
Dear Mr. Agresta,

We are writing in response to your June 26, 2018 letter to our client Charter Communications, Inc. (the "Letter"). Pursuant to your request, please find the attached log of Charter's communications related to its network buildout and efforts to provide New Yorkers with Spectrum broadband internet access (the "Requested Log"). Charter has made a reasonable and good-faith effort to assemble the information in the Requested Log in the limited time provided by the Letter and reserves the right to supplement and further object as appropriate.

Please be advised that Charter disagrees with and disputes the various claims in the Letter, including, without limitation: (i) any allegations of "misleading statements," "false advertising" or similar claims; (ii) any claim that the New York Public Service Commission's ("PSC") June 14, 2018 Order "directed," ordered or otherwise resulted in a "directive" to cease Charter's communications relating to its buildout efforts and/or disseminate advertisements with information favored by the PSC; and (iii) any claims in the Letter or the June 14, 2018 Order that the PSC can, under color of law, deprive Charter of its rights to express itself on a matter of public concern, and/or can require or coerce the adoption of speech favored by the PSC in lieu of or in addition to Charter's lawful communications and public relations efforts.

As a result, this response is provided with the express reservation of all of Charter's available rights and remedies, including, without limitation, the right to raise jurisdictional objections, seek administrative or judicial review of the findings in or conclusions of the June 14, 2018 Order or judicial review of any purported claim or directive arising from the June 14, 2018 Order or Letter that violates Charter's constitutionally protected rights to free speech. The provision of the Requested Log does not constitute any agreement, waiver of rights or a release from liability regarding any of the issues described above.
