
Methodology:

- August 16-26, 2018
- n=404 Completed interviews
- Respondents screened and qualified as likely voters
- All 55 counties are included in the sampling frame
- Confidence interval +/- 4.9 percentage points
- Data Collection A hybrid methodology





More Likely Voters in West Virginia Approve of Donald Trump's Job Performance Than in 2017



Trump's Most Loyal Supporters Are Very Engaged in the 2018 Election General Election




25% of West Virginians are both *very engaged* with this years election and *very approving* of President Trump

One Year After Switching Parties, Jim Justice's Job Approval Ratings Have Improved – From 34% in 2017 to 43% in 2018




Q: Next, do you approve or disapprove of the job the following public figures are doing - Jim Justice as West Virginia Governor






Shelley Moore-Capito's Approval Ratings Are Up 9 Percentage Points from 2017

Only About One Third of Likely Voters Approve of Patrick Morrisey's Job Performance and Another Third Are Unsure




Those "Not Sure" about Morrisey are less interested in this years election than those who have already formed opinions.

In a Generic Ballot, West Virginia's Likely Voters Are More Likely to Prefer a Republican Congress



Party Preference for Control of the West Virginia Legislature Also Significantly Favors Republicans



Manchin Leads Morrisey by Eight Percentage Points at This Stage of the Race



However, Morrisey voters tend to be more interested and engaged in this year's election than Manchin voters - which could impact voter turn-out.

If Don Blankenship Had Been on the Ballot, Manchin Out Polls Morrisey by 11 Percentage Points



Nearly 12% of Morrisey voters would have switched to Blankenship if the West Virginia Supreme Court had ruled in his favor.
