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

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DOROTHY PARKER

November 7, 1951

Dear friend, '

A good many people, in my time, have called me stubborn. I am writing to you because I think that, perhaps, you have been called stubborn too, from time to time -- and are proud of it.

I <u>am</u> stubborn in a way. I'm stubborn in my belief in the people of Spain -- and in refusing to forget that Francisco Franco is a fascist.

The form my stubbornness takes is my inability to grow callous to the hardship and suffering of the Spanish Republican refugees. Their land and lives are in ruins, but they have never lost faith. And that faith, I'm proud to say, has been nourished over the years by the generosity and friendship of a large number of stubborn Americans.

In the last three years alone, despite many difficulties in our path, the Spanish Refugee Appeal has sent abroad almost \$140,000 in relief. Now, with the coming of winter, new hardships in France and Mexico must be alleviated.



I write to ask you to keep continuous this flow of American relief to the exiled victims of Spanish fascism. They look to us as never before in the twelve years of their exile. I write knowing that you will be as generous and willing -- and stubborn -- as Americans of conscience and honor have always been.

Won't you send your contribution to me today?

Communist Activity and Affiliations

AMERICAN COMMITTEE FOR PROTECTION OF FOREIGN BORN

The 1949 5th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the American Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born.

It is to be noted that this organization was cited by the Attorney General as one of those organizations coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

AMERICAN COMMITTEE FOR YUGOSLAV RELIEF

The 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief which was described as a Communist front which used money donated by Americans to help put TITO in power.

A report on the American Slav Congress and associated organizations which was prepared and released on June 26, 1949 by the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was named as one of the sponsors of the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief of the War Relief Fund of Americans of South Slovak Descent, 58 Park Avenue, New York 16, New York.

It is noted that both the American Slav Congress and the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief were cited by the Attorney General as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

AMERICAN CONTINENTAL CONGRESS FOR PEACE

On August 15, 1949, Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that the subject was a sponsor of the United States Committee of the American Continental Congress for Peace.

Confidential Informant T-2 indicated in June, 1949 that the National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions planned to assist in the preparation of a large scale "peace" congress to be held in Mexico City some time in 1949.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability advised that MAXINE WOOD (MAXINE FINSTERWALD), Communist Party member and official of the National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions, was a key figure in the United States in organizing the American Continental Congress for Peace.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability advised that DOROTHY PARKER was a United States sponsor of the Continental Congress for Peace held in Mexico City from September 5 through 10, 1949.

AMERICAN COUNCIL FOR A DEMOGRATIC GREECE

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that DOROTHY PARKER was a member of the National Board of the American Council for a Democratic Greece.

It is to be noted that the American Council for a Democratic Greece is one of the organizations listed by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

AMERICAN RELIEF SHIP FOR SPAIN

Page 489 of Appendix 9, First Section of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, lists DOROTHY PARKER as one of the sponsors of the American Relief Ship for Spain (September 3, 1938.)

The American Relief Ship for Spain was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities report dated March 29, 1944.

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AMERICAN YOUTH FOR DEMOCRACY

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability furnished information reflecting that DOROTHY PARKER was to act as toastmistress at a dinner being held on December 16, 1949 at the Ambassador Hotel, New York City. The informant advised that this dinner was in honor of the anniversary of American Youth for Democracy.

It is to be noted that the American Youth for Democracy has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

ARTISTS FRONT TO WIN THE WAR

The 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that the subject was a sponsor of Artists Front to Win the War. This organization was cited as subversive by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities of the House of Representatives, report of March 29, 1944, page 96.

AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF

"Red Channels", published by Counterattack, 55 West 42nd Street, New York 18 New York, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was reported as a signer of a petition to the Supreme Court to review the conviction of LAWSON and TRUMBO.

It is to be noted that JOHN HOWARD LAWSON and DALTON TRUMBO are two of the members of the "Hollywood Ten". cited for contempt of Congress.

"Political Affairs", July, 1948, page 584, reflects that "real patriots" serving labor and the nation are such people as the Hollywood Ten.

"Political Affairs" is a monthly publication of the Communist Party.



JOHN GATES, editor of the "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist daily newspaper, while testifying before the Senate Judiciary Committee on the Mundt-Nixon Bill on May 28, 1948, called "Political Affairs" "The theoretical organ of the Communist Party".

CITIZENS COMMITTEE FOR HARRY BRIDGES

Page 599 of Appendix 9 of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, lists DOROTHY PARKER, writer, with the Committee members and sponsors for the Citizens Committee for HARRY BRIDGES.

The Citizens Committee for HARRY BRIDGES was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944, pages 90 and 94f.

CIVIL RIGHTS CONGRESS

The "Daily Worker" of February 28, 1947, page 2, column 5, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was among the signers of a statement published by the Civil Rights Congress condemning "the shameful persecution of the German anti-Fascist refugee GERHART EISLER" and calling for the abolition of the House Un-American Activities Committee.

LOUIS BUDENZ, former Communist Party member and former managing editor of the "Daily Worker" has stated that EISLER was number one Communist in the United States and the one from whom BUDENZ took his orders. EISLER was convicted of charges of exit permit fraud and contempt of Congress in Washington, D.C. in 1947 and fled the United States on May 5, 1949.

It is to be noted that the Civil Rights Congress is one of the organizations cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

CONSUMERS UNION

The 1949 5th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that the subject is affiliated with the Consumers Union. The Consumers Union was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE TO LIFT THE EMBARGO

Pages 668 and 1702 of Appendix 9 of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER, writer, was affiliated with the Coordinating Committee to Lift the Embargo. This organization was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944.

"EQUALITY"

The report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, Appendix 9, pages 696 and 698, reflects that the subject was a member of the editorial council of the magazine "Equality".

"Equality" was cited as a Communist Party enterprise by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, report of March 29, 1944, page 49.

HISTORY TODAY, INC.

The 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a member of the Board of Directors of History Today, Inc., a Communist controlled film producing organization which distributes its products through another Communist firm, Garrison Films.

Pages 724 and 725, Appendix 9, First Section of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a member of the Board of Directors of History Today, Inc.

HOLLYWOOD ANTI-NAZI LEAGUE

Page 784, Appendix 9, of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, reflects that the subject was a sponsor of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League.

The 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities, page 232, reflects information that Mrs. FREDRIC MARCH, actress, testified that DOROTHY PARKER was one of those who helped start the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, a Communist Party front.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that DOROTHY PARKER contributed financially to the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities, report of 1948, pages 249, 250 and 256, reflects that the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League was incorporated on June 8, 1936 as the Hollywood League Against Nazism, which became the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League on September 28, 1936. The STALIN-HITLER Pact brought this front to an abrupt termination of activities in August of 1939.

HOLLYWOOD LEAGUE FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION

Page 256 of the 1948 4th report of the California Activities on Un-American Activities, lists DOROTHY PARKER as a sponsor of the Hollywood League for Democratic Action. This organization was cited as a Communist front by the California Committee on Un-American Activities in the 1943 report, page 91.

JOINT ANTI-FASCIST REFUGEE COMMITTEE

The "Daily Worker" of December 6, 1944, page 4, column 5, reflected that DOROTHY PARKER was one of the speakers at a dinner given by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee at the Hotel Commodore on December 4, 1944 honoring BILL GROPPER, artist.

The 5th report of the Un-American Activities in California - 1949, reflects that WILLIAM GROPPER (page 498) has been affiliated with from forty-one to fifty Communist front organizations.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, reported on January 20, 1945 that DOROTHY PARKER was Chairman of the Women's Division of the Spanish Refugee Appeal which was a campaign sponsored by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee



Committee.

The Spanish Refugee Appeal was cited as a Communist front with an address at 111 Ellis Street, San Francisco, California and also 808 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, California, which carried on fund raising and agitation in California in collaboration with the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, a Communist front, from 1947 to 1949. The above was taken from the California Committee on Un-American Activities report dated 1949.

The "Daily Worker" of March 23, 1948, page 12, reflected that the subject was a speaker for the Spanish Refugee Appeal at Manhattan Center, New York City.

Page 942, Appendix 9, of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, reflects that in 1943 DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

It is to be noted that this organization was cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised on March 1, 1950 that the subject was "acting chairman" of the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, 192 Lexington Avenue, New York 16, New York.

T-9 advised that DOROTHY PARKER and DALTON
TRUMBO were Chairmen at the annual dinner of the Joint
Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee honoring the Spanish Republicans
and Dr. EDWARD K. BARSKY, Chairman of the Joint Anti-Fascist
Refugee Committee, held on March 21, 1950 at the Hotel
Astor, New York City.

LEAGUE OF WOMEN SHOPPERS

Page 1009 of Appendix 9 of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, lists DOROTHY PARKER as national sponsor of the League of

Women Shoppers. This organization was cited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944.

MOTION PICTURE ARTISTS COMMITTEE

Page 310 of the 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that DOROTHY PARKER is an executive board member of the Motion Picture Artists Committee.

This committee was cited as a Communist front whose personnel "clearly indicates its character", according to the California Committee on Un-American Activities, report of 1948, page 310.

NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO WIN THE PEACE

In July, 1946, Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that DOROTHY PARKER, writer-humorist, was a member of the American Committee to Win the Peace. It is to be noted that the National Committee to Win the Peace was declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF ARTS, SCIENCES AND PROFESSIONS

The House Un-American Activities report of April 19, 1949 reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the Waldorf Conference held at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in March, 1949.

Confidential Informant T-9 advised that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the final program of the Cultural and Scientific Conference for World Peace held March 25-27, 1949 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised that in his opinion the Cultural and Scientific Conference for World Peace held in New York City March 25-27, 1949 was a follow-up of the World Congress of Intellectuals held in Wroclaw, Poland in August, 1948 and that these conferences were part of a world-wide Communist inspired "peace" propaganda campaign.

NEW YORK TOM MOONEY COMMITTEE

Page 1372, Appendix 9, of the report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the New York TOM MOONEY Committee. This organization was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944, page 154.

NORTH AMERICAN COMMITTEE TO AID SPANISH DEMOCRACY

The Medical Eureau and the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy issued a press release on March 14, 1939 stating that the said Committee was opening a drive for the relief of victims of "FRANCO'S conquest". It announced that a meeting bearing upon this matter would be held in the Hotel Commodore in New York City on the night of March 15, 1939 at which time foreign correspondents and writers would discuss "the Spanish Conflict and Its International Significance". Among the speakers scheduled to address this meeting was DOROTHY PARKER.

Page 1611 of Appendix 9 of the report of the House Un-American Activities Committee reflects that on February 2, 1939, DOROTHY PARKER was listed as a sponsor of the Medical Bureau and the Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy.

It is to be noted that the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Page 389 of the 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was active in the Writers and Artists Committee for Medical Aid to Spain, a Communist front activity.

OPEN LETTER TO AMERICAN LIBERALS

The name DOROTHY PARKER, writer, appeared among the signers of an open letter to American liberals which appeared in the magazine "Soviet Russia Today", March, 1937, pages 14 and 15.

Open Letter to American Liberals was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, June 25, 1942.

The publication "Soviet Russia Today" was cited as a Communist front by the Un-American Activities Committee of the House of Representatives on June 25, 1942 and March 29, 1944.

PEOPLE'S SONGS

Page 392 of the 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that the subject was a member of the board of sponsors of People's Songs, a major Communist Party front.

People's Songs was cited as a Communist front which was incorporated on January 31, 1946 in New York City. "All of the productions of People's Songs, Inc. follow the Communist Party line as assiduously as do the people behind the organization." This citation appears in the 1948 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities.

PROGRESSIVE CITIZENS OF AMERICA

The 1949 5th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that the subject was affiliated with the Progressive Citizensof America. This organization was cited by the Committee as being a "new and broader Communist front for the entire United States" formed in September 1946 at the direction of "Communist steering committees" from the Communist dominated National Citizens Political Action Committee and the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions.

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOR HUMAN WELFARE

Page 1601 of Appendix 9 of the report of the Un-American Activities Committee, House of Representatives, reflects the name DOROTHY PARKER, honorary member of the Association of Young Writers and Artists affiliated with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare and the Negro Youth Congress. These organizations were cited as Communist fronts by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities report of March 29, 1944, pages 48 and 148.

STAGE FOR ACTION

According to the 1949 5th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities, DOROTHY PARKER was affiliated with the group Stage For Action which was cited as a Communist front by that Committee.

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised in March, 1948 that Stage For Action is a group operated under the direction of the Communist Party.

STATEMENT OF AMERICAN PROGRESSIVES ON THE MOSCOW TRIALS

Page 1617, section 5, Appendix 9, of the report of the House Un-American Activities Committee, reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was one of those who signed a statement by American progressives supporting the Moscow trials which statement appeared in "New Masses", May 3, 1938, page 19.

The publication "New Masses" was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives report of March 29, 1944.

UNITED SPANISH AID COMMITTEE

Page 1615, Appendix 9 of the House Un-American Activities Committee report reflects that DOROTHY PARKER was a sponsor of the United American Spanish Aid Committee

which organization was also known as the North American Spanish Aid Committee. It is to be noted that the United American Spanish Aid Committee is one of those organizations cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

VETERANS OF THE ABRAHAM LINCOLN BRIGADE

Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised in 1939 that the subject was a sponsor of the Friends of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities report of March 29, 1944 reflects the following information regarding this organization:

"In 1937-1938, the Communist Party threw itself wholeheartedly into the campaign for the support of the Spanish Loyalist cause, recruiting men and organizing multifarious so called relief organizations."

The Friends of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade was included as one of these organizations.

Page 754, Appendix 9 of the report of the House Committee on Un-American Activities lists DOROTHY PARKER as an active supporter and sponsor of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade fund drive for disabled veterans.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability advised that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade held their tenth anniversary dinner at the Hotel Astor, New York City on February 12, 1947. DOROTHY PARKER was one of the speakers at this dinner, according to the informant. It is to be noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade is one of those organizations which has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, furnished information on December 6, 1946 which reflected that DOROTHY PARKER was a member of the National Committee to oust BILBO. This committee was sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress according to the informant.

Page 244 of the 1948 4th report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities reflects that the subject was affiliated with the Friends of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, a Communist Party front.

VOICE OF FREEDOM COMMITTEE

Page 10 of the January 17, 1949 issue of the "National Guardian" contained an article on the Voice of Freedom Committee which gave a short history of the same. According to this article, "the Committee took shape some two years ago when 'liberal commentators' were being driven off the air. 'Its moving spirit' was authoress DOROTHY PARKER." The article related that the Voice of Freedom Committee "serves unofficially as a watch-dog of radio" and that it has voluntary monitors who man nearly 2,000 listening posts throughout the United States. The article stated that favorite targets of these monitors are such "avowed names as FULTON LEWIS, JR., GABRIEL HEATTER, HENRY TAYLOR and KATE SMITH" at whom they fire a "merciless barrage of protests over distorted facts and unwarranted prejudices". The article stated that on the other hand, the Committee "hotly defends liberal newscasters forced -- or enroute -- to oblivion."

The California Committee on Un-American Activities report of 1949 cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation which the Committee has found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and contents.

CUNTIDENTHAL

The "New York Post" newspaper, March 3, 1947, reflected an article written by PAUL DENIS which reported that a "Save the Voice of Freedom Committee" has been formed under Dr. HENRY PRATT FAIRCHILD for the purpose of putting "liberal commentators back on the air". This article reported that DOROTHY PARKER issued a preliminary statement for the Committee and it was further stated that the Committee was to hold a dinner at the Central Park Hotel in New York City on March 5, 1947 forthe purpose of raising enough money to sponsor "liberal commentators" now off the air. DOROTHY PARKER was named Chairman of the Voice of Freedom Committee.

On March 8, 1947, Confidential Informant T-16, of known reliability, advised that the above mentioned dinner was sponsored by the "Save the Voice of Freedom Committee" and that it had not been contemplated that any permanent committee be established. However, the response at the dinner was so great that DOROTHY PARKER as well as the other speakers had urged the formation of a permanent committee for that purpose. This informant also advised that approximately 500 people attended the dinner and \$3,000.00 was received in contributions.

According to information furnished by Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability the Voice of Freedom Committee on May 8, 1947 held a rally at Town Hall, 123 East 43rd Street, New York City, which rally was "in defense of liberal commentators". The informant stated that the announcement of this rally distributed by the Voice of Freedom Committee reflected that DOROTHY PARKER was to participate in the rally.

The "Daily Worker" of January 20, 1948, page 13, column 3, announced that DOROTHY PARKER was to be honored at a dinner to be given on January 21, 1948 sponsored by the Voice of Freedom Committee and that it was to honor her for her contribution to American literature and the "cause of democracy".

Confidential Informant T-17 furnished information regarding the above mentioned dinner and made available a release dated January 16, 1948 issued by the Voice of Freedom Committee stating:

"We honor DOROTHY PARKER as an artist and fighter because she has never pulled a punch nor lost her pungency. She has always had her way with words. She has had them turning hand-springs in prose and verse but besides making them funny, she has made them forthright and told them how to fight." According to this release, the Voice of Freedom Committee was to use the proceeds from the dinner in order to sponsor a thirteen week series of half hour forums over one of the large independent stations.

The publication "Voice of Freedom" of February, 1948, as furnished by Confidential Informant T-18, of known reliability, also referred to the testimonial dinner for DOROTHY PARKER and quoted one of the speakers who supported the Third Party Drive as saying, "Why choose the lesser evil when we can choose the greater good."

The "Daily Worker" of January 27, 1948, page 13, also referred to the above dinner and reported that the Voice of Freedom Committee promised some excellent developments in the next few months.

On March 31, 1949, Confidential Informant T-17 advised that the subject still held the position of Chairman of the Voice of Freedom Committee.



Confidential Informants T-19 and T-20, both of known reliability, advised in January, 1950 that the subject continued as Chairman of the Voice of Freedom Committee.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities report of 1948, page 192, declared that the Voice of Freedom Committee was a Communist front "whose function is the support of commentators who have received the acclaim of the Communist press".

Confidential Informant T-3 advised that this organization is a Communist front.

The "Voice of Freedom" is a publication cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, report of 1948, page 224, "to be Communist initiated and controlled or so strongly influenced as to be in the Stalin Solar System".

Miscellaneous Communist Activity

Gonfidential Informant T-21, of known reliability, advised on November 30, 1943 that DOROTHY PARKER was to be one of the speakers at a luncheon in honor of LILLIAN HELLMAN.

Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, has indicated that both DOROTHY PARKER and LILLIAN HELIMAN are concealed Communists.

The "Daily Worker" of December 31, 1946, page 5, column 1, reflects an article entitled "MARCANTONIO Will Be Honored at Victory Dance Here January 10". This article indicated that "A testimonial to the progressive leadership of Rep. VITO MARCANTONIO in Congress will be delivered at a dinner for the reelected Congressman, January 10th at the Hotel Commodore, it was announced by the New York County Committee of the American Labor Party. Notice of the dinner

"sponsored by almost one hundred prominent persons from all walks of life was given by DOROTHY PARKER, noted author, at her New Weston Hotel apartment...."

"Miss PARKER said her support of the dinner resulted from the 'idiotic amount of sniping' at Rep. MARCANTONIO during and after his recent successful campaign for reelection in the 18th Congressional District."

VITO MARCANTONIO is the former American Labor Party Congressman from New York.

The American Labor Party was cited as a Communist front organization by the House Committee on Un-American Activities on March 29, 1944.

Confidential Informant T-22, on July 18, 1947, advised that DOROTHY PARKER has been a "valuable alliance" of the Communist Party and it was believed by the informant that she had at one time been a member of the Party.

Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, advised on February 6, 1950, that DOROTHY PARKER has admitted to him that she is a Communist but probably on being confronted with this, she would deny ever having made that statement.

Confidential Informant T-24, of known reliability, advised that he attended a Marxist Literary Quarterly under the auspices of "Mainstream" on June 11, 1947 at Manhattan Center, New York. The informant advised that DOROTHY PARKER was a speaker at this meeting.

"Mainstream" is a Marxist quarterly launched by the Communist Party in January, 1947 for the avowed purpose of stimulating "Marxist thinking in literature and the creative arts", according to the California Committee on Un-American Activities, 1947 report, page 106, and 1948, page 340.

COMERGENTANT

Confidential Informant T-24 advised that "her main protest was against the Un-American Committee in Hollywood. Her argument went something like this:

'I think it is simply preposterous that in 1947 American citizens must meet to protest against witch hunting such as is going on in Hollywood today under the auspices of a Congressional committee. Let us not be fooled -- this is just the beginning. Any of us who can't think America is simply grand and adorable the way it is now run by Capitalists are in for it. I protest this cruelty to decent American citizens. Dam their souls!"

In an article entitled, "Film Figures -- Red by Coast Group, Cry Lie" appearing in the "New York World Telegram" dated June 9, 1949, the following was reflected:

"The 1949 report of the California Un-American Activities Committee headed by Senator JACK TENNEY yesterday listed hundreds of persons as Communist appearers or followers." The name DOROTHY PARKER appeared among those who "have conspicuously followed or appeared some of the Communist Party line program over a long period of time."

Confidential Informant T-25, of unknown reliability, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 12, 1950 that LILLIAN HELIMAN, playwright, had visited DOROTHY PARKER, a short story writer who formerly lived in New Hope area in Pennsylvania. The informant described LILLIAN HELIMAN as a "dedicated Communist".

Confidential Informant T-26, of known reliability, advised that DOROTHY PARKER, the well-known writer, had visited LILLIAN HELIMAN at her home at. Pleasantville, New York, curing the weekend of July 21 to 24, 1950.

The "Daily Worker", Section I, March 19, 1950, page 2, column 1, contained an article concerning DOROTHY

PARKER'S protest on the NBC ban of PAUL ROBESON. This article states, "The National Broadcasting Company's banning of PAUL ROBESON from a TV Sunday broadcast was denounced by DOROTHY PARKER, poet and short story writer, as radio's latest crime against freedom of the air."

"Miss PARKER, who is Chairman of the Voice of Freedom Committee, an organization crusading for democracy on the airwaves, telegraphed her protest to the National Broadcasting Company's Vice President, SIDNEY EIGES."

Confidential Informant T-27, of known reliability, stated that PAUL ROBESON was a member of the Communist Party.





BUDENZ stated that due to the fact he had compiled the list of names in a hurry it is possible he may be in error concerning several individuals. He requested therefore that the names he furnished not be released outside of the Bureau because of the chance of error. He stated that he will go over the list with representatives of the FBI and will furnish information which he possesses concerning each individual, at which time he will determine the individuals, if any, erroneously included.

LOUIS F. BUDENZ, formerly managing editor of the "Daily Worker" and a Communist Party functionary until he broke with the Party in October, 1945, has been interviewed during the past few months concerning the concealed Communists whom he knew. The person named above as the subject of this case, was one of those individuals whom BUDENZ described as a concealed Communist. BUDENZ describes a concealed Communist as one who does not hold himself out as a Communist and who would deny membership in the Party.

BUDEWZ advised SA WILLIAM J. MC CARTHY, JR., on June 27, 1950, of all he knew concerning the subject that he felt was pertinent, and he dictated this information to a stenographer of this office, who was present during the interview.

He used, in order to bring out all he knew about the subject, the following set of questions. He considered all questions in connection with this subject. Where he did not comment on some particular question as to the activity of the subject, then it is because he had no knowledge. If he recalled anything about the subject as a result of these questions he dictated what he knew. The questions are as follows:

Identify individual

a. If observed a description and other identifying data;

- If not seen, enough descriptive data about individual to positively identify him or her:
- Any aliases

2. Narrate how he knows individual as a Communist.

- If seen at a closed meeting, get date, place and persons present at meeting:
- If told officially that individual was a Communist, who said it, what were the circumstances, and who was present;
- Relate all occasions when he met or heard of individual as Communist.

3. Documents

a. Did individual ever write anything that might be considered Communist literature. e

1. For "Daily Worker", "New Masses", "Political Affairs", any front publications or other publications.

Additional questions were asked as a result of his answers to the above questions in order to fully develop his information.

Letter to Director

Attached is a blind memorandum dictated by LOUIS F. BUDENZ and containing all the pertinent information concerning the subject which BUDENZ could presently recollect.

The original of each memo has been reviewed by Mr. BUDENZ and he has made any necessary corrections and he has signed the original. The signed original of each memo is being retained in the confidential informant file of LOUIS F. BUDENZ, NY file 62-8988.

Since the individuals such as the subject of this case are, according to BUDENZ, concealed Communists and since they are, in most instances, persons of some prominence, it is suggested that if the information appearing in the attached blind memo is reported, then Mr. BUDENZ should be given a temporary confidential informant symbol.

For the information of the Bureau the subject is one of the 400 concealed Communists whom BUDENZ stated he knew. The names of these concealed Communists were sent to the Bureau in the case captioned "Communist Party, USA, Internal Security -C".

DOROTHY PARKER

A writer of note.

From the late 1930's on, DOROTHY PARKER (whom I have never met) was constantly referred to officially by V. J. JERONE and ALEXANDER.

TRACHTENBURG in the Cultural Commission as an active adherent of the Communist Party. In the late 1930's and early 1940's she was specifically mentioned in these discussions as being the chief coworker for the Party With DONALD CODEN STEWART in influencing writers in Hollywood and in the Party Writers! Mr. HARVEY WOLF, 3938 South Grand Avenue, Los Angeles, voluntarily furnished the following information on December 2, 1940:

Mr. WOLF advised that he was a member of the Communist Party (hereinafter referred to as the CP) in the early 1930's, having joined the CP in 1933. At that time he was employed as a laboratory worker in the film industry in Hollywood and from his recollection of the activities of the CP during this period, he described DOROTHY PARKER, author and screen writer, as one of the leading characters in the Communist movement in Hollywood. PARKER had toured the United States speaking on behalf of the Spanish Loyalists according to the dictates of the CP line and was considered to be one of the most faithful individuals in the Communist movement.

T-5, of known reliability, advised in December, 1945 that DOROTHY PARKER was scheduled to be toastmistress at a Welcome Dinner for Returned Veterans, to be held at the Ambassador Hotel on Sunday, December 16, 1945. The informant advised that the announcement of this dinner was made at a meeting of the CP in Burbank, California on December 15, 1945.

T-6, of unknown reliability, an individual active in the motion picture industry in Hollywood, advised in July, 1947 that the Screen Writers Guild was organized by JOHN HOWARD

CANTIDENTIAL

LAWSON in Hollywood about 1932 and that it was completely dominated and controlled by the CP during the early years of its existence. T-6 described DOROTHY PARKER as one of the principal figures in the Communist organization and control of the Screen Writers Guild.

T-9, of known reliability, advised in November, 1945 that JOHN HOWARD LAWSON was a member of the Los Angeles County Communist Party (hereinafter referred to as the LACCP).

The Los Angeles Mirror, dated September 10, 1949 on page 1485, contains an article concerning individuals who signed a Brief in the case of the "Hollywood 10" to the United States Supreme Court. DOROTHY PARKER was named as one of the 382 film professional people who affixed their signatures to this Brief.

The "Hollywood 10" is a group of writers and directors who were subpoensed before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in 1947 in connection with that committee's investigation of Communist infiltration into the motion picture industry. They were all held in contempt of congress for refusing to testify as to whether or not they had ever been members of the CP. T-7, of known reliability, advised that he personally knew all members of the "Hollywood 10" to have been members of the CP in Hollywood.

T-7, also a member of the CP in Hollywood among the cultural groups for more than ten years, has characterized DOROTHY PARKER, a writer, as a member of the CP in Hollywood approximately 12 years ago at about the peak of the Spanish Civil War. The informant advised that to his knowledge, the subject was no longer active and is probably out of the Communist movement entirely. It was informant's opinion that DOROTHY PARKER joined the CP during excessively emotional days of the Civil War in Spain. According to T-7, MAKER has not been an important figure in the Communist movement in Hollywood during recent years.

T-8, of known reliability, far former functionary of

the LACCP, advised in February, 1951 that to his knowledge the subject has not been an active member of the CP during recent years and never was a member to the informant's knowledge.

furnished a petition to address a telegram to Attorney General J. HOWARD MC GRATH, Washington, D. C., concerning the trial and conviction of the eleven Communist leaders for teaching and advocating an unpopular political doctrine which represents an invasion of the constitutional rights of all Americans. The telegram called upon the Attorney General to use his high office to halt the destruction of the Bill of Rights by discontinuing further prosecution of the "New York Eleven" in this case for their political beliefs. The telegram also requested the granting of reasonable bail to the eleven defendants pending the appeal of their case. One of the signers of the telegram which was to be addressed to the Attorney General was DOROTHY PARKER.

On April 13, 1951 the subject was interviewed at her home, 216 South Westgate, West Los Angeles by Special Agents MARCUS M. BRIGHT and GILMER G. ROBINSON. During the course of this interview, she denied ever having been affiliated with, having donated to, or being contacted by a representative of the CP.

She advised that she was personally acquainted with LILLIAN HELLMAN, DASHIELL HAMMET, DONALD OGDEN STEWART and ELLA WINTER. Miss PARKER advised that while she was personally acquainted with the above individuals, she denied that she had any knowledge that these persons have ever been members of the CP or that she ever sat in a CP meeting with them. She further advised that she was personally acquainted with JOHN HOWARD LAWSON and that this association had come about through her activities in the Screen Writers Guild. She said that LAWSON had never contacted her for financial contributions to the CP and she denied ever making any contribution to the LACCP.

The subject advised that she was unable to recall her having sponsored the American Committee for the Protection



of Foreign Born and the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief. She recalled the American Continental Congress for Peace, but did not recall the extent of her participation in this organization. She also advised that she may have been a member of the American Council for a Democratic Greece. She recalled having participated in a program for the American Youth for Democracy and was vague as to whether or not she had been a toastmistress.

DOROTHY PARKER further recalled having been associated with the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, the Hollywood League for Democratic Action, the League of Wemen Shoppers, the United Spanish Aid Committee and the National Committee to Win the Peace. She was vague regarding her participation in the Civil Rights Congress, History Today, Inc. and the TOM MOONEY Committee. She recalled having participated in a program for the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and also recalled participating in the Voice of Freedom Committee.

and successful author who, along with a few other individuals, was formerly a member of a special group of the CP in Hollywood.

T-7 also described DONALD OGDEN STEWART, his wife, ELLA WINTER, and the subject as members of this special group of the CP in Hollywood.

T-7 has identified JOHN HOWARD LAWSON as one of the more important leaders of the CP movement in Hollywood, particularly during the years 1938 and 1939.

T-7 has advised that the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League was one of the mass organizations used by the CP in Hollywood to increase party membership during the years 1938 and 1939.

The following organizations mentioned previously have been cited by the Attorney General as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835:

T-ll, of known reliability, bdv/sed that MAXINE WOOD (MAXINE FINSTERWALD), CP member and official of the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions Council, was a key figure in the United States in organizing the American Continental Congress for Peace.

The 1943 Report of the Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities of the California Legislature, on page 91, describes the Hollywood League for Democratic Action as a CP "front organization."

The League of Women Shoppers has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities on March 29, 1944 as a Communist front organization.

The 1948 Fourth Report of the Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities of the California Legislature describes History Today, Inc. as a Communist controlled film producing organization which distributes its projects through another Communist firm, Garrison Films.

The New York TOM MOONEY Committee has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944, page 154.

Joint Inti-Fascist Refugee Committee:

The Daily People's World of June 27, 1945, on page nine, sets forth a letter from DOROTHY PARKER as acting chairman of the Spanish Refugee Appeal, of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee (hereinafter referred to as the JAFRC) to the editor of the People's World, asking readers to give more aid to their work of taking care of Spanish refugees quartered in Southern France at that time.

The Daily People's World is a west coast Communist news organ.

T-13, of known reliability, advised in September, 1945 that the September issue of the Beverly-Westwood Reporter, published monthly by the Citizens Committee of Beverly-Westwood, contained an article on page two, captioned, "Spanish Refugee", written by DOROTHY PARKER concerning the Spanish Refugee appeal for Funds, under the auspices of the JAFRC.

T-3 advised on May 25, 1948 that the subject was to assist in the holding of a tea under the sponsorship of the JAFRC.

T-3 further advised on June 4, 1948 that a tea was to be held under the auspices of the JAFRC at the home of one EDWARD LIPSHITZ in honor of DOROTHY PARKER.

The Daily People's World of July 21, 1948, Los Angeles edition, page five, columns four and five, in an article captioned, "Art Exhibit Will Benefit Spanish Refugee Appeal," announces a Southern California art exhibit, the proceeds of which will go to the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC. DOROTHY PARKER was listed as one of the sponsors.

T-12, of known reliability, advised that a meeting was held at the Embassy Auditorium sponsored by the Spanish Refugee Appeal, on the evening of June 28, 1948, titled, "Protest the Plot Against You." The purpose of the meeting

was to protest possible jail terms and fines imposed on eleven members of the JAFRC and Spanish Refugee Appeal. The informant advised that DOROTHY PARKER was listed among those who gave brief speeches and the person who received the loudest and longest ovation for her statement, "If these people are dirty Reds, then I am a dirty Red, too!"

SA PHILLIP J. REILLY attended the above meeting at the Embassy Auditorium on June 28, 1948 in Los Angeles, California and identified DOROTHY PARKER as the individual who spoke for MARJORIE CHODOROV at the JAFRC rally, the purpose of which was to protest action taken by the Supreme Court in refusing to review the cases of the leaders of the JAFRC who were cited for contempt of congress in proceedings before the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

T-3 advised in October, 1948 that DOROTHY PARKER was to be a judge in a contest sponsored by the JAFRC concerning "Why Spain Should Not Be in the United Nations."

Civil Rights Congress:

The Hollywood Citizen News, dated April 24, 1947 in an article concerning a meeting of the Civil Rights Congress (hereinafter referred to as the CRC) held at the Royal Palms Hotel, 360 South Westlake Avenue, Wednesday, April 23, 1947, listed DOROTHY PARKER as a member of the committee sponsoring or supporting GERHARDT EISLER.

T-14, of known reliability, advised in June, 1949 that he had learned from DELPHINE SMITH, of the CRC, that DOROTHY PARKER was to be a sponsor of the CRC conference to be held Friday, June 24, 1949.

According to T-15, of known reliability, DELPHINE SMITH was amember of the LACCP prior to May, 1947.

T-16, of known reliability, advised in September, 1948 that LEN GOLDSMITH, National Director of the CRC in New York, was in Los Angeles during the month of September, 1948 and that the subject was one of the individuals who GOLDSMITH would contact while in Los Angeles.

SHARING WITH

Arts, Sciences and Professions Council:

T-2 advised in July, 1949 that the Arts, Sciences and Professions Council (hereinafter referred to as the ASP) was planning a reception for HOWARD FAST and that DOROTHY PARKER's name would be utilized in sending telegrams and invitations to the reception.

T-24, of known reliability has identified HOWLRD FAST, the writer, as an Executive Board member of the JAFRC and one of those individuals cited for contempt of congress.

T-2 advised on July 25, 1949 that DOROTHY PARKER was to participate in a series of lectures and seminars planned by the ASP and which were to be held every Friday evening during the months of August and September, 1949 at the DON MARTIN School.

T-2 advised in August, 1949 that DOROTHY PARKER had been nominated for a position on the ASP election ballot. PARKER told the informant that she was highly honored and accepted the nomination.

T-17, of known reliability advised in October, 1949 that DOROTHY PARKER the writer, was elected an Executive Board member of the ASP in Hollywood, California for the year 1950()

T-7 advised on July 26, 1950 that the Hollywood ASP Council is the Southern California chapter of the National ASP Council in New York. T-7, demember of the Hollywood ASP and a former member of the CP in Hollywood for some ten years, has advised that the policies of the organization on important issues are controlled by individuals who have been members of the CP within the informant's own experience. Mere membership in the organization, however, does not, of itself, indicate CP membership.

T-23, of known reliability, advised on January 4, 1951 that he had learned from SARAJO LORD, Executive Director





of the ASP, that DOROTHY PARKER, Mrs. ALLAN CAMPBELL, 240 Bentley Circle, Brentwood, Los Angeles, was an Executive Board member of the ASP.

Miscellaneous Activities:

The Western Worker in its issue of May 4, 1936, on page one, in an article captioned, "Notables Rap Sedition Bill", datelined Los Angelos, April 28, 1936, reflects that the subject was a signer of a telegram sent to Congressmen CHARLES W. KRAMER, denouncing the KRAMER Sedition Bill before congress at that time.

The Western Worker is a former organ of the CP on the west coast.

T-18, of known reliability, advised on March 1, 1945 that DOROTHY PARKER was a known member of the League of American Writers. This informant also advised that the official bulletin for the Western Workers Congress for October, 1936 identified the subject as a member of the above organization and a member of the League of American Writers when the Western Workers Congress was absorbed by the League.

T-18 has identified DOROTHY PARKER as a signer of the Call for a Third Congress of the League of American Writers, held in New York City June 2 through 4, 1949.

The League of American Writers has previously been identified in this report.

T-19, of known reliability, advised on June 7, 1940 that the subject was a member and associate of the Hollywood League for Democratic Action, 6513 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

The Hollywood League for Democratic Action has been previously identified.

T-20, of known reliability, advised on December 12, 1945 that DOROTHY PARKER was to be one of the principal

speakers at a dinner meeting of the American Youth for Democracy to be held during the month of December, 1945.

T-12 advised in May, 1948 at a rally for HENRY A. WALLACE, progressive candidate for the presidential nomination, held at the Gilmore Stadium on the evening of May 16, 1948, under the auspices of the Independent Progressive Party of California, the subject donated \$200 to the campaign fund.

T-21, of known reliability, advised on May 12, 1949 that the Independent Progressive Party in Los Angeles County was, at that time, under the complete control of the CP, which sets the organizational goals of the Independent Progressive Party, lays down its perspectives, organizes its forces, proposes its levels of organization and assigns its leadership. Mere membership in the organization, however, does not, of itself, indicate CP membership on the part of any particular individual.

T-22, of known reliability, has furnished the following information which was received from LINI STOUMEN, who was acquainted with one CONSTANCIA DE LA MORA, Operator of a boarding house in Cuernavaca, Mexico, owned by a Spanish Communist group, catering to those individuals of "correct" political beliefs. According to T-22, following the death of CONSTANCIA DE LA MORA in January, 1950, DOROTHY PARKER, a script and scenario writer and a Communist from Hollywood, California, took over the management of this boarding house. The informant advised that DOROTHY PARKER was considered to be a valuable element in the idealistic fight on behalf of Communism.

T-22 advised that while in Mexico DOROTHY PARKER was in contact with various Spanish refugees from the Spanish Civil War, who reside in Cuernavaca, Mexico, however, she does not speak Spanish.

The Mexican weekly magazina, "Manana", in its issue of May 20, 1950, featured an article concerning DOROTHY PARKER.



According to T-22 CONSTANCIA DE LA MORA is the former head of the Loyalist Censorship Station in Madrid, Spain, the wife of the head of the Loyalist Air Force and a Communist writer of distinction.

LIMI STOUMEN, a member of the CP in New York, while attending Columbia University, was a nurse attached to the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigado has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

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

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

Judge Edward Weinfeld ruled yesterday that Cedric Belfrage, editor of the National Guardian, was entitled to bail pending deportation proceedings. Belfrage has been held on

Ellis Island since May 15, where he was taken 24 hours after he tive of United Electrical Workers, refused to knuckle down to Sen. Joe McCarthy at a witchhunt hearing in Washington.

A native of England, Belfrage has been a resident in the U.S. since the early 1930's. He applied for citizenship in July, 1937, but was forced to interrupt the fiveyear residence requirement in order to undertake a World War II assignment in Europe with the Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Forces.

On May 14, McCarthy subpenaed Belfrage and James Aronson, executive editor of the Guardian, and subjected them to the usual treatment accorded by the by immigration officials, also spake. committee to journalists whose views do not coincide with Mc-Carthyism, Belfrage and Aronson refused to answer McCarthy's questions, invoking their rights under the Fifth Amendment.

More than 700 persons, at a Cedric Belfrage fight-back meeting Friday night in the Palm Gardens, affirmed their determination to work for the freedom of the National Guardian's English-born editor now held without bond on Ellis Island.

Speakers included Daroth arker and Albert Kahn, writers Russ Nixon, legislative representa and Thelma Dale, of the Progressive Party.

Six other speakers enlivened the meeting with accounts of their recent appearances before congressional committees. They were Nathan Witt, labor lawyer; William Mandel, writer; Arnaud D'Usseau, playwright; Victor Perlo, and Joe Joseph, economists, and David Flacks, teacher.

Prof. Henry Pratt Fairchild and John T. McManus of the Guardian co-chaired the meeting.



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THERE is no grimmer portent for a neighborhood, we believe, than a deserted saloon. When the owner of the bar and grill closes his doors, sells his fixtures, and departs, it's a sure indication that the end of something or other is at hand. In Upper West Side where we live, something they call "slum clearance" is in operation. Acres upon acres of five story walk-up tenement houses are to be levelled to the ground to make way for a big housing project. But the housing project is not for us or our neighborsit will provide modern apartments for well-to-do families, And what happens to the present tenants? They must go searching in the increasingly crowded slum areas for another apartment no better-and probably worse-than their present habitation.

BUT meanwhile as the city housing agency purchases one house at a time, the buildings become daily more dilapidated and run down.

We knew this process was going on in our neighborhood, for we were constantly encounter-ing signs posted on boarded-up buildings: Property of New York Housing Authority; Renting Prohibited. But it was only when Flaherty's Bar and Crill on our corner failed to open last Mon-day morning that we realized that we were participating in the wake of a neighborhood. All of which confirms our conviction on this newspaper that housing is one of the most crucial problems of the American people. And that's why you'll find this issue getting more and more attention from us.

IT WAS in 1926 or thereabouts that we first fell in love with her. We had never seen her, of course, nor had we even a photograph to tell us whether she was dark or fair, short or tall. But that didn't matter. We were confident we knew all we

needed to know about her, for had we not read hundreds of her verse? We knew she was sprightly, amusing, clever, or as the word went in those days, brittle. For that was the Dorothy Parker, author of Enough Rope and other light verse which began appearing in the late 1920s.

WE NEVER communicated our devotion and as time passed we went on to other things. And so did Dorothy Parker, as we gathered from pieces which came out now and then over her byline in New Masses. Then came Spain and Dorothy Parker wrote one of the finest pieces produced by anybody concerning that epic struggle for the freedom of a people. That was the short story entitled Soldiers of the Republic which has found its way into at least two anthologies.

LAST WEEK we saw Dorothy Parker for the first time. She stood on the platform of the Amnesty rally at Manhattan Center. They have put the Smith Act defendants in jail, she said, hoping that they will be forgotten. "It's up to us," said Dorothy Parker quietly, "to see that they never will be forgotten. They did nothing to merit prison. . . They thought—that's the thing—they thought. And it's a short step from being told not to think at all, Isn't what goes on in your own private, secret head your own? You can't just say, isn't this awfull" This, said Dorothy Parker, is the "right smack time" to fight for amnesty for political prisoners. Dorothy Parker's brief but pointed speech made us feel very good. Personally, we mean. It proved we were right more than 25 years ago, when unbeknown to her, we offered her our heart.—R.F.H.







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Dear friend,

A good many people, in my time, have called me stubborn. I am writing to you because I think that, perhaps, you have been called stubborn too, from time to time -- and are proud of it.

I am stubborn in a way. I'm stubborn in my belief in the people of Spain -- and in refusing to forget that Francisco Franco is a fascist. And I'm getting more and more so as I watch American guns and dollars convert Spain openly into a sea and air base for war.

The form my stubbornness takes is my inability to grow callous to the hardship and suffering of the Spanish Republican refugees. Their land and lives are in ruins, but they have never lost faith. And that faith, I'm proud to say, has been nourished over the years by the generosity and friendship of a large number of stubborn Americans.

In the last three years alone, despite many difficulties in our path, the Spanish Refugeo Appeal has sent abroad almost \$140,000 in relief. Now, with the coming of fall, new hardships in France and Mexico must be alleviated.

I write to ask you to keep continuous this flow of American relief to the exiled victims of Spanish fascism. They look to us as never before in the twelve years of their exile. I write knowing that you will be as generous and willing -- and stubborn -- as Americans of conscience and honor have always been.

Won't you send your contribution to me today?

National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims Activities

Amnesty Christmas Rally.

Over 800 communists, progressives and left wing trade unionists came to the "Amnesty Christmas Rally" held on Dec. 17th, 1953 at the Manhattan Plaza in New York. The audience consisted mostly of middle age men and women. Women were in the majority. Youth had about 200 in the hall. Most of the audience were Jews. There were a few Russians and Ukrainians; a sprinkle of latins and some 50 or so Negroes.

The functionaries of this meeting, such as ticket sellers, ticket takers, ushers, etc. were communists.

The chairman of the meeting was Dr. Edward Barsky.



In his speech Dr. Barsky appealed to President Eisenhower to grant "amnesty to the great American patriots who were imprisoned for the crime of fighting for peace" and in this way "right the wrong" against them. He underlined that the granting of amnesty to "political prisoners" in the United States isn't new. He enumerated some of the cases where amnesty was granted by Presidents including the freeing of Debs on the recomandation of U.S. Attorney General Dougherty. Barsky said that "our country is drifting into fascism"; that "Mc Carthyism is the American version of fascism $^{\mu}$; that the leaders of the American people and of the peace movement are in the prisons today because of the cold war and of the reactionary war in the country" and he appealed to the people: "the fight for amnesty of the Smith Act victims is a fight against the coming of fascism to this country and is a fight for world peace."

Prof. Royal France was introduced as the man "who gave up his professorship in a university in Florida so he can devote his talent to fight for the civil rights of the American people."

Royal France made a short speech. He stated that "the Smith Act is unconstitutional because its aim is the destruction of the Bill of Rights; the Smith Act is undermining the very fundation of American freedom." He underlined that "the Communist leaders were trown in the prisons not because not they committed any criminal acts but because they have certain thoughts and opinions which disagree with the thoughts and opinions of the politicians in Washington. As long as people are being perscuted for expressing an opinion there is no security for any one. As long as the Communists are in prison no one in the country is free.

Leona Thompson made a "dramatic" speech. (Towards the end of the meeting a motion was made from the floor to have her speech printed for mass distribution. The meeting adopted this motion and the chairman announced that the "National Committee to Win Amnesty for the Smith Act Victims" will make arrangements for the printing and distribution of Leona's speech.) She said that "the winning of amnesty for political prisoners takes on a particularly significant conotation today when Mc Carthyism threatens the right to work, to think, the very right to breathe."

She spoke about the attack made on her husband Robert Thompson by a prisoner. "One might assume that this dastardly act was a warning to Communists to shut up or else. No. This blow is a warning to all Americans that what happened to my husband is on the agenda for them if they do not fight back."

Leona Thompson that Thompson is being deprived of "adequate medical attention" and that he is "deprived of priviliges he had before the attack". She described a lunch she and her daughter had with Robert Thompson and how her daughter "danced before him in the bull pen." She underlined that "the American people are begining to understand that in fighting Mc Carthyism they are retaining for themselves the right to a peacefull destiny." She said that "thousands of staunch and brave people (like or husband) will continue to be the backbone of the fight against fascism in this country." She told the meeting: "There will be a change. Yes, there is a fresh breeze blowing. You must make it sweep the country by your fight for amnesty; by your demands that the political persecution of my husband and others be stopped."

BONET TO THE THE

Dorothy Parker (shook hands and kissed Leona Thompson) said that she couldn't belive that "a time will come when in my beloved country in America people will be trown in prison for thinking and expressing an opinion." She said that she is "bewildered" but this is not enough. Something must be done about it. Firstly, we must put an end to fear; secondly, we must see to it that these patriotic people be freed from the prisons. They want us to forget those in prison, but they will not be forgotten. This meeting must be the begining of a great campaign which will awaken the concious of America against the crime which is being committed against such heroes of our country as the Robert Thompsons."

Leon Straus stated that "Mc Carthyism is a threat to the American labor movement." He underlined that this country should start trading with the Soviet Union, China and the East European peoples Democracies underlining that this will "not only end the cold war but will give jobs to hundreds of thousands of workers in America". He called upon the people to fight for amnesty for all the "Smith Act Victims." He said that the fight for amnesty is not a new thing in this country. He underlined that "The waves of amnesty are now speeping many countries" and that "we must fight here for amnesty of all our political prisoners."

Carl Marzani made the collection speech. He also spoke of the "Amnesty tradition in this country and that amnesty is being granted in every country in the world. He said the fact that people are being imprisoned "for such criminal acts as thinking shows that the Mc Carthy's are weak and scared." He asked for donations "to carry on the fight for Amnesty for the Smith Act victims." He also called for the organization of amnesty neighborhood committees. The collection was about \$1,500.

Dr. Du Bois (received a standing evation) gave a historic review of amnesties in the U.S. underlining that "amnesty was granted even to the men of slavery and violence who tried to overtrow the government in the Civil War. No such accusations were made against the communists." He said that he doesn't know all of the "Smith Act Victims", but he knows well Benjamin Davis who could have lived an easy life but he was always a serious man and "he choose the road of serving the poor and the persecuted, negro and white alike." He said that it is "a shame to the country to keep such a person in prison" and that "we must make an

end to this. We must demand the granting of amnesty to Davis' and all other political prisoners.

At the suggestion of the chairman the meeting instructed the "N.C. to W. A. for the S.V. to send, in the name of the meeting, a resolution to President Eisenhower to "immediately" free Robert Thompson and all others who are imprisoned under the Smith Act.

It was also decided to send an appeal to Bennett, director of Federal prisons, to give R. Thompson a chance to recuperate from the attack made on him by a prisoner. During the meeting the chairman introduced Celia Zitron as the Table secretary of the National Committee to Win Amnesty.

Carl Marzani asked the audience to buy copies of "The Nation" (copy enclosed) which were being sold at a table at the entrance into the meeting hall.

Earl Robinson sang a few songs.

The informant pointed out that of all the Communist affairs he has ever attended, he has never swen such large donations and contributions made as were made at this dinner. The informant estimated the total collection to be \$5,000, which included \$1,000 from CORLISS LAMONT; \$1,000 from FREDERICK V. FIELD; and \$500 from LOUISE BERMAN.

The informant said that the above estimate was verified as he learned from THEODORE BAYER, formerly on the staff of "New World Review" that the collection was approximately five thousand dollars and was beyond all expectations.

B. Residence

T-1, of known reliability, advised December 4, 1950 that the subject was then residing at 8221 Sunset Boulevard, Hollywood, California.

T+2, of known reliability, advised July 14, 1954 5 that the subject was residing at the Hotel Volney, 23 East 74th Street, New York City, for several months as of that time.

On January 12, 1955, Mr. O'CONNELL, mentioned above, advised that the subject was residing at the Hotel Volney, 23 East 74th Street, New York City, and also stated that she had a lease on Suite 9-E, which lease would expire in September, 1955. Mr. O'CONNELL also advised that the subject had leased this suite on a yearly basis since October, 1952.

II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE COMMUNIST PARTY

A. Membership in the Communist Party

On September 19, 1951, MARTIN BERKELEY, screen writer, testified before a public session of a sub-committee of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, in Los Angeles, California, that DOROTHY PARKER was present at a meeting held in his home in Hollywood, California, in June, 1937, at which meeting, he stated, the Hollywood Section of the Communist Party was formed. BERKELEY also testified that because of PARKER'S national prominence, she later became a member at large and, as such, did not attend Communist Party meetings.

B. Association With Communist Party Front Groups

The Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

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T-3, of known reliability, advised January 20, 1945 that the subject was Chairman of the Women's Division of the Spanish Refugee Appeal, which was a campaign sponsored by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee (JAFRC).

T-4, of known reliability, advised September 24, 1951 that a letter dated September 5, 1951, addressed, "Dear Friend", signed, "Dorothy Parker", sought contributions for the Spanish Refugee Appeal.

T-4 also advised in early 1952 that a letter dated March 10, 1952, addressed "Dear Friend", signed "Dorothy Parker", solicited funds for the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC and invited the reader to buy copies of "Spain and Peace", which the letter referred to as a story of the Spanish people which was published by the JAFRC. This letter also reflected that the subject was Chairman of the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC.

On November 28, 1951, T-5, of known reliability, advised that a letter dated November 7, 1951, addressed "Dear Friend", signed by "Dorothy Parker", requested a financial contribution to the Spanish Refugee Appeal.

The July 10, 1952 issue of the "Daily Worker", at page 8, column 2, reflected in an article captioned "Commemorate Spain's Struggle July 24", that DOROTHY PARKER was scheduled to speak at a Spain Salute meeting at the Hotel Capitol, New York City, on July 24, 1952 to commemorate the 16th anniversary of the Defense of the Spanish Republic. According to this article, the meeting was sponsored by the JAFRC and the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

In the July 28, 1952 issue of the "Daily Worker" on page 8, columns 1 to 5, is reflected the information that the subject spoke at the above mentioned meeting held at the Hotel Capitol, New York City, on July 24, 1952, and that she



was identified as the author of "The Heart In Spain", which was termed by the "Daily Worker", "a splendid anthology". This article also reflected that "...she began by explaining that she wasn't hiding her identity from the FBI, for whom she had only monumental scorn." The article also reflected that the subject spoke about seeing first hand the suffering of the Spanish people under the monarchy and concluded with "The clenched fist Popular Front salute and the cry of 'Salud'."

T-6, of known reliability, advised June 16, 1953 that the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC sponsored a rally at Madison Square Garden, New York City, on September 24, 1945, at which rally tribute was paid to the subject as Chairman of the Arrangements Committee for this rally.

On February 2, 1954, T-7, of known reliability, advised the subject had received communications at the headquarters of the JAFRC or the Citizens Committee to Defend the JAFRC, both of which organizations are located in Room 200 at 23 West 26th Street, New York City.

T-8, of known reliability, advised October 19, 1953 that the Spanish Refugee Appeal was presenting a play entitled "Ladies of the Corridor", co-authored by the subject. T-8 advised that this presentation was in tribute to the subject and was to take place on November 25, 1953 at the Longacre Theater in New York City.

T-8 also advised March 8, 1954 that a letter addressed "Dear Friend", dated February 19, 1954, signed "Dorothy Parker", advised the reader that the Spanish Refugee Appeal had chosen the "Three enny Opera" for its first theater evening of 1954. T-8 piso stated that the letter indicated the opera was to be dresented at the Theater De Lys, Greenwich Village, New York City, on March 14, 1954.

On May 10, 1954, T-8 advised that an undated letter, signed "Dorothy Parker", invited the reader to participate in a theater party on May 25, 1954, which was to be held at the Phoenix Theater, Second Avenue and Twelfth Street, New York City. T-8 also stated that the letter

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said that such participation would help in the work of the Spanish Refugee Appeal in giving aid to Spanish Republicans in exile.

C. National Committee to Win Amnesty For Smith Act Victims

T-9, of known reliability, on June 25, 1952.

advised that a National Conference to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims was held at the St. Nicholas Arena, New York City, on June 14; 1952. T-9 stated that at this meeting a National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims was formed. According to T-9, the purpose of this organization was to promote amnesty for the Communist Party leaders who had been indicted or convicted under the Smith Act and for all "Smith Act Victims".

According to the "Daily Worker" dated December 4, 1953, page 3; column 2, the subject was scheduled to speak at a Christmas Amnesty Rally for Smith Act Victims at Manhattan Plaza, New York City, on December 17, 1953. The "Daily Worker" reflected this rally was to be held under the auspices of the National Committee to Win Amnesty For Smith Act Victims.

On January 6, 1954, T-9 advised that the subject spoke at an "Amnesty Christmas Rally", sponsored by the National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims. T-9 stated that this rally was held December 17, 1953, at the Manhattan Plaza, New York City, and that subject, in her speech, called for an end of fear and the freeing of Smith Act victims from prison.

In the December 27, 1953 edition of "The Worker", page 11, column 1, there is reflected an article entitled "A Chat With the Reader" by "R.F.H.". The following is an excerpt from this article:

"It was in 1926 or thereabouts that we first fell in love with her. We had never seen her, of course, nor had we even a photograph to tell us whether she was dark or fair, short or tall. But that didn't matter. We were confident we knew all



"we needed to know about her, for had we not read hundreds of her verse? We knew she was sprightly, amusing, clever, or as the word went in those days, brittle. For that was the Dorothy Parker, author of Enough Rope and other light verse which began appearing in the late 1920's.

"We never communicated our devotion and as time passed we went on to other things. And so did Dorothy Parker, as we gathered from pieces which came out now and then over her byline in 'New Masses'. Then came Spain and Dorothy Parker wrote one of the finest pieces produced by anybody concerning that epic struggle for the freedom of a people. That was the short story entitled Soldiers of the Republic which has found its way into at least two anthologies.

"Last week we saw Dorothy Parker for the first time. She stood on the platform of the Amnesty rally at Manhattan Center. They have put the Smith Act defendants in jail, she said, hoping that they will be forgotten. "It's up to us, " said Dorothy Parker quietly, to see that they never will be forgotten. They did nothing to merit prison ... They thought -that's the thing--they thought. And it's a short step from being told what to think to being told not to think at all. Isn't what goes on in your own private, secret head your own? You can't just say, isn't this awful! This, said Dorothy Parker, is the 'right smack time! to fight for amnesty for political prisoners. Dorothy Parker's brief but pointed speech made us feel very good. Personally, we mean. It proved we were right more than 25 years ago, when unbelmown to her we offered her our heart." unbeknown to her, we offered her our heart.

"New Masses" is cited as a "Communist periodical" by Attorney General FRANCIS BIDDLE, Congressional Record, page 7688, September 24, 1942.

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D. National Council of Arts, Sciences, and Professions

The National Council of Arts, Sciences, and Professions has been cited as a Communist front. (Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, Review of the Scientific and Cultural Conference for World Peace arranged by the National Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions and held in New York City on March 25, 26, and 27, 1949, House Report No. 1954, April 26, 1950 (originally released April 19, 1949), p.2.)

T-10, of known reliability, advised July 27, 1952 that the name DOROTHY PARKER, 8221 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles 46, California, appeared on a mailing list of the Hollywood Arts, Sciences and Professions Council.

T-11, of known reliability, advised May 5, 1954. that the Hollywood Arts, Sciences and Professions Council is the Southern California Chapter of the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions in New York and follows the policy and programs of the national organization.

E. Association With Progressive Party

The National Committee, Communist Party, USA, in issuing its final text of the "Resolution Growing Out of the Presidential Elections" in "Political Affairs", issue of July, 1953, states in substance that in 1948, the Communist Party helped stimulate the formation of the Progressive Party through the 1952 elections. It then states: "However, the mistake our Party made was to confuse this task with the historic task of forming a new mass party of the people. As a consequence, there existed the wrong estimate that the formation of the Progressive Party represented something more than the simple emergence of an important fighting force for peace; that it represented the emergence of a great mass people's party."

As a result of this reasoning, it concludes that the "Progressive Party, the Communist Party and other progressive forces" must unite in a broad, mass front coalition.

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"Political Affairs" has been cited as follows:

1. Cited as an "official Communist Party monthly theoretical organ."

"Political Affairs, formerly known as The Communist, 'a magazine of the theory and practice of Marxism-Leninism published monthly by the Communist Party of the United States of America, now calls itself 'a magazine devoted to the theory and practice of Marxism-Leninism: Its chief editor is EUGENE DENNIS, Executive Secretary of the Party."



According to the August 14, 1952 issue of the "Daily Worker, page 2; column 3, the subject was scheduled to speak at a testimonial dinner to honor C. B. BALDWIN, National Secretary of the Progressive Party. According to the "Daily Worker", the dinner was to be held at the Hotel Commodore, New York City, on August 14, 1952.

F. Miscellaneous Communist Party Activities

On June 27, 1950, T-12, of known reliability advised that from the late 1930's on, the subject was constantly referred to officially by V. J. JEROME and ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG in the Cultural Commission as an active adherent of the Communist Party:

T-12 also stated that in the late 1930's and early 1940's, the subject was specifically mentioned in these discussions as being the chief co-worker for the Communist Party, together with DONALD OGDEN STEWART in influencing writers in the Communist Party Writers Unit in Hollywood.



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According to T-12, the individual in charge of publicity for the Citizens Committee to Defend HARRY BRIDGES was constantly advised officially by EUGENE DENNIS and JACK STACHER that the subject was an adherent of the Communist Party According to T-12, the subject was a very important person in assembling the Citizens Committee to Defend HARRY BRIDGES.

V. J. JEROME and ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG were Communist Party leaders convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on January 21, 1953, for violation of the Smith Act of 1940.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities, 1949 report, at page 498, reflected that DONALD OGDEN STEWART had been affiliated with from 71 to 80 Communist front organizations.

The Citizens Committee to Defend HARRY BRIDGES has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

EUGENE DENNIS and JACK STACHEL were indicted under the Smith Act of 1940 on July 20, 1948 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York. They were convicted October 14, 1949 and on July 2, 1951 began serving five year sentences.

T-13, of known reliability, advised April 24, 1951 that during the early part of the Communist Party movement in Hollywood, California, in the latter part of the 1930's, there was a highly secret group, which was dominated by the Communist Party, but was not necessarily a closed Party unit. T-13 stated that the subject was one of this group but advised that he believed the Communist Party used this group primarily for money and prestige and that the group, strictly speaking, may not have been a Communist Party branch and its members not necessarily Communist Party members.

According to the "Daily Worker" dated June 10, 1953, page 3, column 2, the subject spoke at a meeting held in the Palm Gardens, 306 West 52nd Street, New York City, on June 5, 1953.

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According to the "Daily Worker", the meeting was held to free CEDRIC BELFRAGE, Editor of the "National Guardian". The "Daily Worker" did not reflect any of the text of the subject's speech.

The 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities, page 394, cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at a national circulation, which they found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management and contents.

On October 15, 1954, T-14, of known reliability, advised that the subject spoke at a dinner held October 14, 1954 at the Manhattan Towers Hotel 75th Street and Broadway. New York City. T-14 advised that this dinner was held in honor of ESLANDA and PAUL ROBESON and was sponsored by the "New World Review". T-14 advised the was unable to furnish any specific information concerning the subject's speech at this dinner.

T-12 advised June 29, 1950 that ESLANDA ROBESON was a member of the Communist Party in 1925, but that she did not hold herself out as a Communist and denied membership in the Party. T-12 advised that she was a devoted member of the Communist Party along with her husband, PAUL ROBESON.

According to the Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, 82nd Congress, First Session, dated May 14, 1951, "Soviet Russia Today", which was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report of March 29, 1944, page 165, changed its name in March, 1951 to the "New World Review. T-18, of known reliability, advised October 15, 1953 that one D. PARKER had written an article, undated, entitled

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"We Can Beat The Enemy At His Own Game", which relates how the working class of people in the Loyalist Army of Spain would defeat the Fascists.



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

LOUIS BUDENZ has stated the subject was constantly officially referred to by V. J. JEROME and ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG as a Communist Party adherent.

HARRY WOLF, admitted CP member, advised that the subject was one of the leading characters in the Communist movement in Hollywood in the 1930's.

On 4/13/51, the subject was interviewed by Bureau agents and she denied membership in the CP, but admitted associations with the JAFRC, the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, the Hollywood League for Democratic Action, the Hollywood League of Women Shoppers, The United American-Spanish Aid Committee, and the National Committee to Win the Peace. She also admitted participating in programs for the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

In 1952, subject spoke at a meeting sponsored by the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and JAFRC and said at this meeting that she "wasn't hiding her identity from the FBI for whom she had only monumental scorn." She was listed as Chairman of the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC in March, 1952 and solicited funds for the Appeal from November, 1951-1954. She spoke at rallies sponsored by the National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims in December, 1953 and January, 1954. She also spoke at a dinner in October, 1954 honoring ESLANDA and PAUL ROBESON.

In view of the fact the subject has been alleged to have been a member of the CP by BUDENZ, as well as others and in view of the fact that the subject has been active in soliciting money for the Spanish Refugee Appeal of the JAFRC, as well as her activity described above, it is requested that the subject be placed on the Security Index.

On 3/15/55, the writer reviewed minutes of a public hearing of the NYS Joint Legislative Committee of Charitable and Philanthropic Agencies and Organizations (NYSJLC) concerning testimony regarding captioned organization on 2/23,24, & 25/55.

The record reflects that MARK STRAUS, PAULINE ROYCE, and DOROTHY PARKER testified. STRAUS and ROYCE utilized the Fifth Amendment of the US Constitution and Article I, Section 6 of the NYS Constitution in declining to answer practically all questions regarding the JAFRC.

DOROTHY PARKER testified that she had been called National Chairman of the JAPRC and had signed appeals emanating from this group. She stated that she knew nothing regarding the finances or actual operation of the Committee.

WILLIAM LOVELOCK, an investigator for the NYSJLC, made available a copy of the report on the JAFRC prepared by a CPA firm. The report is based on an analysis of JAFRC financial records obtained by the NYSJLC. Copies of this report have been furnished to the Bureau and a Photostat is being exhibited in captioned case file (100-3642-12).

It is to be noted that this financial report is not a part of the public hearing and the source should be protected.

The writer also reviewed a collection of Photostats of letter and appeals from the JAFRC signed by PARKER, STRAUS and ROYCE, but there was nothing available which is not included in the NYO files.



In accordance with instructions contained in rebulet, the following information is set out regarding the subject:

CP ACTIVITY

On 6/27/50, LOUIS F. BUDENZ (protect by a T symbol) advised that from the late 1930's on, DOROTHY PARKER, a writer, (whom he never met) was constantly referred to officially by V. J. JEROME and ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG in the Cultural Commission, as an active adherent of the CP. In the late 1930's and early 1940's; according to BUDENZ, she was specifically mentioned in these discussions as being the chief co-worker for the Party, together with DONALD OGDEN STEWART in influencing writers in Hollywood, California, and in the Party Writers' Unit there. BUDENZ stated that she played a large part in assembling the Committee to Defend Harry Bridges. BUDENZ also advised that from 1941 on, he was in charge of BRIDGES' publicity and was constantly told by ROBERT MINOR, EUGENE DENNIS and JACK STACHEL that PARKER was an adherent of the CP.

advised on 8/4,10/50 that he was a member of the CP in Hollywood, California, for more than ten years. The informant stated that PARKER, a writer, was a member of the CP in Hollywood, California, around the time of the peak of the Spanish Civil War. The informant stated that to his knowledge, PARKER was no longer active and was probably out of the Communist movement entirely.

3. On 9/19/51, MARTIN BERKELEY, Screen Writer, testified before a public session of a subcommittee of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, US House of Representatives, Los Angeles, California, that DOROTHY PARKER was present at a meeting held in his home in Hollywood, California, in June 1937. He testified that at this meeting, the Hollywood Section of the CP was formed. He testified that because of her prominence, she later became a member at large and as such did not attend CP meetings.

This informant stated that this group was for certain individuals, who needed extra protection to prevent disclosure of their CP membership or sympathy. The informant advised that although she, the informant, was never a member of this group, she understood that DOROTHY PARKER, a prominent writer, was in this group. The informant stated that the CP used this group principally for money and prestige and advised that this group may not have been, strictly speaking, a CP branch, and that its members were not necessarily, ipso facto, CP members.

She stated that she may have been a member of the American Council for Democratic Greece and that she may have taken part in the American Youth for Democracy Program but was vague as to her participation in the Civil Rights Congress. She stated that she had been associated with the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, the Hollywood League for Democratic Action, the League of Women Shoppers, the United Spanish Aid Committee, and the National Committee to Win the Peace.



At this meeting, according to the "Daily Worker," the subject stated, ".....She wasn't hiding her identity from the FBI, for whom she had only monumental scorn."

6. On 1/6/54, advised that the subject spoke at an "Amnesty Christmas Rally," sponsored by the National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims. The SIs advised that the affair, attended by 293 persons, was chaired by FRANCIS JENNINGS. According to the informants, the invocation was given by LOCTOR WILLIAM HOWARD MELISH who spoke to the group for about one half hour. MELISH, the SIs advised, referred to the Brooklyn Eagles, his own church situation, and to some of his parishioners who are teachers to whom he had given guidance, in situations similar to that of the teachers in Philadelphia brought before the HCUA.

MELISH discussed the Louisville, Kentucky, incident where a white man purchased a home for a Negro and was subsequently jailed for sedition. MELISH, according to the SIs, read a reply from the jailed man's wife to one of his parishioners.

The informants advised BARROWS DUNHAM introduced DOROTHY PARKER but their comments were not recalled.

JENNINGS, according to the SIs, talked at length on the subject "Whose Schools" and on the need to do something in the field of legislation for an elected school board.

SARA WALSH WEPMAN, the SIs stated, made a plea for money to carry the case against the Philadelphia School Board to the higher courts and asked for group reports.

and stated only one report was forthcoming from the Oak Lane group who had raised about \$250. An announcement was made that the ANTON family had contributed \$150. According to the SIs, money and pledges were collected from the audience and the total came to about \$1,070 in cash and \$75 in pledges.

HARRY LEVITAN, according to the SIs, presented the Teachers Union annual award to Mrs. BENJAMIN ANTON for her husband, which was accepted with a great display of emotion.
