

He stated that the applicant, while being a genius, is not a cockeyed genius that has good contact with the world around him, and is neither a misogynist nor a misanthrope. He stated that the applicant is either one all or one quarter Jewish on his mother's side and that this resulted in his being a refugee from Germany. He stated that right from the beginning. the applicant was unsympathetic with the Mitler regime. He said that the applicant's wife is the deproter of Stuttgarden, Germany, who is famous for his work in connection with the development with the ex-ray. He stated that the applicant's father is a famous European professor. Dr. FRACK could not elaborate on this. he summed up by stating that the applicant in a frank, honest ren of the highest status of American ideas and ideals.

Mothe and other scientists on Tebruary 4, 1950, at Columbia University where a meeting of the American Physical Association was being held. Dr. Bothe was quoted as stating that he was one of the few reople Fuchs associated with at Los Alemos, New Mexico, and that they were very friendly. The article quoted Bethe as stating, "I didn't know about his real opinions. If he was a spy he played his role absolutely perfectly." Br. Bethe is reported to have also stated that Fuchs was not prominent in urging international exchange of scientific information. Dr. Bethe stated that Fuchs was one of the most valuable men in his division at Los Clamos; "everybody liked him... To made an extremely great contribution." Concerning Fuchs' background, the article quotes Dr. Bethe as stating th to "His father was quite prominent in the Church... so I new r suspected him of anything like being a Communist. she man of the Church his father strongly opposed Eitler and went to prison for that in Taxany. which is all to his credit. We was of that grown of outspoken clergymes. opposing Witler."

Or. Boths was also quoted as stating that, The need British to help us... Now we believe they will be shut off from our work... To have to know our friends.

The "Journal American" newspaper of New York City for February 5, 1950, also carried an article concerning Fuchs in which Dr. Bethe is quoted as stating, "I knew Fuchs well. I considered him a first class man, from a scientific standpoint. At the time I knew him, I never questioned his loyalty." Dr. Bethe is also quoted as stating that America's "closely guarded" secrets on hydrogen bombs are now "no longer secrets."

You are instructed to conduct an immediate, thorough, discreet investigation concerning the character, associates, and loyalty of the above-named individual in accordance with the provisions of the Atomic Moergy Act of 1946.

Reports and correspondence in this case should reflect the character as AEAE.

At the request of the Atomic Energy Commission the Bureau has consented to make inquiries on certain of its employees for the purpose of bringing the original applicant investigation up-to-date. These employees occupy very sensitive positions: therefore, all inquiries must be thorough and all inclusive.

The employee's entire adult life must be accounted for. If this was not done during the original investigation it will be necessary to account for the adult life during instant investigation.

The scope of the current investigation must include interviews with present neighbors, associates, acquaintances, and whenever desirable confidential informants should be contacted. Credit and criminal checks should be made on the employee. The same checks should be made on his immediate relatives at their known place of residence.

Those asking questions pertaining to the purpose of this investigation should be advised that the inquiries are being made at the request of the AEC and are of a routine nature.

Personnal records of the University of California at Los Alamos, made available by reflect that Dr. BETHE was employed as a research group leader in the Theoretical Physics Division of the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory frum April 1, 1943, to January 11, 1946, when he voluntarily resigned to return to his former position at Cornell University. The records reflect that he has been continuously retained as a consultant to the Theoretical Physics Division of the University of California at Los Alamos from April 1, 1946, to the present, and that in such capacity he has been physically present at Los Alamos during the following indicated periods:

Four days in 1946
5 days in 1947
7 days in 1948
July 4 to July 8, 1949
December 28, 1950 to January 28, 1951
February 3, 1952 to September 10, 1952
May 1, 1953, to September 12, 1953.

The records further indicate that at various times between 1946 and present Dr. BETHE has also been paid for performing considerable consultant work for the University of California while he physically remained at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. He is presently paid for such services at the rate of \$120.00 per day.

Instant personnel records reflect that Dr. BETHE was born on July 2, 1906, at Strasbourg, Germany, and that he was maturalized as a citizen of the United States at Ithaca, New York, on February 10, 1941. On a Personnel Security Questionnaire executed for the University of California and and the Atomic Energy Commission under date of August 18, 1947, he indicated that his father, ALBRECHT BETHE, was then living at Frankfurt-on-Main, Germany, and that he had one step-brother and one step-sister at the same address as his father. He indicated that his mother, ANNA BETHE, nee KUHN, resided in Long Island, New York, and that his WAS also born in Germany. Additional records in possession of the University of California at Los Alamos reflect that was born on at Munich, Germany, and that she was naturalized as a citizen of the United States on November 10, 1941, at Ithaca. New York. On a similar Personnel Security Questionnaire executed by under date of April 17, 1943, she indicated that her parents, PETER PAUL and ELLA EWALD, both

From 1946 through 1949 had occasional contact with RETHE at Cornell University, and from 1950 to the present he has worked very closely with him whenever he has been at Los Alamos, with occasional consultation meetings at Cornell University or other places. He also indicated that he has had considerable social contact with BETHE and his wife and stated that he is certain that he has had more contact with Dr. BETHE than anyone else presently at Los Alamos..

stated that BETHE is "extremely capable" as one of the outstanding physicists in the world; that he is honest and conscientious to a degree, and that he is very methodical and thorough on any type of work that he may engage in. He stated that he has never had any reason whatsoever to question the basic loyalty of Dr. BETHE to the United States, and that he is certain that Dr. BETHE entertains a very definite feeling for the desirability of life under a free, democratic form of government. He advised that the mothers of both Dr. BETHE and his wife presently reside in the vicinity of New York City; that he is not certain as to whether either of their fathers are now living, and that to the best of his knowledge neither of them attempt to maintain any particular contact with any possible relative or other individual presently residing in Europe

advised that some individuals may have indicated some criticism of Dr. BETHE because of his apparent lack of active participation in the weapons development program between 1946 and 1950, and that he believes that during such period FETHE did entertain considerable hope that development of greater weapons would not be necessary, and that a way might be found for permanent peace. But he stated derinitely that he has never known FFTHE to offer any active or actual vocal opposition to development of greater veapons, specifically the H-Bomb, and that to the contrary FETHF was actually in Tayor of its development all the time, if possible, although until about 1950 he was not convinced that it was feasible or workable. 


Albuquerque Confidential Informant of known reliability. advised that shortly before commencement of the trial of JULIUS and ETHEL FOSFNBURG on charges of espionage in Federal District Court at New York City, an attorney for the ROSENBURG's directed a letter to HANS BETHE and other outstanding scientists in the United States in which he asked a number of leading questions relative to the possible importance of information furnished Russian espionage agents by the ROSFNBURG espionage ring, and whether or not it would appear logical that BAVID GREENGLASS, in view of his lack of scientific training and background, would be able to provide sufficiently accurate information relative to the atomic weapon to be of actual detriment to the security of the United States. The informant advised that he did not furnish Dr. BETHE any type of advice on this matter, but that he did observe the reply that BETHE personally wrote and sent to this attorney in letter form. Informant stated that in this letter EETHE advised the attorney that in his opinion the information purportedly furnished Russian espionage agents was quite definitely restricted data of considerable importance in the field of atomic weapons and was certainly to the detriment of security of the United States. He furthermore told the attorney that in his opinion GREENGLASS was capable of relaying such information in sufficient detail to be of great value to a possible inerry nation. The informant stated that BETHE definitely did not furnish

any aid or comfort whatsoever to the defense of the ROSENFURGS, or even indicate any possible sympathy for such cause, and that the information or opinion offered by him was not utilized during such trial. To the best of the knowledge of informant, this is the only connection that BETHE ever had with the ROSENBURG espionage case or trial.

Informant requested that his identity not be revealed in connection with this matter due to the confidential nature of his relationship with Dr. EETHE in regard to it.





By letter dated January 22, 1954, a summary reflecting the results of an investigation of Dr. Hans Albrecht bethe was furnished to you. As stated in that letter, this summary did not include a record check of several other Coverment agencies.

The records of the Office of Baval Intelligence contained no additional information regarding Dr. Bethe. The records of the Security Division, New York Operations Office of the Atomie Energy Commission, New York City, reflected that Dr. Bothe was granted a security clearance on May 1, 1947. This clearence was reaffirmed on January 20, 1950, and July 21, 1953.

Information contained in the above records indicated that Dr. Bethe was probably employed by the Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation at Oak Hidge. Tennessee, as a sonsultant to the Research Directors Division. Inquiry has determined that Dr. bethe has a subcontract as a consultant with this company which was entered into on October 1, 1951, and will expire September 30, 1954. Dr. Bethe has visited Oak Ridge on official business on two occasions for periods of two days during the period of the contract. This concludes the investigation of Dr. Sethe.

If derogatory information is developed in the course of the investigation a confrontational interview is not to be conducted in accordance with a DOE/FBI agreement. At the conclusion of the FBI's investigation and reporting of the results DOE will conduct the required interview.

All investigation required is outlined in the MiOG. Interviews relating to derogatory information must be recorded on FD-302 forms (MACP, Part II, Section 18-13.3.5). The candidate should be checked through indices in the offices covering all places of residence, employment, or education. Close family members, cohabitants and business entity or affiliation, and references/associates should be checked through indices in the offices covering their current residence and/or employment. indices to be checked are: general, confidential, electronic surveillance (ELSUR) and any specialized indices unique to your You need not check OCIS, IIS, or ISIS division (such as Woodmur). which are now checked at FBIHQ. Offices conducting indices checks only may transmit results to FBIHQ by sirtel or teletype. All other investigation must be transmitted in report format. Those offices submitting reports should include results of indices checks in the administrative section of the report. Current cohabitants not related to the candidate must be interviewed as close personal associates.

Refrain from sending the results of investigation by teletype to save typing in the field and at FBIHQ. Each office should consider sending reports to FBIHQ via an overnight package express company, in lieu of teletypes, attention SPIN, Room 18035.

Major issues developed that require FBIHQ participation for resolution should be communicated in writing but preceded by telephone discussion (FTS 324-2568).

When a field office determines the Bureau deadline cannot be met due to circumstances beyond their control, FBI Headquarters should be contacted immediately and an FD-205 submitted. An extension will be sought from the client agency by FBIHQ.

Applicant is a renowned physicist with a vast background and would be known by the entire staff, if not by personal association then by reputation. In SIVERS opinion, applicant is a gentleman of the highest moral character and those associates of applicant known to SIVERS, which would be people at the University, are of similar high moral character. b6 Applicant has an excellent reputation and is totally dedicated to the country. SIVERS is aware of no alcohol or drug use by applicant and knows of no derogatory information concerning applicant. SIVERS would recommend without reservation.

RECORD CHECK

A review of Fb. files disclosed the following additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Bethe:

In December, 1951, a name check was conducted on Dr. bethe at the request of the National Science Foundation. A copy of a letterhead memorandum dated December 7, 1951 containing the results of that check is enclosed. It is noted that all information contained therein was previously made available to the Atomic Energy Commission. (133-0)

Dr. Bethe was the subject of background investigations (BI) in 1947 at the request of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC), in 1954 at the request of the Department of Defense, and in 1958, 1965 and 1966 at the request of the White house. Summary memoranda containing the result of those investigations are enclosed. The 1947 BI was incorporated into the 1954 BI. These BI's and name check contain information from other FBI files. (161-4010, 116-2241, 77-60618)

In 1962, an investigation under the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act (AEA) was conducted regarding Dr. Bethe. The AEC alleged that Dr. Bethe disclosed classified information in January, 1962 speech and February, 1962 article based on the speech. Details of that investigation are contained in the enclosed 1965 EI. (117-2406)

In 1968, another investigation under the provisions of the AEA-Espionage was conducted regarding Dr. Bethe. The AEC alleged that Dr. Bethe disclosed classified information in a harch, 1966 magazine article. No action was taken in this regard as in an earlier case involving the same information, the Department of Justice Edvised that prosecution was not warrantee as there were conflicting opinions on critical points in the matter. This intermation was previously furnished to the AEC on harch 25, 1968. (117-2565)
