there was no evidence of tampering.

As a matter of general information, you will recall that there is an unusual amount of telephone company activity presently going on within the Department of Justice Building while the Department's telephone system is being converted to dial equipment. It is observed that during this change-over from one system to another many lines will be disconnected momentarily and reconnected in the process. I note that the telephone people worked within the building again Saturday. They did not work Sunday; however, their work will begin again Monday.

Reurlet 2-6-50 suggesting that there appears to have been omitted from the Manual of Rules and Regulations, Part II, Section 3, page 2, Subsection 12, the requirement that the residence telephones of the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) and the Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) be checked quarterly when the field office lines are surveyed.

There has been no general requirement in the past that the residence telephone lines of the SAC and ASAC be checked regularly by all field offices. However, in a few instances, some offices have made such checks as a security precaution where deemed advisable. Not all offices will encounter the same security problem with regard to the SAC and ASAC. Therefore, it is not believed necessary that a general regulation be made affecting all offices.

Should the San Francisco Office consider the quarterly survey of the SAC's and ASAC's residence lines desirable from the security standpoint, such practice may be continued. The time consumed by such a check should be held to a reasonable minimum.

It is desired to call the Bureau's attention to referenced Manual section which is dated June 30, 1958, and which appears to have omitted the regulation requiring that the residence telephones of the Special Agent in Charge and the Assistant Special Agent in Charge be checked at the time of the quarterly security checks called for in this section.

As the Bureau is aware, the Special Agent in Charge and Assistant Special Agent in Charge often receive calls from the Bureau as well as military and Naval intelligence officers on their home telephones and, therefore, the security aspect is of equal importance to their office telephones; for this reason the residence telephone lines of the Special Agent in Charge and the Assistant Special AGent in Charge in San Francisco were checked as was called for by past Bureau regulation.

In view of the above, it is suggested that the Bureau instruct Field Divisions to incorporate the above check in future security checks of telephone lines.





Brigadier General A. J. Goodpaster was advised by letter 5-11-59 that Laboratory would furnish technical assistance to the White House Secret Service and Signal Corps details. As pointed out in my memoranda of 5-29 and 6-15-59 contact so far with Robert I. Bouck, Special Agent in Charge, Protective Research Section, Secret Service, has resulted in a recheck of countermeasures in White House phones by Laboratory and indication from Bouck that complete survey of White House telephone facilities would be requested at such time as the President is out of town for an extended period. We are presently awaiting further word from Bouck as to when the White House work schedule will permit completion of the survey.

Bouck has indicated that purpose of survey is to obtain recommendations as to how to make the White House telephone system as secure as possible. Subsequent information has been obtained reflecting that Bouck has likewise solicited information and assistance concerning a secure telephone system from representatives of other Government agencies, the local Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company and the Bell Telephone Laboratories, Incorporated, of New Jersey. It appears that Bouck does not have a thorough understanding of either the technical or security problems involved in operating and maintaining a telephone system and is shopping around for advice and assistance. In view of this, we will be most circumspect in future dealings with Bouck.

Information also indicates that neither Bouck nor anyone else has the responsibility for the security of the entire White House telephone system. that Bouck lacks authority to control the installation and removal of telephone instruments, and that he does not have the full cooperation of other White House employees concerning the telephone system. With such a lack of centralized authority and control, it is extremely doubtful that any amount of technical protection would guarantee full security of the telephone system.

Instead of being connected in the usual manner, he was cut directly in on a conversation between the Attorney General's

This should not happen under normal circumstances. If all of the Attorney General's lines are busy, the calling party should get a busy signal.

In view of this report from Mr. Holloman, inquiry was made of the telephone company, without revealing the above details, as to whether equipment trouble had increased since initiation of interdepartmental dialing. A slight increase has been noted, but there has also been a considerable increase in the number of calls handled by the equipment which explains the increase.

From the nature of the instant occurrence, it must have been caused by a malfunction within the Justice Department telephone equipment rather than in the FBI telephone equipment. It was learned from telephone company personnel that no complaints of malfunctioning of Justice Department dial equipment had been received during the instant morning. One thing was learned, however, which could have led to the apparently isolated malfunctioning involved here.

A traffic study (survey of the volume of calls) was being conducted in the Justice Exchange by three telephone company women employees. A temporary malfunction of the present type could easily have been caused by an inadvertent brushing against the telephone switching equipment by one of these employees during the course of their survey work.

In any event, occurrences of the type reported are got normal; they can be expected to happen only rarely, and then only as a result of an equipment malfunction.

It was noted that we have, on occasion in the past, extended this service to higher echelon Government officials other than Cabinet members. While we have not often had occasion to call on HHFA for particular assistance in matters of great importance to the Bureau, our relations with HHFA Administrator and Compliance Division officials have been good, and they have displayed a cooperative attitude in all matters discussed with them by Liaison. Reference is made to your 9-7-60, telephone call to me advising that an Air Force Office of Special Investigations (OSI) security check team had encountered an unexplained situation at the residence of Secretary of the Air Force Dudley C. Sharp, In the course of making a check for concealed listening devices, the team, headed by Major Al Sears, reportedly discovered a working microphone. Due to possible Bureau interest, SA and myself proceeded to the Secretary's residence at 9:00 p.m. and determined the following situation to exist.

A buzzer system is utilized between the four floors of the Sharp residence to enable occupants to signal each other on the different floors. OSI technicians checked the wiring of this system at a central location in the basement for possible hidden microphones attached to the buzzer wires. In the case of the buzzer in the library on the third floor, they were able to hear room conversation. Verification of this fact was made by myself and

This "freak!" condition was determined to be due to the particular buzzer, line, test equipment and test techniques used by OSI. None of the other buzzers at other locations in the house could be activated in the same manner. It was further determined that the condition was confined to the buzzer system itself and there was no indication that the signal was being carried out of the house on other wires.

Reference is made to your memorandum to me of September 9, 1950, concerning a proposal by the General Services Administration (GMA) as to the security of United States Government telephone lines throughout the country, except in Washington, O. C. GSA recommends: (1) identification of all sensitive Government lines; and (4) removal of multiple appearances from such lines by the telephone company.

Although I appreciate your thoughtfulness in referring this to my attention, I do not feel that the Federal Sureau of Investigation is in a position to comment on a matter pertaining to the security of telephone lines of other Government agencies. I do hope you will understand my position in this regard.

NOTE: Bureau has been removing unnecessary multiple appearances from its lines in the course of security surveys of these lines for years. In 1955 Bureau was responsible for having multiples of U.S. Government lines of all otheragencies in Washington removed from premises occupied by foreign governments. This was done on basis of cooperation by Laboratory's telephone contact at no cost to the Government and at considerable expense to the company.

On December 12, 1955 the Chairman of the Interdepartmental

Committee on Internal Security advised you of the request made to the General Services Administration that ICIS be advised of the possibility of the appearances of U.S. Government telephone lines on the premises of foreign establishments in U.S. cities other than Washington, D.C. At that time GSA had indicated that it would make . a survey of foreign establishments with the end in view of removing appearances of U.S. Government lines from the cabling of those establishments.

Recently, members of the ICIS Secretariat met with representatives of GSA in order to determine what progress has been made in meeting this problem. As a result of these conferences, the GSA conferred with officials of the American Telephone and Telegraph, Company regarding the removal of multiple appearances, particularly those containing the lines of U.S. Government establishments, from the telephone cabling going to foreign establishments in the U.S.

Because of the magnitude of such a survey, the Telephone Company recommended as a more practical and economical approach that a list of sensitive Government agencies in cities other than Washington be transmitted so that multiple appearances could be removed from their lines.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter received from GSA dated August 30, 1960 and a copy of a memorandum dated August 12, 1960 received from the American Telephone and Telegraph Company by GSA. This correspondence sets out the results of progress made in this matter to date. As you will note, the GSA requests the assistance of the ICIS in developing the necessary detailed information regarding the identification of all sensitive Government lines throughout the U.S. It would be appreciated if the Federal Bureau of Investigation would submit whatever comments it may have regarding the proposal made by GSA.

With respect to the identification of the sensitive Government telephone lines, it is hoped that your Cammittoo unlikelend applications to the General Services Administravien in developing the necessary detailed information. Of course, no estimate of costa can be made by the telephone company until wa knew the number of lines affected.

NEWORANDUM:

Representatives of GSA recently got in touch with our Washington office to discuss the nature and extent of a security problem that may exist should there be multiple appearances of U. S. Covernment telephone lines on the premises of foreign establishments or in other areas of public buildings in the United States.

This matter was previously considered late in 1955 and was the subject of some discussions between American Company's Washington office and representatives of GSA.

From discussions with GSA representatives, it develops that CDA's suggested approach involves the identification of tolophone lines serving foreign consular offices and foreign trade associations in the United States, then determining the security risk presented by possible close proximity of these lines to lines serving the United States Covernment. During discussion of the problem with GSA representatives, it was explained that such an approach would involve extensive study, improvement measures are likely to be costly, and the net regult would fall short of GSA's intended objective. Some of the considerations which hed to this conclusion fellow:

- 1. Identification of the lines serving foreign consular offices and foreign trade associations would be difficult. For example, the GSA list indicated 51 such offices in San Francisco, 61 in New York City, and included no telephone number for identification of these offices.
- 2. Foreign consular offices and trade associations are only a part of the problem. Buch of these offices has exployees the generally have residence telephone service. Identification of these residence services would be extremely difficults.
- In addition to the listed consular and trade offices, the telephone sarriess of other potential crary agents are usually unadvertised and extremely difficult to identify.





White House representatives have requested the local Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company to submit a proposal which would provide expansion of the present White House telephone switchboard facilities. A proposal in brochure form has been prepared and submitted to the White House,

Security of Telephone Salvices White House representatives have furnished this brochure to Assistant Director Evans for any comment which the Bureau may care to make regarding security of the telephone company's proposal.

Review of this brochure reveals that it is nondetailed, nontechnical and nonspecific with regards to actual installation of equipment, instruments, lines and cables. It does propose in the language of the telephone company's commercial department to effect an expansion of the present small switchboard in the White House by physically removing the board from the White House and incorporating it with a much larger switchboard facility, which still contains expansion capabilities, located in the nearby Executive Office Building. Cost figures as well as an enumeration of the apportionment of lines is set forth in tabular form for consideration. Initiating this move would permit expansion of lines serving the White House. Since no technical detail is set forth in this commercial proposal, no further analysis is possible other than to observe that consolidation of the present White House switchboard with the larger Executive Office switchboard with the resultant removal of the present switchboard from the White House proper necessarily requires the telephone cables and lines serving the White House to be routed through the nearby Executive Office Building. From the standpoint of wire line security, it is imperative, therefore, that the proposed consolidated switchboard facilities, telephone cables, terminals and associated equipment all must be afforded a high level of physical security equal to that which is presently applied to the equipment and switchboard facilities now located within the White House proper. 001 x REC- 77 62-92305

Reference is made to previous correspondence regarding security of telephone lines. On December 12, 1955, the Chairman of the Interdepartmental Committee on Internal Security advised you of the request made to the General Services Administration that ICIS be advised of the possibility of the appearances of U. S. Government telephone lines on the premises of foreign establishments in U. S. cities other than Washington, D. C. At that time GSA indicated that it would make a survey of foreign establishments with the end in view of removing appearances of U. S. Government lines from the cabling of those establishments.

The ICIS has recently discussed this matter, in consultation with experts from GSA, the Department of Defense, and the American Telephone and Telegraph Company. In the course of these discussions it became apparent to the members of the ICIS that although the problem of "multiple appearances" constitutes an internal security danger, the significance of this danger has been considerably diminished by the development of more refined techniques for the exploitation of telephone lines and instruments for clandestine listening purposes. Furthermore, ICIS is mindful that security regulations forbid the discussion of classified information on telephone lines, and that, therefore, the removal of multiple appearances should yield only marginal benefits. The fact that sensitive agencies do make some efforts to check their telephone lines, to detect interference, if any, together with the advanced techniques mentioned above, have led ICIS to conclude that there is not adequate justification for pursuing further the problem of multiple appearances of telephone lines.

SECURITY OF TELEPHONE LINES

Reference is made to the Director's memorandum to the Attorney General dated April 13, 1961, reporting completion of a security check by FBI personnel of the Attorney General's office and residence telephone lines. The Attorney General noted, Would you check the other Cabinet Officers RFK."

For the Director's information, we currently conduct a detailed security check on the residence and office telephone lines serving the Director, Mr. Tolson and Bureau officials each three months. In addition, we include the Attorney General and, at this time, Senator John L. McClellan.

The Bureau has no continuing telephone security check program for Cabinet Officers. Some Departments have their own technical staff. From a confidential source, we know that some Departments use their own men to conduct telephone security checks on their own lines. Such a check involves physical examination and electrical checking on all access points to the lines (such as in telephone exchange buildings, on poles, in basements of buildings, etc.) for the purpose of determining whether the line is tapped. This is contrasted to our countermeasure program (CM) in which we modify the telephone instrument itself to prevent its being used as a microphone to pick up room conversation when the instrument is on the hook. We do have a continuing countermeasure program and, as you know, since the first of the year there has been considerable activity in this program for Cabinet Officers due to the change in Administration.

The Laboratory is equipped to make telephone security checks and has in the past on special requests performed this type of work for several individual Cabinet members. From our experience, where only

one or two lines are involved, the security check may require as little as two man days. However, where numerous lines are involved, upwards of ten man days may be required to complete each security check.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That appropriate Liaison personnel contact the individual Cabinet Officers for the purpose of inquiring as to whether they desire that a telephone security check be made on their lines. If desired, the Liaison representative should work out a suitable time for the performance of the work.

Representatives of the Telephone Company in Boston have advised that the telephone equipment utilized in the area of the city where the Federal Building is located is the oldest equipment still in use in Boston and this undoubtedly accounts for the complaints relative to the telephone service.

During the course of our check it was noted that the space in the Lederal Building wherein the terminals for telephone lines to the United States Attorneys are located was unlocked. As a further security measure arrangements have been made to have this space kept under lock and key.



Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated 4-27-61 recommending (as a result of the Attorney General's request) that Liaison Section personnel determine whether individual Cabinet officers were desirous of having a security check made of their office and/or residence telephone lines and arrange a suitable time for the work. The Director approved.

On May 31, 1961 and June 2 and 5, 1961, as a result of Liaison Section arrangements, Electronics Section personnel made a security check of fourteen office telephone lines of Postmaster General J. Edward Day and Deputy Postmaster General Hiram W. Brawley. No evidence of tampering was found at any point where access could be had to the lines. No request was made for a residence telephone check.

At the request of Postmaster General Day, countermeasures were installed in two office telephone instruments.

No one has been advised of the results of this check.

SECURITY CHECK OF TELEPHONE LINES

Reurlet 5/26/61, requesting the Bureau to reconsider the instruction which directed that a security check be made annually by a sound-trained Agent of the resident agency offices' telephone lines.

The Eureau has weighed your observations and considers the advantages which accrue from the sound-trained agent's contacts to outweigh the disadvantages cited. Accordingly, the Eureau is not making a change in this requirement at this time.

In connection with the use of sound-trained agents and field sound equipment, experience in the past has shown that maximum utility of the specialized sound training and of the technical equipment supplied to each office is realized when the sound-trained agent is assigned to the headquarters city. This fact has been taken into consideration in the delection of candidates currently being trained in additional special sound schools. In the future in the event the handling of technical security check work in your division becomes increasingly difficult the possibility of reassigning one of the newly trained personnel should be kept in mind.

Re No Number SAC Letter 58-K, June 23, 1958, and to that portion which instituted the following instructions: "On an annual basis at Resident Agencies where offices are located in Government or commercial buildings ----" a sound-trained agent shall make security checks of the telephone lines.

I am requesting the Bureau, at this time, to reconsider this instruction with a view toward abolishing it. In the Springfield Division there are 12 resident agencies and only one sound-trained agent in addition to the SAC, who has had sound training. For the sound-trained agent in the Springfield Division it is conservatively estimated that this annual check requires 1450 miles of travel and consumes, during a year's time, approximately one calendar month of the sound-trained agent's time.

It is felt that the benefit achieved from these checks in resident agencies is disproportimate to the time and expense involved. All that is actually accomplished is to determine that there is no tap in existence on a RA line on the particular day that the check is made since RA lines do not come into resident agencies in sealed cables and with other protection such as is afforded to a headquarters establishment.

Contact with telephone company officials and necessary personnel as a liaison function is, of course, excellent and it is believed that the requirement that Senior Resident Agents and SACs should be required to have liaison contacts with telephone company officials should be maintained.

If the Bureau is unable to accede to my request that this annual check by a sound-trained agent be abolished, the Bureau is requested to at least modify the requirement to

They recognize, however, that all of the specific information noted above could have come from the Department and could have been developed if there were a tap on the Department's telephone lines. 167C said that prior to making an issue of this matter and in effect accusing the Internal Revenue Service of having a "leak", he would like to make certain there is no evidence the Department's telephones have been tapped. Because telephone company employees have been involved in other cases where they were bribed by gamblers it was not felt that the telephone company should be asked to make this inquired as to whether it would be possible for the Bureau Laboratory to do this. He was told that a check would be made and he would be advised.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN:

It has been ascertained from the Laboratory that to check the pertinent telephone lines in the Department would take one of our experts about two or three days. Since the information in the specific cases cited was the subject of telephone conversations with the Department immediately prior to its becoming known to the gamblers, there would appear to be some logic to making this check. The situation also has the advantage of making the Department more security conscious and they may desist from their past practice of insisting on a full disclosure of information developed in our reports to the Internal Revenue Service.

Under these circumstances in view of the limited amount of work involved, it is believed it would be to our advantage to comply with the Criminal Division request.

The above requirement regarding the frequency of security checks represents the maximum interval between security checks. However, these checks may be made at more frequent intervals if there are substantial reasons for believing that Bureau lines may be subject to tampering.

Inasmuch as a security check requires a review of confidential telephone company records and physical observation of the Bureau's telephone lines located within the telephone company central office, (a space accessible only to telephone company employees) it is necessary to have the cooperation of the telephone company officials and craftsmen. Careful consideration, therefore, should be given to the attitude and background, particularly regarding security, racial and criminal matters, of local telephone company employees contacted in that these individuals are also in a position to assist any person or group interested in tapping telephones.

ACTION TAKEN

There is attached a suggested SAC letter again alerting all offices to insure that appropriate precautions are taken concerning the security of telephone lines utilized by the Bureau.

57 (u - (C) TELEPHONES - SECURITY OF FBI TELEPHONE LINES -- Individuals having background as telephone men and electricians could be a good source of information to individuals or organizations engaged in subversive, criminal or racial activities if these individuals or organizations choose to use their training and background in an attempt to monitor FBI telephone facilities. Therefore, you are instructed to immediately review the security procedures involving telephone lines used by your office to insure that maximum security is maintained.

There is a present requirement that field office telephone lines be checked quarterly and resident agency lines annually. These security checks should not be performed on such a highly regular basis that a pattern is established as to the time they are conducted. As you are aware, these checks are a precautionary measure and cannot guarantee absolute security of office and resident agency lines. Since these checks guarantee security only at the time they are performed, personnel should be most circumspect as to the nature of their conversation over outside telephone lines.

It is noted that a security check of telephone lines requires a review of confidential telephone company records and physical observation of the Bureau telephone lines located with the telephone company central office (a space accessible only to telephone company employees), and it is necessary to have the cooperation of the telephone company officials and craftsmen. Careful consideration, therefore, should be given to the attitude and background, particularly regarding security, racial and criminal matters, of local telephone company employees contacted in that these individuals are also in a position to assist any person or group interested in tapping telephones.

You will recall that earlier this year the Attorney General upon being notified of the completion of a routine security check of his telephone lines by Bureau personnel asked Assistant Director Courtney A. Evans to have a similar security check made of the telephones of other Cabinet members. Liaison contacted the Cabinet members' offices and arrangements were made to conduct a check for those who expressed a desire for this service.

A total of 20 telephone instruments and 10 lines were involved at three locations, General Eisenhower's office at 300 Carlisle Street, Colonel Robert L. Schulz's apartment at and Chief Warrant Officer The survey included an inspection of the lines not only at the location of the instruments but also at the telephone company offices and all other points where access could be had to the lines. No evidence of tampering was found.

Colonel Schulz advised that General Eisenhower had not requested that the telephone system at his residence on his Gettysburg farm be checked at this time. Neither Colonel Schulz nor Chief Warrant Officer were available at the completion of this survey so that they could be informed of the results. Assistant Director DeLoach was advised immediately upon Special Agents Matter and Stevens' return to Washington.

Reference is made to Mr. DeLoach's 1/29/62 memorandum to Mr. Mohr recommending that Bureau personnel make a security check of the telephones of General Eisenhower at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The Director approved.

You will recall that some years ago, the Electronics Section developed a telephone countermeasure (CM) device as a security measure. This device prevents a telephone from being used as a microphone to overhear room conversation even though the telephone is hung up. Since 1950, these CM devices have been installed in the office and residence telephones of the President, Cabinet members and other high officials of the Federal Government when specifically requested by them or their agency. General Eisenhower's telephones were so protected when he was in the White House.

The CM device is classified "Secret." Because of this, it is desirable for the Bureau to be notified ahead of the telephone company repair department in case trouble develops in the telephone in which a CM device is installed. This permits Bureau personnel to remove the device before a repairman arrives and possibly removes the telephone instrument.

In connection with the survey for General Eisenhower it is suggested that it may be desirable to mention the possibility of being of further service to the General by installing CM devices in the telephones at his residence. If these instruments are made by the Western Electric Company, the CM installation can be made at the time of the survey. If the phones are other than Western Electric, parts will have to be obtained and the CM installation made at a later date. 10131 33 100 29 62-97501



wholeheartedly. He stated within a period of five minutes following the inauguration, an ex-President's whole world collapses from under him. He reiterated that General Eisenhower was most grateful for the Director's kindnesses.

Col. Schulz brought up the subject of the Director and Mr. Tolson coming to Gettysburg. He stated General Eisenhower had often mentioned this possibility and he felt certain that in the early Spring the General would want to have the Director as his guest for luncheon at the Eisenhower farm. He stated the General would also take great delight in showing the Director around certain parts of the Gettysburg Battle Field.

Col. Schulz confided when the two of us were alone, that his greatest problem at Gettysburg is handling Mrs. Eisenhower. He stated she was quite temperamental and would not listen to reason on occasion. He mentioned she was quite possessive of the General and often insisted on talking with him regardless of who might be in the General's office at the time.

Col. Schulz told me that the General when in Gettysburg is in his office everyday and not only dictates a considerable amount of mail but additionally sees a large number of people. He is quite accustomed to a well disciplined schedule.

I talked briefly with Lt. Colonel John Eisenhower, the General's son who has an office right below that of his Father's. He, of course, is still in the service but is on loan to his Father for the purposes of writing a book covering his Father's life. Doubleday is handling the publishing of the book and has an employee assigned to Col. Eisenhower for assisting him in the writing.

It is believed that Col. Schulz is well aware of the Director's desire to be of assistance to General Eisenhower and that such assistance will probably pick up in the near future. Col. Schulz has both my office and home telephone numbers and I have told him the Director would want him to call me at any time day or night to be of service to General Eisenhower.



Attached request appears to be based upon suspicion that there may be microphone installations or telephone taps in the office of the U. S. Attorney or two of his assistants.

S. STEEL." In view of this incident, SULLIVAN is suspicious that in some manner information is leaking from the U. S. Attorney's office.

Mr. DUNCAN stated that he has been planning to make a request through the Department of Justice asking that the Department request the FBI to conduct a search of three specific offices at the U.S. Attorney's office for the purpose of determining whether or not a microphone installation and/or technical coverage of the telephone lines to these three offices might be in effect. The three offices involved are the offices of U. S. Attorney DAVID ACHESON, the office of Principal Assistant CHARLES T. DUNCAN and the office of AUSA HAROLD SULLIVAN. DUNCAN stated that ordinarily requests of this kind are handled by the General Accounting Office. He stated he has been in touch with the General Accounting Office and they declined to make this check as the FBI is presently conducting an investigation in connection with certain ramifications of the Mayflower "Bugging" matter. It is noted that this office is conducting an investigation as an outgrowth of the Mayflower "Bugging" matter concerning alleged bribery and intimidation of witness in case captioned "ALLEGED BRIBERY AND INTIMIDATION OF NITNESS REGARDING 'WIRE TAP," ROOM 633, MAYFLOWER HOTEL, WASHINGTON, D. C., 4/4/62 - INFORMATION CONCERNING," Bufile 63-7612, WFO 62-8544.

Mr. DUNCAN pointed out that the U. S. Attorney's office has absolutely no definite information indicating that any technical coverage is in effect in their office and that they have received no indication that information obtained or directly connected with our specific investigation is involved. It is my frank opinion from talking to Mr. DUNCAN that any leaks in the U. S. Attorney's office are probably caused by AUSA SULLIVAN and/or others in his office talking with certain individuals whom they feel are reliable sources in connection with the grand jury and police department investigation of the actual "bugging" incident. However, in view of the specific request made by Mr. DUNCAN, which he had intended to make directly to the Department, it is requested that the Bureau authorize experienced technicians from the FBI Laboratory to make a check of the three offices mentioned, or authorize me to have this check made by experienced personnel of the Washington Field Office.

which is encoded at the point of origin and decoded at the receiving end by means of special equipment. In order to actuate the equipment, a special coded card must be inserted in the equipment. These coded cards are changed each day at the same time on a world-wide basis. The cards are changed in the Washington area at 8:00 p.m. daily. The change must be made by a person having Top Secret clearance.

The mechanics of handling this matter are essentially very simple. There is a combination lock on the equipment. The door to the equipment is opened by means of this combination. There is a receptacle immediately inside the door which contains a pad of the cards, approximately 3" X 8". These cards are similar in appearance to the ordinary IBM card. The old card is removed and a new card inserted. The person handling this initials the log to show that the new card was inserted and the old card destroyed by burning.

The Attorney General said he knew that the Bureau had Special L Agents on duty in the Justice Building 24 hours a day. He said he would like to have the Agent who is on duty during the evening hours handle the changing of the cards in this special telephone equipment. It was pointed out to the Attorney General that a similar question had previously been

raised with the Bureau by the Department with regard to the maintenance of this equipment, and we had told the Department the only person we had who was qualified to maintain such equipment was not located in Washington but was assigned to our facilities at Quantico, where our only security telephone of this type is located. The Attorney General said this was not a question of maintenance but rather just keeping the coded card up-to-date.

It was then suggested that perhaps the Attorney General could have people in his own office do this. He replied by indicating that the work was now being handled by his Executive Assistant, but that he had to send out of town a great deal. He also stated that he thought this was a particularly sensitive assignment and he would be much more secure in his own mind if it could be handled by the FBI.

It was then pointed out to the Attorney General that security reasons would obviously preclude any widespread knowledge of the special equipment he had and its combination; that we rotated the assignment of our Special Agents on weekend duty and this would mean that a different Agent would be in charge every Saturday and Sunday. The Attorney General said he would handle the matter himself on the weekend but he would still appreciate our handling it during the week.

He again noted that this is a sensitive assignment and that international conditions are tense, and he knew he would not have to worry if the job could be done by the FBI.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN:

It would seem that the Attorney General should be able to get some trustworthy person in the Department to do this job. The mere fact that it has too been done during the evening hours should not make any difference. Nevertheless, he keeps coming back to the thought that the FBI is better qualified. If it is desired that we assist the Attorney General, it would be possible to have one of our regularly-assigned people either in our own code room or an Agent Supervisor regularly assigned to the 4:00 p.m. to midnight shift handle the assignment. It is noted that it would take only a few minutes time each night to do this.
