
**PETITION FOR IMPEACHMENT OF PROSECUTING ATTORNEY KEITH M.

KIUCHI, and hereby moves this Court both on his behalf and on behalf of the more than 500 duly registered voters of the City and County of Honolulu, as set forth in Exhibit "1" attached hereto, pursuant to Sec. 12-203 of the Honolulu City Charter, for the impeachment of

Respondent Keith M. Kaneshiro, as Prosecuting Attorney for the City and County of Honolulu for malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office.

This Petition is brought pursuant to Sec. 12-203 of the Honolulu City Charter, HRS § 603-21.5(a)(4), and Rule 81(b)(11) of the Hawaii Rules of Civil Procedure and is based upon the attached Declaration of Tracy Yoshimura, Exhibits “1” – “5” attached hereto, the attached Memorandum of Law in Support of Petition and such other matters as may be brought before the court in the hearing on this matter.

DECLARATION OF TRACY YOSHIMURA

TRACY YOSHIMURA, declares and states:

1. That I am the Petitioner in the above-entitled matter.
2. That all of the facts set forth in this Declaration are within my personal knowledge.
3. Exhibit "1" attached hereto is a list, in Excel spreadsheet form, of approximately 800 plus individuals who have agreed with a petition for impeachment of Keith M. Kaneshiro, as Prosecuting Attorney for the City and County of Honolulu, the Respondent in the above-entitled matter. The petition was placed on Change.Org, which is a website designed to collect on line signatures, on which individuals could log on and sign the petition electronically. All of these individuals have signed electronically agreeing to the petition. The petition was put out requesting signatures from registered voters in Honolulu. The instructions stated that the petition needed to be signed by duly registered voters in the City and County of Honolulu. The Petitioner acknowledges that some of the individuals that have signed the petition may NOT be duly registered voters in the City and County of Honolulu.

4. Exhibit “2” attached hereto is the content of the petition that was posted on line with Change.Org.

5. That the aforesaid petition asserts that Respondent Keith M. Kaneshiro committed malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office, to wit, the following:

A. As prosecutor failing to take appropriate action as to former Deputy Prosecutor Katherine Kealoha, when it was widely known that the FBI and the United States Justice Department were actively investigating potential criminal acts she was suspected of committing and or had participated in. Prosecutor Kaneshiro failed to take reasonable or necessary “administrative” actions to protect the integrity of any or all, past and present prosecutions that she either had, or was currently participating in or supervising. His failure to take immediate administrative measures to avoid compromising the status of all legal matters she had or was associated with, poses a severe public safety issue, since “if” she is convicted, any and every case she has ever participated in, or supervised, could be challenged on the grounds of her questionable integrity, lack of credibility, and/or any possible improper influence or directions involving other prosecuting attorneys and staff members in the Prosecutors Office whom she may have supervised or worked with.

B. As prosecutor failing to take appropriate action as to Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Chasid Sapolu, since it has been made known via a “Subject Letter” from the Special U.S. Attorney of the United States Department of Justice, that Deputy Prosecutor Chasid Sapolu is the “subject” of a federal grand jury investigation. Prosecutor Kaneshiro has again failed to take reasonable or necessary “administrative” actions to protect the integrity of any or all, past and present prosecutions that he either had, or is currently participating in or supervising. Prosecutor Kaneshiro’s failure to take immediate administrative measures to protect the status of

all legal matters Deputy Chasid Sapolu had or was associated with, poses a severe public safety issue; since “if” he is convicted, any and every case he has ever participated in or supervised, could be challenged on the grounds of his questionable integrity, lack of credibility, and/or any possible improper influence or directions involving other prosecuting attorneys.

C. As prosecutor failing to take appropriate action as to Deputy Prosecutor Jan Futa, since it has been made known via a “Subject Letter” from the Special U.S. Attorney of the United States Department of Justice, that Deputy Prosecutor Jan Futa is the “subject” of a federal grand jury investigation. Prosecutor Kaneshiro has again failed to take reasonable or necessary “administrative” actions to protect the integrity of any or all, past and present prosecutions that she either had, or is currently participating in, or supervising. Prosecutor Kaneshiro’s failure to take immediate administrative measures to protect the status of all legal matters Deputy Prosecutor Jan Futa had or was associated with, poses a severe public safety issue; since “if” convicted, any and every case she has ever participated in could be challenged on the grounds of her questionable integrity, lack of credibility, and/or any possible improper influence or directions involving other prosecuting attorneys and staff members in the Prosecutors Office whom she may have supervised or worked with.

D. It has been confirmed that City and County of Honolulu Prosecutor Keith M. Kaneshiro has himself received official notification via a “Target Letter” from the Special U.S. Attorney of the United States Department of Justice informing him that he is the “Target” of a federal Investigation. However, Prosecutor Kaneshiro failed to immediately notify appropriate officials of the City and County of Honolulu and/or State of Hawaii that he received this official notice, and currently chooses to remain in his position as The Prosecutor for the City and County of Honolulu, where he supervises, directs and oversees all of the cases and employees in that

agency's office. By remaining in this position, Prosecutor Keith Kaneshiro has already jeopardized, and is further jeopardizing the integrity of ANY and ALL past and present criminal cases and investigations which his office has prosecuted under his supervision or employment; since "if" he is convicted, any and every case he has ever participated in or supervised, could be challenged on the grounds of his questionable integrity, lack of credibility, and/or any possible improper influence or directions involving other prosecuting attorneys and staff members in the Prosecutors Office whom he may have supervised or worked with.

6. Exhibit "3" attached hereto is a true and correct copy of news stories on the website of Hawaii News Now, on December 17, 2018 and on December 10, 2018. These articles show that Keith M. Kaneshiro received a target letter from the U.S. Department of Justice amid: "a widening public corruption probe".

I declare, under penalty of law, that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my information and belief.

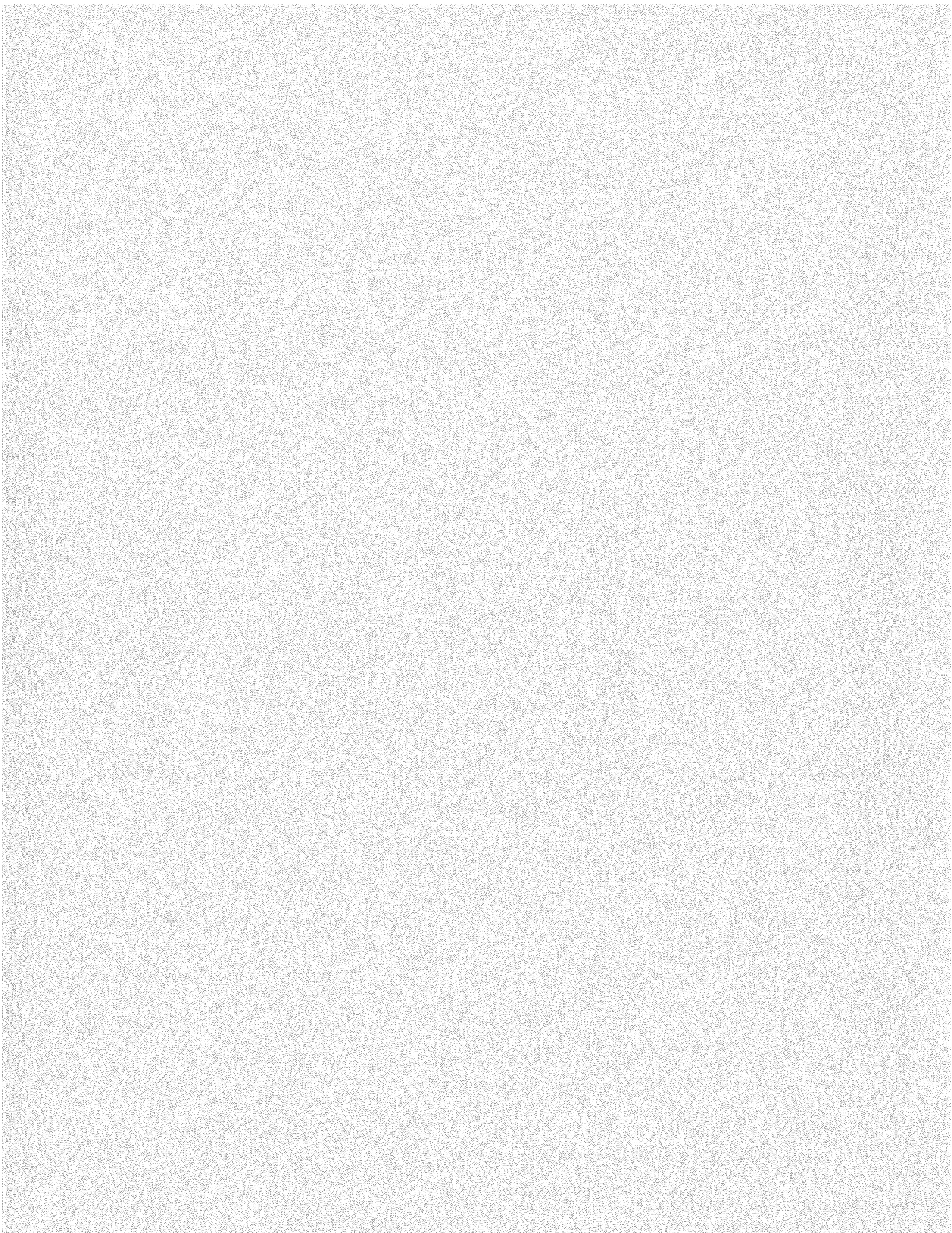

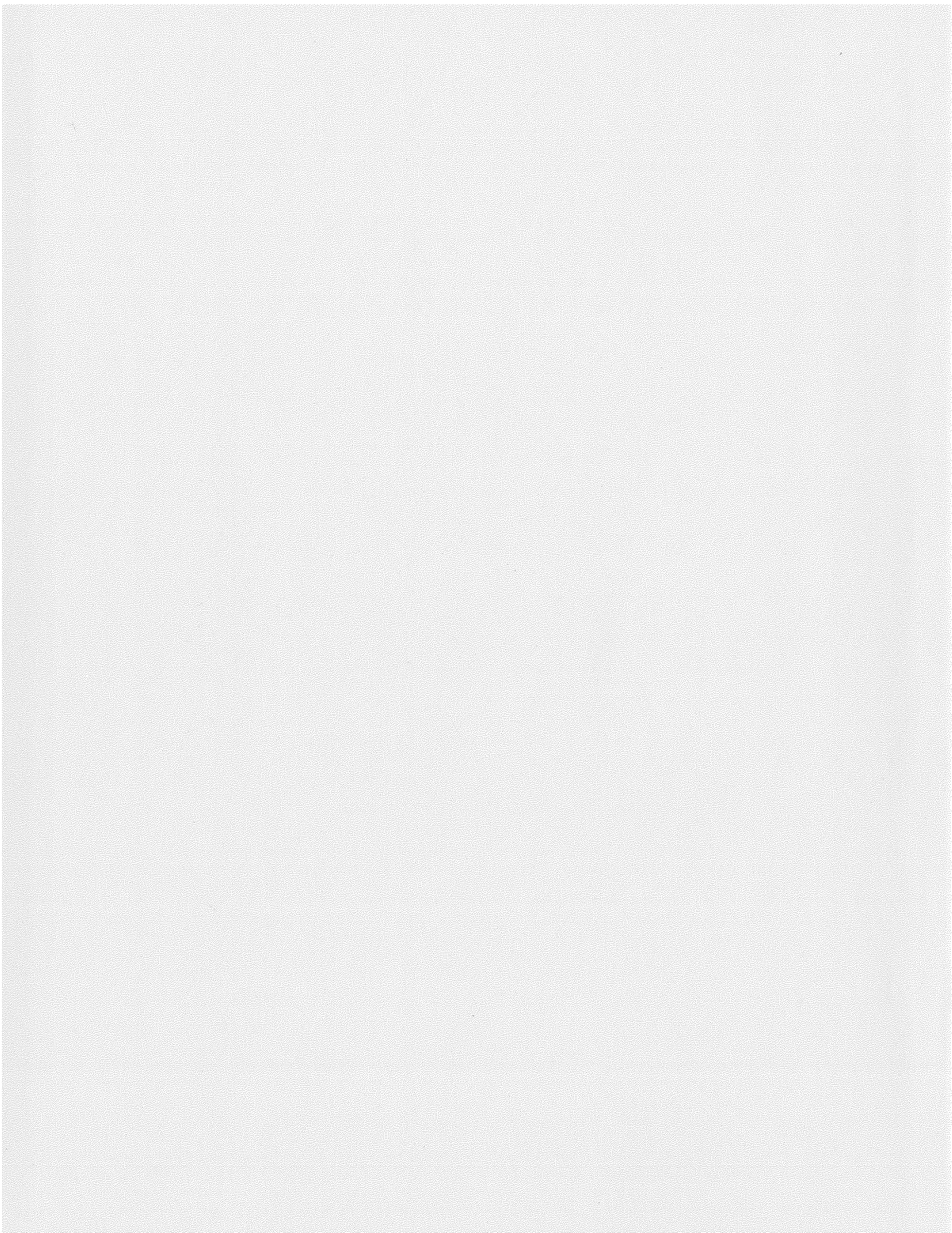

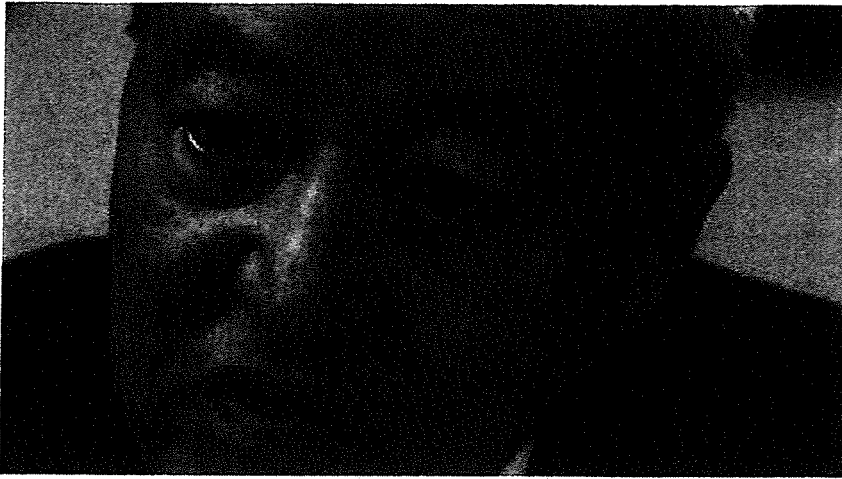

Additionally, it has been confirmed that City and County of Honolulu Prosecutor Keith M. Kaneshiro has himself received official notification via a "Target Letter" from the Special U.S. Attorney of the United States Department of Justice informing him that he is the "Target" of a federal Investigation. However, Prosecutor Kaneshiro failed to immediately notify appropriate officials of the City and County of Honolulu and/or State of Hawaii that he received this official notice, and currently chooses to remain in his position as The Prosecutor for the City and County of Honolulu, where he supervises, directs and oversees all of the cases and employees in that agency's office. 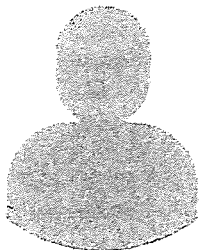

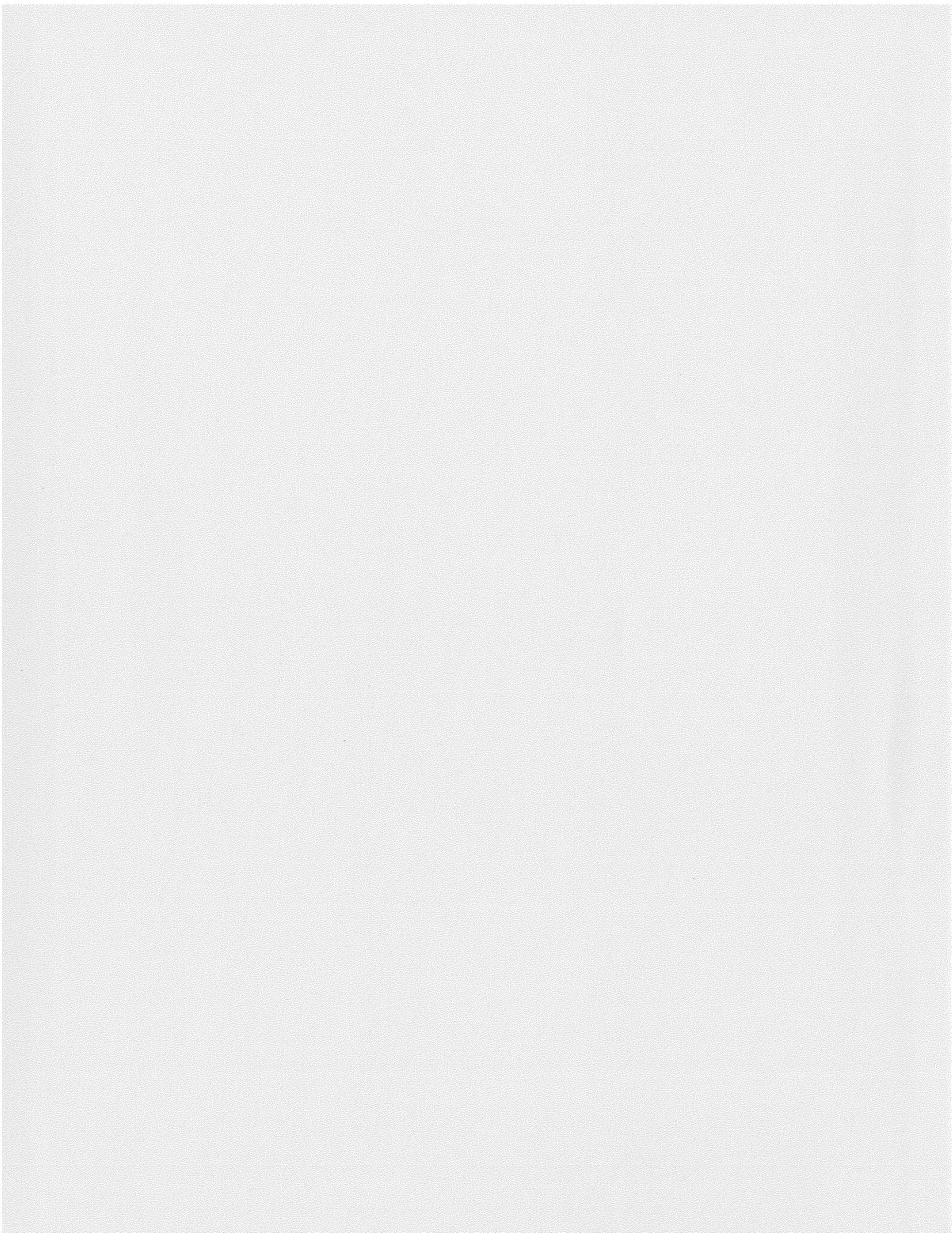

Facing federal probe, city prosecutor rejects calls to step aside, says his office runs 'effectively'

HONOLULU (HawaiiNewsNow) - For the first time Monday, embattled city Prosecutor Keith Kaneshiro responded to growing calls to step aside, saying that he was elected for four years and that his office is being run effectively.

Kaneshiro has received a target letter from the U.S. Department of Justice amid a widening public corruption probe, which has already netted lengthy indictments against ex-Police Chief Louis Kealoha and his wife, a former top-ranking deputy in Kaneshiro's office. Both have multiple federal trials scheduled for next year.

Four other police officers were also arrested in connection with the case and their trials are set for March.

On Monday, Hawaii News Now caught up with Kaneshiro as he left a budget meeting at city hall.

He has repeatedly ignored requests for comment and didn't answer most of the questions posed to him Monday.

But when asked about calls for him to step aside, Kaneshiro said that he had been elected for four years, an apparent indication that he intends to serve out his term if he's able.

He did not comment on efforts underway to impeach him, and was indignant when asked whether continuing to serve in his position was bad for the public and Honolulu's law enforcement community.

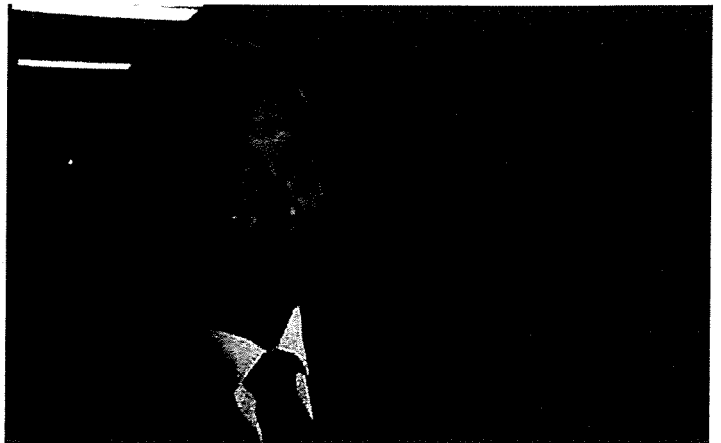

"I was elected to serve for four years," he said.

"I think it's bad for the public when you folks go on harassing me. Our office is operating. Do you have any evidence that it's not effective? It's effective."

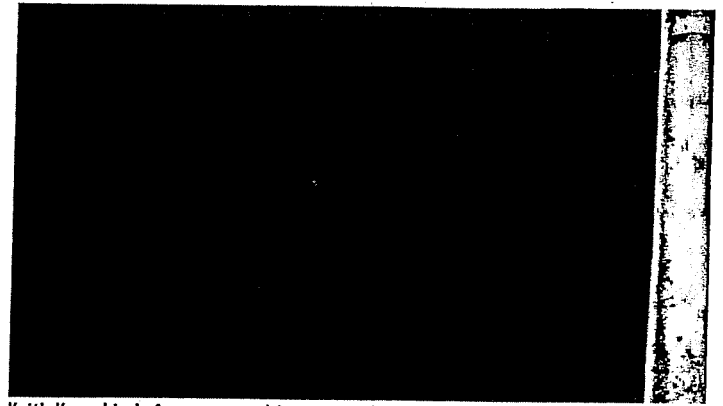

It's a move that indicates Sapolu may not be welcomed back as a result of his stepping down.

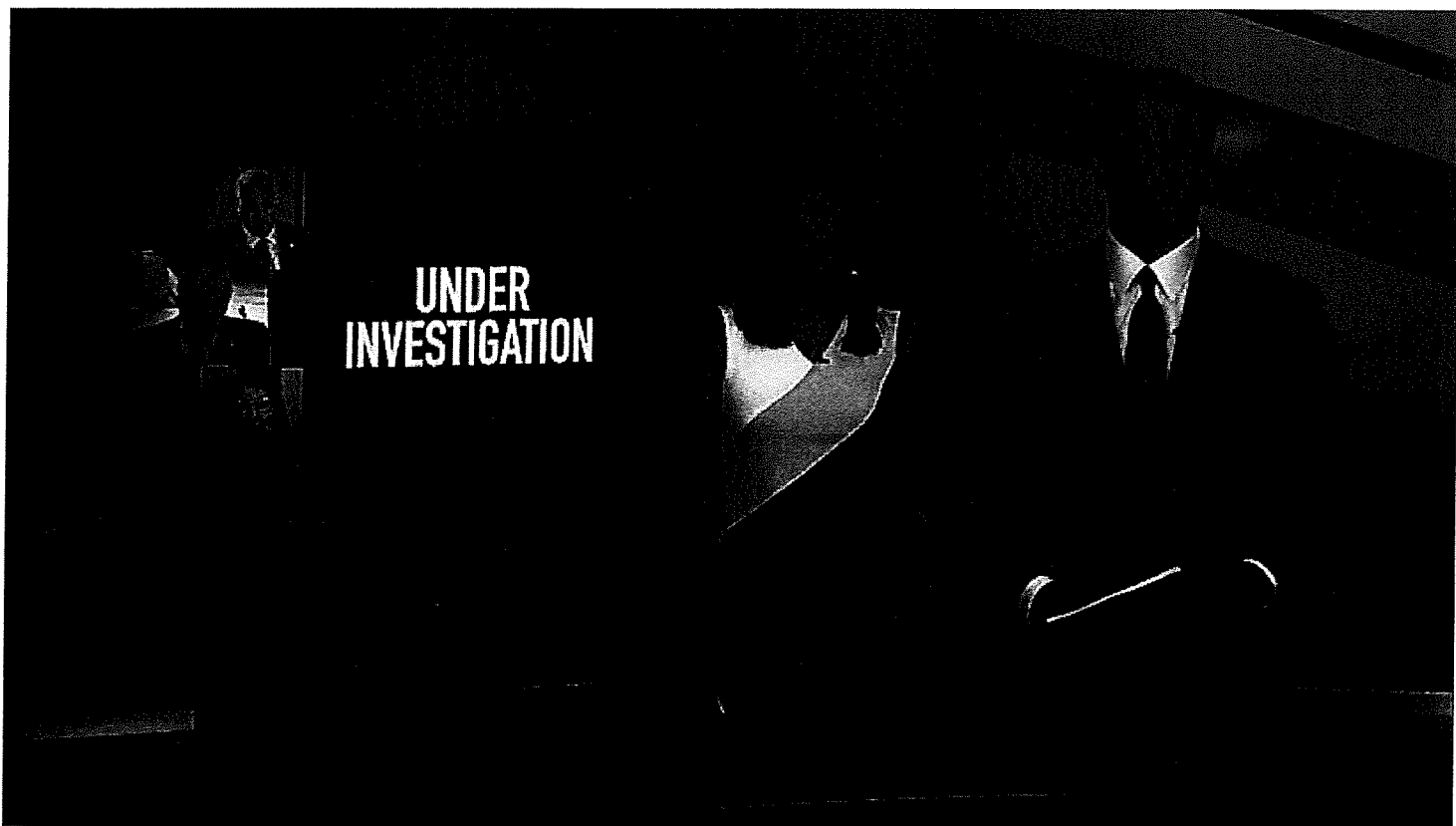

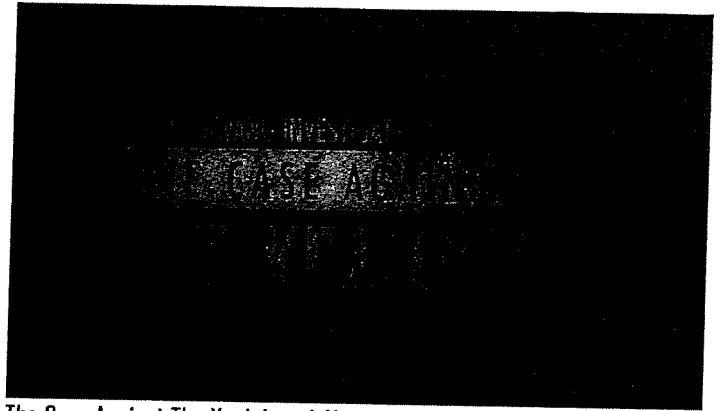

HONOLULU (HawaiiNewsNow) - City Prosecutor Keith Kaneshiro has received a Justice Department target letter informing him that he's under investigation in the federal public corruption probe that has already led to two indictments against his former top deputy, Katherine Kealoha.

Former U.S. Attorney and Honolulu prosecutor Loretta Sheehan says the development is sure to rattle the law enforcement community.

“Target letter means the grand jury has substantial evidence that you’ve engaged in criminal activity. You are going to be indicted,” Sheehan said. “A subject letter you have the opportunity to possibly not be indicted to possibly cooperate or to plead to a much lesser charge. Or if you’re completely innocent, to clear up any misunderstanding.”

Two other leading deputies, Chasid Sapolu and Janice Futa, have received Justice Department subject — but not target — letters.

Special federal prosecutor Michael Wheat is leading the public corruption probe.

His office sent target letters to ex-Honolulu Police Chief Louis Kealoha and other police officers in 2016, and all were immediately put on administrative leave. Months later, indictments came down on all of them.

Kaneshiro’s office appears to be connected to those cases, which are set to go to trial next year.

Kaneshiro is accused of lying to protect Louis Kealoha’s wife, Katherine, a former deputy city prosecutor.

Despite the new developments, Kaneshiro does not show signs of stepping down. And Mayor Kirk Caldwell told Hawaii News Now that the prosecuting attorney is elected and therefore he will not intervene.

Meanwhile, the state Attorney General’s Office said on the issue that “when compelling circumstances exist, the attorney general may supersede the county prosecutor.”

The office also said it is in contact with the city Prosecutor’s Office.

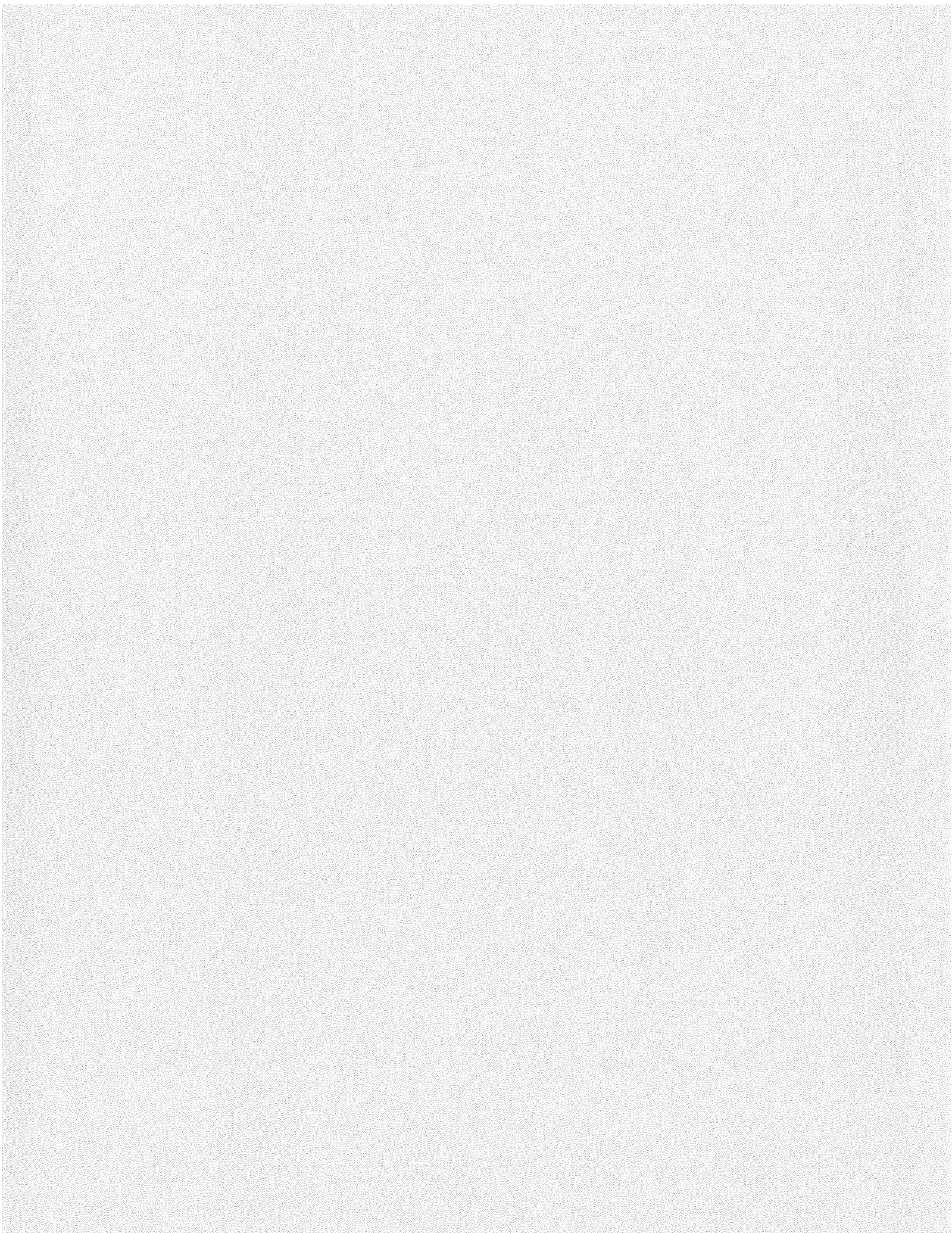
Other experts say that if Kaneshiro is indicted, a judge could require he take leave from office as a condition of his pretrial release.

But Sheehan said members of law enforcement must live up to a high standard.

“When a law enforcement officer gets a target letter, of course of course he should step down of course,” she said. “There’s a cloud over your performance at this point in time, step down.”

The federal probe into Kaneshiro apparently began when investigators learned that Katherine Kealoha allegedly convinced a judge to dismiss a speeding ticket against an electrician who was working for her.

Kaneshiro, Futa and Sapolu were called before a federal grand jury repeatedly on suspicion that they tried to cover up for Kealoha.

Section 7-119. Applicability of Charter Provisions –

Except as otherwise provided, no provision of this charter, other than those set forth in this article of the charter, shall be applicable to the department.

**ARTICLE VIII -
PROSECUTING ATTORNEY**

Section 8-101. Organization –

There shall be a department of the prosecuting attorney headed by a prosecuting attorney.

(Reso. 78-279)

Section 8-102. Term of Office –

The term of office of the prosecuting attorney shall commence at twelve o'clock meridian on the second day of January following the prosecuting attorney's election.
(Reso. 78-279, 83-357 and 86-238; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 4)

Section 8-103. Prosecuting Attorney, Qualifications –

The prosecuting attorney shall be a duly registered voter of the city, an attorney licensed to practice and in good standing before the supreme court of the state, who shall have engaged in the practice of law for at least five years, and who shall have been actively involved in criminal cases for at least three years within ten years next preceding the prosecuting attorney's election.

(Reso. 78-279 and 83-357; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 32A(12))

Section 8-104. Powers, Duties and Functions –

1. The prosecuting attorney shall:
 - (a) Attend all courts in the city and conduct, on behalf of the people, all prosecutions therein for offenses against the laws of the state and the ordinances and rules and regulations of the city.
 - (b) Prosecute offenses against the laws of the state under the authority of the attorney general of the state.

- (c) Appear in every criminal case where there is a change of venue from the courts in the city and prosecute the same in any jurisdiction to which the same is changed or removed. The expense of such proceeding shall be paid by the city.
- (d) Institute proceedings before the district judges for the arrest of persons charged with or reasonably suspected of public offenses, when the prosecuting attorney has information that any such offenses have been committed, and for that purpose, take charge of criminal cases before the district judges either in person or by a deputy or by such other prosecuting officer or in such other manner as the prosecuting attorney shall designate with approval of the district court or in accordance with statute; draw all indictments and attend before and give advice to the grand jury whenever cases are presented to it for its consideration; and investigate all matters which may properly come before the prosecuting attorney. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the conduct of proceedings by private counsel before courts of record under the direction of the prosecuting attorney.

2. The prosecuting attorney may:

- (a) Research, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding crime, crime prevention, and the criminal justice system to the governor, the legislature, the judiciary, the council, the mayor, the Honolulu police department and other criminal justice agencies, or the general public, as the prosecuting attorney deems appropriate.
- (b) Provide crime prevention training programs for law enforcement agencies, citizens, businesses, and civic groups.
- (c) Develop public education programs through various broadcast or print media, to provide the general public information that will assist citizens in developing the knowledge and confidence to prevent crime and to avoid being victims of crime.
- (d) Receive and expend financial grants, donations and other funds as permitted by the provisions of the revised charter, city ordinances and applicable city, state, and federal financial and budget policies for crime research, prevention, and education.

(Reso. 78-279, 83-357, 84-197 and 07-223)

Section 8-105. Staff –

1. The prosecuting attorney may appoint deputies, administrative or executive assistants, and other necessary staff, including investigators who shall have all the powers and privileges of a police officer of the city.

2. At the request of the prosecuting attorney, one or more officers of the police department may be detailed by the chief of police for the purpose of doing necessary investigative work, and such police officers shall continue to serve on such a detail during the pleasure of the prosecuting attorney and as long as the necessity of such detail exists.

3. The deputy who is designated as first deputy shall, during the temporary absence or disability of the prosecuting attorney, assume the power and perform the duties of the prosecuting attorney.

(Reso. 78-279 and 84-197; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 12)

Section 8-106. Vacancy in Office –

A vacancy in the office of the prosecuting attorney caused by death, resignation, removal or disqualification to hold office shall be filled as follows:

- (a) If the unexpired term is for less than one year, the office of the prosecuting attorney shall be filled by the first deputy who shall act as prosecuting attorney, or if the position of first deputy is vacant or if the first deputy does not meet the minimum qualifications for prosecuting attorney, the mayor with the approval of the council shall fill the vacancy by appointment of a person with the requisite qualifications within thirty days after the occurrence of the vacancy.
- (b) If the unexpired term is for one year or more, the vacancy shall be filled by a special election to be called by the council within ten days and to be held within one hundred twenty days after the occurrence of the vacancy. The electors of the city shall then elect a successor with requisite qualifications to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term. If any special or general election is to be held in the city after thirty days and within one hundred eighty days after the occurrence of the vacancy, then the election shall be held in conjunction with such other election. Pending the election of the prosecuting attorney, the first deputy shall act as prosecuting attorney. If the position of first deputy is vacant or if the first deputy does not meet the minimum qualifications for prosecuting attorney, the mayor, with the approval

of the council, shall fill the vacancy by appointment of a person with the requisite qualifications within thirty days after the occurrence of the vacancy. *(Reso. 78-279, 83-357 and 84-197; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 32A(11); 2016 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 14)*

Section 8-107. Removal of Prosecuting Attorney –

The prosecuting attorney may be removed by recall or impeachment as provided in Article XII of this charter.

(Reso. 78-279, 83-357 and 84-197; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 32A(13); cf. Question No. 15)

ARTICLE IX - FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION

CHAPTER 1 - BUDGETING

Section 9-101. Fiscal Year –

The fiscal year of the city shall begin on the first day of July and end on the last day of June of the succeeding year.

Section 9-102. Preparation and Submission of the Program and Annual Budget for the Executive Branch –

1. Not less than one hundred twenty days prior to the end of each fiscal year, the mayor shall prepare and submit to the council:

- (a) An operating and capital program and a statement of relationships between the operating and capital components for the ensuing six fiscal years for the executive branch.
- (b) An operating and capital budget and a statement of relationships between operating and capital items for the ensuing fiscal year for the executive branch.
- (c) An accompanying message and necessary proposed ordinances for the ensuing fiscal year. The proposed budget ordinances shall be in a form prescribed by law.
- (d) Such other information as may be requested by the council.

ARTICLE X - SPECIAL ASSESSMENT IMPROVEMENTS

Section 10-101. Improvements by Special Assessments –

Improvements by special assessment shall be as provided by law. No changes, however, shall be made by the council regarding any matter under the control of the board of water supply without the prior approval of its board.

ARTICLE XI - STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

Section 11-101. Declaration of Policy –

Elected and appointed officers and employees shall demonstrate by their example the highest standards of ethical conduct, to the end that the public may justifiably have trust and confidence in the integrity of government. They, as agents of public purpose, shall hold their offices or positions for the benefit of the public, shall recognize that the public interest is their primary concern, and shall faithfully discharge the duties of their offices regardless of personal considerations.

Section 11-102. Conflicts of Interest –

1. No elected or appointed officer or employee shall:
 - (a) Solicit or accept any gift, directly or indirectly, whether in the form of money, loan, gratuity, favor, service, thing or promise, or in any other form, under circumstances in which it can reasonably be inferred that the gift is intended to influence the officer or employee in the performance of such person's official duties. Nothing herein shall preclude the solicitation or acceptance of lawful contributions for election campaigns.
 - (b) Disclose confidential information gained by reason of such person's office or position or use such information for the personal gain or benefit of anyone.
 - (c) Engage in any business transaction or activity or have a financial interest, direct or indirect, which is incompatible with the proper discharge of such person's official duties or which may tend to impair the independence of judgment in the performance of such person's official duties.

ARTICLE XII - RECALL AND IMPEACHMENT

CHAPTER 1 - RECALL OF ELECTED OFFICERS

Section 12-101. Recall of the Mayor –

The mayor may be removed by recall which shall be initiated upon petition signed by duly registered voters equal in number to at least ten percent of the total voters registered at the last regular mayoral election. Signatures from any one council district, as provided by this charter for the election of councilmembers, in excess of forty percent of the total number required on the petition shall not be counted.

(Reso. 83-357; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question Nos. 15 and 32A(9))

Section 12-102. Recall of a District Councilmember –

A district councilmember may be removed by recall which shall be initiated upon petition signed by duly registered voters of the council district equal in number to at least ten percent of the total voters registered in such councilmember's district in the last regular council election held in the district.

(Reso. 83-357; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question Nos. 15 and 32A(4))

Section 12-103. Recall Petition; Recall Election –

The recall petition shall require each signing voter's signature, address, council district, and the date of signing. Signatures on a recall petition may be on separate sheets but each sheet shall have appended to it the affidavit of the person who circulated that sheet of the petition, that to the best of the affiant's knowledge and belief the persons whose signatures appear on the sheet are duly registered voters of the city, that they signed with full knowledge of the contents of the petition, and that their residences are correctly given.

A recall petition shall be tendered in its entirety for filing with the city clerk with a transmittal letter to the city clerk. Upon filing of such petition with the city clerk, the city clerk shall examine it to determine whether it contains a sufficient number of apparently genuine signatures of registered voters. The city clerk may question the genuineness of any signature or signatures appearing on the recall petition and if the city clerk finds that any such signature or signatures are not genuine, the city clerk

shall disregard them in determining whether the petition contains a sufficient number of signatures. The city clerk shall also disregard any signature dated more than sixty days before the petition was tendered for filing. The city clerk shall eliminate any sheet of the petition which is not accompanied by the required affidavit of the person who circulated that sheet of the petition. The invalidity of any sheet of the petition shall not affect the validity of the petition if a sufficient number of signatures remains after eliminating such an invalid sheet. The city clerk shall complete the examination of the petition within twenty working days after the date of the filing with the city clerk and shall thereupon certify the petition or reject the petition.

As soon as the city clerk has certified the recall petition, the city clerk shall notify the elected officer that the examination has been completed and the petition has been certified. Upon receipt of such notice, the elected officer may resign from office and thereupon the recall proceedings shall terminate.

If the elected officer does not resign from office within ten days after notice of the certification of such petition shall have been given to such elected officer, the city clerk shall arrange a recall election. If a general or special city or state election is to be held not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days after the ten days have expired, the recall question shall be placed before the voters at such an election. Otherwise a special recall election shall be fixed for a date not earlier than thirty days nor later than ninety days after ten days have expired. The elected officer may resign at any time prior to the recall election and thereupon the election shall not be held.

The following question shall be presented to each voter in a recall: "Shall (name of elected officer) be recalled and removed from the office of (title of office)?"

If a majority of the registered voters who vote on the question at a recall election shall vote "Yes," the elected officer shall be deemed recalled and removed from office. Otherwise, the said officer shall remain in office.

No person, who has been removed from elected office or who has resigned from such an office after a recall petition directed to the said person has been filed, shall be eligible for election or appointment to any office of the city within two years after said person's removal or resignation.

No recall petition shall be filed against an elected officer within the first or the last year of the officer's term or within six months after an unsuccessful recall election against such officer.

Section 12-104. Recall of the Prosecuting Attorney –

The prosecuting attorney may be removed by recall which shall be initiated upon petition signed by registered voters equal in number to at least ten percent of the total voters registered in the last regular election of the prosecuting attorney.

Signatures from any one council district, as provided by this charter for the election of councilmembers, in excess of forty percent of the total number required on the petition shall not be counted.

(1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question Nos. 15 and 32A(13))

**CHAPTER 2 -
IMPEACHMENT OF ELECTED OFFICERS**

Section 12-201. Impeachment of the Mayor –

The mayor may be impeached for malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office. The courts of the State of Hawaii shall have jurisdiction as provided by applicable law over any proceeding for the removal of the mayor who may be charged on any of the foregoing grounds. The charges shall be set forth in writing in a petition for impeachment signed by not less than five thousand duly registered voters of the city, and said signatures shall be necessary only for the purpose of filing the petition. The petition having once been filed, hearings shall be held on all such charges.

(Reso. 83-357; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question Nos. 14 and 32A(9); Reso. 08-135)

Section 12-202. Impeachment of a Councilmember –

Any councilmember may be impeached for malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office or for interference with the performance of the duties of any officer or employee in any executive agency of the city government. The courts of the State of Hawaii shall have jurisdiction as provided by applicable law over any proceeding for the removal of a councilmember who may be charged on any of the foregoing grounds. The charges shall be set forth in writing in a petition for impeachment signed by not less than one thousand duly registered voters of the council district for the removal of a councilmember, and said signatures shall be necessary only for the purpose of filing the petition. The petition having once been filed, hearings shall be held on all such charges.

(Reso. 83-357; 1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question Nos. 14 and 32A(4); Reso. 08-135)

Section 12-203. Impeachment of the Prosecuting Attorney –

The prosecuting attorney may be impeached for malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office. The courts of the State of Hawaii shall have jurisdiction as provided by applicable law over any proceeding for the removal of the prosecuting attorney who may be charged on any of the foregoing grounds. The charges shall be set forth in writing in a petition for impeachment signed by not less than five hundred duly registered voters of the city, and said signatures shall be necessary only for the purpose of filing the petition. The petition having once been filed, hearings shall be held on all such charges.

(1992 General Election Charter Amendment Question No. 32A(13); cf. Question No. 15; Reso. 08-135)

ARTICLE XIII - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 13-101. Definitions –

1. The term "agency" shall mean any office, department, board, commission or other governmental unit of the city, excluding the council and its offices and any commission excluded by the provisions of this charter.

2. The term "executive agency" shall mean any agency of the executive branch of the city government, excluding the board of water supply.

3. The term "employee" shall mean any person, except an officer, employed by the city or any agency thereof, but the term shall not include an independent contractor.

4. Except as otherwise provided in this charter, the term "officer" shall include the following:

(a) Members of the council, the mayor, the prosecuting attorney and the managing director.

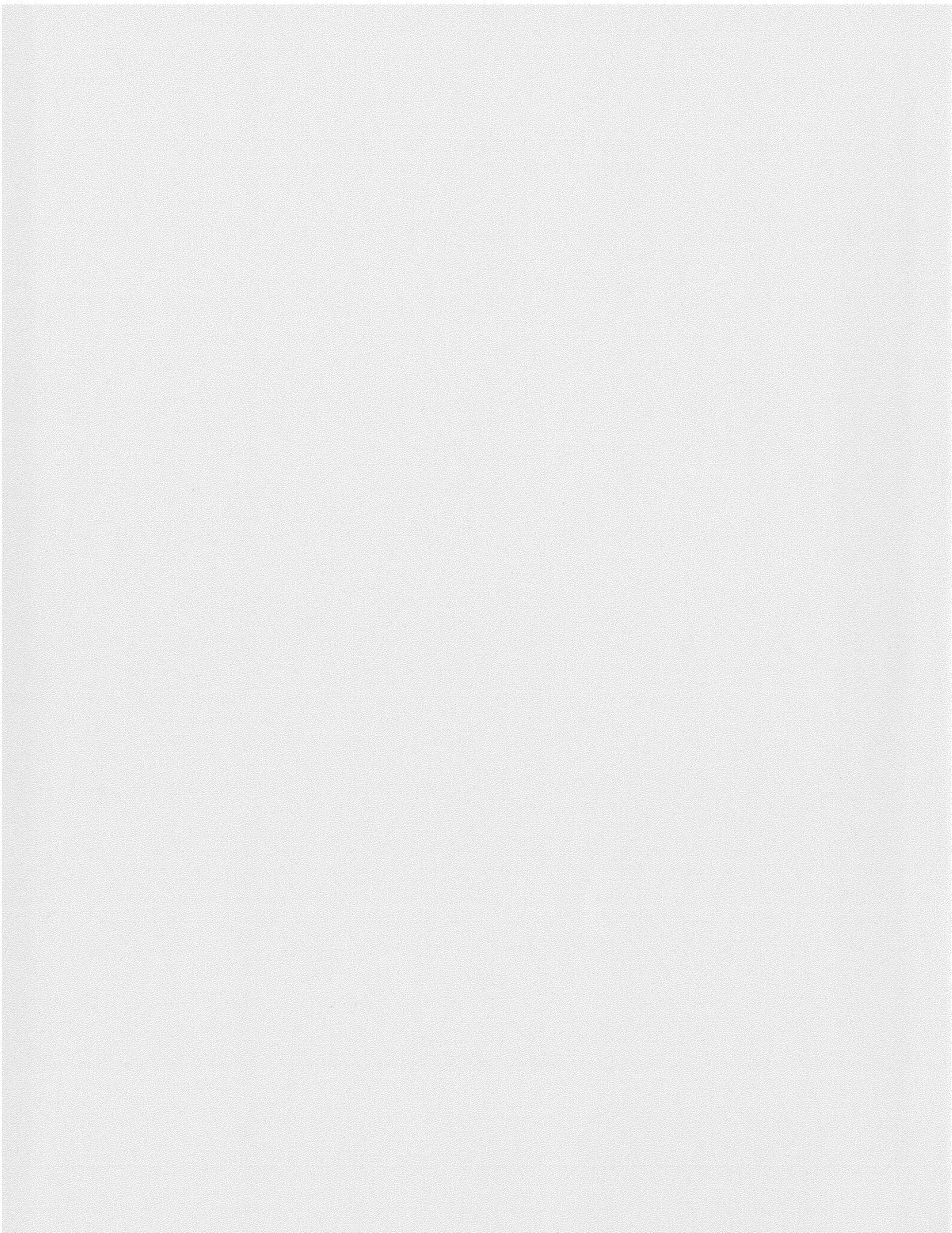
(b) Any person appointed as administrative head of any agency of the city or as a member of any board or commission.

(c) Any person appointed by a board or commission as the administrative head of such agency.

(d) The first deputy, any other deputy, or a division chief appointed by the administrative head of any agency of the city.

(e) Deputies of the corporation counsel and the prosecuting attorney.

MEMORANDUM OF LAW IN SUPPORT OF PETITION

I. INTRODUCTION

This is a petition to impeach the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu, Keith Kaneshiro (“Prosecutor Kaneshiro”), brought pursuant to Section 12-203 of the Honolulu City Charter (applicable provisions of the Honolulu City Charter are attached as Exhibit “4”). The Honolulu City Charter states in Section 11-101 (Exhibit 4):

Elected and appointed officers and employees shall demonstrate by their example the highest standards of ethical conduct, to the end that the public may justifiably have trust and confidence in the integrity of government. They, as agents of public purpose, shall hold their offices or positions for the benefit of the public, shall recognize that the public interest is their primary concern, and shall faithfully discharge the duties of their offices regardless of personal considerations.

Prosecutor Kaneshiro has received a target letter from the U.S. Dept. of Justice which is part of a “widening public corruption probe”. At the very least fact that he is the target of a federal investigation requires him to remove himself from office, pending the final resolution of the case. If he remains in office while the investigation continues, there will be questions about his conduct from this day forward that will certainly affect the public’s trust and confidence in the integrity of government, and he should be impeached for the reasons set forth in the petition.

II. AUTHORITY FOR IMPEACHMENT

Section 12-203 of the Honolulu City Charter states:

The prosecuting attorney may be impeached for malfeasance, misfeasance or nonfeasance in office. The courts of the State of Hawaii shall have jurisdiction as provided by applicable law over any proceeding for the removal of the prosecuting attorney who may be charged on any of the foregoing grounds. The charges shall be set forth in writing in a petition for impeachment signed by not less than five hundred duly registered voters of the city, and said signatures shall be necessary only for the purpose of filing the petition. The petition having once been filed, hearings shall be held on all such charges.

There is nothing more in the Honolulu City Charter that outlines the procedure for impeachment.¹ HRS § 603-21.5(a)(4) states: “The several circuit courts shall have jurisdiction, except as otherwise expressly provided by statute, of: (4) Actions for impeachment of county officers who are subject to impeachment.”² Rule 81(b)(11) of the Hawaii Rules of Civil Procedure states: “These rules shall apply to the following proceedings except insofar as and to

¹ The impeachment criteria for public officials allowing removing for “malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance” has existed in Honolulu at least since 1925. In the Hawaii Supreme Court case of *Irwin v. Cunha*, 29 Haw. 21 (1926), reconsideration denied 29 Haw. 83, the Hawaii Supreme Court was asked to rule on whether a city supervisor should be subjected to impeachment for missing several meetings of the board of supervisors. The Court noted that R. L. 1925, section 1783 read: “Any city and county officer may be removed for malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance or maladministration in office. The board of supervisors shall constitute a board of impeachment for the trial of any elected officer of the city and county (except members of the board of supervisors), who may be charged with malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance or maladministration in office by not less than one hundred legal voters within the city and county. Such officer shall be given an opportunity to defend himself against the same. The board of impeachment shall have power to hear and determine the charge, and if the same be sustained, to remove from office the officer so charged, and to fill the vacancy so occurring by the appointment of some qualified person to said office for the unexpired term thereof.” 29 Haw. at 22, 23. The record of the attempted impeachment of former council member Rene Mansho in 2002 shows that the petition for impeachment was first brought before the Hawaii Supreme Court and later dismissed as moot because council member Mansho resigned (See, Exhibit “5”). That petition was brought under the prior version of the Honolulu City Charter, which allowed proceedings to be brought directly to the Hawaii Supreme Court.

² Subsection (4) was added in 2008 as part of Act 107 of the 2008 Hawaii State Legislature.

the extent that they are inconsistent with specific statutes of the State or rules of court relating to such proceedings: (11) Proceedings for the impeachment of a county officer.”

Thus this petition for impeachment must be brought as a civil matter before the circuit courts for consideration.

III. STANDARD FOR DETERMINING IMPEACHMENT

Having established that this petition is properly before the circuit court, the next question is what standard should this court follow. The Honolulu City Charter requires only a showing of: “malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office”. “Malfeasance”, according to Black’s Law Dictionary (BLACK’S LAW DICTIONARY 862 (5th ed.1979), states that malfeasance can mean: “wrongful conduct that affects, interrupts or interferes with the performance of official duties.” The New Hampshire Supreme Court in *Williams v. City of Dover*, 130 N.H. 527 (1988), stated that malfeasance is, more generally, “the doing of an act which ought not to be done”, citing *Quinn v. Concord*, 108 N.H. 242, 247, 233 A.2d 106, 109-110 (1967). “Misfeasance” is defined by Black’s as: “The improper performance of some act which a man may lawfully do. The improper doing of an act which a person might lawfully do.” (BLACK’S LAW DICTIONARY 862 (5th ed.1979). Nonfeasance has defined by our Hawaii Supreme Court in *Dejetley v. Kaho`ohalahala*, 122 Haw. 251, 226 P.3d 421 (2010). There the Court defined nonfeasance as respect to public officials as a substantial failure to perform a required legal duty. (122 Haw. at 257-258, citing *Lee v. Corregedore*, 83 Haw. 154, 174 n.1, 925 P.2d 324, 344 n.1 (1996). Nonfeasance implies the failure to act where a duty to act existed. 122 Haw. at 258, citing *Baccus v. Ameripride Servs., Inc.*, 145 Idaho 246, 250, 179 P.3d 309 (2008).

IV. ARGUMENT


While the process may not be clear³, what is clear that based upon the Honolulu City Charter that Prosecutor Kaneshiro has a duty under the City Charter to perform: “the highest standards of ethical conduct, to the end that the public may justifiably have trust and confidence in the integrity of government.” As the city prosecutor he is responsible to act: “on behalf of the people” in “all prosecutions therein for offenses against the laws of the state and the ordinances and rules and regulations of the city.” (Section 8-104, Honolulu City Charter). Prosecutor Kaneshiro has received a target letter from the U.S. Dept. of Justice, and has two deputies that have received “subject” letters (See, Exhibit 4). At the very least the investigation creates a perception that the city prosecutor and two deputies are being investigated for public corruption. While the news coverage of these events has been replete with speculation of criminal defense attorneys and experts that the investigation creates a taint on any prosecution that these individuals touch, the simple fact of the matter is that it creates a defense in any criminal case that the prosecuting attorney handling the matter was dishonest. This is similar to the defense proffered by a criminal defendant in *U.S. v. Henthorn*, 931 F.2d 29 (1991), where the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals held that if there was evidence in a law enforcement witness’ personnel file that showed “evidence of perjurious conduct or other like dishonesty”, that this should be disclosed to the defense. Likewise here, if Prosecutor Kaneshiro, or his deputies for that matter, were allowed to remain in office, every single prosecution that they would be involved in would be brought into question. Whether there is a federal indictment or a conviction is not the question. The question is whether the very existence of a federal investigation on public

³ An attempt to make the impeachment process clear, at least for state officials, was done in the 2018 Hawaii State Legislature, with the introduction of S.B. No. 2577. Unfortunately this bill failed, but the bill attempted to institute proceedings for impeachment because the: “current law is absent the constitutionally required statutory provisions establishing the causes, manner, and procedure for removal of the governor, lieutenant governor, and appointive officers by impeachment.”

corruption centering on the Honolulu city prosecutor breaches the trust that the public should have in the: “trust and confidence in the integrity of government.” This is not just a lower level deputy that we are speaking of, this is the individual that the Honolulu City Charter states is empowered to act: “on behalf of the people” in “all prosecutions therein for offenses against the laws of the state”. At a minimum, Prosecutor Kaneshiro should have resigned or taken leave (as one of his deputies did), to avoid any appearance that would affect future prosecutions by the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney. It is this failure to resign or take leave while the investigation is pending that constitutes malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office.

Petitioner has obtained more than 500 signatures, as required by the Honolulu City Charter, agreeing with the impeachment of Prosecutor Kaneshiro. The petition meets the requirements of the Honolulu City Charter stating a case for malfeasance, misfeasance or non-feasance in office. Given the gravity of the charges and the duty imposed upon Prosecutor Kaneshiro by the Honolulu City Charter, this court should grant Petitioner’s request that Prosecutor Kaneshiro be impeached.




