#### FILM INDUSTRY STATE-BY-STATE GUIDE TO WOMEN'S BODILY AUTONOMY

#### Introduction

Following the passage of a number of draconian attacks on a pregnant person's right to choose in 2019, including those in states in which the motion picture and television industries conduct significant business, it has become apparent that those in our industry need to be able to make informed choices on where they will and will not work. This guide attempts to provide a snapshot of the current state of laws across the nation and serve as a quick-reference for actors, producers, directors, studios and other parties in deciding where it is safe for women to work.

#### About the Guide

This guide looks at both current (June 2019) top-line incentives offered by each state (as guideed by filmproductioncapital.com), as well as some of the laws that would impact pregnant people who film in those states. Based on the laws and NOT factoring in the financials, each state is then color-coded on a traffic light system.

**GREEN** is Least Threatened

**YELLOW** is Threatened

**RED** is Most Threatened

Laws were sourced from NARAL Pro Choice America and Ballotpedia primarily. Where those sources differed (as is to be expected in a continually shifting legal landscape), other sources were used.

## What this guide is NOT

This guide was developed with the notion that most of those making use of it in determining whether to travel to a state for work. With that, the writers attempted to look at the factors that would most affect those individuals and not the individuals residing in the state. As a result, it does not account for several factors that would be important to those residents, including limitations on providers, Medicaid or other public payments for health, and other limitations to abortion services. These factors can result in significant problems including race-based bias, income bias, and more. In no way should a "green" rating be interpreted to mean that these restrictions, should they exist in the state, are unimportant or approved of by the writers. Rather, they are simply less likely to directly impact the intended audience for this guide. Information on these laws can be found on a state by state basis on the NARAL Pro Choice America website, and the authors encourage you to read these.

Insofar as the financial incentives are listed, these are meant to be *top-line* readings only. There are often additional limitations on these incentives based on spending, residency, duration of shoot, program caps, and more. For more information on a state-by-state basis, visit filmproductioncapital.com.

Finally, this guide looks *solely* at abortion law. "Green" states may have other significant human rights problems which are not addressed by the guide.

A note on language

Because we know that the LGBTQ community is also affected by abortion access and many nonbinary and transgender individuals may also need access to abortion, this guide attempts to use non-gender specific language like "those affected" or "Pregnant persons" or just "people." This may sometimes conflict with state law, which may list "women" or "females" in some instances. Language matters.

 New law bans abortion after 6th week of pregnancy, creates criminal penalties for those who provide abortions, and may criminalize women who obtain abortions even out of state, effective 1/1/2020

- Expanded state law to specifically protect choice, June 2019

- "Counseling" and 24-hour waiting period
- Consent of one parent before procedure for pregnant persons under the age of 18
- State has "trigger law" that will outlaw all abortions if Roe v. Wade is overturned.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 A near-total six-week ban is currently blocked by courts as the case progresses

# LOUISIANA

- State has "trigger law" that will outlaw all abortions if Roe v. Wade is overturned.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 6-week near total ban to take effect if/when similar Mississippi law is upheld in courts, does not provide execeptions for rape or incest

 6-week ban introduced state legislature in 2019 but is highly unlikely to become law.

# **MASSACHUSETTS**

 25% transferrable and redeemable tax credit on qualified production expenditures

## **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion through the 24th week after implantation.
- "Counseling" required, but portions of this law have been permanently blocked by courts.
- Consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

# **MICHIGAN**

## **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted until "fetal viability."
- "Counseling" and 24-hour waiting period

 20% cash rebate on qualifying expenditures, scales to 25% based on spend or percent of shoot in state

- Abortion is permitted until "fetal viability."
- "Counseling" and 24-hour waiting period
- Requires notice to one parent before procedure for pregnant persons under the age of 18

## **PENDING LAWS**

 A 6-week ban has been introduced in the legislature but is unlikely to become law with current makeup of state government.

# **MISSISSIPPI**

## **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

- 25% cash rebate on qualified production expenditures (EXCLUDES non-resident compensation)
- 30-35% cash rebate on resident payroll depending on veteran status

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion through the 20th week after the last menstrual period.
- "Counseling, ultrasound and 24-hour waiting period
- "Trigger law" that will outlaw all abortions if Roe v. Wade is overturned.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 A six-week ban without protections for rape and incest was scheduled to take effect July 1, 2019. It is currently temporarily blocked by courts as the case progresses.

# **MISSOURI**

 8-week ban scheduled to take effect on August 28, 2019. Does not include exceptions for rape or incest

# **MONTANA**

 Up to 20% cash rebate on qualified production expenditures

- While state law currently requires parental consent for pregnant persons under the age of 18, state courts have blocked enforcement of this provision

## **PENNSYLVANIA**

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted through the 24th week after the last menstrual period.
- "Counseling" and 24-hour waiting period required
  Requires consent of one parent before procedure for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

No major pending changes,

## **PUERTO RICO**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

 40% transferable tax credit on qualified production expenditures, 20% on non-resident compensation

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

Abortion is permitted solely to protect the physical health of the mother. All other abortions are considered criminal.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

No major pending changes,

## **PUERTO RICO**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

 40% transferable tax credit on qualified production expenditures, 20% on non-resident compensation

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

Abortion is permitted solely to protect the physical health of the mother. All other abortions are considered criminal.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

No major pending changes,

# RHODE ISLAND

### **Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

 30% transferable tax credit on qualified production expenditures

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted through the 24th week after the last menstrual period.
- "Counseling" required before procedure.
- Requires consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 The Democratic state legislature attempted to pass an affirmative protection of abortion rights in 2019 but the measure was defeated.

## **SOUTH CAROLINA**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

- 30% cash rebate on qualifying non-payroll expenses
- 25% cash rebate on resident payroll
- 20% cash rebate on nonresident payroll

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted through the 20th week after fertilization.
- "Counseling" required
- 24-hour waiting period after "counseling"
- Requires consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 17

#### **PENDING LAWS**

6-week ban passed state
 House in 2019, not yet
 taken up in Senate.
 Governor intends to sign if
 passed.

## **SOUTH DAKOTA**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

No current incentives

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion through the 20th week after fertilization.
- "Counseling" and 72-hour waiting period required
- Requires notice to one parent for those under the age of 18 "Trigger law" that will outlaw all abortions if Roe v. Wade is overturned.

#### **PENDING LAWS**

No major pending changes.

## **TENNESSEE**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

- 25% cash rebate on qualified production expenditures (EXCLUDES non-resident compensation)
- Additional incentives for scripted television

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted until "fetal viability."
- "Counseling" required48-hour waiting period after"counseling"
- Requires consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 State House passed 6-week heartbeat bill in 2019. Currently postponed indefinitely by state Senate.

## **TEXAS**

## **Most Threatened**

 5-22.5% cash rebate for qualified production expenses based on type of production, spend, and percentage of shoot in state

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted until 20 weeks after fertilization.
- "Counseling," ultrasound, and 24-hour waiting period
- Requires notification to and consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

6-week ban introduced in state House in 2019

## **UTAH**

### **Most Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

 20% refundable tax credit on qualified production expenditures, scales to 25% if certain benchmarks are met

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted until "fetal viability."
- "Counseling," ultrasound, and 72-hour waiting period
- Requires notification to and consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 Has an 18-week ban which is currently unenforceable pending court battle. Seen as likely location for next 6week ban

## **VERMONT**

### **Least Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

No incentives at this time

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

Vermont has no laws restricting the number of weeks into pregnancy an abortion can be performed, or which require counseling, or which require parental notification or consent

## **VIRGINIA**

- 25-45% refundable tax credit on resident payroll for qualifying individuals

- Requires notice to and consent of one parent for those under 18

- Abortion is permitted until "fetal viability."
- There are no state laws requiring "counseling," delays, or parental notification or consent.

## **WEST VIRGINIA**

### **Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

- 30% cash rebate on qualified production expenditures EXCLUDING non-resident pay
- 15% cash rebate on nonresident compensation
- 35% cash rebate for certain television productions

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted through the 22nd week after the last menstrual period.
- "Counseling", 24-hour waiting period and ultrasound required
- Requires notification to one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 6-week ban introduced in 2019. If passed, it currently seems unlikely to be signed by governor but this COULD change. If so, West Virginia would become "Most Threatened"

## WISCONSIN

### **Threatened**

#### **INDUSTRY INCENTIVES**

No current incentives

#### **CURRENT LAWS**

- Abortion is permitted through the 20th week after fertilization.
- "Counseling, 24-hour waiting period and ultrasound required
- Requires consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**

 Wisconsin has no pending changes but electorate has been especially volatile on social issues. Arguments could be made to call this "least threatened" at present

## WYOMING

### **Threatened**

- Requires notification to and consent of one parent for pregnant persons under the age of 18

#### **PENDING LAWS**
