



b. Article 133 - Conduct unbecoming an officer and gentleman. Conduct violative of this article is action or behavior in an official capacity which, in dishonoring or disgracing the person as an officer, seriously compromises the officer's character as a gentleman, or action or behavior in an unofficial or private capacity which, in dishonoring or disgracing the officer personally, seriously compromises the person's standing as an officer. There are certain moral attributes common to the ideal officer and perfect gentleman, a lack of which is indicated by acts of dishonesty, unfair dealing, indecency, indecorum, lawlessness, injustice, or cruelty.


Examples of offenses: Instances of violation of the article include knowingly making a false official statement; dishonorable failure to pay a debt; cheating on an exam; opening and reading a letter of another without authority; using insulting or defamatory language to another officer in that officer's presence or about that officer to other military persons; being drunk and disorderly in a public place; public association with known prostitutes; committing or attempting to commit a crime involving moral turpitude; and failing without good cause to support the officer's family.



6. The primary focus of the investigation was to ascertain the validity of the allegation levied against LtCol by b (6.6) (c) through a thorough analysis of all evidence surrounding the events of 21 Oct 2018 and 23 Dec 2018. Both parties provided a large volume of supporting material in the form of text streams, emails, written statements and other forms of correspondence that outline the b (6) (b) (7) (c)

good order and discipline, this broader context is applicable to the conduct of the service member alone since he is the one under the authority and jurisdiction of the UCMJ. The investigating officer was also careful not to interfere with any of the civilian judicial proceedings occurring in the system, nor the Marine Corps Installations West (b) (6) (b) (7)(C)

Gentlemen,

I have been forced to stop and reflect. We almost lost another Marine to suicide over the past few days. His struggle is not over, and our support on his long road ahead remains vital. I send this email to you all, because I think it is necessary to capture the things that went right this time. I do not claim to have the solution, but I share my observations because I believe it may help save more of our brothers who are in distress. I fear more are coming in the months and years ahead. I also confess that I still do not know all of the details or the reasons.

The one we lost:

- -One year ago, as most of you know, we lost a great Marine to suicide.
- -I didn't even know he was in trouble. I offer most of us didn't because all of us had PCS'd or EAS'd.
- -His suicide came four years after our combat tour together (I do not know if our time together was the root of his suffering).
- -Alcohol abuse led to a DUI, NJP, and inability to re-enlist. Suicide followed.

The one we saved (for now):

- -He has been facing distress five years after our combat tour.
- -PCS has enabled separation from those who knew him best, and could rapidly detect distress.
- -Alcohol abuse has lead to a series of unfortunate personal mistakes that I believe contribute the Marine's sentiment of hopelessness.
- -Drunken texts were sent to a Marine brother who identified the distress and potential tragedy. Despite not being on active duty, that Marine traveled across North Carolina driving all night to get to his friend on CLNC. He further triggered a redundant response that alerted several exemplary Marine SNCO's, all serving in different units on CLNC, who dropped everything without hesitation to find the Marine in distress.
- -The Marine in distress realized he was not alone when two of his peers came to his side and were reinforced by SNCO's from his 2010 chain of command. Those who were able to respond safeguarded the Marine in distress and facilitated the proper medical response.

 -This is what went right in this case: a Marine who is now in the civilian sector identified the distress. Because he is still connected with his chain of command from the past via cell phones and social media, he was able to trigger a redundant response that resulted in the safeguarding of the Marine and access to medical care. The response was a redundant network of Marines who truly cared for each other across all ranks.

Observations:

- -Personal despair is manifesting itself several years after our combat deployment and after we have all dispersed due to PCS or EAS.
- -Wounds are surfacing at a time when we are not postured to identify them (and realistically it is very difficult to do so... I can't stay in daily communication with the thousands of Marines I have served with in 15 years).
- -It may be difficult for present unit leadership to recognize modified behavior, misconduct, or lack of discipline as manifestations of emotional distress (General described this to us recently as having a "clear sight picture" and connecting all

the dots). I cannot fault commanders for maintaining good order and discipline, but the lack of a broader history may detract from the ability to properly identify the wounds that are being manifested.

-My opinion is that Marines are using alcohol to (incorrectly) self-medicate. Alcohol abuse is sending our brothers into a spiral of self-destruction (DUI's, immoral behavior that destroy families, etc). The negative consequences result in further despair and hopelessness.

-Between these two cases and a few more in which I have approached Marines directly via Facebook about some of their alarming posts, I now realize that some may be unwilling to open up or share with me out of respect. One Marine assured me he had everything under control. I am forced to consider that potentially the last thing some Marines want to do is to fail or appear vulnerable in the eyes of their leadership (present or past). This pain masking and desire for infallibility is an obstacle for all of us as engaged leaders who genuinely care about our men, specially given post PCS circumstances.

Opportunities, Thoughts, and Potential Solutions:

-I hate to say it, but social media is a great way to stay connected with Marines over long-term periods. My Marines can't seem to hold onto my cell phone or email, but they sure know how to find me on Facebook (it's the only reason I'm still on there). I believe this is an opportunity. I'm also learning that Facebook is only used by "our generation". Younger generations are using new forms of social media (Instagram, Tumbler, I can't remember the other one-I confess I don't even know what these are). In any case, we need to be aware of how our young Marines are communicating and how we can influence them positively.

-Smart phones are great at keeping "phonebooks" with old numbers. It seems like most people are keeping the same number for long periods of time. This is an opportunity. -In regards to social media, despite the "libo-incident" sub-culture of many social media military groups (F'N Boot, Terminal Lance, etc), these groups have a fierce loyalty to brotherhood and they provide a commendable, consistent message to veterans about suicide prevention. This too is an opportunity.

-I believe we must continue to strengthen our network. Despite our genuine interests in our Marines, we may not be given access to their inner demons. Our network across all ranks is the only solution. Those who are confided in, those who are in the inner circle for every individual, must be able to serve as sensors that activate the redundant response by all of us whether we are on active duty or not. The brotherhood that has been created by our time in the Corps together enables this.


-Afte took his life, I witnessed a humbling response by our "not-so young anymore" Marines. It was bottom-up. Marines reconnected and realized we could not let another brother take his life. Again, many if not most, are now in the civilian sector. I believe a couple of our guys have been safeguarded during dark hours as a result of this network. This Facebook network is helping. The worst thing that could happen is for it to be broken by making it a Top-Down requirement. I share this because I believe this is a best practice that may help in other units if it doesn't already exist.


-Realizing that some may be unwilling to open up to more senior leaders, perhaps the most effective response we can provide is to alert his those who may be in the "inner circle" who will gladly check on their buddy.


-We need to teach our Marines to drink and be men. I believe the club system use to do that. I remember a day when I was forced to go to the club, have a beer or two, and taught to remain a professional and conduct myself like a man at all times. We have lost this mentorship and education because we are trying to prevent drunkenness and misconduct. The clubs should be the place we can take advantage of this opportunity. It will be a process, and not an event.



Sending it back to you. I've reflected back on the points you made quite a bit over the years and used them while talking to the Marines. Coming off a very non-kinetic deployment to Afghanistan recently, I glossed it over but dismissed the feeling I had to share it with the company. As we all PCS'd and moved in different directions, I handed off the company social media page and departed ways. I don't know where that page is now and it was more to keep the families informed while we were deployed. With the tragic incident taking place with Cpl

As for the most recent tragedy. Cpl was an 0311 who worked in the Armory in Hatrs Plt. Charlie Co. He deployed to to an unfaithful wife. Upon his return, he made some poor decisions (breaking his wife's cell phone) and placed under a lengthy investigation for domestic violence. During the work up, he was counseled by myself and my XO about his off duty activities regarding alcohol. Much like was a stellar performer at work and portrayed his alcohol consumption as just hanging with the Marines. To my knowledge, he never had an alcohol related incident before my arrival to Charlie Co. and had none while I was there. We deployed to (b) (b) (c) will and he was placed in a rifle platoon and was an outstanding performer. He returned with the XO and I on ADVON and did a phenomenal job in the armory. We had a brief discussion prior to my departure where he seemed on the up and up and getting his life together. A few months ago Cp vas FAP'd over to SOI East to work as 1/2 prepared for their upcoming deployment that I don't think he had the time to make. After a short time at SOI, he committed suicide (pending details) due to it happening yesterday.

I figured I would outline the similarities in his situation with the Marines we lost and the ones that we've had successful intervention with. Going forward, I think it will be beneficial to share the details of your points


with the Marines from Charlie 1/2. We've hit that time period in our redeployment where Marines are departing and are no longer surrounded by their Marine family. I feel this could become a common occurrence if we don't get ahead of it. I hope the social media connection coupled with your points has a positive impact on the boys and we are able to have success like we did with Sgt 100 (100 m).
