and 848. In lieu of bringing said person before a magistrate, you may release, prior to the time limitations of Penal
Code Section 825, said person from custody without bail or further appearance before a magistrate and then shall
file with me no later than the next day on which the court is in session a declaration under penalty of perjury setting
forth the fact that said person has been released without bail or further appearance before a magistrate.

Defendant is to be admitted to bail in the amount of \$ 5000

This warrant may be executed at anytime during the ten calendar days subsequent to its issuance
(that is, until 12/10/84).

1 Your affiant's name is Richard A. Marks #20018, a Police Officer
2 for the City of Los Angeles for the past 11 years. Affiant is
3 presently assigned to Southwest Area Detectives - Homicide
4 Section. On October 23, 1984, your affiant and his partner,
5 John O. Bunch #12848, were assigned investigative responsibility
6 for the stabbing death of Christopher Hanson which occurred on
7 October 23, 1984, 2130 hours, next to 2248 South Hobart Avenue,
8 Los Angeles, and was reported under DR# 84-03-32221. (Attach-
9 ment "A"). The victim and his girlfriend (Witness Bishop) were
10 seated in his vehicle which was parked at the curb on a residential
11 street. Two suspects approached the vehicle and positioned them-
12 selves, one on each side. Suspect #1 pulled open the driver's
13 (Victim's) door confronted victim with a knife and demanded
14 his money. Witness Bishop, who had been asleep with her head
15 in victim's lap, awakened to observe Suspect #2 leaning thru
16 passenger's window while Suspect #1 stood inside the open
17 driver's door striking at victim with a knife. Suspect #1
18 removed victim's wallet and fled northbound Hobart Avenue toward
19 22nd Street ^{WITH SUSPECT/2}. Witness Bishop provided a description of suspects
20 and later (October 26, 1984) with a police artist, prepared a
21 composite drawing. On November 27, 1984, affiant interviewed a
22 previously unidentified witness, Clarence Pace, who had observed
23 two possible suspects running from the scene of the murder.
24 Witness Pace stated that on October 23, 1984, he was walking
25 northbound on La Salle between 22nd and 23rd Streets, when two
26 male blacks ran into view eastbound 22nd Street then southbound
27 La Salle. The shorter of the suspects ran past Witness Pace at
28 a distance just beyond arm's length and then together with the

1 other suspect turned eastbound 23rd Street. Pace continued
2 walking in the direction the suspects had come running from
3 and observed activity and an ambulance in the 2200 block of
4 Hobart Avenue surrounding a yellow pick-up truck. Approaching,
5 Pace learned that a robbery-murder had occurred involving (2)
6 male black suspects. Pace described the individuals he'd seen
7 running as: (1) Male, Black, 5-7/5-8, thin, 30 years of age,
8 unshaven with a mustache and goatee. #2 , Male, Black, 5-9/5-10,
9 medium weight, 25 years of age, with a large (4"-5") unkept
10 wild afro and wearing a dark blue sleeveless ski vest. Pace's
11 physical description was consistent with that provided by
12 Witness Bishop. What's more, Pace indicated that he was 80%
13 sure that Suspect #1 (Closest to him) was a person known to him
14 only as "A.D." Pace was shown the area's robbery mug books
15 and identified booking #7788415 (Andrew Wilson) as "A.D.". In
16 addition, he identified a second booking photo (#7788414) as
17 that of "Fast Freddie" (Frederick Terrell) a frequent companion
18 of "A.D.". Pace was unable, however, to identify "Fast Freddie"
19 as the other male, black he'd seen running. Affiant noted that
20 both Wilson and Terrell bore a strong resemblance to the
21 composite drawing of the suspects. On checking the association
22 between Wilson and Terrell, affiant determined that on October
23 14, 1984, they had been arrested together for a street 211 P.C.
24 (Robbery) at 1755 West Adams Boulevard, (DR# 84-03-31221). No
25 criminal complaint had been filed (District Attorney Reject -
26 1 on 1 identification) and they had been released on October
27 17, 1984. On November 8, 1984, Wilson was again arrested for
28 12020 P.C. (DWCL - Billy) at 2545 West Adams.

1 Terrell was the other passenger in the vehicle but was not
2 arrested (DR# 84-03-34380). Your affiant interviewed Jimmy
3 Lee Stewart, the registered owner of the vehicle which Wilson
4 had been operating at the time of the November 8, 1984 arrest.
5 Stewart described Wilson as currently living with an elderly
6 male, black, known to him only as "Joe" in an unfinished unit
7 of the apartment courts being remodeled at [REDACTED]
8 Affiant prepared a photo line-up containing 16 photo's, to include
9 those of Wilson and Terrell. That line-up was shown to Witness
10 Bishop who hesitated over photo of Terrell, commenting over
11 similarity with Suspect #2 on her side of the vehicle. However,
12 she indicated she couldn't be positive absent a live line-up
13 and the opportunity to hear him speak. She then eliminated
14 several other photo's following which your affiant directed
15 her attention to Wilson's photo which she then identified with
16 80% confidence. Again she indicated her desire for live line-up,
17 profile view, and voice. It is your affiant's belief that
18 Andrew Wilson and Frederick Terrell are the persons responsible
19 for the Robbery/Murder of Christopher Hanson. What's more, your
20 affiant believes that the dark blue sleeveless ski vest described
21 by Witness Pace as being worn by Suspect #2 will be found in
22 Terrell's residence. Affiant prays that probable cause arrest
23 warrants be issued for the persons of Andrew Wilson (Male, Black,
24 DOB: January 23, 1955) and Frederick Terrell (Male, Black DOB:
25 March 13, 1953) together with a search warrant for Terrell's
26 residence at [REDACTED] Los Angeles.
