Dear Charles,

The Libertarian Party of Michigan is currently engaged in a petition drive to achieve ballot status for 1980. Legally, we need to collect 18,333 valid signatures within a six month period ending no later than May 5, 1980. Accomplishing this only gets us onto a primary ballot for August, 1980, in which we need .3% of the vote to qualify for the general election ballot. The failure of the party to gather enough signatures in 1978, combined with the obstacle of the August primary, has made some Michigan libertarians skeptical of our chances for success.

The LP of Michigan has decided that the best strategy for overcoming these obstacles is to run a high speed petition drive. Our goal is to complete the drive by the end of 1979 after gathering at least 23,000 signatures. To complete the drive so quickly, we need to rely heavily on paid petitioners and on outside money to pay for them. The national Clark Committee is helping us substantially, and the drive is now in full swing. Any financial assistance from you will be well used and much appreciated.

The following information on what offices Libertarian candidates in Michigan may be expected to run for might be of interest to you.

In Michigan, once ballot status is achieved by a minor party, it is easy to become a candidate for office. No further petitioning is required; one need only file, fill out some papers, and pay a small fee. For this reason, there were sixty eight Libertarian Party candidates for office on the ballot in Michigan in 1976, which was the last year in which the party had ballot status. (The current more restrictive ballot access law, requiring .3% of the vote in a primary, did not become effective until after the 1976 elections.) Of these candidates, fifty one, or 75%, were running for state or local offices, and seventeen, or 25%, were running for federal offices. We expect a similar ratio between state-local and federal office seekers to run as Libertarians in 1980. A list of the 1976 offices and candidates is enclosed.

Also enclosed is a budget for the ballot drive, geared toward the collection of 24,000 signatures. Because 23,000 is our minimum goal, we plan to end with closer to 25,000 than 23,000.

We are paying for part of the ballot drive through the Michigan Clark for President Committee. But because assistance from you might be for helping our candidates for state and local offices get on the ballot, a contribution to the Libertarian Party of Michigan Ballot Drive Fund could be more appropriate. Any money contributed to this Fund will be used only for our efforts to obtain Libertarian Party ballot status in Michigan for 1980.
