

Muhlenberg College/Morning Call Pennsylvania 7th Congressional District 2018 Midterm Election Survey April/May

Key Findings:

- 1. In the wake of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court ordered redistricting, voters in Lehigh, Northampton and southern Monroe County will now be voting in the newly constructed Pennsylvania 7th Congressional District.
- 2. A majority (53%) of registered voters in the 7th Congressional District disapprove of the job that President Trump is doing in office with just under 4 out of 10 (39%) approving of the 45th President's job performance.
- 3. An enthusiasm gap appears to have emerged among voters in the 7th Congressional District with 64% of Democrats "very interested" in the midterm election in November compared to 53% of Republicans.
- 4. In a generic congressional ballot 7th District voters give Democrats an 11% lead over Republicans (46%-35%).
- 5. Voters in the 7th Congressional District are generally not familiar with the array of Democrat and Republican candidates running for their party's nomination as a candidate for Congress.
- 6. In potential match-ups of leading Democrat and Republican challengers in the 7th Congressional District the Democrats outperform their Republican Counterparts with leads ranging between 7% and 18%.
- 7. The job performance of Congressman Charlie Dent, who currently represents a large portion of the newly constructed 7th Congressional District, is rated fairly positively with 43% of voters in the 7th District approving of Dent's work compared to 25% who disapprove of his performance in the House of Representatives.

Methodological Statement

The following report contains the results of a telephone survey of 408 voters in the 7th Congressional District of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania between April 24 and May 3, 2018. Respondents were interviewed in English on both landlines (173) and cell phones (235). With a randomly selected sample of respondents the margin of error for the survey is +/-5.5% at a 95% level of confidence. Margins of error for questions with smaller sample size will be larger. In addition to sampling error, one should consider that question wording and other fielding issues can introduce error or bias into survey results. The data has been weighted by gender and party registration to reflect voter population parameters in the 7th Congressional District in Pennsylvania. The calculation of sampling error takes into account design effects due to the weighting identified above. In order to reach a representative sample of likely voters both land lines and cell phones were called up to 3 times. The response rate for this survey as calculated using the American Association of Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) RRII formula is approximately 11%. The sampling frame for the study is from the registered voters files of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Due to rounding the totals provided in the frequency report may not total 100%. The survey instrument (presented in its entirety below) was designed by Dr. Christopher P. Borick of the MCIPO is conjunction with the staff of the Morning Call. The survey was funded exclusively by the Morning Call and the MCIPO.
