
#### **Pretrial Statistics**

#### **SUMMARY**

The Pretrial Services Department generated 2,663 Public Safety Assessments (PSA's) for persons arrested in the Cleveland Municipal Court's jurisdiction from September 24, 2018 – March 24, 2019 for misdemeanor and felony offenses. Using the Laura and John Arnold Foundation's tool, the department generated 1,650 (62%) felony PSA's and 1,013 (38%) misdemeanor PSA's during the six-month period.

The Judges ordered pretrial services for 521 Defendants. The majority of the pretrial conditions of release were for Global Positioning System (GPS) monitoring and Supervision Only.

The overall occurrence of Failure to Appear (FTA) for cases referred to Pretrial Services was 11.3%. However, only 33 of the 59 Defendants remained capias as of March 15, 2019, reflecting a net FTA rate of 6.3%.







### **CONDITIONS OF RELEASE**

The majority of the pretrial conditions of release were for Global Positioning System (GPS) monitoring and Supervision Only. Supervision includes regular contact with the Defendant, court date reminders, and ongoing reviews of the Defendant's criminal activity.

At arraignment, a total of 306 (52.8%) GPS monitoring devices were ordered for Defendants. Supervision Only was ordered for 182 (31.4) defendants. A smaller percentage has also been required to submit to substance abuse testing (72/12.5%) and other electronic monitoring devices (19/3.3%).



#### **APPEARANCE RATE**

Prior to the implementation of Pretrial Services, Cleveland Municipal Court had a failure to appear (FTA) rate of approximately 30%. Since the launch of Pretrial Services, the FTA rate has significantly reduced. As of March 15, 2019, 59 cases (11.3%) referred to court supervised release have had at least one occurrence where the Defendant failed to appear for a scheduled court date reflecting an overall Appearance Rate of 89%. Twenty-six (26) Defendants reconnected with the Court. As of March 15, 2019, 33 Defendants remain capias reflecting an increase in the net Appearance Rate to 93.7%.
