On August 3, 1968, the Buffalo Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) telephonically advised the Miami Office that the Buffalo, New York Police Department had received an anonymous telephone call at 9:50 PM, wherein the caller stated, "Reagan at the airport at Miami, bomb will go off and kill several hundred people." The caller then hung up.

At 10:21 PM, that same day, Officer O. R. Martin, Dade County Public Safety Department, Miami International Airport Sub-station, telephonically advised Governor Reagan had arrived at the airport eight minutes earlier and departed the airport complex without incident. The Public Safety Department was not going to conduct a search in view of the nature of the call.

The receipt of the above referenced threat was immediately disseminated to James M. Masterovito, U.S. Secret Service, and Roger Herman of the 111th M.I. Group by Special Agent John J. Mc Breen of the Miami Office of the FBI.







By letter dated January 29, 1969 Mr. Charles E. Casey, Assistant Director, State of California, Department of Corrections, Sacramento, California, advised that he had received the following communication addressed to California Governor Ronald Reagan by one Bernard H. Bell, an inmate at the Vacaville Medical Facility, Vacaville, California:

"Dear Govner Regan

"Have tryed many times to aid myself by trying to get interviews and write to lawyers and also get some money from a bank in Warren Ohio.

"But Doctor Klanar the boss doctor here womt let me aid myself. I am here for a parole violation for driving a car and leaving the State without the parole officers permition. And have been here sence Feb\_16 of 1958.

"And mearly because you and goven Brown have orderd and let these dum doctors here exspermenter on me with a piece of Brain wave equipment. I have made fools out of them for eleven yours and they are mad at me because they can't handle my brain and distroy it.

This 61-year-old second termer was received 12/28/35 for Murder 1st, Robbery 1st and Burglary 1st. He was paroled 12/28/51 and returned 11/4/57 as a PV TFT. This is the twelfth regular Psychiatric Report to the Adult Authority.

Subject has been known to writer for the past one and one-half years. He has a long and continuing history of hearing voices and believing that doctors have placed a machine in his head. He has been housed in the psychotic unit since he was received at this institution on 1/31/61. Subject continues the delusion that the sound equipment planted in his head by doctors is used to control him. In a letter addressed to the Governor dated April, 1968, "I really do intend to obtain a knife and if I have to use it to get something done for myself I will do so". In another letter to his sister dated June 28, 1968, subject stated, "Tell him if sometime later I have to come to that damn bank and beat his damn brains out or rob and kill everyone in that damn bank or town to get my money, I'll do just that. Nellie I need that money for attorney fees so I can obtain a pardon and get out of this damn place". Photostat copies of both of these letters are available and on file. There is also a threatening letter on file to the Second National Bank in Warren, Chio dated June 10, 1968 wherein subject threatened to someday go to the bank and take his money by force with a gun in his hand.

PSYCHIATRIC DIAGNOSIS: Schizophrenic Reaction, paranoid type.

PSYCHIATRIC CONCLUSIONS: During observation in this institution, he has psychiatrically shown no significant change. In a less controlled setting such as return to the community, this inmate is considered to be unpredictable. Aggressive potential outside a controlled setting is estimated to be great. He is currently receiving the following medication: Valium 5 mgs. four times a day.

RECOMMENDATION TO CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE: Continue in present program and hopefully work toward day parole on an all day basis and eventually progress to the general population.



governor will urge a 5% acrossthe-board cut in state and localassistance spending except on debt service, which can't be cut.

Sounds fine, and we hope it

happens.

It doesn't sound nearly as fine, though, as a couple of things Gov. Ronald Reagan (R-Calif.) included in his state of the state message to the California Legislature yesterday.

Gov. Reagan, whom "liberals" delight in smearing because he once was a movie actor (and what's wrong with that?), proposed what he termed "a substantial personal [state] income tax reduction," and added

that "under no circumstances will I support or sign into law any tax increase." Gov. Rocketeller, we believe, though expected to ask

a state sales tax boost, should ponder this Reagan astonisher.

Reagan also came out flatfooted for tough new laws aimed at hell-raisers on college campuses - stepped-up penalties for assaults on teachers or students; dismissal of teachers who interfere with educational processes; stronger anti-trespass laws to keep troublemakers off

college property. To which, we respond with a grand Amen.

We recommend this Reagan formula to the New York Legislature, and to Mayor John V. Lindsay with reference to his just-launched anticrime drive. It's fine to tell people how to make life harder for burglars. But how about also concentrating on making the streets a lot safer - and giving the police ample leeway in their efforts to that end?

Copies of this communication are being disseminated to U.S. Attorney, Secret Service and the Intelligence Agencies of Army, Navy and Air Force.

The Board of Regents, University of California, held a meeting on October 17 and 18, 1968, on the campus of the University of California at Santa Cruz (UCSC), California. On the second day of the meeting, at which California Governor Ronald Reagan was present, a Vietnamborn student at UCSC Stevenson College, Ho Nguyen, presented three proposals to the Board of Regents. These proposals, according to the October 18, 1968 edition of the "Santa Cruz Sentinel", a newspaper published daily in Santa Cruz, . California, were concerned with support for a proposed Malcolm X College at UCSC; that the Regents favor a boycott of California table grapes on University of California campuses; and a protest against earlier action by the Board of Regents restricting the number of lectures by outside speakers on University of California campuses. The "Press", a UCSC student newspaper, on October 18, 1968, identified Rich, Towsend president of the Black Student Alliance, as also présenting these proposals.

According to Santa Cruz, California Chief of Police Geno J. Pini (NA), Governor Reagan held a press conference at the conclusion of the meeting, at which there were 200 to 300 demonstrators. He advised that the Governor was verbally attacked with insults and profanity and at one point was struck by an unknown person. He stated that the Governor immediately struck back, and when he was asked by Chief Pini if he needed

the Santa Cruz Police Department tactical squad, he replied that he did not since he did not wish to have uniformed police on the campus.

There were no injuries, no arrests and there was no property damage.

When Governor Reagan's private plane departed Santa Cruz later in the afternoon on October 18, 1968, and after the plane was airborne, a telephone call was received by the Scotts Valley Fire Department, which is the location of the Santa Cruz airport. The anonymous caller stated that there was a bomb on the Governor's plane. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) offices at Oakland and Salinas, California were immediately notified and since the Governor's plane was out of radio reach of Santa Cruz, FAA Los Angeles was notified and attempted to contact the Governor's plan. Vernon Bourg, Air Traffic Control Center, FAA, Oakland, California, advised at 5:48 PM that Governor Reagan's plane had landed safely at Santa Monica, California, at 5:44 PM that date.

Chief Pini advised that Governor Reagan's plane was under police guard for the entire time that it was in Santa Cruz and feels that the bomb scare must have been a hoax.

Two weeks ago last Friday the mighty Regents of the University of California decided that Eldridge Cleaver could not give a series of ten lectures to students in a course for credit. Last Friday Cleaver spoke to an audience of more than 7,000 students in the Edwin Pauley Memorial Basketball Pavilion and before long he will have spoken at every. UC campus in the state.

Governor Ronald Reagan stirred up a storm of controversy over Sociology 139X, the class Cleaver will teach, and forced him before the attention of the media. In reporting his speeches the daily press paid close atten-

Cleaver's speech began:

"Good afternoon, my fellow hu-

man beings.

"I want to thank those who are responsible for inviting me down here. I want to thank Mickey Mouse Reagan and Donald Duck Rafferty for making it possible. Before I go any further I want to get into this by saying what some people don't want to hear and others do not mind: Fuck Ronald Reagan. Fuck Ronald Reagan.

"Here we have a grade B character actor, who swindled his way into the governor's mansion by very quietly and very beautifully parroting the scripts put before him by some criminal writers from Hollywood or Disneyland or somewhere funny like that

"He wants everybody to know and to behave in the manner prescribed by our governor. Our governor, our lord, our master, our leader and teacher—oink.

"Students at the University of California, along with some faculty members, invited me to participate in a series of lectures. They asked me to deliver ten lectures. I wouldn't have to change what I had been saying, but perhaps structure it a little bit so that it could be moulded into a package that could be brought off of the streets and into the quiet, peaceful halls of higher education.

"You would have thought they invited me down there to rape all the white girls and kill all the white men. Ronald Reagan says that it's a disgrace for a man with my background, a disreputable character like myself to be a invited onto a campus where I

might corrupt the morals of the 'youth. I say that Reagan and all the pigs of the power structure have corrupted the very air that we breathe.

"What we are trying to do is save ourselves and perhaps save. the world. Rescue this funky, corrupt polluted country from the death role in which it has been placed by old, decrepit, avaricious, crazy, dizzy, loony, kooky, corrupt people who want to rule the world, who want to rule the people of this country and who want to make us believe that they own the state of California and that they own the people of the state of California. They have forgotten that they are nothing but public servants, that they owe their first duty to the public.

"They are nothing but public servants and they have no right to impose their dimwitted will upon the people. The people don't have to go for it. I'm not gonna

"I say Ronald Reagan is a punk, a sissy and a coward. I challenge him to a duel to the death right now. He can choose his own weapons. He can choose a baseball bat, a knife, a gun or a marshmallow. I will beat him to death with a marshmallow, cause he's a punk.

"He's a coward and he won't do that. He won't confront that. What he does, since he's the Chief Executive of the state of California, he turns to the machinery of oppression beneath him, namely to the department of corrections—to the parole officers and my parole officer in particular and tells them, twists their arms to force them (and you really don't have to force THOSE pigs) and he gets them to revore my parole. Just as he twisted the arms of the courts and of ary other agency under his control to get rid of Eldridge Cleaver and send him back to the penitentiary. Well I'm not going. Fuck him in his ass. Fuck him.

"I went to the penitentiary to investigate it for you. You might call it a field trip, an extended safari and I didn't like it. During the time that I was behind those walls I had the pleasure of visiting every part of the prison from the hospital to solitary confinement, and I don't like any of it, not even the medicine.

"So let him go to the penitentlary. Let him take his mama to the penitentiary. I want to stay out here where the people are and

19t the penitentiary be for the pigs, for that's who belongs in it, I have been rehabilitated. I am 1 not gonna bother no more citizens. All of my hostility, all of the hatred that I have in my heart, all of the bitterness I have in my heart-and I have it-is for the pigs and the power structure, the machinery of oppression and the fucked up system that has fucked up the world and fucked up our lives, and that we have to deal with for ourselves and for posterity whether they like it or not!

"And it is necessary for us to realize that we have three categories of pigs to deal with. First and foremost, deepest in the pit of evil, we have the avaricious. greedy businessmen, those who own the planet Earth, those who own the resources in the planet Earth, those who own us.

"In the second category we have the hypocritical, demagogic politicians. In the third category we have the ignorant, racist pig cops, your local police, the gestapo, occupying armies, the strongarm forces of the power structure. These are our enemies, broadly, cutlined. They have detailed categories that we can get into, but those are our enemies, those are the forces that have to be dealt! with. And we have to start by

letting them know that we know that every one of them came out of their mother's pussy naked and with nothin,' cryin' into this world like everybody else. They didn't come here with any blue chip stock pinned to their asses. They didn't come here with any deeds

leave like we're going to leave, depending on how the shit breaks.

"Because we happen to know that there are more people in this country than there are pigs. And we don't have to be afraid of the pigs. All they can do is kill us, and lock us up in their jails. But they can't go on killing us and they won't be able to keep us in their jails if the people of this country would stand up and tell them: "No more, motherfucker, no more!"

"The McCarthyites and the Kennedyites and those who are not really off into the right-wing bag —I think they got the message in Chicago. Racist pig Daley, Mayor Daley the butcher, the murderer, released his pigs on the people who had come to express their political position, helping to insure that meathead Humphrey would still maintain his pig-like grasp on the reins of power in the Democratic party. Let him have the Democratic party. Let us take the Democratic party and the Republican party and all the pigs that stand with both those parties and let us dump them into the garbage can of history where they belong, and let's bury it where we bury the dead!

"Because if you want to talk about tomorrow, if you want to talk about the future, if you want to talk about the 21st century, then you're gonna have to start talkin' about corralling these international gangsters who are putting the world into a position where there's going to be universal death, not just for the nigger: When you look at the world, the world is no longer a far-flung planet. The earth is a neighborhood.

won't need a crystal ball to tell a us what's in store for us when we see General Hershey, the man who sends greetings to the young black brothers in the ghetto tellin' them, 'Come on boy, go over there in Vietnam and kill some of those niggers for me."

"We don't need a crystal ball to read it when we see that same man come out and endorse a feather-weight, feather-brained, pint-sized punk, racist dog like George Wallace of Alabama. We know what's behind that, And if we needed any other proof, all'

we'd have to do is check the news, out and see that general Curtis' LeMay, the god of the Strategic Air Command, has been selected by this pintsized idiot to be his running mate—running mate to where? Where in the fuck does he think he's going?

"He's running and he's better keep running. And those other pigs; Oink Nixon and Oink Humphrey, Oink all of them... all of them had better start running because there is a storm brewing over America and the people are going to rise up and say: 'Up against the wall Motherfucker, because you done wrong."

"We're not going to ask them. The Regents aren't going to pass a resolution instructing themselves to get up against the wall. The oppressor has no rights which the oppressed are bound to respect and don't forget it. They ain't got nothin' coming. They ain't got nothing coming.

"We want to make a distinction, because we can't go around speaking categorically if we start talking about ethnic groups, races and people and things, because some of your allies might be turned against you. So we want to make it very clear to all the inhabitants of Disneyland, Los Angeles, Chief Reddin's pigpen, snorty Yorty's pigpen. We want to make it clear that we recognize - that the Black Panther party, Black people alone, cannot deal with this. That its going to take an awakening generation, a revolutionary generation of white people, young white people who are brave enough and willing to face "It's a neighborhood, its communications and transportation are up tight and everything is around the corner including the specter of genocide, which black people have their eyes on.

"We see what the racists in this country are cookin' up for us. We the challenges of the ruture, the challenges of the present—to get out of all of these bags that we've been in—to look beyond the eth-nocentrism, the xenophobia that we've all been indoctrinated with to recognize that the world is a neighborhood, a community, and then move to eradicate every obstacle in our way to make it that

way so we can have peace on this pearth!

"It is a basic principle that every man, woman and child on, the face of the planet earth has an absolute right to the highest and the best standard of living that human knowledge and technology is capable of providing. Period. Every man, woman and child, I don't care what color he is, or what country he's in. It is enough that he is born into this world and therefore he has the right to live. It is the responsibility of the organized machinery of society to do everything that it can to insure and to guarantee that everybody gets their issue without no bullshit about it.

"And we are gonna have it that way. That's the way it's gonna be. Because the revolutionary people of the world are saying that we're gonna be part of the democratic destruction of the world or we're going to be part of the democratic regeneration of this burnt-out planet.

"There aint gonna be no two ways about it. It's gonna be us or it ain't gonna be nobody. It's gonna be us together, or it's gonna be chaos in Babylon all over the planet earth, and we've got to understand that. This is the last gonound. Everybody is face-to-face with the enemy and toe-to-toe. We've got to learn to make distinctions and somehow manifests where we are, so we can know who is the enemy and who is not the enemy.

"We can start out right now with" a song that I have written entitled: "Fuck Ronald Reagan." Cleaver admitted that he is not much of a choir director. Then he led six "Fuck Ronald Reagan" cheers in the UCLA basketball pavilion. By the sixth try the cheerleader had most of the crowd shouting with him. Then he went on talking about power, racism and politics.)

"All power to the people. Black power to Black people. Red power to Red people. Brown power to Brown people. Yellow power to Yellow people. White power to White people. That's not what you have now. You have pig power now. If you have White power you wouldn't have the pigs on the Board of Regents inflicting their will on you.

"The people are insulted now by public servants who have become so arrogant. Take Mickey Mouse Rafferty with his PhD in Physical Education, who has based his career on taking all mention of communism out of the textbooks. We already have a song and dance man in the Senate. Now we're going to have a volleyball coach to decide over our lives. They say the people get the rulers they deserve. I'll be goddamned if we deserve that.

"Every people and every ethnic group has an absolute right to be in control of its own destiny.

"It is not man's destiny to be an exploiter and butcher of the people. We want to bring the boys home, but we don't want to bring them home to put them on the police force. We're not going to bring them home to do to us what they do in Vietnam. The boys don't want to murder people, We've got to welcome them home because we need a people's militia.

"We have to break with the past. We are going to have to dance to a tune that does not insult the humanity of any one."

"It is possible for White people not to be racists. White supremacy is over. It is possible for everybody not to be a racist. It is possible to get along. It is possible for everyone on the same planet earth to live together without being at everybody's throats and if they don't believe they ought to give up. It's possible for me to get along with Ronald Reagan if he doesn't try to tell me what to do, where I can go and if he doesn't force me to watch his movies.

"If we don't have that faith we can just let go, take acid, get drunk and let the pigs have it."

Green indicated the  ${f v}$ letter read, ''I have a Winchester rifle to blow your head off in 24 hours after You had better have your insurance paid up. you receive this letter. I met you 2 years ago and I did not like your looks. Green advised the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) were investigating this matter with the assistance of Governor Reagan's staff and the Secret Service, Washington, D. C. Attempts were being made to locate captioned individual in Washington, D. C.

No information was located in Bureau indices identifiable with captioned individual and this information was telephonically furnished to SA Green on 2/27/69 and confirmed in writing.

Since no investigation has been requested of Bureau in this matter and the matter is being investigated by Governor Reagan's staff, assisted by the MPD and Secret Service, Washington, D. C., the Bureau is conducting no investigation.

Therefore, this matter does not include one of the essential elements of the Bureau's jurisdiction of violation of the Extortion Statute and is, therefore, not being presented to the United States Attorney at San Diego for a prosecutive opinion.

W. G. HOUSTON, Naval Investigative Service Office, 11th Naval District, advised on 2/4/69, that was discharged from the U. S. Navy service in 1967 and retired on disability because of a psychiatric condition making him unfit for continued military service. HOUSTON stated that records of his office are replete with entries reflecting that | since this discharge, has entered numerous petitions to sue, all of which involve alleged violation of his Constitutional rights and his claim that he was involuntarily forced out of the U. S. Navy service against his will. All of these claims have been entered in Small Claims Court and the Courts in each instance have declined to hear such cases based on lack of jurisdiction or sufficient evidence. HOUSTON advised that this latest petition is another similar such claim and representative of \_\_\_\_\_ prolific capacity for this type of endeavor.



Captain John Shingle, Placer County Sheriff's Office, Auburn, California, advised on March 7, 1969, at approximately 3:23 AM their dispatcher received a telephone call from a pay booth at Roseville, California, from an individual who was very difficult to understand. This individual asked if he was sixteen miles from where Governor Ronald Reagan lived. He went on to state that he was going to travel to Sacramento and kill Governor Reagan on March 7, 1969. He stated that he was also going to do the same thing to President Richard M. Nixon.

This individual stated that he went to the Roseville Police Department and inquired why the bus depot was closed. He stated that the police department advised him that the bus depot was closed at night and that he could not spend the night at their jail. He stated that the only way he could spend the night in jail was if he was drunk. He stated that he was very upset with the Roseville Police Department and the police "dogs" that work there. This individual made many other derogatory remarks against the Roseville Police Department. This individual further advised that he was from Washington, D. C. and that he has previously written to Governor Ronald Reagan and President Richard M. Nixon.





Ladies and Gentlemen:

Thank you for granting me the privilege of appearing before you. My request to come was prompted by the crises brought about by UCSD Chancellor William McGill's decision to rehire Dr. Herbert Marcuse. Admittedly, I have come in the hope that some words I say will influence you to veto this decision and use your power to prevent like disasters from occuring in the future.

Now, disaster is a strong word but, in the context of the times in which we live, when the campus is being rapidly converted to a battleground, I doubt if the term is overdrawn. The world over, University campuses are being used as revolutionary launching pads. This is not merely the hysterical opinion of one Assemblyman. It is a grim fact of life attested to by every issue of every current newspaper and on every newscast. Within the year, in Mexico, students took to trenches around the National University; in France students started a sequence of events that nearly toppled the government; in Japan, students engaged in a pyrotechnic rampage of appalling proportions; and so on, around the globe.

Our own battlefields are well known--among others, Columbia, Duke, the University of Wisconsin, and, to our sorrow, California. In every case, demands (some legitimate, some not) are accompanied by intimidation and violence by those who are, as has been said, quick to claim 'rights,' yet refuse to grant them; who worship dissent, yet tolerate none; and who, by the weapon of mass interference, impose their own brand of censorship.

Thus, events force us to look at this situation squarely and ask ourselves what are our responsibilities? What is your responsibility as Regents? What is my responsibility as a legislator? Our responsibility is the same. We must find out why the measures taken have not improved the campus situation. There is a simple answer, and I believe it is because they were not the right measures. Almost consistently, symptoms have received treatment, not the disease itself. Incredibly, the measures taken have first, generally ignored the fact that cause has effect (which, if you will pardon the expression, Emerson called "the chancellors of God"). Second, blithly sidestepped the notion that ideas can have consequences, and third, that somebody is responsible for actions. Again, if you will excuse the expression, there has been little or no "relating." The case of Marcuse is a prime example.

On the one hand, the so-called New Left worships Marcuse as part of its trinity. "Marx, Marcuse, and Mao" is the battle cry and wherever Marcuse goes, trouble follows. Marcuse is no man of mystery. He has made no secret of what he believes either in his writing or in his speeches. And, unfortunately, there are those who mistake this visibility for his being the less dangerous.

Late last year, Marcuse shared a New Left platform in New York with black revolutionary, H. Rap Brown; S.D.S. Leader Carl Ogilve; folk singer Pete Seeger; and William Rose, acting general manager of the national radical newspaper, <u>Guardian</u>. On this occasion, Marcuse called for the sabotage of U. S. society and told the leftists to develop political guerrilla forces. He said small local groups, operating independently of each other, can encourage political ferment and can associate themselves with restless students, racial

disorders and other disturbances to foster what he calls "true socialist traditions." These traditions, he said, are being built in Communist Cuba, Communist China, and in Vietnam.

During a panel discussion of Columbia University riots, Marcuse said his definition of democracy included the "forcible occupation of buildings and the invasion of private property as a part of the democratic process."

In a book called "A Critique of Pure Tolerance," Marcuse says that people confused about politics don't really know how to use freedom of speech correctly—turning such freedom into "an instrument for absolving servitude," so that "that which is radically evil now appears as good." They employ their freedom for improper purposes. Having established this premise, Marcuse recommends "the withdrawal of toleration of speech and assembly from groups and movements which promote aggressive policies, armament, chauvinism, racial and religious discrimination, or which oppose the extension of public services." He says that the correct political attitude is one of "intolerance against movements from the right and toleration of movements from the left." He proposes, in short, leftwing dictatorship.

And along these lines, he has made a case for what he terms "socially useful destructiveness." This thesis is expressed in his book, "One Dimensional Man." Here he abandons the proletariat as the medium for the desired social upheaval and instead, finds much promise in students and the "oppressed" minorities. And what would come after the revolution? Marcuse says it will be ruled by an elite and majority rule would be replaced by the "morality" of a

presumably infallible minority. So it goes, almost endlessly.

All this notwithstanding, on the other hand, we are told by Chancellor McGill that Marcuse has been rehired because he is an eminent scholar, he is one of the leading philosophers in the world today, and "was not found to be subversive." With no comment on the possible criteria used in reaching these conclusions, we find a form of schizophrenia imposed on Marcuse. What they say he does on campus is separated from what he is.

The community is asked to believe that Marcuse's mere presence is <u>not</u> a revolutionary factor; that his clarion call to arms for the destruction of the Republic has no bearing on whether he is on the payroll of the state; that what he does in the classroom is not related to what he does out of it. I maintain that it is not possible to separate Marcuse the teacher from Marcuse the revolutionary. The weird reasoning that tries to separate him from what he is, is tantamount to saying Jack the Ripper makes a neat incision and this is more important than the fact he is a murderer. Ergo, the thing to consider in giving the Ripper a job is that he makes a neat incision.

Marcuse is a cause.

Campus violence is an effect.

It is nothing short of delusion to think otherwise and in this given situation, this is an expensive delusion.

Therefore, most seriously, I ask you not to renew Marcuse's contract. And, because his action regarding rehiring Marcuse, makes him an accessory before the fact of further campus violence, I ask you to relieve William McGill as Chancellor of the University of California. At this point, we cannot tolerate those who advocate

offilliffication.

violence such as Marcuse nor those such as McGill who underwrite it.

None of this is occurring in a vacuum. Responsibility for disorder
can and must be fixed or it will never be eliminated.

The argument is advanced that a philosophical balance in the departments will eliminate the threat of Marcuse. I can only say that although balance is desirable and possible in some cases, Marcuse is a star and he cannot be balanced by the cast, whoever they are. I also maintain that the issues of academic freedom and freedom of speech do not apply here as no society is required to finance its own destruction.

Nothing less than the fate of the university itself is at stake because, obviously, it cannot long endure with this continuing pressure both from within and without. The increasing violence and disorder within will inevitably be met by a public without, who, one way or another, will simply choke off funds or resort to other drastic steps. Then, this magnificent university system which has been a hundred years a-building will wither and die. This in no sense is a threat. It is simply an obvious conclusion.

What Marcuse contemptuously calls "reactionary political pressure" is not otherwise than the will of the people of California. Make no mistake—the will of the people is not to employ persons who seek to replace this Republic with a dictatorship, such as Marcuse advocates. Nor do the people, as I said before, crave to finance their own destruction, even, if in some quarters, its architect, is considered an eminent philosopher. The people also know that what is happening on the campus today can spill out into all of our lives tomorrow and our way of life will be gone.





have to find out what this mysterious outfit with the merging cadres is about, so, once more, I ask what the organization stands for.

Tuesday the 9th, answers the boy, was the date of Martin Luther King's death: "TNC symbolizes the death of nonviolence. We're mostly white, organized in cadres to fight racism."

With violence, I wonder, or with nonviolence?

"Depends who you're talking to," he says. "Like I'm interested in what we accomplish, not necessarily how we do what we have to do. Other people are hung up on the idea that you can only honor King's memory by honoring nonviolent means. And then we have guys who say nonviolence died with the man and only force is gonna work in the future. Hell, we get pretty confused but we're the biggest activist outfit on this campus. About 300 students."

The Personal Circus is UCSD's self-discovery outfit, started by students. Last year, sophomore Tuck Donnelly went up to the Esalen Institute at Big Sur and came back to Atlantis Hall with his psyche full of encounter groups and body awareness sessions and sensitivity marathons. He wanted to bring awareness techniques to the campus, as a way of showing other students that you find expanded consciousness in yourself and not in drugs.

Meanwhile, Donnelly's friends-Tom Peifer, Jim Miner and Barry Waynehad decided they were tired of talking politics and wanted to try other ways of understanding their world. "I was in this strong political bag,' remembers mustached Jim Miner, sitting with his colleagues and me in an Atlantis lounge. "I wasn't getting anything out of it except tensions. Some brought on by the system, sure. But some tensions were really selfrepressions."

"Right," says blond Tom Peifer, who has the smile and the gestures of a cheerleader. "The trouble with overthrowing a political system is that you have to get into the same kind of organizations, meetings, dumb bureaucracy—the same kind of crap you're busy trying to overthrow."

The Personal Circus started informally, unofficially, with occasional encounter groups in dorm lounges. This year, in order to accommodate more applicants and have a regular meeting place, the founders decided to register the Circus with the adminis-

That's when the trouble started. The dean of students threw them out. Donnelly figures the dean thought Personal Circus was a fancy name for free love or free pot. Their application didn't do anything to reassure the authorities. Where the form said PURPOSE, Personal Circus leaders wrote, "Happiness in human feelings. Where the form called for ACTIVITIES, they filled in, "Varied."

"We really didn't know how to approach them," says Peifer. "One of our ideas was to get started as a language club--you know, nonverbal communication. But it's almost impossible to describe an awareness group."

"You have to be there," says Miner. "Otherwise you wind up talking about what we hope to avoid. We have a high rate of dropouts here and we have a high rate of drug use. There are people on this campus who drop out or take drugs to keep from having nervous breakdowns. The Circus was the only thing that helped the headache I had all last year."

"We're trying to offer a third alternative," says Barry Wayne. "Dropping out and drugs both come from stress. We figure this is a better way to relax and discover yourself within the pressures of the place."

Having failed once, the Personal Circus petitioned the administration with more than 100 signatures. Members promised not to play therapists and they went to the faculty for support and guidance. Along with the second effort came an implied threat: if the school would not register the Circus, then it would meet anyway, underground, without formal permission. The administration has agreed to send an observer to the next meeting.

"But can they really understand what we're trying to do?" asks one of the mem-

"I dunno," answers Tom Peifer. "Look at the trouble we're having at our ages. It's pretty difficult to cure 18 vears of mind screw."

"I know," says a boy in a cowboy hat. "Personal Circus replaces what people lose



secretary who calls Marcuse's secretary who promises to check with the professor himself. Back through the same chain comes the message: yes. But I will have to pick up a special pass at Marcuse's office first. The doors to the lecture 'hal! are monitored.

Marcuse's office is above the campus library, light and airy and staffed by an attractive blond secretary. No place to conduct conspiracies.


My pass is a green piece of paper with purple print, hand-lettered in blue. Lettered is my name and the underlined plarase. ONE-TIME UNITY. As I thank the secretary, in walks a slightly-stooped, gray-haired sparrow of a man who starts to pour himself a cup of coffee from an urn in the corner. The secretary smiles at me and nods at him, meaning Dr. Marcuse is among us. When he turns to face her with his coffee, she introduces me.

We shake hands, and he asks if I have any "devices" with me. I have no idea what he means but I open my briefcase so that he can look inside where there are only pads and pencils. He explains that he meant recording equipment. And then, in a soft, paternal voice he apologizes. He is embarrassed for having asked and I am embarrassed too.

His course called "The Present Age" meets in the basement of the Humanities Building. Indeed, there are graduate student guards at the doors of the 250-seat auditorium and I must flash my ONE-TIME ONLY pass at them to enter.

The room is fan-shaped and full. An American flag stands behind the lectern. The students are predominantly freshmen, mostly clean cutters by the lengths of hair and skirts. Dr. Marcuse comes in a few minutes after the hour and his first remark is a request: "Would you please not smoke in this room. There have been many complaints. So repress. Repress." He rolls his "R's" and the students giggle over repression while the philosopher wipes his glasses. The kids lean forward, expectantly.

Today's lecture is basic Freud, all about man's instinctive need for pleasure versus civilization's restraint and repression of pleasure. Marcuse walks as he talks, constantly taking off his glasses and wiping them. He is cordial enough but hardly rousing as he describes the primal horde and goes on to define ego, id and superego.


From time to time, says Marcuse, the primordial force breaks through the repressions of civilization; sons may band together, as in the primal horde, to revolt against the father. Witness the generation gap.

The pimpled boy next to me snickers, I scowl at him. He looks surprised and turns to his notes. At last I have intimidated a student.

Marcuse continues: man's basic drives are sex and aggression. Both are in constant antagonism. There is no such thing as a self-preservation instinct; the need for pleasure supercedes self-preservation. Then, still using the same mild tone, still wiping his glasses, Marcuse concludes, "Aggression in man must sooner or later destroy him—as we shall see next time."


The guru of the revolution is a gentle, repressed personality, I realize. Certainly less aggressive than his critics.

## **SAN DIEGO:** SIGNS **AND SOUNDS** OF TODAY

The environment is one of pressure. It's primarily a science school and study loads are heavy. Most students live on campus, with uneasy La Jolla nearby. They communicate with signs, and search for purpose through chemicals. revolutionary thought, religion and something called the Personal Circus.

I walked onto the UC San Diego campus and immediately saw larger-than-life faces of folk celebrities staring down at me: Bob Dylan, W. C. Fields, Che Guevara, Sophia Loren. They were pasted on high-rise dormitory windows, sharing glass space with other posters, bumper strips, cutouts, collages and tempera paintings.

A nude in shocking pink was painted into a window as if she were sitting on its sill. A political message read: "Citizens for Boysenberry Jam." Another window said: "God bless the pill." An eloquent sign language flourishes all over the University of California, San Diego branch. It flashes from bulletin boards and kiosks. It shrieks between buildings.

The sign language permits Argo Hall for men to communicate with Blake Hall for womenthe facing windows of the two large dormitories are dressed in social comment instead of curtains.

I walked through the Argo-Blake message center onto the main campus plaza, an open space the size of a city block surrounded by massive modern architecture. There was a solid geometry of classroom buildings to the north and east; a big library-humanities building to the south, complete with ramps and concretelined moat; residence halls to the west. It was powerful and formal and, at mid-morning, almost completely empty. I felt like the only character in a modern version of Last Year at Marienbad—dwarfed by pattern and perspective.

I could hear high fidelity rock from several dormitory rooms at a time; it was louder-thanlife background music for the outsized faces in the windows. At six-story Argo, the Rolling

Stones played against the Jimi Hendrix Experience who played against the Mothers of Invention. There was one second-story window with Bach behind it, but you had to stand right underneath to hear it.

This campus seemed to live by signals, a giant stage full of audio-visual devices but hardly any live action. Other campuses deal in confronta-

I sat on a wood bench and waited for some activity. And just before noon, people began to appear-some of them hauling card tables and bulletin boards into the plaza to recruit for various campus organizations. I wandered over to a board labeled TNC and read a cryptic. message: "Cadre J will meet Thursday, 7:15 in the Revelle dormitory parking lot-we are merging temporarily with Cadre D.'

What does TNC stand for?" I asked a girl at the TNC table with a textbook in her hands.

She looked up, large blue eyes beneath a sheepdog hairdo. She said, "Tuesday Ninth Committee," and then went back to her book.

'Oh," I said. "And what's that? What are the cadres?'

"I'm sorry, I can't talk," she answered, this time keeping her eyes in her text. "I have a midterm. Maybe you can come back later when there's someone here."

I walked away thinking UCSD is a remarkable place, where you hardly see people and when you finally do, they say they're not really there.

I found other symbolic signs of campus life by going indoors. I almost stepped on a spaghettihaired boy at Atlantis, one of six low-rise residence halls behind Argo. He was sprawled on the floor of a student lounge. studying while connected to a large headset which was attached to a wire which led through a doorway to a phonograph playing in his room. The plugged-in man.

I apologized. "S'okay," he said. "I can't study if there's quiet."

I didn't see any residents in the De Anza Hall lounge but there were two notices on the blackboard: "Will the individual(s) who has (have) been terrorizing this bulletin board contact Don Betts in Rm. 406 before he contacts you?" Just under that threat, in a different handwriting, came a very lewd but very funny suggestion for Betts.

I looked up Dana Pippin at Argo Hall. He's a clear-eved, clean-chinned freshman from Los Angeles whose parents are friends of mine. Pippin showed me his room, a cubicle hardly larger than a walk-in closet. Three beds crammed the walls, a single decker and a double-decker, with aisle-space in between. The lower bunk had drapes all-around it like a pullman berth.

"It's the school work," explained Pippin. "My roommate wants the privacy. I have another friend who's a biology major; he has to stay up all night every two nights just to keep up with the workload. This place is very tough and, as you can see, it's very crowded."

I talked to some more students and heard them agree: UCSD is a place of pressure.

The environment is one pressure. This fiveyear-old university grows atop 1,000 acres across Torrey Pines Mesa, overlooking the Pacific and the town of La Jolla. The ocean is handy for surfing and sailing but the community -full of rich people and retired people—is sometimes hostile to students in its midst. "This neighborhood," complained one boy wearing surplus military clothing from three different services, "is upper rent, upper class and upper tight."

Before the school came to La Jolla, liberals were a tiny minority, Jews were a rarity and Negroes were servants. Slowly, and not without pain on both sides, that's changing. But students who might prefer to live in town can't afford the rentals, so the residence halls are packed more by necessity than choice.

The academic program is another pressure. Revelle College, the first of UCSD's undergraduate schools, has a science-oriented curriculum and the administration assumes Revelle students are preparing for graduate work. Muir College, the second campus, is more inclined toward the humanities but insists on year-long sequences in math and the sciences.

UCSD is primarily a male preserve because it is science-strong. Boys outnumber girls by about two to one. This produces yet another pressure, according to a student I met while both of us were studying "rides-wanted" notices on the bulletin board in the cafeteria lobby. I asked him about the social life and he told me about the drug life without first asking my

"Not much social life," said the boy whose sharp nose contrasted with his rococo sideburns. "I think we probably have more speed freaks (methedrine users) than most campuses because there's so goddam much work and so few girls. At 2 a.m., you can see people flying and freaking out on the plaza, after they've finished studying and don't know what else to do. You teach here?"

"No, I don't teach," L'told him. I said I was doing research and pointed out that drugs Semided with the seminated in the

"Sure they are," he continued, walking me through the cafeteria line, "but what you have to understand is that people around here are controlled. Even the freaking is controlled. We use drugs as tools now instead of letting drugs use us. A science school doesn't riot. It studies. For some guys, drugs may be like getting drunk on Friday night. For other guys, drugs are another way to do our research. We figure classes are only one place to learn; we're also studying things like life style, religion and revolution—kind of all at once." He stopped his tray. "Hey, if you're gonna get to know this place, you ought to hear Marcuse.'

I told him I intended to hear Marcuse. After lunch I crossed the Revelle Commons to notice another window message: "Don't spit in the soup—we've all got to eat."

Marcuse is the most controversial philosopher in California, the synthesizer of Freud and Marx whose books have become working manuals for American student revolutionaries. Marcuse has been the target of the San Diego press, the American Legion, the La Jolla rightists and conservative politicians; they all want to have him fired. They all keep applying pressure on the UCSD administration and the Board of Regents.

So when I ask a UCSD information executive where to find this besieged celebrity, he hesitates. Then he reminds me that Marcuse has received death threats.


The Sociology of Everyday Life" convenes in a nearby hut and I wander over to see whether students can turn the everyday into the cosmic as quickly as they brought the cosmic down to everyday.

But this is an entirely different physical setup: larger classroom, ordered rows of chairs, some 50 students. This is a lecture. And although the subject is interesting enough and the instructor is lucid enough, there are four students sleeping before the class is 20 minutes old.

The lecturer pays no attention to them. He contrasts the middle and lower classes, saying that middle people tend to live interior lives in private settings, whereas poor people tend to take to the streets. For many lower-class kids, their neighborhood is their turf and their private preserve, which often leads to conflict with the police who think of a street as a public setting.

A girl in front of me sleeps with her head cradled in her arms and even as I try to concentrate on the lecture, I'm fascinated to see her back as a flag of four colors: hiked up green sweater, pale skin, pink underpants showing above a hiked down pair of brown slacks. Sleepers are themselves a distraction and I find myself beginning to agree with the students who scream for participation in the learning process.

The instructor winds up with a discussion of private morality versus public morality, marijuana being an example. Many people who smoke pot, says the lecturer, privately believe it to be harmless and pleasurable. But they play safe and smoke secretly because there's still a law against marijuana. So public morality, which is the law, often outlives its useful-

The campus is quiet and quite beautiful at night. Lights warm the insides of the buildings and darkness softens the hard corners of their exteriors. On the grass next to the plaza, a boy and a girl wrestle with a collie and then wrestle, laughing, with each other while the dog barks. A steady stream, almost a processional, of other kids go into the library.

The added attractions for this night include an old horror move saway campus Coffee Hut, a visiting radical speaker from UC ankeley and a student-faculty discussion meeting.

I choose the student-faculty session in the Science Building and take a seat on the far aisle of a lecture hall. Student activist Mike Brown, an extremely bright boy who hides under a black floppy hat and black flowing beard,

has told me that sometimes as few as 15 people show up for these things. Usually almost half of them are faculty; professors, too, are curious about this student generation.

Nearly 50 people appear this time, making it a success, but causing immediate procedural confusion. There are 10 professors in the room and almost every one of them seems to have a suggestion—on framing an agenda, on changing rooms, on breaking up into smaller groups.

A student complains that this is typical faculty decisiveness. Everybody laughs but the older men laugh more nervously.

The consensus is to split into sections of about 10 people, with at least two professors attached to each. I tag along behind a group that

decides to shop for an open lounge in Argo. We ride the elevator up the high-rise dormitory and I think back 20 years to when I used to have to wait to be invited to see a professor after regular school hours. Here the teachers are coming to the students, wanting to be wanted.

We find a lounge and most of the people, faculty included, sit on the floor. A student charges that the faculty is the most powerful population at a university and he wants to know why the faculty hasn't used that power to push for change.

If that means power to move to the left, answers a professor, then that's what's happening. "The period of appeasing the Regents," he says, "seems to be at an end."

Then would the faculty strike, asks a student, if the situation here ever became as repressive as, say, San Francisco State?

"I suspect," answers a second professor, "that the more radical faculty members are the younger ones—
to be trained, the ones with less to lose should the choices come to striking, quitting, or core to striking, quitting, or core to striking, think there something worth saving here at this campus, and I'd hate to see us ever reach an impasse where this university loses its capacity for open inquiry because either repression or revolution has closed us down."

"Okay," answers a student, "but if the university really is a forum for open inquiry, then it seems that the worthwhile discussions and ideas happen outside the classroom. That's wrong. We want to use what we are learning and apply it to the community and ourselves."

The professors nod. And I realize that even under the pressures here the students are doing exactly that. They are doing their things and influencing our things and dragging all of us along with them.

The students are already changing this world. They talk about it while they do it and at UCSD they even post notices about it.

On the way off the campus I took one last look at the residence hall complex. There was a window I hadn't stared at before. "Sex before finals," it said. Just one more outside experiment before academic judgment day.



Mr. Herbert Ellingwood, who is a contact of our Sacramento Office, along with Mr. Theodore Baier, both representatives of Governor Reagan's office, State of California, came by my office at 9:15 a.m. this morning.

Mr. Ellingwood stated that Governor Reagan has no opportunity to outright dismiss eight chancellors of state educational institutions who are more or less palliative in their handling of the Students for a Democratic Society and extremist elements. The Governor merely sits as one member of a 24-man Board of Regents governing these institutions. Consideration has been given to requesting the state legislature to pass bills calling for the dismissal of the eight chancellors, however, this is deemed politically unwise. Ronald Reagan-615

Mr. Ellingwood also indicated that the California State Supreme Court has been worse than the U. S. Supreme Court insofar as favoritism towards these groups is concerned. He pointed out that Chief Justice Trainor will retire early next year and Governor Reagan plans to appoint a conservative. Later on other retirements will occur which will cause a better balance towards conservatism in the State Supreme Court.

Mr. Ellingwood stated that Governor Reagan is dedicated to the destruction of disruptive elements on California college campuses. state government will attack these groups through several methods. (1) By hounding the groups as much as possible by bringing any form of violation available against them. He cited as an example that if any of these groups has a bookstore on campus they will bring building code violations against them. He also indicated that he hopes to bring to the attention of the Federal Government possible Federal violations. In this instance he cited the fact

Athat U. S. Attorney Cecil Poole, San Francisco, is of no help whatsoever to the state government and, as a matter of fact, refuses to be of any cooperation in the fight against these groups. Mr. Ellingwood at this point also referred to the fact that he and Governor Reagan planned to call on Department of Justice officials today in the hope of having the Civil Rights Division move against those elements which disrupted the peaceful pursuit of studies by right-thinking (2) Mr. Ellingwood spoke of the possibility of referring tax violations both to the Internal Revenue Service of the State of California and to the Federal Internal Revenue Service. He asked if the FBI had referred such matters to Internal Revenue. I answered in the affirmative, stating that each time violations or potential violations came to our attention we naturally disseminated such information to the Internal Revenue Service. (3) A psychological warfare campaign. In this connection Mr. Ellingwood indicated that he plans to confer with Department of Defense officials today to get ideas from those individuals as to how to conduct campaigns of this nature. I told him that we were well aware of such potentials.

I outlined briefly for Mr. Ellingwood the type of investigations carried on by the FBI, the progress we had made in this field, and the tremendous accumulation of evidence we had furnished the Department of Justice.

Mr. Ellingwood told me he did not plan to confer with Secretary Finch of Health, Education and Welfare or with any officials of Health, Education and Welfare inasmuch as he considered this agency to be deplorable in its favoritism towards the Students for a Democratic Society and extremist elements. I told Mr. Ellingwood that we, of course, would have no comment concerning the handling of such matters by any Federal agency, however, we were dismayed last week when one of our officials had accepted an invitation to speak before the top-level executives of Health, Education and Welfare only to find that there were approximately 20 disruptive individuals attempting to break up this meeting. I stated these were summer employees of Health, Education and Welfare.

Mr. Ellingwood asked me regarding the possibility of Federal courts placing travel restrictions on leaders of the Students for a Democratic Society and extremist groups. I told him I would not be too encouraged in this regard in view of the travels of Rap Brown and a number of other individuals who, while under indictment, had been allowed to travel freely about the country. I told him also of the individual under indictment who was being allowed by a Federal judge to travel to Hanoi and participate in an exchange of prisoners.

Mr. Ellingwood asked if the FBI could be of any assistance in furnishing Governor Reagan items of intelligence so that assistance could be offered in the California fight against these groups. I told Mr. Ellingwood that we of course were bound by Executive Order insofar as dissemination of intelligence is concerned, however, in a number of instances Mr. Hoover had permitted our Special Agent in Charge, John Williams, Sacramento, to informally discuss matters with the Governor and his top assistants. I stated that we, of course, must consider each request on an individual basis and that when SAC Williams received a request for assistance from Governor Reagan, he would forward this request for consideration to FBI Headquarters in Washington, D. C. I told Mr. Ellingwood further that his request would of course be made known to the Director and if the Director had any different ideas, we would let him know.

Mr. Ellingwood was most commendatory concerning the Director and the FBI, and he spoke of Governor Reagan's admiration for the Director. Mr. Ellingwood left with me a "white paper" prepared by his office and submitted to Governor Reagan. This concerns the confrontation at the "People's Park" at Berkeley, California.

### ACTION:

SAC Williams, Sacramento, is being advised of the call paid to us by Messrs. Ellingwood and Baier. There appears to be no further action unless a request is received from Governor Reagan for information. As stated above, it is suggested that each request be handled on an individual and confidential basis. This has been done in the past and has worked quite successfully.





# RESERKS BY GOVERNOR RONALD RESEARCH AN Eisenhower College Fund Raising Dinner Washington, D. C., October 14, 1969

The memory of a man we hold in high esteem and for whom we have a great personal warmth and affection has brought us all together here tonight. At the groundbreaking for Eisenhower College, Bob Hope called the school a monument...a living monument to a monumental man. He said the General believed that education was something more than one of freedom's blessings——education was freedom...freedom of the mind to search for, and find, a better way of life for all mankind.

And, the General's great and good friend, Winston Churchill, said: "The destiny of man is not measured by material computation. When great forces are on the move in the world, we learn we are spirits, not animals. There is something going on in time and space—and beyond time and space—which, whether we like it or not, spells beauty." How appropriate these words are to this man we could refer to as President or General, but who is enshrined in all of our hearts, and so many millions more, as just "Ike."

His lifetime was devoted to duty. In expressing his pride in this college he said we must, all of us, have a sharper understanding of how we are to exercise the rights of citizenship, and to discharge its duties. He was trained in the science of war. But, he called it "man's greatest stupidity." And his dream for all mankind was a world at peace.

Still, he knew that his craft and his profession were absolutely necessary in this world. For there is a price on peace, and sometimes that price is more than free men can pay.

There is also one with us here tonight \_the president who knows the weight of duty. He too knows that the price for an immediate peace could well be a thousand years of darkness for generations yet unborn.

There are parades held today in our streets in the name of peace. But, some who march in those parades carry the flag of a nation that has killed almost 40,000 of our young men. We have a right to suspect that at least some who organized those parades are less concerned with peace than they are with the welfare of the enemy.

Many of our universities who should be committed to learning and free inquiry will close down classes in what is called a "Vietnam Moratorium Day", and it is correctly named because there will be a moratorium on free discussion. There will be no legitimate debate of the alternatives facing this nation.

The decision has already been reached by the National Vietnam Day Committee. Those responsible for the safety and the security of this nation and it's people...those who have access to the facts and the information...will simply be told what their course shall be by the self-annointed.

And young Americans, living today, will die on some tomorrow because the enemy planned his strategy so as to add fuel to the demonstrations in American streets where he hopes to win that which he cannot win in the rice paddies and the jungles of Vietnam.

If I sound too harsh, it's because I know no other way to talk about those who would lend comfort and aid to the enemy. Those who protest would have the game without the name.

But today, no less than the Premier in Hanoi, Than Van Dong, made it plain that he does receive comfort and aid from this planned protest. His letter has been made public by the government in Hanoi. It is addressed to his 'dear American friends' and it is full of praise and gratitude for their efforts. It expresses the hope that together, with those friends in America, they can go forward to total victory. He signs it 'affectionately yours'.

Those entrusted with the awesome responsibility of the leadership of our nation deserve not only our support, but our rejection
of those in our midst who would arrogantly kibitz in a game where
they haven't even seen the cards with which the game is played.
They would like to attempt brain-surgery. But, they have gone only
so far as to read the directions on an aspirin bottle.

I know it is something of a cliche to draw a parallel between the rise and fall of Rome and the course of our own Republic. Certainly this is true in academic circles. And yet, the parallel is there in such detail that it is frightening...almost eerie.

Dr. Robert Straus-Hauppe recently published a series of articles based on the observations of a number of historians; Spengler, DeReincourt, Ferraro, Gibbons and some others.

He told how Rome had known a pioneer beginning not unlike our own pioneer heritage, and then entered into two centuries of greatness reaching its pinnacle in the second of those centuries, going into the decline and collapse in the third. Yet, the signs of decay were becoming apparent in the latter years of that second century.

It is written that there were vast increases in the number of the idle rich, and the idle poor. The latter were put on a permanent dole, a welfare system not unlike our own. As this system became permanent, the recipients of public largesse increased in number. They organized into a political bloc with sizeable power. They were not hesitant about making their demands known. Nor was the government hesitant about agreeing to their demands...and with ever increasing frequency. Would-be emperors catered to them. The great, solid middle class--Rome's strength then as ours is today--was taxed more and more to support a bureacracy that kept growing larger, and ever more powerful. Surtaxes were imposed upon incomes to meet emergencies. The government engaged in deficit spending. The Denarius, a silver coin similar to our half dollar began to lose it's silvery hue. took on a copper color as the government reduced the silver content.

Even then, Gresham's law was at work, because the real silver coin soon disappeared. It went into hiding.

Military service was an obligation highly honored by the Romans. Indeed, a foreigner could win Roman citizenship simply by volunteering for service in the legions of Rome. But, with increasing affluence and opulence, the young men of Rome began avoiding this service, finding excuses to remain in the soft and sordid life of the city.

They took to using cosmetics and wearing feminine-like hairdo's and garments, until it became difficult, the historians tell us, to tell the sexes apart.

Among the teachers and scholars was a group called the Cynics whose number let their hair and beards grow, and who wore slovenly clothes, and professed indifference to worldly goods as they heaped scorn on what they called "middle class values."

I'm still talking about Rome.

The morals declined. It became unsafe to walk in the countryside or the city streets. Rioting was commonplace and sometimes whole sections of towns and cities were burned.

And, all the time, the twin diseases of confiscatory taxation and creeping inflation were waiting to deliver the death blow.

Then finally, all these forces overcame the energy and ambition of the middle class.

Rome fell.

We are now approaching the end of our second century. It's been pointed out that the days of a democracy are numbered once the belly takes command of the head. When the less affluent feel an urge to break a commandment and begin to covet that which their more affluent meighbors possess they are tempted to use their votes to obtain instant satisfaction. Then equal opportunity at the starting line becomes an extended guarantee of at least a tie at the finish of the race.

Under the euphemism "the greatest good for the greatest number," we destroy a system which for two centuries has accomplished just that. The greatest good for the greatest number.

Demonstrations to force colleges to divorce themselves from participating in the defense of the nation take place. We've known riots in our streets. We no longer walk the countryside or the city streets without fear.

The jungle seems to be closing in on this little plot we have been trying to civilize for 5,000 years and all of us, I know, are disturbed at the virus that has infected the campus.

No doubt we could all top each other with frightening and unbelievable stories. One day on one of our campuses I listened to a tape recording of a so-called student meeting where they were planning a campus disruption. Explicit directions were given on how to start fires in college buildings. Subsequently, there were 50 fires started in those buildings in one day.

Continuing to listen, they outlined where the pickets would go and how they would parade and what they would do and how they would take over the college. We actually heard a voice say: "If, in the process, it becomes necessary to kill, you will kill."

We were gripped with an overwhelming sense of unreality.

Unreality that it is happening at all. But, even more frightening is how close we have come to accepting it as a normal way of life.

Dr. Spock's babies have grown up, which is probably more than we can say for the doctor. I confess I liked him better when his concerns were pablum and potty training.

In my state, two young people lie with mangled hands and sightless eyes. One 20-year-old girl was picking up the mail delivery in a college administration office when the bomb exploded. The other was a 19-year-old boy.

In the dark early morning hours, he was planting a bomb in a campus building when it exploded prematurely. The bomb was a symbol of his rage and his hatred. We wonder, when and how did this all begin?

It began the first time someone old enough to know better declared it is no crime to break a law in the name of social protest.

It started with those who proclaimed, in the name of academic freedom, that the campus was a sanctuary, immune to the laws and rules that govern the rest of us.

It began with those who, in the name of change and progress, decided we could scrap all the time tested wisdom man has accumulated in his climb from the swamp to the stars.

Simply call its constricting tradition and morality the dead hand of the past, and wipe out the discipline as no longer binding upon us.

Saint Thomas Aquinas warns teachers that they must never dig a ditch in front of a student that they fail to fill in.

To cleverly raise doubts, and ever seek, but never to find, is to discuss freely all sides of a question without values and, thus, to insure the creation of a generation of uninformed and talkative minds.

Our obligation is to help our young people find truth and purpose...to find identity and a goal.

I have talked to those already in rebellion, already with a torch and the club in their hands. Admittedly, they are a tiny few. A very few in number on all of our campuses.

But, there is a ferment on our campuses involving the great majority. They have complaints, and their complaints are legitimate. They want to invest their energy and their idealism in causes they can believe in. They refuse to become numbers in a computer. They want more than a four-year ride on an assembly line in some kind of a diploma mill. They want a re-ordering of the priorities.

The United States Department of Education, in taking a survey on 68 campuses, and questioning 7,500 professors, found this answer to the question: "What is the obligation of a University?" The professors said: "To protect the academic freedom of the faculty."

What has happened to teaching? It is time for all of us, especially those in charge of the institutions of learning, to revise and review the bidding.

Shouldn't the doctrine 'publish or perish', and even research, follow in the order of importance the need to teach our young people?

It is possible that even among the most radical protestors, there are those who have in reality been crying out for help. And, it is all the more poignant because the cries have gone unheard and unheeded.

One day I participated in a lecture series in a large midwestern university. It was opened to the public. There were about
4,000 adults on the main floor of the auditorium of the field house.
There were more than 10,000 students all the way to the ceiling in
the tiers of seats around the great oval. During a question and
answer period one question came to me and I don't remember exactly
what it was about. But, the questioner expressed concern that our
young people were rebelling against the moral standards and the
principles we have tried to teach them all of their lives.

In my answer I expressed a belief that they were 't so much rebelling against the standards and the principles. They were rebelling because they don't believe that we are living up to those standards and principles.

There was a second of silence, and then 10,000 young people came to their feet with a roar I shall never forget.

Have they lost faith in the rules, or have they lost faith in us?

Do they doubt our willingness to practice what we preach?

Has there been a quiet drifting away...an erosion of our moral commitments?

Where were we when God was expelled from the classroom?

How often do they see us dismiss wrong-doing in public life with this sort of easy tolerance--"well that's just politics"?

The halls of government are the very temples of freedom and we should so consider them. What about us when the youngster comes home from the football field and tells us, with great pride, how he learned to get away with holding—without being caught—on a block. How many times have they been in a car with us and seen us look over our shoulder, then fudge on a stop—light because there wasn't any policeman in sight?

As the country parson once said, "The fellow who left the gate open is only slightly more guilty than the one who saw it open and didn't close it."

Is it possible that much of what frightens and disturbs us actually started with us?

With such a gradual and silent erosion of our own moral code, no government at any level and for any price can afford the police necessary to insure our freedom unless the overwhelming majority of us are guided by an inner personal code of morality—a code that makes us act when we are alone, the same as we do when the eyes of the crowd are upon us.

Some years ago, when Bud Wilkinson had those great national championship teams out in Oklahoma, toward the close of the season he took one of those great teams to play a very mediocre Texas—Christian team. That day, TCU rose to the heights as some times a beaten team will. In the closing seconds a receiver dived into the end zone to make a shoestring catch of what would have been the winning touchdown against the national champions. There was a huge upset in view. The crowd was going wild. But down in the end zone the kid stood up...walked over to the referee, and said: "No sir, it touched the ground before I caught it."

Now, what was your reaction? Was your first reaction... Now wait a minute---that's going too far? The referee didn't see it! He should have kept his mouth shut! Or, should he?

Someday, he may represent you in a statehouse, or in Congress or in the White House, And what then? Do you want him to keep his mouth shut if no one is looking? Do you want him to base his decisions on political expediency? Or, do you want him to base those decisions on the same kind of inner moral conviction that made him tell the truth to the referee without being asked?

And, who will teach them--by word and deed--that kind of morality if it isn't us?

On the deck of the tiny Arabella off the coast of Massachusetts, in 1630, John Winthrop gathered a little band of pilgrims together. He told them of the life they would have in this land that they had not yet seen. He said: "We shall be as a city upon a hill. The eyes of all people are upon us so that if we shall deal falsely with our God in this work we have undertaken and so cause Him to withdraw His present help from us, we shall be made a story and a byword through all the world." For you who have considered, "What can I do?" in this time of crisis in our world, I would suggest supporting Eisenhower College, and making it as a city upon a hill.

Without such schools, this shining dream of John Winthrop may well become a taste of ashes in our mouths.

These schools—like Eisenhower College—are educational whet—stones, serving to home the educational process, helping to improve the public tax—supported system, keeping it competitive in the drive for excellence. By their very competition, they help preserve the freedom of public institutions from political interference and guarantee a measure of academic freedom the public institutions could never attain by themselves.

General Eisenhower commended those who gave of their time and substance to bring this college into being, and to keep it alive. He knew that institutions such as Eisenhower College are essential to America. They provide leadership out of all proportion to their size.

America will be needing them more and more in the days ahead.

Ladies and gentlemen of the world of commerce and industry and the professions, you can make no greater investment in freedom than by your contributions to independent schools and colleges, such as Eisenhower College.

I dare to hope that one day the federal government will grant tax-credits--not deductions, but tax credits--for a portion of the tuition fees made by parents sending their sons and daughters to such colleges. I even dare to hope that they will explore the possibility of extending federal aid, not through more bureacracy, but by creating tax credits for contributions to such schools and colleges, if we are to win the battle that is being fought today in the minds and hearts of our young people.

I pray that you will keep alive this dream of a man named Ike who left us these words: "We believe individual liberty, rooted in human dignity, is man's greatest treasure; that men, given free expression, will prefer freedom and self-dependence to dictatorship and collectivism."

And then he reminded us that freedom from fear, injustice and oppression will be ours only in the measure that men who value such freedom are ready to sustain its possession and defend it against every threat from within or without.

The college bearing his name is pledged to the preservation of his ideals, and the country he loved so much. I think we can do nothing less than to see that it becomes as a city upon a hill.

I am not writing this as a part of the radical, draft dodging dissident movement so prevalent in our country today, rather as a concerned citizen who happens to love and care what happens to a few people very close to her. This letter is meant, to supplement the information on the request for discharge and to appeal to you as the Commander in Chief of our armed forces to act upon this request. Night I suggest that before reading any further, that you take a moment to review the enclosed affidavits, as this letter will bring those statements up to date. Thank you.

Had it not been for the apathy and lack of concern I have faced in trying to get belp. I would never have some so far. The day called to tell us he had been recycled into another infantry training unit and give us his new address, went out and got a bottle and got really drunk. When I went over to get him to run some errands we had to take care of, I found him in this condition. So rather than have him go out alone and chance an accident, I went with him. Well, while in the bank when the teller turned around to check our account number, reached in and stole about \$5.00 in quarters from the change rack. I almost died on the spot! He has always been an honest man who instilled the respect for the law in his sons, so you can imagine how shocked I was when he took this money. I managed to put the money back before anyone noticed it was missing and then we left for the phone company. While there, he started talking real loud shout going up to Fort Ord and blowing up the bese "so there would be no place to train our infantry". I managed to get him out of there real quick, too. Then we went to eat, and he started talking about how our country ought to be taken over by the Communists because they would surely got us straightened out. Re also mentioned killing the President and possibly our rovernor, too. People were staring at him and I tried to quiet him. I told him he could go to jail for relking like that and I doubted that Dould be very proud of him if that happened. He just laughed and said they'd nover eatch him because he was too smart for them.

On the evening of April 6, 1970, Governor Ronald Reagan made a scheduled appearance at the Las Vegas Room of the Hacienda Motel, Clinton Avenue and Highway 99, Fresno, California. At about 7 p.m. a group of 50 to 60 males and females, principally of Mexican-American extraction, ranging in ages from about 18 to 30, entered the Hacienda Motel Lobby and proceeded to the entrance of the Las Vegas Room and began creating a disturbance by chanting "Viva La Raza" and various obscenities. The chief Security Officer for the motel asked the crowd to leave the premises but they refused and the intensity of the chanting increased as Fresno police reinforcements arrived. One individual, later identispit on a police officer and as he was being apprehended, the crowd began throwing rocks Several windows were broken but there were no and bottles. injuries. A Fresno Police Sergeant declared the crowd and area an unlawful assembly and ordered dispersal several times



It was certainly nice talking with you yesterday and, following your telephone call, I determined that Governor Reagan was en route to San Diego, scheduled to arrive at 4:55 p.m., Pacific Southwest Airlines, with arrival at Lindbergh Field.

Arrangements were made so that I could talk to the Governor as soon as he arrived. Just as his plane had come to a stop on the apron for disembarking, there was an anonymous telephone call concerning a bomb threat which caused his aides to move him from Lindbergh Field as quickly as possible and, since he was staying at the Royal Inn Motel only five minutes from the airport, he was immediately ushered to that location.

As a matter of expediency, I followed the Governor to the Royal Inn Motel and, as soon as he left his limousine outside the motel, I contacted him and gave him your message. This was delivered at 5:08 p.m., Pacific Daylight Time.

SA NEWMAN further indicated that his Sagramento office would furnish the information to Governor REAGAN.

Subsequent to the receipt of the enclosed letter, SA NORMAN R. SNELLGROVE, Special Services Unit. Department of Corrections, San Prancisco, advised that the writer of the latter had been identified through joint investigation by U. S. The Director noted that he hoped that matters concerning the Black Panthers. Students for a Democratic Society and the Weathermen would eventually be the responsibility of Mr. Mardian's Internal Security Division. Mardian indicated that plans were going forward to do precisely this at the present time.

Mr. Mardian observed that he intended to resolve all doubts regarding prosecution of persons who have violated laws having 4 bearing on this country's internal security in favor of prosecution wherever and whenever possible.

In this regard Mr. Mardian advised that he intended to put together a Task Force to develop new strategy and ideas for prosecuting people who represent a threat to this country's internal security. He noted that he anticipated as the result of this Task Force new legislation would be recommended where present legislation is now inadequate, that efforts would be made to have prosecution where state laws...

RE: ROBERT C. MARDIAN...MEETING WITH THE DIRECTOR

Mardian advised Mr. Hoover that Sharp is an excellent man with outstanding credentials. Bufiles reflect no information on Sharp. He is currently under investigation by the Bureau in connection with his appointment as Consultant to the Attorney General.

The Director assured Mr. Mardian of the Bureau's full cooperation and indicated that a Bureau representative would be designated to work with the Unit.

Mr. Mardian stated the second matter which he wished to mention to the Director was the fact that he has also been commissioned by the White House to form a Task Force to decide what our Government's response will be should there ever be a kidnaping of a Government official such as there was in Canada recently. Mardian stated that it is his earnest hope that the Task Force, when it is formed and confers, will recommend no response be made to the demands of would be abductors and that this policy, if established, be given full disclosure in the press, in the hope that it will serve as a deterrent.

In response to a request by Mardian for the Director's opinion concerning this matter, the Director noted that he shared Mardian's views and felt that plans must be formulated in anticipation of possible kidnapings since it is not realistic to take the position they will not occur in this country.

Just prior to the conclusion of their talk, Mr. Mardian expressed concern over Frank Sinatra's recent association with Governor Ronald Reagan of California and advised Mr. Hoover that efforts on his, Mardian's, part and those of Lyn Nofziger, of the White House, to convince Reagan of Sinatra's unsavory background have been met by disbelief.

Mr. Hoover noted that he is well acquainted with Governor Reagan and that the next time he is in touch with him, he will brief him concerning Sinatra. Mardian stated that he appreciates Mr. Hoover's offer to do this since, while Reagan is not inclined to believe Mardian or Nofziger, even though they are close friends, he most certainly will believe Mr. Hoover.

Mardian said that he is of the opinion that Reagan has sought a relationship with Sinatra to dim his own image of being a right wing conservative. Mardian noted that one of Reagan's biggest financial supporters, Taft Schreiber, President of the Music Corporation of America, served as actor's agent to both Reagan and Sinatra several years back.



EXCERPTS OF REMARKS BY GOVERNOR RONALD REAGAN
California Peace Officers Association
San Francisco
May 10, 1971

A senseless act of violence took place a few weeks ago on the campus of Stanford University, one of America's great private institutions of higher learning. An arsonist--sneaking through the dead of night--deliberately set a fire that destroyed the lounge of a dormitory. The flames and smoke drove 80 sleeping students from their beds.

After the fire was put out, one student remarked that this particular act of violence was--in his words--"far different from setting a truck or a motorcycle on fire. If one of us had not seen it, a lot of us would be dead. That is not vandalism; that is murder."

The student was right in one sense. If someone had been killed, it would have been murder. But setting a fire in a dormitory is no different from setting a truck or a motorcycle on fire. Vandalism, arson and murder are all illegal acts of violence. And they differ only in degree.

It is a tragic dilemma of our times that there are some on campus and elsewhere who do not always perceive that simple truth. When you are counting the casualties...the dead and injured...the needless property loss that results from such an act...it makes no difference what warped sense of values motivates the arsonist.

Crime cannot be divided into "just" and "unjust" categories.

Violence cannot be justified, excused or explained by any real or imagined grievance.

Unfortunately, the crime at Stanford was not an isolated act.

I don't mean to single it out as any more deplorable than the scores of other similar violent acts which have taken place elsewhere before or since...at schools, banks, National Guard armories or business firms. But it does dramatize with chilling clarity the new challenge that confronts those of you whose task it is to protect society.

A new kind of crime threatens California and the United States...

plotted and carried out by a new breed of criminal, the self-proclaimed revolutionary who directs senseless acts of violence against innocent bystanders. What makes these new criminals doubly dangerous, is their fanaticism which makes them perform with an almost religious zeal, as if they are ordained by a higher power to right all the ills of mankind.

The immensity of task cannot be over-empasized. There were 4,443 bomb threats in California during the last 10 conths of 1970. There were 1,052 actual bomb incidents in which an explosive device was found and on some tragic occasions, these bombs exploded, killing or injuring innocent people. Fifteen police officers died in the line of duty in California last year, six under circumstances which can only be described as acts of cold-blooded murder.

The new type of so-called "revolutionary" crime is becoming one of America's most critical internal problems, at a time when certain other types of crime are slowly declining.

It isn't necessary to lay before you all the appalling statistical evidence. You know far better than I the corrosive effects of crime and violence on our society. The most tragic impact is the aura of fear and distrust it creates among us. A recent national survey disclosed that one-third of all Americans believe it is unsafe to walk alone at night in their own neighborhoods.

The threat of the mugger, the rapist, and now, the revolutionary whose rhetoric has escalated into violence, is a real threat. It cannot be ignored. And it cannot be excused or explained as legitimate political discontent...illegitimately expressed through illegal means.

There is a national concern, no, I would say, a national <u>demand</u> for public safety and public order.

But what kind of public safety? What kind of public order?

Our nation is built upon a system of legal values which provides greater protection for the individual...for his right to speak and to protest legitimate grievances...than any other society ever known. Those of you who are gathered here today are dedicated guardians of those rights; you represent society's first line of defense against crime and anarchy.

In such a nation, how do we achieve order and bring to justice the lawless elements among us without sacrificing the individual liberty to which we are all dedicated?

One first step is to never lose sight of just who is threatening the peace or violating the rights of the law-abiding citizen. Those who set fires and plant bombs--who demonstrate violently in the name of non-violence--are not protecting the rights of others or preserving the legal system that makes possible peaceful protest. They are the outlaws.

Yet some of our cierzens—who abhor violence—eee the enforcer of the law as a social outcast. They have accepted without question the steady, unrelenting campaign that is going on to discredit those whose job it is to preserve law and order in our society. Police are accused of "represeion"—for putting down disorders that have been calculated to incite a confrontation.

But it is the rioter who supresses the rights of others, not the policeman called to restore order.

It is the criminal who violates the rights of others by stealing, mugging or other acts of violence. It is to the police officer the crime victim turns for help after such crimes have taken place or when criminal violence threatens him.

In carrying out their duties, our policemen are expected to be psychologists, constitutional lawyers, family counselors. They are expected to patiently endure insults while coping with hoodlums intent on injuring either innocent citizens or the policemen themselves and sometimes both.

They are expected to be perfect men in an imperfect world, and they come far closer than most to that goal.

Plutarch said if all the world were just, there would be no need of valor. But the world is not filled with all just men and we do need valor---we need the valor that you, our law enforcement officers, exhibit every day and every night.

I believe it is a tribute to your courage and dedication that those of you who wear the badge of authority have never lost sight of the real threat to liberty. The greatest threat to our liberties are those who seek to destroy the ability of law enforcement to assure that liberty. They use the word "repression" to describe any forceful response to lawlessness.

And they seek to defeat or inhibit effective law enforcement by spreading suspicion of the policeman and his motives, by seeking to cast the policeman in the role of villain rather than the criminal.

In recent months, one of America's greatest law enforcement officials has become the object of a bitter verbal assault by some who are in a position to know just how much J. Edgar Hoover has contributed to this country's safety.

It is no exaggeration to suggest that America might well owe its very survival to the effectiveness of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in rooting out subversion and fighting crime of all types.

Some critics make mockery of the facts by taggesting that the FBI seeks to become some sort of secret police. J. Edgar Hoover's whole career has been devoted to resisting the efforts of others to turn the FBI into a national police force. He has worked to strengthen local and state law enforcement.

There is no doubt why the subversive and criminal elements would like to see the FBI downgraded and discredited. It was this agency which pioneered in most of the modern crime-fighting techniques we use today---fingerprinting, scientific collection of evidence, advanced training for law enforcement personnel, and now, a National Crime Information Center utilizing the computer to fight crime.

But these innovations have been used only to protect society against the threats posed against it by criminals and subversive elements.

Unlike some who criticize him, J. Edgar Hoover's entire career has been devoted to keeping government the servant of the people rather than making government the master. This same type of harassment has been directed against local and state law enforcement officers.

To respond to crime or riots with any degree of effective force is called "police brutality." Yet those who raise the charge say nothing about the "brutality" of the criminals who murdered 15 California law officers last year.

A few days ago a brave highway patrolman was killed as he investigated a traffic accident. He left a wife and four small children.

Where were the mass marches protesting this brutality? Where were the loud voices of protest? There was only silence as an eloquent testimony to the kind of hypocrisy with which you in law enforcement are all too familiar.

Every law-abiding citizen has a right to expect that government will insure his safety. Every parent has a right to expect government to protect his children from those who deal in and profit from pornography or narcotics. Every homeowner and every businessman has the right to expect his government to protect his property against the criminal, the arsonist, the rioter and the looter.

In return, I believe it is less than presumptuous to suggest that those who risk life and limb to defend society have a right to expect society to give them the support they need to carry on the war against crime.

As one small gesture of our respect, I am Caring, effective today, that every time a California peace officer is killed in the line of duty, that the flag at our State Capitol building be flown at half mast.

I have pledged to you before, and I repeat that pledge---we are trying to provide such support by attacking crime on several fronts. We have developed educational programs to acquaint our youngsters with the dangers of misusing drugs and we are funding dozens of experimental programs ranging from professional psychiatric counseling to the use of self-help programs to combat drug abuse. For the first time, we have a state office solely devoted to coordinating the state's anti-drug abuse efforts and to assist local communities.

Last year, we succeeded in adopting the nation's most comprehensive plan for intra-state control of restricted dangerous drugs. We intend to find out where all the pills on the illicit street market are coming from and to follow through with action to cut off the supply.

We have sponsored legislation to protect minors from the smut peddlers, to deal with campus disorder and to increase penalties for assaults on peace officers.

Despite these advances, we have suffered some defeats.

You and I know that one of the most necessary tools to fight organized crime is electronic surveillance. Contrary to what its opponents falsely claim, this authority is not an unreasonable invasion of privacy---it would be used only after a judge independently agreed there was good reason to believe a crime was being committed.

Our bills on electronic surveillance contained the strictest judicial safeguards to insure the individual's right of privacy, while giving law enforcement an effective weapon to use in the battle against sophisticated and well-financed criminals.

Electronic surveillance often is the only way to break through to the higher echelons of organized crime. And I think it is about time the legislature ends the legal imbalance that favors the criminal's rights against the right of society to be protected against the lawbreaker. We have tried for three years to do this and we will keep on trying until we succeed.

The tougher laws we managed to pass are not enough. We must do more. We must do more to protect the policemen who risk their lives to protect us.

I have asked the legislature to give priority attention this year to new laws that would: -5-

--Make the killing of a law enforcement off per while on duty first degree murder. The criminal who is armed in the commission of a crime and who uses that weapon to kill a policeman when apprehended is obviously acting with premeditation. He obviously carried the weapon to use it in just such an eventuality and that is plainly with premeditation and malice aforethought.

-- Make it a felony to specifically advocate killing or injuring law enforcement officers.

--Increase the amount of reward a governor may offer for information leading to the arrest and conviction of persons killing or injuring police officers.

We want to make the California Council on Criminal Justice more useful to local law enforcement. Local law enforcement agencies should have a greater voice in allocating the \$70 million of federal anti-crime funds California will spend next year to strengthen police and correctional agencies and the court system.

Our goal in public safety is to assure every citizen the right to a quick and efficient system of criminal justice.

To be effective as a deterrent, punishment must be swiftly administered.

Defendants in a criminal trial have a constitutional right to a speedy trial. In California, the law provides that trial must start within 60 days after arraignment.

I suggest that the public also has a right to a speedy trial---by carrying out the result of that trial swiftly and without endless and calculated legal manuevering designed to delay and obstruct justice.

We must examine court procedures to make certain we are doing all we can to make the constitutional promise of a speedy trial apply equally to the guilty defendant and to the society whose laws he has violated.

The judiciary and the organized bar must do their part with more effective enforcement of the ethics which govern the legal profession to see that lawyers and defendants who deliberately disrupt the courtroom are disciplined.

Those steps will help. But let no one pretend this is a lasting solution.

We are the most powerful nation in the history of the world. We have more sophisticated technology, more knowledge and probably more laws than any other society in history. And still we have problems. Someone once said we have 30,000 laws to help us keep the Ten Commandments. Many people wonder why.

values upon which we founded this great country of ours. Some of our citizens have simply lost a sense of moral responsibility...to themselves...to their children...to a cause.

You don't have to be a sociologist to know that there has been a massive breakdown of America's ethical standards. We are an affluent society to some and some of our citizens have deluded themselves that material prosperity and the pursuit of pleasure is an end in itself.

The alienation between parents and children which many call the generation gap is a tragic sympton of this moral decline. The pressures of urban living...the rootlessness of modern life...all these things contribute to what can only be described as a nation in which many citizens have simply lost their way.

How many parents believe their duty to their children is fulfilled by providing shelter, food and a generous allowance? How many parents sow the seeds of juvenile alienation by seeming never to care how late their sons or daughters stay out...or even if they return home at all?

It is a favorite past-time of the "kick America" crowd to sneer at the Puritan ethic...to denounce the moral code and the values which created this country...the sense of national purpose which held us together in times of great stress...through war and depression.

Have we lost all this?

In our zeal to fulfill personal desires...to seek personal pleasures...to satisfy material wants and everyone's desire to "do his own thing," can we forget that it was to unify this country we fought the bloodiest civil war in man's history? Can we forget our duty to honor our country and our own sense of morality?

Better prisons, speedier court trials, more federal funds...all of these things alone will not solve our crime problems. And all the laws and law enforcement in the world won't heal the rift and discord among our people.

With all our wealth, we cannot afford to be divided by animosity, suspicion and hate.

We will never recapture the vitality...the sense of national purpose that created our country...until every individual reaffirms a commitment to a personal moral code that holds each person accountable to his fellow man, to his community and to whatever religious code he lives by. Indeed, civilization cannot exist unless people voluntarily abide by rules that are actually unenforceable.

Churchill stirred the hopes of the world by proudl declaring his belief that "when great causes are on the move in the world, we learn that we are spirits, not animals, and that something is going on in space and time, which, whether we like it or not, spells duty."

America is not doomed to be consumed by disorder and decadence; our people are made of sterner stuff.

The principles of honor, respect, obedience to law and yes--of love for one's fellow man--have not been swept away by the turbulence of our times. These ideals still provide the inherent strength and power of our nation and our people.

They need only to be reawakened to provide the moral force and direction our country so desperately needs.

SUBJECT: 1967 ARMORED CAR

Mr. Edward V. Hickey, Jr., Director of Security for Governor Ronald Reagan, came by to see me the other day accompanied by Mr. Michael K. Deaver, Assistant to the Governor and Director of Administration, for the purpose of discussing the possible acquisition of one of the Bureau's armored cars. Mr. Hickey, of course, is aware of the fact that we do have an armored vehicle in the Los Angeles Office and that we dispose of one each year since the Director made available his armored car in Los Angeles to Governor Reagan when he was visiting that area and proceeding into a ghetto area.

Mr. Hickey stated he was most concerned with the protection and safety of Governor Reagan and he, Hickey, is most anxious to secure an armored vehicle for the purpose of protecting the Governor. He pointed out that the Governor expects to be in office for three more years and does not intend to run for reelection and under the circumstances, it would be highly impossible to secure a new Cadillac armored for the protection of the Governor.

Mr. Hickey was informed that this matter would be presented to the Director for his consideration and for the purpose of determining whether it would be possible to sell or give an armored car to the State of California for the use of Governor Reagan.

The question of whether we can give or sell an armored vehicle to the State of California has been researched in conjunction with the Office of Legal Counsel. Under GSA Federal Property Management regulations, the car could be given to the State of California by following the prescribed regulations, i.e. (1) declare the vehicle surplus to the Department proper; (2) request the Department to ask the Department of Health. Education and Welfare to permit the vehicle to be given to the State of California.

The GSA Federal Property Management regulations further require that used vehicles be disposed of only by sale, such as in this instance where we are replacing the vehicle with a new one.

An examination of the statutes of the State of California, Section 2501, reflects that the Commissioner of the California Highway Patrol has the power to issue licenses for the private operation of armored cars; thus it is legally possible for an armored car to be privately owned and operated in the State of California.

In view of this, there could be competitive bidding on an armored car that might be offered for sale in that state and, of course, the State of California could be one of the qualified bidders.

The sale of the present 1967 Cadillac could be made with the proviso that it is subject to bidding by qualified bidders only and the further proviso that the Bureau retain authority to supervise the dearmoring of the vehicle before subsequent sale by the successful purchaser.

We have the 1967 armored car available in Los Angeles which we will be disposing of shortly. This car has approximately 30,000 miles on the speedometer and Mr. Hickey understands that in spite of the low mileage on the speedometer, the mileage on the motor is considerable. Mr. Hickey stated that any arrangement that we could make to make the car available for the Governor would be agreeable he was certain with the Governor and with his own office.

If the Director is agreeable, I will notify SAC Williams of the Sacramento Office, who maintains contact with Mr. Hickey, that the Director will make the 1967 armored car available through the regular procedure of securing bids for such vehicle. Normally we sell the dearmored vehicles to the highest bidder and we would do the same with the armored vehicle. There is very little likelihood that anyone else would bid on the car since there are only a limited number of firms in California who could qualify to own an armored vehicle. If for some reason the Governor's office was not the high bidder and the high bidder was somebody unacceptable to us, we of course could withdraw the vehicle from the bidding process and dispose of it after it has been dearmored.

## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that through SAC Williams of the Sacramento Office, arrangements be made for the sale of the 1967 armored vehicle to the State of California for the use of Governor Reagan.

At 2:28 P.M., August 12, 1971, an anonymous male telephonically contacted the Santa Ana Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Santa Ana, California, and stated he was calling from Sacramento, California, to furnish information regarding a plot to kill California Governor Ronald Reagan.

The caller advised that Governor Reagan would be shot by a sniper's bullet as he arrived at the Capitol Building in Sacramento, California, at 10:00 A.M., Friday, August 13, 1971. The caller related that he heard of this plot at a bar but refused to identify the bar by name or location. He also refused to describe the individuals who were discussing this plot. He stated he had not called the FBI Office at Sacramento, nor had he advised any law enforcement agency at Sacramento. The caller did not have any discernible accent.

The above information was telephonically furnished to Sergeant Dennis Williams, California State Police at Los Angeles, California, at 2:35 P.M., August 12, 1971, and to Special Agent Richard Cameron, U. S. Secret Service, Los Angeles, at 2:40 P.M., August 12, 1971, both by Special Agent Theodore J. A'Hearn, FBI, Los Angeles.

"Nixon came to campus to congratulate our Number 1 team and offer his version of an olive branch to the students - we got front row seats - chanted Peace Now and got booed down. Its all so tiring - I'm so tired and feel so utterly useless - why doesn't anyone ever shoot a Hitler or a Nixon -"

Sawdon stated that the diary contained no threats after the entry on January 14, 1971, through her arrest on February 13, 1972, that she did not make any threat after her arrest, and that, as far as he knows, there was no current threat against the President. Sawdon commented that it is the policy of his department to take an outspoken and perhaps sensationalized stand against those persons who intentionally create an enforcement problem. He equated his comments concerning the demonstration to the comment he had recently made about members of a local gay-liberation group whom he had described to the press as "tutti-fruities dressed in Playtex girdles." He feels the public should know what type of person gets involved in either type of demonstration.

OUTSIDE OF ACAPULCO THE BANDIT REVOLUTIONARY GROUP HEADED
BY LUCIO CABANAS BARRIENTOS OPERATES COMMITTING ROBBERIES,

It will be recalled, that on 4/5/74, Mr. Anthony Palumbo, who described himself as a "Special Assistant to Governor Reagan," requested to meet the Director at 2:30 p.m., Monday, 4/8/74, in order to extend an invitation for Mr. Kelley to speak before the Governor's National Conference on Standards and Goals for Criminal Justice," which is tentatively set for September, 1974. No more specific information regarding this conference was given. The Director has agreed to meet Mr. Palumbo.

Our Sacramento Office has advised that Mr. Palumbo (also known as Colonel Palumbo) is the Executive Director of the Office of Criminal Justice Planning for California. This Office disperses Federal grants under the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. According to the Sacramento Office, Colonel Palumbo is very close to Governor Reagan and prior to his present position was on the Governor's Select Committee on Law Enforcement Problems. Nothing derogatory concerning Colonel Palumbo was contained in the indices of the Sacramento Office nor in Bufiles.

Bufiles indicate that by letter of 8/24/73, the Director acknowledged receipt of the Report of the Governor's Select Committee on Law Enforcement Problems, entitled "Controlling Crime in California," which Colonel Palumbo had sent. This Report was submitted to the California Legislature by Governor Reagan in August, 1973. Bufiles also reflect that in 1970 Colonel Palumbo was the subject of a favorable Departmental applicant investigation in relation to the position of Law Enforcement Program Specialist with LEAA.



### BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Governor Reagan was born on February 6, 1911, in Tampico, Illinois. His parents are John Edward and Nellie Wilson Reagan. He graduated from Eureka College, Eureka, Illinois, with an A.B. degree in 1932. Governor Reagan is well known as a former movie star. He was formerly married to the movie actress, Jane Wyman. They were divorced in 1948 after being married for eight years. He has been married to Nancy Davis since March, 1952. They have two children, Patricia and Ronald, and Mr. Reagan has two children, Maureen and Michael, by his former wife. From 1932 to 1937, Governor Reagan was a sports announcer for Radio Station WHO, Des Moines, Iowa, and a motion picture and television actor from 1937 to 1966. Since 1967, he has been the Governor of the State of California. He resides at the Executive Mansion, Sacramento, California.

#### RESULTS OF FILE REVIEW

Governor Reagan was the subject of an applicanttype investigation conducted in 1967, in connection with his position as a member of the Board of Regents of the University of California. Inasmuch as the Board of Regents had access to sensitive material from the Atomic Energy Commission, our investigation was requested by the Atomic Energy Commission. No derogatory information was developed during this investigation. except as follows:

Although Reagan has been extremely anticommunist since the latter part of the 1940's, he had previously been listed as a member of a committee and appeared in a play at a meeting called by the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, which later became known as the National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions. The Southern California Committee of this organization has been cited as a communist dominated propaganda media.

The Mobilization for Democracy has been cited an a communist front by the California Un-American Activities Committee. Reagan was also, in 1946, listed as a sponsor and director of the Los Angeles Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy and in 1947 was listed as a sponsor of a recital put on by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, both communist front organizations. In 1947, Reagan testified as a friendly witness before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and explained that he was duped through a telephone call to lend his name as sponsor of the recital of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

In March, 1960, the FBI cooperated with Governor Reagan by making inquiries in Washington, D. C., concerning Maureen Reagan, daughter of Reagan and Jane Wyman, who was living with a married Metropolitan Police Officer in Washington, D. C.



ROMALD PEAGAN (Reprint of a Radio Programmatitled "F.B.I." Commentary by Ronald Reagant

Legislation is now before the Congress which would end all -- QUOTE -- "political surveillance" and shut down the intelligence-gathering functions of the P.B.I. and the C.I.A. This legislation will prevent all covert gathering of foreign intelligence in peace time and keep the F.B.I. from collecting information on any person unless there is evidence that person has already committed a crime, or is about to commit one.

If such a law had existed in the years preceding World War II, the F.B.I. would have been prevented from infiltrating the German-American Bund. The record will show that the F.B.I. deserves most of the credit for the fact that not one major act of sabotage interrupted our war effort during the years from Pearl Harbor to V.J. Day.

As for the second point, how do we propose to halt the increasing wave of terrorist activities if we have to wait until the crime is committed? Or, how will we know someone is about to commit the crime? Our police intelligence forces - the F.B.I. and the C.I.A. - have for 40 years used tactics of surveillance, phone taps and, yes, mail openings when they had reason to believe there was a threat' to the safety of our country and our people.

Using these techniques, an F.B.I. agent infiltrated the Ku Klux Klan, and found the murderers of three young civil rights workers a few years ago. I know of no government agency that can match the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its record of more than 40 years of dedication, effectiveness and freedom from scandal.

Now the Attorney General of the United States, evidently carrying out Department of Justice policy, will try to convict a 25 year veteran of the Bureau -- former agent and supervisor John Kearney, who retired in 1972. He will be charged with illegal phone taps and opening mail several years ago when these were normal operating procedures. The Attorney General admits that even if he is found Not Guilty, he will be ruined because the cost of defending himself will wipe out his life savings.

And, who was the object of Agent Kearney's attention when he did these things? The "Weathermen", one of the groups that surfaced in the anti-war demonstrations several years ago. Members of the Weathermen traveled to communist countries, boasted of bombings they were responsible for and 26 of them were, at one time, on law enforcement's "most wanted" list.

There is no other way to protect against terrorism than to try to learn in advances what the terrorists are planning. I wish we could have known beforehand about the bomb that would arrive in a California college office, packaged as mail. A young 3 bride of three weeks was blinded and had her hands mangled as she opened that package. A janitor, on another campus, was blown to eternity when he tried to remove a bomb in the faculty dining room.

I'm glad for the intelligence report, and I, frankly, don't care how it was obtained, that warned me -- when I was Governor of California -- of a plot to kidnap my wife and kill her if I wouldn't agree to free some imprisoned members of a terrorist group.

John Kearney is being prosecuted and persecuted for protecting his fellow citizens; for doing what the Congress, several Presidents and Attorney Generals had approved over a period of several decades.

On October 13, 1976, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) John D. O'Connor was presented the facts of this case as indicated in the above Seattle memorandum. He declined prosecution based on the fact there was no apparent violation of Civil Rights involved, but he felt the information should be disseminated to logical law enforcement agencies for their information.

RONALD REAGAN (Reprint of a Radio Program entitled "F.B.I. Commentary by Ronald Reagan.)

Some weeks ago, on this program, I told of the retired F.B.I. agent who is being prosecuted by the Justice Department for having used wiretaps, mail openings, and so forth in order to get a line on the revolutionary Weatherman organization.

All of this took place several years ago before the agent, John Kearney, had retired. It seems that Mr. Kearney had done nothing that wasn't standard operating procedure at this time. And certainly, the best interests of our people and the nation called for knowing, in advance, what activities were being planned by the Weatherman activists.

It is hard to understand how the Justice Department thinks the interest of the nation will be served by proceeding with this after-the-fact prosecution of a man who served his country and his fellow citizens honorably and well. The Attorney General, himself, has expressed sorrow about the case, which makes one wonder why he doesn't drop the whole thing. He has even declared that John Kearney will face ruin even if he's found innocent, because his entire life savings will be used up in his defense against the charges.

This charging of an F.B.I. agent with a crime for carrying out orders has reduced -- to zero -- the morale of every agent. The Bureau, a proud service with a unique record, is being treated as if it were some kind of "secret police", guilty of harassing and persecuting the law-abiding. Personally, I don't know of any governmental agency more entitled to the respect and gratitude of the American people.

It has guarded against sabotage in times of war, carried on a tireless crusade against organized crime and aided local law enforcement in every way possible. Now, in a climate of fear, mistrust and hysteria, not only the Bureau, but police intelligence of every kind, has been attacked as somehow threatening us with a police state. It is in this climate that former agent John Kearney is being prosecuted.

When I spoke of this before, I closed the broadcast expressing the hope that a committee to come to the aid of John Kearney would be formed so I could contribute to his defense fund. Well, that hope has been realized and there is such a committee.

Former United States Senator James Buckley, former United States Ambassador Clare Booth Luce and former Secretary of the Treasury William Simon are writing letters asking for help to finance the "Citizen's Legal Defense Fund for the F.B.I.". Contributions should be sent to the Committee, Suite 608, 95 Madison Avenue, New York City 10016. I'll repeat that address in a few seconds, so be ready. The monies received will be turned over to the Special Agents' legal fund of the Society of Former Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation which will assist Kearney in the forthcoming trial.

Now I said I'd repeat that address. It is, "Citizen's Legal Defense Fund for the F.B.I.", Suite 608, 95 Madison Avenue, New York City 10016.

I know this is something I haven't done before, but in a time when dozens of government agencies are snooping into every facet of our lives without restraint of any kind, it seems to me there is a great injustice in hounding an agency whose so-called snooping is aimed at our protection.





The crowd started to break up as soon as Tom HAYDEN had finished his talk.

H. Tom HAYDEN which is not the same Tom HAYDEN as the SDS founder, but who represents the right as compared to the leftist views of the other Tom HAYDEN spoke on the Viet Nam issue but received a cold reception from the crowd that remained.

After both Tom HAYDENS had completed their speeches a Dr. Mellvin MEYER a journalism professor at the University of Massachusetts, spoke to the remaining group of people in attendance and stated that the "The revolution is overdue." He said, "It isn't a matter of systems but men. You are young and will wage it or win it. My object is to pursuade you to wage a revolution not a rebellion." He critized campus violence and suggested as a replacement a demand for improvement of a already debased education.





Bobby SEALE, for example the Government is going to try to electrocute Bobby SEALE in September, there will not be a college, university or high school in this country that will be left standing. He also told that he had been warned not to cross state lines. He said he didn't understand what state lines were and that he was going to go back to the Convention in Chicago in 1970.

He stated that KUNSTLER was the main revolutionary in the United States. He told the group that he had just received news that there was a riot in Berkley which was going on at this moment. He got a great deal of applause. He also stated that there was a Bank of America which had been burned down this day. This also drew a great deal of applause. He said that he was going to Santa Barbara on April 16 and from there he would be going to U C Berkley. He touched on Timothy O'LEARY and said that for everyone of us that is put in jail, there is a group of us out on the streets. Timothy O'LEARY was sent to jail for smoking pot, and for being in possession of three sticks of marijuana. Where were the pot smokers on the street? They should organize for Timothy O'LEARY.


He spoke of Bobby SEALE'S trial which is coming up in New Haven, Connecticut and said that New Haven was not responsible, but that Yale University was responsible. He stated we would be going to Yale (source unable to obtain exact date--either May 2 or 3). He said that revolution was on the street. He spoke against the Police Department referring to them as pigs and said pigs have to go.

He stated that we in the movement are everything our mothers and fathers wanted us not to be. They wanted us to take baths—we wern't going to take baths. He stated that he was fed up with people coming up and saying, "Hi Jerry, we hope you don't have to go back to jail again—we support you Jerry—we are behind you." He repeated again, "F—— that we don't want you behind us, we want you in front of us."

Jerry RUBIN also stated that we are all "Mother F----" and that frankly he did not know where to start or when to stop. He stated that he and the rest of his cohorts in the Conspiracy Trial would not have been released if the Bank of America had not been burned down is Isla Vista. He emphasized it was not Conspiracy 7, but Conspiracy 8 because whether the crowd wanted to believe it or not Bobby SEALE was right in there. 



Mike ABELES was the first speaker. He was from the SEATTLE LIBERATION Defendants. He spoke at some length about his start in the movement, the oppression in the schools and the war in Vietnam. He ended up emphasizing that delegates should be sent from the United States to Hanoi to talk to the Viet Cong and to sign their own Peace Treaties. These should be brought back to the American people, to the churches, to the schools and to various organizations. This he said was being organized now and would be taking place in the very near future.

Marque NEAL gave a short speech starting first with a letter which he stated had come directly from Angela DAVIS. He stated that most of the people in the movement had probably heard by now that Angela was on a hunger strike. The reasons for her hunger strike were as follows:

- (1) Only being able to shower once a day.
- (2) Only being allowed two hours recreation.
- (3) Solitary confinement.
- (4) Not allowed to read books which had been sent to her.


He stated that DAVIS had no faith in the American courts. She did have faith in the American people and the reason Huey NEWTON was on the streets today was not because of the American courts, but was in fact because of the pressure which had been put on by the people. He stated that the first of many demonstrations would be taking place in New York October 25 at the residence of Governor Rockefeller. On Tuesday, 5:00 p.m. at the State Building in Los Angeles there would be another demonstration to protest the treatment of sister Angela DAVIS. He stated that the movement wanted as many people there as possible so that the workers coming out of the State Building at 5:00 p.m. would know what it was all about. He stated he would get in contact with the other people on the DEFENSE COMMITTEE TO FREE ANGELA DAVIS as soon as this meeting was over.

Mike TIGAR spoke of the oppression in the Judicial System in the United States and said that instead of coming to meetings like this people would do much better to talk to each other and find out where it was really at.

Mike LERNER was the next speaker. He also spoke on Washington and the Peace Treaties and the delegates going to Hanoi.

Rennie DAVIS' speech was very much the same as the speech he gave at the ILWU Hall on October 24. He spoke of repression in South Vietnam. He emphasized that there were tigar cages there with five people to a cage. He spoke about the food which they had been given. Then he touched on the Saigon Government. He stated that people who were in a movement and looking for a place to "get out of that movement, do something." He referred to them as "spooks" and then he referred to Mr. Duke of the Saigon He stated that DUKE publically made a statement that the Saigon Government should be overthrown, and there should be an uprising, and a complete withdrawal of U.S. Troops. DAVIS stated that according to the Saigon Government these statements were treasonous. Duke had been flown back to Saigon. Without question, many important people, places and organizations had supported Mr. DUKES statement. Ronald Reagan-5017

DAVIS stated that before the presidential election in 1971 he expected to see these things happen. June 13, 1971 would be the deadline Nixon would get. There again, he stated, this deadline would be flexible. He stated that if Nixon would agree to do this immediately things would start happening. Prisoners would be home by Christmas. There would be an immediate cease fire tomorrow. There would be a provisional government in Saigon. Sigh, Key and Kim (phonetic) had to be replaced immediately. Other than that the Saigon government would remain in tact. He stated that a country which had fought 25 years was now willing to accept minority



positions on the provisional government and this was fair enough and no one could question it. He spoke again about delegates going to Hanoi to sign their own Peace Treaties and completely bypass the Government. From this could come an organization to organize Campus Referendums. This would bring church organizers together and the Americans could ratify their own Peace Treaty with the people of Vietnam. He stated that May I was when Nixon stated there would be another troop withdrawal from Vietnam. This was just a token stance. May I is also the date of the Cambodian invasion by the U.S. He stated that May I would also be the "Peoples" ultimatum. He stated that on May I, "We intend to stop the Government of the United States of America."

Great emphasis was put on collectives by Rennie DAVIS. in groups of five or ten should now organize themselves and start getting together \$150 to \$200. He stated that with that they would be able to purchase a car and to remember this car requires no insurance. All they had to do on May 3 was drive to Shirley Highway and stall their auto. In other words, it would break down. There would also be an automobile stall in on the main artery going to the CIA building. These demonstrations would not be one day demonstrations, but would be a continuous The movement intends to paralyze this country. on-going thing. At the same time, this movement would coordinate with Asia, Europe, Latin American countries and that the North Vietnamese would then send out an appeal to So. Vietnam to overthrow the Saigon Government. Rennie DAVIS stated that all groups primary focus should be on local issues -- Examples: sexism, racism, political trials & particularly the trial of Angela DAVIS. This was not going and not intended to be a one-shot action.

The next speaker was Doug DOWD. He leaned heavily on the money bit. He stated that the movement needed money, that he was very sorry to see the cans which had been passed around this night not filled. We should take a can home with us and fill it. This was important as money is needed.

The next speaker was a young girl, not identified. She announced that next week there was going to be a Halloween show. The emcee was Ronald Reagan. The guest of honor was Richard Nixon. The star actor was Senator Murphy. She stated that free tickets could be obtained to the Anaheim Convention Center October 30, 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. for anyone who wanted to contact the Republican Party. She then stated, "If you can't get inside to do your thing, there will be a peaceful, non-violent picket outside."



"During the period when ANGELIA DAVIS was an at large fugutive from the top ten hit parade of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Communist Party almost never mentioned the name of the incident. The silence has been broken.

A not-too-well planned meeting of the District Committee was called & held Saturday morning October 17th.

LOU DISKINS, ROSE CHERNIN,

had met previously when it was
learned that ANGELIA had been captured, or kidnapped according
to the headlines of the People's World. The conclusion
drawn from that emergency conf of was that ANGELIA had
committed no crime, that she could not get a fair trial in
the State of Calif. & a number of other glamorous charges
made by the group.

"The function of that meeting & the authority vested in it by the Constitution of the Last Convention of the Partys - says that in any such emergency matters the District Board is empowered to act at the <u>behest</u> of its authority & make decisions, statements, etc.

"The meeting today was no-none & no less a ratification Ronald Reagan-5021

of that decision. The decision is that the Party would use every legal & political means at its disposal to first free ANGELIA from Jail & secondly to fight this charges brought against her by the State of Calif.

"LOU <u>DISKINS</u> gave a prepared statement to the District Committee members which specifically called for the structuring of organization of every means at its disposal to fight this. LOU called this the most important case since the JULISM RASENBERG Case.

"The question of repression against Blacks & Chicanos & specifically this brilliant young woman is only a means to striffle the voice of dissent. or something to that effect. We naturally mentioned the Board of Regents & Governor REAGEN her stop-gap measures to prevent her from teaching at the Universities & all parts of pressure brought to bear upon Miss DAVIS.

"People were urged to make this their number one concentration by calling meeting in their areas on mass work to discuss the legal & political issues involved. LOU defenately feels, & said so, that ANGELIA DAVIS has been singled out by the Bougeorise repressive elements to distroy & embarass the party & its fight for free democracy in this country. The party is now so mobolized to fight this.

"CHARLENE MITCHELL will address an audience Friday night October 23rd at the First Unitarian Church & the following day another meeting of a mass charcter will be held, I believe there also.

"There has been no official word or <u>confiremation</u> as to the National Office <u>thinhones</u> but I am sure its safe to assume that CHARLENE will carry this <u>fonners</u> for the National Office.

"LOU reported that already a number of prominent min people, although he did not elaborate how prominent or whom

he spoke of, had called & volunteered to participate on a special committee to "Free ANGELIA DAVIS. He did say it consisted of several ministers & one or two polatical officials.

"DOROTHY HEALEY had been given credit for the organization of this special committee.



"Los Angeles, Calif. Nov. 24, 1970

"On Sunday afternoon Nov. 22nd there was a mass rally for ANGELA DAVIS held at the First Unitarian Church which is located at 2936 W. 8th St. The meeting was sponsored by the Fellowship for Social Justice Committee in conjunction with the United Committee to Free Angela Davis. There was a capasity filled hall in the Fritchman Auditorium. of the Church and was composed of a well intergrated groupe of young & old - Black, Brown and white citizens in smypathy with the plight of Miss DAVIS. The main speaker was one of the attorneys - handling the case. Mr. JOHN L. ABT. He described the charges etc. against Miss DAVIS & explained the necessity of a broad mass "peoples campaign" in conjunction with a good legal defense for Miss DAVIS. He told the crowd that ANGELA had lost a few pounds but had not lost spirit and had sent a letter to be read to the groupe where she urged continued struggle to free all political prisoners. said that ANGELA was not guilty of the crimes she had been indicted of & described her guilt as follows: ANGELA DAVIS is guilty of being "a black women, who showed she could make it in a "white masculine" America - without bowing down to the racist form of traditional type leaders & government bodies such as Gov REAGON etc.

"He suggested that letters be sent to Governor ROCKEFELLOW, asking that he withdraw the warrant he has signed for ANGELA's return to the State of California.

"Mrs. SHIRLEY WILLIAMS who is serving as chairman of the United Committee to Free Angela Davis appealed to the audience to get involved and to get others to help form a strong defense committee with at least one million sponsors. It was suggested that everyone use their own initiative and form committees of all kinds & sizes to fight for ANGELA's freedom. A black movie actor was on stage - he read one of

DUNBAR's poems as well as the letter from ANGELA. CORKY GONZALES, Chicano friend was present and spoke on behalf of the unity & support of the Mexican Community for the DAVIS defense.

"People were urged to sign up for specific committees to work on.

"FRED RINALDO, a member of the L.A. Committee for the Defense of the Bill of Rights made the appeal for the collection and urged that pledges be made also. Over \$1400.00 was collected. Four Japanese union men who are members of the Anti napon bomb committee were present & took a bow. There was much enthusiam at the meeting."





#### . VIII. Information Concerning:

- 1) Attorney JOHN ABT was the main speaker at the Communist Party's Free ANGELIA DAVIS rally that was held at the First Unitarian Church of 11/22/70. Since this is November 22, 1970, it should be noted that this dat is the 7th anniversary of the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY in Dallas, Texas. This factor can be properly noted in this report insofar as the alleged assassin of Pres. KENNEDY, LEE H. OSWALD, for whatever reasc. When held in custody by Dallas Police after being told that they accused his of assassinating KENNEDY and Officer JEFFERSON D. TIPPET, apparently contacted JOHN ABT and asked ABT to represent him in trial court. Neither ABT or any of the other speakers at the rally mentioned the assassination of President KENNEDY or LEE H. OSWALD today.
- 2) This rally that the Communist Party coordinated today is part of a national Party effort to free ANGELIA DAVIS. Knowing of JOHN ABT, this reporter wanted to see him for myself. When this reporter arrived at the Firs Unitarian Church I was greeted by a comrade selling the Trotskyite Communis newspaper THE MILITANT. The Party charged everyone \$1.00 to get in. The Party had gone to great extent to keep people from sneaking in through othe exits or just not paying anything at all. The rally was held in Fritchman Auditorium, the main auditorium at the church. The rally commenced mostly c time. Mr. CHRISTIANSON explained that they had to begin as soon as possible

since Mr. ABT had to catch an early plane out of Los Angeles and back to New York City. Ronald Reagan-5030

3) JOHN ABT is an attorney practising law in New England. ABT is about 45 or 50 years of age. When dressed in a suit ABT looks like any 20-year veteran of the FBI or Los Angeles Police Intelligence. CHRISTIANSON, when introducing ABT, noted that ABT had worked in the New Deal of President FRE KLIN D. ROOSEVELT and was originally a corporation lawyer. ABT has received more hate commentaries for having OSWALD contact him probably than for anything else he has ever been connected with. ABT is known to be a member of the Communist Party's New England District. ABT stated that he is now representing the legalistic interests of ANEGLIA Y. DAVIS. ABT stated that the case against ANGELIA DAVIS that has been represented so far by the Californ authorities is marked by a lack of evidence against her. ANGELIA DAVIS is the former UCLA Philosophy Departmental instructor and C.P. member who the Marin County District Attorney says was involved in the famous gun fight in which a judge was killed when black revolutionists tried to free several prisoners. Miss DAVIS was arrested by the FBI in New York City after leaving a trail behind her that the FBI picked up in Miami, Fla,, area. ABT stated that when Miss DAVIS was being held in New York for unlawful flight Gov. RE. GAN sent papers to Gov. ROCKEFELLER requesting that Miss DAVIS be sent back to California. He said that these papers are known as an affidavit. He said that an affidavit is supposed to contain evidence in extradition cases that the defendant committed a particular crime. He said that Gov. ROCKEFELLER had 30 days to rule on the matter. He said that the affidavit that REAGAN sent ROCKY had know particular evidence at all in it. He said that ROCKY signed it within 24 hours anyway despite its lack of evidence. He then said that this showed how the REAGAN-ROCKEFELIER ruling class was after Miss DAT. for shaking a black fist at them. He said that the Marin County Grand Jury then handed down an indictment against Miss DAVIS and new extradition paper: were sent to New York. He said that in the case of an indictment by a Grand Jury evidence was not necessary in unlawful flight extradition cases. also stated that there are many people in London, Rome and Moscow who are supporting ANGELIA DAVIS. This means that the Fabian socialists in London, the Communist Party members in Rome and the revisionist neo-Czarist pig pseudo-Communists in Moscow are all behind ANRELIA DAVIS. (Most New Leftist: describe the USSR Russian Communists by these words, but ABT's Party member: evidently feel that the USSR Russian Communists are the real vanguard of the proletariat). ABT's comment about Moscow could also mean that the Soviet secret service K.G.B. does not feel that Miss DAVIS or ABT are C.I.A. agent: MILES COPELAND of the C.I.A. recently told the L.A. FREE PRESS readers that you should consider why someone like ABT or NIXON says something instead of just what they say. ABT's comment also helps to build support behind ANGELI. DAVIS on the part of pro-Moscow Communists who might be hesitant to support someone mixed up with adventurists and sometimes pro-Red Chinese Communists and New Leftists. ABT also stated that Miss DAVIS was being hasseled by he: treatment in jail. He said that after the FBI caught her, they turned her over to the New York prison authorities for working and keeping. He said the Miss DAVIS was first put in the psychiatric ward at the City jail, for wome: He said that she was often disturbed by a woman screaming at her about the evilness of Negroes. He said that when the defense got her out of the nut ward, as it is called, she was then given solitary confinement treatment. He said that has since ended, and that now ANGELIA DAVIS is with the other prisoners and getting along well with them. ABT said that when she was firs being arraigned after her arrest, the black clerk in the Judges courtrocm grabbed him by the arm after the trial was over and told him that he would fix him up with a pass so that he could see his client in the morning. ABT said that the girl who writes the passes, who is a Negro, remarked that the would not have gone after ANGELIA DAYYS if she had not been a militant. AST said that clerks had never been that nice with him before now.

- 4) ABT was not the only main speaker that the Party had. When ABT left, the Party took up a collection. The Party later reported that they had collected \$1800-plus that day, and this apparently includes the money that they raised at the door plus other donations and pledges. Actor WILLIAM MARSHALL, a Negro, read a letter to the group from Miss DAVIS and put on a performance for the comrades that RONALD REAGAN might even be envious of. The next speaker on hand was the Castroite revolutionist OSCAR Z. ACCSTA, who in turn introduced CORKY GONZALES, who is on trial in Los Angeles for certain activities he had performed in the East L.A. riot that was held on August 29, 1970, after the peace march and before the peace fally could get underway.
- 5) CORKY GONZALESes real name is supposed to be RUDOLPHO GONZALES. GONZALES is linked to the Party through his and the Party's ties with FIDEL CASTRO or CASTRO's movement in Cuba. GONZALES attended the rally due to his association with ANGELIA DAVIS. He said that he has met Miss DAVIS in San Diego and at UCLA. GONZALES said that there is a revolution in the U.S. today. He said that the adversaries include the types of people who would rut a bullet in his head, and that these people include racist Minutemen and pigs. His tone was that he feels that pig stands for punk-idiot-goon instead of pride-integrity-guts, if you are a local police officer, or patriotism-I: telligence-guts, if you are an FBI pig. GONZALES is based in Denver, Col., and works with his Crusade for Justice communist front organization. In Cole rodo there are probably several hundred Minutemen of one type of another, along with Soldiers of the Cross, U.S. Rangers, John Birchers, and NSRPers. GONZALES said that his group is part of the network of revolutionists doing the dirty work. He said that the Communists in this country should gives his group(s) more money to help pay for the dirty work being done. He said that more participation is needed to from armchair revolutionists. GONZALES attacked white people, particularly the white man, in his talk. (ABT had criticized the white-masculine American too). GONZALES statements indicate that he is a nationalist socialist. Unlike HITLER, his nationalism is not the white German race but the Mexicans, Like HITLER, GONZALES is a socialist In the future the fusion of socialism and racial nationalism in GONZALES could make him the RUDOLF HESS of the Mexican-American-Chicano movement unless a pig or a Minuteman winds up stopping him before the time comes to do toethe police and white people what the Nazis did to the Jews and Gipsie The Reds evidently believe that they will rule America by 1980 or it will be burned down so badly that nobody will run it.
- 6) The Communist network to bring America to its knees evidently includes revolutionists like YURI ANDROPOV and CORKY GONZALES, and of course others in other groups. To save the United States a workable counterinsurge cy strategy is going to have to be developed that won't destroy the basic democratic nature of our system. At the high point of the rally, when everyone was cheering ABT's call to free Miss DAVIS and others were calling for Marxist revolution, I almost started to cry. I would have not been crying for them but for this country.





On Sunday, 22 November, 1970, at 2.30 p.m. a meeting was held at the auditorium of the First Unitarian Church, 2936 West 8th Street, Los Angeles.

Meeting. - - Report by John Abt, attorney, on his client, Angela Davis.

In passage way in front of entrances to auditorium at small table were and another male caucasian in charge of admission tickets.

The meeting was in progress.

John Abt was addressing the audience.

Seated behind the speaker's podium on the stage were two women and four men.

John Abt spoke of his client and aspects of the case.

Some of remarks, in effect.

That there is no evidence to link Angela Davis with the murder and kidnapping for ramson charges she is faced with.

The District Attorney (or judge) at Marin County had obtained the indictment. These indictments, as all attorneys know, are easily obtained. There is no need of evidence, just a description of the crime in question and request for indictment.

(Governor) Reagan asked for extradiction of his client from New York and within twenty four hours (Governor) Rockefellow signed the papers. Abt said Rockefellow signed the extradition papers without giving them any thought, As for sixteen hours that day Rockefelow had been busy getting votes for himself, kissing babies, sampling knishes, (Jewish food), etc.

Some laughter in audience.

Abt spoke of the use by him of act of Habeas Corpus to delay extradition of his client.

That the winning of the case, release of Angela Davis, will not be in the courts but through the pressures from outside ( mass movements working for her release ).

John Abt spoke of a surprise move they ( legal defense ) had which will be made known in December.

At conclusion of his speech John Abt was enthusiastically applauded.

The chairman, one of men seated on stage, announced that they were able to get a plane booking for only one flight for John Abt and would have to proveed with the meeting. To end the ovation to the speaker.

That there would be two extra speakers, Oscar Ocosta and Corky Gonsales.

( Some applause from audience. ) Ronald Reagan-5035

Another member of group on stage was introduced, Marshall Williams, actor, ( Negro ) who would read to audience letter of greeting from Angela Davis.

Marshall Williams, smartly dressed, came to the speaker's podium, greeted the audience with "Power to the people", then proceeded with his short speech about Angela Davis then read the greetings letter.

Shirley Williams, with the Defense Committee for Angela Davis spoke. Some of her remarks, in effect.

The defense drive must aim for involvement of one million people from across the United States and abroad.

That the defense must be not only for Angela Davis but for all political prisoners.

That at conclusion of the meeting there would be in hallway outside auditorium posters of Angela for sale, also donation envelopes for donations for the defense committee.

A book of greetings to Angela Davis on which the people could put their signatures after the meeting.

That the Defense Committee also ( besides money ) needed help in the head-quarters, with mailing, etc.

Shirley Williams gave the address of the Committee. 3450 34th Street. L.A.

A collection made for the Davis Defense Fund by Fred - , introduced as a writer who had been once blackballed.

Fred - spoke of the need to give more than the usual. That all should make a point of either giving a day ( or more ) pay each month till Angela Davis is freed; or holding meetings or parties of ten, and then getting each of the ten to give a party.

He started the collection off with appeal for any one hundred dollar donations, a few moments silence, then a hundred dollar donation brought to the stage by one of the ushers. Fred - announced the donor's names as money (or checks) brought to the stage.

Among the donors, one hundred dollars from Dore Pike ( probably sent in, Dore Pike, old and not well, is home bound ).

Bok Large, seated next to Gibson, sent an envelope to the stage. This donation announced as one hundred dollars from anonymous friend.

The donations called for lower sums, then finally the ushers passed around collection baskets for dollar bills and any coins.

Oscar Acosta made a short speech, referring to the revolution, that it is now here.

Then Corky Gonsales took the speaker's stand.

Gonsales spoke of the position in the Barrios, of the injustices inflicted on the people there (Mexican ) by the establishment.

Of the people killed by the police and their (activists) preparing the people (in barries) to care for themselves.

Gonsales criticized some of the (in effect) non-active revolutionaries, those who gave a twenty dollar bill or paid for a dinner to help (progressive causes) but did not come down and get their hands dirty or themselves bloody. Of the reactions against the Chicanos when they try or express themselves, as at the 29 October Moratorium, etc. Ronald Reagan-5036

At conclusion of his speech Gonsales was enthusiastically applaueded,.

Davida Franchi said we have four Japanese trade unionists in the audience and asked them to come to the stage.

They did so and were introduced. The four acknowledged the applause of the audience with bows and some hand waving.

"A restaurant was shown bearing a sign, "Thompson's Mexican Food"

"It told how Indians and Chicanos were the same and of Aztec ancestry.

"After film SHERRY or CAROLYN introduced CRIS CEVADA as editor of La Causa.

"He wore a Brown Beret and tan, military type jacket.

"CEBADA said all the land belongs to the Chicanos. That is Nev., Colo., Ariz., N.M., and Calif.

"CEBADA stated that there are large numbers of Chicanos in Denver, Albuquerque, N.M., Chicago, and many other cities.

"He said all Chicanos across the nation and Mexicans in northern Mexico should be united in the struggle and they are working on such uniting.

"CEBADA said over a million Mexicans are deported to Mexico each year but we don't believe in a border, it was man-made and all this part of the U.S. was and still is part of Mexico, so belongs to the Chicanos.

"He said about 15 million in Mexico live near the border and about as many live in the S. Western States so it should belong to the people.

"CEBADA said when asked what will be done with the whites, they will be turned into Mexicans as the Chicanos were made to become white, he stated.

"He said the way Chicanos breed, for we like to live

in 10 to 15 years will have enough population in the S.W. to take the land back by political or any means necessary.

"Also, European idea, live to work, we enjoy life, aren't clock punchers.

"CEBADA said if we and the Indians had taken over Europe as the Europeans did America we woud be called savages.

"He stated Zapata believed in having those who work the land own the land.

"He said in New Mexico a few years ago when Tijerina and his followers took over a court-hours, etc, the pigs were afraid and the D.A. was a traitor.

"CEBADA said at the last Moratorium the pigs used guns and all the people had was a few rocks.

"He said rocks can't hurt, maybe just split a pigs head a little unless one is close and that's no harm. This brought applause from the audience.

"He said the Brown Berets are not communists even though Chief DAVIS claims we are dupes of communists.

"Before the next speaker a collection was taken as Brown Berets were passed people put in money but it appeared as if only about half give anything.

"It was said \$75 was charged to rent the hall for the evening.

"The La Causa paper was on sale for \$25.

"The next speaker was introduced as one of, Biltmore Chicanos, charged with disturbances during Gov. REAGAN's speech.

"He, the Biltmore defendant said they are questioning judges to learn if they are racists.

"He stated that this is an important case for they are testing the grand jury decision, for only of late has a Chicano, and Negro been place on it.

"He said funds are needed and support, so come to the Hall of Injustice.

"CEBADA spoke again saying they are not like the Black Panthers but are for any peoples in the struggle.

"He said the Panthers have done some things that weren't successful and by some tactics not agreeable to the Chicanos.

"The second film shown was titled "Salt of the Earth" It had sound and was in black and white.

"A white man over 50, gray hair, glasses about 5'7" or 8", said film was old, 1953 and seen all over the world so some of the sound and picture poor but the story good.

"He announced it was made by some poeple who suffered under the JOE MC CARTHY period. It sounded as if he said projector belonged to the U.A.W.

"Film was a drama with actors and actresses about a mining strike in New Mexico about 1951.

"It claimed Chicanos were not paid the same scale for the same work done by whites.

"Also that dangerous blasting was done by one Chicano when two men were needed for safety.

"After an accident men went on strike and picketed road so scabs were afraid to come in to take jobs.

"Police arrested Chicano strike leader on false charge of assault and then police beat him in an automobile, according to film.

"Mine Co. used law that did not permit picketing.

"Wives took over picket line and police drove a car into them, cursed the women but the women beat them off.

"The police were shown as obeying the mine co. officials.

"Women were arrested but others stayed on the line. Children were in jail too.

"Police were evicting Chicano leader from mine co. owned home that did not have heated water.

"Company also cut off credit to miners at company owned store.

"At eviction police were removing furniture stepped on picture of JUAREZ, but when large crowd of miners arrived police left.

"Mine official said they would have to contact Eastern office. It was assumed strikers won fight for equality and sanitation.

"Cheers from audience when police appeared bad and a shout of, "Off the Pigs"

CRANE's guests on this 7.30--8.30 show on Friday night on 5/7/71 included ROBERT SCHEER, REX WESTERFIELD, the D.A. in Orange County, ALAN CRANSTON, CHARLES BRAGG.

CRANE's most interesting guests probably are SCHEER and WESTERFIELD. SCHEER is one of the few real "insiders" of the street action movement. His contacts range from CPUSA to Chairman Mao himself. NELSON ROCKEFELLER only paid about \$700 in taxes (federal) about two years ago. SCHEER stated that the superrich write their own laws so that the middle class will have to pay mostly while the rich will not. SCHEER balamed this on the progressive income tax laws. RW stated that the progressive income tax was a Marxist action. SCHEER agreed that the Insiders of international finance had patterned it off of Marxist activity and writings. SCHEER and RW agreed that the income tax should go, be done away with, since it is unfair to the middle and poor classes. SCHEER said that this was a misuse of Marxism in so many words, and RW stopped or was stopped right there. SCHEER stated that he was, in so many words, impressed with the Birchers concentration on Marxism and that "I might even join the John Birch Society." SCHEER may have half meant this, or he may have been trying to play the Far Right against the Near Right Establishment-leaning types CRANE also hadon. RW also plugged the NAKED CAPITALIST by former special agent for the FBI W. CLEON SKOUSEN. Maybe R.W. gave SCHEER a copy of it and his card in case SCHEER was serious SCHEER, and WESTERFIELD, and SKOUSEN, and New Lefteists all agree that the Bankers are running America. The banking families set up dynasties that create central banks in nations, leaving one family controlling more than one country, if they are like ROTHCHILDS. The other Banks, like Bank of America, are involved in decision making. Both SCHEER and RW were talking about giving power to the people instead of to the unelected and ultrarich who spend money but pay little taxes.





of Information and Interior, he is the author of an ambitious and costly plan to break South Africa's increasing isolation and ostlucium by the nations of the world. By skillful techniques and private maneuvers, he peddies the illusion that real change is occurring in South Africa. He seeks to lure the United States into deeper and deeper economic, cultural, and military alliance with his racist and fascist country.

Bulder sits on the South African State Security Council, a small group like the United States Security Council, where he has a voice in the major decisions of the regime. He may soon replace Hilgard Muller as Foreign Minister. He would like one day to replace John Vorster as Prime Minister. His private diplomacy with U.S. "decision-makers" is ballyhooed at home as a triumph in order to promote his ambitions.

#### WHAT IS MUIDER DOING HERE?

Supposedly, Mulder is here on routine business: meeting with Intermation officials who serve in Jos Angeles, San Francisco, New York, Washington and Canada. But his last trip to the United States in early 1974 gives us the clue as to what he is really up to. It was the kickoff of a greatly accelerated push to destroy opposition of Apartheid in the United States. That's why he is here to "answer" Helen Suzman before the World Affairs Council.

WHAT IS THE MULDER CPERATION IN THE UNITED STATES?

Be meets "decision makers" secretly: Mulder met then-Vice President Ford in a quiet, "private" visit and tried to sell him the idea that South Africa could help solve the energy crisis in early 1974. He secretly met Vice Admiral Ray Peet, the senior official in charge of International Security Affairs at the Pentagon. Peet is responsible for foreign military sales and U.S. military involvement in the Indian Ocean; they claim that they only discussed "mutual friends."

In Washington, Mulder met with leadership of both parties in Congress.

He also met with California Governor Ronald Reagan and editors of the Los Angeles Times.

He hired a well-placed Republic law firm to Lobby For South Africa: The Ministry of Information has spent over \$85,000 already on "back-door diplomacy", trying to circumvent U.S. government officials who support the official U.S. policy of opposition to Apartheid. Its lobbyists, Collier, Shannon, Rill and Edwards, also work for the stainless steel industry in its attack on United Nations sanctions against Rhodesia.

Mulder's agents have arranged illicit high-level military contacts between South African and U.S. defense personnel: The U.S. has an arms embargo policy against South Africa, which prohibits such contacts. But in May, 1974, South Africa's Chief of the General Staff of the Defense Force, Admiral Hugo Biermann, met privately with Admiral Thomas Moorer, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and with J.W. Middendorf, Acting Secretary of the Navy.

Ministry has promoted and arranged illegal trips to South Africa by U.S. Congressmen and their staffs: Last year the Ministry paid for the trip of six Congressional staffers although it is a violation of the Constitution for any member or staff of Congress to accept such gifts. #### WHAT MULDER WALTS FROM THE UNITED STATES

South Africa is increasingly isolated in the international community. Mulder's propaganda presents South Africa as a much-misunderstood friend and ally of the United States, Europe, and even independent Africa. To cover up his real interest in eliciting western support for the racist South African regime, Bulder argues that it is in the interests of the United States to co-operate with South Africa:

Bulder says: .South Africa's Simonstown naval base should be used by the United States and NATO for the defense of the semianes around the Cape of Good Hope.

Fact: The sealance around Africa can be equally well protected by western forces operating from other bases in the Atlantic and the Indian Ocean which are far closer to any possible zone of conflict, in the unlikely event of a conventional war on the high seas. South Africa's real concern is not the sealance, but the "strategy of communism to recure world domination", where South Africa is the next target. Because, in South Africa, anyone who opposes the racism and minority rule of the current regime is labelled a "Communist" and is likely to be harrassed, detained, banned, and possibly tortured.

We say: NO MORE VILINAMS! THE UNITED STATES MUST NOT BECOME MILITARLLY COMMITTED ON THE SIDE OF THE MINORITY IN SOUTHERN AFRICA.

Bulder says: South Africa is a multinational state in which different ethnic groups have equal rights and opportunities in their own areas.

Fact: This policy of "separate development" or Apartheid is the Reystone of South Africa's intransigent racist policy. South Africa's African people are not citizens in the major part of the land which is reserved for the 17. European population. The African "homelands" comprise only 13% of the land, and much less than 13% of the natural resources. Three million Africans have been moved from their homes to "their" "bantustans" because of this inhumane policy. Even the vast majority of the government-paid "homeland" chiefs reject the homelands policy. The bantustans serve as a reservoir of cheap labor for the white economy. They are occupied mostly by women, children and the aged, while the men stay in the white areas to work. Starvation, malnutrition, and early childhood deaths are widespread.

We say: THE UNITED STATES MUST NEVER ACCEPT THIS MYTH OF POLITICAL FREEDOM IN SOUTH AFRICA. THE ONLY ACCEPTABLE SOLUTION IS REAL MAJORITY RULE - A UNIVERSAL FRANCHISE FOR ALL SOUTH AFRICANS.

Mulder says: South Africa's new "detente" policy offers black Africa a better way to achieve progress in independent Africa and in southern Africa.

Fact: South Africa is acutally becoming more isolated. The imminent independence of Mozambique and Angola have radically changed the balance of forces in southern Africa, to such an extent that even Prime Minister Vorster realizes he has to pull back from Rhodesia and withdraw back to South Africa's own borders. White South Africa does not intend to give up its economic privel@g. or its political control, without a fight.

We say: We support the April 19 declaration of the Organization of African Unity:
"... ANY TALK OF DETENTE WITH THE AFARTHEID REGIME IS SUCH MONSENSE THAT IT SHOULD
