Bullying

Definition: IC 20-33-8-2 "BULLYING" is overt, unwanted, repeated acts or gestures, including verbal or written communications in any manner, physical acts committed, aggression, or any other behaviors that are committed by a student or group of students against another student with the intent to harass, ridicule, humiliate, intimidate or harm the targeted student and create for the hostile student an objectively hactila anvironment
