I have only one key point to make which is that I do not believe that Ineos have been asked to do enough checks during flaring operations.

I understand that the location of the noise level measurement point of NS 96880 80035 is to the west of Nether Kinneil Cottage on the road that runs east to west above the A904 Bo'ness / Grangemouth Road. This point being the nearest domestic property and also at similar height to the Ineos elevated flaring operations.

[REDACTED] Ineos flaring noise and light which effects my home area of [REDACTED] during sleep hours for long durations and also surrounding open areas such as the Douglas Park where not only noise but smell and oily taste is a problem when simply out for a walk with the dog.

During such times I have driven to Ineos and found that locally the noise output and nuisance is not as bad as that suffered within the Bo'ness areas, I suspect that there is some sort of sonic boom noise transfer coupled with the prevailing wind which allows pollution of noise and contaminants to travel the 2.5 miles as the Crows fly.

My suggestion to SEPA is to include additional noise measurement locations to cover Bo'ness, Polmont and Grangemouth west areas within any future requirements of Ineos.
