Re: Protest of Issuing Cultivation Facility Licenses

To the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission (“Commission”):

Please accept this letter as an official protest regarding the issuance of licenses for the cultivation of medical marijuana in Arkansas to the following entities (or individuals on behalf of entities): (1) NSMC-OPCO, LLC; (2) Bold Team, LLC; (3) Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC; (4) Osage Creek Cultivation, LLC; and (5) Delta Medical Cannabis Company, LLC.

I am the individual applicant for a cultivation facility license on behalf of Delta Cannabinoid Corporation. I know first-hand that the Commission has worked diligently to award licenses for Arkansas’s medical marijuana industry and that thousands of qualifying patients have been waiting for access to medicine. I believe, however, that the long-term health of this industry requires that licenses only be awarded fairly and impartially, with strict adherence to the law, so that patients can be confident in the integrity of the industry and the quality of their medicine.

Accordingly, I request that the Commission refrain from issuing licenses to the above listed entities for the following reasons: (1) such issuance would violate Amendment 98 to the Arkansas Constitution (“Amendment 98”) and be based upon an error of law; (2) the Commission failed to adopt or enforce rules necessary for the fair and impartial administration of its duties under Amendment 98; (3) the Commission’s review, selection, and scoring decisions of applications were not supported by substantial evidence of record and were arbitrary and capricious; and (4) the Commission failed to consider adequately the importance and need of racial diversity in the industry and for a majority minority-owned cultivation facility.

1. Issuance of the Licenses to the Selected Entities Violates Amendment 98 Because the Selected Entities Are Not Incorporated

The Commission’s rules, procedures, and actions, including the licensing of individuals and entities to operate cultivation facilities, is governed by Amendment 98 of the Arkansas Constitution. Section 10(b)(2) of Amendment 98 states: “A dispensary and a cultivation facility shall be an entity incorporated in the State of Arkansas.”

The Arkansas Supreme Court has emphasized that it will “interpret [a] constitutional provision . . . precisely as it reads.” *Bd of Trustees of Univ. of Arkansas v. Andrews*, 2018 Ark. 12, at 10. The term “incorporate” means “[t]o form a legal corporation.” Black’s Law Dictionary (9th ed. 2010). The Arkansas Code makes it painstakingly clear that a corporation is materially different than an LLC. *See e.g.*, Ark. Code Ann. § 4-32-102 (defining “Corporation” separately from and differently than a “Limited Liability Company”). Moreover, to form a corporation, Arkansas law requires one to file “articles of incorporation, which shall be duly signed by all of the incorporators,” but to form an LLC, Arkansas law requires one to “sign[] articles of organization.” *Compare* Ark. Code Ann. § 4-26-202 to Ark. Code Ann. § 4-32-201. The distinction between incorporating a corporation and organizing an LLC is an axiomatic principle of business law that (1) informs individuals of the different requirements for forming the entities and (2) notifies people about the structure of organizations with whom they’re dealing, how those organizations make decisions, and who may be held accountable in the organizations. In short, the distinction between a corporation and an LLC is one that matters.

Amendment 98 is crystal clear. Interpreted “precisely as it reads,” Section 10(b)(2) requires a cultivation facility to be incorporated and, thus, be a corporation. All five entities that the Commission has selected to receive a cultivation facility license are limited liability companies. By the terms of Amendment 98, none of these entities are allowed to be a licensed cultivation facility.

Amendment 98 further provides that the Commission is subject to the Administrative Procedures Act, which prohibits the Commission from violating constitutional or statutory provisions. Amend. 98 §8(b)(2); Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-212(h). Amendment 98 establishes minimum criteria to which the Commission’s rules and decisions must adhere. Indeed, the Commission has set forth a precedent of disqualifying applicants for failing to meet minimum criteria, including criteria stated in Amendment 98. Therefore, the Commission is required by law to disqualify all entities that are not incorporated, including the five entities currently selected to receive licenses, and to award the licenses to the top ranked corporations.

Accordingly, I request that the Commission refrain from awarding licenses to the five selected entities or their representatives, disqualify all entities not incorporated, and notify the top ranked corporations of their selection and ensuing requirements for paying the license fee and posting a performance bond, pending assurances that all such corporations are otherwise qualified to receive a license.

2. The Commission failed to Adopt or Enforce Rules Necessary for the Fair and Impartial Administration of its Duties

Section 8(d) of Amendment 98 provides that “the commission shall adopt rules governing . . . matters necessary for the commission’s fair, impartial, stringent, and comprehensive administration of its duties under this amendment.” Further, Amendment 98 prohibits a Commissioner from having an “economic interest” in a cultivation facility. The Amendment does not define “economic interest,” but elsewhere in the law the term is defined to include “a relationship as officer, director, advisor or other active participant in the affairs of a party.” *See*

Honorable Huffman v. AR Judicial Discipline, 344 Ark. 274 (2001). Arkansas’s statutes and regulations, including those covering the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division and governing the Ethics Commission, emphasize the important governmental interest in ensuring that officials act impartially and without conflicts of interest.

The Commission failed to adopt any rules governing the impartial administration of its duties, and to the extent it aimed to create such rules, the Commission wholly failed to enforce or abide by them. The Commission did not adopt any rules governing Commissioners’ conflicts of interest or Commissioners’ communication about license applications with applicants or individuals whom Commissioners knew intended to become applicants. In the absence of any such properly promulgated rules, one or more Commissioners communicated and/or maintained professional relationships with individuals whom the Commissioners knew intended to apply for a license. Further, the Commission allowed itself to review and score cultivation facility applications despite one or more Commissioners having biases and conflicts of interest because of such communications and/or relationships. One or more of the Commissioner’s scores even suggests preferential treatment because of such conflicts of interest and biases.

The purported directive that individuals’ names in the applications viewed by the Commissioners would be redacted to “depersonalize” the applications was wholly inadequate and falls short of the requirements of Amendment 98. Individuals’ names are not the only easily identifiable ways to recognize a person, especially if there is a relationship that would cause a Commissioner to recognize an individual by way of that individual’s past employment or business ventures, detailed experiences, places of residence or employment, and/or other unique identifiers. The Commission made no rules to ensure that it could (1) review applications without reasonably knowing the identities of certain individuals or (2) maintain impartiality when a Commissioner reviewed an application containing detailed information about experiences of individuals with whom the Commissioner had a working relationship.

Without such rules, one or more Commissioners reviewed applications of individuals with whom the Commissioner had a relationship, whose identities the Commissioner knew, and who the Commissioner knew intended to apply for a license. Intentional or not, the allowance of Commissioners to serve on the Commission with a conflict of interest, combined with the inadequate “depersonalization,” undermined the Commission’s impartiality and calls into question the Commission’s review and scoring of applications. As evidence of at least one concerning conflict of interest and potentially resulting preference, please see attached a Citizen Complaint filed with the Arkansas Ethics Commission on March 9, 2018, alleging certain conflicts of interest of a Commissioner. Because of this pending Citizen Complaint, I request that the Commission refrain from awarding licenses to the five selected entities or stay the award of any licenses until resolution of the Citizen Complaint by the Ethics Commission and reasonable assurances of the Commission’s impartial administration of its duties.

3. The Review and Selection of Applications was Arbitrary and Capricious

The Commission’s review of applications was arbitrary and capricious for two reasons. First, the Commission’s review of the minimum qualifications of applications and selection for scoring of certain applications that appear to have not met the minimum qualifications violates the

Commission's rules and Amendment 98. Second, the Commission's scoring decisions of certain applications lacked substantial evidence and were arbitrary and capricious.

a. Review and Rejection of Applications for Failing to Meet Minimum Qualifications was Arbitrary and Capricious

All five entities selected by the Commission appear to have submitted applications that did not meet the minimum requirements set forth by the Commission. By reviewing and scoring these applications and selecting them as winners, the Commission's actions are arbitrary and capricious and in violation of the Commission's rules. The Commission's rules state that only "[a]pplications that have been received and verified by the commission will be considered based upon the selection processes set out in Section IV.9," which is the "Selection Process and Criteria Based on Merit Selection." RR. § IV.3(c). Further, the Commission's Request for Application ("RFA") states: "Only applications which meet the requirements of AMMC Rules, Sections IV.4 and IV.5 will be subject to further review and merit scoring by the commission. Applications which fail to meet the requirements of Section IV.4 and IV.5 will be rejected." RFA, at 3.

All five respective applications appear to fall short of the Commission's minimum requirements and, therefore, never should have been subjected to further review or merit scoring by the Commission. The following issues disqualify the selected applications.

i. Invalid Passports

The Commission's rules and the RFA required that applicants and certain individuals establish their legal name and date of birth by providing at least one of several listed documents. One of the approved documents is a "[v]alid, unexpired U.S. passport or U.S. passport card." RR. IV.5(b)(i)(2). Regulations for the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services division of the Department of Homeland Security provide that "[a] passport is valid only when signed by the bearer in the space designated for signature." 22 CFR § 51.4.

As evidenced from the applications for the five selected entities released by the Commission, the owners, directors, or officers listed below provided only unsigned, invalid U.S. passports to prove either or both of their legal name and date of birth.

- Terence Fitch, General Manager, NSMC-OPCO, LLC Application, Section B, Appendix 2, p.541.
- Kyndall Lercher, Medical Director and Owner (25.5%), Bold Team, LLC Application, Section B, Appendix 1, p.40.
- Mary Trulove, Applicant, CEO and Owner (60%), Osage Creek Cultivation, LLC Application, Section B, Appendix 1 and 2, pp. 71-72.
- Three individual owners of Delta Medical Cannabis Company (the identities of these owners are unknown as the copies of their passports did not accompany a particular Section B Form), Delta Medical Cannabis Company, LLC Application, Section B, Appendix 1 and 2, pp. 64, 67-68, 82, 88, 90.

Because the above listed entities/applications did not provide valid proof of certain owners, directors, or officers' legal names and/or dates of birth, the applications failed to meet the Commission's minimum requirements and, thus, should not have been reviewed or scored for merit by the Commission. I request that the Commission disqualify the above cited applications.

ii. Proof of Assets

Osage Creek Cultivation, LLC's application failed to provide proof of assets and should be disqualified. The Commission's rules state: "Applicants shall provide proof of assets or a surety bond in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 and proof of at least \$500,000.00 in liquid assets." RR. IV.4(c). Further, the rule states that "if an applicant posts a surety bond, the bond shall be maintained . . ." *Id.* Osage Creek Cultivation, LLC appears to have shown proof of liquid assets, although the amount is redacted in the released application. To the extent that Osage Creek's amount of liquid assets was below \$1,000,000.00, then Osage Creek would be required to have a surety bond. Osage Creek provided a Surety Bond, but that bond was not signed and thus, not "maintained" as required by the Rules. *See* Osage Creek Cultivation, LLC Application, pp. 7 and 452. Because Osage Creek did not maintain the surety bond, they failed to demonstrate proof of minimum assets or a surety bond as required by the rules and, therefore, Osage Creek's application should not have been reviewed or scored for merit by the Commission. I request that the Commission disqualify Osage Creek's application.

iii. Criminal History Background Checks

Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC failed to provide Background Check Applications or Background Check Results in its application for two listed officers and, therefore, its application should be disqualified. The Commission's rules require "[a]ll owners, officers, and board members of an entity seeking to apply for a cultivation license through its designated individual applicant" to complete an application for a Criminal History Check by the Arkansas State Police and provide the results of the background check in the application packet upon submission to the Commission. RR IV.6(a); RFA, pp. 4-5 ("The applicant and all owners, officers, and board members affiliated with the proposed cultivation facility are required to complete an application for a Criminal History Check by the Arkansas State Police. Results from the Criminal History Check must be included with the application packet when it is submitted to the Commission. . . . Application packets must include the following: . . .Background results from the Arkansas State Police for the applicant and all owners, officers, and board members affiliated with the proposed cultivation facility.").

Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC's application states that its company's operating team includes the following people: "John Terry, Chief Financial Officer" and "Chris Hewitt, Chief Operating Officer." Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC Application, Ex. 11, p. 879. These individuals are not owners of Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC, but they are listed as officers. In a review of documents legally obtained through a FOIA request, it was discovered that these individuals failed to submit applications for a Criminal History Check by the Arkansas State Police. Further, Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC's application provides 27 redacted Arkansas State Police background check results forms, equaling the number of owners of Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC. If these listed officers had included their background check results, then 29 redacted background check results forms would be provided. Therefore, Natural

State Wellness Enterprises, LLC failed to provide background check applications and results for all individuals required to provide them and, therefore, failed to meet the Commission's minimum requirements. Accordingly, I ask that the Commission disqualify the application of Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC.

b. Scoring Decisions Lacked Substantial Evidence and Were Arbitrary and Capricious

The AMMC released the separate grades given by each Commissioner for every application. Several outliers and anomalies call into question whether certain groups were given preferences despite their applications lacking substantial evidence to justify higher scores. At a minimum, some of the grading disparities indicate arbitrary and capricious decisions in violation of the Administrative Procedures Act.

Several applications had substantively the same answers on the same questions but received different grades. For example, the application graded groups on their "Timeline to Open." Two different groups both proposed a 7-month timeline, with one group receiving 2 out of 4 points from a Commissioner while the other group, one of the winners, received 4 out of 4 points from the same Commissioner. For "Qualifications of Applicant," one Commissioner gave my application a 3/10, or an "Underqualified" score, and another Commissioner gave my application a 6/10, despite the other three Commissioners all giving the application a 10/10 and despite the application having a roster that met all requirements and included a Black D.O. with experience at the University of Mississippi's federal cannabis program, a member of the Arkansas Black Hall of Fame who is the Chairwoman of the Lee County Community Clinic, a former Circuit Court Judge and farmer who is a member of the Arkansas Black Hall of Fame, several local, experienced farmers, and internationally-renowned scientists and Ph.D. experts in cannabis and medicine.

Further, it is evident from the Commission's document "Cultivation Facility Score Breakdown," that Commissioners neither reviewed nor scored Schedule 7 for any of the applications. Rather, ABC and/or DFA staff apparently reviewed such schedules and gave a uniform 2.5 points for all material submitted in response to Schedule 7 without comparing the relative merits of each application's content for this Schedule. This is evident because every application's score for this Schedule is the same for all five Commissioners, and the Commissioners' scoring rubric sheet does not include a space for the scoring of Schedule 7.

Unlike Schedules 5 and 6, which asked for simple facts (such as location of the facility and resulting economic tier) that did not require Commissioners to evaluate the merit of content, Schedule 7 asked for substantive content such as substance abuse, compassionate care, and research plans that required an evaluation of merit. Schedule 7d also indicated that the Commission would award points based on the "percentage of ownership in a cultivation facility by Arkansas residents." Unlike the Schedule 6 sections giving points for "at least 51% ownership" by various groups, Schedule 7d indicates that groups with higher percentages of Arkansas ownership would get higher points than groups with lower percentages of Arkansas ownership. The uniform scoring of the applications for Schedule 7 shows that Schedule 7d was not applied according to its terms.

I also have a deep concern that higher scores were given to groups that celebrated their experience manufacturing products that would be illegal under Arkansas law. One of the winning applications emphasized its team's experience manufacturing Bhang chocolate bars, "the most awarded cannabis edible product in the country" and its team's perfect compliance track record, having delivered "1,000,000 products without an incident comprising product or employee safety or security." Bhang chocolate edibles would be an illegal product form in Arkansas's medical marijuana market because they would appeal to children in violation of the ABC's regulations. (ABC RR 12.2.). Such products are not in line with Arkansas's medical program or the public interest. My application focused exclusively on medical products and over-compliance, pledging not to sell "flower" or "edible" product forms, yet received lower scores than the other application for "Qualifications of Applicant" and "Manufacturing."

These cited disparities, among others, demonstrate that many scores were not supported by substantial evidence and were arbitrary and capricious. Several applications were scored with zero points on some sections despite having content for those sections. Although the cited point differentials may seem small, very few points separated the winners from the alternates (10 points separated No. 5 and No. 10). Therefore, these discrepancies materially affected the final rankings of applicants and, combined with the apparent conflicts of interest, undermine the integrity of the Commission's selections. I request that the Commission refrain from awarding licenses to the five selected entities, pending a review of the scores and applications, and the implementation of standardized scoring procedures that remove the risk of bias.

4. The Commission Did Not Consider Adequately the Need for Racial Diversity in the Industry

Despite the application's appearance of providing bonus points for "diversity," the Commission failed to consider the need for racial diversity in the majority-ownership and operations of this industry and excluded Blacks from having an equal opportunity to receive a license.

Arkansas has some of the most harmful marijuana-possession laws and has arrested Blacks for such crimes at a rate of more than three times the rate it arrests Whites,¹ even though marijuana consumption is roughly equal among the two races.² Several owners of winning cultivation applications played roles in the institutions that prosecuted and enforced these laws. Now, this industry is legal, and the same individuals are standing to profit from it.

The Commission's allocation of points for "Diversity" diluted any consideration of an entity's minority ownership. Sixty-one out of eighty-two Cultivation Facility applicants (75%) received maximum bonus points allowed for "Diversity." Four out of the five winners received these bonus points for having 51% or more ownership by women, many of whom do not appear involved in governance or operations of the entities and who are spouses or relatives of other owners. Further, by giving the same points to women-owned businesses as black-owned businesses, the application undermined any preference or bonus points for minorities with a majority ownership stake or operational position. This process contradicts public policy as outlined

in Ark. Code Ann. § 15-4-301, et seq. (providing a higher percentage of state procurement contracts be given for minority-owned businesses than for women-owned businesses and indicating importance of operational ownership versus nominal equity only ownership). The diversity section also did not give more points for greater minority ownership, meaning that a group with 51% minority ownership received the same points as groups with 90% or more minority ownership, and without consideration of governance or operations.

The implications of the Commission’s failure to consider adequately the race of applicants and their operational teams is staggering:

- Zero (0) majority black-owned winning groups
- Total Black Ownership Percentage: **9.12% out of 100%** (45.59% out of 500%)
- Total Number of Black Owners: **5 out of 53 Total Owners**
- Total Black Governance: **6.67% out of 100%**
- Total Black Operations: **0%**
- One (1) out of the five (5) winning groups listed itself as a majority minority-owned group, with exactly 51% majority minority ownership. Natural State Wellness Enterprises, LLC counted Mr. William “Ryan” Young’s 34% ownership stake as “minority” ownership. Mr. Young listed his race as “W” in his ASP background check form.

Given the history of prosecutions against Blacks for marijuana possession laws, the absence of Black ownership and operations in this new industry, and the Commission’s failure to consider adequately these disparities, I request that the Commission refrain from awarding licenses until after it conducts a report on the need for majority minority ownership and operations in the industry and determines the necessity of re-evaluating applications and the “diversity” section given such report.

Conclusion

The goal of this letter is to ensure Arkansas maintains a fair and equitable medical marijuana industry. The concerning issues and questions cited above need to be answered and investigated before licenses are awarded. Please accept this letter as a good faith attempt to resolve the issues with the Commission in an effort to preserve the integrity of Arkansas’s medical marijuana program.



2. State in your own words the detailed facts and the actions of the person named in section 1 which prompted you to make this complaint. Include relevant dates, times, and the names, and addresses of other persons whom you believe have knowledge of the facts.

- I. The Medical Marijuana Commission is a “Covered Board” under the Ethics Commission’s Rules on Special State Employees – Conflicts of Interest and Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-718.
 - a. The Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission (“Commission”) was created as a commission within the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration and is therefore “a commission . . . created within the executive branch.”
 - b. The Commission was created by constitutional amendment and various enacting legislation, including through appropriation legislation for the Department of Finance and Administration, and is therefore “an entity that is created by regulation, statute, legislative direction, executive order, or other informal means” and maintains “decision-making authority over procurement criteria, contracts, appointment of individuals to negotiate procurement directly or indirectly, or the approval of procurements.” Rules on Special State Employees – Conflicts of Interest, §100(b).
- II. Travis Story is a “Special State Employee” under the Ethics Commission’s Rules on Special State Employees – Conflicts of Interest and Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-718.
 - a. Travis Story is a person appointed to the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission and is therefore a “Special state employee” as defined in Rules on Special State Employees – Conflicts of Interest, §100(c).
- III. Travis Story voted on, received, or read confidential materials related to, participated in the discussion of, or attempted to influence the covered board’s decision on a procurement matter.
 - a. Travis Story reviewed all Arkansas Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility License Applications submitted to the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission. (Ex. A)

- b. Travis Story graded or scored certain Arkansas Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility License Applications submitted to the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission (“Applications”) for the purpose of determining which Applications would be chosen and therefore which individuals and entities would become licensed to operate medical marijuana cultivation facilities in Arkansas. (Ex. A)
- IV. Travis Story has a “Conflict of Interest” under the Ethics Commission’s Rules on Special State Employees – Conflicts of Interest and Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-718.
- a. Travis story has a direct or indirect interest in certain Arkansas Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility License Applications submitted to the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission.
 - b. Jay and Mary Trulove submitted an Arkansas Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility License Application to the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission individually and associated with the entity Osage Creek Cultivation, L.L.C. (“Osage Creek”). (Ex. B).
 - c. Jay and Mary Trulove own Osage Creek. (Ex. B).
 - d. Jay Trulove is the Incorporator/Organizer for Osage Creek, the organization of which was filed on April 21, 2017 and a matter of public record on the Secretary of State’s website. (Ex. C).
 - e. Osage Creek’s Application was Application No. 83. (Ex. A).
 - f. Travis Story ranked Osage Creek’s application No. 3 in his overall rankings. (Ex. A).
 - g. Osage Creek’s next highest rank among the other commissioners was No. 6 and its average ranking among the other commissioners was No. 20.5. (Ex. A).
 - h. Travis Story has or has had an attorney-client relationship with Jay and Mary Trulove or businesses owned or operated by Jay and Mary Trulove of Berryville, Arkansas.
 - i. Travis Story was the Incorporator/Organizer for Trulove Properties LLC which was organized on February 1, 2016. (Ex. D).
 - j. Travis Story was the Incorporator/Organizer for Trulove Farms, LLC which was organized on October 12, 2016. (Ex. E).

- q. Osage Creek was represented by registered lobbyist Chase Dugger. (Ex. K).
- r. Chase Dugger contributed \$325.00 worth of "Food" to Bob Ballinger on June 15, 2017. (Ex. J).
- s. On October 30, 2017, Ballinger's campaign paid "Sports Corner" \$626.75. (Ex. L).
- t. "Sports Corner" is owned by Jay and Mary Trulove. (Ex. B, pp. 43-46; Ex. M)
- u. Jay and Mary Trulove provided resumes as exhibits to their Cultivation Application. These resumes listed "Sports Corner" as an employer and described the Truloves' business experiences with Sports Corner as well as with other entities, including the entities that Travis Story organized for the Truloves. (Ex. B, pp. 43-46)
- v. Bob Ballinger paid JCD Consulting Services \$1,600.00 on July 7, 2017. (Ex. N).
- w. JCD Consulting Services is a consulting company owned by Chase Dugger. (Ex. K).

SOPs will include, at a minimum, all items included in RR 12.3. The Company will only process parts of the medical marijuana plant that are free of seeds and stems; are free of dirt, sand, debris, or other foreign matter; and have no level of mold, rot, or other fungus or bacterial diseases. All surfaces used for processing will be food-grade, microbial-resistant stainless steel, and cleaned and sanitized regularly to prevent contamination. All water used in

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processing will be potable. Products will be assigned lot numbers to allow for effective inventory tracking from seed to sale.

Safety Policies: Safety is paramount in a processing operation as there are many risks posed by the processes and equipment used throughout extraction and infusion. The Company will develop stringent safety checks and procedures as part of the Company’s SOPs for every part of the processing operation. All processing equipment will be certified by a licensed engineer as being safe and adequate for its intended purpose. The Company will use a professional grade closed loop system installed in a Class 1, Division 1 room in a manner that is compliant with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including electrical, fire, food, building, and other relevant codes.

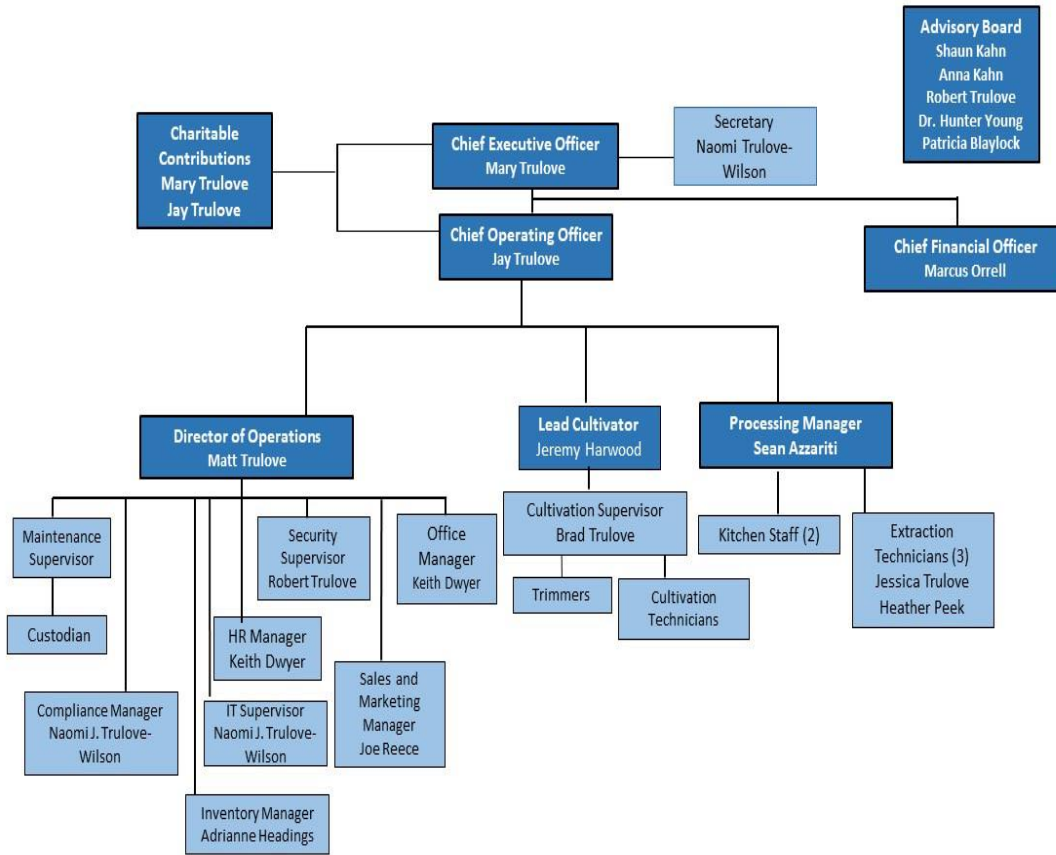

Curry, the Defendants, Trulove Dirt Works, LLC d/b/a Trulove Construction, Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove, appearing through their attorney, Robert A. Ballinger, and the Defendant Benton County, Arkansas, appearing through its attorney, George Ray Spence, and upon agreement of the parties, this Court finds as follows:

1. This Court has jurisdiction of the parties and subject matter before it.
2. There is pending before this Court the Plaintiffs' Notice of Appeal and Complaint. This action is an appeal from a final decision of the Benton County Appellate Review Panel, reversing a previous decision of the Benton County Planning Board related to real estate use in Benton County, Arkansas.

3. Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove are the owners of certain lands in Benton County, Arkansas located at 3901 S. 1st Street, Rogers, Arkansas, and more particularly described as:

Lots 1 and 2, Bo-De Acres, a subdivision of part of the Fractional SW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 30, Township 19 North, Range 29 West, as shown in plat record "S" at page 43, Benton County Arkansas, EXCEPT beginning at the NE corner of said Lot 1, thence South 02 degrees 32 minutes West 271 feet, thence North 88 degrees 04 minutes West 210 feet, thence North 02 degrees 32 minutes East 271 feet to the North

line of said Lot 1, thence South 88 degrees 29 minutes East 210 feet more or less to the place of beginning.

4. On or about July 1, 2015, Trulove Dirtworks, LLC, d/b/a Trulove Construction, submitted plans to the Benton County Planning Board for site plan review related to the operation of a heavy equipment storage and despatch center at the above described property.

5. The application was first considered by the Technical Advisory Committee of the Benton County Planning Board on July 15, 2015. At a public hearing on August 5, 2015, the Benton County Planning Board, by unanimous vote, denied the application of Trulove Construction, LLC, finding that the proposed use was incompatible with the existing agricultural and residential uses that neighbor the subject property and that there was insufficient landscape buffering and screening proposed.

6. Upon the denial of its application by the Benton County Planning Board, Trulove Construction, LLC sought relief from the Appellate Review Panel. On December 10, 2015, the Appellate Review Panel reversed the decision of the Benton County Planning Board and granted Trulove Construction, LLC's request, conditioned on certain stipulations. Those stipulations were formalized in the Final Stipulations Summary prepared by the staff of the Benton County Planning Department on December 22, 2015.

7. The decision of the Appellate Review Panel is a final decision of an administrative body.

8. That pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-17-211, the Plaintiff's herein have standing to appeal the final decision of the Appellate Review Panel for a de novo review by this Court.

9. As part of the settlement of the parties herein the decision of the Benton County Appellate Review Panel is hereby set aside, and the site plan approved by the Review Panel will be terminated consistent with the terms set forth in this agreed order

10. The above described property shall not be used for any industrial uses, heavy

commercial uses, or any other use that does not comply with the Benton County Planning & Development Regulations, or other County ordinance or regulation.

11. Trulove Dirt Works, LLC d/b/a Trulove Construction, Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove shall stop performing equipment maintenance on the above described property, or allowing others to do so, within 10 days of the date of this order.


12. Trulove Dirt Works, LLC d/b/a Trulove Construction, Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove shall remove the equipment, machinery, and heavy vehicles from the property within 15 days of the date of this order.

13. Trulove Dirt Works, LLC d/b/a Trulove Construction, Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove shall remove the existing debris pile and any other remnant of the previous industrial use of the property within 30 days of the date of this order.

14. Trulove Dirt Works, LLC d/b/a Trulove Construction, Jay Trulove and Mary Trulove shall take whatever other steps shall be necessary to bring the subject property into compliance with any applicable county regulations, and shall continue to comply with such regulations as to future uses of the subject property.

15. This Court retains jurisdiction over this matter for the purpose of enforcing this order.





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Text messages shed light on inner workings of Arkansas Medical Marijuana Commission

At least one Arkansas medical-marijuana commissioner missed the board's self-imposed deadline to grade applications for the state's first cannabis-growing facilities, and others tweaked their evaluations after submitting them, according to records obtained under the state's Freedom of Information Act on Thursday.

The text messages shed some light on the process that applicants and industry insiders have criticized for lacking structure and transparency.

Former Attorney General Dustin McDaniel, an investor, lobbyist and attorney for Natural State Wellness Enterprises, one of the successful cannabis-cultivation applicants, spoke at a Rotary Club gathering in Little Rock this week and complimented the commission for its hard work evaluating the stacks of applications. But he also noted that the commissioners rejected suggestions in 2017 to hire an outside contractor to evaluate the proposals in a "professional, uniform, standardized, objective, verifiable fashion."

"Well, the next thing you know they've got 75,000 pages of documents in their living room next to their easy chair," he said. "They've got a cup of coffee and a red pen, and they're just doing it."

Hopeful cultivators have feared from the start that the most deserving applicants may not be selected because of impropriety or poor grading, and the commissioners themselves said they were crunched to finish reviewing the bids in time.

One commissioner, Fayetteville attorney Travis Story, didn't receive the 95th cultivation facility application until the evening of Feb. 25 -- five days after the scoring deadline and two days before the commission's Feb. 27 meeting when the winning proposals were announced.

He told Mary Robin Casteel, director of the state Alcoholic Beverage Control Division, he may have failed to download it from the file-sharing service used by the commission.

"I'll do it real quick," he texted Casteel before she sent the application by email on Feb. 25.

Story returned the scored bid for Grady-based Carpenter Medical Group early on Feb. 26 about 45 minutes before Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration staff members met to review the scores, according to the text messages released under the state Freedom of Information Act. That application was ultimately deemed ineligible for unreleased reasons.

It also became public this week that Story and his law firm have represented the owners of one of the companies that won cannabis growing licenses -- Osage Creek Cultivation. The company was tied for the second-highest scoring among Story's evaluations, but it's unclear whether he knew the application belonged to his clients.

Other commissioners made changes to their proposals after turning them in to the finance department, mostly filling in blanks and clarifying scores, text messages between commission and finance department staff members show.

Only the five winning applications have been publicly released. They're heavily redacted, ranging from 500-1,600 pages.

The commission is now scoring the 227 applications for dispensaries. It plans to formally award all five cultivation licenses at its meeting Wednesday. Four of the five potential growers had paid the required \$100,000 licensing fee and posted a \$500,000 performance bond as of Wednesday, according to the Department of Finance and Administration.

Finance department staff members "depersonalized" each cultivation application, removing the names of owners and other associates, before sending them to the commission members for scoring.

Still, it was impossible to hide the identities of all individuals associated with each application because each company's articles of incorporation were publicly available through the secretary of state's office.

In the case of Osage Creek Cultivation, Jay Trulove is listed as the incorporator/organizer. He and his wife, Mary, own the company, which plans to grow medical marijuana in Berryville.

Story and his law firm have done legal work for the Truloves, representing them in court and helping them with business filings.

Two other commissioners gave Osage Creek higher scores than Story, although those commissioners tended to give higher scores across the board.

The Truloves used a different law firm to incorporate their cannabis-growing company, according to online business records.

Jay Trulove, reached by phone Thursday, declined to comment. Story didn't return phone calls and emails requesting comment on Wednesday and Thursday. The commissioners have avoided making public comments outside meetings while scoring applications.

The *Arkansas Times* first reported Story's work for the Truloves on Thursday.

State Rep. Bob Ballinger, R-Hindsville, is Story's law partner and has also represented the Truloves. On Thursday, he said that he and Story told the Truloves that the firm couldn't do any legal work for them on marijuana-related matters.

He added that he saw no problem if the firm continued representing them in unrelated matters.

Ballinger said Story has sequestered himself since medical-marijuana applications were submitted, avoiding news stories and other sources of information about the applicants.

He noted that other commissioners scored Osage Creek higher than his partner.

"If there was any undue influence, Travis [Story] would have rated them higher," he said.

The Truloves, Ballinger said, are "stalwarts of the community" and will responsibly operate their cultivation business.

Attorneys regularly help clients set up corporations. Story has been involved in at least 43 corporation filings, according to the secretary of state's website. Just two of those involved the Truloves, who also have operated a farm, construction company and embroidery shop.

Story is also listed as one of the attorneys who represented the Truloves in a land-use dispute in Benton County Circuit Court in 2016, but Ballinger was the attorney who signed all the pleadings, according to online court records.

A finance department spokesman said that any applicants who believe conflicts of interest influenced the scoring process could seek to have those concerns addressed through circuit court or the Arkansas Ethics Commission. The possibility of appealing to circuit court is in the Medical Marijuana Commission's regulations.

McDaniel, speaking to the Rotary Club on Tuesday, publicly voiced the concerns other industry insiders have complained about privately. Chiefly, the commission lacks predictability, McDaniel said.

For example, he said that several state legislators have said the commission was considering awarding three additional cultivation licenses this week.

Scott Hardin, a spokesman for the finance department, said in a statement that several unsuccessful applicants and their supporters have asked that additional licenses be issued, but Hardin said that's not in the commission's current plans.

Amendment 98 to the Arkansas Constitution, which voters approved in 2016 to legalize medical marijuana, allows for up to eight cultivation facilities. The commission elected to start with five.

"The plan has been and remains five total cultivation licenses at this point," Hardin said. "Considering three additional licenses is contrary to the rules and procedures established by the commission."

Melissa Fults, executive director of the Drug Policy Education Group, a patient advocacy organization, said adding more growers would be a positive step.

"The more product, the more dispensaries, the more competitive pricing, the better for the patients," she said.

McDaniel said awarding additional licenses would be a "terrible signal for the future of this business" because all the successful applicants based their business models and investment structure on there being four other growers.

A lawmaker also said the commission was considering regulating cultivators' transportation costs, according to McDaniel.

Asked about transportation regulations, Hardin said, "It is premature to speculate what type of regulations the commission will implement regarding transportation as this process is in its early stages."

None of the commissioners responded to emailed questions this week.

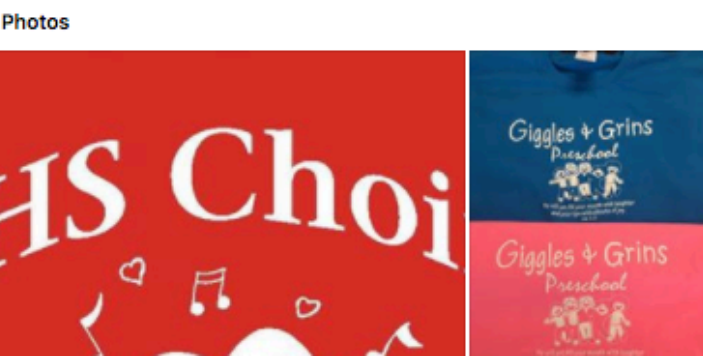
