

C. LEXICON

"As I've said any number of times over the years, once you lose the language battle, the substantive policy defeat is sure to follow." Andrew C. McCarthy, Contributing Editor, National Review

Words reflect meaning and can improperly or properly communicate ideas and facts. Thus, the following language guidelines are to be used in Alliance Defending Freedom communications. In all instances, do not use highly pejorative adjectives regarding those who oppose us, do not single out individuals as the opposition—instead refer to the organization or the administration. The only exceptions are for direct, documented quotes from third parties, which then should not be altered unless noted or when deviation from the norm is determined to be in the best interest of a legal client (for major exceptions, consult with the CEO/General Counsel).

Guidelines are listed by topic (Organization, Religious Liberty, the Sanctity of Life, Marriage and Family) in alphabetical order.

Organization

USE: ACLU and its allies

DON'T USE: ACLU (unless they are acting alone)

USE: Alliance Defending Freedom

DON'T USE: ADF (do not use the acronym at this time)

Note: When introducing our new name, it is important to use the full name so that our target audiences intuitively and consistently recall Alliance Defending Freedom as the name of our organization.

USE: Alliance Defending Freedom
DON'T USE: The Alliance Defending Freedom

Note: In order to strengthen the impact of the brand name, articles generally do not precede the name of a brand; for example, Apple is "Apple" not "the Apple," Barnes & Noble is "Barnes & Noble" not "the Barnes & Noble."

USE: Alliance Defending Freedom

DON'T USE: Alliance Defending Freedom's (no use of possessive)

USE: Alliance Defending Freedom and its allies

DON'T USE: Alliance Defending Freedom (unless we are acting alone)

USE: Alliance Defending Freedom-backed (for organizational funded cases)

DON'T USE: Alliance Defending Freedom-funded

Note: Alliance Defending Freedom funding takes on many different aspects. For example, Alliance Defending Freedom may not directly fund a case, but does fund a moot court training session for an attorney who is going to argue the case. So it is a misnomer to say that Alliance Defending Freedom funded a case, because we did not fund all aspects of it.



USE: Alliance Defending Freedom was launched in 1994

Alliance Defending Freedom was founded in 1993

DON'T USE: Alliance Defending Freedom was founded in 1994

Note: January 31, 1994, was the first day Alliance Defending Freedom opened its doors publicly for business. The conference call that led to the founding of Alliance Defending Freedom occurred in 1993. But January 31, 1994, is really the "birthday" of Alliance Defending Freedom.

USE: Attorneys General (for multiple persons in that office)

DON'T USE: Attorney Generals

USE: Blackstone interns or Blackstone graduates (as a blanket term)

DON'T USE: Blackstone Fellows or Blackstoners

Note: Not all Blackstone interns eventually become fellows. "Fellows" can be used if someone has been awarded that status, but it cannot be used as a blanket term to describe all who participate in the summer program. Additionally, there is no such thing as a "Former" Blackstone Fellow.

USE: Blackstone leadership development program

DON'T USE: Blackstone program

USE: faith promise, faith commitment

DON'T USE: pledge

Note: Alliance Defending Freedom Co-founder Larry Burkett mandated that Alliance Defending Freedom never use the term "pledge" in any allied Ministry Friend communications. Larry saw "pledge" as making a vow that you may not be able to keep, but a "faith promise" as relying on the Lord to be able to provide the funds to give.

USE: keep the door open for the spread of the Gospel
DON'T USE: keep the legal door open for the spread of the Gospel

Note: Important to remain true to Alliance Defending Freedom history by keeping this phrase as originally spoken by Bill Bright. While we will not add the word "legal" to the phrase, we continue to reinforce that we are working in the legal arena in the context of the rest of the communication.

USE: "legal ministry" or "alliance-building legal ministry" to describe Alliance Defending Freedom

DON'T USE: "legal alliance" to describe Alliance Defending Freedom

Note: "legal alliance" or "the alliance" can be used when referring to Alliance Defending Freedom working with its allies (allied Ministry Friends, allied attorneys, allied partners, etc.).



USE: Allied Ministry Friend Education Letter

DON'T USE: acquisition letter

Note: The major purpose of all Alliance Defending Freedom communications is to educate the Body of Christ on the battle and call them to act—what's working, what's not, what needs to be done, and what needs prayer.

USE: Allied Ministry Friends

DON'T USE: Donors

USE: opposition DON'T USE: enemy

USE: the name of the organization or the administration (when referring to the opposition)
DON'T USE: do not refer to a personal name or the last name of a person as profanity or obscenity

USE: Prayer and Information Letter
DON'T USE: Appeal Letter OR Fundraising Letter

Note: The major purpose of all Alliance Defending Freedom communications is to educate the Body of Christ on the battle and call them to pray and to act—what's working, what's not, what needs to be done, and what needs prayer.

USE: team members (for those on the payroll)

DON'T USE: employees

Note: We are part of a team.

USE: "This is...," "That is...," "They are...," etc. (see Note below)

DON'T USE: Do not use "I believe...," "I think...," "It's my opinion...," etc. However, depending on the context of the communication, these phrases may be appropriately but very sparingly used.

Note: Per Alan, something is either correct or incorrect, but usually we "think" is nothing more than an "opinion." In this battle we are fighting, we do not want to reduce the stakes/situation/issue down to whose "opinion" wins. We are not relativists, but Christians.

USE: Title, Team Leader (or similar)

DON'T USE: Boss

Note: Alan says we are co-laborers in the vineyard, and brothers and sisters in Christ; "ladies and gentlemen serving ladies and gentlemen."



USE: U.S. Court of Appeals for the ____ Circuit

DON'T USE: U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, ____ Circuit Court

Religious Liberty

USE: Christmas

DON'T USE: X-mas, holiday season, winter holiday/break

USE: defending biblical, religious principles, convictions

DON'T USE: bigotry, anti-tolerance

USE: equality of opportunity

DON'T USE: equality

Note: "Where equality is enthroned, freedom is extinguished. The rise of the egalitarian society means the death of the free society." Patrick Buchanan [Suicide of a Superpower: Will America Survive to 2025?]

USE: "hate" crimes, so-called "hate" crimes

DON'T USE: hate crimes

Note: We put quotes around "hate" because all crimes are motivated by hate of some kind; there are no "love" crimes.

USE: Rights protected by the Constitution, Rights guaranteed by the Constitution,

First Amendment protected rights, constitutionally protected rights.

DON'T USE: First amendment rights, constitutional rights

USE: science

DON'T USE: antievolution, antiscience, creationism

Note: In Alliance Defending Freedom communications, we do not want to add a qualifier to "science" such as "Creation science." Adding a qualifier suggests that there are many types of science about the foundations of our existence.

USE: sexual indoctrination programs

DON'T USE: sexual education programs, health education

USE: troubled/religious theory of evolution

DON'T USE: fact of evolution, scientific theory of evolution

The Sanctity of Life

USE: abortion advocates, proponents of the culture of death, etc.

DON'T USE: pro-choice

USE: abortion, killing of the innocent, committing abortions



DON'T USE: termination of pregnancy, abortion procedure, performing abortions

Note: "Procedure" is a medical euphemism.

USE: abortion-inducing drug, morning-after abortion pill DON'T USE: emergency contraception, birth control, morning-after pill

USE: abortionist, abortion facility, commit an abortion

DON'T USE: health clinic, family-planning center, women's center, do an abortion

USE: killing the defenseless, premeditated murder of the helpless

DON'T USE: mercy killing, euthanasia, right to die, pulling the plug, compassion

USE: preborn child

DON'T USE: unborn child, fetus, unwanted pregnancy

USE: pro-abstinence, pro-purity/responsibility

DON'T USE: anti-contraception, unrealistic expectations

USE: pro-life, pro-family, pro-children
DON'T USE: antiabortion, anti-reproductive rights
USE: pro-life advocates, defenders of life

DON'T USE: pro-life protesters, antiabortion protesters, pro-lifers

Note: Describe those wanting to save lives in a positive way.

USE: protect human life DON'T USE: restrict abortion

USE: women considering abortion, women struggling with abortion

DON'T USE: women exercising their reproductive rights

USE: women who've experienced abortion, women struggling with abortion

DON'T USE: women who've exercised their freedom of choice

Marriage and Family

USE: adultery, infidelity, fornication
DON'T USE: extramarital relationship, affair, liaison

USE: advocating/promoting promiscuity/immorality

DON'T USE: sex education, safe sex, responsible sex

USE: anti-marriage, opponents of marriage

DON'T USE: pro-marriage rights, gay marriage advocates



USE: advocates of homosexual behavior, homosexual behavior advocates

DON'T USE: homosexual or gay activists

USE: biological sex in reference to he/she
DON'T USE: "changed" sex in reference to he/she

USE: convictions against homosexual behavior
DON'T USE: homophobia, antigay bias, intolerance
USE: cross-dressing, sexually confused

DON'T USE: transgender

USE: demands of/by the homosexual legal agenda, demands of/by advocates of homosexual behavior, special privileges

DON'T USE: homosexual/gay rights, hate-crimes legislation, antidiscrimination laws

Note: According to Alan, "The goals and the agenda of advocates of homosexual behavior are not 'rights,' but 'demands.'"

USE: homosexual agenda

DON'T USE: lesbian and gay civil rights movement

USE: homosexual behavior DON'T USE: homosexuality or gay

Note: Homosexuality is a personal struggle; however, homosexual behavior is sinful. Alan adds, "It isn't a condition."

USE: homosexual behavior

DON'T USE: gay

Note: The word "gay" was conceived by advocates of homosexual behavior to de-stigmatize their behavior and advance their agenda.

USE: homosexual behavior DON'T USE: homosexual lifestyle

Note: Alan notes that it's not a "lifestyle"—tragically, it's a way that often leads to death (Proverbs 14:12).

USE: marriage and family

DON'T USE: traditional marriage OR traditional marriage and the family

Note: Using the word "traditional" reinforces the notion—by some—that there are many types of marriage and lends credibility that marriage could be something besides "one man / one woman."



USE: panderers of pornography
DON'T USE: pornography industry

USE: pedophile, child predator, child molester

DON'T USE: adult attracted to children

USE: pornography

DON'T USE: adult literature, literature for mature audiences

USE: protect families, protect communities
DON'T USE: restrict pornography, censor pornography

Note: Protecting children, families, and communities against the scourge of pornography is not censorship.

USE: same-sex "marriage," marriage imitation
DON'T USE: gay marriage or homosexual marriage

Note: According to Alan, "It isn't marriage."

USE: sexual-identity confusion / sexual confusion

DON'T USE: gender / gender identity confusion

USE: sexual preference/choice

DON'T USE: sexual orientation, genetic predisposition, gay gene

USE: sexually mutilated male/female, self-proclaimed male/female, biological male/female

DON'T USE: intersex person/male/female

USE: sexually oriented businesses (SOBs)

DON'T USE: adult businesses.

Note: "Adult" was a term that pornographers fabricated to try to de-stigmatize hard-core pornography. We do not want to adapt to their lexicon. For media interviews, generally do not use the acronym "SOBs." Simply say, "sexually oriented businesses," or you may get more media coverage than you want!
