The world lived without ice cream until 1832, when Augustus Jackson, a Negro caterer in Philadelphia made the first dish of it partly by accident, according to "Capper's Weekly." For a time he enjoyed the monopoly of its sale and had no difficulty in selling all he could make at a dollar a quart. After his death his daughter continued the business, but with all the members of the Jackson family working they were unable to meet the demand for this favorite American dish and gradually other confectioners and caterers took it up. . . .
