Hi James,

Attached is a re-worked bill for you and the Senate to consider. I've re-worked it to accomplish 4 main things:

- 1. Establishment of the State Resiliency Office
- 2. Secretary of Commerce is the chair of the board as his office would coordinate the meetings, activities, reports to legislature.
- 3. Add all resiliency efforts to the purpose of the office not just flooding.
- 4. 8 member board governs the office with the Secretary (as said) being the chair.

The bill does not impede or interfere with the normal responsibilities of any agency – it simply adds an office through which resiliency / flooding plans are coordinated.

- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
- 2 designated §4-15-1; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new article, designated
- 3 §29-30-1, §29-30-2, §29-30-3 and §29-30-4, all relating to state flood protection planning;
- 4 providing legislative findings; defining terms; establishing the State
- 5 Resiliency Office(SRO) and governing board; describing certain
- 6 <u>duties; requiring reports; and establishing a Joint Legislative Committee on Flooding.</u>

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
- 2 article, designated §4-15-1; and that said code be amended by adding there to a new article,
- 3 designated §29-30-1, §29-30-2, §29-30-3 and §29-30-4, all to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER 4. THE LEGISLATURE.

#### ARTICLE 15. JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON FLOODING.

#### §4-15-1. Establishing a Joint Legislative Committee on Flooding.

- 1 (a) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall each
- 2 appoint five members of their respective houses, at least two of whom shall be members of the
- 3 minority party, and at least one shall be a member of the Committee on Government Organization,
- 4 to serve an interim committee charged with studying flood damage reduction and flood plain

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish the <u>State Resiliency Office</u> and authorize certain duties; and establish a Joint Legislative Committee on Flooding.
