


WISCONSIN STATE OVERVIEW - RURAL HOSPITALS

METHODOLOGY NOTES

Evaluation Criteria

Essentiality: How important is the hospital to the market(s) it serves?

Essentiality Rating

- Critically Essential
- Moderately Essential
- Less Essential

Hospitals are rated on four indicators:

- 1. Trauma Level Designation
 - Trauma Level I and II are "Critically Essential"
- 2. Service to Vulnerable Populations
 - Composite of proportion of Medicaid days and level of Uncompensated Care compared to national average
- 3. Geographic Isolation
 - Proportion of hospital beds within 25 mile radius
- 4. Economic Impact on Community
 - Ratio of Hospital employees to community residents

<u>Financial Risk</u>: What is the hospital's short and longterm financial state?

Financial Risk rating

- High Financial Risk
- Medium Financial Risk
- Low Financial Risk

Hospitals are rated on <u>three</u> key indicators and ratings are based on comparisons with Moody's healthcare medians for different bond ratings groups

- 1. Non-Audited Operating Margin*
 - Last 3 years: below/above/variable compared to Moody's medians
- 2. Days Cash on Hand
- 3. Debt to Capitalization Ratio
